A commodity analysis by Ryan Broxterman

Nearly all commodity markets saw long liquidation last week, most of this was due to tight credit and margin calls. Continued concerns about the US economy fueled the push lower as funds jumped ship on long positions. Investments banks are finding it hard to sell bonds because investors fear subprime mortgages will eventually take these companies down. The extreme volatility is continuing to make it harder and harder for farmers to market their grain. Cargill, ADM and Bunge all recently adopted a policy of accepting no new crop forward contracts in an attempt to stay away from crippling margin calls.

Soybeans

Soybean futures went from a high on the 14th of

\$14.22, to last Friday's limit down close at \$12.07. Fundamentally the soybean market has changed little with this 2 dollar swing lower. Most of the fundamental news out last week was bullish. Cash US soybean export basis firmed as cargos of sovbeans were switched from Argentina to US. This was due to Argentina farmer's strike which prevented Argentina soybeans from being available. In addition, there was also an increase in US sales to Europe. This continued increase in business could eventually lower US soybean carryout below USDA latest estimate of 140 million bushels, which is already extremely tight.

Thoughts: We are now less than a week away from the March 31 planting inten-

tions report. This report will give us a better idea on what farmers are planning to plant over the coming months. Many analysts are calling for a larger acreage number for soybeans in 2008. With the large shift from soybeans to corn last vear, this didn't take anyone off guard. Analysts are currently estimating total soybean acreage to be between 71 and 73 million acres. We feel we will likely trade sideways to lower going into the report, and which side of the market the report comes out on will likely dictate the trend for the upcoming months.

Corn

Continued weak trade in energies and a stronger dollar forced more speculative long liquidation. Commercials appear to be waiting to see how far futures drop before they step in and buy the market. With no-one willing to step in front of the large fund liquidation, we have found ourselves in a free fall. Weekly US export sales rose 29 million bushels which puts our total commitment near 2055 million bushels vs. 1600 last year. Current estimates for the USDA March 31 acreage report range from 89 to 84 million acres.

Thoughts: The corn market last week looked more like it was being drug lower, than it wanted to move lower. Corn seemed to be following both outside markets and the soybeans lower last week. We feel corn will likely trade sideways going into the acreage report next Monday, however, long term we don't feel the corn market is done. Fundamentally the numbers look quite bullish. Good weather will play a critical role this summer as to just how high the corn market can go. We view this pull back as a very good opportunity for livestock producers to be getting all of their summer and fall corn bought.

Wheat

Wheat like all of the other grains fell hard last week. Wheat was a follower of the weak commodity action last week. Open interest dropped as prices declined, with hedge funds rolling to a net short position in Chicago wheat. Wheat futures look poised to continue to follow both outside markets and the rest of the grains unless the dry weather in the west continues to hold.

Thoughts: Wheat broke key support levels late last week and went into a free fall. At one point on Friday we were down over a dollar in several of the contract months. Fundamentally we are getting close to being in a weather market in wheat. Most of the western wheat belt is suffering from dry conditions. A stretch from southwest Kansas all the way to Montana continues to remain dry. If we start to turn lower with corn and soybeans after the report we will look to get more new crop wheat sold.

Cattle

The monthly cattle on feed report was released on Friday afternoon. The report

showed on feed supplies at 102.2% compared to the range of estimates of 102.0 to 103.3%. The total reflects a placement number of 103.9% (range of estimates was 97 1-110.0) and a marketing number of 103.8% (range of estimates was 97 6-103 0) These numbers look friendly, with marketing's being the friendliest of the three. In addition to the Cattle on feed report the Cold Storage report was also released on Friday. That report showed 9% less beef in storage which was friendly, however, it also showed a lot more pork (+25%) and chicken (+21%) in storage, which should keep a cap on beef prices.

Thoughts: We remain skeptical the cattle market especially the feeders through the summer months. Fall fat cattle look friendlier than summer cattle based on placement numbers. We just can't see feeders taking off with the unknowns of corn acreage, summer weather, and beef demand, especially with large premiums already held by feeder futures. We continue to maintain the bias that feeders should be hedged out through August.

Baucus, Conrad say Harkin's farm bill proposal unacceptable

WASHINGTON (AP) — High Plains senators say a new farm bill proposal would shortchange farmers who have lost crops to bad

A dedicated fund designed to help those farmers continues to be a sticking point as farm-state members of Congress struggle to come up with money to pay for the legislation passed by the House and Senate last

Those from the High Plains and other droughtprone areas insist the disaster aid be part of the farm bill, saying it is often difficult to push emergency dollars for farmers through Congress. Other farm-state members have higher priorities.

Sen. Tom Harkin, D-Iowa, and Rep. Collin Peterson, D-Minn., the chairmen of the Senate and House Agriculture Committees, proposed on Tuesday spending \$2.2 billion over 10 years on the so-called agriculture disaster fund, according to aides and senators familiar with the negoti-

That is much less than the \$5.1 billion over five years that was included in the Senate bill. The House included no money for the

Sen. Max Baucus, D-Mont., the chairman of the Senate Finance Committee who sponsored the Senate that the latest proposal disaster provision, said the Harkin-Peterson proposal is "dead on arrival." Sen. Kent Conrad, D-N.D., the chairman of the Senate Budget Committee, said it is "unacceptable."

