Hay trade slow. Demand light to moderate for dairy, stock cow and grinding alfalfa, for alfalfa pellets and grass hay. Alfalfa producers hope to cut one more good cutting of dairy quality hay. Cooler nights are helping, a good rain or two would be welcome. Triticale and Rye are being planted for pasture, wheat planting is getting near. Kansas Ag Statistics is reporting alfalfa production down 6 percent and other hay down 19 percent from last year. Fred Provenza Livestock Behavior-Based Management Workshop planned for Sept. 25th

Fred Provenza, Utah State University, will be conducting a Livestock Behavior-Based Management Workshop on September 25, 2010 from 8:30 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. at the Evangel United Methodist Family Life Center, 227 Pennsylvania Ave., Holton.

Topics for the workshop include: (1) More than a Matter of Taste — train livestock in a variety of ways to avoid eating poisonous plants, better utilize invasive plants and to rejuvenate landscapes; (2) Social Influences on Food and Habitat Selection and (3) Variety: The Spice of Life — providing animals with a variety of foods and habitats that enhances their nutrition, health, well-being and ultimately efficiency of production in confinement, on pastures, and on rangelands.

Fred Provenza was born in Colorado Springs, Colorado, and began his career working on a small ranch near Salida in south-central Colorado. In total, he spent seven years working on the ranch. After earning a B.S. in wildlife biology from Colorado State University in 1973, he became ranch manager. In 1975, he left the ranch to attend graduate school. As a research assistant and technician at Utah

State University, he earned his M.S. and Ph.D. in range science. He joined the faculty there in 1982 and is currently a professor in the Department of Wildland Resources.

He has been recognized for accomplishments in research and as a mentor of students. In 1994, Fred received an Outstanding Achievement Award from the Society for Range Management. In 1999, he received the W.R. Chapline Research Award from the Society for Range Management for exceptional research accomplishments that enhance management of rangelands. The same year, he also received the University Outstanding Graduate Mentor award from Utah State University. He has supervised 45 graduate - M.S. and Ph.D. students - and post-doctoral students from 19 different countries. He has also been named Professor of the Year for the College of Natural Resources at Utah State University twice, in 1989 and 2003.

Fred's research focuses on understanding behavioral processes, and using that understanding to inform management. For over two decades, his emphasis has been on understanding the role of learning in food

and habitat selection by herbivores.

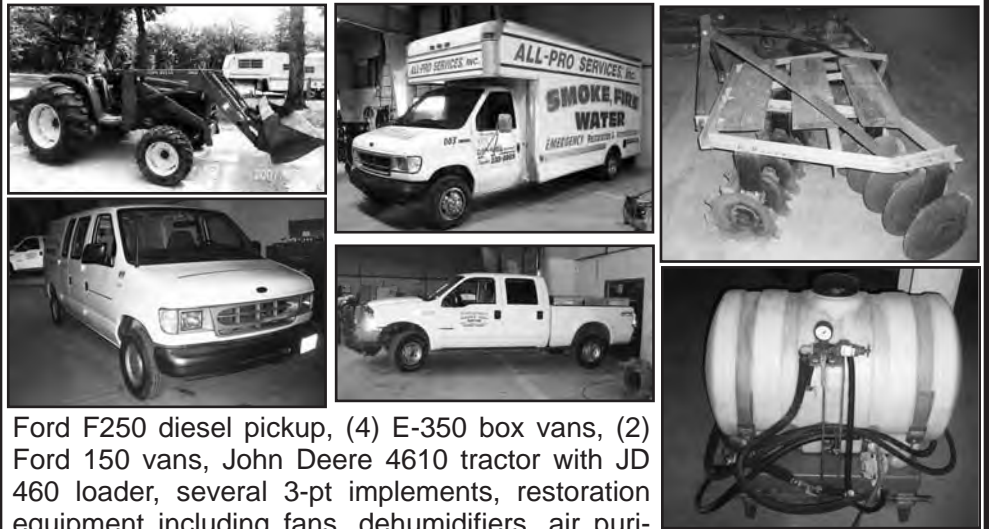

State treasurer celebrates ag program anniversary

Over 1485 loans have assisted family farmers during the last 10 years as part of the State Treasurer's Agricultural Production Loan Deposit Program.

"As a small business owner I know how tight some years can be due to many factors outside your control. Personally, I have experienced drought and rapid declines in cattle prices" said state treasurer Dennis McKinney. "This program helps Kansas' Ag banks and family farms continue our tradition of producing the safest and most abundant food supply in the world."

