

MU grad student simulates 100 years of farming to measure impact on land and water quality

Estimating the long-term impact of agriculture on land is tricky when you don't have much information about what a field was like before it was farmed. Some fields in Missouri started producing crops more than a century ago — long before anyone kept detailed records about the physical and chemical properties of the soil in a field.

Researchers can't go back in time to revisit old fields in their pristine state, but a University of Missouri graduate student did perhaps the next best thing, using a detailed computer model to simulate, year-by-year, the effects of 100 years of farming on claypan soils.

This can help determine the impact of certain conservation practices on farmland's crop yields and soil and water quality, said Ashish Mudgal, who recently completed his doctorate in soil science at MU.

Mudgal took detailed measurements of the soil properties of two 80-acre claypan fields in Missouri — a never-farmed native prairie managed by MU and a field that had been under cultivation for more than a century and is currently managed by the USDA's Agricultural Research Service (ARS). These served as "before" and "after" snapshots to calibrate the model. He also made use of satellite

images and aerial photographs taken between 1930 and 1990.

Mudgal incorporated the data into a model developed by researchers at Texas A&M University called APEX (Agricultural Policy Environment eXtender). The simulation estimated changes in runoff, erosion, and the flow of sediment, nutrients and herbicides.

After 100 simulated years of row-crop farming, the model showed an 82 percent increase in the average annual amount of the herbicide atrazine in runoff. Corn yields declined by 39 percent and soybean yields fell by 75 percent.

"These results show that the restoration of agricultural lands would be beneficial not only to enhance crop yields but also to reduce nonpoint-source pollution," Mudgal said.

The study also indicates that on claypan soils, the land that often causes the most environmental challenges when farmed tends to be less productive as well.

Findings from simulations like this can help farmers, policymakers and conservation agents make informed decisions about best practices for managing farmland to reduce the environmental impact and enhance productivity.

The study was funded in part by the USDA's Conservation Effects Assessment Program (CEAP), a long-range national effort to measure the impact of conservation practices and programs on agricultural land and water quality.

Programs such as the USDA's Conservation Reserve Program provide farmers and ranchers financial incentives to retire areas of farmland for a certain length of time and/or implement conservation practices such as terraces, hedges of native grasses and plant buffers that filter nutrients, sediment and other pollutants from runoff.

Conservation practices can't replace soil that has been lost over time, but they can return properties such as the soil's water infiltration capacity to something closer to the original state.

Through studies such as Mudgal's, CEAP seeks to devise scientifically sound tools to gauge the effectiveness of conservation practices, which are designed to control erosion, maintain soil productivity, protect watersheds and enhance wildlife habitat.

This can provide guidance for bringing retired land back into production and for targeting conservation efforts where they can do the most good, Mudgal said.

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

There were a number of markets that posted impressive gains last week. The gold and cotton markets made new all-time highs, the silver reached the highest level since 1980, and the Dow Jones reached the highest level since the fall of 2008. Meanwhile, the U.S. Dollar Index reached the lowest level in a year, which is no coincidence. The weak dollar isn't the only reason for the strength in commodities, but it does help. After this week's break the dollar seems to have found some support and will probably have a corrective bounce. However, there is still no indication of a change in the trend and with the Federal Reserve committed to printing another \$75 billion a month for the next eight months it is hard to imagine much reason for strength in the dollar.

This week is the November supply and demand report. Expectations are generally for lower corn production and steady to slightly higher soybean production. Traders are also looking for lower corn and soybean ending stocks and wheat stocks that are near unchanged. The theme to take away from this is that the trend in corn and soybean ending stocks is expected to stay down, which in turn means that the trend in price should be expected to stay up. Statistically it is highly likely that the corn

yield will be trimmed again in the January report, which means that the trend in the corn can remain higher for quite some time. It wasn't a great week for the corn, but the December corn did make a new high for the move twice this week and did finish 4 cents higher for the week. The chart pattern is sideways/higher and with the fundamental outlook still improving, breaks are still a buying opportunity. The \$6.00 level and the \$6.20 level are still likely near term upside targets.

One aspect of the corn market that could use some improvement is the export market. Export sales were poor again this week at 461,600 MT. If demand would improve a little, it would put a fresh spark into the market, but for now it seems that the rising price and generally firmer basis is discouraging some buying. If it looks to importers like the dollar has bottomed for a little bit, it could encourage them to make buys if they begin to fear a change in trend.

