### Tyson cutting more than half its Emporia work force

EMPORIA (AP) — Tyson Foods Inc., the world's largest meat company, said Friday it would end beef slaughtering at its Emporia plant, cutting about 1,500 jobs, or more than half its work force at the facility.

The cuts were a response to overcapacity at slaughter houses and shifting of production to western Kansas from eastern, where the Emporia plant is located. The plant has been part of Tyson Foods since the company's purchase of IBP Inc. in 2001, said Dick Bond, president and CEO of Tyson Foods.

Beef slaughter operations at the Emporia plant, which has about 2.400 employees, will end within the next few weeks, the Springdale, Ark.-

based company said. The company will continue to use the Emporia facility as a cold storage and distribution warehouse and will process ground beef there.

"There continues to be far more beef slaughter capacity than available cattle, and we believe this problem will continue to afflict the industry for the foreseeable future," Bond said. "We estimate the current slaughter overcapacity in the industry to be between 10,000 and 14,000 head of cattle per day."

Bond also said cattle production had moved from eastern Kansas, where Emporia is located, to western Kansas in the last few decades.

"There is a lot more agriculture than beef business in eastern

Kansas," said Emporia City Manager Matt Zimmerman. "I think it's been a gradual process."

Tyson also said the company didn't see signs of growth in the fed cattle supply over the next two to three years, and that high grain prices spurred by the demand for cornbased ethanol also contributed to their decision to cut jobs in Emporia.

Jim Lochner, senior group vice president of Tyson Fresh Meats, said in the release that by making the cuts in Emporia, the company would be able to send more cattle to other more strategically located facilities.

Emporia has about 30,000 residents and is located about 120 miles southwest of Kansas City, Mo.



### Kansas Wheat and K-State receive bioscience authority grant

At the end of the sixmonth planning grant period, the Bioscience Authority will review all submitted proposals and may award contracts for the completion of proposed centers.

The Kansas Innovation Center for Advanced Plant Design: "Plants for the Heartland" would focus on the emerging commercial opportunities for wheat, sorghum, small grains, and native plants and grasses. By coordinating efforts across the state, nation and the world, the Center would accelerate scientific discoveries and innovation in plant bioscience. The Center would be business collaboration among plant science industry groups and university research counterparts. The Kansas Wheat Commission of Manhattan and K-State will be the lead organization for founding the center. Facilities for the Center would be headquartered on the campus of Kansas State

University in Manhattan, collaborating with existing research programs at the University of Kansas in Lawrence and elsewhere. The Center would unlock the power of plant genomes to create a host of novel products. "The Center would be a pivotal opportunity for Kansas," said Kansas Wheat chief executive officer Dusti Fritz. "World food security depends on three major (wheat, rice, maize) and several minor (barley, sorghum, millets) cereal crops. Kansas is a major producer of two of these crops (wheat and sorghum). The current global shortage of wheat and sorghum demonstrates the

opportunity that exists for Kansas to be in a pivotal position to lead innovation in these crops and continue as the breadbasket of the world. These crops now have the opportunity to meet other energy and industrial needs as we transition from fossil fuels into renewable sources of energy and industrial goods. The genomic sciences offer unprecedented opportunity to identify genetic advantages to redesign plants for target uses. The establishment of this center would be a game-changing opportunity for Kansas to take the premier leadership role in this new economy based on high-tech science." The Center's Native

Plants Innovation Team will be led by Dr. Barbara Timmerman, University Distinguished Professor and Chair of Medicinal Chemistry at the University of Kansas in Lawrence. Native Plants Team members will include faculty and staff from the University of Kansas. Kansas State University and the KU Medical Center. The Team's efforts will focus on using advanced plant design techniques to produce novel therapeutic drugs derived from Kansas native plants.

'The Kansas Innovation Center for Advanced Plant Design will build a strong new future for exploration, discovery and development of valuable natural product drugs that prevent and cure diseases in humans and animals," KU's Timmerman said. Dr. Fred Cholick, Dean of K-State's College of Agriculture and director of K-State Research and Extension said, "This center will position Kansas as the global leader in plant genetics by translating innovative research into value-added agricultural products delivered to the market place. For Kansas, this would create new jobs and attract the best and brightest minds in plant bioscience to Manhattan. Kansas. Overall, it will enhance the economy of Kansas and the region, particularly in rural areas.'

