

Grants available to Kansas communities for Pride projects

Finding the money to fund community health improvements isn't always easy, but funding opportunities, including the 2010 "Get It -Do It" Kansas PRIDE Extension Grants, are available. The competitive grant program is sponsored by the Kansas PRIDE Program and K-State Research and Extension. It is open to Kansas PRIDE communities collaborating with county and district Extension offices to develop youth and adult partnerships to improve community, said Elaine Johannes, grant program coordinator. The goal, Johannes said, is to encourage youth

and adults to work side-by-side in developing physical activity and health promotion projects in their community.

Grant projects targeting physical activity might include, for example, trail development and promotion; establishment or promotion of walking, hiking or bicycling programs; collaboration with school programs promoting healthy lifestyle choices, and/or a campaign to reduce screen time. PRIDE communities are eligible to apply for grants of up to \$3,000. Proposals are due Nov. 15, 2009 and grant awards will be announced before the end of the year

and awarded to fund projects in 2010, Johannes said.

Grant applications are available through the Kansas PRIDE Program at www.kansasprideprogram.ksu.edu or 785-532-5840.

The Kansas PRIDE Program is a statewide community and economic development effort co-administered by K-State Research and Extension and the Kansas Department of Commerce. Johannes is a Kansas State University Research and Extension youth development specialist based in the School of Family

Studies and Human Services in the College of Human Ecology. Much of her work focuses on health promotion.

Ground alfalfa movement: Southwest/South Central Tonnage: 13,006/4,054 Last week: 12,482/4,149 Last year: 11,785/3,395 Hay trade slow. Demand moderate for dairy and stock cow alfalfa, alfalfa pellets, grinding alfalfa and grass hay. The Northwest 2/3 of the State had at least frost or for many a hard freeze over the weekend, with drizzle stopping all fall harvest, wheat drilling and haying. Almost all of the good late cut alfalfa on the ground has been ruined for dairy quality. Dairy quality alfalfa is in short supply, all other grades an adequate supply. Take steps to ensure best alfalfa stand establishment

Alfalfa is the most productive legume in Missouri. It can be grazed or fed as hay, is productive all summer long except during extreme drought and has high yield potential. But alfalfa can be extremely particular about the soil it grows in, said a University of Missouri Extension agronomy specialist.

The first step in providing adequate fertility for alfalfa establishment is to take a soil test around 12 months prior to planting, said Travis Harper. Alfalfa requires well-drained soil with a pH of 6.0-6.5 and adequate levels of phosphorus, potassium and boron.

"Every year soil tests come across my desk in early March for fields where alfalfa is going to be planted in late March or early April," Harper said.

Most of the time, the pH of the soil is less than 5.5 and soil-test phosphorus levels are in the single digits, he said. "Farmers are less than thrilled when I tell them they should work on the fertility of their field and wait until next year to plant alfalfa."

The main reason they should wait is that it can take several months for lime to correct the pH of an acidic soil. Adequate soil pH is important for the formation of root nodules, which contain nitrogen-fixing bacteria. "It is very difficult for alfalfa to thrive without good nodulation," Harper said.

Apply lime on prepared seedbeds and work it into the soil at least six months before planting. For no-till seedings, when lime cannot be incorporated, apply lime a year in advance.

Phosphorus also is important in establishing a good stand of alfalfa. Phosphorus stimulates root growth, which helps with summer drought resistance, winter survival and quick spring growth.

"Soils in Missouri have a tendency to be low in phosphorus. Unless a field has had phosphorus applied recently, more phosphorus is likely to be needed," he said.

Even soil that is well-fertilized prior to establishment is still going to need additional lime and fertilizer down the road, Harper noted. Test soils two years after establishment and every two years after that.

USDA sets referendum for cotton checkoff amendments

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced that a referendum is being conducted among U.S. Up-land producers and importers. The referendum is scheduled for Oct. 13, 2009, through Nov. 10, 2009.

The Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is proposing to amend the Cotton Research and Promotion Order (Order) to implement

section 14202 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (2008 Farm Bill) that amended the Cotton Research and Promotion Act (Act). The 2008 Farm Bill provided that the states of Kansas, Virginia and Florida be separate states in the definition of "cotton-producing state."

According to the Act, a referendum among cotton

producers and importers is required to implement, amend, continue, or when appropriate, to suspend, or to terminate the Order or any of its provisions. According to the Act, the AMS will provide an opportunity for all eligible persons to vote on the amendments to the Order.

