Climatologist explains 'sun dogs' phenomenon

Just as the sun is rising or setting on a hazy day, watchers can sometimes see an unusual, strangelooking phenomenon.

"The sun will appear to have had pups: smaller reddish-orange spots that are nestled up close on either side," said climatologist Mary Knapp. "Called sun dogs, these bright spots can't show up on clear or cloud-covered days. They need just the right kind and amount of haze which is why being able to

see them is a fairly rare occurrence." Sun dogs are just sun-

light, reflected off ice crystals in the atmosphere, said Knapp, who as the state climatologist oversees the Kansas Weather Data Library, based at Kansas State.


"They're not that different from a ring around the sun or moon," Knapp said. "If you're lucky, though, you may get to see sun dogs' most unique forms - a pillar or even a cross.

"As you can imagine, early humans thought those forms looked a bit scary."

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Research 'N' Review By Joel DeRouchey

With spring calving and bull buying season approaching for many producers; genetic selection planning should be on the forefront of their minds. In order to determine the genetic influences on calving ease, the U.S. Meat Animal Research Center at Clay Center, Neb., studied selection for calving ease in four purebred and three composite groups. All of the cattle involved were of British and/or Continental breeding.

The study was conducted over seven years, producing almost 9,000 calves from 586 sires. In the purebred groups, replacement males and females were selected to increase yearling weight and maternal effects on weaning weight. In the composite groups, replacements were selected to stabilize yearling and maternal weaning weight effects. Within each of the seven breed-type groups, two lines were formed, called control and calving ease. In all control lines, birth weight was kept in proportion to yearling weight in order to stabilize calving difficulty. But in the calving ease lines, replacements were selected for calving ease, based on subjective calving difficulty score (1=no assistance, 7=cesarean).

Genetic Effects: By the end of the study, 1.56 generations of selection had occurred. In the calving ease line, estimated breeding value (EBV) for calving ease had decreased by 1.06 calving-difficulty scores and was accompanied by decreased EBV of 7.7 lb for birth weight. There were no

significant differences between the lines in change of EBV for any other traits. In the purebreds, EBV for yearling weight increased by an average of 50 lb.

Phenotypic Effects: Over seven years, calving ease lines averaged 3.0 days earlier calving, 1.8 days shorter gestation, 6.6 lb lighter birth weight, and 0.8 calving-difficulty lower score with 19.8% fewer assisted births in two-yearold heifers. (There were no differences in assisted births between calving ease and control in threeyear-old and older cows). Calving ease averaged 7.0 lb higher preweaning gain so, coupled with lower average birth weight of 6.6 lb, weaning weight did not differ from control and yearling weight also did not differ. As yearlings, calving ease heifers averaged about 0.3 inches shorter at the hip. Pelvic areas did not differ between calving ease and control.

The authors concluded that genetic selection for calving ease EBV can be effective in reducing twoyear-old heifer calving difficulty and calving assistance while maintaining or increasing yearling weight.

There has been some indication that feeding in the evening can affect when calving occurs, thus reducing the need to frequently check heifers at night. Kansas State University and Oregon State University researchers collaborated to study this topic.

western Idaho were full-fed alfalfa hay or oat silage every day between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. beginning two months before calving began. For 5 years, Hereford x Angus and Angus x Brahman spring-calving cows located in western Kansas were full fed sorghum hay every day between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. beginning two weeks before calving began.

Distribution of calving in the morning-fed herd was very uniform. From 15 to 18 percent of cows calved during each four-hour period of the day. But in the afternoon-fed herd, approximately 85% of calvings occurred from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Also, in this herd there was less variation over years in time of calving for a particular cow. In both herds. there was a tendency for daughters to give birth at a similar time of day that her dam gave birth. The authors concluded that feeding time affects calving time and can be used as a management practice by producers.

Five-year terms for registration proposed

The USDA's Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration (GIPSA) proposes to amend the regulations under the Packers and Stockyards (P&S) Act regarding the registration of market agencies and dealers. Under the proposed rule, persons registered as dealers or market agencies under the P&S Act would be registered for five-year terms. Upon expiration of the five-year term, registrants would be required to renew their registration. Under the proposed regulation, a registration that is not renewed in a timely manner would expire after five years.

