

With record crop prospects, growers believe plenty of corn for all

Kansas corn producers are expected to harvest a record 518 million bushel corn crop this year as part of the nation's 13 billion harvest. The projected US harvest will just about tie the record 2007 harvest of 13.1 billion bushels. Farmers continue to prove they can meet the needs of their customers, according to Kansas Corn Growers Association Executive Director Jere White.

"What is interesting is that in 2008, the year of the so-called corn shortage, we produced 12.1 billion bushels which at the time was the second largest crop in history," White said said. "So in the last three years, we are seeing the three largest corn crops in history in the United States."

The 2009 U.S. corn crop is expected to have an average yield of 162 bushels per acre, a record yield. Kansas Corn Commission Chairman Mike Brzon of Courtland pointed out that farmers are using improved technology and growing practices to

produce more corn per acre.

"I wish people would look at the great advances we have made in agriculture that allow us to grow more corn on fewer acres and at the same time substantially reduce our use of fertilizers and pesticides, and we've reduced erosion as well," Brzon said. "We don't seem to get credit for any of that."

In 2008, many predicted a corn shortage, and some groups called for a stop in the use of corn for ethanol to prevent the shortage. Corn-based ethanol was blamed for sharp spikes in consumer food prices. Markets joined the clamor, with speculators raising the price of corn near \$8 per bushel for a short time in the summer of 2008. That fall, corn producers harvested the second largest crop in history, and ended the year with a significant corn carry-over of 1.7 billion bushels.

"Many special interest groups have found that fear is the best weapon," White said. "Last year, anti-ethanol

groups used fear to attack corn producers and the ethanol industry blaming ethanol for a fictitious corn shortage. In the end, it was corn's customers as well as consumers who were hurt by speculators who bought into the fear and elevated crop prices to record levels."

Higher prices across the board were blamed on corn and ethanol last year. The AMC movie theater chain blamed an increase in ticket prices on higher popcorn costs.

"You can imagine the markup on popcorn at a movie theater when you pay more than \$5 for a bag of popcorn. That was simply a bogus excuse," White said. "But what concerns me is that while commodity prices have dropped dramatically, consumer food prices have not dropped that much. Last year food prices increased 5.1 percent and food companies blamed corn and ethanol while they pocketed record profits. They were in a hurry to raise the prices,

but seem a little slower to lower them even at a time when consumers are suffering through a recession."

The Kansas Corn Commission was one of several corn grower groups that created the Corn Farmers Coalition, a national effort to provide accurate information about corn farming. The Corn Farmers Coalition used information from credible sources like the US Department of Agriculture to make sure decision-makers in Washington, DC and others were well informed about today's corn production.

"I don't think people understand how much farming has changed especially in the last 10 years. Just like any business, technology has made us so much more efficient," Brzon said. "Last year we had floods in some isolated areas and people thought the corn crop was doomed. This year, we had late planting and a cool growing season in many

areas. By overcoming these adversities with near record results, we are proving that our growers can provide a reliable supply of corn for all of our customers year after year."

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The September Supply and Demand Report came out almost exactly as expected. USDA is now projecting a record US corn yield of 161.9 bu./ac. and a near record soybean yield of 42.3 bu./ac. It seems like as soon as the August Supply and Demand report was out traders were already talking about the probability of seeing a record high corn yield estimate in the September report. With no threatening weather for the past month and with crop conditions not making their normal seasonal decline, a yield increase had to be expected. A record corn yield estimate is bearish, but the rest of the numbers in the report weren't all that bad. USDA increased the feed usage estimate and the export estimate which put total demand at a new record high of 13.025 billion bushels. The increase in demand also meant that the ending stocks estimate only grew by 14 million bushels to 1.635 billion, which is still below last year. So, if all the current estimates are correct, we will have a record yield, but less corn at the end of the year. That isn't terribly bearish considering the current price level. As long as

the yield estimate doesn't go up next month, the worst the December corn will probably do is test last year's low of \$2.90. If Informa is right and we end up at 168, well, then we are going to \$2.60, but we will also probably set a record for exports and the ethanol industry will be printing money. Right now, a bounce back to the \$3.30 level in the December corn is a definite selling opportunity.

The soybean report had several interesting changes and non-changes. Old crop exports were increased to a new record high of 1.280 billion and there was a corresponding cut in residual usage so that ending stocks were left unchanged. New crop exports were also increased to 1.280 billion and crush was increased by 20 million bushels, which was nearly enough to offset the yield increase. Ending stocks increased by 10 million to 220 million bushels. 220 million is a more than comfortable level of ending stocks, but since we have already sold nearly half of the export estimate there is a strong possibility that the export estimate will continue to grow. The strong demand

gives the soybean market good upside potential once we get past harvest. That is especially true if USDA's yield estimate happens to be too high. After all, we have to keep in mind that crop development is behind normal and the skeptics keep pointing out that the crops are still way behind on growing degree units. The problem is that we need to get past harvest and find out what the yield really is and if the demand is going to keep up, so in the mean time look for more pressure in the soybeans.