"There is a new era emerging in agriculture. Wheat and sorghum are currently losing ground to corn and sovbean production. In spite of their lack of envi-

Page 19 ronmental compatibility for much of the state, corn and soybeans currently offer a short-term economic advantage to producers, and are more preferred by end users in the livestock and biofuel sectors," said Kansas Wheat Commissioner Dean Stoskopf. "Because of this approach, profitability for dryland farmers is at risk and ground water resources are being depleted. Advanced plant design affords a sustainable. long-term solution to this challenge by improving the performance of wheat and sorghum, which are better suited for Kansas. Bioscience is the key to unlocking the maximum potential of crops grown for the benefit of the state's economy and the world's consumers."



# Paragon Perspectives

A commodity analysis by Ryan Broxterman

#### Wheat

Wheat futures continue to surge higher. Weekly U.S. wheat export sales rose 15 million bushels last week, putting total export commitment near 1113 million bushels, which compares to 661 million at this time last year. Some estimate that U.S. Hard Red Soft sales already have reached USDA forecast of 275 million bushels. Two weeks ago a private analyst estimated that U.S. spring wheat ending stocks could be as low as 2 mil bushels, compared to the USDA estimate of 88 million. This continues to offer support to Minneapolis wheat futures now trading over \$12.50 per bushel. Early estimate for U.S. 2008 all wheat acres are near 63.5 million acres (+3.1), and production near 2273 million bushels. Estimates for total 2008/09 demand is near 2125 million bushels, which would in turn bring ending stock up to the 490 million bushel area for next year vs. 292 million for this year.

Thoughts: The wheat market looks like it will test highs and will make an attempt to put in a new high again. Right now traders are afraid to sell the uptrend but favorable weather in 2008 should eventually offer resistance. The volatility continues to be ever present, with one month of another touching the limit move nearly every day. We view buying puts and selling out of the money calls as a good strategy at the current time. Producers need to have protection in place as it would not be hard to picture wheat falling back to the \$8.00 range with good weather this spring.

### Soybeans

Weekly soybean export sales increased 24 million bushel last week bringing our total commit to near 829 million bushels versus 816 last year. The current USDA export goal is 995 million bushels vs. 1118 last year. Also this week, December census crush was 162 million bushels versus 157 last vear. Demand numbers suggest soybean demand may not yet be rationed at current prices. Word that Congressional budget estimated U.S. 2008/09 soybean crop near 2935 million bushels, demand near 3000 million bushels and end stocks near 100 million bushels offered support last week. Feelings that U.S. /world economies may soon bottom and show signs of recovery also offered support.

Thoughts: Most traders feel soybean prices could work higher to reflect tight U.S. 2008 outlook. A U.S. /World recession or perfect U.S. weather is needed to turn the bulls bearish. We will continue to hold off on new crop soybean sales and hold our remaining 2007 bushels.

#### Corn

Recent U.S. action to lower interest rates and a new stimulus package may be enough to limit further downside in U.S. economy and even help start a recovery added to support late

last week. Weekly export sales rose 63 million bushels last week with S. Korea, Taiwan, Japan and Mexico as the big buyers. Total export commitment is near 1749 million bushels versus 1337 million last year. The USDA goal is 2450 million bushels. Demand numbers suggest prices may not be high enough to ration demand. Congressional Budget Office estimated U.S. 2008/09 corn production near 12,594 million bushels. This assumes a drop of 5.8 mil planted acres and a yield of 155.3 vs. 151.1 this past year. They estimated total demand near 13,290 million bushels vs. a current demand of 12,955. This would lead to an ending stocks number near 892 million bushels. In other words, 2008 U.S. weather needs to be better than last year to keep prices from moving higher. Higher wheat prices are also supporting corn. Argentina weather has improved, however many traders question how much the recent rains will help the crop. There is also talk that China may restrict exports which could increase demand for U.S. exports.

Thoughts: Long term traders are friendly corn prices due to forecast of higher fuel demand, and because the U.S. corn yield needs to be close to 160

bushels per acre to keep prices from moving higher and force prices lower. We feel that a push back to contract highs warrants both old and new crop corn sales. Cattle

On Friday the USDA released their monthly cattle of feed report. The report showed the January 1 on feed number to be a record high for the January 1 time frame, pegged at 12.097 million head or 101.0% relative to last year. The total reflected placements at 99.2%

and marketing's at 101.8% of the year-ago figures. These numbers seem slightly bullish relative to the pre-release estimates; however, they do represent a record high number which is a concern if demand doesn't keep pace. The light placements seem likely to support June futures, which seemed to take the brunt of the selling over the last couple of weeks. The lower placements will also encourage



### $Continued from \ page \ 22$ buying in deferred futures as lighter placements are the expectation for the spring months too.

