Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

Friday USDA released the September supply and demand report. The corn numbers were more or less as expected with a cut in the corn yield from 165 bu/ac to 162.5 and cuts to both the old crop and new crop ending stocks. The new crop ending stocks estimate of 1.116 billion would be the lowest since the 03/04 crop year and the stocks to use ratio would be the tightest since the 95/96 crop year. While it is highly unlikely that our ending stocks fall to 426 million like in the 95/96 crop year, it is possible that the stocks to use ratio challenges the 5% that we had in 95-96. If the final yield comes in at 160 bu/ac and if demand increases 200 million bushels, ending stocks would fall to 706 million and the stocks to use ratio would

be 5.1%. That is not a far-fetched scenario and that is why the corn market is moving higher.

The wheat numbers also came in as expected. The export estimate was increased by 50 million bushels, which cut the ending stocks by 50 million bushels to 902 million. 902 million is still at the top end of the range for the past 20 years, but at least the number is falling and demand is improving.

The soybeans had the most disappointing report. Traders were expecting a small cut in the yield estimate, but we ended up with a small increase. Ending stocks were still lower than last month at 350 million because of lower beginning stocks and higher exports. Demand is tremendous and

I expect that we will see record exports yet again this year.

The corn market doesn't seem to move higher steadily and easily, it is a very choppy affair, but it does keep moving up. For the week the December corn gained 13 3/4 cents. The December corn nearly reached the \$4.81 level which is the 38% retracement of the entire move down from the 2008 high. The corn bottomed out when the USDA released the June Quarterly Stocks and Acreage reports. Since then the perception has been that our corn stocks are shrinking and the September supply and demand report confirmed once again that they are in fact shrinking. Also, and this is extremely important, the supply and demand report

did nothing to suggest that the trend in the lower stocks estimates has ended. There is still fear that we may see a lower yield estimate in the October report and demand is good enough that there is still fear of further increases in the export, and possibly ethanol usage estimates. As long as traders feel that stocks are getting tighter, the price will keep moving higher.

Export sales weren't as strong as recent weeks, but they were still over 700,000 MT. We often see very large sales in the fall when the corn market typically is making its harvest low. This year is not typical and it doesn't look like we will see a normal harvest low, but one should expect to see sales continue at a good pace because of fears of tight world supplies of feed grain and shrinking US stocks. We are by far the number one exporter of corn in the world, and if we run out, there is no one to turn to. Look for importers to secure supplies while they still can.

The wheat was very choppy last week. The December KW came back from early

losses to close 1 1/2 cents higher for the week.

Export sales were very good again at 953,400 MT of old crop and 660,000 MT of new crop sales. It is a little unusual to see large new crop sales at this time of year, but it could be an indi-

cation that importers fear tighter supplies and higher prices in the future.

World ending stocks were actually increased this month, which was a little surprising. The main reason for the increase, was that beginning stocks were in-

creased. So USDA found some old crop wheat somewhere to keep the bullish enthusiasm in check. World production was cut, but so was demand, so we end up with higher new crop stocks. On paper the fundamental outlook still isn't good enough to justify the current price level, especially for Hard Red Winter Wheat. However, if demand can stay strong, and we can keep from increasing acreage in the US, we are only 1 below average crop from having a bullish fundamental setup. In other words, the market is still in the hands of the investors of the world. Money flow is a very important fundamental and fear of production problems in Europe is keeping money coming into the wheat.

The thing holding the soybean market back has been the fear of growing stocks. Traders had expected to see a lower production estimate in the supply and demand report which would have taken away a lot of that fear, but that was not the case. The higher yield esti-

mate and some good early yield reports pressured the soybean market as we closed out the week and the November contract ended up 4 cents lower.

The charts suggest further range bound trade. The excess supply will pressure the market but our tremendous demand will support the market on breaks. There is little reason for buyers to chase the market higher because of the plentiful supplies, but they are willing to secure supplies on breaks.

Export sales were very good again at 824,700 MT. Soybean oil sales have been amazing with 138,200 MT of old crop and new crop sales. This week's sales were very close to record large for a single week and next week's sales report will be record large.

Cash cattle traded mostly at the \$97-\$98 level last week, which was up 50 cent to 1 dollar from the bulk of last week's trade. The futures didn't fare as well and the October LC lost \$1.30 and the December fell .65. The live cattle do appear to

have found some support this week and I look for the market to rebound next week. I still like the fundamental outlook for the live cattle and I still think the October contract can make new highs. The feeder cattle were pressure by the combination of weaker live cattle and stronger corn. For the week the October feeders fell \$3.25. The feeder cattle found support this week as well. The market is overbought and the October contract has a double bottom on the chart, so hopefully there is a bounce next week. I am inclined to look at bounces in the October and November feeder cattle as a selling opportunity. I don't like the seasonal outlook of the feeders and I don't really care for the chart pattern either.

2010 wheat quality is pleasant surprise

With preliminary data in, quality traits of the 2010 Kansas wheat crop were a pleasant surprise, according to the annual Wheat Quality Report released Sept. 2 by the Kansas Agriculture Statistics. This year's crop featured an average test weight of 61.4 pounds per bushel and protein of 12.0%, both of which exceed the 2009 averages of 61.0 pounds and 11.6%, respectively. The 10-year test-weight average is 60.3 pounds per bushel, and protein, 12.3%. Moisture content of the 2010 crop averaged 11.2%, the same as last year and down from the 10-year average of 11.5%. "The excellent test weight and higher protein in the 2010 Kansas Hard Red Winter wheat crop reflects the good management practices of Kansas wheat farmers,"

says Aaron Harries, marketing director for Kansas Wheat.

Wheat samples graded at No. 1 were at 89%; down from 90% last year. Wheat grading No. 2 averaged 10%, compared to 9% in 2009.