There were no changes to any of the wheat numbers, but I would look for a few next month. Unless the export market improves there will probably be a cut in the export estimate. I also think there is still potential for a production increase sometime in between now and the January report. There is little positive news to report in the wheat other than the facts that the market is very oversold and due for a correction and the wheat posted a reversal higher on the charts Friday. There is typically

some follow through after a move like that, so I look for some strength in the wheat next week. However, I think the strength will create a better opportunity to sell call options.

Ark. Sen. Lincoln new head of Senate ag committee

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (AP) — U.S. Sen. Blanche Lincoln was picked to head the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry on Wednesday, making her the first woman to serve as the panel's leader.

The Arkansas Democrat will take over for Sen. Tom Harkin, D-Iowa. Lincoln has served on the Senate committee since January 1999. When she was a congresswoman, Lincoln served on the House Agriculture Committee from 1993-1995.

"As a seventh-generation Arkansan and farmer's

daughter, I know my father is smiling down on me today," Lincoln said.

She said implementing the federal farm bill and ending the Cuba trade embargo are among the top issues facing the panel.

"I've always supported opening up trade with Cuba, and I'll continue to do so. I can't single-handedly make it happen as chairman of the committee," she said, adding that she would do her best to keep the issue front and center.

Lincoln said the committee has always been a top choice for her during her time in Congress.

"As the chairman, I'm going to again enjoy an elevated opportunity to really help our state, and that's exactly what I'll be aiming to do," she said.

Farm advocates in her home state praised the move, saying they hoped it would increase the state's clout on agricultural issues.

"Agriculture is the largest industry in our state," said Randy Veach, president of the Arkansas Farm Bureau. "Her being in that position gives us an opportunity to keep agriculture financially sound and stable."

Lincoln said she ended up first in line for the job because other more senior senators — Sens. Max Baucus, Kent Conrad and Patrick Leahy — already serve as chairmen of other committees.

"The ag committee is a very old committee, and it's also a very senior committee in the sense that most of the members have been on

there for quite some time, and that means there's not a lot of turnover in terms of chairmanship," she said.

In a conference call with reporters Wednesday, Lincoln downplayed the notion that the new role would make her more politically powerful as she runs for re-election next year.

"I fully expect there'll be many challengers out there. It's kind of the season for that, I suppose," she said.

Six Republicans have announced bids for Lincoln's seat, and state Senate President Bob Johnson says he's considering challenging her in the Democratic primary. Lincoln has more than \$3.2 million cash on hand for her re-election bid.

Arkansas Republican Party Chairman Doyle Webb said he wasn't optimistic that Lincoln would be able to help farmers in the new position, accusing the Democratic senator of not standing firm against President Barack Obama.

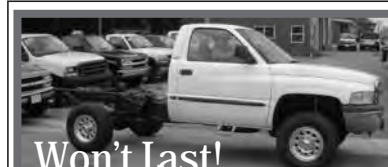

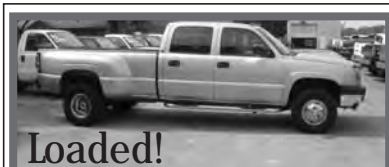

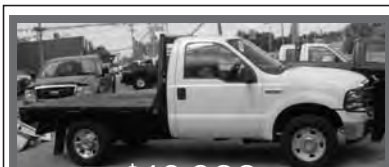

Ag finance counselors advice: Start early, get help

A segment of agriculture, particularly dairy and pork producers, are facing tough economic conditions. Ag financial counselors have observed several common mistakes and self-defeating behaviors some farmers make when facing overwhelming challenges.

Here are six recommendations on what farmers can do differently to avoid a downward spiral of financial and emotional pain.

Seek out professional health resources for depression and/or suicidal thinking. Medication and counseling together are extremely important in treating depression. Physical ailments are one way the stress and depression are manifest. Seek out family physicians, clergy, outreach workers, and the extension service for ideas on where to go for assistance.

Keep the faith. Look to a higher power. Keep attending your church. Find support in a spiritual setting or in a support group. Hold your head up and let your

friends know what is really going on with you.

Social withdrawal and shame turn the problems inward, exactly where they don't need to go. Move into the future in a proactive sense. Don't dwell on mistakes. Don't blame yourself for things you had no control over.

Keep the family together. When debts mount and obtaining a loan is difficult, there is almost always marital discord. Decisions to continue to dump income into the farm cause conflict, especially when it is the wife's off-farm income barely keeping the farming operation afloat at the expense of family living and high stress.

Couples need to be mutually supportive and work through their solutions together instead of withdrawing into isolated, aggressive or solitary positions. Ag counselors often find that by the time they arrive at a farmstead they have two clients with two opposing agendas.

