Reward offered in Phillips County cattle shootings

KLA is offering up to a \$2,500 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of those involved in a series of November cattle shootings in Phillips County. KLA member Dustin Chester of Glade reported cows shot in a pasture six miles north of Logan November 1 and November 12. While both of those cows survived, another was found November 29 shot to death in a pasture three miles south of Speed. A veterinarian confirmed all three were shot.

Anyone with information about those involved in this crime should call Chester at (785) 533-2192 or the Phillips County Sheriff's Department at (785) 543-6885.

All KLA members are eligible for the reward program. The program applies to livestock, equipment, tack and pharmaceutical thefts, as well as animal mutilations or killings.

Ag Committee leaders talk timelines for 2012 Farm Bil

Congress have begun opening up about their plans for the 2012 Farm Bill process.

The leaders – and the ag community at large - have been examining options for renewing the law since attempts to attach a farm policy proposal to a debt reduction bill failed with the debt-deficit super-committee last month.

Senate Agriculture Committee Chairwoman Debbie Stabenow (D-Mich.) said recently Congress must complete the farm bill rewrite before the current bill expires. Speaking at the Farm Journal Forum in Washington, she said her committee will resume hearings on farm bill issues in January, with the goal of having an "initial product" by spring.

She also said 12 public hearings held this year and the lessons learned from the super-committee-related attempt "have helped us identify ways to streamline and strengthen programs to reduce the deficit and create agriculture jobs" and will be the framework for coming efforts.

In an interview with Oklahoma farm broadcaster Ron Hays, House Agriculture Chairman Frank Lucas (R-Okla.) noted Stabenow's plans to hold hearings, but did not commit to do the

He was generally positive about the package he and Stabenow negotiated prior to the super-committee's collapse — which has yet to be released publicly and indicated the House's schedule could mean an extension of current policy is needed.

For his part, House Agriculture Committee ranking member Collin Peterson (D-Minn.) suggested the proposal formulated before the super-committee's demise be added to a bill to extend an existing payroll tax holi-

Extending the payroll tax holiday is popular in Congress, but how to pay for it is a significant roadblock. Though it is unlikely Peterson's idea will get traction, and he said he hadn't discussed it with other key Congressional ag leaders, the concept would theoreti-

offset. It would also lock in farm safety net spending for five years while largely avoiding what is expected to be a drawn-out and nasty House floor flight.

Lucas later voiced support for the idea in an interview with the Red River Farm Network

Senate Agriculture ranking member Pat Roberts (R-Kan.) continued this week to call for hearings to begin under regular order, telling agriculture news outlet Agri-Pulse "the biggest thing is the process." Roberts maintains he was not part of the super committee proposal negotiations and, based on what he's heard about them, thinks they're problematic.



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Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

outside markets were mostly negative last week, which didn't help the ag markets, but at the same time, when we did see pressure in the grain and livestock, it wasn't necessarily related to what was going on in the financial markets. Perhaps we are going to have some separation from the outside markets, which would be great as far as I am concerned, because it would reduce the volatility and traders could take one eye off the Euro. Anyway, the Dow Jones lost over 300 points last week and the charts suggest further weakness ahead. The gold had three consecutive days of heavy selling and lost over

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\$100/oz. The crude oil couldn't hold gains generated by news that the Iranians would do military exercises in the Strait of Hormuz and then fell to the 38% retracement of the last move up. Friday's low of \$92.95 is now critical support in the March crude oil. Meanwhile the Dollar Index was strong gaining 1.54 points thanks to weakness in the Euro and the ever present debt issues over there. To me, it looks like the Dollar and the Euro are ready to correct, so I won't be surprised to see a temporary turnaround in those markets next week.

As for the grains, Wednesday's weakness sunk the corn for the week and

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the March contract lost 111/4 cents. The December contract only lost 34 thanks to some bear spreading. The front months made new lows for the move this week, while the December 12 contract is still holding above the November low. One can make a solid technical case for a bottom having been made in the December 12 due to the support holding and the divergence in the

technical indicators. Unfortunately we still can't get that fundamental spark that the market needs in order to see consistent gains. Old crop stocks are tight and basis is strong, but traders aren't concerned about that since stocks aren't getting tighter and there is concern that stocks estimates will grow in the future and that new crop supplies may actually become burdensome. Export sales came in at 504,700 MT, which is basically the bare minimum we can sell and meet expectations. It will take consistent sales over 1 MMT to get anyone excited.

The wheat fared worse than the corn and the March KW lost 22 cents for the week. At the moment there

isn't much to say that is positive about the wheat in either technical or fundamental terms. The market is oversold and trading funds have a massive net short position in Chicago wheat, but that doesn't mean we will see any short covering. There have also been reports that U.S. SRW is now

competitive on the world market, which is due to a combination of falling prices here and prices no longer falling in the Black Sea region. I have heard that the combination of lifting the export ban in Russia, high interest rates and poor liquidity have encouraged rapid liquidation of

wheat supplies in Russia. It is possible that they are now sold out, and coupled with the poor growing conditions this fall, we may start to see European prices start to rise. That would be good news for us and if true and we would see our exports start to improve. In the meantime, sell option premium.