The July KW had a great finish to the week. Thursday and Friday the wheat overcame the early week losses and the July KW made a new contract high on Friday and finished 19 cents higher for the week. Dry weather in the U.S. HRW area is becoming a major concern. Crop condition ratings are poor and

there is little moisture in the forecast. Each week without rain will increase the speculative interest and diminish the farmers' interest in selling. The chart pattern suggests we have the potential for very large gains in the wheat and it wouldn't be surprising to see the July KW reach \$10.00 at some point.

The soybeans continued in their choppy/higher pattern. The May and July contracts were in the teens briefly and the January contract gain 48 cents for the week. The beans had another great export sales report with 1.59 MMT of sales being reported. There weren't as many daily announcements last week, so Thursday's number will probably be down, but at this point, with cumulative sales over 1 billion bushels, we can afford to see a dramatic slowdown in sales and still have a record year. The supply and demand report will be key. If there is another surprise cut in yield, the soybean market will be explosive. There is already concern that supplies will be tight in the summer due to the Chinese demand. If production

slips too, the market will be crazy.

Cash cattle trade was at \$98 and the December live cattle lost some ground last week. The February contract is still holding critical support and the early action this week will be very important. If we start the week under pressure and support fails, look for steep losses. I still like the fundamental outlook of the market, but I am nervous about the chart action.

Stout's supporters gather at American Royal

Leaders from the livestock industry gathered at the American Royal on Oct. 28 for The Final Drive. The Final Drive kicked off the second phase of fundraising for the Livestock Marketing and Learning Center in memory of Col. Stanley E. Stout at Kansas State University. K-State is taking the campaign to a national level and encouraging seedstock producers to designate one lot in their respective livestock sales, and donate the proceeds from that lot to the fund.

Seedstock producers and industry leaders from New York to New Mexico have raised \$250,000 for the center through private donations. Kenneth Odde, K-State department head of Animal Sciences and Industry, said the university needs to raise another \$250,000 over the next year before they can break ground for the center. The Livestock Marketing and Learning Center will serve as the home for K-State's annual Legacy Sale, which is managed by students. The center will be available for producers to hold sales and video auctions and serve as a multi-purpose teaching unit for various educational events. Odde said the center will be an asset to the College of Agriculture and not only create opportunities for students, but also serve as a resource for the livestock industry.

The Livestock Marketing and Learning Center will provide traditional and non-traditional agriculture students with more exposure to the livestock industry. Dan Moser, K-State professor of beef cattle genetics, said the center will be a valuable addition to the university from a teaching standpoint. "It will provide hands-on learning and animal observation opportunities," he said.

The fundraising began as a tribute to Stout. The center will bear Stout's name in honor of his lifelong support of K-State and the livestock industry. Ryan Breiner, manager of the K-State Purebred Beef Barn, said K-State wanted to honor Stout as a longtime supporter of the university and believed naming the building after him would be a fitting tribute.

Kristian Rennert, American-International Charolais Association field representative, considered Stout a mentor. "Stanley was a legend in the business of livestock marketing and was extremely loyal to his Kansas State roots," he said. "He's an icon for the livestock industry."

You won't score many bonus points by suggesting similarities between the women in your life and females of the bovine persuasion, but looking at just such a comparison might help your cow herd and calf crop.

For decades, pregnant women have been told to avoid alcohol, to eat "right" and take a prenatal vitamin. New research even shows what women eat during gestation could affect the taste buds of the tiny beings they're nurturing.

All well and good, but what's that got to do with your cows?

Animal scientists have

started to dig into this whole area of fetal programming and it turns out that what the cows eat affects the calves in a big way. You probably can't get them to prefer wheat straw over good alfalfa hay or create a calf that will never test the electric fence, but what you can't influence is not as important as what you can.

In spring-calving herds, late gestation starts in the late fall to early winter, headed into lean times for forage resources on many ranches. Coincidentally, and you might even say unfortunately, this could be your best chance to change for the better what's going

on in the cells of your soon-to-be-born calves. In one study, when cows were supplemented during the final stages of pregnancy, birth weights and even rebreeding rates were similar to counterparts on a lower plan of nutrition. But where that extra crude protein really made the difference was in the progeny's performance. Heifer calves had increased fertility while the steer mates had higher weaning weights and greater subsequent carcass weights. The calves from the supplemented mommas had dramatically higher levels of marbling, adding 18 points to the percentage grading premium Choice or higher. Yield grade was virtually the same.

Note: This benefits producers selling at weaning (increased weight and fertility) as well as those retaining ownership (increased weight and quality). It seems important to blatantly point that out, because so often the latter group is the main beneficiary from increased labor and expense. This time everybody wins.