Thoughts: Live cattle seem to have found support around \$93 basis April. The outlook for deferred live cattle looks relatively friendly so long as the stock market holds together. Cattle futures last week looked as if they were going to be extremely susceptible to set back in the stock market due to consumer confidence.

Beef being a superior good is considered to be a luxury item and if we do slide into a recession the demand for beef would also slide as consumers shift their eating habits to cheaper pork and poultry products. Feeder cattle continue to worry us more than the live cattle market for the simple fact that no one knows when corn is going to stop. With costs of gains already above 90 cents, one must ask how we can support March feeders at \$102 with August live cattle at \$95.

**KLA-RT** completes Grassland Reserve monitoring project The Kansas Livestock Association Ranchland Trust (KLA-RT) wrapped up a Grassland Reserve Program (GRP) monitoring project on over 25,000 grassland acres in 19 Kansas counties. This conservation effort is a one-year cooperative agreement between KLA-RT and the United States Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). The agreement assigned KLA-RT the responsibility to meet with over 60 Kansas landowners who owned land enrolled in a GRP conservation easement or long-term rental agreement. KLA-RT representatives performed land ownership verifications, inspected the enrolled property to monitor compliance with the easement or rental agreement, and visited with

the landowners about man-

agement practices that might improve the health of the grasslands. "Kansas, GRP, and KLA-RT have been a perfect fit," said Paul Gallagher, NRCS Agriculture Economist. "Maintaining healthy, productive native grassland is economically and ecologically vital to the state. GRP offered ranchers an opportunity to protect that grassland for the future, and Kansas ranchers enthusiastically responded with more than 25.000 acres enrolled in GRP easements or rental agreement contracts. Now, with the NRCS & KLA-RT partnership, that protected grassland will remain healthy and productive for generations to come."

KLA-RT volunteers and advisors Dale Kirkham, Eureka and Bill Sproul, Sedan conducted the monitoring visits. Kirkham is a Certified Professional in Range

Management and former NRCS range specialist. Sproul, a rancher and grass manager from Chautauqua County, has participated in several range management educational sessions. KLA-RT board members agreed to participate in the GRP monitoring project as a means of meeting Kansas grassland owners committed to long-term conservation.

"Everyone I met during this project seemed excited to learn the KLA Ranchland

Trust was involved in the initial monitoring of GRP contracts," said Sproul.

The NRCS cooperative agreement also provided KLA Ranchland Trust an opportunity to gain experience in monitoring conservation easements. Monitoring land subject to conservation easements is an important function of land trust organizations.

According to Kirkham, "I found everyone to be very receptive of the review process. Most of these landowners were really proud to show us the conditions of their grasslands."



### Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone **Starting Seeds**

It is time to dust off the shop light and start some plants for the garden. Onions, snapdragons, and wishbone flowers should be started now. I start onions from seed because I like to watch them grow. Later on, I get to give them a hair cut so to speak. That is the only time I get to give any haircuts in my house.

Starting seeds in the house is easy. Light, temperature, seeds and seed mix are required. I like to use vermiculite to start seeds and then transplant them to a potting mix. Larger seed like broccoli and zinnia are planted directly in a container with the potting mix.

Light is critical for sturdy healthy plants. I literally dusted off my fluorescent light bulbs. The ends of one looked a little used. A light meter indicated that it was giving off less light. My eyes couldn't tell but the young seedling plants sure would. A new 40 watt bulb was installed.

The duration of light makes for healthy plants. The longer the plants get light the better. Some information sources state to leave the lights on at least 14 to 16 hours per day. For

several years I used a timer. Now I just leave the lights on continuously.

Fluorescent lights are used because they don't give off much heat. My light meter indicates the level of light reaching the plant. More light is available right at the bulb than further away. Some information sources state to have the bulbs no more than two inches away. My bulbs usually are on top of the leaves. Occasionally, there is some leaf desiccation but no detrimental effects.

I start my seeds in the basement with no natural light. This is the only space where I can control the temperature. Control means cool. The four shop lights don't produce enough light for healthy rapid growth. Slow steady growth is what I'm after. To accomplish this, air temperature to grow most of my plants needs to be around 60 degrees.

Seed germination is sped up by using a heat mat. Many seeds like 70 degrees for germination. You can start your seeds in a warmer room but they will need move to a cooler environment to grow into short stocky healthy plants.

### Senators voice few objections to Agriculture Department nominee

WASHINGTON (AP) -Senators on Thursday urged President Bush' pick for agriculture secretary to work with farm-state lawmakers on the five-year farm bill that has stalled in talks between Congress and the administration.