The proposed rule will allow GIPSA to maintain more accurate records and be more effective and efficient in enforcing the P&S Act. When applying for registration, the applicant must certify that its financial condition meets the P&S Act's requirements, list its type of business organization, whether it will operate on a calendar year or fiscal year basis, and identify the character of its business and the species of livestock it will handle. Under current regulations, if a registration is granted it is effective indefinitely. Requiring registration renewal would give GIPSA periodic updates on whether entities are still operating and the type of operation being conducted. This will enable GIPSA to better manage the oversight of its pool of regulated entities.

The proposed rule was published in the Dec. 16, 2008, Federal Register. GIPSA is accepting public comments received by Feb. 17, 2009. Additional information is available in GIPSA's Federal Register notice.

The P&S Act is a fair trade practice and payment protection law that promotes fair and competitive marketing environments for the livestock, meat, and poultry indus-

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The biotechnology industry remains firmly opposed to the labeling of food products as "biotechfree" or "genetically engineered-free." Such labels wrongly plant the idea with consumers that biotech food products are inferior or pose a health threat, Bill Olson, director of federal government affairs for the Biotechnology Industry Organization. told Farm Bureau members at an issues conference at the American Farm Bureau Federation's 90th annual meeting.

"A non-GE label leads consumers to believe there is a difference between GE products and those produced by traditional methods. There is no difference," Olson em-All biotech phasized. food products on the market have gone through a rigorous regulatory

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process that ensures they are safe for humans, animals and the environment.

The Food and Drug Administration requires that nutrition information appear on most foods, and any claims on food products must be truthful and not misleading. Special labels are not required for biotech products. Labels identifying food as biotech- or GE-free are allowed, which frustrates BIO because the group believes such labels are misleading.

"The labeling debate last year focused on biotech and cloned animals - two distinct things," Olson said. None of the bills introduced in Congress or state legislatures in 2008 became law, and while the new Congress and incoming administration have other priorities,

Olson expects the issue to resurface He said the biotech in-

dustry is optimistic that as consumers more fully grasp the benefits of biotechnology, such as producing drought- and cold-tolerant crops and minimizing the environmental impact of farming, they will embrace the technology. Ultimately, it will come down to what must be done to feed, clothe and fuel a booming global population. The number of people in the world is increasing, but the amount of crop and grazing land is not.

"The food labeling debate will continue, but we believe science is on our side and American agriculture must continue to meet the needs of an everexpanding population," Olson said. "Food security will come through scientific and technological advances."

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He also noted that studies have shown that while consumers may say they prefer food to be labeled according to whether it was produced with biotechnology or not, that does not translate into action at the retail level.

After record U.S. grain exports in 2008, organizations that focus on spurring the flow of U.S. grain abroad will be looking at a few more challenges this year, according to a grain industry official who spoke during the American Farm Bureau Federation's 90th annual meeting.

According to Shannon Schaffer. director of membership for the U.S. Grains Council, a non-profit organization focused on expanding demand and building global markets for America's feed grains, this year's global market dynamics substantial chal-'pose lenges regarding exports."

Feed grains exports in 2008 largely surpassed 2007 numbers. U.S. corn exports totaled 59.9 million metric tons (2.36 billion bushels), up 300 million bushels from last year. U.S. sorghum ex-

ports totaled 6.1 million tons (240 million bushels), nearly doubling from 2007's 3.3 millions tons (129 million bushels). However, the Agriculture Department projects fiscal 2009 exports for coarse grains lower at 51.6 million tons, nearly 17 million tons below last year. Schaffer said due to

tough competition in global markets, the kind of handson international market development for U.S. ag products offered by organizations such as USGC will be more important this year.

"The U.S. Grains Council's top priority is increasing profitability for U.S. farmers and we will not let a gloomy 2009 forecast stand in our way," Schaffer said . "We will work with livestock and poultry industries overseas to expand capacity and increase the need for feed ingredients."

Given the tough competition U.S. farmers face from an abundant and affordable supply of feed wheat from Russia, the European Union and Ukraine this year, Schaffer said his organization will focus on marketing U.S. supplies of the ethanol co-product, distiller's dried grains with solubles.

"We see it (distiller's dried grains) as an ingredient most likely to compete with feed wheat from a price perspective," Schaffer said. "Now is the time to work with our members to secure the presence of U.S. barley, corn, sorghum and their co-products in the global marketplace.'

