AFBF livestock economist sees flat cattle prices for next year

The national recession and its impact on people's eating habits will continue to hold cattle prices flat in 2010, according to James Sartwelle, a livestock economist with the American Farm Bureau Federation. Sartwelle, the son of longtime LMA member J.D. Sartwelle, Jr., Sealy, Texas, spoke last Friday at the annual convention of the South Dakota Farm Bureau.

When gas prices hit nearly \$4 per gallon last year, per capita miles driven dropped, and continued to drop month after month for the first time since the 1950s, he said. When fewer miles are driven, restaurant traffic, particularly for "high-end" restaurants, also shrank. "That's deathly bad news for the beef sector," he

The only element of the restaurant business that hasn't seen business drop has been fast-food outlets. However, restaurant owners surveyed predict less business next year. "I think if there's one habit we've broken in this country, it's eating out at restaurants," Sartwelle said. With worries about their jobs and mortgage payments, people are eating more meals at

Americans today are on average saving seven percent of what they earn, a figure not seen since 1980. As a result of lower consumer spending, cattle prices are

staying flat despite the lowest herd numbers since the 1950s and early 1960s. The number of mother cows, at 42 million in the mid-1970s, has dropped to 31.5 million and is probably headed for 29 million, he told his Rapid City audience.

However, the amount of beef is produced now as in 1975, due to increased efficiency and productivity. He said the cattle market could improve in the second half of next year, depending on the amount of competing pork that comes to market, as independent hog farmers liquidate their herds. "We're going to have to fight our way through a lot of cheap pork," he pre-

Ratliff said he got the idea to invite Thompson to his market after being a judge at the 2008 WLAC in South Dakota. "I believe it was the most fun thing I've ever done, and that's when I started thinking about getting the world champion to appear here." Sale time is 1 p.m.

Eight auctioneers at Parsons Livestock Market contest will qualify for 2010 World **Livestock Auctioneer Championship**

The last eight spots in Livestock Marketing Association's 2010 World Livestock Auctioneer Championship (WLAC) will be on the line Dec. 2, at the Parsons Livestock Market, Inc.

The market is hosting 36 contestants in the last quarterfinal qualifying contest for next summer's WLAC, which will be held June 19 at the Oklahoma National Stockyards in Oklahoma City. The sale here will start at noon.

Three winners — champion, reserve champion and runner-up champion — will be named after the contest. These three, and the next five highest scorers, then move on to the Oklahoma contest, often called the "Super Bowl" and the "World Series" of the profession.

All the contests are actual livestock sales, with buyers on the seats. Contestants must be at least 18 years old, and employed and sponsored by a livestock market.

Contest judges, all LMA members, score each contestant on vocal clarity and quality, bid-catching ability, conduct of the sale and personal expression. Judges also ask the question, "Would I hire this auctioneer?"

The master of ceremonies will be the reigning champion, Ty Thompson, of Billings, Mont. He won the title in June in Fergus Falls, Minn. Understanding farmer motivations

I have been privileged to learn about the psychology and soul of rural people, of farmers and ranchers who brave this variable and ocinhospitable casionally land. They have shared their pain, their worry, their joy, their hopes and their dreams. I've been privileged to be a witness to a special people in special circumstances and to tell their stories.

Right from the beginning I stood in awe of the lives and values of farm families. This was unique, different from anything I was used to. I've tried to understand and I'm still trying. I've written about unique themes, stories and lives playing themselves out in farmlands of the Midwest and in agricultural communities in general.

What is unique? Nature has to be respected. Hazards abound — blizzards, tornados, thunderstorms, hailstorms, complex machinery, disease and unpredictable livestock. The slightest miscalculation can be fatal.

What other occupation is so dependent on the weather? There are years when the country seems like it will dry up and blow away. There are some years when wet fields and flooding conditions have farmers holding their breath as they wonder about getting into their fields. It might be hail in the summer, killer frosts in the spring and early frosts in the fall — weather plays havoc with har-

This is a fragile land. So much depends on timely rains. Sometimes it hits just right. Some years it is too

dry, other years it is too dry. Farmers understand and prepare for adversity. A bad year is followed by hope that next year will be better.

biology When is humans stressed, are stressed. When biology fails, humans sometimes fail. This is a land of hidden and not so hidden dependencies. Vulnerabilities are closer to the surface. Illusions of control are occasionally shattered by nature herself.

