Kansas farmers and ranchers encouraged to participate in Census of Agriculture

The U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Kansas Department of Agriculture are urging all Kansas farmers to sign up for the 2012 Census of Agriculture, and to share stories about how Census data benefit them.

The agencies want to make sure all Kansas farmers and ranchers are counted in the upcoming Census. USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service conducts the Census of Agriculture every five years and is currently preparing to send the Census form to all agricultural producers in December.

The Census of Agriculture is a leading source of facts and figures about American agriculture. Conducted every five years, the Census provides a detailed picture of U.S. farms and ranches and the people who operate them.

Kansas Agricultural Statistics staff members notified producers on National Agriculture Day, on March 8, about the Census.

"As we celebrated National Ag Day, it was a great. opportunity to reflect on the important contributions of Kansas farmers and ranchers," said Jason Lamprecht, acting director of Kansas Agricultural 'Census data can help us to better tell the amazing story of American and Kansas agriculture, but that story will be incomplete if farmers aren't all counted."

To put together a complete list of agricultural producers, NASS sent out the National Agricultural Classification Survey, or NACS, early in 2012. This initial survey helps identify potential agricultural activities in the United States and people who should receive the Census form later this year. Producers who did not fill out the NACS can still sign up for the Census by visiting www.agcensus. usda.gov and clicking "Be Counted - Make Your Voice Heard."

Federal law requires all agricultural producers to participate in the Census of Agriculture. The same law requires the national statistics service to keep all information confidential. In the Census, and in all related surveys, the statistics service safeguards the privacy of all respondents so that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

Farmers and communities benefit from Census of Agriculture data, and the USDA invites producers to share their Census stories in their own words. At the "Share your Census Story" web page, producers can tell how local, state and national farm services, programs and policies were shaped by Census of Agriculture data. They can also convey that by just answering a few simple questions. the Census data significantly affected their lives, operations and communities.

"Sharing information about how agricultural and rural programs enhance their quality of life will help others understand the importance of Census information and encourage them to sign up and be counted," Lamprecht said.

Alfalfa weevils spotted in Kansas

It's not only cyclists and joggers taking advantage of recent unusually warm Kansas weather — alfalfa weevils are rapidly developing throughout the state, according to K-State Research and Extension entomologist Jeff Whitworth.

Whitworth said samples he's taken and reports from others showed the first larvae were detected the week of March 5, and with the significant warm spell Kansas has experienced since then, egg and larval development has been readily apparent. "All fields we sampled this week in central Kansas had 10-30 percent of the stems infested with 1st instar larvae," Whitworth said. "Most infested stems had multiple larvae simply because that is where the female weevil deposited a clutch of eggs last fall and now they are all hatching together." Treatment thresholds vary in alfalfa, depending upon the end use, but usually delaying application until there is one larva for every two stems (50 percent infestation) is the most effective management tactic, he said. "This warm weather may condense weevil development by increasing it so quickly, so early that the infestation may not drag out over a four- to six-week period as it has in the past," Whitworth said. "We've been getting questions about the use of chlorpyrifos, or products containing chlorpyrifos, relative to the legality of making a second application, if needed, per cutting. This question has arisen because of the early egg hatch and the potential length of time between this and swathing, which usually doesn't occur until at least late April. If you do decide a second application is necessary prior to that first cutting, make sure you consult the label of the product you intend to use to ensure it is allowed for that product. Always read the label prior to and have the label available during application."

The grass IS greener for backgrounders

Cinch up that seatbelt. This cattle market madness is only going to get more dramatic. You may think you've been on a roller-coaster ride, but Derrell Peel, Oklahoma State University (OSU) ag economist, shared data at a recent field day that could wow the most seasoned thrill seeker.

"We have record level prices pretty much anywhere you look in this industry and they're going to get higher," Peel said, addressing nearly 75 stocker operators earlier this month.

The "Backgrounding for Quality" seminar at White Brothers Cattle Co., near Chickasha, Okla., was cosponsored by OSU, Pfizer Animal Health and Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB).

Peel said being a market analyst used to be much easier. "Beef demand wasn't changing much, international trade wasn't all that important and corn was always \$2 a bushel, so all you had to do was figure out the cattle inventory and you had a pretty good bet on what was going to happen in cattle markets." Not anymore.

"What's driving prices today is not something

that's happened overnight," he said. The industry has liquidated cattle 14 of the last 16 years. In January, USDA numbers showed fewer than 91 million head of U.S. cattle, the lowest inventory since

That makes supply a key driver, not just in 2012, but for the next four to six years, he said.

Replacement heifer retention has increased since 2009. "But it hasn't translated into net growth in the herd because we've had very large cow slaughter," he said.

Drought drove that last year and still remains a wild card moving forward. Perhaps surprisingly, these lower animal numbers have not shown up in the form of significantly smaller beef production, until now.

"You're eating your way into smaller inventories," Peel said, noting that liquidation means more harvested animals. "That supports production in the short run, but at some point you simply can't maintain that. We have reached that point."