Marital tension needs to be addressed quickly

through outside guidance. Get a good word-of-mouth referral on who can help you. Ag financial counselors believe that many a divorce could be prevented if couples start seeking help two years sooner than they do.

Pride is a factor. Farmers want to put up a good front with their local clergy and professionals. They don't really turn a corner and get the help they need until they stop worrying about what others think. They also need to be assured of confidentiality and, if possible, anonymity.

Start sooner to get help. Don't try to work through the process alone. Farmers in this position need help with decision-making, information about tax and legal consequences. Ideally it takes one to three years to dissolve a farming operation while winding down slowly.

Be careful to select accountants and attorneys who have a good understanding of "farm law." Too

many farmers rely on "hearsay" or gossip in the farm community about how to solve their problems without actually turning to experts for second or third opinions.

Financial counselors feel they get to farmers about 1 « to two years late to prevent the financial wrecks they find when they first make contact. The financial ideas and help they offer could help salvage farmers' equity if the process were started earlier.

Too many families are not realistic when it comes to their family living expenses. They guess too low. They live on credit cards. If the bank cuts them off, they turn to their credit cards as a quick fix.

Make tough family decisions. Trying to farm together — father and son operations — may jeopardize the financial viability of both operations. Too many families are trying to earn a living on too few acres.

Big mistakes are made when the parents go out on a limb to keep their children in farming and end up losing their own farm. Farmers may ignore reality in order to keep a son or a son-in-law in farming. An outside consultant can help take emotion out of the decision-making process and explain various options based on what the numbers actually mean.

Waiting until the last minute. Don't put off paperwork to the bank until the last minute. Farmers may end up getting the bank decision about the status of their operational loans too close to spring planting. By then they have made decisions and commitments so, if they are denied their loan, they try to farm with main street credit and credit cards.

Alternate ways of financing are shaky if not shady. Be careful of financing schemes coming from non-traditional sources.

Later filers are often so busy with day-to-day operations that they ignore the future and long term planning. Putting off decisions or reviewing their finances is a way of continuing to deny their problems.

The later they file their loan applications and financial statements, the greater the likelihood is that they haven't discussed their plans with anyone and haven't rehearsed their answers or presentation. By preparing early, they have a chance to get some input from an advisor before trying to "sell" the bank.

Ag financial counselors are truly on the front lines for mental health, family well being, and financial concerns. My experience is that they listen, they care

and are patient. They understand the referral network and make good referrals. The main thing they wish is that they could be on the scene a lot sooner to prevent some of the pain and suffering they encounter.

Experts give guidance to those who want to sell meat directly to the consumer

“Direct marketing meat is an attractive option for many producers, but they need to be aware that they will have to adhere to state or federal guidelines for processing, storage and tax collection,” said an MU Extension specialist in community development and local food systems.

“If you plan to sell your meat to consumers or to retailers such as restaurants, grocery stores and farmers markets, you need to arrange for it to be processed by a facility inspected by either the Missouri Department of Agriculture or the USDA,” said Crystal Weber.

You also will need to create a product label and submit it for approval by the facility’s inspection agency. Required information on the label includes your name, the name of your product, an inspection legend identifying the processing facility, and safe-handling instructions.

Check with your local

health department regarding any regulations governing the sale of food in your community, she said.

Custom-exempt processing is an option for meat intended for exclusive use by the owner, members of the owner’s household, nonpaying guests and employees. Meat packaged in such a facility must be stamped “not for sale.”

A list of state-inspected processing facilities is available at mda.mo.gov/animals/health/inspections. USDA-inspected facilities are listed by the department’s Food Safety and Inspection Service at www.fsis.usda.gov.

Ag scientist Norman Borlaug dead at 95

DALLAS (AP) — Agricultural scientist Norman Borlaug, the father of the “green revolution” who won the Nobel Peace Prize for his role in combating world hunger and saving hundreds of millions of lives, died Saturday in Texas, a Texas A&M University spokeswoman said. He was 95.

The Nobel committee honored Borlaug in 1970 for his contributions to high-yield crop varieties and bringing other agricultural innovations to the developing world. Many experts credit the green revolution with averting global famine during the second half of the 20th century and saving perhaps 1 billion lives.

Thanks to the green revolution, world food production more than doubled between 1960 and 1990. In Pakistan and India, two of the nations that benefited most from the new crop varieties, grain yields more than quadrupled over the period.

Equal parts scientist and humanitarian, the Iowa-born Borlaug realized improved crop varieties were

just part of the answer, and he pressed governments for farmer-friendly economic policies and improved infrastructure to make markets accessible. A 2006 book about Borlaug is titled “The Man Who Fed the World.”

Add value to your cull cows

As fall arrives, cattle producers are getting ready to wean and market their calves. At the same time, producers are deciding which cows met performance expectations and which cows they will cull. Many producers sell their culls immediately, but that might not be the most profitable marketing strategy, said a University of Missouri Extension livestock specialist.

