

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The Quarterly Stock Report was decidedly bearish for the corn. USDA came up with a 1.128 billion bushel ending stocks estimate, which was up 208 million from the September supply and demand report and much higher than expected. I will be very interested to see how they change the demand estimates in order to explain the extra bushels of corn. We may end up seeing 2010 production revised higher, but if they were going to do that, I would have expected to see that revision made last week just like they did with the sovbeans. I think we have to plan on numerous changes to both the old crop and new crop supply and demand numbers for months to come and the "final" report in January won't be

The wheat numbers were mixed. The stocks estimate was higher than expected at 2.150 billion, but the production estimate in the small grains summary was smaller than expected at 2.008 billion. These numbers tell us that demand is slow, but we have less wheat to work with than previously thought. Once again we need some good export sales reports to put some enthusiasm into the wheat market.

The sovbean stocks estimate was friendly at 214.7 million bushels. USDA also

increased 2010 production to see a repeat of that kind by 59 million, so that implies quite a bit of extra demand and puts new crop ending stocks down towards the 150 million area, which is supportive and makes it more difficult for the soybeans to give up acres this

December corn lost 46 cents this week, 40 of which came on Friday. The corn had a fairly promising start to the week with a reversal higher on Monday and good strength early Tuesday. Rest of the week wasn't so great, culminating in Friday's limit lower move which was caused by the higher than expected stocks figure and exacerbated by end of the month and end of the quarter fund liquidation.

The market is certainly oversold, but that doesn't really matter at this point. The momentum of the market is clearly lower and it appears that the December contract is now head back to the July 1st low of \$5.75. It is interesting to note that that low came the day after a limit lower move, which followed the last stocks report, which was bearish because USDA found way more corn than expected. That sharp break attracted demand, bottomed the market, and with the help of hot weather, got the market started on a run up to the highs. I won't be surprised of action in the coming days and weeks. It is still very likely that production will be cut in the October supply and demand report and that our new crop stocks to use ratio will be at or near record tight levels. A move to \$5.75 is a buying opportunity. Buy November \$5.50 puts and buy futures against

The December KW lost 271/4 cents this week while the December Minneapolis wheat gained 414 cents. Friday the December KW posted an outside day down on the charts and fell to the lowest level since August of 2010 while the December Minneapolis wheat made multi-week highs.

The small grains summary certainly justified this extreme spread activity. Most of the production cuts came in the spring wheat, which came in at 462.5 million bushels. The assumption has been for quite some time that USDA had been overestimating both acreage and yield in the spring wheat country and Friday's report finally confirmed that. Friday's could have been really bullish had it not been for the larger than expected stocks estimate. The stocks estimate confirms that demand is very slow and that UDSA has been correct in telling us that we don't have any kind of supply problem for

the time being. Planting conditions are still very poor and much of the HRW Belt still needs rain. The new crop July contract is still at a premium to the old crop, but it doesn't seem to me that traders are overly concerned about planting conditions at this time, or at least it doesn't seem to be providing much support to the wheat market.

Pressure continued in the soybeans last week despite the supportive export sales report and the supportive stocks report. The November soybean lost 79 cents for the week with over 50 of that coming on Friday.

The charts look terrible for the soybeans. They looked terrible last week after the market fell out of the multi-month trading range, but this week the November beans took out the March low and reached the November low on the weekly chart. \$11.20 is the next retracement level on the daily chart and \$11.28 is the next retracement on the weekly chart, so don't be surprised to see a move down to one of those levels.

The fundamental outlook doesn't seem as negative as the technical outlook does. We will need to see more than just one week in a row of export sales over 1 MMT, but that is certainly possible after this recent weakness. Any production cut will now take ending stocks dangerously close to 100 million bushels, which would be supportive to old crop and new crop soybeans as well as the corn.