Producers will have an opportunity to vote by mail or through their respective Farm Service Agency County office and by mail for importers. All known cotton importers will be mailed a ballot and referendum instructions. Ballots will also be available on the internet

www.ams.usda.gov/cotton.

Record number of CSP apps received, says NRCS

Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) Chief Dave White announced last week that NRCS has received 21,300 applications to participate in the new Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP). These applications cover an estimated 33 million acres, nationwide. "NRCS has received enough applications to carry out conservation activities on more than twice the number of acres Congress authorized for CSP this year," White said. "This incredible response shows that conservation-minded producers and landowners want to attain higher levels of conservation stewardship." Kansas received 778 applications, according to Eric B. Banks, Kansas NRCS State Conservationist, Salina.

"Kansas received 541,404 acres in agricultural land and 6,418 acres in nonindustrial private forestland for its share of the annual acreage enrollment," said Banks. Congress capped the annual acreage enrollment nationally at 12,769,000 for each fiscal year. Lands accepted into CSP include private agricultural land (cropland,

pastureland, and rangeland) and nonindustrial private forestland—a new land use for the program and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of an Indian tribe. Operators, with control of the land, are eligible to apply for CSP assistance.

CSP provides financial and technical assistance to eligible agricultural and forestry producers to conserve and enhance soil, water, air, and related natural resources on their land; and encourages producers to voluntarily implement more conservation practices and improve, maintain, and manage existing ones.

"Those who are not approved for funding through this first ranking period will have the option to participate in the second ranking period," said Banks, "which will be held from October 1, 2009 through January 2010."

International auctioneer champ to sell

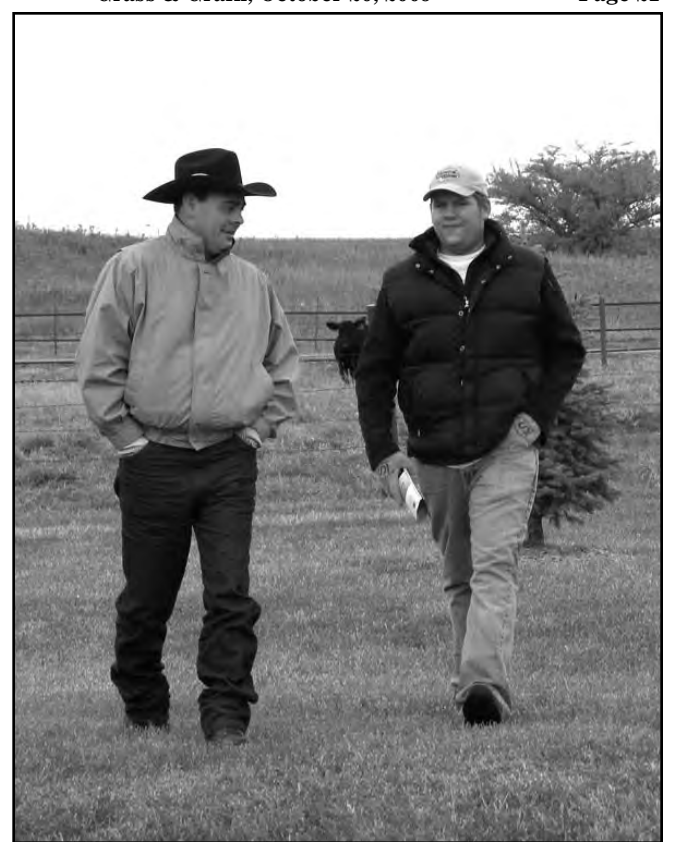
Kevin Borger of Hutchinson entered, and successfully won the International Auctioneer Championship.

Climate concerns turn city's smell into cash cow

GREELEY, Colo. (AP) — The smell of manure hangs over Greeley as it has for half a century.

These days it's more than just a potent reminder of the region's agricultural roots and the hundreds of thousands of cattle raised on the city's outskirts.

The stench smells like an opportunity.

Investors are lining up to support a planned clean energy park that eventually will convert some of the methane gas released from the manure piles into power for a cheese factory and other businesses. JBS, which runs two of the largest feed yards and the local slaughterhouse, is testing a new technology that heats the cattle excrement and turns it into energy.