"When deciding whether to sell cows when culled or at a later date, first consider the seasonality of cow prices," said David Hoffman. "Typically, cull cow prices are lowest during the fall and early winter and highest in late winter and early spring."

Hoffman recommends adding weight to thin cows. "With an abundance of high-quality fall forage, cull cows can rapidly replenish their muscle and body mass," he said.

Adding cheap weight gains with proper supplementation will result in a greater carcass grade. Higher-yielding cows typically earn a premium — currently \$5-\$8 per hundredweight, Hoffman said.

You will want to sell cull cows before they become excessive in their body condition (BCS of 8 or higher), as they will be discounted. Plan to market cull cows at an optimum BCS of 5-6.

When adding value to cull cows, select the best candidates to retain, he said. Heavy-conditioned, unhealthy or older cows are generally poor candidates for adding value.

Consider cull cows as a valuable asset to your operation, Hoffman said. Generally, adding weight or changing marketing time will increase the value of your cull cows and result in greater return for the cow-calf producer.

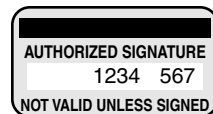

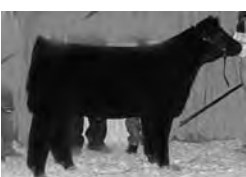



Steve and Becky Tipton — Country Creek Honey

Busy as a bee. If you have observed a hive of bees at work, you know that saying is accurate. It seems bees are always working, going after nectar for the hive. Today we'll meet a family in rural Kansas that started raising bees and found that the enterprise is keeping them quite busy as well.

Steve and Becky Tipton are the owners of Country Creek Honey near Meriden, Kansas.

Steve is from north Topeka originally. His parents bought a farm near Meriden in 1967. Steve went to Washburn, married Becky, went to work at Goodyear and moved back to the farm. Becky is a teacher at Seaman High School. She has always been interested in bees and had read lots of bee journals, but hadn't tried raising bees.

One day in late 1988, Steve went to a farm store in Emporia to pick up a part for a tractor. Steve said, "It was three days before Christmas, and the store had a sign that said, 'Beginning beekeeper kits - everything you need to get started.'" He said to himself, "Yes! My Christmas shopping is done."

Now isn't that a guy's dream - to Christmas shop for his wife at the farm store? Anyway, Steve bought that beekeeper kit and gave it to Becky. They

soon bought two hives of bees and have raised bees ever since.

When Steve retired from Goodyear, he took over the beekeeping. Today, their business is known as Country Creek Honey.

Steve says with a smile, "This has grown into a hobby well out of control." The Tiptons own 100 hives. At 60,000 to 80,000 bees per hive, that means that the Tiptons could have some 8 million bees. As amazing as that sounds, Steve says it pales in comparison to some commercial operations in California.

"There are some California operators with a thousand hives, where they use the bees to pollinate fruit and almond orchards," he says.

Steve and Becky are self-taught beekeepers, and now they share their expertise with others. They teach in the master beekeeper program at the University of Nebraska (directed by Dr. Marion Ellis), do seminars for the Kansas Honey Producers, and teach beginning beekeeping classes locally.

Becky has represented Kansas on committees of the National Honey Board.

Steve says, "One of the things we learned was to promote anything that comes out of the hive." In other words, the honey has value, but other related products such as beeswax can have value as well.

The Tiptons took this advice to heart. They market an amazing variety of products and flavors. For example, they offer lip balm, soap leaves, beeswax lotion, liquid soap, natural insect repellent, and - oh yeah - honey.

All these products are made by the Tiptons themselves from honey or beeswax from their hives, with added flavors like raspberry cream, cinnamon, blackberry, wildflower, and jalapeno. The soaps come in flavors like honey lemon sunshine scrub, bee clean shampoo and body bar, drone scrub, bees in the garden, buzzy face, honey herb, cranberry bumble, pollen pleasure, honey rose, and many more. There is even a baby bee extremely mild soap.

In addition to the soap and lotion bars, there are soap leaves, flavored honey stix, and a natural insect repellent called Buzz Off. All these products are sold at farmers' markets, festivals, and craft fairs. One passerby at the Topeka farmers market described Steve as "the best bee person alive."

Becky teaches soapmaking and Steve gives talks to schools and garden clubs. They have gone to honey group meetings in locations from Texas to Delaware, but after those meetings, they return to their rural commu-

nity of Meriden, Kansas, population 701 people. Now, that's rural. How exciting to find these entrepreneurs of bees in rural Kansas.

Busy as a bee. Just as bees stay busy in the field and in the hive, so Steve and Becky stay busy at promoting honey and related products. We commend the Tiptons for making a difference with their honey production and marketing. This type of agricultural entrepreneurship can help rural communities bee all that they can bee.