We don't often see people trade the cattle on feed report numbers, but we seemed to last week. The cattle futures surged higher Monday and Tuesday and finished the week strong as well. Cash cattle traded at \$121 in Kansas and \$121.50 in Nebraska, which helped the October live cattle make multi-month highs and the deferred feeder cattle contracts make new contract highs. It wouldn't be surprising at all to see follow through strength next week on ideas of seeing higher cash trade again. It is possible that we will see the spring feeder cattle contracts reach \$150.

The February live cattle should temporarily run out of steam at the \$126-\$127 area, so that would be a good place to put on hedges, but keep in mind that the fundamentals are still very bullish.

Gigstad to join USB

Craig Gigstad, a soybean farmer from Valley Falls, has been appointed by U.S. Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack to serve on the United Soybean Board (USB). Six U.S. soybean farmers will be sworn in as new USB directors at the USB annual meeting in December. "New uses for U.S. soybeans continue to amaze a lot of people," said Gigstad. "There is a lot of research being done, some that I don't even know about yet, and I'm anxious to be a part of that as we continue to expand new uses on a broader scale."

The six new appointees will join 63 existing or returning farmer-leaders in volunteering their time to serve as stewards of all U.S. soybean farmers' checkoff investments, ensuring the funds are used effectively to support global demand for U.S. soy and maximize profit opportunities for all U.S. soybean farmers. Soybean checkoff farmer-leaders focus on investing checkoff funds in domestic and international marketing, maintaining and increasing U.S. soybean yields, finding new uses for soy, ensuring market access for U.S. soy and other areas affecting the U.S. soy indus-

"I'm excited to be able to increase profit opportunities for Kansas farmers," added Gigstad. "With the growth in soybean acres in my state, I can't wait to see how we can expand the market for Kansas soybeans.

Gigstad, nominated by the Kansas Soybean Commission, joins Kansas farmers Bob Haselwood from Berryton and Ron Ohlde of Palmer on the board.

Longhorn drive featured in parade through downtown Wichita

The Kansas Livestock Association (KLA) will help celebrate the state's 150th birthday by driving 30 trophy Longhorn steers through downtown Wichita as part of the Kansas Sunflower Parade. Hundreds of Kansans are expected to watch the majestic Longhorns being driven down Main Street during the October 8 event. Kansas Gov. Sam Brownback will be on horseback ahead of the herd.

Several KLA members, including president-elect Frank Harper of Sedgwick, will be among the outriders driving the Longhorns in the parade. KLA president Ken Grecian from Palco will follow the cattle in a trail-drive era wagon provided by Josh and Gwen Hoy with the Flying W Ranch at Cedar Point. Flying W also is providing several saddle horses for dignitaries, including Brownback, who are helping drive the cat-Chain Ranch of Woodward, Okla., will supply the Longhorns for the KLA parade entry. These cattle have led large parades in Cheyenne, Wyo., and Greeley, Colo. The Longhorns have been used to help promote events as far away as Detroit, Mich., and have been part of at least one movie.

Longhorns symbolize the early years of a business that has contributed significantly to the Kansas economy since the Civil War. Ranchers, feeders and dairymen today are responsible for billions of dollars circulating through the state's econo-



When Leslie Kitchenmaster caught the oil drilling bug and began operating his K.O.T. Drilling Company in Lost Springs in the late 1960s, money was tight. The only oil to be had in the once booming Marion County town needed to be drilled in strip wells, or low production wells. To make drilling such wells profitable, "Kitch" realized

Bina Auction Service he'd have to buy used drilling equipment as cheap as possible.

> "It was hard to find used equipment then" Kitchenmaster said, "I'd spend \$50 on phone calls trying to find used equipment, there was just no marketplace, or no communication between people who wanted to sell used equipment and the people who wanted to buy

ers and sellers together was the motivation behind Kitch's creation of Oiltizer, an advertising tabloid for pipeline, gas and oil field equipment.

The former Air Force major, who also owned a real estate company in Junction City and a management firm in Tampa, Florida opened Oiltizer in 1977. From modest beginnings in his house.