K-State specialist offers tips to tackle credit cards

Working to retire debt can put more money in your pocket to help build an emergency fund, add to savings and retirement accounts, and pay for occasional extras such as a vacation or home improvement, a Kansas State University specialist said.

With the average U.S. household now carrying \$8,000 — or more — in credit card debt, making even the minimum payment each month can leave overextended card holders feeling strapped and short on cash to cover necessities, said Carol Young, K-State **Research and Extension fi**nancial management specialist.

Her tips to reduce – and eliminate — credit card debt include:

Put the credit card(s) away at home. If carrying a

credit card, you'll be tempted to use it. Review current debt, bal-

ance due, the interest rate on each account, and minimum monthly payment. Contact the card company and try to negotiate a

lower interest rate to make monthly payments cover more of the amount due. Or, if carrying more debt on multiple cards (or from multiple sources) than you can handle, consult a reputable debt management specialist to determine a payment plan designed for you to pay off the loan (In Kansas, check http://www.debtadvice.org/takethefirststep/locator.cfm to find the locations of nearby organizations that are members of the National Foundation for Credit Counseling.)

Paying with a credit card can be convenient, but charging more that can be reasonably paid off at the end of the month often is troublesome, Young said.



Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone **Growing Big Onions**

December is filled with much anticipation. For some, January may seem like a letdown of sorts. A gardener flips over the calendar and sees the start of another growing season. For me, January is filled with just as much anticipation

If you like to start seeds indoors, January is full of activity. Many annuals are started now to get them big enough for planting in the garden this spring. Pentas, pansies, alyssum, and rose moss are started in January

Starting asparagus and onion from seed indoors

need to be planted soon. Onion seeds are started in mid to late January to have them ready for planting outdoors by late March. Onion seeds are planted in a container filled with a moist seeding mix. For quick germination, the container is place where the temperature is 75 to 80 degrees. After the onions begin to grow, place them under a fluorescent light with the light bulbs just above the onion plants in a place that is 60 to 65 degrees.

The biggest onion is a class that the Riley County 4-H youth can enter at this

year's county fair. Early planting, frequent watering and fertilizer is needed to grow the biggest onions. Growing them in full sun would also be necessary.

Getting the onions to grow fast is needed to get the biggest onion. The onion varieties we mostly plant are long day varieties. That means that the onion starts to form the bulb when there is about 14 hours of light per day. This occurs around the first part of May. The bigger onion plants by that time will make the biggest bulbs.

An onion has a short

and shallow root system. It will require light and frequent watering and fertilizer. This is particularly important from planting in late March to the start of bulb formation in early May. Frequent watering promotes weeds and they need to be removed so that the onion gets all the water, fertilizer and available sunlight.

Frostbite a threat when temps fall Frostbite is a winter hazard most people associate with mountain climbing or Arctic excursions, but it can happen in Kansas, as well, said State of Kansas Climatologist Mary Knapp

"The term `frostbite' actually refers to frozen tissue, which can develop during any outdoor winter activity," said Knapp, who directs the Kansas Weather Data Library at Kansas State University. "Children are at greater risk, both because they lose body heat more quickly and because they do not notice the signs in the midst of winter fun." Frostbite is characterized by white, waxy skin that is hard to the touch. It requires immediate medical attention, she said.

Frostnip is an early warning sign for frostbite. It usually affects areas exposed to the cold, plus extremities such as fingers and toes, Knapp said. Frostnip shows up as white, numb spots, and usually can be treated at home.

"The steps are to get indoors, remove wet clothing, and gently warm the affected area in warm — not hot – water until feeling is restored," she said. "Be careful about the water temperature, though. Numbed parts won't be able to detect water that is too hot, so can easily be burned."

One of the fears that traders had coming into the first week of trading in 2009 was that we would see more Index Fund liquidation due to rebalancing. This was especially the case in the corn where large liquidation was expected to take place. So far the grain markets have done pretty well in 2009. The corn was definitely the poor performer of the week, but was only slightly lower. The livestock markets on the other hand did not fair very well and much of that weakness may be attributed to Index fund liquidation. When we get next week's Commitment of Traders report, we should be able to see if that was the case or not.

