She is going to have the opportunity to hear many member stories in the coming year when she serves as the 2009-2010 National FFA Secretary. She was elected to that office this past weekend at the 82nd National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Ind. This Labette County High School FFA Chapter member from Altamont was among six individuals selected from a field of 39 to hold a national office. Fulfilling her position will require traveling more than 100,000 miles; meeting top leaders in business, government and education; visiting approximately 40 states; and participating in an international experience tour to Japan. Her responsibilities will include providing personal growth and leadership training for students, setting policies that shape the future of the organization and promoting agricultural literacy.

The national FFA officer selection process is intense and represents an assessment of years of academic and extracurricular accomplishments made by each student running for office.

Nominees must first qualify on the state level to

state FFA associations. They then submit a thorough application, detailing their accomplishments and contributions to the community, along with an essay explaining their desire to be elected to national office.

Once at the convention, candidates participate in five rounds of interviews, take an in-depth written test on the organization and agricultural education topics and complete two writing exercises.

Bohnenblust attends Kansas State University in Manhattan, with a double major in agriculture communications and agriculture economics. While at school, she serves as an ag ambassador, is a member of the student alumni board, leads a Bible study group

and is a mentor for Big Brothers Big Sisters. In 2007 she served as president of the Kansas FFA Association.

As a member of FFA, Bohnenblust has had several supervised agricultural experience (SAE) programs. She has created a wildlife habitat on her family farm; raised sheep, rabbits, chickens and goats; and worked as a laborer and rental property co-manager for Bohnenblust Farms.

"I truly have a passion to serve others and to see them succeed, especially in the blue jacket," said Bohnenblust. "Serving as a national officer, I have the opportunity to not only hear other people's stories and how they are adding to FFA, but I can help them discover the purpose that only they can

FSA now issuing program payments, advises to check amounts

Adrian J. Polansky, state executive director Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Kansas announced that FSA is issuing payments to Kansas farmers and ranchers.

Conservation Reserve acres enrolled on 49,834 Program (CRP) rental payments are issued the first of October year. CRP particieach pants in Kansas received \$122,815,104 for 3,103,993

contracts. Across the country, participants received \$1.7 billion in CRP rental payments on approximately 33 million acres. CRP is the largest public-private partnership for conservation and wildlife habitat in the United States. This voluntary program helps agricultural producers safeguard environmentally sensitive land. Producers enroll in CRP and plant long-term, resource-conserving covers to improve water quality, control soil erosion and enhance habitats for waterfowl and wildlife. In return, USDA provides producers with annual rental and costshare payments on 10 to 15 year contracts.

Final Direct Payments under the 2009 Direct and Counter-Cyclical Program (DCP) are currently being issued. Approximately \$308.8 million will be issued, with producers receiving an advance payment of 22 percent earlier in the year.

Payment Statements will be mailed from the Kansas City Accounting Office for the entire country and not the local FSA county office. Therefore, producers may receive their electronic payment in their bank account before they receive their Payment Statement in the mail. Producers should be aware that a new webbased payment system is being used for all FSA payments.

Because of a glitch found in the new web-based payment system, some CRP assignments were not applied to producer payments. Assignment of payments provided by lenders are a service of FSA, but the financial obligation is between the producer and their financial institution. Producers with assignments that received their payment instead of it going to their lender shall contact their financial institution to make appropriate payment arrangements.

The DCP Advance Direct Payments equal to 22 percent of the total earned were issued last spring on the old payment system. Because of that, when the DCP Final Direct Payments were issued, there was no way for the new web-based payment system to know that 22 percent of the total payment was already issued. Therefore, all the Advance Direct ceivables on the new payment system so they would be subtracted from the Total Direct Payment calculated on the new payment

However, if there were multiple receivables for different farms and counties they were totaled to one amount and subtracted from the first Direct Payment issued for the producer no matter what farm or what county. Freeze has impact on soybean crop; producers in western regions will need to make decisions

Typically, some late-maturing soybean fields suffer from freeze damage in the fall, but more soybean acres than normal have been affected this year in western Kansas, according to Kent Martin, crops and soils specialist with Kansas State University's Southwest Area Extension Office.

