

Most of the driest areas of the eastern Corn Belt received rain this week, which seems to have put an end to the weather scare. Forecasts still call for above normal temperatures for the next two weeks, but moisture will be adequate, which eases the fears about the heat. For the week the December corn lost 22 3/4 cents

Export sales were excellent at 614,100 MT of old crop and 540,900 MT of new crop sales. USDA will have to raise the old crop export estimate in the next supply and demand report by at least 50 million bushels.

Looking at the charts, the December corn closed just above the 100-day moving average support on Friday. Friday's trading action suggests we will see follow through selling on Sunday night unless the forecast is much hotter and much drier. A move down to \$3.70 at some point next

week is likely. This week's commit-

ment of traders report showed that Index funds have a record large net long position, which means that investment funds are still coming into commodity markets. Trading funds are building their net long positions rapidly. Investment money flow is a bullish factor, but it is being matched and sometimes overwhelmed by farmer/ commercial selling. Do keep in mind though that the trend in the market is often dictated by the trend in the trading funds position. In other words, there should be very good support under the market next week.

U.S. wheat futures chased the French milling wheat higher again this week. The September KW nearly reached the \$6.25 objective, and the market is overbought, so a correction should be expected. However, the only thing that matters to the

wheat market right now is the movement of the French wheat. If it keeps going up, so will the US wheat. For the week, the September KW gained 16 cents.

Export sales were poor again at 382,100 MT. Sales have to be better than that to justify the current export estimate. The run up in the wheat is based on the idea that we will have less export completion from Europe and the Black Sea region, but we sure haven't seen any better business yet. It will have to show up soon to avoid a sharp break in prices.

Heat and demand are keeping the soybean market supported, while moisture and large new crop ending stocks keep the bulls in check. The net result of that this week was that the November sovbeans were down 3 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cents. Soybean charts look good. It will probably take another dry spell to

get it done, but the soybeans are in position to start another leg higher. Funds are buying, importers are buying, technical indicators are telling you to be long. All that is lacking is a supply scare. Next week's forecasts will have a huge impact on the price trend for the rest of the growing season. A dry forecast will take the November soybeans to \$10.20.

Cash cattle trade came in at \$95 and the futures had a good week as well. August LC gained \$1.20 and the August FC gained \$2.15. The August FC made higher highs every day this week.

I think that the cattle market can continue to move higher, but we are due for a correction. A \$2 break in the October LC is likely, but it is also a buying opportunity. This is the correction the market needs before making new contract highs.

### Soaring temperatures and humidity take toll on cattle

Compared to people, cattle have a distinct disadvantage when it comes to handling some kinds of heat. Soaring tem-peratures and high humidity are taking a deadly toll, a Kansas State University veterinarian said.

'Cattle lack the ability to sweat significantly, so it is critical that producers and livestock handlers take steps to reduce heat stress before conditions become dangerous," said K-State Research and Extension veterinarian Larry Hollis. "High daytime temperature by itself rarely causes problems. It is a combination of the humidity with heat that creates the maximum heat load on cattle.

He cited this month's reports in Kansas of hundreds of cattle deaths attributed to the weather mix. Temperatures well into the 90 F range coupled with high humidity levels to push heat indices to 105 degrees or above. Other factors compounded the cattle's lack of ability to perspire. Several days in a row of high temperatures, a lack of nighttime cooling, lack of shade or cloud cover, lack of wind, lack of air movement in pens, and grazing on endophyte-infested fescue pastures can all create problems for cattle, Hollis said.

In addition, animals with dark hides and/or heavy body weights, as well as those in advanced stages of pregnancy are particularly vulnerable to the consequences of such weather.

"Producers should watch for signs of heat-related distress during hot, humid weather. The signs can include cat-tle going off feed, standing with their head over the water source, panting, salivating excessively, or open-mouthed breathing," he added. Producers and feedlot managers should consider ways to alleviate the stress, when possible, including:

Avoid gathering or working cattle after mid-morning; \* Provide access to abundant cold water/waterer space and make sure the water flow rate is adequate;

<sup>4</sup> Provide access to shade;

\* Provide the ability to move away from anything that reduces air flow, even cutting down weeds around pens; Use sprinklers - wet the skin;

\* Control flies;

"And, don't forget about the people," Hollis added.