Both senators are influential in negotiations over the multibillion-dollar farm bill. Baucus and Conrad both sit on the agriculture panel and the finance panel, which is charged with finding extra money to pay it.

"I won't vote for or help to fund any agreement that does not do disaster assistance right for our farmers in need," Baucus said in a statement.

Conrad said negotiators are "a long way from the end of the story" in terms of final

"This is not unusual in a negotiation, people put out numbers to enhance their position," he said.

Harkin has opposed the disaster program, saying it could be vulnerable to abuse, but has agreed it will be part of the final package in some form.

He said in a statement would allocate funding across the "full spectrum" of farm bill needs - renewable energy, nutrition, conservation, rural development, disaster assistance and other areas.

Farm-state members are scrambling to come up with enough money for the bill by April 18, when current law expires. Congress extended the law from March 15 last week.

President Bush has the extra money for the bill.

threatened to veto both the House- and Senate- passed versions of the five year legislation that would provide \$286 billion to expand farm and nutrition programs such as food stamps and farmer

The administration contends both chambers used tax increases and funding gimmicks to pay for the bills, and lawmakers are scrambling to find new ways to finance the legislation.

The process has been complicated by the absence of House Ways and Means Chairman Charlie Rangel, D-N.Y., who was hospitalized with the flu and has not yet returned to Washington. Negotiators are waiting for Rangel and Baucus to find

Lawmakers also have disagreed on who has control over the legislation. Baucus and Iowa Sen. Charles Grassley, the top Republican on the finance panel, want their committee to control some farm programs along with finding the money for it. But Harkin has said his committee should have total control over the bill.

Conrad said the Harkin-Peterson proposal could threaten Senate Finance Committee talks over funding the farm bill, since the disaster money is a priority for him and Baucus.

"One would have hoped that after all this time, they would have come up with something that wouldn't have put at risk the financing package," Conrad said.

Still, he said, "It's very evident that these are negotiating numbers."

Steve Irsik named K-State alumni fellow

A would-be business partner's reactions while shooting the rapids on a river raft or negotiating a ropes course will typically offer clues as to how he — or she — will react when pressured to make business decisions, said Steve Irsik, an agribusiness entrepreneur.

Irsik made the comparison during a recent visit to the Kansas State University campus as the College of Agriculture's 2008 Alumni Fellow. The University-wide fellowship program invites successful graduates to share lessons they have learned in building a successful career. He earned a degree in agricultural economics at K-State in 1969 and, since then, has developed an entrepreneurial career in agribusiness that includes crops and forage, a value-added cattle operation, and a dairy with 6,000 cows — in the middle of beef country, no less.

His career is far different than what he might have imagined as a student, he

Irsik had hoped to attend law school after graduating from K-State, but, with the Vietnam War going on, he chose the United States Air Force instead. When he completed his service, he had a wife and young family and chose to return to the family farm near Garden

The family has had its share of hard times, Irsik said. His Great-Grandmother Merck emigrated to the United States in 1880. She fear the ship would sink during a storm at sea, and later found out the captain had feared the same outcome.

Once in the U.S., she traveled to Dodge City, by stagecoach to begin a new life, married and had children, including Irsik's Grandmother Allen who was born in a dugout.

The Irsik grandparents were down to their last dollar during bleak Depression days, when they loaded their nine children and a few possessions into a Model A Ford and Model T truck to seek opportunities father west, said Irsik, who credits his family's success to a variety of factors.

"DNA matters," he said. "I come from a family of hard workers. We've had our share of struggles and have worked hard to overcome them."

His father advised him to "Do whatever you want to do, but never get yourself overextended," and that advice still applies, said Irsik, who noted that the family has learned to recognize opportunities and do the homework before taking well-calculated risks to expand their businesses and create successful new ventures.

Growth and development is not without risks, said Irsik, who believes that education is a lifelong process — and a key actor in success. "Education should not stop the day you graduate from college," said Irsik, who advised students to "Keep learning. Apply for internships, fellowships and scholarships."

Irsik also advised students to volunteer, to choose from a variety of campus, civic and service activities that typically broaden personal interests and experiences, and may also bring unexpected opportunities.

As a businessman with an entrepreneurial flair, he also is supportive of programs such as the Kansas Agricultural and Rural Leadership (KARL) Program, which offers emerging leaders in agribusiness and skill-building industry study, training and travel opportunities to get acquainted with Kansas and the larger world.

In building successful agribusinesses, Irsik prefers to look at "the big picture."

"Ask yourself: How can expanding the business in one area support - or enhance - profitability in another area?" said Irsik, who cited hauling 30,000 tons of manure from the dairy operation to use in place of more costly fertilizer on nearby cropland as an example.

The cost to haul the ma-\$70,000 nure — about trims commercial fertilizer costs by several hundred thousand dollars, he said. Operating a commercial grain elevator facilitates cattle feeding, and owning a mill offers time- and moneysaving opportunities in delivering fresh oats and wheat flour to food processors and consumers.

