Knowing what contributes to BRD can help minimize its impact

Bovine respiratory disease (BRD) is an infectious disease complex and one of the most common causes of morbidity and mortality in stocker and feedlot operations. Understanding the many factors that contribute to the BRD complex is an important step for producers to take in managing the disease. When BRD hits, a perfect storm of stress factors, virus agents and bacteria are at play in the animal's respiratory system.

"There are multiple layers of the immune system protecting the respiratory tract, and once we compromise any one of them, we have the potential for a problem," explained Daniel Scruggs, DVM, DACVP, Pfizer Animal Health veterinarian. "Compromise two or more with a mix of stress, viral infection and bacterial infection and you are starting down a difficult road."

Stress factors, such as weaning and transporting, commingling and crowding,

and inadequate nutrition, usually set the stage for BRD by reducing the animal's disease resistance. Scruggs noted that castration and dehorning are some of the main stressors on the immune system, so producers should do these as early as possible to minimize blood loss and allow for a faster immune system recovery. Other factors like transition to new climates, heat stress, access to water, and dust also contribute heavily to the complex.

To reduce the stress factors that contribute to BRD, Scruggs recommended weaning and vaccinating prior to shipment, minimizing commingling by buying cattle from one source, giving cattle room to spread out, minimizing dust, maximizing water availability and avoiding gastrointestinal disturbances by slowly incorporating higher concentrate feed into their diets.

"Producers should al-

ways keep in mind the number of cattle they can effectively manage and not purchase more cattle than they can look out for," Scruggs said. "Make sure you match your type, class, and risk level of cattle to the amount of available time and resources on your operation."

As these factors place stress on the immune system and stack on top of each other, the door is open for viral and bacterial agents to invade. A primary viral infection of the upper respiratory tract is often the next step in the BRD complex.

"Anything that improves bacteria's ability to attach to respiratory mucosa, proliferate and migrate down into the lung impacts the respiratory tract and makes it susceptible to colonization with a wide variety of bacteria," Scruggs said. "The viral agents are probably the most effective at compromising the respiratory defense mechanisms to allow bacterial BRD to flourish, but there are other factors that may be as effective."

When examining the viral agents of the BRD complex, the main diseases to watch out for include bovine viral diarrhea (BVD). infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR), bovine respiratory synctial virus (BRSV) and parainfluenza type 3 (PI3). Because these are often the viral agents producers vaccinate for, confirming a purchased calf's vaccinations and working with your veterinarian to incorporate a modified-live vaccine on arrival is an important step in managing BRD. But Scruggs cautioned there are other viruses and factors that can predispose animals to BRD, so vaccination is not going to be entirely protective by itself.

Once stress factors and viruses attack an animal, dangerous bacteria, like Mycoplasma bovis.

Mannheimia haemolytica, Pasteurella multocida and

Histophillus somni, are given the perfect opportunity to settle into the lower respiratory tract with little resistance from the animal's

immune system. Each bacteria common to the BRD complex is a little different, and unfortunately it is virtually impossible to determine which organisms are affecting cattle by visual appraisal alone. Difficult to identify, Mycoplasma bovis is considered one of the most frequent causes of retreatments. peat haemolytica is often associated with calves that get sick quickly and is known to be the most responsible for death loss, while P. multocida is commonly associated with treatment failures much like Mycoplasma bovis. H. somni tends to be a problem in northern climates, but has been recognized in all cattle-producing areas, and can look like M. haemolytica.

"It's important to realize that we often don't get just one, but a combination of

bacteria in a case of BRD," added Scruggs.

In addition to minimizing stress factors and vaccinating, the use of on-arrival anti-infectives with extended therapy in higher risk cattle is a key BRD management technique. Not only does this technique allow producers to reduce the number of pulls initially, but it provides more time to pay attention to the management factors that reduce sickness in the first place. Multiple studies show that using tulathromycin on arrival provides significant improvement in morbidity, mortality and first-treatment success rates on stocker and feedlot operations.

"With the use of anti-infectives on arrival, you can pay attention to things that make you money," encouraged Scruggs.