"This year demonstrated just how consistent the Kansas wheat crop is," says Mark Fowler, associate director of the International Grains Program at Kansas State University and milling specialist. "We had above average test weight across the state and a very sound, high quality year with no real areas of concern."

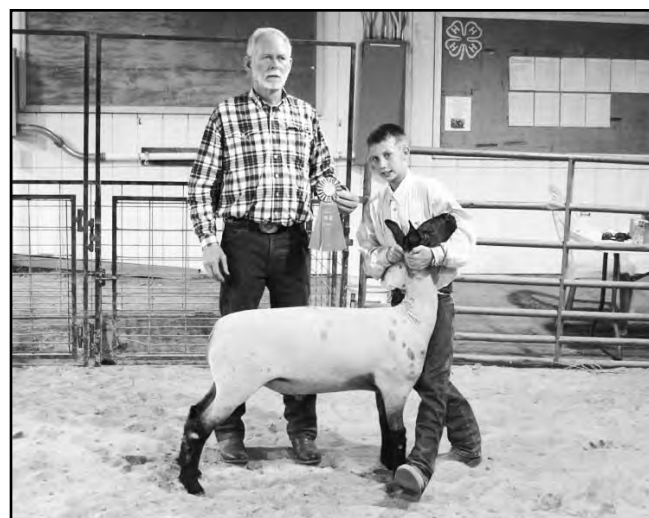
Southwest Kansas wheat producers had the highest overall protein average, at 12.5%, while southeast Kansas produced 12.4% protein. Leading the state in test weight and highest grade overall was west cen-

tral Kansas with 62.2 pounds per bushel. The Kansas crop's excellent quality attributes are a positive selling point, given a volatile world wheat supply situation. Drought and wildfires in Russia forced that country to postpone wheat exports, requiring many wheat importing countries to look elsewhere for wheat. The U.S. is a logical choice to meet that demand, Harries adds.

"This high-quality, milling wheat reinforces the demand from our international customers who have come to rely on a consistent, quality product from the U.S.," he explains. "When wheat supplies becoming tight, our buyers know that the U.S. wheat market is open to everyone."

In comparison to surrounding states, the 2010

Kansas crop fared well. In Texas, test weights averaged 61.5 pounds per bushel and protein averaged 12%. Test weight average in Oklahoma was 60.9 pounds per bushel and protein was 11.8%. In Colorado, test weight average was 60.7 pounds per bushel and protein, 11.2%. Meanwhile, Nebraska's test weight average was 60.7 pounds per bushel and protein, 11.7%. Testing hay can save supplement dollars

Forage analysis can be a useful tool to remove some of the mystery concerning the hay that producers will feed this winter, writes Glenn Selk, Oklahoma State University Professor Emeritus. Testing the grass hays this year for protein and energy content will help the producer design winter supplementation programs most appropriate for the forage supply that is available. Any of the potential nitrate accumulating hays should be tested for nitrate concentration.

Forage quality has two important benefits to cows or heifers. First, higher quality forages contain larger concentrations of important nutrients so animals consuming these forages should be more likely to meet their nutrient needs from the forages. Secondly, and just as important, animals can consume a larger quantity of higher quality forages. Higher quality forages are fermented more rapidly in the rumen leaving a void that the animal can fill with additional forage. Consequently, forage intake increases. For example, low quality forages (below about 6% crude protein) will be consumed at about 1.5% of body weight (on a dry matter basis) per day. Higher quality grass hays (above 8% crude protein) may be consumed at about 2.0% of body weight.

Excellent forages, such as good alfalfa, silages, or green pasture may be consumed at the rate of 2.5% of body weight per day. The combination of increased nutrient content AND increased forage intake makes high quality forage very valuable to the animal and the producer.

The value of forage testing can best be illustrated by comparing the supplement needed to meet the nutrient needs of cows in the winter. Assume we are feeding hay to a 1200-pound spring-calving cow in late gestation. She needs 1.9 pounds of crude protein to meet her needs and that of the growing fetus. If she consumes 2.0% of her body weight in a low quality grass hay (4.0% Crude Protein) she will receive 0.96 pounds of protein from the hay leaving a deficiency of 0.94 pounds of protein needed from the supplement. To meet her protein needs with a 30% crude protein supplement would require 3.13 pounds of supplement each day. However, if the same cow was consuming a higher quality grass hay (7.0% Crude Protein), then she receives 1.68 pounds of protein from the hay and must be given enough supplement to meet the 0.22 pounds that is lacking. Now, to meet her needs the cow only needs 0.73 pounds of the same supplement per

day. Because of the difference in hay quality the supplement needs vary by four-fold!

There are several good methods of sampling hay for forage analysis. Most nutritionists would prefer to use a mechanical coring probe made specifically for this purpose. The coring probe is usually a stainless steel tube with a serrated, cutting edge. It is 1 inch in diameter and is designed to fit on a 1/2 inch drill or brace. Cordless drills make these tools quite mobile so that the hay bales to be tested do not have to be hauled to be near an electrical outlet. The hay samples are placed in paper or plastic bags for transfer to a forage testing laboratory. Cores are taken from several bales at random to obtain a representative sample to be analyzed.

Grab samples can also be obtained and tested. To receive the best information, grab several samples by hand from about 6 inches into the open side of the bale or the middle third of a small round bale. Place all of the sample in the bag. Do not discard weeds or stems, just because they look undesirable. They are still part of the hay that you are offering to the livestock. Be certain to label the forage samples accurately and immediately, in order for the laboratory analysis to be correctly assigned to the proper hay piles or bales. Obviously the more samples that are sent to the laboratory for analysis, the more information can be gained. Just as obvious is the fact that as the number of samples increase, the cost of forage testing increases.