Monday we had a number of reports out and were inundated with fresh fundamental information. Corn numbers were negative. Production was higher due to higher acreage and yield. Ending stocks were higher due to higher production and lower feed, food and industrial, and ethanol usage as well as lower exports. There was nothing positive about the numbers at all. Ending stocks at 1.790 billion is up from a year ago and could have a major impact on planting decisions this spring. The initial downside target for the March corn this week is the \$3.80 - \$3.85 area

The wheat numbers were mixed. Ending stocks were higher at 655 million bushels due to a cut in feed usage, but the winter wheat seedings figure came in well below expectations at 42.098 million. That is very friendly to the new crop and makes spring weather all the more critical. Wheat will likely follow the corn and soybeans lower. but the wheat certainly doesn't have to follow too closely and the wheat, especially the new crop, has a chance of separating from the other markets.

The soybean numbers were mostly negative. Production and ending stocks were both raised and the crush estimate was cut. The only positive factor was that the export estimate was increased by 50 million. The fact that corn ending stocks are higher than a year ago is probably the most negative factor because it implies that there is no need to expand corn acreage next year, therefore many traders will look for soybean acres to increase.

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Economist sees lower crop prices in 2009

Farm income hit a record high in 2008 due in part to record prices for corn, soybeans and wheat, but an economist speaking at a crop outlook seminar at the American Farm Bureau's 90th annual meeting said farmers can expect lower prices this year.

Jim Sullivan, an agricultural economist and senior vice president of Informa Economics in Washington. D.C., said the global recession will mean weakening demand for corn. sovbeans and wheat this year. For corn, the only strong driver for demand will be ethanol while biodiesel will be the top demand driver for soybeans.

"Last year was a good year for U.S. farms, but declining prices cloud the 2009 horizon. Volatility is still there, and we will see declining prices from last summer's highs," Sullivan said.

"The only demand increase we can expect to see for corn this year and next year will be corn used for ethanol," he explained. In 2008, 30 percent of total U.S.

corn production went to ethanol while it represented 35 percent of total domestic use. In 2009, ethanol is expected to climb to 34 percent of U.S. production and 38 percent of domestic use. Sullivan sees a "decent" supply of soybeans in the United States and worldwide this year. The economist expects soybean prices, like corn prices, to be down in 2009. For wheat, there is an excess supply both in the United States and worldwide. "We will see stocks build for wheat, which should mean lower U.S. winter wheat plantings," Sullivan said.

One bright spot of the weak global economy for farmers is that fertilizer prices are coming down from last summer's record highs. Continued price softening is expected, and Sullivan encouraged farmers to delay their fertilizer purchases.

Cotton farmers can expect another challenging year in 2009, according to Sharon Johnson, senior cotton analyst with First Capitol Group in Atlanta, who also addressed the seminar. "Cotton prices are under significant pressure as consumption and trade are negatively impacted," Johnson said.

The global recession is weakening demand for cotton products. "Nobody is going to the stores, and they're certainly not buying many cotton items," Johnson said.

The past few years have been tough for cotton producers. In 2007 and 2008. world cotton consumption declined by its largest percentage in 65 years.

Cotton acreage has been losing to corn acreage since 2006. For 2009. cotton acreage will also be impacted by input costs, versus competing crops and credit availability.

For 2009, Johnson projects cotton acreage at 8.3 million acres with harvested acres at 7.8 million acres. She sees a potential yield of 860 pounds per acre, indicating a crop forecast of 14 million bales with a range of 12 million to 15 million bales.

Plants can remove indoor air pollutants

Overwintering plants indoors may improve air quality in your home during the long, chilly months, said a University of Missouri horticulturist.

"Research has found that plants can be very useful in absorbing harmful pollutants," said Mary Kroening.

During photosynthesis, plants take in carbon dioxide from the atmosphere and release oxygen. In doing so, they can remove harmful chemicals, including benzene, formaldehyde, which is found in almost all indoor environments, and trichloroethylene.

The roots and plant tissue degrade the pollutants. Studies indicate that potting soil and microorganisms in the soil play a role in removing pollutants from the air, Kroening said.

NASA found that living plants were efficient at absorbing contaminants in space stations, she said.

Modern homes and office buildings are better insulated and sealed than older buildings, so they trap more air, allowing contaminants to accumulate, she said.

Several plants are particularly good at absorbing contaminants. These include English ivy, spider plants, devil's ivy, peace lily, Chinese evergreen, bamboo and a variety of philodendrons and dracaena.