With ideas aplenty, Irsik advised students and faculty to be aware of the larger world and how they might serve it. His example? Mexico currently imports 30 to 35 percent of its food. Western Kansas farmers and ranchers might seem well positioned as suppliers, but the question becomes: How can we in Kansas work to fulfill the need? Working together is key, said Irsik, who believes strongly in the value of relationships in any successful venture and also in rewarding loyal employees who work hard.

The family's ranch and farm managers have, for example, been involved in the operation for more than 20 years, he said.

"Being able to delegate allows more time to look for more opportunities," he

Young farmers and ranchers anticipate bright future according to survey

The availability of land and farm facilities and overall profitability remain the top challenges of America's young farmers and ranchers. However, they also believe they are better off today than five years ago, and they are more optimistic about the future of farming.

These are just a few of the key findings of an informal survey of young U.S. farmers and ranchers, ages 18-35, conducted by the American Farm Bureau Federation. Overall, the 16th annual survey of participants in AFBF's Young Farmer & Rancher Program, conducted during the 2008 YF&R conference held in Baltimore, Md., recently, shows the future of U.S. agriculture is in caring and competent hands.

"Despite facing some significant challenges, young farmers and ranchers are enthusiastic about the future of agriculture," AFBF YF&R Chair Townsend Kyser said. Kyser, a farmer and catfish producer from Greensboro, Ala., was elected to lead Farm Bureau's young farmers and ranchers in January.

Following land and facility availability (36 percent) and overall profitability (20 percent) as the two top concerns, young farmers and ranchers cite increasing urbanization and loss of farmland (14 percent), government regulations (11 percent), and the availability and costs of health care (10

percent) as the next mostpressing challenges. Land and facility availability and overall profitability have ranked high in most previ-

Once again, the vast majority of young farmers and ranchers (83 percent) said they are more optimistic about farming than five years earlier. In 2007, 79 percent of those surveyed said they were more optimistic, and the percentage of respondents feeling more optimistic has hovered around 80 percent since 2004. In 2003, 61 percent said they were more opti-

When young farmers and ranchers were asked if they feel better off now than five years ago, 90 percent indicated they are better off now. Back in 2000, 70 percent said they were better off than five years previously, the lowest percentage since the survey's inception in 1993.

In addition, 92 percent of today's young farmers and

Eighty-four percent believe their children will be able to follow them in farming and ranching if they choose to do so.

Most (43 percent) of the individuals surveyed said they got started in farming and ranching as a result of a family partnership, but 30 percent said they started in agriculture on their own, without benefit of family

When asked what steps the federal government could take to help them continue farming and ranching, the measure cited most often was greater financial help for beginning farmers (22 percent), followed by maintaining a viable farm income safety net and strengthening private property rights (17 percent each), boosting U.S. agricultural exports and trade (15 percent) and reforming or

cutting federal taxes (13 tural communities," AFBF percent).

Two-thirds of survey participants said they believe farm income should come totally from domestic and international markets, while 33 percent said farm income should be supplemented by federal farm program payments. Last year, 63 percent said farm income should come totally from the marketplace, and 79 percent said so in 2006.

For the first time, young farmers and ranchers were asked if state and local issues, such as property taxes, concern them more than federal issues, and 75 percent responded in the affirmative.

"The high level of interest in local and state issues by young farmers and ranchers is encouraging. Their active involvement in Farm Bureau grassroots organizations in every state and 2,800 counties around our nation is critical as we continue working to build strong, prosperous agriculPresident Bob Stallman

Taking care of the environment and practicing conservation stewardship are important to today's young farmers and ranchers. Fifty-five percent said they practice conservation tillage at home, and 49 percent rotate three or more crops. Forty percent use soil/tissue analysis, and 36 percent employ integrated pest management and field scouting.

Conservation tillage has been cited as the top earthfriendly practice every year but one since the survey began in 1993. Rotation of three or more crops and soil/tissue analysis have been popular environmental initiatives for years, as

Not surprisingly, using technology is important to today's young farmers and ranchers. About 90 percent have cellular telephones

and computers, 46 percent have home satellite television, and 99 percent use the Internet in various ways. High-speed Internet service is used by 55 percent, followed by 27 percent with traditional dial-up service, while about 13 percent have service that relies on satellite technology.

In terms of how the general public views farmers and ranchers, 42 percent said they feel the public sees them positively. Equal numbers of respondents (29 percent each) said the public sees farmers negatively or doesn't spend time thinking about them.

AFBF's YF&R program includes men and women between the ages of 18-35. The objective of the program, according to Kyser, is to provide leadership in building a more effective Farm Bureau, while preserving individual freedoms and expanding oppotunities in agriculture.

Warmer weather brings out lady beetles

Jeff Whitworth has been hearing a lot about ladies lately. Lady beetles, that is.

Whitworth, an entomologist with Kansas State University Research and Extension, said the recent warmer weather has sparked calls from homeowners regarding lady beetles becoming active inside their homes. "This is almost a sure sign that even more spring-like weather is on its way," Whitworth said.
"However, in the meantime, these little beetles can be a real nuisance."

Several different species of lady beetles make their home in Kansas. All are beneficial, he added, because they can feed voraciously on some of our common pest insects. Depending on the species of pest, lady beetles are often our number one source of control. They are normally solitary insects, which means the only time you find large numbers of lady beetles together is because they all find a quality food source, or they have aggregated at a protective overwintering site. This seems to be the case, in reverse, throughout much of the state.