Temperatures fell to 24 degrees Oct. 10 in Garden City, 20 degrees at Tribune, and 20 degrees at Colby, he said. For much of western Kansas, the earliest killing freeze occurred Oct. 3. "This caused many late-maturing plants to die before the seeds were fully developed," Martin said. Temperatures in the range of 30 to 32 degrees damage soybean tops, the agronomist said. Wisconsin data show that 80 percent of soybean leaves were damaged after five minutes at 26 degrees. While freeze tolerance may be slightly higher in thick stands and narrower rows. Martin said, the Wisconsin were reduced when frost occurred at or before R6 (the stage at which seed fills the pod cavity at one of the four uppermost nodes). The most sensitive growth stage for economic yield loss was the R5 (seed 0.3 centimeter long at one of the four uppermost nodes). Yield reductions occur as a result of a reduction in number of beans per plant and reduced bean size, he said. The maturity of freeze- damaged soybeans is never delayed, but can be accelerated. "Soybean seeds that are soft and green at the time of the freeze will shrivel, but those in pods that have turned yellow may still mature normally," Martin said. "Clearly, green soybeans are undesirable because of low seed quality and yield, as well as poor end-use qualities. Green soybeans result in off-color meal and oil. They have to be refined out of the oil because of high levels of free fatty acids, which can cause

research found that yields the oil to become rancid." Martin outlined the options producers have with green soybeans.

> **Feeding to cattle** — If the soybeans are not moldy, they can be fed to beef cattle if introduced slowly. They should not be fed to young calves that do not have a functional rumen, but can make up to 7 percent of a growing calf's diet. In a roughage diet, the fat content should be limited to less than 4 percent, which is key in feeding green soybeans to

> Grazing — The best growth stage for grazing freeze-damaged soybeans is when the plants are in R4 to R5 (full pod to 0.3 cm long seed at one of the four uppermost nodes). The cattle need to have another forage source available, which could include grass pasture,

concern at times, but is less of a concern than with alfalfa or clover.

Haying or Ensiling -Freeze-damaged soybeans can be a great source of hay or silage for livestock. The best time to harvest soybeans for silage is near maturity, but before leaf loss. When ensiling, producers must add another source of fermentable carbohydrates, such as ground corn grain or molasses (minimum of 10 percent on a dry matter basis), because soybeans near maturity are low in soluble carbohydrates.

"Without the addition of other materials, the silage will have an unpleasant smell and be low quality," Martin said. "Soybeans may be cut for hay at any time because both forage and pods provide digestible pro-

hay or silage. Bloat may be a tein. Some portions of the hay may not be eaten by the cattle, though, due to refusal - which can be substantial in some cases."

Storage — If not sold or fed to livestock, soybeans must be stored. Green soybeans will require special considerations. Note that the soybeans will not lose their green color, although it will be camouflaged after being mixed with other beans. More specifically, aeration does not affect the internal color of green soybeans. But, aerating green soybeans quickly is still very important because of their greater risk of spoilage from mold or insects while in storage. "During aeration, the grain temperature should be reduced to below 40 degrees as soon as possible," Martin said. "Note that it will take longer to aerate these smaller, immature beans, and make adjustments accordingly. The storage risks for green soybeans are the same as they are for yellow soybeans, as long as they are stored at the recommended 18 percent moisture."



First of all, what does it mean to be rural? The best definition of "rural" is one of low population density.

For residents of Canada, Great Britain, Australia and the United States, a better description would be: Those who live in geographically isolated, low population areas where occupations are tied to natural resources. They have more in common with each other than they do with their fellow countryman in cities and towns of any size.

Social dynamics and mental health. Small numbers of people living in sparsely populated areas create their own peculiar social dynamics. The values of rural life are more family, social and community based.

The social and relational

Is there such a thing as rural mental health?

parts of rural life are more conceive. powerful in terms of stress and in their psychological rewards. Rural people understand what it means to belong to a close knit community. They put stock in being a good neighbor. They have lifelong relationships with relatives close by and friends who seem like family.

Occupations and careers are important, but in a larger context of social obligations and constraints. People count. Community counts. The landscape is familiar and comforting. Family history and connection is meaningful. Local history is passed on as a part of heritage. Each person's future and family well-being are tied in with place. Living somewhere else, doing something else, is hard to

Personal identity is drawn from the association and support of other people. Belonging and being in good standing with the group has deep meaning. Reliance on social identity is at once a strength and a weakness. The boundaries between oneself and others is more fluid and subject to pressures and threat.

What are some common dilemmas and problems facing people in rural communities?

