

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

Last Thursday's June Stocks and Planted Acreage Reports were both shockingly and surprisingly bearish for the corn market. The stocks estimate came in above the highest trade guess at 3.670 billion. That was like finding an extra 300-350 million bushels of corn. Nobody knows where it came from but it implies that feed usage for the third quarter was the lowest level since the mid 1970s. It is difficult to explain the surprisingly large stocks and I think that we will have to prepare for another surprise in the September stocks report. The planted acreage figure came in at 92.3 million, which was also higher than the highest trade guess and was even above the March intentions estimate. Many traders were expecting a small increase in acreage from the June supply and demand report estimate of 90.7 million due to good planting conditions in Iowa and Nebraska, but most also thought that the potential increase would be tempered by the weather problems we have seen around the country.

A lot of people are thinking that these USDA numbers are probably bogus since they do very little to account for all the weather problems we have seen, the record ethanol production pace or the higher cattle on feed numbers we have. I am

certain that we will see numerous acreage adjustments over the next several months as USDA tries to figure out what actually got planted and how much will end up being harvested. As for the stocks, I think watching the spread trade between September and December and the basis levels will tell us whether we actually have 300 million extra bushels or not. Judging by the reaction of the basis so far, I am guessing that the corn isn't there.

The charts suggest that we may see the September corn head down to the March low of \$5.81 in the near future. The market is oversold, but that probably doesn't matter. What the market will need to see is more export sales announcements like we saw on Friday. The 1.14 MMT of corn to unknown destinations, which is probably China, is a step in the right direction. There are still rumors of more Chinese business and confirmation of that business would likely bottom the market.

The wheat numbers were basically neutral, but the wheat market followed the corn lower. The September KW reached the lowest level since last August, and why not? USDA keeps telling us we don't have any problems and the market believes that. The stocks report showed we had 861 million

bushels on June 1st, which was a little higher than expected. It makes sense to me though, because export shipments were so slow and USDA probably overstated the export estimate. The acreage estimate was basically in line with expectations, but the fact that the Spring Wheat acreage estimate was higher than expected is questionable, and the percent harvested is also questionable. There will be numerous revisions to these estimates as we move through the crop year. The \$6.90 area should be good support for the September KW and we have

probably run out of bearish news for a while, so look for the wheat market to consolidate next week. A short covering bounce could easily take the market back to \$8.00.

The November soybeans were actually a couple of cents higher for the week. The stocks report was slightly negative at 619 million bushels, but the acreage report was definitely friendly as the estimate came in below the lowest trade guess at 75.2 million. The 1.4 million acre cut will have a pretty big impact on new crop ending stocks, they may not fall enough in the July supply and demand report to start a new bull market, but the acreage cut, if accurate, will put a floor under the market.

The overall pattern for the soybeans is still sideways and the \$12.85 area will be key support for the November contract. If that level holds early next week,

the bean market will have made a low and the market will work its way up to the top end of the trading range in anticipation of a friendly supply and demand report.

Feeder cattle posted solid gains this week. The August contract picked up \$1.87 and appears to have broken out of a bull flag formation. The chart formation suggests we could see new all time high prices very soon, so it would be wise not to stand in the way of this market. The August live cattle held support at the 50-day moving average last week then made a strong move higher on Friday. The market is not overbought and the market appears to be set to make a run at the \$120 level. Be very patient with hedges.

Hay trade moderate. Demand very strong for dairy and grinding alfalfa, moderate to strong for stock cow hay and alfalfa pellets, moderate for grass hay. Record breaking, triple digit temperatures were common across Kansas last week with a record high of 110 degrees on Sunday. Second cutting of alfalfa is in short supply. Several producers have turned off their irrigation systems on alfalfa fields due to the inability of the systems to keep up with the hot temperatures and wind resulting in high evaporation loss. Another very hot week is in the forecast. The overall supply of hay remains tight to very tight. Saving wheat seed

Throughout the ages, farmers have planted seed saved from their previous crop. They selected the best quality seed of the highest yielding varieties. It was just common sense.

