

Schwieterman Market Outlook A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Friday is the December supply and demand report, but December reports are typically very dull and don't have many changes. Unfortunately we will have to wait until the January report before we see any major adjustments to the supply and demand tables.

Last week's news from the outside markets was somewhat friendly, or at least it wasn't as bad. The debt situation in Europe is still unresolved, but an announcement by our Federal Reserve and several other central banks this week that basically indicated the Fed would be available for the world's liquidity needs certainly lifted some spirits and the drop in the U.S. unemployment rate is encouraging even though it implied that a lot of people quit looking for work. The Dow Jones gained over 800 points for the week due to that friendly news and gold was up about \$60 due to the prospects of increased liquidity and more potential for inflation.

Unfortunately the strength in the outside markets didn't spill over into the

corn market. The March corn did gain 5 cents for the week, but there was an awful lot of bear spreading Thursday and Friday which is not a good sign. Export sales were poor again at 280,600 MT for the old crop and analysts have had a field day with just how poor sales have been recently. Apparently sales over the last several weeks have been the worst in over 30 years for this time of year. The cumulative sales pace is now below last year and traders are talking about a lower export estimate in the January report. I will point out that sales have been slow in the fall the last few years and then picked up after the first of the year and that may happen again this year. The problem, however, is that traders are going to want to see the sales materialize before they try to buy corn and most likely speculators are going to be willing sellers until better export demand

shows up. On the chart, the \$5.88 area is critical support in the March corn. Failure at that level would do major

chart damage and suggest that we are in for a move below the \$5.00 level. It is hard to imagine that much pressure in the corn with ending stocks as tight as they are and basis as strong as it is, but right now the onus is on the bulls to prove there is a reason to be concerned about supplies and that won't happen without better demand.

The wheat market performed pretty well last week. We have had two consecutive weeks of solid export sales with this week's total at 503,000 MT. Like the corn, what the wheat market needs more than anything is big demand numbers. It didn't hurt that traders were moving out of the long corn, short wheat spreads either. In reality it will take more than just two weeks of good sales to keep the wheat market moving higher and the wheat won't be able to post consistent gains without strength in the corn.

The soybeans also performed fairly well last week gaining about 30 cents. The trade was very choppy, but at least it was choppy/higher. Several technical indicators are giving buy signals and short traders are covering their positions. Export sales came in at 489,600 MT, which is down from recent weeks, but still better than what we need to see each week. Chinese buying has been more active, which is a big help and if it continues at the recent pace, USDA will have to increase the export estimate, and that would change the complexion of the supply and demand tables dramatically. A cautious way to approach reownership in the sovbeans would be to buy the \$12.00 - \$13.00 bull call spread and sell the \$11.00 put.

Cattle futures were higher last week even though cash trade wasn't quite as strong as last week and the beef market was lower. There was still a lot of trade at the \$124 area and with the December futures at less than \$122, I really expected bigger gains in the live cattle futures. The December LC only picked up 80 cents for the week and the January feeders gained about \$2.00. I still like the fundamental outlook of the cattle market. Supplies are too tight and demand is too strong, which is a great combination for prices.

As his experiences grew, he soon became active in managing breeding, artificial insemination and performing several duties of the operation on his own. Nathan has been steadily improving his skill level and getting more involved with the operation of the facilities each year. Nathan is currently a senior and plans to attend college upon graduation majoring in livestock production. Nathan is the son of Justin and Paige Hill.

Both Nathan and Austin were awarded \$500 cash prizes and a plaque for their achievement in their SAE programs.

Tyler Rose, Washington County, was honored as a finalist for the coveted Star Farmer of America award this year.

Tyler first started his SAE by purchasing eight sows and raising the pigs in a farrow-to-finish operation, marketing the best of his offspring as show pigs. Over past few years, he had changed the emphasis of his operation to evolve into the most profitable production system that his resources would allow. During his junior year of high school, he phased out his farrowing program to expand into purchasing feeder pigs, feeding out nearly 250 hogs at any given time. When he left home to attend Southeast Community College in Beatrice, Nebraska, he dissolved his swine production program and switched his emphasis to beef cattle, crops and hay production. In the past three years, he has grown this program into owning 87 cow/calf pairs and five bulls. He also fed out 94 steers in the feedlot in 2009 and raised 36 calves through a special short term calving program. He has acquired operating loans to manage his program and recently purchased farm ground to go with the acres that he is currently renting. Tyler also rents pasture, prairie hay and alfalfa to produce feed for his livestock. Tyler has also purchased a variety of livestock buildings, machinery and equipment to handle his operation. He works closely with his parents and exchanges his labor on their farm for some use of equipment, feed, supplies and facility use. Tyler hopes to further de-

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velop his business into a full time career and plans to return to the family farm once he completes his education at Southeast Community College. Tyler received a check in the amount of \$2000 dollars and a plaque. Tyler was the 2010 State Star Farmer and a two-time State Proficiency Award winner. His parents. Dewayne and JoAnn Rose, received the Honorary American FFA Degree as a result of their efforts in assisting Tyler with his accomplishments in the national FFA organization.

