

Schwieterman Market Outlook A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The Pro Farmer Crop Tour's findings this year were generally in good agreement with USDA's outlook for corn yield with two important exceptions. USDA is looking for considerably better corn in Illinois this year, whereas Pro Farmer found slightly less vield potential and USDA is looking for a slightly lower yield in Iowa, but Pro Farmer found considerably less yield potential. If Pro Farmer's findings are correct it would mean we will have an excellent national average yield, but probably not a record high yield. Pro Farmer pegged the corn crop at 13.365 billion using a

yield of 164.1 bu/ac. As for the soybeans, it looks like there is very good yield potential. Pro Farmer is looking for a 13.5 billion bushel crop with a yield of 44.9 bu/ac However Sudden Death Syndrome is very prevalent, which means that the crop condition ratings will be important for the next few weeks. If the con-dition ratings drop off sig-

nificantly it will cause traders to doubt the USDA's and Pro Farmer's yield estimates.

It was a very slow grind higher for the corn. The December corn gain 9 cents for the week, 7 of which came on Friday. The trade was very choppy and the corn rarely closed the same di-rection it opened. The December corn did make it through the \$4.38 ¾ high, but did make the best close since January 11th on three occasions this week.

Traders are concerned that USDA is over estimating production, but are also worried about the fact that harvest activity will be increasing. That creates choppy trade, but what we have to pay attention to is that the trend is still higher. Ever since the June Quarterly Stocks/Planted Acreage report the trend has been toward lower ending stocks projections and the price trend has been higher. The trend to lower ending stocks will continue until at least the September supply and

demand report and possibly longer. As long as our stocks keep shrinking, the price will keep rising. It may be slow, but it will happen.

Export sales were great with old crop sales at 594,900 MT and new crop at 2.29 MMT. USDA is probably underestimating both old crop and new crop exports, but it is hard to say how they will handle the old crop since the shipments pace is pretty slow and we are down to just a couple weeks left in the crop year.

The December KW was sideways/lower this week, losing about 18 cents. To me, it looks like the wheat has topped out, however both the French Milling wheat and the December Chicago wheat tested, and held, at critical support areas. Also, technical indicators are becoming oversold, which means the market is probably due for a corrective bounce. bounce, at this point, is a great selling opportunity, or at least a chance to buy put options.

Demand is staving strong. Export sales came in at 1.41 MMT, which is once again the best since September of 2007. We will still have to see these strong sales numbers continue for quite some time to have a major impact on ending stocks. Even with record exports, which would be a 40% increase from the current estimate, stocks would not be extremely tight.

That is what is tough about the wheat market. There is still a lot of bullish rhetoric out of the FSU, and we are seeing improved demand, but we are still a long way from being bullish from a statistical stand point. If we end up with expanded acreage because of this run up in prices, fundamentals could look quite bleak next summer.

The November soybeans posted an outside day down on the chart both Monday and Wednesday, which led to a poor finish to the week on Thursday and Friday. The late week weakness has the charts looking bearish and we could end up seeing quite a bit of pressure in the soybeans. The first support in the November contract will come in at the \$9.90 area, but it is more likely that we see a move down to \$9.70 and possibly \$9.55 in the short run.

I thought that all the great demand we have been seeing and the talk of wide-

spread Sudden Death Syndrome, would push the soybeans to the \$10.60 - \$10.70 area, but the \$10.50 resistance has proven to be too much for the market. Plus, it appears that we have tremendous yield potential due to the great moisture in the Corn Belt despite the SDS problems.

Export sales were tremendous again with 181,600 MT of old crop and 2.05 MMT of new crop sales. I am becoming more convinced every day that we will have yet another year of record exports. Yes, world supplies are huge, but Chinese demand, and world demand in general, seems to be insatiable. If we do end up with a 3.5 billion bushel crop, it will just mean it will be very easy to sell a record number of beans on the ex-

port market. It was a great week in the cash cattle market with cattle trading as high as \$100. The futures followed suit with the October LC reaching \$100 at one point and gaining over \$4.00 for the week. The October feeders rebounded from last week's poor close and picked up over \$6.00.

The cattle on feed report was a little bit negative with on feed numbers higher than expected at 103%, placements higher than expected at 94%, and marketings lower than expected at 98%. I think this will give traders an excuse to take

profits next week, but I want to be a buyer on breaks. I don't think the October LC have seen their high for the year.