"What once used to be a waste stream that was just a byproduct ... they are now recognizing has value," said Bruce Biggi, the economic development coordinator for the city of Greeley, which received an \$82,000 grant from the governor's energy office this year for the park.

The idea is to lure new business to the area with what Biggi likes to call its renewable natural gas — the endless supply of methane from cheap manure.

By reducing the amount of the potent greenhouse gas released into the air, the projects also potentially could turn cow dung into dollars, if a climate bill before Congress becomes law.

"Agriculture and agri-

business is what Greeley is all about," Biggi said. "We needed to take that strong traditional economic base and ... merge it with emerging renewable energy and technology."

Waste may be the new energy crop in these parts. But elsewhere, communities are looking anew at power sources such as the sun and wind that may exist in their own backyards.

The shift is being driven partly by legislation in Congress that would reduce the gases linked to global warming.

The legislation, experts acknowledge, would do little to stem the heating up of the planet if other countries don't take similar action.

Should President Barack Obama sign the bill, it would put a price on each ton of carbon dioxide released. That would drive up the cost of polluting fossil fuels such as oil and natural gas and lead to investment in cleaner sources of energy.

Getting into the game now — like JBS and the investors eyeing Greeley's energy park are doing — could potentially reap profits: selling credits generated by reducing greenhouse gases now into the emissions-trading market the bill would create.

That market could prove lucrative for projects that reduce methane, which is 20 times more potent than carbon dioxide when it comes to trapping heat in the earth's atmosphere.

The fear in Greeley, and

elsewhere, is what else the legislation would change.

In the city and surrounding Weld County, the worry is it would raise energy and fertilizer costs for farmers. They need to pump water to irrigate their crops and rely on cheap manure — the same manure that will be tapped for energy — when high natural gas prices drive up the cost of fertilizer.

For the oil and gas industry, which produces more oil in Weld County than any other in the state, a shift to cleaner sources of energy could take away good-paying jobs. And it's not clear whether all those will be replaced by the new green jobs that supporters are banking on.

"I can't think of another place in the country like Weld County, where all the various interests are at play," said John Christiansen, a spokesman for Anadarko Petroleum Corp., which produces oil and gas from 4,600 wells in the county. Many are on fields planted with feed corn, which also is being used to produce ethanol for gasoline locally.

The confluence of different interests has made Weld County a frequent stop for members of Congress interested in how climate legislation is playing outside of Washington. Sen. Michael Bennet, D-Colo., Rep. Betsy Markey, D-Colo., and House Agriculture Committee Chairman Collin Peterson, D-Minn., all made visits over the summer.

“Our rural communities aren’t sold on this yet, there is a lot of uncertainty. But I think in the long run it will stabilize energy prices,” Markey said in an interview.

Markey voted for the climate bill when it passed the House in June. Her vote could play a role in her reelection race next year in the largely Republican district.

On an August afternoon, Markey and three other members of the state’s congressional delegation were singled out for their climate bill vote. A billboard covered with signatures and topped with the words “Shame on you!” stood at the entrance of the lunchtime event, organized by the American Petroleum Institute. The event drew about 600 people to a cavernous exhibit hall outside of Greeley for a pep rally opposing the legislation. API is a Washington, D.C.-based lobbying organization for the oil and gas industry.

“Why would we do anything to drive up their cost of doing business? It makes no sense,” local radio host Amy Oliver Cooke told the crowd. Many wore shirts that said, “Congress, Don’t Take Away my Job.”

“I can’t afford the legislation and neither can you,” she said.

David Eckhardt, a fourth-generation Weld County farmer, is struggling with the math. Despite meeting with Bennet and Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack, Eckhardt remains skeptical of an Agriculture Department’s analysis of the House climate bill that says farmers stand to make more money from trapping carbon in their soil and crops than they will pay out

in higher energy prices. “I know my fuel will go up, I know my chemicals will go up. And the question that was asked at the meeting we had with them was how much? And their answer was not as much as you think it will,” said Eckhardt. “That’s not an answer.”

For Eckhardt, a climate law could change what crops he plants.

For JBS, which operates a feedlot down the road from his farm, changes are already afoot.

Fattening the tens of thousands of cattle the company slaughters annually at its Greeley headquarters requires flaking with steam the corn it receives from farmers. That can get expensive because it relies on traditional natural gas, which in recent years has been subject to price swings.

In 2006, with gas prices peaking, Tom McDonald, the environmental affairs manager for JBS Swift’s cattle-feeding operation Five Rivers, started looking for ways not to waste the cows’ waste any longer.