Authorized by the 2000 Legislature, the Kansas Agricultural Production Loan Deposit Program allows for up to \$55M in idle state funds to be loaned through Kansas banks at 2.0 percent below market rates to be used by agricultural borrowers with high debt to equity ratios. Currently 387 loans are outstanding for nearly \$49 million loaned to family farms.

"With over 20 percent of the jobs in Kansas related to agriculture, this highly successful loan program is the least we can do to help ensure the survival of family farms in Kansas while saving and creating new ag related jobs," said McKinney. "I want Kansas agriculture organizations, farmers and bankers to make full use of this program to do all we can to help Kansas

farm families to create jobs."

"These are difficult and challenging times on the farm," said Steve Bacus, an Ottawa County farmer who serves as president of Kansas Farm Bureau. "The State Treasurer's Agricultural Production Loan Deposit Program

has proven to be a popular and valuable tool for many of our members in managing their operations."

"It's an extremely successful program and a wonderful example of a win/win situation" states Donn Teske, president of the Kansas Farmers

Union. "These idle funds would be earning little otherwise and very often a couple of points of interest less can be the difference on a farm operations cash flow."

As one of the major pillars of the Kansas economy, this program has proven very suc-

cessful for all parties involved. The state is able to earn a return on its idle funds. Local financial institutions are able to increase loan volume and circulation of currency in the local economy. Local farmers are able to use these funds as a source of

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

Friday was the September supply and demand report. The two most important numbers will be the corn yield estimate and the corn ending stocks. Private analysts are consistently coming in below USDA's August corn production estimate and expectations are for next week's report to be friendly. USDA will probably cut the corn yield estimate, or at least they should, but there is no guarantee that they will this month and it may not happen until the October report. They will probably increase the old crop and new crop corn export estimates, and I am confident that will happen. It will depend on how much, if any, the USDA cuts the yield estimate, but the combination of lower production and higher demand will cut the ending stocks estimate to something near the 1 billion bushel level and make the stocks to use ratio very tight and very bullish.

Expectations for soybean production are mixed, with some above and some below USDA's August estimate. If production is increased it will likely be offset by increased demand. I don't think that the ending stocks estimate will grow from the August estimate; there is just too much demand for soybeans out there. If production is cut, ending stocks will drop, but it won't be enough to make stocks tight, which will keep the soybean market in the role of the follower.

As for the wheat, I don't expect much adjustment to the U.S. numbers. It is probably too early to change the export estimate again. However, it will be very, very interesting to see what USDA does with the world num-

bers. There is the potential for numerous production changes around the world and we will have to pay close attention to which of our export competitors are affected.

The corn was impressive last week. The December corn moved through the \$4.50 resistance that had kept the market in check since November, and closed at the highest level since mid-2009, gaining 28 1/2 cents for the week. On the weekly chart the corn closed at the highest level since the fall of 2008.

The charts look friendly since the December corn finally broke through the \$4.50 resistance, but this week's move higher put technical indicators into overbought territory. A correction next week is very likely. Expectations are for a friendly crop report, which will make it difficult to have a friendly reaction to the report especially if we are trending higher as we go into it. The fundamentals are bullish and getting more so each week, but right now the move may be overdone. Ideally the \$4.50 level will now become support in the December contract, and after a correction the corn will resume the trend higher. As long as the perception that stocks are shrinking remains, the corn will continue to work its way higher.

Export sales were great again with new crop coming in at 1.69 MMT. One thing that we cannot forget is that this is a demand led market. This run up is not a weather scare. There is some uncertainty about production, but for the most part the question has been whether we will have a record yield or merely an above trend line yield. The only reason a

bushel or two in the yield estimate matters so much this year is because we have record demand again, and we really don't know how big of a record it might be. With the problems in Europe and China, USDA could still be underestimating exports by as much as 400 million bushels. Also, we are going to need more acreage next year and a great yield to go with those acres, so end users will be encouraged to secure supplies sooner, rather than later. Demand is a great thing and the only thing that stops demand is higher prices.

Cash cattle traded at the \$97-\$97.50 level last week, which was down a couple dollars from the previous week. The October futures, however, look like they have completed a correction and are ready for another leg higher. For the week the October LC were 35 cents higher after a poor start to the week.

All of the contracts from December forward made new contract highs this week, but finished the week with a very wild Friday and what may be, reversals lower in the December and February contracts. There is a strong seasonal tenden-

cy for those contracts to be weaker at this time of year, so we must be cautious.