The beetles gathered last fall at potential overwintering sites which in nature would be under tree bark, under fallen trees and in cracks and crevices in rocks. However, many also gather on the south and west side of houses and barns, and other man-made structures because they held warmth longer last

As the weather got colder, they moved inside those structures and became relatively inactive, thus going

unnoticed by the homeowner, Whitworth said. Once the first warm spring days occur, the lady beetles start to become more and more active.

"They don't always remember the way to the outside, so often are trapped in the structure where they actively crawl about trying to find an exit. But, and especially if there are many, they can be a real nuisance," Whitworth said.

"In addition, recent reports have indicated an increase in allergic reactions, like asthma, in locations where large concentrations of lady beetles are found inside," he said.

The Multicolored Asian Lady Beetle has been the most common culprit identified in recent calls, he

"All lady beetles are predators, thus they have chewing mouthparts and can deliver a small bite. This little "nip" is not dangerous, but it can be irritating especially if you have several "taste-testing" you at the same time," the entomologist said.

The Multicolored Asian Lady Beetle is a very efficient aphid predator. It was first introduced into the United States in 1916, but did not become well established until additional releases were made by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in the late 1970s and early 1980s.

"Lady beetles that overwintered in your home will eventually find their way outside or die," Whitworth said. As the weather continues to moderate, their activ-

ity will increase. They need to find a suitable food source as soon as possible so they can resume their lifecycle of feeding, mating and laying eggs for the next generation. "If you want to control the lady beetles inside your home this spring, a common, general-use pesticide sprayed in the interior cracks and crevices will probably work," he added. "However, as lady beetles are not usually considered a pest, insecticides are not registered or labeled for their control.'

Purple martin scouts heralding time to prep birdhouses

The first purple martins returned to the Wichita area in time for St. Patrick's Day this year, signaling birdhouse owners to prepare for the 2008 nesting season.

When they're on schedule, the first martins arrive in northern Kansas about 10 to 14 days after they're sighted in the south, said Chuck Otte, natural resources agent with Kansas State University Research and

Extension. So, they could other species from claiming appear in northern counties in time for April Fool's Day.

More than 1 million Americans maintain purple martin houses — in part, because each bird can eat 2,000 flying insects per day, Otte said. The nesting sites often look like small apartment houses, atop a tall pole. They're plugged over the winter to discourage sparrows, starlings and

Although putting out the welcome mat at the correct time is important, Otte added, the birds do allow for some flexibility. Migrating martins arrive daily throughout their breeding range each year for at least two months.

And, although they're

called scouts, the early birds aren't really scoping out nesting sites for the flock. Scouts are just the fastest of the older birds, so not attracting one isn't a problem.

The Purple Martin Conservation Association maintains a map of reported sightings, color coded for adults and subadults, on the Web at http://www.purplemartin.org/. The site also offers an array of useful information on everything from martin house placement to squirrel problems, Otte

Purple martins have lost so much habitat that they've been dependent on humanmade nesting sites for more than 100 years, he said. Recent research found, however, the birds actually like the safety of being near, but not too close to human

dwellings. Their preferred distance is 30 to 100 feet.

"Evidently, they know their enemies — snakes. owls, raccoons — will avoid areas close to human dwellings if they can." Otte said. "This 'knowing' may be instinct. Or, it may be a behavior they started to learn long ago when Native Americans hung up empty gourds to attract nesting purple



The tour began in Manhattan with visits to wheat research facilities, where research is being funded by Kansas wheat producers through the Kansas Wheat Commission.

At the KSU Agronomy Department, wheat breeding technician Andy Auld showed the participants the greenhouses where research is done. John Fellers, Re-

search Molecular Biologist with USDA's Agricultural Research Service, discussed the effort to sequence the wheat genome and his research to develop and provide genetic solutions to several economically important stress problems in hard winter

Next, the group toured the Bioprocessing and Industry Value Added Program with Ron Madl, who is the Director of that program. Madl explained how researchers are working to improve the process by which cellulosic materials may be converted to sugars and fermented into higher value products, including

biofuels. He also discussed research that is investigating the factors that influence antioxidant content of wheat.

Bob Bennett, KSU Senior Scientist, took the group on a tour of the Hal Ross Flour Mill and the International Grains Program Executive Conference Center at K-State's Grain Science and Industry Depart-

In Topeka, the group visited the Kansas Grain Inspection Service, which provides unbiased grades to allow buyers and sellers to know the grade, class and condition of grain, thereby facilitating its marketing.

The participants also

met with Brent Emch, FSC Operations Leader at Cargill Ag Horizons in Topeka, before heading to Kansas City.

On Thursday, the group was able to view the opening of the Kansas City Board of Trade, meet with General Mills wheat trader/broker Justin Gilpin, and tour Best Harvest Bakeries. Finally, the group attended Kansas Agriculture Day at the Statehouse in Topeka and toured the State Capi-





Feed efficiency getting attention in beef industry

ing cattle is causing producers to look for ways to improve the efficiency of the animals consuming expensive feed.