If confirmed, former North Dakota Gov. Ed Schafer will become head of the Agriculture Department in the midst of contentious negotiations on the \$286 billion bill passed by both the House and Senate last year.

Still, there were no objections and few tough questions from members of the Senate Agriculture Committee. North Dakota's threeman congressional delegation — all Democrats — introduced and enthusiastically endorsed the popular Republican.

"We are counting on your help in working out differences in order to enact a sound new farm bill," said Iowa Sen. Tom Harkin, the Democratic chairman of the committee.

Bush nominated Schafer in October to replace former Nebraska Gov. Mike Johanns, who left the agriculture post to run for the Senate. Former deputy secretary Charles Conner has served as acting secretary and is negotiating with Harkin and House Agriculture Chairman Collin Peterson, D-Minn., on the bill.

At issue are tax provisions added to both versions of the bill that are intended to raise additional money for farm programs. The Bush administration says the bills use funding gimmicks and tax increases to supplement

### Pruning trees in late winter has real benefits

Pruning trees early — in fact, by March — is typical only of fruit tree growers.

Even so, shade, ornamental and even woodlot tree owners could find real advantages in adopting a late-winter deadline, said Kansas State University horticulturist Ward Upham.

"In most years, the deciduous trees around here are fully dormant by January. So, judicious trimming then won't hurt them so long as temperatures are above 20 degrees," said Upham, the Master Gardener program coordinator for K-State Research and Extension.

In turn, the chore will be done before gardeners and farmers alike have to face the pressures of getting the growing season started, he said. And, when the trees awaken from dormancy, they'll be immersed in a spring environment, which fosters most plants' best growth and fastest wound recovery of the year.


For appearances alone, early pruning also helps "bleeder" trees weep less sap from fresh-cut wounds. Freezing temperatures (32 to 20 degrees F) help limit sap's flow without causing internal wood damage, Upham said.

Tree species vary in how easily and heavily they lose sap, Upham said. Central U.S. trees most apt to look like abused victims after a warm-weather pruning include any of the maples: amur, hedge, Norway, silver, sugar. Some other plant types, such as the grape vine, can also bleed, but additional trees that tend to flow with wound sap are the black walnut, pecan, birch, mulberry and Osage orange (also called hedge tree).

"One reason most fruit tree growers prune so early is that they need trees with the strongest structure possible for holding heavy fruit. Pruning while the trees are bare simply provides the clearest picture of which weak, rubbing or badly attached branches to remove," the horticulturist said.



# Dirk Maier named head of grain science and industry

Dirk Maier, professor and associate head of Purdue University's Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering, has been tapped to lead Kansas State University's Department of Grain Science and Industry. He will begin his duties at K-State on April 1.

"With the innovations occurring in grain processing seemingly every day, this is an exciting time in the grain business," said Fred Cholick, K-State dean of agriculture and director of K-State Research and Extension. "We are so pleased to have someone of Dirk Maier's caliber joining us to take the lead in educating our students to take on the challenges and opportunities in industry and to help guide research and extension that will benefit Kansas and U.S. grain producers."

Maier, who earned bachelor's, master's and Ph.D. degrees in agricultural engineering from Michigan State University, has been a professor and extension agricultural engineer at Purdue since 1991, and associate head since 2005.

He is a Purdue University Faculty Scholar for 2005-2010, and was a DAAD Guest Professor at the University of Hohenheim in Stuttgart- Hohenheim, Germany in June, 2004. He was a guest professor at the University of Torino, Italy in 2003 and a Fulbright Scholar at the Universidad Nacional de Mar del Plata in Balcarce, Argentina in 2000.

Maier's research has focused on engineered technologies for the protection of stored products and the delivery of identity-preserved, traceable and biosecure quality grains to the food, industrials, biofuels and feed processing industries.

He has secured more than \$9 million in research, technology transfer and extension education grants. He has been the recipient of numerous awards including the 2007 The Andersons/NC-213 Cereals and Oilseeds Award of Excellence in Research.

In addition to his research, Maier has demonstrated a commitment to extension work, Cholick said. He was the cofounder of the Purdue Grain Quality Team, which offers free grain composition analysis to Indiana producers, elevators and processors. He was also a key initiator of the Purdue Post-Harvest Education and Research Center. He currently serves as the director of the GEAPS-Purdue Grain and Biorefinery Operations Distance Education Program.

"Dirk has an outstanding record of providing scientific information to his colleagues and to industry," Cholick said.