"When health becomes the limiting factor in production it is probably costing you a lot more than just the medicine bill and death loss," stated Scruggs.

Risk Management Agency points out details of compliance to producers

Extremely wet harvest conditions are occurring in many areas causing delayed harvest of sugar beets, potatoes, cotton, corn, and soybeans. In some cases, the moisture content is so high the crop cannot be physically harvested with normal harvest equipment.

The most important action you can do is to contact your crop insurance agent to report a loss, indicating your harvest is delayed because of adverse weather, which is an insured cause of loss. You must then continue to carry out normal and customary harvesting practices, if possible.

Your crop insurance policy will cover loss of quality (as specified in the crop provisions), reduced yields and revenue losses if revenue coverage was chosen. The cost of drying the harvested crop is not covered.

If you are unable to harvest by the calendar date for the End of the Insurance Period (EOIP) due to extreme wet or snowy conditions, you may request additional time to harvest beyond the calendar date for the EOIP, from your crop insurance company.

The EOIP is December 10 for most spring planted crops The specific date is

found in your applicable crop provisions and is a contractual date that is not extended by the Risk Management Agency (RMA). Read the applicable crop provisions in your policy to be sure of the date.

RMA procedures (Loss Adjustment Manual Standards Handbook, FCIC 25010) allow your crop insurance company to authorize policyholders, on a case by case basis, additional time to attempt to harvest so their claims can be settled on the basis of harvested production.

Your crop insurance company may allow additional time to harvest when the following conditions are

You give timely notice of are granted additional time loss to the crop insurance agent; and the crop insurance company determines and documents that the delay in harvest was due to an insured cause of loss: and you demonstrate to the crop insurance company that harvest was not possible due to insured causes; and the delay in harvest was not due to uninsured causes of loss, nor because you did not have sufficient equipment or manpower to harvest the crop by the calendar date for the EOIP.

When the crop insurance company authorizes additional time to harvest, the calendar date for the EOIP is not extended. Rather, you to attempt to harvest the crop in order to settle any loss on the basis of harvested production. Any additional damage to your crop (by an insured cause of loss) during the extension period is covered. Any avoidable loss of production will be charged as an appraisal against the guarantee in your policy.

It is important that you document conditions for your acreage and the actions you take in order to receive an accurate claim payment if one is due. You must harvest your crop during the extension period if a window of opportunity arises. If you do not, the crop insurance company will appraise the acreage at that time and finalize the claim based on that appraisal. Damage occurring after the window of opportunity to harvest is uninsurable.

If there is significant snow cover, if the crop is under water, or if extreme wet conditions exist, the crop insurance company should not (and is not required to), perform final inspections when conditions make it impossible to obtain appraisals accurately.

If weather conditions are delaying your harvest, contact your crop insurance agent to report a loss and request additional time to harvest in order to protect your crop insurance cover-



Rare birds flew into Kansas evening of Nov. 4; hunting limited at Cheyenne Bottoms, closed at Quivira NWR

endangered cranes were whooping spotted by Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP) staff at Cheyenne Bottoms Wildlife Area, near Great Bend, the evening of Nov. 4. Central Kansas is one of the most popular annual stopover points for migrating whooping cranes. In addition to the 12 birds reported from the Cheyenne Bottoms office, and another three were spotted on The Nature Conservancy property nearby.

In response to the sightings, Bottoms staff have closed the goose firing line. Pool 1B, where the birds are staying, is a refuge area. However, waterfowl hunters should be aware that other pools may be closed if the birds move.

Quivira National

Wildlife Refuge, about 30 miles south and east of Chevenne Bottoms, another 14 whoopers were spotted by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service staff. In response, the entire refuge is closed to hunting until further notice. For daily updates on Quivira's whooper status, go online to www.fws.gov/quivira.