The human experiment of living in the Midwest and making a living here has been in progress for generations. Nature gives its gifts but manages to hold back a few surprises. Just when you think you've seen it all, you haven't. This land can break even the strong and resourceful. Some people show their resilience by leaving and moving on in life.

It isn't always nature. During the Mid-1980s, it wasn't weather but a debt crisis brought on human policies and human error, many of which were made by lending practices based on inflation. Faith and trust were shattered in institutions and people. For some, the healing process from those rude and dark days rolls on.

Farming is a high stress profession. It is a dangerous occupation. It is a physically demanding occupation. The work hours are incredibly long. The risks are great. It is a gambling profession.

Why do it? What is this allure to occupations that depend on applications of

Economics is a part of it. Successful farmers and ranchers are able to enjoy good profits. It is an occupation from which you can make a comfortable living. It is a quiet secret not talked about much, but a reality

of farmers?

A treasure trove of knowledge and experience on the land is stored and passed on to the next generation. The farm itself is a heritage, a gift passed from generation to generation. Victories come by attention to detail. Small victories lead to large victories. Each day is different. Each day can be a challenge. There is the thrill of being one's own boss in an honorable profession that sustains life for so many others.

Occasionally time stands still. Meeting the challenge of the moment becomes the most important thing, despite how long it takes. Crops need to be nurtured. Livestock need attention. People grow to love what they serve. It is easy to love

the farm. It requires so much. Work is love made visible.

This attachment isn't just about money and work. Add to the mix all the lifestyle considerations that make farming satisfying. Rural people like their neighbors, communities and close relatives. The human face of agriculture is full of joy, faith and rewarding human relationships. It is an artful blend of work, love, family and community life. It is a place where it is easy to love oth-

The farm is good for children, both for being around nature and taking meaningful responsibility. Husbands and wives can enjoy true partnerships in business and in companionship. Nature is just outside the door. And the door is a long way from the neighbor's door.

Who among those who have lived in the country hasn't thrilled to a starlit night, a timely rain, a mighty wind, the awesome power of a blizzard, the fury of nature that causes them to retreat to their homes and wait within the safe confines of family?

Who among those who have lived here haven't felt a spiritual relationship with

the Creator because of this closeness to nature? Prayer might come a little easier to those whose livelihood depends on what the heavens may bring.

KSU crops team again national champs, sweeping contests

The Kansas State University Crops Team has again claimed the title as national champion, a feat that K-State teams have accomplished in eight of the last 11 years.

The team won both the Kansas City Board of Trade and Chicago CME Group Collegiate Crops contests to win the 2009 national championship. K-State placed first at both Kansas City and Chicago in all three phases of the contest: plant and seed identification, grain grading and seed analysis.

Such a sweep of all three contest parts at both con-

tests is a very rare event and represents one of the top rankings ever accomplished by a K-State team, according to Kevin Donnelly, K-State professor of agronomy and team coach. The Kansas City and Chicago contests took place Nov. 17 and 21, respectively.

In both contests, participants are required to identify 200 different plant or seed samples of crops and weeds; grade eight different samples of grain according to Federal Grain Inspection Service standards; and analyze 10 seed samples to determine whether they contain impu-

rities, and if so, what the contaminants are.

For its performance, K-State received a team scholarship award from contest sponsors at Kansas City, and CME Group provided major scholarships to the individual student winners at Chicago.

Members of the K-State Crops Team and competition results, if earned, include:

Bryson Haverkamp, sophomore in agronomy, Bern, placed second overall at Kansas City, which included tying for first, with a perfect score, in grain grading, and finishing third in

both identification and seed analysis. At Chicago, he placed third overall, which included finishing second in identification and grain grading, and fourth in seed analysis.

Jared Kohls, sophomore in agronomy and agricultural economics, Clearwater, was the high individual overall at Kansas City where he placed first in plant and seed identification, first in seed analysis, and tied for first in grain grading with a perfect score. At Chicago, he was second high individual

overall, first in identification, third in seed analysis, and fourth in grain grading. He missed only one sample out of 200 in the identification category.