A pregnant woman sipping a cup of caffeinated coffee or even splurging on some greasy cuisine is often criticized for her poor choices. For opposite reasons, ranchers who feed cake or liquid supplement in the winter might feel the derision of similar judgments.

You can just hear the critics now: "Can't your cows make their own living?" "Do you baby them year-round?" You can take comfort knowing that you're feeding more than just the

cow. Sure, they can make it through the winter and regain body condition as they go onto spring pasture, but at what expense?

Researchers say cells are already differentiated into muscle, fat, organs or bone by late gestation, but calves in utero may still be programmed to use nutrients differently.

It almost sounds too good to be true, but obstetricians probably wouldn't argue with that logic. For decades they've known that keeping moms in good nutrition will

help babies. So it might be time to pay a little more attention to your winter resources and evaluate your herd's needs with more of a long view. It could improve the fertility, weight and quality of your next calf crop — and that's more valuable than any arbitrary bonus points.

Konza Prairie research to benefit grasslands worldwide

Scientists at Konza Prairie Biological Station have received major funding for research on critical questions about the underlying decisions made by grazing animals and the effects on grassland dynamics.

Konza is jointly owned by Kansas State University and The Nature Conservancy and managed by K-State's Division of Biology.

The National Science Foundation recently awarded Tony Joern, university distinguished professor in biology at K-State, and collaborators John Briggs, director of Konza Prairie Biological Station; Douglas Goodin, professor of geography; Adam Skibbe, information manager in biology; and Gene Towne, research asso-

ciate in biology, \$750,000 to study how and why grazing animals choose certain feeding locations, and the impact of the grazing on the tallgrass prairie ecology.

"Grazing animals are a major driving force for grasslands all over the world, but how they actually use space is poorly understood," Joern said. "Understanding how bison and cattle actually select areas to graze on native grasslands will provide new management opportunities for grassland conservation efforts, as well develop alternate grazing options for grassland managers."

The group will use comparative studies by Towne on the effects of bison and cattle as background for the

current study, Joern said. Towne's studies have shown that cattle and bison do not feed uniformly, so the goal is to get a better idea of the decisions the animals are making to determine where they forage. Joern said there may be several factors that influence feeding choices, such as forage nutritional quality, height of vegetation, landscape position, weather conditions and the area's level of fire frequency.

"There are a lot of data out there that suggest herbivores prefer to graze on burned areas, but within those areas how do they finally decide which clump of grass to chomp on?" Briggs said.

American bison will be used as the model species for the experiment, and they will be given access to various areas on Konza with differing forage quality, burn frequency and landscape positions, thus allowing the animals the opportunity to choose which area they prefer to feed.

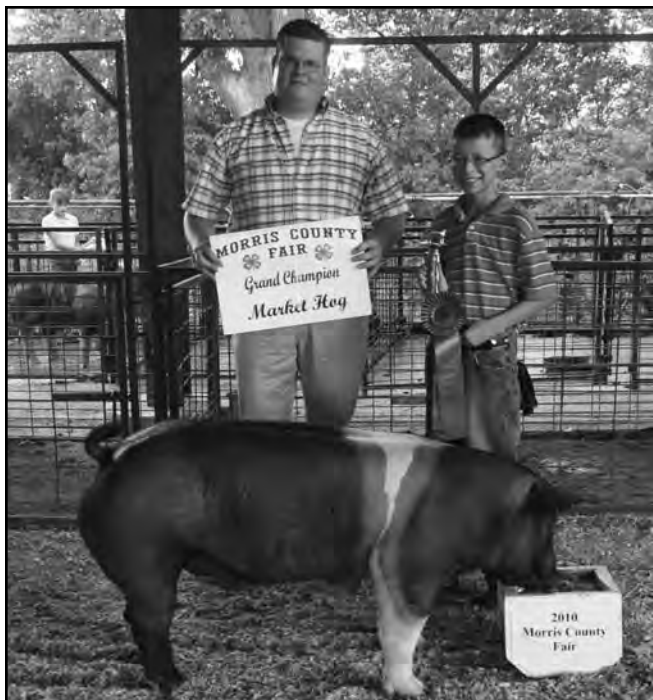
"Konza Prairie is the ideal site for this type of research because it is set up in a huge watershed level experiment, where we already manipulate grazing and fire frequency," Joern said. "When you burn the prairie at different intervals you get different kinds of grassland with different forage qualities. We are layering this new grazing experiment on top of all that."