With the advent of hybrid crops like corn, farmers discovered that they did not get the advantage of hybrid vigor when they saved their seed and the ensuing crop was not uniform. They quickly learned they needed to buy new seed each year of these hybrid crops. This annual purchase of hybrid seed commercialized the corn seed business and resulted in enormous investment into research and development of improved corn hybrids. Consequently, technology in corn has benefited farmers. It just didn't make sense to save your corn seed any more.

With the passing of the U.S. Plant Variety Protection Act in 1970, congress encouraged the private investment into development of new plant varieties. An important component of this act was the farmer's right to save seed. Section 113 of the act states,

"...it shall not infringe any right hereunder for a person to save seed pro-

duced by the person from seed obtained, or descended from seed obtained, by authority of the owner of the variety for seeding purposes and use such saved seed in the production of a crop for use on the farm of the person..."

Simply stated, if a farmer purchases Certified seed, he may keep seed grown from that seed for planting on his farm. However, if a farmer buys non-certified seed of a

PVPA protected variety from someone else, it is likely that not only is the purchase of that seed in violation of the Act, but saving seed of subsequent production is also a violation.

The most recent restrictions to saving seed are those imposed by patented traits and sales contracts. In most cases, farmers are prohibited by patent laws from saving seed of varieties with patented traits like

Roundup® resistance in soybeans and Clearfield® in wheat. This is usually reinforced through a contract that is signed at the point of purchase. Even if traits are not patented, saving seed may be prohibited as part of the sales contract.

The consequences of planting illegal seed can be substantial. The owner of the variety could go as far as filing a lawsuit asking for the destruction of the crop. There could also be monetary awards and attorney fees. If state or federal officials get in-

involved, fines could range from \$50-\$500 per occurrence.

Ignorance of the law is no excuse. As a best management practice, farmers should know what variety they are planting. If they can't show that they purchased Certified, they will need to investigate further before they save any production for planting. If they did purchase Certified seed, they should read the label and sales contracts to see if there are any restrictions on saving seed.

With the recent private investment and inclusion of proprietary genetic traits into wheat variety development, it is going to be less likely a farmer will be able to save and replant his own seed in the future. On the bright side, the value that seed certification brings to seed wheat performance and convenience along with the improvements in yield and quality offered by new varieties will make saving your own seed an economically unattractive choice.

FSA emergency loans available because of natural disasters

Adrian J. Polansky, State executive director for USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Kansas announced that FSA is making emergency loans available to help qualified producers recover from production and physical losses due to natural disasters.

Secretarial Disaster Designation S3121 for drought, excessive heat, and high winds on January 1, 2011 and continuing made the following primary counties in Kansas eligible: Barber, Barton, Butler, Clark, Comanche, Cowley, Edwards, Ellis, Ford, Graham, Gray, Harper, Harvey, Hodgeman, Kingman, Lincoln, Norton, Phillips, Reno, Rice, Russell, Sedgwick, Stafford, Sumner, and Trego. These contiguous counties in Kansas are also eligible: Chase, Chautauqua, Decatur, Elk, Ellsworth, Finney, Gove, Greenwood, Haskell, Kiowa, Marion, McPherson, Meade,

Mitchell, Ness, Osborne, Otawa, Pawnee, Pratt, Rooks, Rush, Saline, Sheridan, and Smith. In addition, there are some contiguous counties eligible in Nebraska and Oklahoma. Producers in the above counties have until February 23, 2012 to apply for an emergency loan.