Kelly Yunghans, junior in agronomy, Leavenworth, was the high individual overall at Chicago, placing first in seed analysis with a score of 594 out of 600, and third in both grain grading and identification. At Kansas City, she tied for third overall, and placed third in grain grading, tied for third in identification and was fifth in seed analysis.

Ben Meyer, sophomore in agronomy, Linn, competed as an alternate at the Kansas City contest.

Jared Unrau, senior in agricultural technology management, Newton, competed as the first alternate for both contests. His scores at Chicago were equivalent to fifth overall and third in identification, and at Kansas City he would have placed sixth overall.

Nathan Keep, senior in agronomy, Elm Creek, Neb., competed as an alternate the Kansas City contest.

Located adjacent to the Gettysburg Battlefield, the farm served the President as a weekend retreat and a meeting place for world leaders. With its peaceful setting and view of South Mountain, it was a muchneeded respite from Washington.

President Eisenhower maintained a show herd of black Angus cattle on his Gettysburg farm, which later became a National Park.

The President entered cattle in livestock shows across the country, winning grand championships at the Pennsylvania State Farm Show, blue ribbons at the International Livestock Competition in Chicago, and numerous other awards. While President, his cattle were entered into competitions under the names of his partners in order to maintain fairness.

By the 1960s, the Eisenhower herd numbered 100 cows with calves. Today, a herd of 40-50 Angus still graze the pastures of the President's farm, and the cattle ribbons are displayed on the walls of the show barn.

Walnut Council, tree farm groups merge to form Kansas Forestry Association

After two years of debate and planning, a new Kansas Forestry Association has emerged from the combined memberships of the Walnut Council of Kansas and the Kansas Tree Farm Committee (an affiliate of the Kansas Forest Products Association). "This is exciting news for those who care about our woodland resources," said Bob Atchison, rural program coordinator for the Kansas Forest Service. "Both groups are experienced in putting landowners and natural resource professionals together in dvnamic networks that provide educational, financial, and project opportunities for managing forestland.

"By combining their ef-

forts, however, these nonprofits can provide a single voice for Kansas forestry. They can leverage their pooled abilities and aggressively pursue funding opportunities that are out of the reach of individuals and government agen-

cies." Having a "one-stop shop" also will allow the former groups' members more complete access to the information, assistance and services now available to support tree farming in Kansas, Atchison said. Individual Kansans own 95 percent of the state's 2.1 million forested acres, he said. The USDA Forest Service's official census —

the National Woodland Owner's Survey - puts the landowners at 103,000.

"In addition to their timber, the forests are a vital natural resource in Kansas because of their impacts on water, soil, wildlife, air temperature, wind and even recreation. As a result, the collective stewardship of private owners is truly important for everyone in the state," Atchison said. That's true for other states, as well, he said, where owned forests are larger in size and number for 359,000 forest landowners in Missouri, 498,000 in Michigan and 225,000 in Indiana. But, the actions of each Kansas forest landowner tend to be more important because such owners are fewer in

number of Kansas forest number, their woodlands tend to be in environmentally sensitive areas, and their combined impact can

be far-reaching. "That's something the new Kansas Forestry Association seems to recognize. They're already looking for additional members and energetic leaders to help guide forestry into a new decade," Atchison said. "In fact, their bylaws were written to allow whole forestry-related groups to consolidate with the association." So far, dues for new members are \$10 per person or \$50 per organization. Interested landowners can learn more about the association's efforts by calling 785-532-3310 or emailing atchison@ksu.edu.

Soundtrack for an empty land

I sometimes think as I drive the backroads of northeastern and northcentral Kansas that the empty countryside deserves its own musical soundtrack, something prescient and personal, able to enhance and deepen one's emotional state, to fit the mood exactlv. without having to channel-surf or root through stuffed CD or cassette cases or, God forbid, to execute one's own improvisation of half-remembered stanzas, off-key choruses and not a few wordless riffs interspersed with la-de-dahs, dum-de-dums and other mindless repetitive utterances. In my case, this would be known as extempore horriblis. There are those who can sing like angels and those who can't carry a tune in a bucket, and I. unfortunately, fit in the latter category. I try not to sing around other people or fresh milk for fear of unintended, and often disastrous, consequences, which might be one reason I premy music either acoustic, classical or electronic. Not having lyrics to memorize (or mangle) lets me focus strictly on a tonal scale that can be altered or modified to suit conditions. Plus it's hard to screw up humming.