I still like the fundamental outlook of the cattle market. We are killing more cattle than last year, but only producing the same amount of beef. We are killing more cows than last year, so we can't be growing the cow herd, so unless there is a dramatic change in carcass weights, our beef supplies are going to be tight, and probably getting tighter as we move forward.

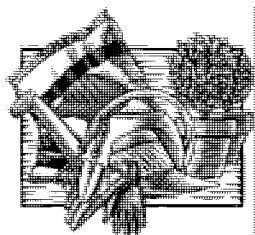

Yard & Garden Tips

By Gregg Eyestone

Hardy Lawn Grasses

The lawn was doing fine until August. Now I will need to do some over-seeding. Looking at weather data, the difference from this year and the previous years was heat. Moisture was similar so the lawn decline was caused by high

temperatures which stress cool-season grasses.

Our lawn is a mix of turf-type tall fescue and bluegrass. It was the bluegrass that declined the most. Over-seeding with a blend of turf-type tall fescue will be my solution. The selected

seed will need to be planted into the soil. Use a rake or a core aerator to open up the soil for the seed to enter. Raking and watering will cover the seed.

There are lots of grass seed packages available. When I looked at the seed label, only a few would be what I would want to use for my lawn. Many of them didn't have grass varieties trialed by K-State Research and Extension. Hidden weeds were another concern.

Turf-type tall fescues and trialed bluegrass is what will make for a long term healthy cool-season grass lawn in our area. K-31 tall fescue is fine for a lower input lawn. Other cool-season grasses are not able to survive our Kansas environment for very long. Packages containing ryegrass, chewing fescues, creeping red fescue, sheep fescue and bluegrasses not recommended by K-State will be temporary cover.

Besides using recommended varieties, look at

the "other crop seed" portion of the seed label. Other crop means other grasses. In the lawn, other grasses are called weeds. Most people don't want to plant weeds in their lawn. A good package of grass will have less than .5% other crop. I have seen some labels with zero percent. Other parts of the seed label are useful. Purity of each grass variety should be 90 percent or greater. Live seed that will germinate should be greater than 80 percent. Weed seed and noxious weeds needs to be low. Date the seed lot was tested needs to be in the last nine months.

Price should be an indicator but it isn't always. A good package of turf-type tall fescue can be about \$2 a pound. I saw some packages of temporary grasses for \$6 a pound. Make sure you are paying for what you want to plant.

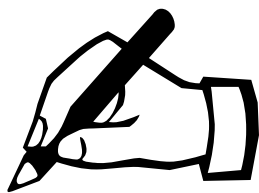

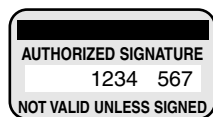



The event will take place at the Old Mill Museum, 120 Mill Street. Hours for the event will be from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Interested persons from the central Kansas area may drop by the museum and speak with Kansas State Historical Society and other archeologists. Well-experienced avocational archeologists from the KAA will also be available. Collectors can bring Native American artifacts or early historical items throughout the event for assistance in identification and dating. Helpful suggestions will also be made for cataloging and collection maintenance.

No appraisals or sales will be made: this is a free public service to improve knowledge of our state's archeological heritage.

The public is encouraged to visit this event. Visitors may come and go as is convenient for them. Light refreshments will be served.

In previous years the ID Day has been held in Abilene, Kanopolis, Lyons, and Newton. This will be the 9th year the chapter has hosted the event. The Kansas Anthropological Association is a nonprofit organization which was founded in 1955 to bring together professional and amateur archeologists and collectors for the study of the history and prehistory of Kansas people.

KAA holds a number of events each year with

statewide participation, the most popular of which is the annual field school/ archeology training program (KATP). In June 2010 the event was held in the city of Neodesha and on the Verdigris River in Montgomery County. The area is the site of an early ceramic period

culture (AD 1-1000) in Kansas, as well as earlier Late Archaic occupations dating from about 2500 BC to AD1.

Kansas Profile

Duane Durst — Pony Express

The rider gallops up to the station, carrying the mochila full of mail. It's the Pony Express — but it's also 2010. This rider is re-enacting this historic delivery service in honor of the 150th anniversary of the Pony Express. A re-enactment ride passed through rural Kansas in 2010, including a stop at the nation's only unaltered Pony Express station still standing at its original site. Special thanks to Kansas Magazine and writer Mark Janssen whose article told this remarkable story. It's today's Kansas Profile.