Although most whooping cranes usually have migrated through the Kansas by the opening of sandhill crane season — Nov. 11 this year - whoopers are sometimes sighted into early December. Sandhill crane hunters — and all migratory bird hunters — should expect to see whooping cranes throughout central Kansas and be sure of their targets before shooting. All sandhill crane hunters are required to take an online crane identification test before purchasing a sandhill crane permit. The test may be found by going to the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP) website, www.kdwp.state. ks.us, and typing "sandhill crane" in the search box at the top of the home page.

Hunters who see a whooping crane are asked to report it to the nearest KDWP office. All hunters should check with public hunting areas before planning a hunt.

Climate change panel gives insight into the discussion

By Kaleb Little

Six expert panelists, the K-State director of sustainability, a room full of faculty and students and two hours of discussion, and one thing was very clear; climate change is a very complex issue. The focus of the panel discussion on climate change and food production was how agriculture fits into the climate change picture, and how to find common ground between producing food and preserving re-

The panel discussion was held on the Kansas State University campus on October 22nd and was sponsored by the Alpha Zeta Agriculture Honorary Fraternity, and was organized by the K-

State department of Agricultural Communications and Journalism.

The event started with an opening from the moderator, Ben Champion. Champion, K-State director of sustainability, is tasked with developing a university-wide approach for addressing sustainability at K-State. One of the ways he works to do that is through open discussions on sustainability such as this.

Some of the major issues raised in the discussion were food security, natural resource security and climate

Food Security

Chuck Rice, distinguished professor in agronomy at K-State said, "Food

production must double by 2050 to meet the growing population of the world.' That increase in a need for food is a major issue around the world. The number of chronically or acutely malnourished in the world is around 854 million, or about 15% of our total population, Rice said.

Scott Staggenborg, professor in crop systems in agronomy, said that the average U.S. consumer doesn't see a problem with food security. "The reason they don't see a problem is because there is a disconnect between the food production process and most consumers," Staggenborg said.

Another issue with food security is a lack of farm-

the lack of new lands entering production around the world, farmers must continue to become more efficient in their production practices. Over the last 40 years grain production has doubled with less acreage said Mary Rezac, professor of Chemical Engineering and co-director of the Center for Sustainable Energy. "The main reason for that is the huge increase in the use of fertilizer around the world," said Rezac. "A five-fold increase in 40 years has had an enormous impact."

Natural **Resource Security**

When producing enough food for a growing popula-

land. Rice said, because of tion, the security of natural resources for the future becomes very important. "So far we have been able to avoid a global famine catastrophe, but with an estimated 9.1 billion population by 2050 it is going to become very tricky," said John Harrington, professor of geography with emphasis in climate change. We have a fixed resource base, and with increased production comes increased water use, Harrington said. Rice added that only around one percent of the earth's water is available for use. "Water is a huge constraint on production agriculture," Harrington

> There is usually a clash between natural resource

preservation and production agriculture practices, Staggenborg said, but right now agronomy can be part of the solution. "We have the ability to produce a lot of grain in this country and now we can step back and say, how can we do it better?" Staggenborg said. This ability to adjust production practices to have the least impact is very important to the security of our natural resources.

Climate Change

Of the big three issues from the panel discussion, the changing world climate seemed to be the largest and least definable problem of them all. One of the questions asked of the panel that received a wide array of re-

sponses was: what is the role of agriculture in climate change? Should agriculture work to adapt to climate change or try to slow down climate change?

Mitigating climate change is difficult in tropical areas of the globe due to production practices, said Telmo Amado professor of Agronomy and Soil Science at the Federal University of Santa Maria, Brazil. "Carbon sequestration in tropical areas is difficult now because of production practices where farmers use every bit of plant matter," Amado said. "It is hard to implement no-till practices when there is nothing left on the ground after harvest."

However, Rice said, "It has been estimated that 10-18% of greenhouse gas emissions can be offset by agricultural practices." This is a good sign for those who believe agriculture should work to prevent climate change.

For those that feel that

agriculture should work to adapt to a changing climate, Staggenborg said, "Crops will be able to adapt fairly easily with what we do on a yearly basis with seed genetics." The problems with adapting to climate change will come with livestock production and irrigation. "It's going to be very difficult for animals and plants to adapt to having less water," Staggenborg said. "This is why we must both mitigate to prevent climate change, as well as work to adapt to climate change."