"The major cost in producing cattle is feed," says John Dhuyvetter, area livestock specialist at North Dakota State University's North Central Research Extension Center in Minot. "The high demand and price for corn and other commodities is raising finishing costs and devaluing feeder cattle. It's also impacting land use decisions, which puts inflationary pressure on pasture and forage costs."

Feed storage, processing, additives and delivery that minimize waste and maximize utilization are critical to improving efficiency, according to Dhuyvetter. He believes large economic impacts also might be possible through genetic improvements that make cattle more metabolically efficient in their use of feed. Research has identified heritable differences in cattle for feed efficiency.

'The amount of variation and potential savings are large, stimulating study and technology regarding how to measure and improve," he says.

Feed yards routinely have tracked pen feed conversion (pounds of feed consumed per pound of gain) as a key economic benchmark. However, feed intake never has been pushed widely as a genetic trait for several reasons. One is that measuring actual feed consumption for in-



dividual animals is difficult. Two, good conversions are favored by high feed intake in which maintenance energy needs are diluted over high average daily gains. Better feedlot conversion ratios are associated with higher growth rate and larger-sized cattle.

Feed intake soon may be a bigger factor in animal genetics, though. Some advancing technologies for measuring individual animal feed intake and expressing feed efficiency are moving the industry toward being able to select cattle that eat less while gaining the same, Dhuyvetter says.

This technology includes feed bunks with load-cell scales that continually weigh a feed tub accessed by one animal at a time. The tub has a reader to identify the animal by radio frequency ear tag and computerize the data accumulation to track what an individual animal eats while in the pen on the feeding trial.

Using the feed intake information to calculate a residual feed intake (RFI) identifies metabolic efficiency differences among animals independently of average daily gain and body size. RFI is defined as the difference between what an animal actually consumed and what was expected based on its growth and maintenance.

Testing groups of yearling bulls identifies animals with a negative RFI, which means they consumed less than expected for performance achieved, as well as positive RFI bulls, which consumed more feed than expected.

"This information can be utilized in the selection of bulls expected to sire calves with lower finishing feed costs and daughters with lower feed maintenance requirements," Dhuyvetter says.

In yearling bulls on feed tests, the variation is more than 5 pounds less feed per day for similar performance. Selection for low RFI could reduce cow herd maintenance requirements by up to 10 percent through time. Research also indicates selection for low RFI would lower methane emissions and reduce nutrients in manure.

A number of bull test-

including a couple of the largest test centers in the U.S. and Canada, have invested in the equipment to be able to measure RFI and evaluate bulls for feed efficiency. Additionally, several large seedstock breeders are measuring RFI on some of their best breeding prospects, and more and more land-grant universities are becoming set up to measure individual efficiency in larger groups of animals, which will contribute to more meaningful

A third factor - the discovery of several genetic markers related to an animal's ability to convert

research.

pact on improving efficien-

Because of the cost and complexity of measuring actual feed intake and calculating RFI, DNA profiling would be a much simpler means to evaluate a larger number of animals for their genetic ability to use feed more efficiently, Dhuyvetter says.

Current markers identify a portion of the variation in RFI, with the most favorably rated genotypes saving about 2.5 pounds of feed per day at similar gains, compared with the least favorable genotypes. For many breed populations, the practical range of variation that current

likely to be .5 to 1 pound.

"The economic potential from widespread improvement in feed efficiency is huge for the cattle industry," Dhuyvetter says. "At today's high grain and feed prices, the measurement, evaluation and application of improving feed efficiency are rightly receiving a lot of industry and academic attention."







KAMS has been helping farmers for 20 years

The Kansas Agricultural Mediation Services -KAMS - has been in the "help" business for 20 years.

Based at Kansas State University as part of K-State Research and Extension, KAMS works with farm and ranch families in a confidential manner to find information, connect to services or help resolve disputes that arise with USDA agencies, banks, suppliers and others.

"Our services are either free of charge or low-cost," said KAMS Mediation Coordinator Char Henton. "KAMS can also refer rural Kansans to a financial analyst who can help them determine their best course of action or to an attorney who specializes in agricultural issues.'

KAMS's focus is to help farm families discover options and alternatives and make informed choices, Henton said.

The program was initially funded by a U.S. Department of Agriculture startup grant awarded to 12 states in 1988

K-State works on parasitic weed could help reduce hunger in Africa

The grain sorghum research team at Kansas State University has been working to solve a serious food production problem in Africa — and the team now has a solution that could have a significant beneficial impact for many.

Striga, a parasitic weed, costs \$6 billion in crop damage every year in Africa, said Kassim Al-Khatib, K-State Research and Extension weed physiologist. The weed has huge impacts on food production and hunger because of the crop losses it causes, he said. K-State is involved in an international effort to eradicate Striga from African fields, and the results look promising.

"The flowering weed invades fields of sorghum and certain other crops. Underground, Striga parts connect to sorghum roots and feed on them. This dramatically reduces crop yield and sometimes destroys entire fields. African farmers have tried crop rotations and other simple strategies to control Striga, but nothing has worked," said Al- Khatib.