If I had my iPod on a recent backroads jaunt from Washington to Hanover, I might have put on something dark and foreboding to emphasize the low dark clouds and the stiff wind cutting down from the north. Any symphony by Beethoven would have been

equally appropriate, or my boots were three times maybe a little Wagner, or even something lighter with an expressive cello or piano. Since I'd left it at home, I turned the radio to NPR and listened to the latest news. Dire reports of bombings, economic collapse, bank failures and global warming were every bit as dark and foreboding as I'd wanted, only more so. I finally turned it off and drove in silence.

The object of my excur-

sion was one of the original one-room schools. It's hard to believe that Washington County once had 146 such schools, the highest number of any county in the state. Most are still standing in one form or another though it's just a matter of time before neglect and the elements reduce them to rubble. Most were also simple structures framed in wood, iconic in shape. Charleston Center School was different: heavy limestone and brick walls, with rows of arched windows and a central arch spanning the front, it was a monument to education and a community's sense of itself. And, when I found it, mostly fallen down. My first thought was cello, definitely. A dirge, mournful and sad. The side road leading to the school was liquid muck, so I parked on the main road and walked in. I tried keeping out of the deepest mud but found it impossible. Leaving posthole impressions in my wake, I made my way up the shallow incline until I could cross the road into a grassy field. By then their normal size.

Even in its dilapidated state the school was impressive. The east wall still stood, flanked by two redbrick pillars in front, with the intervening space filled with the remainder of the walls and ceiling. Some of it had burned as evidenced by charred beams. Mostly, it appeared to have imploded into a compact heap, the front archway falling inward as if it were the last to go. About half of its graceful length was still visible.

The wind moaned through the trees shadowing a small deep creek, plucking at my jacket with invisible fingers. As I moved around the building looking for the right angle for a photograph, a redtailed hawk erupted from the ruin and flashed past in a long trajectory. It cried out in a shrill plaint of anger, its golden eves boring into mine, and wheeling once and then twice around the school rose higher until it disappeared in the dis-

For a long moment I stood there with my heart hammering in my ribs, stunned at seeing the hawk at such close quarters. Its wild and untamed presence seemed the perfect match for the untamed land and the shattered walls. And that, I thought, was the best soundtrack to the great empty spaces: the cry of an angry raptor, the roar of wind through winter-bare trees. It doesn't get much more personal, or evocative, than that.

Nebraska family weathers changes on the farm

FREMONT, Neb. (AP) — Jack Engel can tell you about the time he worked the land with a one-row cultivator and horses.

He can't quite remember how old he was somewhere between 12 and 14 — but he still recalls the results.

"I cultivated all day, and I didn't accomplish very much," he said.

These days, Engel and his son, Jeff, use a 12-row planter on the family farm south of Fremont. They note such equipment isn't that big any more — not with the 48-row planters available now much has changed since the first of six generations of Engels began living on the farm.

The Fremont Area Chamber of Commerce is recognizing the Jack and Jeff Engel families for exceptional leadership in farm management, crop production, farmstead appearance and community involvement. The Engels will receive the Farm Family Excellence Award during the chamber's annual award luncheon at Fremont Golf Club.

"I think it's quite an honor," said Jack Engel, now 79.

It also is part of a lengthy history for the Engel family.

Jack Engel's greatgrandfather, Frederick, came from Germany and bought this farm in 1887.

"My grandfather (Herman) came over later and he was about 6 years old," Jack said.

Frederick, who had three sons and daughter, purchased 400 acres of land. In 1913, Herman bought 142 acres of land from his father. Herman also built the house where Jack and his wife, JoAnn, live.

"This was a sunflower patch when my grandfather built (the house) — just great big, old, tall sunflowers," Jack said.

In 1927, Herman bought an additional 160 acres of land across from Platteville School. He also had more than one job during his lifetime. He was a schoolteacher and later a State Farm insurance agent for 50 years. He ran the Woodcliff Elevator.

Oh, and he did farm, but he had a hired man.

Jack's father, Alfred, farmed the land from 1925 to 1981.