The feeder cattle are getting into some pretty rarified air as several of the futures months approach \$120. \$120 is a pretty good place to make sales, but wait for a good technical signal to do SO.



Deere 3Q profit up 47% on strong U.S. farm sales

(AP) Deere & Co. said Wednesday its third-quarter profit grew 47 percent because American and Canadian farmers bought enough of the company's large equipment to offset a sharp downturn in Europe, but Deere kept its forecast for the year conservative.

The company reported \$617 million net income, or \$1.44 per share, in the quarter that ended July 31. That's up from \$420 million, or 99 cents per share, a year ago.

Deere says global revenue spiked 16 percent to \$6.84 billion.

Agricultural equipment sales in the U.S. and Canadian markets increased 19 percent in the quarter. Sales in other markets rose 16 percent, but that figure masks the European weakness.

'While we have benefited from positive conditions in the U.S. farm sector, particularly in terms

of demand for large equipment, European markets are down sharply," Deere's chairman and CEO Samuel Allen said in a statement.

Overall, Deere's agricultural and turf equipment sales grew 12 percent to \$5.2 billion from last year's \$4.7 billion.

Demand for construction and forestry equipment has improved from last year, but Deere said it remains well below normal. Quarterly sales for that division jumped 59 percent to just over \$1 billion from \$632 million a year ago.

The quarterly results from the maker of iconic green-and-yellow farm and construction equipment easily beat Wall Street expectations. On average, analysts expected earnings per share of \$1.24 on \$6.52 billion revenue.

praised Analysts Deere's performance, but were soured by the company's expectations going forward. Deere stock declined 96 cents, or 1.4 percent, to \$66.27 in early trading Wednesday.

Sterne Agee analyst Lawrence De Maria said in a research note that Deere's guidance appeared conservative after the past two quarters of solid results.

"We believe the underlying fundamentals for ag are exceptional, and anticipate continued strong operating performance and another solid year in 2011," De Maria said.

Jeffries & Co. analyst Stephen Volkmann said in a research note that Deere delivered a strong performance, but investors may be disappointed with the company's fourthquarter forecast.

The company said it now expects its sales to grow about 12 percent in fiscal 2010. That prediction is in line with the 11

Deere also said it expects fourth-quarter net income to increase about 32 percent over last year to \$375 million.

Deere said it expects U.S. farm income this year to total \$85.7 billion. That's up from the company's previous forecast of \$81.5 billion. The amount of money farmers have is a key indicator of how much equipment Deere will sell.

Deere, based in Moline, Illinois, is the world's largest maker of agricultural equipment, but it also makes construction, forestry and landscaping equipment.

Birds make stop in Kansas before autumn migration

(AP) — Through a hot and steamy August, masses of visitors from much cooler climates have come to Kansas. Many won't stay long because their destinations are across the Gulf of Mexico and deep into South America. That's a lot of wing beats for birds currently on southerly migrations.

"We call it the fall migration, but not all (species) migrate at the same time," said Bob Gress, director of the Great Plains Nature Center. "Fall starts in early August if you're an earlymigrating bird. It's certainly going on now.

Since mid-July, some birds have come from the north. The same species came from the south for spring migrations a few months ago.

Some seem to spend much of their year in migration, said Ken Brunson, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks non-game biologist. They spend little time on their summer nesting grounds.

"They get up there and get the job done pretty darned quickly," Brunson said. "Most of those chicks are pretty active even when they're small."

He said many chicks may only be about six weeks old when they begin southward migrations with their parents.

Max Thompson has had upland sandpipers passing over his Winfield home for several days. "All you have to do is

step outside early and listen," said Thompson, a retired professor of biology at Southwestern College. They nest from the Flint Hills up into Alaska and they're going clear back to Argentina for the winter.

Gress said several other species of sandpipers have been seen locally and most of those nested in the tundra only a few weeks ago.

Shorebirds, like sandpipers, make up many of the earliest migrants.

Barry Jones, Quivira National Wildlife Refuge naturalist, said about 20 species of the small- to medium-size wading birds have arrived within the past few weeks.

But you needn't head to a wetland to witness early migrations.

'Now's a great time to have hummingbird feeders out," Gress said. "You may have not had any nest anywhere near your house this summer, but they're moving through.

Some of Kansas' most common and popular birds are readying for migrations, too.