Another important issue that comes with climate change is getting people to relate to the issues. Andrew McGowan, senior in Agronomy and Natural Resources and Environmental Sciences

"To get people to relate you have to educate, inform, and inspire." This can be a challenge in the Midwest because of the extreme variability of our weather.

"It is hard for a farmer in western Kansas to buy into climate change when our weather is so variable," Rice said. "It could be 70 degrees one day and snow the next, but we are talking about much more long-term trends." Harrington added, "Most people understand the system that gives us weather but it's hard to picture long-term changes like soil moisture and planting

Progress report from Nov. 2 shows the delay in harvest

Moisture across Kansas has slowed harvest for another week, with only a small portion of counties reporting less than half an inch of precipitation. Over 2 inches of rain were reported in Greenwood and Rice counties. The northwest area reported snowfall with over 8 inches in the Goodland area. Temperatures remained cold during the week but warmed to highs in the 70s by the weekend.

Precipitation and below normal temperatures limited producers to an average of only 2.1 days suitable for fieldwork.

Topsoil moisture supplies across Kansas were rated as 2 percent short, 68 percent adequate, and 30 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were rated as 1 percent very short, 6 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 16 percent surplus.

Limited activities for the week included harvesting corn, sorghum, sunflowers, and soybeans, along with planting winter wheat.

Below average temperatures combined with above average precipitation has delayed row crop harvest for the past 4 weeks. Sorghum is the hardest hit being 42 points behind average, while corn and soybeans are behind the average by 34 and 23 points, respectively. Fifty-two percent of the corn crop has been harvested, behind both last year at 69 percent and the 5- year average of 86 percent.

Corn condition is rated as 3 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 19 percent excellent. Eightynine percent of the sorghum crop has reached maturity, the same as last vear but behind the 5-vear average of 94 percent. Farmers have harvested only 17 percent of the sorghum crop, behind 2008 at 37 percent and 59 percent for the 5-year average.

Sorghum condition is rated as 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 25 percent fair, 51 percent good, and 18 percent excellent.

Fifty-five percent of the soybean crop has been harvested, behind 2008 at 70 percent and the 5-year average of 78 percent.

The condition of the soy bean crop is rated as 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 18 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 28 percent excellent. Snow and rain again slowed wheat planting, as the progress only advanced 3 points last

Eighty-three percent of the winter wheat has been planted, behind last years 90 percent and the 5-year average of 94 percent. Seventy percent has emerged, behind 81 percent for both last year and the 5-year av-

Wheat condition is rated as 3 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 65 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.

Seventy percent of the cotton has bolls opening, behind 99 percent for last year and 92 percent for the 5-year average. Harvest has begun in some areas, with 1 percent of the crop being harvested, behind 2 percent last year and 13 percent for the 5-year aver-

Cotton condition is rated as 7 percent very poor, 14 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 34 percent good, and 5 percent excellent.

Ninety-two percent of sunflowers have bracts yellow, behind both 2008 and the 5-year averages of 100 percent. Seventy-eight percent of the sunflowers have reached maturity, behind 88 percent for last year and 94 percent for the 5-year average. Farmers had only harvested 20 percent of the crop by weeks end, behind last year at 37 percent and 55 percent for the 5-year av-

Sunflower condition is rated as 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 10 percent excellent. Eighty-three percent of the fourth cutting of alfalfa has been completed, behind the previous year and the 5year average at 100 and 99 percent, respectively.

Hay and forage supplies were rated as 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 81 percent adequate, and 15 percent surplus. Stock water supplies were rated as 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 9 percent







Producers scratch heads and sharpen pencils when considering wheat acres

For the past few years, trend continue, Coppock technology that has brought they all are bad trends for acres planted to wheat throughout the U.S. have fallen, acres sown to corn and soybeans are on the increase. Wheat is falling out of favor with many farmers, causing a conundrum among those involved in the indus-

"The Wheat Conundrum" was addressed by wheat leaders at a forum sponsored by the Kansas City Agribusiness Council October 15. Daren Coppock, chief executive officer of the National Association of Wheat Growers and Justin Gilpin, chief executive officer of Kansas Wheat, set the stage by describing the challenges faced by the wheat industry, including lack of research and development into wheat, and declining profitability for wheat farmers compared to other crops.