Grain sorghum is the major food crop for human consumption in East and West Africa, he said: "There are tens of millions of acres of grain sorghum produced for food in those regions. The grain is used for bread and

As part of their research, Al-Khatib and Mitch Tuinstra, former professor of agronomy at K-State and now at Purdue University began treating the seeds with an inexpensive, low-toxic herbicide.

"As the sorghum grows, the seed treatment will kill the Striga. All of these new technologies are being developed in Manhattan, and we are testing the seeds in Africa to select the right herbicide, rate, landrace, seed treatment, and other factors," explained Al-Khatib.

The treated seed currently is being tested in Mali and Niger with successful results, he added. "It has stirred up excitement because of its implications for reducing hunger in these areas. Testing will soon expand to other countries," he said.

Panelists debate ethanol, say careers abound for youth with ag background

While challenging times are ahead for U.S. agriculture due to cost increases from biofuel production and growing demand for U.S. agricultural products overseas, the future looks bright for young people who want careers in agriculture, said panelists at a March 11 forum hosted by the University of Missouri Collegiate Farm Bureau.

Leaders of Missouri agribusiness and government agreed on this point while debating the role of ethanol amid rising feed costs.

"As we discussed this year's forum topic, few other issues came up," said Scott Brown, MU agricultural economics professor and advisor to the student group. "The subject of animal I.D. tags came up, but

ethanol and food costs were more important."

Panelists were Tim Kelley, state executive director of the USDA's Farm Services Agency: Don Copenhaver, president and CEO of MFA; Don Nikodim, executive vice president of the Missouri Pork Association; and state Sen. Bill Stouffer of Napton.

"We like to have a broad spectrum of speakers and views," said Katie Jarboe, vice president of the MU Collegiate Farm Bureau. "Biofuels seemed like a natural topic."

Panelists shared views on how ethanol and rising costs affect their industries. They disagreed on the role ethanol should have in Missouri's economy, but all agreed that U.S. agriculture always worried before about the supply side but no so much about demand. This year we had a bumper crop," Kelley said. "I think what we're seeing is a different situation in agriculture than we've ever seen in my time or your grandfather's time."

He said the record overseas demand, as well as high feed costs, might be hard to deal with, but the prospect of new world markets was "exciting to think

Representatives of Missouri's livestock industry voiced more ambivalence. While grain farmers reap the benefits of strong export

struggle to cope with rising costs of feed and other essential farm goods, Copenhaver and Nikodim.

"If you're a grain farmer, you're pretty happy," Copenhaver said. "But with input costs going up, this affects me as a livestock farmer. We're getting hit with increased fertilizer costs, as well as food and fuel costs."

As a farmer-owned cooperative that supplies farm goods like fertilizer and livestock feed but also buys grain, MFA is caught in the middle, Copenhaver said. Farm suppliers must double or triple their profit

staying in business.

Missouri hog farmers use an average of one-third of the corn produced in the state, Nikodim said. With corn prices near \$6 per bushel, he said, many hog producers are losing \$35 to \$40 per head.

"We're moving a lot of pork through the system. But 60 to 80 percent of our costs are on feed - that's a lot of red ink," he said. "The bottom line is we're in a time of tremendous change."

Nikodim expects continued high demand because few places in the world export corn and China and India are consuming more

None of the panelists disputed that ethanol is a factor in the rising costs of food and farm commodities. But they all said ethanol is only partly the cause.

"I wish ethanol and biodiesel were half as influential as everyone thinks," Stouffer said. "We're seeing a lot of disruptions and everyone wants to blame ethanol, but that's only part of the reason. This is bigger than just ethanol. Whenever the dollar is low, all commodities are higher."

Copenhaver said hedge fund traders who invest in gas, corn and wheat are also

to blame for rising costs. "They're tying up huge amounts of cash. Now they own twice the amount of wheat that we own in the United States," he said.

Stouffer believes ethanol has a positive impact on rural economies by holding gas prices down by 50 cents per gallon. "Overall, the rural economy is much better than it was leading up to this time," he said.

Jim Spain, MU vice provost for undergraduate studies, moderated questions to the panel. The audience asked about ethanol's impact on grocery prices,

the environment, and how young people could work as farmers with the current economic outlook.

"With an agriculture background, the future is unlimited," Stouffer said. "And it's not just limited to production agriculture. Genetics especially is an unlimited field, and people will seek you out."

Being open-minded is key, the panelists agreed. While there will still be opportunity on the production side, youth must avoid a narrow focus on it. "The future looks good," Nikodim said. "There's a world of opportunities out there - it's just different than we had in the past."

Approximately school children and educators from across the Kansas City metropolitan area will learn where their food comes from while attending a pizza party, Tuesday, March 25. This event, which is part of the 2008 bi-state observance of National Agriculture Day will be held at the National Agricultural Center and Hall of Fame in

Bonner Springs. Students and educators will begin the day rotating through stations focused on explaining each pizza ingredient — dairy, meat, vegeta-

arcass event open to producers

Anyone who produces a crop of at least 38 calves from registered Angus bulls can again put them to the test in a national contest. The 2008 Angus-Source Carcass Challenge (ASCC) opens in April as the latest in a long tradition of proving Angus genetics in the feedlot and packing plant.