To evaluate the nutritional quality of the prairie, the group will deploy a hyper-spectral remote imaging aircraft four times a year. This methodology, under the direction of Goodin, will measure the spatial distribution of the protein

content of the grassland at a two-meter scale. Spatial distributions of nutritional quality of vegetation will be compared to data on bison movement, gathered using global positioning system collars that track the animals' movement as they feed. Geographic information system modeling, done under the direction of Skibbe, will correlate these two data sets. In addition to tracking bison movement, the group will also record vegetation responses to bison grazing activity.

A special component of the project is the involvement of Drew Ising, a high school biology teacher with the Geary County School District. Ising is interested in including ecology research in his classroom, and will be using real data from the grazing study to develop lesson plans in a multitude of subjects for use by other teachers.

"Having enthusiastic teachers like Drew participate in the project to make our results available to students is really exciting, and we plan to do some pretty exciting things with this opportunity," Joern said.

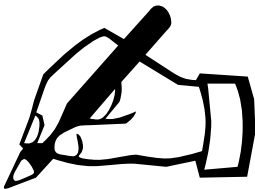

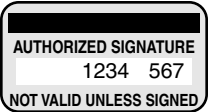

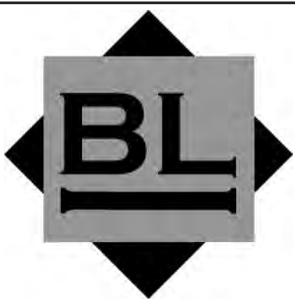

Natise Vogt – Walton School

“What’s growing here?” That’s the type of question little kids might ask when they drive by a field with a crop they haven’t seen before. Educators are finding that such natural curiosity about growing things can be harnessed and utilized to enhance classroom education in a rural setting. Special thanks to Kansas Agri-Women President Jocelyn Busick, whose article told this remarkable story.

Natise Vogt is principal of Walton 21st Century Rural Life Center in Walton. This is a charter school with a curriculum based on agriculture. It’s part of the Newton School District.

The school building has been in Walton since 1964, but most country schools have closed since that time, and budgets were tight.

Natise, a long-time special education teacher, became principal of Walton Elementary in 2005. “Our superintendent, Dr. Morton, approached me with the idea of Walton becoming a charter school based on agriculture,” Natise said. “I told him no, I was just settling in, and besides, I’m a city girl. But we talked some more. The staff was 210 percent behind the idea. We decided

to give it a try.”

They developed a proposal for Walton to become a charter school with an ag/tech, project-based curriculum. The proposal was approved in spring 2006, provided that the newly organized school had to open that August.

“We worked like crazy,” Natise said. “We took special classes, ordered materials, and bought a greenhouse.” In August 2006, the school opened on time. It is named the Walton 21st Century Rural Life Center.

What is an agriculture-based curriculum? For example, the school hallways are decorated with buckets of wheat and soybeans. A bulletin board displays many small pairs of garden gloves.

The topic of agriculture is woven into each subject the students cover. One class learned about math and measurement units by measuring bean plants and tractor tires. Reading is emphasized through researching agriculture topics or writing letters to go with “Flat Stanley” to other children around the world.

Each class is paired with a farm family for the duration of the school year. The students go on a field trip to visit the farm,

and the farmer also comes to visit the classroom.

Each class is also involved in a special project. For example, one class followed the life of three real pigs from insemination to meat on their plates. Another class raised chickens and then sold the eggs in the community. The projects vary depending on the grade. Some of the younger children did projects like “Tomato to Salsa” or “Milk to Ice Cream.” Older students applied technology in learning about wind turbines or soil testing. Their projects are summarized on display boards and featured at a spring community agriculture fair.

On the school grounds, one will find a playground plus a barn, greenhouse, vegetable garden, chicken house, and a sensory garden for kindergarteners – and Petey the goat.

The school is partnering with K-State Research and Extension - Harvey County. The kindergarten and first grade classes form their own 4-H club. This is an innovative model to provide the benefits of 4-H in new ways. What are the results? Natise said, “It is absolutely wonderful. The kids have made incredible gains. We have met standard of excellence every year, every grade, and every subject. We’ve received the Governor’s achievement award twice for being in the top five percent of Kansas schools according to state assessment tests.”

That’s a remarkable achievement for a rural school. After all, Walton is a town of 287 people. Now, that’s rural. A town that size needs creativity to sustain a school.

“We have exceptional teachers who are dedicated to the kids. We believe hands-on, real-life learning is best,” Natise said.