Wheat farmers, on average, are projected to return about \$100 per acre over variable expenses in 2009-10, while soybean producers net about \$250 per acreand corn producers, nearly \$300 per acre, based on figures from the Food and Agriculture Research Policy Institute from the University of Missouri. The ratio of income has been largely the same for the last decade, FAPRI reports. Should the

Coppock says U.S. consumers, including food companies, millers and bakers, show little resistance to biotechnology. Many overseas markets are willing to accept biotech wheat, too. "Other markets have ex-

pressed pretty strong concern on behalf of their customers," he says. "Those are the markets in which we need to have conversations the next several years. We need to explain that this trend of declining wheat acreage and production, slower yield growth, lower returns per acre compared to other crops, wheat being pushed on marginal land as other crops take better land; people that buy, use and eat wheat. We need to be able to get technology in the hands of producers that helps alleviate that problem."

Gilpin points out that biotechnology could bring about improved quality characteristics and other traits that prove beneficial to end-users, not just farmers.

"(Biotechnology) means more than just looking at agronomic factors. We can seek biotechnology investments that improve end-use functionality and quality of wheat. It's not just an issue of trying to create a better variety, but a more desired variety, one that gets pulled through the marketplace, not just pushed through it," Gilpin explains. "The U.S. is regarded as a quality provider throughout the world. We can expand on that and capitalize on that with new traits we bring to the marketplace."

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The December gold made new all time highs last week and moved briefly above the \$1100/oz. level. It was a very impressive rally considering the Dollar did not fall to new lows for the move. However, it does look like the bounce in the Dollar is over with and it won't be surprising at all to see new lows next week. This week is the November supply and demand report. The estimates for corn production range from 12.674 billion to 13.4 billion, so opinions are obviously mixed when it comes to yield. Some think the slow maturity of the crop and disease issues will prevent us from having a record yield, while others see no problems at all. We shall see. I don't think USDA will quit making adjustments to the yield estimate until at least January. There just hasn't been enough corn harwe have.

As for the soybeans, the average trade guess calls for a small increase in production and a small increase in ending stocks. It seems that the majority of yield reports are very good and that a production increase is likely. There are harvest delay concerns and other issues, but it seems like the good comments are outweighing the

There was certainly a lot of activity in the corn market last week, but the December contract only gained a penny when it was all said and done. The market had very good gains to start the week, but gave them all up by Friday. The outside markets didn't seem to play much of a roll this week, which is a change of pace, but that made the trading pretty confusing. When you get used

vested to really know what to weakness in the Dollar, or strength in the stock market helping the grains, and then it doesn't happen, one gets out of step and I think that added to the volatility.

> On the charts, short term technical indicators are turning down, but the market held at trend line support twice last week. Monday's trade will be critical from a technical stand point. Failure at the trend line will make \$3.58 and \$3.45 the next downside objectives.

In the short run we have to worry about improved harvest progress. There is still a lot of corn to be harvested and sold, which can put a great deal of pressure on the market. A lower yield estimate on Tuesday would offset that, but a neutral or negative report will result in lower prices.

The December KW was 1 better than the corn and gained 2 cents for the week. Like the corn, the wheat had good early strength, but gave it all up Thursday and Friday. Also like the corn, the December KW is finding support at an uptrend line and is just above the 40 and 50-day moving averages. The news isn't very friendly. Export sales were poor at 284,500 MT, the weather is favorable for getting the rest of the crop planted, and weakness in the Dollar provided no support. Tuesday report probably won't have any market moving information, but if the corn moves drastically in one direction or the other then the wheat will follow along.