Overseeding in fall can repair, improve lawn

Tall fescue still holds the title as the best-adapted cool-season lawn turf for the gamut of central U.S. weather extremes.

Even so, overseeding existing fescue lawns during September is a fairly common practice, according to Chip Miller, horticulturist with Kansas State University Research and Extension.

Typically, some homeowners are hoping to improve their lawn's thickness or fill in bare spots, following a stressful growing season. Others are trying to improve lawn quality by mixing in a new, improved fescue variety with the old standby they've already got — Kentucky 31 or K-31 tall fescue.

They may or may not succeed in improving their lawn, Miller said. Most often, success depends on the seed variety they select and their ability to avoid several serious mistakes.

"For example, K-31 has been around for a long time, and it tends to have the least expensive seed on the market," Miller explained. "But, it grows so fast that it can require mowing more often than any other lawn turf grown in Kansas. It also has a tendency to react to stress by clumping.

"Simply put: K-31 is a cheap workhorse. So, it may still be a good choice for large, open areas that need to look covered, not manicured. For lawns, however, the newer varieties both look and perform better."

Each year, K-State scientists rate tall fescue varieties for color, green up, quality and texture. In their largest Tall Fescue Cultivar Trial near Wichita, they now have 113 different varieties under study. Their most recently reported recommendations included:

Apache III, Avenger, Biltmore, Blackwatch, Cayenne, Coshise III, Dynasty, Escalade, Falcon IV, Fidelity, Finelawn Elite,

Forte, Guardian 21, Inferno, Justice, Kalahari, Matador, Padre, Picasso, Regiment II, Rembrandt, 2nd Millennium, Tar Heel, Titanium, Ultimate, Watchdog and Wolf-pack.

"You shouldn't try to buy a specific variety, though. For one thing, every member of the trial's top 30 fescues ranked practically alike. For another, no store is going to stock all of those cultivars," Miller said. "So, you need to find a retail nursery or garden center that keeps up with the research for you and offers a local blend of several cultivars. Blends let you take advantage of different varieties' differing strengths."

Bad Planting Can Waste Good Seed

Planting good seed badly can still yield problems, the horticulturist warned. The seed has to go down evenly and at the recommended rate with good seed-to-soil contact, followed by proper watering.

Achieving good seed-to-soil contact typically requires some advance preparation. The thicker the lawn thatch and/or the more compacted the soil, the more important that prep work becomes, Miller said.

"You can do it with a level-head (bow) rake that you use to disturb and even furrow the soil. But I wouldn't suggest doing the job by hand unless you're only overseeding some pretty small bare spots," he said. "Otherwise, your best choices are machines you'll probably need to rent.

"You can use a core aerator — which will make your lawn look littered with little cigar-shaped soil cores for a couple of weeks, but can loosen compacted soil and break through thatch. Or, you can use a power rake, which mostly is designed to cut through and pull up a thatch layer, but can tear up an existing lawn if not han-

dled right. Or, you can try a verticutter that slices through, rather than ripping out thatch, but still needs careful handling."

A cut-through-the-thatch machine that also sows and covers seed — known as a slit seeder — may also be available for rent at some stores, Miller said. As with the other machines, however, it will require upper body strength to operate well. So, some homeowners may want to hire help.

For an existing lawn, the overseeding rate for tall fescue or Kentucky bluegrass is half or less of what's recommended for starting a new lawn from scratch. K-State's recommended full-seeding rate for new tall fescue lawns in the central Plains is 6 to 8 pounds of seed per 1,000 square feet of lawn. For new Kentucky bluegrass lawns, it's 2 to 3 pounds per 1,000 square feet.

"To avoid mistakes, you've got to do the obvious and actually determine the square footage of your yard.

Then calculate the amount of seed you need," Miller said. "With tall fescue, in particular, using too little seed can result in clumpy turf that is neither attractive nor easy to mow — 'a-bump, a-bump, a-bump.' Too much seed can produce a lawn vulnerable to disease and stress damage. Sometimes, excessive seedlings can actually end up killing each other."

Few homeowners still try to achieve even distribution by carefully calibrating a seeder and then strictly following a pattern that overlaps each previous pass — just by the width of the nearest wheel mark that the seeder left behind, he said.

"The easier approach with both seed and fertilizer is to load up your spreader, adjust it to a low setting and then keep covering the lawn — perhaps from north to south and then from east to west — until you run out of seed or fertilizer," Miller said. "Overlapping each individual pass a little bit is

still a good idea, though, so you don't accidentally miss any areas."

On bare soil, a light, follow-up hand-raking will give seed some protective soil cover, he added.

"After that, you just water newly planted areas lightly, but often — keeping the soil constantly moist, but not waterlogged," the horticulturist said. "If we get some hot weather, that may mean watering three times a day. During cool weather, you may only have to water every couple of days."

"If we don't get rain as the grass plants come up, then you should gradually decrease watering to once a week. Let the plants tell you when. If you push the blades down and they don't spring back up quickly, the lawn needs water."