Dealing with powerful social expectations and pres-

Finding it difficult to say

Being expected to participate in time-consuming social and community events.

Being too successful in a

community where others are easily threatened.

Being judged by social comparisons to peers in the local community.

Becoming easily upset or disturbed by adverse public opinion. Fault-finding and gossiping are tactics used to control others' behavior or hurt others.

Maintaining appearances at a personal cost of being unauthentic. Not feeling emotional safety in expressing feelings, problems or divergent opinionsbeing criticized for being too open, spontaneous and honest.

Serving in multiple roles and encountering others in different roles and settings means getting behind a mask. Social harmony comes at the personal expense of stifling true opinions and feelings.

Not being able to solve problems because conflict itself is viewed as harmful. It is easier to cover up a problem than to get people to try out seldom used conflict-resolution skills.

Being too different or out-of-step with strict community standards.

Viewing onself as causing and solving one's own difficulties means not turning to others for help.

An urban person would say, "Who cares what other people think?" A rural person knows there is social accountability and obligation.

Rural drinking problems. The social acceptability of alcohol use in many rural social situations can add personal problems. While rural communities do not have a corner on alcohol problems, a lack of entertainment and recreation activities can lead to the use of alcohol to enliven social life.

Some people are more genetically vulnerable to alcoholism and/or the social pressures that go with regular drinking. This can lead to marriage and family problems.

Financial pressures. Another common rural stressor is the increasingly marginal rural economy. Economic pressures mount in markets where population continues to decline. Wages are typically low and alternatives other than self-employment are limited.

Depression and anxiety are common problems when personal or business finances are precarious. Farming, ranching, fishing, mining and the timber industry rural occupations that deal with raw commodities that are tied to geography —

have tremendous economic pressures due to prices being set by variable commodity markets. Living constantly on the edge takes an emotional toll.

Some stressors are peculiar to farming and ranching. Management decisions are often reactions to weather conditions, which sometimes can be a disaster. Having little control over product market prices also makes financial risks and stress great. Too much farm and ranch debt puts the family livelihood, identity and way of life at risk and is probably the greatest source of stress.

Complex technology, expensive inputs, seasonal pressures, combining the work and home environments, labor shortages, supervisory responsibilities, and other on-farm enterprises and off/farm employment



Advocacy to be the focus of livestock group's annual meeting A veterinarian who is providing national leadership on the animal care issue, the

chief executive officer of the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) and a U.S. senator from Kansas are among those on the program for the Kansas Livestock Association (KLA) Convention in Wichita. The group's annual meeting will take place December 3-4 at the Wichita Hyatt and Century II Convention Center. Responding to the mis-

leading or false accusations of animal activists will be the underlying theme of several convention presentations. It will start with Beef Industry University (BIU), sponsored by the Farm Credit Associations of Kansas, where Kansas State University veterinarian Dan Thomson will talk about how activist groups are working to eliminate livestock production through public information campaigns, ballot initiatives and federal regulations. Thomson is co-chairman of the new North American Food Animal Well-Being Commission for Beef, organized earlier this year to facilitate communication of animal care practices to the public and advance cattle health and welfare.

Thomson will bring the academic perspective to the BIU discussion about how land-grant universities, industry organizations and individual producers are cooperating to amplify the livestock industry's voice on animal care issues. He is the Jones professor of production medicine and epidemiology at the K-State College of Veterinary Medicine and

serves as director of K-State's Beef Cattle Institute. Thomson also chairs the World Organization for Animal Health Ad Hoc Group on Animal Welfare in Beef Cattle Production Systems.

Four members of the KLA and Kansas Beef Council (KBC) staff will follow Thomson on the BIU program by taking a comprehensive look at where the industry stands on animal care and the environment, and efforts to protect members' common business interests on these is-

Clayton Huseman, executive director of the KLA Feedlot Division, will explain best management practices contained in the industry's Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) program. He'll tell producers how following BQA protocol can be the basis for reassuring consumers beef is humanely raised and wholesome.

KLA Vice President and General Counsel Allie Devine will discuss legislative and regulatory proposals activists are using to achieve the overarching goal of eliminating animal agriculture. She will describe the efforts of KLA and NCBA to address these challenges in a very difficult political environment.