TOPEKA - Gov. Sam Brownback has announced his administration's 2012 legislative proposals to promote water conservation, grow the economy and create jobs in western Kansas.

Without the Ogallala Aquifer, agriculture and all of its related businesses could not be sustained, manufacturing could not continue, recreational opportunities would diminish and the towns in the area would cease to exist," Gov. Brownback said. "Our proposed legislation will help to conserve and extend this vital resource so important to our state's economic future."

Brownback said the work on the proposals began at the Governor's Economic Summit on the Future of the Ogallala Aquifer in held Colby last July. The Summit provided a forum for stakeholders to discuss their concerns, ideas and visions for the future. Following the Summit, the Kansas Water Authority (KWA) appointed the Ogallala Aquifer Advisory Committee (OAAC), a 21-member committee consisting of KWA members and Ogallala stakeholders, to review short and long term solutions.

"The Ogallala Aquifer is the primary source of water for the western third of Kansas," KWA chair Gary Harshberger said. "It is essential to find ways to help extend and conserve the life of the aquifer.'

Following the OAAC's and stakeholder input, the KWA developed the recommendations for the Governor's 2012 water legislation proposals:

• Amend appropriation act to eliminate "use it or lose it" for groundwater rights in areas closed to new water right development to protect those rights from unintentional forfeiture:

• Support legislation to provide a process for a conservation proactive plans (called Local Enhancement Management Plans, or LEMAs) that can have mandatory reductions, if supported by the Groundwater Management District, has corrective measures that address conservation needs, and is approved by the Chief Engineer;

• Allow development of groundwater additional Water Banks for a marketbased program to relocate water use and provide conservation in water short areas; and



"The proposals are an important step towards addressing the depleting aquifer issues," said Tracy Streeter, Kansas Water Office director and Kansas Water Authority secretary. "The OAAC will continue to meet in 2012 to further discuss options to define and reach the goal to conserve and extend the useful life of the Ogallala aquifer as it is stated in the Kansas Water Plan."

Gov. Brownback made the Ogallala a high priority while he served as the Secretary of Agriculture more than 20 years ago. Current Kansas Secretary of Agriculture Dale Rodman also understands the importance of implementing water legislation.



oration because in their natural habitat of Mexico, they are in full flower at that time. Flowering is "photoperiodic" induced in the poinsettia. Without long nights, this plant will continue to produce leaves and will grow but will never flower.

The flowers themselves are not that eye-catching. They give way to the colorful bracts or modified leaves. However, the flowers are a good indicator of the maturity of plant. A fresh pointhe settia is one on which little or no yellow pollen is showing on the flower clusters in the center of the bracts. Really old plants are missing their flowers; however, the colorful bracts remain.

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Researcher looking for ethanol from Eastern redcedar trees

The nuisance of Eastern redcedar trees has been well documented in Oklahoma and surrounding states during the past several years. They are a fire danger, an over-powering competitor for water among surrounding plants and are incredibly invasive

However, researchers at Oklahoma State University are looking for a way to use this tree, which caused an estimated economic loss of \$447 million to Oklahoma landowners nearly 10 years ago, as a natural resource. This pesky species has done nothing but grow and expand its coverage of land over that time, so losses are much higher now.

One of those researchers is Mark Wilkins, assistant professor in the department of biosystems and agricultural engineering, who is working on a project to make ethanol from the cedar trees

"We are testing various processes to make it easier to use enzymes to convert parts of the redcedar wood into sugars that can be fermented to ethanol by yeast," Wilkins said. "We also are looking at methods to extract the oil from the cedar wood since the oil is harmful to the yeast used to make ethanol."

This research is funded through a grant from the South Central Sun Grant Initiative and could result in some strong implications for the state, region inate the costs of disposand country.


"Right now, most people want to cut the cedars, pile them up, and burn them, but you obviously are risking spreading embers and causing a wild fire doing this as well as releasing lots of smoke," Wilkins said. "Also, there's a cost to doing this."

Oil and natural gas have provided for our energy needs for many years, but these resources will not last forever. "My team is trying to reduce or elim-

ing of redcedars by converting them into a valuable product, fuel ethanol, which has a large market," he said. "At the same time, we are producing a domestic fuel with a reduced carbon footprint compared to gasoline that should benefit the Oklahoma economy."

Much of our oil comes from other nations, including several that face political instability. While oil production here in Oklahoma and the rest of the country provides jobs

and improves our economy, oil production in other countries does not provide the same benefits. "My research is seeking to develop ways to make renewable transportation fuels that can replace the oil we currently buy from other countries while creating jobs here in Oklahoma and the rest of the U.S.," Wilkins said. "A domestic renewable energy sector will keep more of our money here and strengthen our economy, and our economy definitely needs that."

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