Secretarial Disaster Designation S3117 for drought and related disasters, including wildfires and high winds, on January 1, 2011 and continuing made the following primary counties in Kansas eligible: Finney, Lane, Logan, Gove, Grant, Greeley, Hamilton, Haskell, Kearny, Meade, Morton, Ness, Scott, Seward, Sheridan, Sherman, Stanton, Stevens, Thomas, Wallace, and Wichita. These contiguous counties in Kansas, which are not included in a later designation, are also eligible: Cheyenne and Rawlins. In addition, there are some contiguous coun-

ties eligible in Colorado and Oklahoma. Producers in the above listed counties have until January 10, 2012 to apply for an emergency loan.

Eligible loan funds may be used to restore or replace essential property and pay production costs associated with the disaster year. Applicants can borrow up to 100 percent of actual production or physical losses not to exceed \$500,000. The current rate for these low interest loans is 3.75 percent. Producers must meet eligibility requirements and not be able to obtain credit from a commercial lender. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. Producers in these counties may also be eligible for 2011-crop year Supplemental Revenue Assistance (SURE) Payments. SURE is

one of five disaster programs included in the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 that provides assistance to farmers and ranchers who have suffered losses due to natural disasters. Sign-up for 2011 losses will be held in a future year.

KGLC range school format is rancher-friendly, questions welcomed

Why do some native grasses and forbs prefer shallow soils? Why do the plants in low-lying areas or along stream banks look different from upland plants? Why don't all native grasses and forbs respond to grazing pressure the same? What can I do to keep invasive plants out of my pastures? They hope to help students answer these and other questions at the Kansas Grazing Lands Coalition's range schools. To start each school, all students are asked to state their interests in attending the school and what they hope to learn to take home and use on their ranch. In other words, the critical beginning session in these producer-oriented schools is to find out what students have come to find out, then they tailor materials and presentations to get at answers for them, said Tim Christian, state coordinator for the Kansas Grazing Lands Coalition (KGLC). David Kraft, NRCS state grazing lands specialist, added that each person attending the school has come with the idea of learning and sharing ranching and

grazing experiences with others who are challenged with managing Kansas grassland resources while earning a living.

The 2011 Kansas Grazing Lands Coalition's (KGLC) range schools will be held August 16-18 at Camp Wood YMCA near Elmdale, and August 23-25 at Camp Lakeside, Scott County State Lake, and The Nature Conservancy's Smoky Valley Ranch. This is their first year at Camp Wood and the third time to hold the school at Camp Lakeside, Christian said. The registration fee is \$300 per person and scholarships will be available to eligible ranchers, students, and agency staffs. He explained that scholarships range from \$150 for ranchers and students to \$100 for agency personnel. Registration and scholarship application deadlines are July 15 and July 22, respectively. Forms are available online at www.kglc.org, under the 2011 Range School heading in the navigation bar, or by contacting KGLC staff. They encourage anyone interested in attending to get the

paperwork completed and submitted as the cut-off dates will get here quickly, he said. Each school is limited to 35 students.

Kraft said that each instructor tries to tailor their remarks to meet the needs expressed by individuals through the entire course. The set of instructors varies by location but will include ranchers, federal agency staffs, organizational staffs, and university and Extension specialists. Co-sponsors of the schools are the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, Kansas State University Extension, Fort Hays University, The Nature Conservancy, Playa Lakes Joint Venture, Kansas Rural Center, Kansas Native Plant Society, and the Kansas Section of the Society for Range Management. U.S. corn acreage is up in 2011, while soybeans slightly down

U.S. farmers planted 92.3 million acres to corn in 2011, up 4.6 percent from last year, according to the Acreage report released by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS). Driven by the higher commodity prices, U.S. corn growers increased the planted acreage by 4.1 million acres from last year. This is a third consecutive year of increased corn acreage and is the second-largest corn acreage in more than 60 years, behind 2007. Overall, farmers planted 319.2 million acres to major crops this year. This is 4.63 million acres less than they indicated in the March 2011 Prospective Plantings report, but is a 2.45-million-acre increase from 2010. The most signifi-

cant acreage increases were reported in South Dakota and Kansas, where farmers planted 0.6 and 0.4 million acres more, respectively, than in 2010. The nation's cotton farmers also reported a significant acreage increase this year. According to the report, 13.7 million acres have been planted to cotton, up 25 percent from last year. The largest increase was reported in Texas where the growers planted 1.6 million acres more than in 2010, up one million acres from March intentions. Despite an overall acreage increase for major crops, U.S. soybean growers planted 2.2 million fewer acres than last year. A total of 75.2 million acres have been planted to soybeans in 2011, the lowest since 2007.