### K-State ag economists discuss causes and impacts of wide wheat basis levels

By Mary Lou Peter The difference between cash wheat prices in Kansas and July 2010 Kansas City Board of Trade wheat futures widened sharply in mid-June rather than moving toward convergence as the cash and futures prices normally do. This situation is raising questions about the relationship between the cash and futures markets for hard red winter (HRW) wheat and creating the potential for additional risk for producers in their marketing and financial risk management decisions.

"The cash basis differential has widened to as much as \$1.25 to \$1.60 per bushel under futures in western Kansas and to \$1.00 to \$1.20 under futures in central Kansas," said Kansas State Universitv agricultural economist Daniel O'Brien. "That's as much as \$0.55 to \$0.60 wider than we've seen in June in at least the last 12 vears." For example, on July 19th, cash wheat prices at Hutchinson were \$4.84 per bushel and at Colby, \$4.40 per bushel. On that same day July, 2010 wheat futures on the Kansas City Board of Trade closed at \$5.95 a bushel. Typically, the cash price and the futures price of a commodity come together, or converge, during the month that the wheat is to be delivered, also called the spot month, O'Brien said.

O'Brien and colleague Art Barnaby, who is a risk management specialist both with K-State Research and Extension – agree that the cash HRW wheat prices have been reflecting the real market value of wheat the export value plus transportation costs to bring it to port, in competition with the value of HRW wheat processed by U.S. millers for domestic food consumption. If that is correct, the difference between wheat cash and futures prices would need to decline by \$0.50 to \$0.60 or more per bushel to converge to June-July basis levels that have existed in the Kansas wheat market over the last five vears.

When determining why the gap between July cash markets and futures values has not narrowed, the economists said they believe several factors are involved. They have focused on how well the wheat futures delivery system has worked to allow arbitrage forces to bring about convergence between the hard red winter wheat cash and futures mar-

kets. The bottom line, they said, is that there are a number of reasons why farmers have been unable to obtain enough warehouse receipts to exploit their economic incentive to deliver on the KCBT wheat futures contract and force convergence between futures and cash prices.

the short term, In O'Brien and Barnaby expect Kansas grain basis levels to remain wide because of a combination of wheat market supply and demand factors and the likelihood that KCBT HRW wheat futures delivery mechanisms designed to bring about convergence of cash and futures prices are not functioning as well as intended. In addition, it is possible that a combination of factors including limited grain storage space in Kansas, difficulties in moving a sizable 2010 wheat crop into export channels, and prospects for large feedgrain and oilseed crops in fall 2010 may lead to wider-than-normal basis levels for fall crops as well. "The current market conditions have created additional basis risk for growers, because hedgers can no longer count on cash-futures convergence at delivery points," Barnaby said. "If

hedgers could count on the wide basis to remain, then efficient hedging could continue. One would just add \$0.50 to the historical basis. The new source of risk in grain marketing is the increasingly unpredictable local grain basis caused by lack of convergence. It is possible, however, that market supply-demand forces will cause the wheat basis to narrow or even return to historically `normal' levels in the near-to-intermediate term future," he said.

For that reason, Barnaby added, it is important that farmers avoid being caught on the wrong side of the wheat basis when and if it narrows.

"Contrary to normal, farmers now may be facing a much larger risk of a stronger (narrower) wheat basis if they forward contract grain for future delivery to country grain elevators," Barnaby said. "Wheat basis is likely to strengthen if supply-demand factors such as a major U.S. or foreign wheat crop failure or a dramatic reduction in U.S. winter wheat acreage occurs. Often a short crop will cause prices to increase. Farmers with a crop failure who pre-harvest forward contracted grain at wide

basis levels would be forced to fill their forward contract obligations by buying higher-priced grain during a period of higher futures prices and stronger basis levels than reflected in their lower forward contracted price."

For those reasons, he said, farmers may want to avoid locking in wide basis levels as they forward price grain in 2010-2011. Forward pricing of wheat without locking in wide basis levels can be accomplished by using short hedges, by purchasing puts, or in some cases by finding a grain elevator that is offering an open basis contract, also called a hedge-to-arrive contract. "These grain marketing tools, combined with crop revenue insurance that has an open basis, allow for protection from volatile futures prices without commitment to wide cash basis levels," Barnaby said.





# Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

### **Vegetables** For The Fall Harvest

One of my favorite vegetable eating combinations is the mix of cauliflower, broccoli and carrot. When vou purchase these vegetables processed, it is often referred to as the California blend. Now is the time to plant any or all of these vegetable crops along with beans and beets to create a Kansas blend.