Two speakers will talk about the industry's efforts to correct misinformation about animal care practices and environmental stewardship. KLA Vice President of Communications Todd Domer will discuss why ranchers, feeders and industry supporters must step outside their



comfort zones and use their cap-and-trade, healthcare reinherent credibility with consumers to tell positive stories about beef production. He'll be joined by KBC Executive Director Todd Johnson, who will highlight some of the checkoff-funded programs designed to train producers to be industry advocates and help connect them with consumers.

The subject of Domer and Johnson's presentation will carry over to the Consumer Trends Forum, hosted by KBC and the Kansas Cattle-Women. Several KLA members will share how they are taking key beef industry messages directly to con-

NCBA Chief Executive Officer Forrest Roberts will speak to KLA members for the first time since he took over the position early this year. Roberts will review the work of the NCBA Governance Task Force and what that will mean for members. He also will discuss some of the issues NCBA currently is addressing in Washington, D.C., including proposed restrictions on antibiotic use in livestock and efforts to regulate the industry's greenhouse gas emissions. His presentation is sponsored by Micro Beef Technologies.

U.S. Sen. Sam Brownback will offer further insight on issues affecting KLA members in Congress. His discussion list will include





Biomass 'trash' can be alternative energy treasure

An intriguing part of looking to biomass as a non-fossil fuel source is what it can do with leftovers — trash. Biomass is a renewable energy source because it can be anything organic. While some organics are better than others. the potential energy sources in Kansas include crop residues, animal manure, switchgrass, grain crops and wood, said Bob Atchison, Kansas Forest Service (KFS) rural programs coordinator. Some biomass gets converted into ethanol, Atchison said. Some becomes milled pellets, sawdust or wood chips that, in combination with a converted boiler, can substitute for fossil fuels. "With today's new combustion technologies, for example, wood is one of the energy sources that can be clean-

burning — carbon neutral. So, you simply need to manage your forest sustainably," he said. "Yet, wood is a surprisingly untapped energy source for Kansas residents.

He pointed out that Florida's New Hope Power Partnership has become the largest biomass power plant in North America, using just sugar cane fiber and recycled urban wood. The 140megawatt facility generates enough power to run its large milling and refining operations, as well as to supply electricity for almost 60,000 homes. In effect, the company is reducing U.S. oil consumption by 1-plus million barrels a year. Naturally, Atchison has no interest in clear-cutting Kansas trees as a short-term energy

solution.

But, Kansas' community tree-care work and its wood products manufacturing already produce "leftovers" that add up to an annual 282,724 "green" tons of biomass — 66 percent of which is never used, according to KFS estimates. Municipal and county disposal sites receive another 58,327 tons of woody trash and debris each year, much of which ends up occupying some of the remaining space in local landfills. "Kansas also has 2.1 million acres of forest. That's about 72 million tons of livetree biomass," Atchison said. "This resource is largely unmanaged. If the economics can fall in place, though, it offers a great opportunity for biomass and sustainable forest management."

Farm Service Agency announces program deadlines

Adrian J. Polansky, state executive director of USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Kansas made several announcements affecting program deadlines for Kansas farmers and ranchers.

Enrollment for the 2010 Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) and the Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) program has begun and will continue through June 1, 2010. USDA computes DCP Program payments using base acres and payment yields established for each farm.

Eligible producers receive direct payments at rates established by statute regardless of market prices. Producers may request an advance direct payment based on 22 percent of the direct payment. USDA will issue advance direct payments beginning Dec. 1, 2009.

Counter-cyclical payment rates vary depending on market prices. Countercyclical payments are issued only when the effective price for a commodity is below its target price.

The optional ACRE Program provides a safety net based on state revenue losses and acts in place of the price-based safety net of counter-cyclical payments

under DCP. A farm's payment is based on a revenue guarantee calculated using a 5-year average state yield and the most recent 2-year national price for each eligible commodity. An ACRE payment is issued when both the state and the farm have incurred a revenue

The payment is based on 83.3 percent (85 percent in 2012) of the farm's planted acres times the difference between the State ACRE guarantee and the state revenue times the ratio of the farm's yield divided by the state expected yield. In exchange for participating in ACRE, in addition to not receiving counter-cyclical payments, a farm's direct payment is reduced by 20 percent, and marketing assistance loan rates are reduced by 30 percent.

The decision to enroll in the ACRE Program is irrevocable. Once enrolled, the farm shall be enrolled for that initial crop year and will remain in ACRE through the 2012 crop year. The June 1, 2010, deadline for DCP and ACRE is mandatory and USDA will not accept any late-filed applications.