Despite reporting a large acreage decrease this year, Iowa continues to lead the nation with 9.2 million acres planted to soybeans. NASS acreage estimates are based on surveys of approximately 70,500 farm operators across the United States, conducted during the first two weeks of June. Principal crops included in the survey are corn, sorghum, oats, barley, winter wheat, rye, Durum wheat, other spring wheat, rice, soybeans, peanuts, sunflower, cotton, dry edible beans, potatoes, sugarbeets, canola and proso millet, as well as harvested area for all hay, tobacco and sugarcane. 





Soybeans affected by damping off disease this year in Kansas

Pythium damping off disease has been rampant on soybeans this spring throughout eastern and central Kansas, said Doug Jardine, K-State Research and Extension plant pathologist.

Pythium is most active on soybeans that emerge into cool, wet soils, Jardine said. Producers in eastern and central Kansas who planted their soybeans in mid-May ran into this problem in many cases this year, said Stu Duncan, K-State Research and Extension crops and soils specialist.

"A lot of soybeans were planted about May 15-20 in

northeast Kansas. Then there was some rain and the soil cooled down, which created ideal conditions for Pythium," Duncan said.

Certain fungicide seed treatments will help protect against Pythium for about 10-14 days, Jardine said.

"But this may not work in all cases, especially if the lowest labeled rates of the product are used. Even with higher product use rates, if the disease pressure is high enough, Pythium can overwhelm the seed treatment. Evidently there are several cases this year where this has hap-

pened," he explained.

If affected fields are replanted now, seed treatments would not be as necessary as they are for earlier planting dates, Jardine added.

Where soybeans have been infected with Pythium this year, the lesson to learn is that soybeans planted no-till before June 1 in Kansas should be treated with a fungicide seed treatment, just to be safe — and the higher the rate of product used, the better, Jardine said. The seed treatment should contain mefenoxam or metalaxyl, he said.

Due to widespread planting delays, the final entry deadline for the 2011 National Corn Yield Contest has been extended 10 days, to July 25, the National Corn Growers Association has announced. Entries must be submitted online or postmarked on or before that date and are subject to the standard entry fee of \$110 per entry.



For nearly a half century, NCGA's National Corn Yield Contest has provided corn growers the opportunity to compete with their colleagues to grow the most corn per acre, helping feed and fuel the world. This has given participants not only

the recognition they deserved, but the opportunity to learn from their peers.

Winners receive national recognition in publications such as the NCCY Corn Yield Guide, as well as cash trips or other awards from participating sponsoring seed, chemical and crop protection companies. In Nashville, Tenn., during the 2012 Commodity Classic, state winners will be presented awards at the NCCY Breakfast and national winners will receive awards at the Awards Banquet.

Beef producers can reduce environmental impact by searching for best practices

When it comes to reducing the environmental impact of raising beef, the industry has come further over the past 30 years than many people realize, according to a Washington State University scientist. "The environmental impact of U.S. beef production has been reduced by improved productivity," said Judith Capper, assistant professor of dairy science at WSU. She spoke at the American Meat Science Association's Reciprocal Meat Conference, hosted by Kansas State University June 19-22. "In 1977 it took five animals to produce the same amount of beef as four animals produced in 2007."

"The majority of beef production's environmental impact occurs on-farm," Capper said of the farm-to-feedlot-to-processing system.