At K-State, Maier will lead a department that is known worldwide in the baking, milling, feed production, and grain handling industries. It is the only place in the United States that offers college degrees in baking, feed and milling science and management. It also is currently expanding its reach into biorefinery/biofuels operations management. The program grants bachelor's, master's and Ph.D. degrees in those areas.

In addition, K-State's grain science department trains industry professionals who come to campus for short courses designed to help with research and training support. The department also has a strong international program focused on educating international consumers of Kansas and U.S. cereal products on their utilization and value. Under Maier's leadership, the department intends to expand its outreach effort through distance education.

The grain science department is home to a new 16-acre K-State Grain Science and Industry Complex, which was begun in 2002. The complex includes the International Grains Program (IGP) Conference Center, the Bioprocessing and Industrial Value-Added Program (BIVAP), and the new Hal Ross Flour Mill. A proposed feed mill/bioprocessing facility and a building with lab and classroom facilities for research and teaching will complete the complex.

Maier will succeed former grain science department head Richard "Dick" Hahn, who came out of retirement last year to serve as interim grain science department head while the university conducted the national search that led to Maier's hiring.

# Kanopolis man uses hobby to create metal artwork

KANOPOLIS (AP) — A display wall in the tall metal shed Gary Miller calls a workshop attests to his artistic talent with steel.

Floor to ceiling, the wall holds dozens of the shiny cutout figures he has created and finished: 3-D portraits of galloping wild horses; cowboys roping cattle; fish arched in action against being caught; and panoramas of exquisitely detailed nature scenes and motif themes of the Wild West and Southwest.

"As much as anything, I pride myself in the finish on them," Miller said as he scanned the wall and detailed the workmanship that goes into each piece.

A modest man and a selftaught artist, Miller, 56, has worked with metal since the late 1960s, when he started welded for a living. His "Fort Harker Metal Arts" evolved from those days.

Today, he generates the designs on a computer and cuts the pieces with the high-tech plasma process, air over electricity that cuts

the steel with a fine point a step up from the days of acetylene torches.

Once a design is cut from a sheet of cold-rolled steel, Miller polish-grinds and finishes it, using a powder coating or copper plating with a chemical process. The powder coating pieces are fired in a 400-degree oven, and a final coat of polyurethane seals the finish.

Along with using his own ideas, he fills custom orders.

Outside the shed, Miller set up a display area with stone fence posts and barbed wire that holds a windmill, along with a large-sized buffalo, a longhorn steer, a bear and an elk.

A four-shade metal sculpture light fixture of Western scenes welcomes visitors into the entrance of the Miller home. Other pieces include a doubleswinging, personalized entrance gate that leads onto the deck and a backyard steelwork bench.

A Kanopolis native, Miller works in the daytime doing maintenance at Cashco Inc. in Ellsworth. Evenings and weekends he's at work in his shop, creating the inventory of metal art that he and his wife, Stella, market during the summer at area art shows and craft fairs. He also sells to several retail businesses, including the Kansas Originals Market and Gallery north of Interstate 70 at Wilson, and Santa Fe Traders in Lyons. "It goes well," Miller

"It goes well," Miller said. In Lyons, Ken Byard, at

Santa Fe Traders, who is also a metalwork artist, describes Miller's work as "all great" and "beautiful."

Marjorie Larson, chief executive officer of the nonprofit Kansas Originals Market and Gallery, described the Fort Harker Metal Arts work as "very high-quality, very outstanding."

Looking ahead to retirement, Gary and Stella plan to travel, pulling the trailer that holds his metal art and selling it along the way.

### Snow cover can make a difference in nitrogen applied to wheat fields

Kansas wheat growers often welcome a blanket of snow over their fields, but that snow cover may impede nitrogen effectiveness, according to Kansas State University scientists.

"We have observed in Kansas that when nitrogen (N) is applied on top of snow cover, wheat yields are sometimes not as good as when nitrogen is applied to fields without snow cover," said K-State Research and Extension soil specialist Dave Mengel. "This applies


Kansas wheat growers to both dry urea and liquid en welcome a blanket of UAN applications."

Why this happens is not entirely certain, because there would be no cause for volatilization, said K-State agronomist Scott Staggenborg.

One possible reason is run-off, as N applied in this manner may sometimes move along the surface of the field as the snow melts, Staggenborg said. Nitrogen could be carried off the field or redistributed within the field, resulting in some areas of the field ending up with too much fertilizer N and some areas having an N deficiency. The end result would be an overall reduction in yield, compared to fields in which there was no snow cover when the N was applied.