Soybean futures were the bright spot of the week. March soybeans gained 23 cents for the week and closed at the high of the week. It is not a huge accomplishment, but it is a step in the right direction that has a solid fundamental basis. Dry weather is a concern in S. America right now and if it continues it should help prices greatly. Lower supplies in S. America should result in better exports for us, which would lower stocks and change our new crop acreage dynamic completely. Export sales have been relatively poor this year, but something to consider is that we cannot return to the past two years sales levels because we don't have that many soybeans available. Another thing to consider is that if sales continue at this week's pace of 468,600 MT we would exceed the current sales estimate by over 100

million bushels and ending stocks would be as tight as they were when prices were record-high. As the numbers stand right now we have way more soybeans that we need and there isn't much reason to be concerned, but keep in mind that conditions can change quickly. A great spec trade would be to buy 2 July soybean \$14.00 - \$15.00 bull call spreads and sell 1 \$10.00 put for a net premium cost of zero

Choice beef is back to \$190, so I think we are going to see good strength in the market next week. Monday and Friday's technical action was impressive and with oversold indicators, suggest a bottom has been made. The cattle on feed report probably won't help matters Monday morning with the 104% on feed and the 104% placements, but I think that the cash trade and fundamentals will overcome the report numbers very quickly. I look for the February LC to make it back to the \$122 area early next week, and then we will see where cash cattle trade develops. I like bull spreading the live cattle.

Groups announce theme for 2012 Be Ag-Wise Workshops

Kansas Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom (KFAC) and Kansas Farm Bureau (KFB) are to host the 2012 Be Ag-Wise workshops in several locations in early 2012. The theme this year is "Ag Counts."

The workshops, which are designed especially for agricultural education presenters at the county level, will give participants the opportunity to receive training for a variety of agriculture-based, hands-on learning labs; receive resource materials; share ideas; network with others; and practheir presentation

The workshops are designed to assist volunteer agricultural educators in the counties such as Cooperative Extension educators, county Farm Bureau agricultural education volunteers, Conservation District managers, agricultural educators, youth presenters and

"Each year we have teachers, volunteers, Cooperative Extension professionals, and FFA youth and instructors attend these Saturday workshops," said Cathy Musick, executive director for KFAC. "Attendees receive five hours of training and up to eight lesson plans they can take back to teach elementary students in their school district. Lesson plans can also be used for after school, summer school and day camp venues. One of the best parts of the day is when the attendees share ideas on how they have used agriculture as a tool for teaching math, science, reading and social

The theme for the workshops is "Ag Counts," which focuses on practical applications of math, using agriculture as the teaching tool. Pumpkin Predictions, Mealtime Math, By the Pound, Change for a Dollar and Barnyard Math are all ways to teach elementary youth math principals using agriculture. The "fat bucks buffet" will be an exercise in budgeting of fat grams for the noon meal. The dates and locations for the oneday workshops are: Jan. 14 in Emporia at Girl Scout's Heartland, Inc.; Jan. 21 in Manhattan at Kansas Farm Bureau; Feb. 25 in Colby, at the Colby Community Center; and March 3 in Garden City, at the Southwest Area Research and Extension Complex; and March 10 in Wichita at Farm Bureau Claims Office. The workshops will be held from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

There must be a minimum of 10 participants at each location in order to conduct a workshop. In the event that one of the workshops will not be held, participants who have registered to attend it may attend any of the other workshops.

USDA announces sign-up period for **Conservation Stewardship Program**

U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has announced that the ranking period cutoff date for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) is January 13, 2012. Producers interested in CSP should submit applications to their local NRCS office by the deadline so that their applications can be considered during the first ranking period of 2012.

"CSP is one of our most popular conservation programs, and we expect to receive many applications," NRCS chief Dave White said. "I encourage all farmers and ranchers who are interested in applying to contact their local NRCS office as soon as possible so they can meet the deadline."

CSP is offered in all 50 states and the Pacific and Caribbean areas through continuous sign-ups. The program provides many conservation benefits including improvement of water and soil quality, wildlife habit enhancements, and adoption of conservation activities that address the effects of climate change. Eligible lands include cropland, pastureland, rangeland, nonindustrial private forest land, and agricultural land under the jurisdiction of an Indian

A CSP self-screening checklist is available to help potential applicants determine if CSP is suitable for

their operation. The checklist highlights basic information about CSP eligibility requirements, contract obligations, and potential payments. It is available from local NRCS offices and on the CSP webpage http:// www.nrcs.usda.gov/wps/por tal/nrcs/main/national/progr ams/financial/csp.

As part of the CSP application process, applicants will work with NRCS field personnel to complete the resource inventory using a Conservation Measurement Tool (CMT). The CMT determines the conservation performance for existing and new conservation activities. The applicant's conservation performance will be used to determine eligibility, ranking, and payments.

In 2010 alone, nearly 21,000 applicants enrolled in CSP, putting additional conservation on 25.2 million acres, about the size of the state of Kentucky, to improve water and soil quality, enhance wildlife habitat, and address the effects of climate change.