Kitchenmaster's publishing interests grew to fill most of a block-long concrete and metal building. Keep in mind, today's luxury of the internet was not available to the public so everything was done by hand from each individual picture to stacks of index cards, typing each mailing address even to hand labeling each piece of outgo-



Latta heads up both areas of procurement. "Our cattle from Florida and Louisiana customers fit in with those from Kansas, Oklahoma, Kentucky and South Dakota, pretty much all Angus," he says. Perhead premiums earned in June ranged from the mid-\$40s to twice that above the cash market.

Bohn says a key to earning premiums is learning how to feed high-quality cattle as a category, and specific to repeat customers. He set the course for success years ago with a strategy to learn as much as possible about the cattle he feeds while inviting higher quality placements. The feedvard has enrolled more than 150,000 cattle in the CAB database since licensing. It opened doors to Angus producers for networking and a series of options to return data, even when the feedlot buys up to full interest. "Angus customers have made a pretty intensive selection for qual-

them a bit more and returned the data," Bohn says. In 2003, he knew something about the genetic potential in 15% of the cattle fed. Today that stands at 35% to 40%. Other factors have affected quality, too, he says, including weather and instrument grading.

Over the last couple of years, Pratt Feeders has been increasingly involved with CAB in training foodservice and beef sales teams.

"Our industry has to become a little more transparent," Bohn says. "The beef consumer is quite removed from the rural roots of years ago. We have to become advocates for our industry."

That's why the feedlot keeps looking for more ways to bridge the cultural and information gap between segments in the food chain. From rancher to feeder, packer to purveyor and consumer, "Everybody in the system is more willing to share information than they used to be," he says. "All the volatility and higher prices in the system put more pressure on the need to share if we are all going to move ahead."



Brownback: State should invest in livestock

hundreds of millions of dollars more in its beef, dairy and pork industries in order to give the state a larger share of U.S. animal agriculture production, Gov. Sam Brownback said.

"I just want to see us put that on steroids and grow it," Brownback said Wednesday during an economic development summit in Garden City.

Brownback also said that reforming the state's regulatory and legal framework for the agriculture industry would attract new investment to Kansas. He said his administration would soon announce proposals for lowering the top rate of the state income tax, The Topeka Capital Journal re-

Brownback said the recent expansion of dairy farms in western Kansas could be replicated by the redevelopment of poultry production in the state.

"We can grow the animal agriculture industry in this state," Brownback said. "We can compete against anybody in the world with what we do."

But he said the state had to take a firm position on preservation of the Ogallala Aquifer, a key underground source for water in western Kansas.

"It's probably the main issue we have facing animal agriculture," Brown-

Dale Rodman, secretary of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, said the state's livestock producers had to organize around marketing opportunities to supply more meat to countries with a rising standard of living.

"Government can't do it all," he said.

The meeting also included an open microphone period, when people raised question about the state's capacity to issue driver's licenses to

Nourishing nutrients: Agronomy research examines nitrogen use in winter wheat

Not all wheat varieties are created equal in terms of nitrogen use. Research from Kansas State University is examining the nature of those differences and how appropriate management can improve agricultural ef-

Nathan Nelson, associate professor of agronomy, and Allan Fritz, professor of agronomy, are researching nitrogen use efficiency in different varieties of wheat. Genetic effects on nutrient uptake have been acknowledged, but research has not been done to characterize these differences in varieties grown in Kansas. The project began with an observation from Fritz on how certain wheat varieties appeared to outcompete others in situations typical of nitrogen limitation.

The study is in its first year and has provided research opportunities for two undergraduate students. Bryson Haverkamp, senior in agronomy, Bern, has worked with Nelson for the entirety of the project. T.C. Alex, senior in microbiology and animal sciences and industry, Olathe, assisted Nelson during the summer while Haverkamp completed an internship with AgriGold, a breeder, seller and producer of hybrid

Approximately 30 varieties of wheat are being screened for their nitrogen use efficiency. Each variety was planted with and without nitrogen and replicated four times for 240 plots. The nitrogen was applied and growth monitored during the spring. An initial harvest was taken in early May, where all biomass above ground was harvested. The amount of nitrogen taken up by the wheat prior to grain development was determined and will be used to describe differences in how

the varieties reallocate nitrogen. Following grain maturity, the plots were harvested to determine the final nitrogen uptake in both grain and straw.