The soybeans were the worst performers last week with the January contract failing at trend line resistance, falling below the 50day moving average and losing about 20 cents. The charts look bad, expectations are for a negative report, and there will be great harvest activity over the next couple of weeks. In the

short run the market doesn't look good. If USDA raised yield and ending stocks it will look worse. Export demand is great, but it just isn't enough to offset the big crop. Time will tell what crop size really is, but that the moment we have to plan on bigger numbers.

Last week's plan was to sell a bounce in the December LC and add to the position on a close below \$85.25, which we did on Friday. I am very comfortable with that position right now. The charts suggest the December contract is headed back to \$83.50. Boxed beef was only slightly lower for the week, which you can try and spin as positive if you want, but I would look for weakness this week. Pork prices were weak on Friday and the hog charts look like they are ready to roll over too. I may be too negative right now, but I would plan on this week being rough on the livestock.

Climatologist explains 'frost line'

Mary Knapp is asked a lot of weatherrelated questions in her role as the state climatologist for Kansas. One of the questions that comes up at this time of year, in particular, is "What is the frost line and why is it important?" "In our region, 'frost line' generally refers to the depth to which the ground or the water in the ground, will freeze," said Knapp, who heads the Kansas Weather Data Library, based in Kansas State University Research and Ex-

"The frost line will vary from season to season. It depends on air temperature, soil type, the amount of moisture in the soil, the vegetative or snow cover, and such heat reservoirs as asphalt or buildings."

Knapp said the frost line is primarily of interest in construction. Many building codes, for example, specify that utilities be buried below the frost line.

"In Arctic regions, the more common reference is to the 'thaw depth' - the distance to the permafrost," she added. "In tropical regions, 'frost line' more commonly refers to an elevation below which frost won't occur."



Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

No More Lawn Work

Soon the mower, fertilizer spreader and leaf rake can be put away for the winter. If you have a warm-season grass like zovsia, bermuda or buffalo, the work has been done since the first frost. Cool-season grasses like tall fescue and bluegrass will soon stop needing attention.

I anticipate one more mowing to keep my tall fescue under 3.5 inches tall. There is no advantage to allowing the grasses grow taller than normal before cutting. Depending on your mowing practice, tall fescue should be between 2.5 and 3.5 inches for the winter. Mowing at the lower end works best for me to chop up the tree leaves along with the grass leaves.

Bluegrass can be cut a little bit shorter than tall fescue. The mowing height is between two and three inches. This works out well since my lawn is a mix of both tall fescue and blue-

Grass leaves returned to

the turf supplies around a quarter pound of nitrogen back to the lawn to use. A supplemental application of nitrogen at the last mowing for cool-season grasses can keep them greener longer in the fall and cause earlier greening in the spring. Anytime the grass is green, it is producing food for a healthy

Depending on your fertilizing practices, one to one and a half pounds of actual nitrogen can be applied per thousand square feet of

No more lawn work means the mower can be put away. The operator's manual will provide instructions. My mower hit another 100 hours of use so it was time to change the oil filter, spark plug, air filter and oil, Blowing off the mower removes the dried leaves and other debris from around the en-

I like to fill my fuel tank full for the off season. If there is no air space, no condensation can spoil the fuel.

It is difficult for me to time the last mowing with running out of fuel in the tank. A fuel stabilizer can be used but is an added expense.

The chance I have to take is whether fuel prices will be lower come spring.

Now is best time to tame dandelions The first part of this

month is the most effective time to control some of the worst broadleaf weeds that commonly infest central U.S. lawns.

"Young weeds are always the easiest to control. So believe it or not — that's one reason early November is a good time to apply broadleaf weed herbicides in our region," said Ward Upham, horticulturist with Kansas State University Research and Extension.

Another factor makes such applications especially effective.

"At this time of year, cool-season weeds are actively moving materials from their leaves to their roots, storing food for winter," Upham said. "They're so intent on this that they Il even translocate a herbicide application. That's why you can finally kill dandelions completely - from their deep tap root on up.'