At one of the company’s largest feedlots in Weld County, some of the manure that used to be raked up from the pens and stock-

piled is now being fed into a manure gasifier. The apparatus, which looks like an extra large pizza oven, bakes the excrement, extracting the gases which in turn feed the fire. The heat generated can power the feedlots’ boiler, reducing the company’s natural gas consumption.

Eventually, McDonald says it could supply all the power the facility needs to make its corn flakes.

It would also help with global warming because the process converts methane into the less efficient heat-trapper carbon dioxide.

“These ideas had been kicked around for years and been dismissed because they weren’t economical,” said McDonald. “Well now the economics are coming in line and these systems actually have a payback are looking very promising.”

Protect trees from winter woes

Winter is hazardous for newly planted trees, even “mighty oak” saplings. Sometimes it remains dangerous for trees that

stay fairly smooth and thin-barked as they grow—including ashes, honeylocusts, lindens, maples, willows and most fruit trees.

The cold weather’s perils are twofold (although drought can add a third). Winter’s freeze-thaw cycles can cause sunscald and bark cracks. Foraging rabbits are able to be just as damaging, said Ward Upham, horticulturist with Kansas State University Research and Extension.

“In the central United States, many of the samplings will recover, if you provide some TLC later. But, the injury can still affect the tree’s strength and appearance for life,” he said. “Fortunately, you

don’t have to take heroic measures to reduce the risk for either type of damage. Think of it as wrapping presents during October or November—in time for Thanksgiving, perhaps.”

In most years, rabbit damage is likely to occur first, Upham said.

The gnawing hoppers enjoy many fruit trees’ bark, but seem particularly fond of the tender tissues on newly planted trees and shrubs.

“That’s damaging enough. But, if they nibble

all of the way around a trunk, it could die,” he warned.

The simplest barrier to rabbit damage is a 2-foot-tall, trunk-protecting cylinder of 1-inch wire mesh, chicken wire or the like,

Upham said. Plastic tree wrap is another alternative, as is regularly sprayed liquid rabbit repellent on vulnerable plants.

Sunscald and bark cracks usually develop on the south or southwest side of trees, typically during late winter.

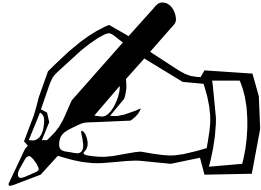

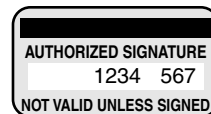



Young area farmer an FFA 'Star'

Every year the National FFA organization gives out their four most prestigious awards at the national convention. The Stars over America program recognizes the most outstanding students in the nation in four categories. The FFA organization's top awards are the American Star Farmer, American Star in Agribusiness, American Star in Agricultural Placement and American Star in Agriscience.

This year Andrew Pachta is one of four finalists for the Star Farmer award. Pachta is a senior in animal science and industry at Kansas State University and is from the north-east Kansas town of Linn. The award will be presented at the morning session on October 24. Throughout Pachta's long FFA career in both high school and college he has had many experiences that will help him in the future.

"FFA has been an amazing experience for me," Pachta said. "I have gained a vast amount of knowledge and skills in agriculture that I will use everyday on the farm."

Another aspect of his involvement in FFA that has benefitted is the ability to travel. "FFA is an organization that takes you places," Pachta said. "This will be my fifth national conference and I have been all

over the country with FFA, and I have met so many great people." Even though he has traveled the country with FFA, he wants to stay close to home. Pachta said, after graduation in May he plans to return home to help run the family farm. "Farming has always been in the family and I've always enjoyed it," Pachta said. "I remember riding in the tractor with dad when I was little and I'd like to keep the family tradition going."

Pachta said his parents, grandparents, an uncle and one of his older brothers work together on the family farm. His goal after college is to try to expand both his own, and the family's operation and to eventually take on a greater role in the family operation. If Pachta receives the American Star Farmer award at this year's National FFA convention,

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

The Dollar Index continues to push lower, the gold market made new all time highs, and the Dow Jones moved above 10,000, at least for a while. The crude oil moved up to the highest level since last November and the charts suggest that a move to \$89 is likely. The outside markets are definitely supportive right now, and that cannot be ignored.