The Guaranteed Loan Program allows commercial and farm credit lenders to extend credit to qualified applicants, who otherwise would not meet their standard lending criteria. Participating lenders can use the Guaranteed Loan Program to strengthen a loan's viability through a guarantee of up to 95 percent of the loan amount.

Farmers interested in guaranteed loans should apply through a conventional lender. FSA also offers the Direct Loan Program as an alternative for those unable to obtain financing from commercial credit sources. Direct farm loans are government-funded, and made by FSA. The loan limit

\$1,112,000, effective Oct. 1. for loans under the Direct Program is \$300,000. A percentage of FSA's farm loan funds are set-aside for socially disadvantaged appli-(minorities cants women) and beginning farm-

Other FSA programs currently available are Farm Storage Facility Loans, Milk Income Loss Contract Program, Livestock Indemnity Program, Livestock Forage Program, Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish, Commodity Loans and Loan Deficiency Payments, Continuous CRP, Biomass Crop Assistance Program and Non-Insured Crop Disaster Assistance Program.

For Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) coverage, eligible producers must apply and pay the applicable service fees by the application closing date. NAP Service Fees are \$250 per crop; \$750 per county; \$1,875 per producer for all counties. Dec. 1 is the final application closing date for all grasses, alfalfa, apricots, asparagus, blueberries, caneberries, cherries, clover, grapes, lespedeza, honey, mixed forage, nectarines, oats, peaches, plums, strawberries, and vetch.

The fall leaf color has been wonderful. Cool days along with sun aids in the leaves having vivid colors. If I had a way to select weather from year to year, it would be much like this year has

Once the leaves drop from the plant, they can either be a nuisance or a resource. Leaves can be chopped up using the lawn mower and left on the lawn. The grass will need sunlight

and air. Keep the leaf size small enough to allow the grass to thrive. These pieces of leaves will break down over the winter. Nutrients (free fertilizer) will become available for the grass to

Leaves that collect in the street and at the curb could become a pollutant to our water ways. Since these leaves are free fertilizer, it makes sense to scoop them up and use them. They can

be chopped up and used on the lawn or chopped up and worked into the vegetable or flower bed. If you have other organic materials, they can be chopped up and worked into the soil along with the leaves. My annuals and dead tops to perennials get chopped up and turned into fertilizer.

Some tender plants can be mulched with leaves. It is the air between the leaf particles that provides the insulation.

Loose mulch is better than compacted. There are some plants that leaf mulch will not be beneficial. A rule of thumb is that gray foliage plants like a drier soil both in summer and winter. Lavender that had tree leaves covering them this past winter at the courthouse was damaged.

There may be a case where you have more leaves than you can use. Riley County residents can take leaves to the composting site at the transfer station at 1881

Henton Road. There is no fee to drop-off leaves. The dropped off leaves will be composted. Compost makes a good fertilizer for plants. It will cost you a small fee to get your leaves back as com-

Once a year you get a chance to have free fertilizer. I hope you can take advantage of nature's gift. You can find out more information on

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

We had vet another week in which the US Dollar Index fell to a new low for the move. Technical indicators are oversold and the market is due for a correction, but there is really nothing that indicates we are near a change in trend in the Dollar. For the time being we have to look at strength in the Dollar as a selling opportunity. For at least the past year the Dollar Index and the US stock markets have been moving in opposite directions. That means if the Dollar looks like it is due for a correction, then the stock market should too, and it does. Both the Dow Jones and the S&P 500 posted a reversal down on the charts Wednesday, which is often times a sign of a top, so be looking for a correction in the stock market next week.

The corn market performed well last week with gaining 25 ¾ cents. The market closed lower on Friday and well off the daily highs, which makes it look like the corn is ready for a setback. The market is overbought and due for a correction, and if we have a correction in the Dollar and the Stock market it makes it all the more likely that we will see one in the corn as well. The weak Dollar has certainly been a benefit to the corn market, but it isn't the only factor. Harvest delays and concerns that USDA is over estimating corn yield are also driving the market. Both the trading funds and Index funds have been active buyers, which means there is still a great deal of money coming into commodity markets in general. How much longer it will last is hard to judge, but so far we have seen no indication that it is ending. In the short run it looks like the December corn could pull back to the \$3.71 area, but a move to that level is probably a buying opportunity. Until harvest activity speeds up, or the Dollar ends its down trend, or the funds quit buying, the trend in the corn going to be up.