Thompson said Mississippi kites will start leaving in about two weeks. Other species will, too.

"A lot of our birds are gone by the first of Septem-ber," he said. "I've seen purple martins in Belize the first week of August and they didn't spend the sum-mer there."

More species will take up migration through the late fall.

By late November. Kansas prairies will hold some of the nation's top concentrations of hawks

Huge flocks of ducks and geese will settle in Kansas to feed amid broad fields of wheat and grain. Bald eagles will settle in Kansas to feed on those flocks of ducks and geese.

Come the first teasingly warm days of late winter and early spring, the migrational cycle will reverse itself. The waterfowl will be some of the first to head north.

Some of those passing through last, like the shorebirds, will be the birds we're seeing migrating now.

But they'll make the many thousands of miles trip, some species flying up to 600 miles a day. They'll stay up north just long enough to fledge their young and do it all again.

"It's a bi-yearly migra-tional miracle," Brunson said. "It's all pretty amazing.



"Speak for Wheat" spokespersons enjoy northern anniversary trip

In 1985, Sharon Davis, serving as the Kansas Wheat Commission's nutrition educator, developed the "Speak for Wheat" spokesperson program, which allowed volunteers from throughout Kansas to share information about wheat production, wheat food preparation and nutrition to audiences of all ages. Through the years, nearly 90 Kansans women, farmers and non-farmers – have served as Speak for Wheat spokespeople, includ-ing Cindy Falk, the Kansas Wheat Commission's current nutrition educator.

In this, its 25th year, Falk developed an educational Speak for Wheat Anniversary Tour to Des Moines and Mineapolis. The three-day tour took place in mid-July and featured a host of educational and informative stops for 25 spokespersons. In Carlisle, Iowa, the group met Steve Curran, plant manager of the General Mills flour mill. A K-State graduate, Curran said more than 1.3 million pounds of wheat are ground into flour each year at the plant; about 20% of that is used in the company's dry cookie mixes. Also in Iowa, the group toured the headquarters of Meredith Corporation, publisher of Better Homes and Gardens, Midwest Living and Successful Farming magazines. Loren Kruse, editor of Successful Farming and a K-State graduate, thanked the spokespersons for their time and

service in advocating for agriculture. "I admire you all for giving back to the agriculture industry. It is more important than ever. Be engaged in the battle," said Kruse, another K-State graduate.

The advocacy theme also was championed by Dan Dye, president of Cargill's Horizon Milling, in Minneapolis. Dye, who greeted the group at the Cargill headquarters, chal-lenged the spokespersons to be more proactive in telling the story of agriculture, together as an industry

"Mr. Dye said that all of us in agriculture need to tell consumers what we are doing on our farms," Falk said. A stop at the Saint Agnes Baking Co. in St. Paul brought the group face-to-face with Dan "Klecko" McGleno, who founded the Saint Paul Bread Club and runs the bakery's wholesale and retail businesses. The bakery balances the quality and tradition of Old World baking, with the reality of running a successful business in a competi-tive market. "Klecko's passion for making bread and his positive personality resonated with the spokespersons," Falk said. "He has tremendous pride in his product, and for the industry. He co-founded the Saint Paul Bread Club to teach others the art and technique of here bread baking." of home bread baking." Kim Ode, a feature writer for the Minneapolis Star Tribune, helped Klecko establish

the Saint Paul Bread Club. Ode also addressed the group. A baker herself, she built her own wood-fired brick bread oven in her backyard and wrote a book entitled "Baking with the St. Paul Bread Club.'

The group also toured Turtle Bread Company, so named because "great bread takes time to create," according to owner Harvey McClain. Head baker Solveig Tofte was select-

ed to represent Team USA at the World Cup of Bread in Paris in 2008. A lunch stop at Lucia's in Minneapolis was also a featured stop. In addition, spokesper-sons learned of a new Horizon Milling product called GrainWise wheat aleurone, a naturally concentrated source of essential vitamins and minerals found in whole grains and developed for the school food service industry. The Horizon Milling flour mill in Wichita makes GrainWise.

A stop at General Mills' headquarters in Golden Valley, Minn. included a tour of the Betty Crocker Kitchens. The tour was a diverse educational opportunity that included presentations from leaders of Fortune 500 companies, scientists, marketing experts, bread bakers and bakery owners.