Sara Moyer, Director of AngusSource for the American Angus Association®, said the contest will operate exclusively through Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB)-licensed feedlots. "Those who want to enter cattle for April or later harvest in CAB plants should contact their CAB feedlot," Moyer said. "The feedlots may obtain entry forms through the CAB supply development office or AngusSource. There is no entry fee." The ASCC has evolved from earlier CAB contests such as the Value Discovery Project, Best of the Breed and most recently, the National Angus Carcass Challenge (2003-06). "CAB welcomes the opportunity to continue working with Angus producers to help showcase their best efforts," said Mark McCully, supply development direcmust be enrolled in Angus-Source at the ranch of origin and fed in a CABlicensed feedyard. The 38 calves can be steers, heifers or a mixed-sex group. They can come from multiple operations, but all must be harvested in one lot, and prizes will be awarded to the feeder and owner based on documented Angus genetics that hit the Certified Angus Beef ® (CAB®) brand target.

The contest aims to promote the value of feeding high-percentage Angus cattle. AngusSource, a USDA Process Verified Program (PVP), was developed in October, 2005 for Angus-sired calves. The program, which enrolled nearly 100,000 calves last year, verifies source, age and a minimum of 50% Angus genetics.

"Through the USDA PVP, AngusSource calves are eligible for the age verification premiums offered by many packers," Moyer said. "But the real value is in the genetics. 



As researchers learn to help farmers manage more about the soybean genome, U.S. soybean farmers reap the benefits. That's why farmer-leaders from the American Soybean Association (ASA) and United Soybean Board (USB) and soybean checkoff commit time, energy and resources to advancing soybean research. To keep the momentum going, the soybean checkoff is funding a new genomics project that will open a new world of possibilities in improving soybean varieties.

Farmer-leaders with USB and ASA have met with U.S. Department of Agriculture-Agricultural Research Service (USDA-ARS) officials and are encouraged about the possibility of additional help in funding this project. ASA helps to secure Federal funding for soybean yield, genomics and disease research. USB invests checkoff funding in projects yield-robbing diseases and pests and to improve soybean composition. Having all three organizations contributing to the success of this project will be essential for further success.

"This genomics project will greatly aid soybeanbreeding efforts," says Ike Boudreaux, USB chairman and soybean farmer from Lebeau, La. "Ultimately, improved varieties will be available to farmers much faster. Our friends at ASA and USDA are playing critical roles in making this type of research a reality for farmers. The checkoff will also play a significant role in not only helping fund research, but relaying valuable information about new discoveries to farmers.'

With funding from the soybean checkoff, USDA-ARS scientists will analyze each of the nearly 20,000 lines in the USDA-ARS sovbean germplasm collection and will be identifying approximately 50,000 Single Nucleotide Polymorphism (SNP) genetic markers for each line. Examples of SNPs include markers for rust resistance or for improved oil composition. The entire USDA-ARS germplasm collection is expected to be analyzed in three years.

By mapping more SNP genetic markers, plant breeders can work more efficiently to determine the location of genes controlling seed quality, disease and stress resistance. The additional mapped SNP markers will not only enable a more precise assembly of the sequenced genome, genome will be more accurately anchored to the phys-

these actions should result in improved tools for soybean breeders and should lead to quicker, more efficient development of new soybean varieties to meet the changing needs of the market.

"ASA has long recognized the importance of public research in improving soybean yields," says John Hoffman, ASA president and soybean farmer from Waterloo, Iowa. "This joint partnership between ASA, USDA and USB is a significant step forward in nering appropriations of \$40 million annually for soybean research. Leveraging checkoff dollars and federal appropriations is important





Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

Spring Vegetable Planting

Lately, I have been giving talks on container vegetable gardening. This is an option for someone with limited space. As long as there is some sunlight available, vegetables can be grown on the front step, back porch or balcony. One advantage of container gardening is that you can plant on your terms and not on the weather's.

St. Patrick's Day has come and gone and my potatoes are still in the basement. It has been too cold and wet to get in the garden. It is better to wait than work in the garden when the soil is wet. In the long run, the

maturing crop will only be a day or two behind anyway.

I purchased mostly small potatoes that won't need cut. The seed potato needs to be about 2 ounces in size. Golf ball size is about right. Cut larger potatoes two to three days ahead of planting so that the cut ends will suberize (seal over) to prevent rot.

Potatoes are planted 12 inches apart in rows 3 feet apart. Usually, the seed piece is planted no more than 2 inches deep. If it stays wet, shallower may be better. As the new potatoes develop, they will need shaded to prevent them

from turning green. Pulling loose soil over them is common way to shade the potato. I have some straw left over from covering the strawberries which will work for the potatoes as

Hopefully, it will dry out to get some other vegetables planted. Peas, radish, broccoli, cabbage, lettuce, and spinach are a few we like to grow. All of these crops can be planted in containers if it stays too wet. However, it would take a lot of containers of peas to make a mess for a meal.

You're welcome to stop-

by the office and get a copy of the container vegetable gardening brochure. While you're in, look over the other vegetable gardening publications titles. They are on our website as well.

Vegetables are plentiful from our local markets. Growing your own gives a feeling of accomplishment. It will connect you with nature and the land. Purchasing vegetables from the store can be a weekly experience. Digging and eating a new potato is only a spring and fall experience. I hope vou don't miss out.