Many dandelions are

young now because the weed typically puts out a flush of new plants during early to mid fall, the horticulturist said. The winter annuals among the broadleaf weeds (e.g., henbit, chickweed) go to seed much earlier in the growing season. But, that seed germinates in the same year during mid to late fall.

"That's why winter annuals can get off to such a strong start in spring,' Upham said. "Just before winter arrives, they sprout, grow a little and develop a root system. Then they lose their new top growth to winter's cold. But, having already gotten a head start, they're raring to grow the following spring.'

Even with November's good timing, however, herbicide applications can fail, he warned. The reasons:

The better the weed is growing, the more herbicide it will move from leaves to root. And, vice versa.

Broadleaf weed herbicides perform best if applied on a day when temperatures are 50 degrees or higher. Colder temperatures slow or stop the herbicides' action.

The herbicide 2,4-D is a good choice for November applications, Upham said. Other effective choices -

sold under such trade names as Trimec, Weed-B-Gon and Weed-Out - combine 2,4-D with both MCPP and Dicamba. Another option, marketed as Weed Free Zone and Speed Zone, combines those three active ingredients with yet another - carfentrazone — so it can provide the quickest results of all, especially as temperatures approach 50 F.





If Wal-Mart were in the cattle business, it would probably serve as an operating definition of "least-cost producer." People might refer to its cowherd enterprise as the model for slashing expenses.

That's the way to make more money in this margin business, isn't it? The simple economic equation is income minus expenses equals profit, so it's only natural to want to shrink fixed costs. But it might pay to give some thought to the top line.

Wal-Mart's trademark smiley face happily rolls back prices. On the outside of every store are four words that no beef producer would be proud to utter at the coffee shop: "We sell for less."

After all, bragging rights belong to those who top the market, to those who best the fetching price of all their neighbors' calves.

In that same equation, increased income while holding expenses steady would also get you more net pro-

With today's markets and the uncertainty surrounding many issues that could take away from your bottom line, it makes sense to take a long, hard look at areas where you can become more efficient. That's a worthy goal, but not necessarily if it comes at the cost of longterm income potential.

Let's say in the name of savings you back off your vaccination program or give it the axe altogether. Buyers

will notice. You might get a lower price this year, or buyers may take note of the increased health risk and refuse to bid on your calves

A lower quality bull could fill the basic needs with a smaller initial price tag, but at what cost? Lighter and slower growing calves, decreased demand, lower quality grades and less desirable replacements? The same goes for cutting pasture inputs or giving up a mineral program. These are effects that could cut your bottom line more deeply than they save a buck today.

Turning your focus to the other profit variable will help with lasting results.

Documenting age and source will allow you to capture premiums. Research proves if you market calves in load-lots you'll get a higher price. For smaller producers, that might mean pooling with a neighbor or getting involved in an alliance program. Graded, breed- or breeder-sponsored calf sales can add value and give you exposure to more buyers.

Improved genetics for growth, marbling and muscle can increase profit and actually cut costs if you keep cowherd function in

Communicating all of this added-value is the key to capturing it. Even Wal-Mart announces when it's investing in new stores or a new product line. Create a resume for your calves so all of their qualities are announced from the auction block. Or, consider retaining ownership. You know better than anyone how much those calves are worth.

You might have to reverse your thinking. Get out of the cutting and slashing mindset and you won't have to keep rolling back prices to sell your calves. Embrace an attitude of building, growing and adding income. Just think of it as a more stable route to your ultimate goal of putting more black ink on your bottom line.

Red maple was named for year-round reasons

Sometimes a common name can cause disappointment. Although it provides many benefits, for example, a case in point is the red maple tree — the Acer rubrum.

"In East Coast forests, the native red maples may turn scarlet in fall. But, they're even more likely to turn brilliant yellow. They can even be bright orange or multicolored," said Jake Weber, Kansas State University Research and Extension horticulturist.

The tree actually got its everyday name for year-round reasons, he said.

As one of the first trees to bloom in spring, the red maple produces clusters of tiny crimson flowers with long, showy stamens. Its emerging leaves and winged seeds are red, too. The leaf stems (petioles) remain bright red through the rest of the growing season. Then the tree's buds add a vibrant red note to brighten winter's colors, Weber explained.