It was the trip of a lifetime and what a great opportunity to see the test kitchens at Better Homes and Gardens and Betty Crocker test kitchens," says Julene DeRouchey, Wamego. Jean Ann Trout, Satanta, said the trip enabled her to network with other Speak for Wheat spokespersons from across Kansas.

Ideas gained from this trip will be very helpful in promoting wheat," Trout says. "The Kansas Wheat spokespersons are very professional and I am proud to be a member of this group

Rural and how to engage the next generation in farming, ranching, and rural communities will be the topic for the keynote speaker at a special presentation during the Kansas Rural Center's summer board meeting on August 28. Each of these programs is designed to provide NCTA students with an early entry into agriculture or business enterprise as a partner/owner that will lead to eventual ranch, farm or rural business ownership. For example, The "100 Cow Herd Upon Graduation Program" combines several existing beginning farmer programs with training programs at the

college, and aims to give graduates an opportunity to build enough income so they can eventually take over or start a farm or ranch, as well as build cattle numbers in the state. "My passion," states Sleight, "is to help communities engage their youth before they leave for college or other endeavors with the intent that they return home to be partners/employees in farms, ranches, and rural mainstreet businesses."

Sleight's afternoon presentation will follow the Kansas Rural Center board's morning business meeting. Both the 1:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. presentations are open to the public and should be of special interest to rural and economic development officials, FFA sponsors, and anyone interested in revitalizing rural

Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

Peonies For Next Memorial Day

In an instant gratification world, most gardening still requires patience. Container grown peonies can be planted which would make an instant splash. However, peonies are most often planted in early fall from a dormant root. Expectation of a bloom waits for next spring. Anticipation is part of the joy in gardening.

I'm looking forward to the peony talk along with the other presentations at the "Back to Gardening Night" educational event. The growing peonies presentation will be at 6 p.m. on Thursday, August 26 in Pottorf Hall at CiCo Park in Manhattan. All of the presentations are free and open to the public. More information is available by calling the office at 785-537-6350 or at www.riley.ksu. edu.

The peony program will be given by Riley County Extension Master Gardener Jim Roush. Master Gardeners are trained by K-State Research and Extension to be a resource for information which will change people for the better. These volunteers invest their time to teach the joys and advantages of gardening to others.

It will soon be time to teach a new class of volunteers. Beginning on Friday, September 3, the twentythird Master Gardener class in Riley County will start. Individuals in surrounding counties are welcome to belong in the Riley County group. Applications are due to the office by September 2. The application and more information are available on our website.

One of the Extension Master Gardener classes is on "Prairie Bloom" plants. These are perennial flowers that have done very well growing in our Kansas environment. 'Sarah Bernhardt' and 'Duchesse de Orleans' are two pink blooming peonies that are on the list. The recommended red peonies are 'Karl Rosenfield' and 'Shawnee Chief.' 'Festiva Maxima' is a peony that has a white bloom with red flecks.

A sunny, well-drained spot is a good location for any peony. Situate peonies so that the top of the root is no more than two inches deep or they won't bloom well. I'm going to try the fernleaf peony which has a small red bloom. The leaf shape is the intriguing part. It is shorter than most, getting only 15 to 20 inches tall, and blooms very early. Although it is slow to establish after transplanting, the anticipation shall be high.

"Peonies in the Garden" is a publication available from the Extension office. It will be available for the program on August 26.



Bayer agrees to terminate all uses of aldicarb in U.S.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Bayer CropScience, the manufacturer, have reached an agreement to end use of the pesticide aldicarb in the United States. A new risk assessment conducted by EPA based on recently submitted toxicity data indicates that aldicarb, an N-methyl carbamate insecticide, no longer meets the agency's rigorous food safety standards and may pose unacceptable dietary risks, especially to infants and young children. To address the most significant risks, Bayer has agreed first to end aldicarb use on citrus and potatoes and will adopt risk mitigation measures for other uses to protect groundwater resources.

New measures to protect shallow drinking water wells in vulnerable areas of the southeastern U.S. coastal plain and lower application rates will be immediately added to product labels for use on cotton, soybeans, and peanuts. The company will voluntarily phase out production of aldicarb by December 31, 2014. All remaining aldicarb uses will end no later than August 2018.

Additionally, EPA plans to revoke the tolerances (legal pesticide residues allowed in food) associated with these commodities. EPA did this to ensure the U.S. has the safest food supply