Broccoli and cauliflower can be started from seed in the garden, but often it is planted already as a small plant. Beans, beets and carrots are started from seed. Fall seeding is different from spring. Plant the seed slightly deeper to ensure seeds don't dry out and the soil temperature won't be as extreme

It is suggested to seed heavy and to do some thinning later to ensure an adequate stand. The seed will need to be kept moist which means frequent watering that typically forms a crust on the soil. To alleviate crusting, sprinkle a small layer of peat moss, vermiculite or compost directly over the seed row.

Carrots have some unique characteristics. They take 14 to 21 days to germinate. Most vegetables and weeds germinate sooner than the carrots. The soil

needs to be loose to an 8 or 9 inch depth. Because of these challenges, I prefer to grow carrots in containers filled with weed-free potting mix. Five gallon buckets work well for me.

My colleague in Sedgwick County, Rebecca McMahan, host;s a vegetable gardening blog. On her blog she has a section on garden templates. She was cordial in including my favorite blend of vegetables. Check out the vegetable combinations to grow at

The voung tender seedlings in the fall have been nice juice morsels for feeding insects. I have needed the use of floating row cover to keep my young vegetable plants from being harvested without my permission. Prepare for insect and small mammal issues before it is too late.

Fall vegetable gardening produces the best tasting cool-season crops of the year. There are several resources available for fall vegetable gardening. The "Kansas Garden Guide" has a chapter on "Fall Gardens" along with specifics on individual crops and much more. It is available from the local K-State Research and Extension office and online at www.ksre.ksu.edu.

At the same website, you can get the publication on "Fall Vegetable Gardens."

# **Cattle Feeders Hall of Fame inducts new members**

The Cattle Feeders Hall Of Fame has inducted H.C. (Ladd) Hitch and Kenny Monfort as its newest members and presented a special honor to former TCFA president & CEO Richard McDonald.

Ladd Hitch was a member of the prominent Oklahoma Panhandle family that has been involved in ranching and farming since the 1880s. He is considered to be the one who established the family feeding business. Hitch was among the first to

believe that cattle feeding could succeed in the High Plains using locally produced feedstuffs rather than shipping animals out of state to be finished. From its small beginnings with a few pens in 1953, the Hitch family feeding business has grown to three separate yards with a capacity of 160,000 head. Two of his grandsons, TCFA board member Chris Hitch and TCFA member Jason Hitch, currently head the family business, which also in-

cludes ranching, farming, a large pork operation and other interests.

Kenny Monfort is remembered for transforming his family's small farm in Colorado into a vast cattle feeding and beef-packing business. A key element of his accomplishments was his recognition of how to improve efficiencies within the industry by combining feeding with packing.

Richard McDonald, who retired from TCFA in 2006 following a 32-year career with the association, received the Hall's new Industry Leadership Award. The honor is intended to salute the contributions of a noncattle feeder to the industry. McDonald joined the TCFA staff in 1974 as executive director, and in 1988 was appointed as chief executive of the association. Among his many victories on behalf of cattle feeders over the years, McDonald was instrumental in helping pass a number of tax-relief measures for cattlemen, obtaining clear title and prompt payment legislation for ag producers and worked closely with other beef organizations to develop coalitions to obtain important legislative victories in Austin and Washington D.C.



The 24th Annual Flint Hills Beef Fest of Emporia is planned for August 20-22. This event is a celebration of the Kansas grass cattle industry. There are events for everyone in the family to enjoy.

Awards will be given in both divisions in each contest and will be awarded as such: 1st Place receives \$700.00 and a plaque, 2nd place receives \$450.00, 3rd place receives \$300.00, 4th place \$150.00, 5th place

Some people live in one of the most dangerous work places in America — the family farm. That's right. The family farm. Agriculture ranks second in the nation as the most dangerous occupation, next to mining.

Farmers are at high risk for fatal and nonfatal injuries, work-related lung diseases, noise-induced hearing loss, skin diseases and cancers associated with chemical use and prolonged sun exposure. Research shows that in an average year 516 workers die doing farm work in the U.S. (1992-2005).

Family members who often share the work are also at risk for injuries, illness and death. Between 175 and 300 children die in farm accidents each year, and thousands more are seriously injured.

If you live on a farm, you already know how dangerous it is. It is something you live with on a daily basis. Yet, with a few precautions, farm accidents are preventable.

Why is this such a tough

issue? Economics are involved. Family values are involved. It goes to the heart of family farming.