The wheat futures led the way higher last week. The December KW gained 39 cents. It is still strange that the wheat is the upside leader, but there are some valid reasons for the buying interest. The wet weather in the Corn Belt and Delta is not only slowing the corn and soybean harvest it is slowing the SRW planting as well. For example, Monday's progress report showed that only 13% on the Illinois wheat crop has been planted compared with 67% on average. That has traders concerned that acreage could be less than expected, which could in turn help to control next years ending stocks level.

Export sales have also been improving, with this week's total coming in at 627,600 MT. We haven't had any huge numbers that would get speculators really excited, but if sales could stay at this level for several weeks in a row, maybe we could get rid of some of our burdensome wheat supplies. The wheat market needs to see lower supplies and better demand and right now we are taking a few first steps in that direc-

The sovbeans were firm last week as well. The November contract gained 13 34 cents and broke out of its trading range. The problem, from a technical perspective, is that the beans ran into trend line resistance Friday, stalled out, and had a poor close. The beans are overbought like the wheat and corn and look like they are going to have a setback to start next week. The sovbeans have a very good fundamental outlook due to the excellent demand. Export sales were great at 987,300 MT and there is no sign of

the sales slowing. The wet weather in the Corn Belt is also supportive as it causes harvest delays and yield loss. The November crop report is still weeks away, but it could be much more friendly than the October report if USDA has to increase the export estimate and rethink their yield estimate.

Next week look for the November beans to pull back to the \$9.80 - \$9.90 area, but look at the weakness as an opportunity to replace sold bushels with call

Nitrogen cycling via cover crops protects groundwater

One of the range of reasons for growing cover crops is to "trap" nitrogen in the soil and preserve it for future use.


A trap crop actually absorbs nitrogen from the soil, said Dave Mengel, soil fertility specialist with Kansas State University Research and Extension. Unless the crop is then grazed or harvested, however, the nitrogen it absorbs will remain on-site, preserved within the residue for use by future crops. This helps reduce the soil nitrogen losses that can occur between cash crops, he said, due to either leaching or denitrification (natural process by which bacteria convert nitrates into nitrogen gas).

Fast-growing, nitrogendemanding crops are ideal as trap crops, Mengel said. Good choices include millet or forage sorghum, planted in summer after winter wheat. Others choices are cereal rye, wheat, triticale or canola, planted in fall after summer crops. "Keep in mind that trap crops use the soil nitrogen they take up to support their own growth. And, in most cases, they end up with a high carbon-to-nitrogen ratio," he added. "So, the release of that nitrogen to following crops may be slow. In fact, the second or third subsequent crop may be the one that finally benefits from the trapped

nitrogen."

Nonetheless, trapped nitrogen simply isn't avail-

able to move through the soil to contaminate groundwater, Mengel pointed out.

Oklahoma-made cheese takes the gold prize

COMANCHE, Okla. (AP) — People used to give the Mc-Garr family a strange look when they explained that they ran a sheep dairy.

"If we had a dollar for every person who said 'You can milk sheep?' we'd never have to work again," Lee McGarr

They still get strange looks from people, but have a gold medal and a second place award in international cheese competitions to give credance that they aren't crazy for milking sheep.

McGarr is a pilot by trade. He has a small orchard south of Comanche, Oklahoma - K,S&A Orchards - and his own personal landing strip. The trouble is that it took a long time to mow the landing strip.

Between myself, Kim and the girls, we'd each do a couple passes with the mower," McGarr said. "By the time we'd finish, it would be dark and time to start all over again."

McGarr decided to get a few sheep to help keep the strip

Kim McGarr, McGarr's wife, had stumbled upon a recipe for soap made out of milk, and decided to try the recipe with the sheep's milk.

One night, they were making a batch of the soap and accidentally forgot about the milk heating and it over pasturized and started making cheese.

McGarr added some blue cheese culture to it and finished out the process. He tried the recipe out on his neighbors, which he calls his guinea pigs.

'They're brutally honest," McGarr said, "and they liked

He decided to turn his accidental success into a professional venture and pursued the idea of a USDA-approved sheep dairy.

McGarr contacted a USDA health inspector and told them what their intentions were.

"The guy must have been thinking 'these guys are crazy," McGarr said.