Lawn mowing can begin again once the seedlings reach three inches tall, Miller said.

Record bounty coming for corn, soybeans

WICHITA (AP) — Kansas farmers are expecting plentiful crops as fall harvest nears.

Kansas Agricultural Statistics Service reported Friday that the corn production in the state is forecast at a record high 581 million bushels.

And the state's growers are also on track to set a record for soybean production. About 140 million bushels are expected after farmers planted an unprecedented number of acres this season.

Also faring extremely well is sorghum. Its forecast production of 221.4 million bushels would not set any records, but the expected yields for that crop of 82 bushels per acre would set a yield record.

The bounty extends beyond Kansas. Corn production nationwide is forecast at 13 billion bushels. If realized, it would be the second largest corn crop in U.S. history.

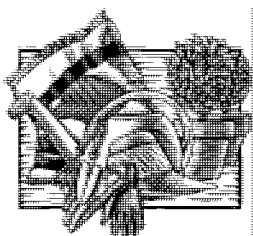

Yard & Garden Tips

September is Planting Time

Now is a good time to be dividing perennials, planting new plants and finishing all your spring plans. Soil temperatures are right for root growth. Soil moisture is good this fall. Plants have this fall and next spring to get established before the normal stresses of summer will occur.

Planting depth is critical for plant health. The crown of the plant should be at or slightly above ground level. I prefer using a woodchip mulch over the rooting zone of my plants. Therefore, the plants are slightly above grade to compensate for the layer of wood chips. A heavy clay soil is another factor to plant a little above grade.

Roots need oxygen for growth and survival. Planting in clay soil and too deep, reduces the availability of the roots to get oxygen. Mulches also reduce the plants gas exchange. The majority of many plant

roots will be in the upper 18 inches of soil.

The soil should be loosened around the planting hole. This will improve the air in the soil which roots will seek. Loosening the soil below the roots is not recommended. As the soil compacts, the plant usually sinks with the soil. When this occurs, the roots are no longer where they prefer which is close to the surface.

Air is important for roots and so is good soil to root contact. The soil needs to be settled back around the newly planted plant. Some gardeners like to press the soil back into place with their foot. This may be a preferred method when forced to plant in wet soil because you have to get it done.

A preferred way to get the soil in contact with the roots is to run water slowly over the rooting zone. The soil will sink around the plant and fill in the large

air pockets. No soil amendments are suggested, such as peat moss, to individual planting holes. Amendments are suggested only to whole planting beds to be blended into the complete rooting zone of the plants.

Most plants will be dormant through the winter and have no low temperature injury. Broadleaf plants will continue to need available moisture in the winter. The soil will need to be moist during the winter. A layer of mulch will reduce evaporation.

Weather expert says crickets are a good indicator

You are outdoors without your thermometer and wonder "what's the temperature?" If you listen to the crickets, there is an easy formula to calculate it, according to Mary Knapp.

"Count the chirps in 15 seconds and add 40," said Knapp, who as the state climatologist for Kansas, is a weather watcher herself. "The result is the temperature in Fahrenheit." Knapp, who is in charge of the Kansas Weather Data Library, said that a Swedish chemist, Savante Arrhenius described a similar equation in 1897

to explain chemical reaction rates and their response to temperature. Crickets' chirp rate is controlled by metabolic reactions and is faster when it is warm and slower when it is cool. "But it is accurate?" Knapp said. "Studies have shown that it is accurate to within a degree or two. "You just need to be careful in counting the chirps, and be able to hear the crickets over the noisy cicadas."

Researchers study factors that regulate vaccination efficiency

Using vaccination to induce a robust immune response has been an effective strategy for managing infectious diseases in humans and animals for more than a century. Now, Agricultural Research Service (ARS) scientists and colleagues have found that a concurrent parasite infection significantly compromises the effectiveness of a commonly administered vaccine in swine. The study was conducted by researchers at the ARS Diet, Genomics and Immunology Laboratory in Beltsville, Md., led by microbiologist Joseph Urban, working with Nina Steenhard of the Institute for Veterinary Disease Biology of the University of Copenhagen in Denmark.

For the study, 36 pigs raised on a pathogen-free farm were divided into four groups and studied for nearly three months. The researchers wanted to compare health indicators among three groups compared with an untreated control group.

The three groups included pigs that had been continuously exposed to a common worm infection; pigs that were exposed to the same worm infection, but vaccinated against Mycoplasma hyopneumoniae bac-

teria at week three; and a worm-free group that was similarly vaccinated against the bacteria at week three.

All pigs were infected with live M. hyopneumoniae bacteria via aerosol four weeks after the vaccine injections were administered. Another four weeks later, the tissue of all pigs were evaluated.