The potential implications differ for each variety. Certain varieties may store more nitrogen earlier and reallocate it later, which could cause them to be more responsive to fertilizer nitrogen because it can be collected earlier without being lost. Efficiency is likely less for varieties without that capability. Other outcomes are possible, including varieties that might be better suited for utilizing soil nitrogen released late in the growing season. Some varieties

could be suited for growing in nitrogen-deficit situations.

Nelson hopes the research results will assist with wheat variety selection and future breeding efforts.

"That's the objective," he said. "It will help people choose different varieties that will fit into their production systems.'

The presence of nitrogen in soil depends on past fertilization history, organic matter and climate and soil properties. Nitrogen is an important input in maximizing crop yield. It can result in increased profitability, increased food production and greater food security.

Continuation of the study

is contingent on availability of funding. Funding will be sought from wheat or fertilizer industries, as well as commodities commissions, according to Nelson. Depending on results, the project will be expanded to include additional studies.

Haverkamp will present the results at the American Society of Agronomy's annual meetings, Oct. 16-19, in San Antonio. More than 200 undergraduate students from around the nation will be in attendance, as well as

more than 4,000 scientists and professionals from around the Haverkamp is the current president of the Wheat State Agronomy Club, the department of agronomy's undergraduate organization at K-State. He is grateful for the research experience and would like to be a crop consultant after graduation.

Likewise, Alex is appreciative of the research opportunity. An aspiring cancer researcher, he enjoyed becoming more well-rounded in his research experiences.


Nelson says the opportunity to do undergraduate research is invaluable.

"It's a great opportunity to see what goes on at a university beyond education,' he said. "A lot of people don't realize the research component of university programs. For undergraduates, it helps them explore learning outside of the classroom as well as apply what they have learned inside the classroom."

Grazing cattle best for pastures, water quality and calf health

By Tom Parker

Dale Kirkham believes that the quality of air, water, grasslands, pastures and cattle would improve if more ranchers adopted a keep-it-simple attitude and returned to the basics. The basics in this case being an elementary law of bovine anatomy: cows have legs. Four of them, to be exact, and cows, as well as everything associated with cows, are better off when those four legs are moving.

Kirkham, a Kansas Rural Center field organizer from Eureka, backed up his belief with examples and statistics during a presentation on cattle and pasture management at the Treasure Tree in Belleville, on September 19. The workshop, sponsored by the Milford WRAPS and the Kansas Rural Center, included other experts such as Dr. Larry Hollis, K-State beef production medicine specialist, and Will Boyer, K-State watershed specialist. About 25 people attend-

His advice — and the subject of his topic, "Cows have four legs and a rumen for a reason" — was to make cattle do the work of staying healthy, and while they're at it they'll keep pastures healthy, too. But it takes planning, a change of attitude, and a clear picture of the lay of the land. "Cows are like kids waiting for their parents to come home and feed them cookies and milk," he said. "They're creatures of habit. And they'll sit around waiting for a handout."

Given the opportunity, cattle will bunch together, he said. When cattle loiter beneath shade trees near stream banks on sweltering afternoons or on downward slopes, livestock waste carries into creeks to pollute downstream resources. At winter feeders, waste accumulates underfoot to create biological laboratories for unwanted pathogens. When proper site management is added to the mix, both sce-

narios could be alleviated by simply making cattle do what they do best: graze.

"I want them to be grazers, first, last and always," he said. "Keep them spread

This includes using rotating pastures, restricting transportation corridors where erosion is prevalent, locating mineral and salt feeders at corners of pastures where grazing normally doesn't occur, providing minimal amounts of hay when needed and rolling out hay for supplemental feeding. Dr. Hollis agreed. "It's an equal-opportunity feeding system," quipped. "It can be done anvwhere and changed daily. They're working instead of you."