It costs money to be safe. It takes money to upgrade equipment and to have safety features like shields on power trains installed on older farm equipment. It's money some farmers don't have. In the scramble to get by, one place farmers often cut corners is in the area of safety.

Tractors need roll-over protection. How many farmers can afford to retrofit their equipment? Tractor roll-overs are the number one cause of farm-related deaths. One fifth of farm deaths are caused by tractors overturning.

When safety practices are discussed, farmers often say, "Get real." Improvements are too expensive or too impractical to be used.

It takes a lot of work to supervise children on a family farm. There are lots of dangerous places to be. Children lack judgment. Farmyards have a lot of

vehicle and equipment

movement. Besides parents, there are fathers, brothers, truckers and others who come into the yard. Parents need to insure that there are no unsupervised wanderings, not for a minute. For young children, an enclosed play yard provides safety. Babysitters and day care can be used when necessary. Drowning incidents accounted for one-fourth of the total deaths, and onethird of the deaths among youth less than 5 years old.

Parents shouldn't try to work on the farm and watch children at the same time. Attention is divided and sometimes parents lose track of their kids — with tragic results.

**Too much, too soon.** Having the kids take responsibilities on the farm is a part of the process of raising the next generation of farmers, a goal many family farmers share.

Children need age and ability appropriate tasks. Instead they are often expected to perform adult responsibilities. Unfortunately there isn't a lot known about development norms for operating different pieces of farm equipment or for different farm tasks. Even when the norms are known, farmers tend to overestimate the abilities and judgment of their children.

Even if dads understand the safety issues, they will have a hard time saying no when his kids are pushing to help. Kids will have peer pressure from their farm friends.

Teens need to meet the same tractor safety certifi-cation rules as if farmers were hiring a teenager from another family. One of the statistical peaks for farm accidents is for 13-year-old boys who have physically matured but lack mental judgment in dealing with a crisis. Farm equipment generally isn't designed for use by children and consequently safety features for children are lacking. When children are operating fourwheelers, they need to wear safety helmets. Some dads may not see the necessity.

One of the biggest causes of farm child deaths comes from allowing them on tractors as extra riders. Dads



Farmers are in a hurry. Farmers are driven, time conscious workers who are anxious about completing their work and getting on to the next job. Being in a hurry gets in the way of using proper safety precautions. They know better but they think they can save time by cutting corners. If a son has watched his father cut corners over the years and there weren't any accidents, then his confidence and safety practices may re-flect an "it can't happen to me" attitude.

Farmers respect the need for shields for their power-trains on tractors, augers and other equipment. Sometimes they get too busy to replace a shield and invite disaster sometime down the road. When headers get plugged, farmers need to shut off the equipment. Fingers, hands and feet shouldn't get near running equipment. Even when farmers have the necessary certification as pesticide applicators, they are tempted to cut corners on the use of safety clothes, goggles or gloves.

As you can see, some of these safety issues go against the grain. To farmers, it may seem like opening the door to government regulation, added expense, more inconvenience and taking children away from work experiences on their own farm.

These are all good arguments until you read the stories, see the statistics and hear of families who have suffered a tragic loss. Hopefully it won't take an accident or a near miss to educate hard-headed, hardnosed farmers. Good farming means putting safety first.





### Eat Beef — Keep Slim

I've lost ten pounds. I know, the joke is: "You've lost ten pounds? Take a look behind you - I just found it." But it's really true – I have lost ten pounds and I'm working on more.

Last time I was in to see my doctor, he told me I should lose some weight. (No duh — he went to medical school for this?) I already knew I wanted to take off some pounds, but now I got serious about it and I've lost about ten pounds since.

Our commodity organizations work very hard at promoting consumption of our products, and certainly that's true of the beef industry. The various check-off programs are designed to promote and encourage our products (Seems to me that deciding how to allocate those funds would be a dilemma. You need to spend enough money in farm country to be visible so as to maintain political support among producers, but you really should be spending that money in the cities where most of the consumers are located).

Anyway, I'm thankful for those people who work to promote our Kansas farm products, and I'm grateful that lean beef can still be part of a weight loss plan. My doctor will be pleased that I've taken off some pounds — and my horse will be even happier.

"I hope the work we've done over these years makes a difference in people's lives," Christian said. "That's why we're in Extension, to help people. I hope the contributions I've made have made that difference for them." Christian and his wife, Cheryl, live in Manhattan.