All worm-free, vaccinated pigs infected with M. hyopneumoniae tested 100 percent positive for vaccine-derived antibodies, meaning they presented an optimal serum response. But only 78 percent of the vaccinated pigs that had been worm infected developed serum antibodies. The other 22 percent were considered vaccine failures. The worm-infected pigs also had a higher percentage of lung pathology than their non-worm-infected counterparts after vaccination and subsequent bacteria exposure.

These findings are an indicator of the importance of parasite control during vaccination. The next step is to conduct further field studies in environments where animals are susceptible to both worm and bacterial infection, according to authors.

FSIS hopes to clarify ‘natural’ meat claims

The USDA Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) announced it will solicit further public comment as the agency seeks to define the conditions under which it would permit the voluntary claim “natural” to be used in the labeling of meat and poultry products.

FSIS is seeking comments to clarify and resolve issues surrounding the “natural” claim, including how best to coordinate FSIS regulation of “natural” claims with the agricultural marketing service (AMS) voluntary “naturally raised” marketing claim standard.

The current FSIS policy states that the term “natural” may be used in the labeling of meat and poultry products provided that the product does not

contain any artificial flavor or flavoring, coloring ingredients, chemical preservative, or any other artificial or synthetic ingredient and that the product is not more than minimally processed.

Turf specialist advises homeowners to seed for quality

“You get what you pay for” is an old adage that’s a practical certainty for lawn seed, according to Kansas State University horticulturist Rodney St. John.

“Clean seed that has zero percent ‘other crop’ and zero percent weed seeds will always cost more. Highly recommended varieties with a good germination rate will cost more, too. But, they’re worth more. You might have trouble believing, for example, how just a tiny percentage of some weed seeds can ruin a yard,” said St. John, who’s a turfgrass specialist with K-State Research and Extension.

He strongly suggests

homeowners buy lawn seed from a reputable garden center or landscape supply provider, not a big-box store. In his experience, retailers whose year-round business is horticulture are much more likely to know the latest research results on varieties that do well locally. They also tend to be more personally involved in supplying lawn products and advice that help ensure customers’ success.

“For example, a current trend among reputable retailers is to supply blends and mixes of turf varieties, rather than to suggest people plant a mono-culture lawn. If selected well, the varieties in those products

can work together to produce a stronger, better-looking lawn that’s less vulnerable to pests,” St. John said.

The difference between a blend and a mix is that a blend provides several varieties of the same turf, such as a combination of three different tall fescues or a five-way blend of Kentucky bluegrasses. In contrast, a mix combines different turf species, such as a bag with both tall fescue and Kentucky bluegrass.

Because blend seeds are from the same genus and species, they can produce a lawn with a smooth, uniform appearance, St. John said. By including different varieties with slightly different traits, however, a blend also can strengthen a lawn’s disease resistance, for example, or its ability to withstand stress.

A mix of different turf species can be good or bad, he said. Their quality mostly depends on how carefully the varieties were selected and how well adapted they are for local conditions.

Kansas mixes often combine the state’s two top turfs — tall fescue and Kentucky bluegrass. But, the good

ones often contain three or more fescue varieties and two or more bluegrass cultivars - which, in turn, provide a high-quality, uniform lawn with greater strengths in drought, disease, and insect resistance.

“Typically, these mixes are a 50-50 combination of fescue and bluegrass seeds. They won’t look equal on the label or in the hopper because fescue seeds are so much larger. In actuality, though, mixes that by volume are 80 to 90 percent tall fescue and 20 to 10 percent Kentucky bluegrass have roughly the same number of tall fescue and Kentucky bluegrass seeds,” the specialist said.

Sun-and-shade mixes tend to perform in ways that are hard to predict, St. John warned.

“In most cases, they combine lots of species, in hopes that something will emerge in all of the yard’s varying degrees of sunlight. More often than not, though, the end result is a patchwork of different shades of green and differing turf textures and thicknesses. Homeowners may not be pleased,” he said.

Moisture vital to seed performance

Homeowners who are seeding or overseeding a fescue lawn this September could see seedlings emerge in as few as five to 10 days. Those starting or renovating Kentucky bluegrass could see germination begin in eight to 14 days.

“You can only expect that, however, under ideal conditions in moisture, sunlight and temperature. And, if you live somewhere such as the central Great Plains, ideal weather is never guaranteed. So, you may have to be patient,” said Rodney St. John, turf specialist for Kansas State University Research and Extension.

An important part of that will be continuing to irrigate the area lightly as often as needed to keep the soil surface moist (not wet), he said. That’s vital until the seed germinates and the new grass grows 1 to 2 inches tall.

“Otherwise, you’ll have a very poor germination rate,” St. John said. “Plus, if you let them dry out, the new seedlings will die.”