When Jack was discharged from the U.S. Army in 1953, he began farming. Then, years later, when Alfred decided to retire, he moved into Fremont and Jack and JoAnn and their family moved out to the farm.

During his years of farming, Jack purchased 700 acres of land and he also farms 400 acres of rental ground.

His son, Jeff, graduated from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and started farming: he also rents an additional 200 acres.

Jack and JoAnn continue to live on the family farmstead, while Jeff, his wife, Sue, and their children, Ryan and Megan, live just across the property line to the north.

The Engels have formed a corporation, JAE Farms Inc. They raise corn, soybeans, alfalfa, wheat and

grass hay. "I have fed cattle and hogs, but not anymore,

Jack said. Jack - and even Jeff have seen many changes in farming during their

"It's gotten a lot more expensive and a lot more complicated," Jeff said. "There's a lot more economics and chemical knowledge involved.'

Years ago, farmers cultivated their land more to control weeds that chemicals take care of now Farmers don't waste fuel or risk the loss of soil moisture from such cultivation. Farmers practice conservation tillage.

The economy in the ag sector is based on a global market, whereas it didn't have as much affect many years ago.

Like other farmers, the Engels have seen a host of technological advancements. And they've encountered something else: "We have to coexist with housing developments. You have to be careful where you're spraying (chemicals) so you don't damage their properties," Jeff said.

One thing has remained consistent in farming, however: dependence on the weather.

In 2008, the Engels had a great crop. Then came the June 27 storm that wiped out 95 percent of it.

"With farming, you're putting your paycheck out in the field to weather all the elements and hopefully it will still be there at harvest time," Sue Engel said.

Website gives consumers a inside look at the transformation of wheat to food

If you've ever wondered how wheat gets from those Kansas farm fields to your dining room, a new, online program is for you. The Wheat Foods Council has launched, "How Wheat Works," a multimedia program that aims to educate users about the wheat growing process and wheat products' nutritional value.

Available at www.how wheatworks.com, the tool allows participants of all ages to virtually grow, harvest and mill their own kernels to create their de-

sired wheat food. Each of the program's

four phases — growth, harvest, milling/baking and the grocer's aisle — takes just a few minutes to complete, while the program spans the course of four days. Interactive opportunities include the selection of the type of wheat to be grown and wheat flour to be milled, based on the participant's preferred wheat food creation

"How Wheat Works is an exciting educational opportunity to take wheat kernels from farm to fork in a virtual world, while providing wheat flour which holds endless meal possibilities, for needy

U.S. troops and their families," said Carol Pratt, M.S., R.D., Wheat Foods Council nutrition expert. "This unique mixture of subjects like agriculture, milling, baking and nutrition allows people to better understand wheat's role in a healthy diet."

The program itself incorporates 3-D animation, still photography, video and factual information to chronicle wheat's path from field to table. The end of each phase includes activity suggestions that will help participants extend the learning experience

wheat-based recipes, exploring wheat grown in their area and viewing harvest videos from America's Heartland, a public TV show about American agriculture

Cindy Falk, nutrition educator at Kansas Wheat, says the How Wheat Works Web site is informative, fun and interactive.

"Visitors are invited to step into the shoes of producers, millers, bakers and manufacturers and take virtual wheat from kernel to market during their four-day experience. The combination of computer graphics, still photography and video packs a lot of information in a condensed amount of time. What's more, completing the four-segment program results in a good thing for our military families," Falk says.

For each participant who completes a quiz at the end of the program, the Council and their members will donate two pounds of flour to Operation Homefront.



and we are very proud to be one of the states declaring this day as 'Thank a Farmer' day," says Fred Lombardi, Colorado Beef Council executive director. "It has really brought a heightened sense of awareness in consumers and activated beef producers throughout Colorado. We're thankful for their dedication to the beef industry EVERY day."

These state officials noted that the holiday season is a good time to remember that America's agricultural sector works to provide consumers with safe, wholesome and affordable foods that nourish bodies and create the centerpieces for our traditional family gatherings and celebrations. In fact, the average U.S. farmer now feeds 144 people a day, in the United States and abroad, compared to 46 people in 1960. And, many consumers aren't

aware of where their food comes from, since the average American is now three generations removed from farming as a livelihood.