“What’s growing here?” That’s the type of question that little kids might ask about growing crops. Educators in Walton have harnessed that curiosity to enhance the education provided by their school. We commend Natise Vogt and all those involved with the Walton 21st Century Rural Life Center for making a difference with this creative curriculum. Here at this school, what’s growing are the kids and their learning.

Local author and WWII Battle of the Bulge veteran to discuss new book

Veteran and author Jim Sharp will speak at the Eisenhower Presidential Library and Museum on Veterans Day, Nov. 11. The program is scheduled for 2 p.m. in the Visitors Center Auditorium and is free and open to the public. Following the program, Sharp will be available to sign copies of his book.

Sharp was shipped off to the frontlines as the Battle of the Bulge was raging during World War II. Just before leaving Boston Harbor, the American Red Cross gave him a small pocket-sized diary. Sharp used this diary to document his experiences during the war and

heroism at the Rhine River crossing.

Following WWII in 1945 and 1946, Sharp was selected for Special Guard Duty at the Nuremburg Trials for German leaders of the Third Reich and was assigned as Sgt. of the Guard in both the courtroom and the prisoner cell block.

A native of rural Morris County, Sharp now lives in nearby Manhattan. Sharp and his wife, Marilyn, have three children, seven grandchildren and two great grandchildren. He is a graduate of Kansas State University and retired from Kansas Farm Bureau and Affiliated Companies as Manager of Information Systems.

To participate in the project producers must enter a minimum of five spring-born steers weaned at least 45 days prior to delivery. Steers must be out of a registered Angus bull and have a known sire or sire group.

An approved vaccination program as well as having individual identification tags is also required.

The KAA is proud to announce a new partnership with Certified Angus Beef, LLC that will enhance your CDP experience. CAB is sponsoring up to a \$750 cash award and CAB merchandise including a jacket to the owner of the top CDP entry (based on participant's top three steers). In addition, CAB will present each CDP participant with a travel coffee mug. Actual cash award is based upon participation. McPherson County Feeders (MCF), Marquette will host the 2011 CDP. MCF was awarded Certified Angus Beef Feed Lot Partner of the Year in 2010.

The annual Carcass Data Project (CDP) gets under way in December. Entries are due December 15, \$5 per head entry fee payable to the Kansas Angus Association. McPherson County Feeders will bill participants twice a month for feed and yardage. Participants are responsible for delivery/transportation to MCF, December 28-30, 2010. 

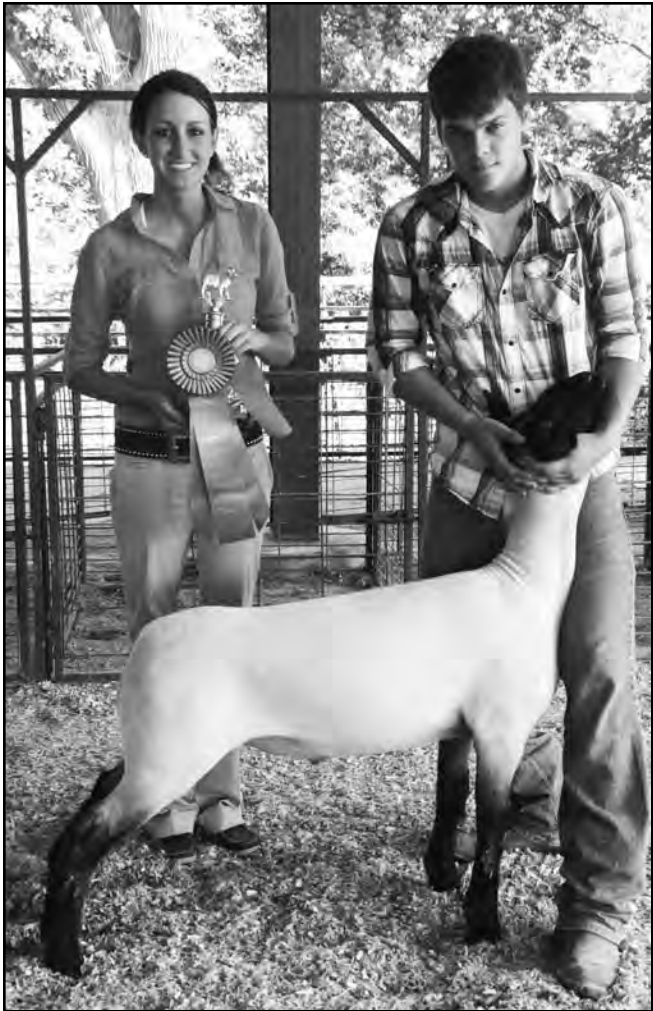