Field day to demonstrate solar water pumping for livestock

Greg and Mary Kropf and their family operate a pasture-based dairy operation five miles West of Harris. Over the past two years, the family has installed two solar water pumping systems to provide water to their 100-head dairy while they are out to pasture. By utilizing the pasture, the cattle are often long distances away, where the rural water is unavailable. Ponds are available although dairymen understand the hazards of allowing lactating cows access to a pond. The Kropfs decided to pump the water from the ponds to tanks for the cattle to drink.

On April 5, at 12:30 p.m Sunrise Dairy will host a field day to demonstrate how they have incorporated the solar watering systems into their operation. The two solar water pumping systems use different styles of intake from two different ponds, which use two different styles of pumps. The dairy even uses two styles of delivery systems; one system is for non-freezing conditions, while the other system has a buried pipeline. Both watering systems work well, provided the sun will shine.

We welcome you to visit, view and ask questions about the installations at the farm located at 1986 Xeric Rd NE, Westphalia. The field day will begin at 12:30 p.m. with a description of the pasture based dairy followed by stops at each of the solar pumping sites. These systems must work rain or shine. The event will be held rain or shine.

All interested parties should plan to attend. There is no fee to attend. We need to be finished by 2:30 p.m. when the cows think it is time to again be milked.

Additional wildlife habitat funds available

The one month extension of the 2002 Farm Bill is allowing the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) to offer additional funds to landowners interested in the Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program (WHIP). The NRCS accepts applications on a continuous basis. Applications received now through April 1, 2008, will be considered for funding.

"This is a short timeline but it will allow interested landowners to apply for the program," said Astor F. Boozer, NRCS Acting State Conservationist for Kansas. "Approximately \$150,000 is available statewide. Interested landowners should contact their local NRCS to apply by April 1."

The WHIP offers the financial and technical assistance for the development of habitat, for both wildlife and fisheries, on private or tribal lands. Priority is given to applications that benefit declining species. The

The NRCS identified the following priorities for the Kansas WHIP plan: Grassland birds with emphasis on bobwhite quail, ring-neck pheasant, and prairie chicken (lesser and greater); threatened and endangered (T&E) species and species in need of conservation (SINC), and natural communities to include prairies, wetlands, and riparian areas.

"During the last 10 years in Kansas, we have written over 1,000 WHIP contracts to improve more than 151,000 acres so these are very small parcels but vital to wildlife," said Boozer.

# Energy, farm prices protect West, Midwest states from recession

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) - Rising energy costs have been cited as one factor pushing the nation toward recession, but those same increases are keeping some state economies strong.

Central states and those in the West with large stakes in oil, gas, minerals and corn — the main ingredient in ethanol — have avoided the economic downturn that threatens tax revenues elsewhere.

Montana and New Mexico expect oil revenue to remain strong and Wyoming, the nation's leading coalproducing state, projects its energy production revenue will increase a savings fund to \$4 billion by 2010.

In Alaska, oil and gas revenue could produce a \$5 billion surplus over two years.

Ernest Goss, a professor of economics at Creighton University in Nebraska, said there's no doubt that some states with energy reserves will maintain robust economies.

'Not only are they weathering the recession, it just isn't hitting them," Goss said.

Many Midwestern states expect to ride out the economic slump without severely cutting spending.

South Dakota, Nebraska, Kansas and Iowa are insulated somewhat from serious impact because farmers are on a spending spree. Goss said. They expect the ethanol boom, which has driven corn and soybean

"Auto and truck dealerships are selling trucks to farmers like crazv." Goss said. Additionally, Midwestern states hadn't come to depend on new home construction and rising real estate prices as sources of tax revenue. The declines in the housing sector are adding to the financial problems in many states.

"This part of the country is weathering the recession much better and the reasons are the very good farm income, alternative energy production and finally the housing downturn has had not nearly the impact here."

shielding some states in the South, including Mississippi. North Carolina and West Virginia, where state budgets are expected to have surpluses or at the least remain

States such as Washington and Oregon are benefiting from their ports, where products like high technology goods, transportation equipment and parts for other products continue to move to emerging markets in China and India, said Tom Fullerton, an economics professor at the University of Texas at El Paso. A weak dollar also could help drive demand for U.S. prod-

Although about half the

states are reporting they will run a surplus or will balance the next year's budget with little pain, Fullerton and others cautioned them against being too optimistic.

Fullerton recommended that states with large reserves consider spending more to repair roads and bridges, a move that would improve the infrastructure and boost the regional econ-

"For those states who

have taken the time to build up contingency funds, 2008 is probably a good year to take advantage of those funds and spend them down," he said.

The economic news is not unwaveringly optimistic in the central United States. Michael A. Lipsman, an economic analyst for the state of Iowa, said a deep recession would hurt even a strong state economy.

"If things really go south, there's no way we can es-

A February survey from supply managers and business leaders in nine Midwest and Plains states showed the lowest confidence in the economy since 2000, just before the last recession began.

The survey, led by Goss at Creighton, said business leaders are seeing higher costs for raw materials and supplies and anticipate job losses through the middle of