Controlling weeds can hurt turf
Homeowners can successfully overseed and fertilize a tall fescue or Kentucky bluegrass lawn at the same time in September or early October. Most often, though, they can’t control the dandelions, too.
“The only exception to that, of course, is if they dig up the dandelions by hand,” said Rodney St. John, turfgrass horticulturist with Kansas State University Research and Extension.
The problem is that the commonly available broadleaf weed controls can kill turfgrass seedlings, he said. Most products require that homeowners apply the herbicide only after newly seeded lawns have grown enough to merit mowing two to three times.
K-State recommends a mowing height of 2.5 to 3.5 inches for tall fescue and 2 to 3 inches for bluegrass.
“If you get your seed going early enough, though, that’s not bad timing,” St John said. “An early November application of a broadleaf weed control can kill dandelions quite well — plus control henbit and chickweed. You just need to pick a day when the temperature is 50 degrees or warmer.”
He added that two controls are legal and safe to use as early as seven days after turf seedlings emerge. They are Drive 75DF (quinclorac) and Quicksilver (carfentrazone). “They can be hard to find, however, because they’re usually considered to be professional products,” St. John said. “So, homeowners who just can’t wait to control broadleaf weeds in November might have to hunt around for a while or shop on the Web. Or ... hire a lawn-care professional to do the job.”

Consumers improving at food safety skills

Most consumers were "home-schooled" on hamburger preparation, a recent national study funded by the Beef Checkoff shows. According to surveys, 57% of consumers say a parent taught them how to cook burgers. Another 29% said their hamburger-making skills were self-taught.

Hamburgers and other ground beef products should be cooked to an internal temperature of at least 160°F, as measured by an instant-read meat thermometer. However, only 13% of consumers in this latest survey correctly identified 160°F as the proper cooking temperature for

ground beef to ensure safety, and only 9% said they learned to use a meat thermometer to determine when a hamburger is done.

"In the beef industry, we know that 'the way it has always been done' is not good enough when it comes to food safety. That's why we invest in a wide range of initiatives to ensure we continue to produce the safest food possible," said Mandy Carr, Ph.D., executive director of beef safety research for the NCBA. "Consumers can be part of the food safety innovation process by following proper in-home food safety practices, including cooking

ground beef to 160°F."

The survey also showed retail establishments are getting the word out about the best in-home food safety practices. Half of survey respondents mentioned seeing information in a supermarket about proper handling and cooking of fresh meat. The top two tips or techniques consumers said they saw in supermarkets were related to hand washing and cooking meats to recommended temperatures using a meat thermometer.

The survey of 1,007 American adults included 971 beef eaters and had a margin of error of 3.2%.

Pilot program allows new type of fishing in Kansas, offers new catch

Kansas is halfway through the first year of a pilot program that's making floatline fishing legal until 2011 during the daylight hours from mid-July to mid-September at eight Kansas reservoirs. The test program's targeted species is a bottom feeder — the channel catfish. Fans say floatline fishing has long been an effective approach for those who want meat for the family dinner table. But, not every angler approves it, said Charlie Lee, wildlife specialist with Kansas State University Research and Extension. Floatline fishing typically involves setting a number of hooks and fishing in several areas at the same time. It can involve, but doesn't require using so much as a rod and reel. All that's really needed is a closed-cell, easy-to-see float, fastened to a fishing line that hangs down deep in the water with a weight at the end. Kansans have the option of adding two baited hooks somewhere along each line. They can anchor each setup in place or allow it to float with the current.

"Either way, this basically becomes fishing from a boat because Kansas is requiring that anglers supervise their floatlines at all times and then remove their setups before they go home," Lee said. "Besides, if they're good at picking fishing spots,

they're likely to have things happening almost all of the time." Kansas' pilot program permits two poles and up to eight floatlines (with no more than two hooks each). Anglers also must label their equipment with their name and address.

"Down South, they usually call this kind of fishing jugline or jug fishing — perhaps because they have traditionally made their own floats and may actually have used jugs once," Lee said. "Today, you're more likely to see commercially available closed-cell or solid floats, because they help prevent the spread of zebra mussels.

"Still, jug fishing can be a relatively cheap and easy way to get into angling. For some people, it's more fun, too, because they have multiple lines going at once and multiple floats to watch for action." A Kansas floatline permit is \$2.50 (in addition to a regular fishing permit). The creel limit depends on the reservoir: Council Grove, Hillsdale, John Redmond, Kanopolis, Pomona, Toronto, Tuttle Creek or Wilson. Program continues to grow

The Masters of Beef Advocacy Program (MBA), launched last fall by the Beef Checkoff, recently hit a major milestone: 1,000 registered course participants. Of that total, nearly 350 have graduated from the program.

MBA continues to teach (or refresh) producers, university and Extension representatives, 4-H and FFA kids and industry affiliates across the country how to be effective spokespersons for the industry. The program consists of six, one-hour core courses: beef safety, beef nutrition, animal care, environmental stew-

ardship, modern beef production and the Beef Checkoff.

A majority of the graduates are also connected via an online alumni association that enables course graduates to network and engage in responding to media issues and share personal success stories.