The December corn gained almost 10 cents last week, so the uptrend is alive and well. The outside markets were supportive this week, which helps, but there are a number of other concerns as well. First of all, the corn crop isn't entirely mature, which along with the wet weather is holding back harvest progress. Next you have the concern about how many bushels may have been lost to the freeze and finally early yield reports don't exactly support the idea of a record national average corn yield.

On the charts it looks like we the potential to see a deeper correction, but so far the \$3.68-\$3.69 area is holding as support. Besides that I think we will have to see some open harvest weather in the corn belt to bring pressure to the corn. So far it looks like there will be some decent weather over the weekend, but it is far from being a certainty. The extended forecasts call for above normal precipitation, so farmers are going to need to get something done this weekend. If they don't we could have a very strong day on Monday as harvest delays and failure to replenish supplies take the forefront in the news.

The December KW gained 25 1/2 cents last week, so it wasn't exactly a follow-up of the corn, but since there still isn't much bullish fundamental news out there I have to look at the wheat as a market that is just tagging along for the ride.

Short covering by the trading funds can still take this market a lot higher, but it is going to take further weakness in the US Dollar and further strength in the corn and soybeans to really make it happen. At the moment I am still looking at this rally as a chance to sell call premium. Things are different now than they were at the beginning of the century, but I keep looking at our ending stocks figure and the last time it was this high we had futures below \$3.00. I don't think that is going to happen now, but I think that the upside potential in the wheat market is definitely limited.

November soybeans gained 13 1/2 cents last week, but with the exception of Monday the bean market struggled to move up. Demand is still great with export sales coming in at 654,500 MT and soybean

meal over 400,000 MT, so there is good underlying support, but I still think there is fear that the crop is very large and we won't be able to use enough of it. A move back to the \$9.50 area looks likely in the short run, barring further wet weather.

Early yield reports have been variable. A week ago it seemed that most of the reports were quite favorable and seemed to suggest that USDA might be too low in their yield estimate, but this week the production comments seemed to become more negative. Harvest is slow, just like the corn, so it will take more time to get a full grasp on yield.

There was \$84 cash trade in TX, which is an improvement and the choice boxed beef gained almost \$2.00. Also the live cattle and feeder cattle futures charts look fairly friendly now.

The December LC were .85 higher for the week, but more importantly moved through trend line resistance that has been in place since July. Friday's high was just below the 40-day moving average, so it looks like the \$86-\$86.50 area is going to be strong resistance as we start the week. A close above

\$86.50 sometime next week should be viewed as bullish and all we really need is to see a higher cash cattle market next week to get that done.

The cattle on feed report was about like expected with on feed at 101%, placements at 105%, and marketings at 96%. The most interesting thing is that for the first time in 18 months the on feed number is above a year ago. The big placement figures we have been seeing have finally caught up to us. Keep in mind though that the on feed number is still not large and cattle supplies are still relatively tight. The supply fundamentals are still bullish and maybe now we are starting to see that help the market.

KSU students do genetic work on wheat thriving in harsh climates

Kansas State University undergraduate students are conducting research to help map wheat chromosomes for a project that could help the crop feed more people and grow in harsh climates. The students are working in K-State's Wheat Genetic and Genomic Resources Center with Sunish K. Sehgal, research associate in plant pathology. The students are: Kendra Miller, junior in biology and pre-medicine, 2007 graduate of Republic County High School, Belleville; and Raven Skinner, sophomore in biology and premedicine and 2008 graduate of Paola High School. "The projects that we are

working on in the lab are huge — some of the largest being attempted worldwide," Miller said. "The wheat genome is several times the size of the human genome, so that puts it into perspective." Miller and Skinner are involved in a project to create a physical map of four chromosomes of wheat. A physical map of a chromosome is a physical representation of the linear order of genes and other landmarks along the chromosome. Sehgal said mapping wheat genomes is complex because wheat has a large amount of DNA in its nucleus, and the nucleus contains three different genomes.