The red maple is one of the first trees to change color in fall. But, two things determine whether that color is an additional red show: (1) the tree's geneotype and (2) the year's late summer and fall weather patterns. "Genetic makeup is by far the more profound influence. And, this tree naturally produces genetic variations," the horticulturist said.

Fortunately, reproducing the trees that have a desired fall foliage color isn't difficult, Weber said. All that's required is to propagate them via grafting, rather than planting their seeds. "That's how we've ended up with landscape trees that reliably turn red in fall. They're the cultivars with names, many of which include such descriptors as flame, magenta and red sunset," he said.

25,000 tons of U.S. sorghum destined for Morocco

Morocco's livestock and poultry sector will soon have high protein U.S. sorghum available for inclusion in feed rations. On Monday, Oct. 26, 2009, Archer Daniels Midland (ADM) loaded 25,000 metric tons (984,000 bushels) of U.S. sorghum on a vessel in Galveston, Texas, destined for the North African country. U.S. Grains Council Director in the Mediterranean and Africa Kurt Shultz said the sale was a result of developing longterm relationships and sharing information with top feed manufacturers in Morocco.

"The sorghum was purchased by Graderco, a trading company in Casablanca we have worked with for many years," said Shultz. "They know what we tell them is the truth. When you have trust, you have a good chance at providing customers high-quality feed ingredients produced by U.S. farmers."

The recent purchase occurred subsequent to a visit by USGC Senior Director of International Operations Chris Corry and other Council representatives with Graderco officials earlier this year. Corry said the representatives of Graderco were misinformed about U.S. sorghum at the time of the visit.

'They told us when they enquired about sorghum they were either told there was none available or the price exceeded other options," said Corry. "We set the record straight by providing them with real-time market information, provided to us by the United Sorghum Checkoff Program (USCP), on the U.S. sorghum crop and pricing. With the information we provided, Graderco made the purchase. Without accurate information and a trusting relationship, the purchase would not have been made."

Corry said the Council has intensified its sorghum marketing efforts as a result of funding provided by USCP, which was formed last

Troy Skarke, USCP board member and sorghum producer from Claude, Texas, said Morocco's purchase demonstrates the strong return on investment USCP facilitates for sorghum producers.

"We have a good quality product and are seeing very good yields and test weights coming out of the fields. I am optimistic the crop will move quickly from the elevators to the end-user. I look forward to the continued success from the Sorghum Checkoff efforts and the investment with the U.S. Grains Council to market our crop overseas.'

Avoid compaction when harvesting wet fields

Hurried harvesting of wet corn fields may have a longterm effect on soil compaction, said a University of Missouri Extension agricultural engineer.

"Soil compaction can cause greater surface wetness, longer drying time and more runoff, which increases erosion," said Kent Shannon, extension natural resource engineering specialist.

Heavy loads can cause compaction at depths that tillage can't remedy. Shallow compaction, at depths of 12 inches or less, can be remedied, Shannon said.

The increased use of flotation tires has encouraged farmers to carry out field operations when the soil is too wet to support heavy machines.

Tire inflation pressure is the main factor affecting soil compaction, he said. By selecting the proper tires, a 200horsepower tractor may cause no more surface compaction than a 50-horsepower tractor.

Whenever possible, restrict traffic to specific tracks or lanes. The first trip through the field causes the greatest compaction. Additional trips over the same lanes do not significantly increase the amount of compaction. When unloading the combine, try to use the combine's previous wheel tracks.

"Do not travel on wet soil unless it is absolutely necessary," Shannon said."Try to avoid excessive axle loads, which cause deep compaction."

One way to decrease axle load is bynot filling the grain tank as full as the hopper extension allows.

Research on soil types indicates that compaction in silty clay loam affects yields more than in silt loam. Generally, the smaller the soil particles, the more compaction reduces the yield. If compaction occurs this fall, it probably will still be noticeable next spring.