The McGarr family now has gone from three sheep to close to 300 sheep and own and operate one of only three USDA-approved sheep dairies in the nation, and the only one

They have only been making cheese for three years but have been steadily growing every since. When asked how much they usually make a year, the McGarrs couldn't give an accurate number.

"The first year we did probably 150 wheels of cheese,"

The next year, they made considerably more, but due to a cooler malfunction, had to discard almost 550 wheels.

"That was a bad day," Kim McGarr said.

As well as milking them and making cheese, the McGarrs use the rest of the sheep for various meat products after they can no longer make milk and sell the wool when they are sheared.

The McGarrs use their sheep much like a herd of cattle they still develop a bond and friendship between themselves and members of the flock.

"We give them names if they do something or stand out in any way," Kim McGarr said. "Not always good things, mind you, but that's how some of them get their names."

A sheep named "Ford" got it's name from being born in a Ford pickup during the winter.

They also have a sheep named Goofy that would follow the dogs around on the farm and act as if it was one of

"I went out and saw this white blob between the dogs and thought 'Oh no, Goofy's dead," Kim McGarr said, "but he just hopped right up with the dogs and was fine.

"They all have their own personalities," McGarr said.

The family loves their flock, and daughters Sarah and Ashley are avidly involved in the process of caring for them.

Even the name of the business reflects how much of a family business it really is.

"K,S&A stands for Kim, Sarah and Ashley," McGarr said. They have worked hard over a period of several years and all that hard work paid off this year when they entered their "trubleu" cheese into the Los Angeles International Dairy competition and received a gold medal.

"They only award gold medals to people who score over a 98 on a scale of 100," Kim McGarr said.

They also entered their cheese in a competition in Austin, Texas this year.

"It's an international competition," Kim McGarr said, "and there were over 1,300 entries from all over the world."

The McGarrs' "tru-bleu" took second overall. "Unfortunately we lost to the French," McGarr said, "but they've been doing cheese for however many hundreds of

They were very happy with their placing, but almost didn't get judged at all.

We shipped two wheels to the competition and they should have arrived right on time," McGarr said.

"We got a call from the committee . . . saying that the internal temperature of our cheese was too high."

Turns out that their delivery was on the hottest day Austin had seen all year. In the process of sorting through and distributing the entries, theirs just sat on the loading dock too long.

"We were in Tulsa and couldn't send another sample, so they just put a red sticker on it," Kim McGarr said.

'That meant that the judges could judge it if they wanted, but it wasn't a guarantee that they would."

The next day they received a call from a friend saying that they had received second place in the competition.

We were the first Oklahoma dairy to ever place in the competition," McGarr said. "Our business has really picked up since we won that award. We're selling as fast as we can make it right now."

Workshop to focus on **SARE** grant-writing set for Nov. 3 in Missouri

Farmers and ranchers can learn how to write and submit proposals for grants to promote sustainable agriculture practices at a Nov. 3 workshop at the August A. Busch Conservation Nature Center in St. Charles, Mo.

Funding for the grants comes from the USDA's Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education (SARE)

"These grants allow farmers and ranchers an opportunity to test new sustainable-agriculture techniques and demonstrate how they can be used over a wider area," said Debi Kelly, University of Missouri Extension associate, Missouri SARE co-coordinator and workshop instructor.

SARE invites farmers or ranchers operating in USDA's North Central Region, which includes Missouri and Kansas, to submit proposals that test and evaluate adaptable sustainable agriculture practices for their operations. Grants upt to \$6,000 for individuals or up to \$18,000 for groups of three or more people from separate operations are available.

Deadline for submitting proposals is Dec. 3.

SARE expects to fund about 50 projects in the region, Kelly said.

"Proposals should show how farmers and ranchers plan to use their own innovative ideas to explore sustainable agriculture options and how they will share project results," she said.

North Central Region SARE has funded more than 700 farmer and rancher grants worth more than \$4.3 million since the program's inception in 1992.

The one-day workshop runs 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., with registration starting at 9 a.m. Cost is \$25, which includes lunch and workshop materials.

"We will take participants step-by-step through the application process," Kelly said. "My goal is to have every participant walk out of the workshop with the backbone of the grant written."

SARE awards grants for a wide range of ideas related to sustainable agriculture. Examples of 2009 projects include use of green manure crops, reducing parasites in yellow perch production, pasture management and vegetable production.