Kirkham showed a slide of a bale-wide strip of short grass bisecting a pasture of much taller grass. Cattle following rolled-out hay tend to crop underlying grasses while providing nutrients to the soil, Kirkham said. "I think of manure as minerals," he said, "It includes nitrogen, potassium and phosphate. And if you include a little cracked corn in the feed, birds will break up the cow patties for

Letting cattle crop native grasslands also reduces the necessity for burning. "Burning is contagious." he said. "We sometimes do it because our neighbor is doing it. We need to ask ourselves if it will have a positive impact, such as cleaning out cedars. If not, let's reconsider."

Reducing or preventing cattle congregating on calving grounds is crucial for healthy newborns, Dr. Hollis said. When cattle are spread throughout a pasture rather than bunched together, calves are born into more sterile environments. While it's hardly the same as having them delivered at the local regional hospital, steps can be taken to alleviate some of the contamination associated with grazers-excrement.

"Anyone see a problem with that?" He pointed to a photograph of a newborn calf lying on a carpet of manure-splattered hay. "It's like calving into a toilet," he said.

Unless calving is spread out over a wide area, disease can build up over time on calving grounds. The number one neonatal disease responsible for calf

deaths is scours, he said, which can most often be traced back to the soil.

Simple methods can minimize or even eradicate the problem. Hollis recommended the Sandhills Calving System, a methodology developed in the Sandhills region of Nebraska, where formerly during calving season it wasn't unusual for clinics to be staffed with 50 veterinarians, and even then ranchers frequently lost five percent or more of their newborns.

The system is based upon separating cattle through a series of pastures depending on calving cycles. Once a set of calves is born, other cattle are moved to the next pasture in a sequential alignment that assures that newborns are kept separate. "Newborn calves are never left in the presence of older calves," Hollis said. "Older calves can serve as disease amplifiers, and are the biggest source of infection for calves born later in the season." The system has been proven to reduce or eliminate scours, and when an outbreak does occur, it minimizes the number of calves affected.

Hollis concurred with







Don't wait any longer to begin bat exclusion

Bats typically are considered a frightening animal, perfect for Halloween displays, but the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's wildlife damage project coordinator said now is a good time to get rid of bats.

Bats can accidentally enter homes when they are looking for shelter in high, hot areas during the evening. In homes, these conditions are found in at-

Some may have experienced some bat problems in their homes during the summer months, but Stephen Vantassel, coordinator for UNL's Internet Center for Wildlife Damage Management, said waiting until after August to get them out is important. He said people shouldn't wait too much longer, though.

"You can probably go all the way through October," Vantassel said. "Bats don't move when the temperature is 50 degrees Fahrenheit or lower. Bats don't move when there aren't

any bugs. If you see bugs outside, chances are you'll be able to do your exclusion; otherwise you'll have to wait until next spring."

Bats can't make their own holes to get inside homes. They get in through pre-existing holes of at least 1/4 inch in diameter. Vantassel said it's important for homeowners to identify every opening bats can use to fly in and out either by watching them fly through at dusk or finding grease smudges around holes when looking on a

Once exit holes are identified, Vantassel suggests installing a one-way door over them and sealing all other potential exits. Bats will be looking for a way to get out, and the oneway door provides a way for them to get out and sealing unused holes prevents their ability to get back in. He said the key is to seal your home while still providing the bats a way of escape.

"Make sure that you never trap the bats inside of the house because they will come into the living space," Vantassel said.

Homeowners run the risk of a potential rabies exposure if that happens, according to Vantassel, in which case everyone needs to be interviewed to ensure there was no contact with the bat. He said to assume there was contact unless proven otherwise, especially if people were asleep.

Vantassel suggests capturing bats and then contacting medical professionals to determine what should be done with them.

"If they decide the bat should be released, take it outside and release it." Vantassel said. "Otherwise, if they think the bat should be tested, you have the animal there to get it tested in the lab. If it turns up negative, no one needs rabies shots and it saves people a lot of money and a lot of