"Farmers and ranchers not only provide the food we eat, but also help sustain rural communities, preserve open space and wildlife habitat, and protect the environment," said North Dakota Stockmen's Association (NDSA) President Jack Reich, a Zap, N.D., rancher.

In the national blitz, a few other farm facts were shared with the consuming public.

U.S. consumers spend about 10 percent of their disposable income on food, compared to 22 percent in the United Kingdom, 26 percent in Japan and 28 percent in South Africa.

Farmers and ranchers provide food and habitat for 75 percent of the nation's wildlife.

The U.S. beef industry is comprised of 1 million beef and dairy producers, 75 percent of whom work on operations that have been in the family for at least two generations.

The average U.S. farm is 441 acres; 99 percent are classified as family operations. About 41 percent of total U.S. land area is farm land.

85 percent of U.S. grazing lands are unsuitable for crops; grazing animals on this land more than doubles the land that can be used to raise other foods.





Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

Plant decorations for the holiday season

Evergreen trees, poinsettias, holly, live wreaths, Amaryllis and more are commonly used holiday season decorations. Some of these are temporary uses and others may be kept alive for future enjoyment. Proper care will get the best use out of them. When selecting a tree for indoors, it must be fresh. The needles should bend when tested. If they should snap or break, no amount of care will bring it back to usefulness. Keep looking. A woody stem cut from its root system will need to be kept under water. This is no different than cut flowers. Those first few days, the stem will take up lots of water. Over time the rate slows down. This indicates the plugging of the water conducting tissues. Unlike cut flowers, no additives are used to slow the clogging of the tissues. The cut end can be recut to open the tissues but it is difficult with ornaments on the tree.

Greenery will add to the holiday decoration choices. It should be as fresh as possible. It won't be absorbing any more water. For these, we want to trap the moisture in the plant. There are products that can be applied to the plant material to slow down the moisture loss. Read and follow label directions on any of these products.

Poinsettias, Amaryllis, holiday cactus and other plants will need to be watered as needed. Check them regularly. Be cautious and don't overwater. Poinsettias like a constant moist media. Other plants like it drier. Picking up the pot gives a good indication on the amount of moisture in the soil. If it is easy to pick up, water. When the pot is heavy, skip a watering. Always water until excess comes out of the bottom of the container. Discard the excess water.

Keeping these decorations away from the heater vent or active fireplace is suggested. The drying air is not helpful. When the best site for the decorations is near them, a deflector to direct the air away from the decorations is recommended.

With a little attention, our holiday greens will stay that way and be enjoyable this holiday season. Online course to focus on farm-family investing

A secure future, a farm for future generations. It's everything a farm family wants. "You can learn to secure your farm's future and protect your family's legacy by enrolling now in an online course just for farm families," said Barbara O'Neill, Extension specialist in Financial Resource Management at Rutgers Cooperative Extension. "Investing for Farm Families provides the information you need to make strategic decisions while weaving together farm and personal investments." The eight-lesson course helps farm families plan for a financially stable future that meets their long-term needs. Developed by a team of Extension educators from several states, farm families can work at their own pace while taking the course.

"You can learn to increase your future financial security, identify investment strategies, know asset allocation basics, evaluate investment production alternatives to agriculture business risks, and invest for retirement and farm succession planning,' O'Neill said. She noted that farm families have unique investing needs, which the course addresses. Surveys and focus groups with farmers provided the course developers with insights about farmers' investment concerns and learning preferences.

Tim Eggers, Extension agricultural economist with Iowa State University said he and others affiliated with Annie's Project have encouraged farmers to enroll in the course. Annie's Project is an educational program offered in 20 states and dedicated to strengthening women's roles in the modern farm enterprise. "The primary benefit of the course is the thoughtful analysis of how on- and offfarm investments can be balanced based on the participant's unique situation," Eggers said. "Farm and ranch families tend to be more comfortable with the investments they can see and use. Investing for Farm Families can help farmers to diversify their investments."

O'Neill and Eggers along with several Extension staff from around the nation developed the course through the Online Investment Education (OIE) project, which was created to reach farm families nationwide with investment information relevant to their needs. It was funded with a twoyear grant to the eXtension Foundation from the Financial Industry Regulatory

Authority (FINRA) Investor Education Foundation. More information about the course, including enrollment, is available at www. extension.org/pages/Invest ingforFarmFamilies.