She acknowledged that opportunities to further improve beef yield per animal may be limited. Through genetic, feeding and management improvements, the amount of beef an animal yielded in 2007 averaged 773 pounds, well

above the 603-pound average in 1977. In addition, the average number of days for a beef animal to reach slaughter weight was 482 in 2007, down from 606 days in 1977. Capper cited a recent study that showed that in 2007:

- 31 percent more beef was produced than in 1977;
- The number of beef animals was down 30 percent from the total in 1977;
- Beef cattle consumed 19 percent less feed than they did in 1977;
- Beef cattle consumed 14 percent less water than beef cattle consumed in 1977;
- Beef cattle production used 34 percent less land than it used in 1977;
- Beef cattle produced 20 percent less manure than in 1977;
- Beef cattle produced 20 percent less methane than in 1977;
- Beef cattle produced 11 percent less nitrous oxide than in 1977;
- Beef cattle production's carbon footprint was 18 percent less than in 1977.

Overall, in 2007, the beef cattle industry had 18 percent less impact on the

environment than it had in 1977 and it produced more beef, Capper said.

She used the example of two vehicles — one of which is more fuel-efficient than the other. However, by revealing that the less fuel-efficient vehicle is a bus that can transport many more people per gallon of fuel than a small car that can transport two, it makes a person view challenges differently, she said.

"It's essential to assess impact per unit of output rather than per unit of the production process," she said. When assessing which is better for the planet — grass-fed, natural production-enhancing technologies not used) or conventional (feedlot-finished), Capper said she does not advocate for any particular group. However, removing technology from beef production con-

siderably increases animal numbers and increases resource use and greenhouse gas emissions if attempting to keep output the same.

"If all U.S. beef was grass-fed, it would increase land use by 53.1 million hectares, which is about 75 percent of the land area of Texas," Capper said. "It would increase water use by 1,733 billion liters, which is equal to annual usage by 46.3 million U.S. households, and it would increase greenhouse gas emissions enough to equal annual emissions from 26.6 million U.S. cars." Capper said that incorrect data is sometimes used in newspaper and magazine articles which can lead to a bias in consumers' food choices. She cited an example where studies that appeared in a major U.S. magazine referred to beef

production but the data came from other countries where practices are not as efficient as in the United States. For example, in

Brazil only 62 percent of beef cows produce a live calf, and cows are typically four years old at first calving.

Yard & Garden Tips

Gathering Ripe Berries

It is hard to beat the flavor of homegrown produce. Many of our crops are maturing and are being harvested. To get the most benefit from the garden, harvest the crop at its peak of ripeness. Knowing when to harvest may require patience.

Blueberries, raspberries, blackberries and such don't ripen off the plant. Once it is picked, it is as good as it gets. Many times these are harvested early so that they store longer. At our house, they often are picked too early for a snack in the garden before someone else gets them. For the home gardener, pick them at their peak in flavor and consume or process right away.

Coming into harvest for me are the blueberries. Berries with a reddish tinge are not yet ripe. Flavor will continue to improve for several days after the fruit is completely blue. Bird netting allows for me to harvest when the berries are at their peak. Ripe berries are typically picked once or twice each week.

Black raspberries mature first, followed by purple and red. Ripe raspberries develop full color. Raspberries separate easily from the stem leaving the core attached to the plant. Pick by gently lifting berries with thumb or finger. Harvest fruit as it ripens, every two to three days. Cool all fruit immediately to retain flavor.

Our gooseberry bushes are loaded with fruit. Harvest as the fruit color changes to light green. Some varieties may have pink or other color. The fruit will still be firm when ready to pick. In blackberries, the core comes off with the fruit. The fruit will separate easily from the plant. Full color often develops before the berries separate easily. Fruit develops a dull black color with plump and juicy fruitlets.

Once the crop is grown, enjoy the home grown taste at its peak. The K-State Research and Extension publication "Harvest and Storage of Fruits and Vegetables" is available from the office or on the web at www.ksre.ksu.edu to assist you.