Duane Durst is director of the Hollenberg Pony Express Station State Historic Site near Hanover. The Pony Express was created in 1860 to deliver mail between St. Joseph, Missouri and the west coast. The route generally followed the wagon ruts

of the Oregon and California trails through northeast Kansas.

The destination was Sacramento — 1,966 miles away. The mission was delivery-transporting the mail in no more than 10 days through Kansas, Nebraska, Wyoming, Colorado, Utah, Nevada and California territories.

The Pony Express concept came from the Russell, Majors & Waddell freight company, which provided the horses and hired the riders. Posters seeking riders read: "Wanted — young, skinny, wiry fellows not over 18. Must be expert riders, willing to risk death daily. Orphans preferred. Wages \$25 per week."

When they said they wanted skinny riders, they meant it. Duane Durst pointed out that the considera-

tion was for the horse. He said, "The total weight of rider, saddle and mail could not exceed 150 pounds."

Riders signed contracts promising they would not use profane language, get drunk, gamble, treat the animals cruelly or "do anything incompatible with the conduct of a gentleman." I'd like to see some behavior codes like that today.

Each rider covered 50 to 80 miles per day, riding at an 8 to 12 miles per hour clip. Horses and mochila were changed every 10 to 15 miles. The riders were allowed two minutes to make that change. "A rider would swing off one horse and swing on another," Durst said. "It would happen that fast." Although the riders were asked to risk death daily, only one of its riders was killed during the existence of the Pony Express.

The cost of sending a letter was \$5 per half ounce, later reduced to \$1 when letters were written on tissue-type paper. More than 30,000 pieces of mail were delivered in the 18-month existence of the Pony Express, including the text of President Lincoln's inaugural address which arrived in seven days and 17 hours — well ahead of the guaranteed 10-day delivery.

The Pony Express captured the imagination of the nation, but it found itself displaced by the telegraph. It ended on October 26, 1861.

In honor of the 150th anniversary of the Pony Ex-

press, a re-enactment ride was held in June 2010. It passed through northeast Kansas, going to the Hollenberg Pony Express Station before going to Marysville and beyond.

The Hollenberg Pony Express Station is a 60-by-25-foot, six-room, rustic building. Today it is a National Historical Landmark, making it unique among the 190 stations along the trail. Duane Durst said, "It is the only original unaltered station standing right where it was built. There are other stations, but they have been moved or altered, which takes away the historical value."

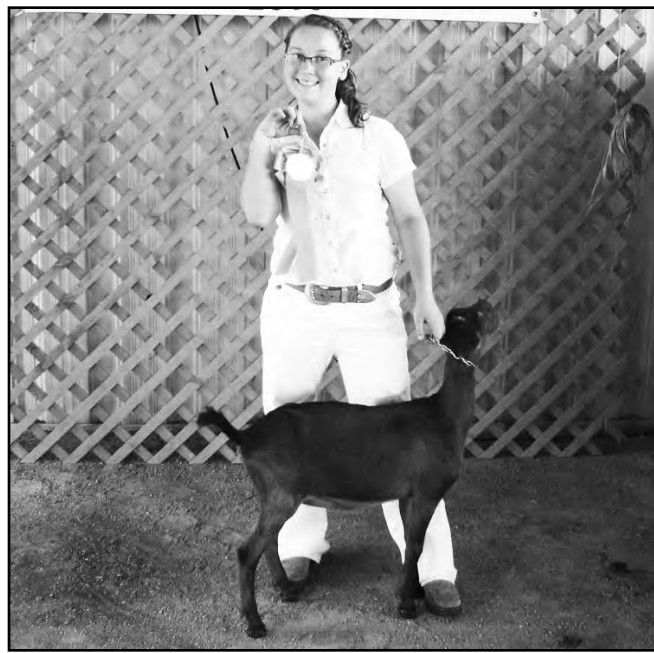
Now the Kansas State Historical Society maintains the site, which features educational displays and a beautiful mural. This Pony Express station is located in a truly rural setting, because Hanover is a town of 632 people. Now, that's rural.

August 29 marked the 25th Annual Pony Express Festival at the historic Hollenberg Station, and included live demonstrations and a short Pony Express re-ride.

The rider has transferred the mail, and now he gallops away from the station as a way of celebrating

150 years since the founding of the Pony Express. We commend Duane Durst and all those involved for making a difference by honoring this legacy. It's the type of genuine history which rural Kansas can deliver.