Understanding why rye works as a cover crop

Agricultural Research Service (ARS) scientists may soon find a way to enhance the weed-killing capabilities of a cereal grain that enriches the soil when used as a winter cover crop. Rye is often grown in winter and killed in the spring, so the dead stalks can be flattened over soybean and vegetable fields to block sunlight and prevent spring weeds from getting the light they need to germinate. The effect makes rye a popular alternative for organic farmers who grow crops without herbicides. Rye's roots also capture nutrients and hold the soil in place, reducing erosion and run off. John Teasdale, research leader of the ARS Sustainable Agricultural Systems Laboratory in Beltsville, Md., is working with ARS chemist Cliff Rice to see whether organic compounds released by rye in the soil play a role in suppressing weeds and whether those compounds can be exploited to improve rye's weed-killing capabilities. Although compounds in rye are known to inhibit weed growth, little is known about how they behave in the soil. Teasdale and Rice grew rye in winter, killed it in spring and either tilled the stalks shallowly into the soil or left them untilled on the surface. They then took weekly soil samples to extract chemicals from them and tested the soils to see how lettuce and pigweed grew in them. They also measured levels of a family of organic compounds called benzoxazinoids, released from the rye, which are believed to play a role in weed suppression. The researchers found that weeds began to grow better as concentrations of the compounds diminished, within a few weeks of when the rye was killed. The compounds reached peak levels about a week after the rye was killed and dropped significantly within two or three weeks. The preliminary results suggest that the benzoxazinoids do affect soil chemistry and may enhance rye's weed-suppressing ability. The work is part of an effort to clarify such issues as how long rye should be grown before being killed, the amount of biomass needed to maximize its effects, and the impact of weather and soil conditions on its effectiveness.

To construct a physical map for wheat, the researchers are using a chromosome-by-chromosome approach, where chromosomes or chromosome arms are separated by the flow cytometry technique, Sehgal said. Then genomic DNA from each chromosome or chromosome arm is fragmented and cloned. Each clone is fingerprinted, and the data are analyzed to develop a fingerprint map. "Kendra and Raven form an excellent team," Sehgal said. "One develops the map and the other anchors the map with markers for defining the orientation and comparative genomics with other crops like rice and corn." Miller's role in the project involves inoculating bacteria with DNA that the lab researchers want to analyze. Then she isolates the DNA, which is then digested by enzymes and labeled with fluorescent dyes. Later it's put into a DNA sequencing machine, which is where a fingerprint map of each individual chromosome is developed. Skinner's role in the project involves the physical anchoring of markers on the cloned DNA segments. She also recently began replicating bacterial artificial chromosomes to show where specific clones are located in the wheat genome. Sehgal said physical maps are important for advances in wheat genetics and genomics because they are the first step in sequencing the entirety of the complex wheat genome. The maps demonstrate that large genomes like wheat can be sequenced chromosome by chromosome. This work is essential for understanding and manipulating the genetics of wheat for enhanced yield potential, resistance to pests and diseases, and tolerance of adverse environmental conditions. That means sustained development of better wheat varieties. "Mapping and sequencing the wheat genome will allow us to start looking at how we can feed more people with a larger yield or how we can grow wheat in

climates unsuited for vegetation," Skinner said. Skinner became involved with the research as a freshman at K-State. She said it wasn't difficult to find an on-campus research job. She visited K-State's Career and Employment Services and learned about the lab assistant opportunity. Skinner began her research experience by learning basic lab techniques like how to extract DNA from plant tissue. "I will be applying to medical school at the end of my junior year, and I think having a research job that involves mapping out a genome my first year in college will show how much I have to offer," Skinner said. "I've had the opportunity, which a lot of graduate students don't get, to work on a project that is worldwide and that will affect millions in the future." Miller also will apply to medical school. She said she wanted to work in a lab as an undergraduate to gain experience. "I love to be able to put a reason and an actual process behind the things I learn in textbooks, and here I am able to do that every day," she said. Two more students have recently started working with Sehgal on the physical mapping project: Aaron Avery, junior in biology, chemistry and predentistry and a 2006 Manhattan High School graduate; and Jayce Brandt, sophomore in agronomy and a 2008 Paola High School graduate. The projects are under the leadership of K-State's Bikram S. Gill, University Distinguished Professor of plant pathology. The research is funded by a \$1.5 million grant from the National Science Foundation. Funding also is provided through a \$1 million grant from the National Research Initiative of the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Institute of Food and Agriculture, which supports a collaboration between K-State and researchers at the U.S. Department of Agriculture in Fargo, N.D., and at South Dakota State University.

Joe and Connie Mushrush, Mushrush Red Angus, Strong City, received the 2009 Red Angus Breeder of the Year Award at the National Red Angus Convention in Mahanomen, Minn., Sept. 16-19. Frank Wedel of Leoti, fellow Red Angus breeder, presented the award to Mushrushes.