Beef production was already declining during the last quarter of 2011, and

happened the 2012 projection cuts aid. The in-that an additional 3% to 4%.

"We certainly have more concerns about what that's going to do on the demand side," he said, noting fears about how high prices can go before that turns away consumers.

"We're at record-level prices and they're only going to go higher," Peel said. As heifers are retained, supplies will get tighter, putting a squeeze on through 2013 and maybe even 2014.

"That's going to be very important from a beef demand standpoint in terms of how (consumers) will be able to respond with this additional pressure we'll see on prices," he said.

USDA Choice boxed beef has never traded above \$2 per pound, but in recent months it's gotten close. What's a thorn to purchasers is a bright spot for any producers marketing on a value-based grid.

"For the last three years, we've had a pretty weak Choice-Select spread," Peel said. "This year it's returning to a bit more normal spread." Hamburger purchases are partially to blame, as consumers have shifted away from pricier steaks, or middle meats, to end meats.

"For the most part they didn't stop eating beef," he said.

Exports are picking up any slack, and setting records. Japan, Mexico, Canada and Korea are the major players, taking nearly equal shares of U.S. beef.

But even record prices can't prop up profits when input prices are also on the same sky-high track.

"Most of the beef industry we know and think about was built on cheap feed, cheap corn," Peel said. "We don't have that right now."

Or any time soon, he added, thanks to increased competition. "The beauty of the market is that it never says you can't have something. It just prices it so you can decide that you can get by without it," he says.

That's why the beef industry is better poised to deal with record-high corn prices.

"I don't see a big future for stocker chickens," he joked. "There are some folks promoting pasture poultry, and all that does is make the covotes smile."

For 40 years, the industry built up the idea of cheap gains on grain. "Now it's not the cheapest game



Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

Ahead of Schedule Gardening

It appears that spring or summer is here to stay. Typically, April 15 is when we want to have crabgrass weed preventers applied to the lawn. Other indicators of time to apply are when forsythia and redbud have bloomed. Mine are blooming! There are several preventer product choices with even a good post-emergent.

The vegetable gardening season may be early but there is plenty of time to plant. Later plantings often catch up with the early sowings. However, it is too early to plant tomatoes except for those you are starting from seed indoors.

In preparation of more vegetable gardening, I'm holding a meeting in Pottorf Hall in Manhattan on Thursday, March 29. It will begin at 7 p.m. Vegetable gardening in our area will be highlighted. Raised bed gardening, containers and making seed tape are some topics.

Using seed tape is my latest gardening technique. I have good intentions of thinning but it seldom gets done. My radishes, lettuce, carrots and spinach end up too thick. Seed tape can space the plants appropriately at planting. Commercial tape is available, although it usually needs thinning as well.

I make my own seed tape. Toilet tissue, glue, seed and measuring tape are the supplies. Roll out the length of tissue you need. For example, my raised beds are 54 inches wide. A dap of glue is spaced along the tissue as needed. My carrots are spaced three inches apart. I can put two rows of carrots on the roll of tissue. If you have confidence in seed germination, then each glue spot gets only one seed. No thinning required. Perhaps there will be empty spaces if the seed doesn't germi-These seed tapes nate. can be made on the kitchen table. They can be made

well in advance of planting. I usually do it a day ahead of planting. Store seed tape in a cool and dry location if not planting right away.

The strip of tissue with the glued seeds is laid on the soil. Cover the seeds with soil or potting media. Water the row and it is ready to grow.

Let's hope for a good season of gardening. It is already starting out interesting.

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

March 30th is the Quarterly Stocks report and the Prospective Plantings report. USDA has been talking about a big corn acreage number for quite some time, so we should expect to see at least 94 million acres of corn and many feel the number is more likely to be 95 million. Along with that we should expect to see 75 million acres of soybeans. The acreage numbers are fairly easy to predict since USDA probably won't deviate much from the number released at the Outlook Conference. The Quarterly Stocks number, however, I feel is impossible to predict. The numbers have been so erratic and have made so little mathematic sense that the stocks estimates feel random. The market reactions to the stocks reports have been violent with a limit higher move last March, limit lower in June, limit lower in September, and limit lower in January. Will we have four limit lower moves in a row? It seems like the odds should be against that happening. but I wouldn't be willing to bet much against it happening. If you still have unpriced old crop corn, the prudent thing to do would be to have some sort of price protection. Buy a May put, sell a call, do both, or sell your corn and buy a call. The point is that you need to take some kind of action before this report to protect yourself from the USDA and their wild stocks reports.

The reaction in the wheat and sovbean markets hasn't been quite as violent as the corn, but it is still easy to pick out the days of the stocks reports by glancing at the chart. The old crop sovbeans are already dealing with large ending stocks and a market that has seen months of persistent gains. It wouldn't take much convincing for the bulls to take profits if the numbers are negative, so if you are holding old crop soybeans there is plenty of reason to take protection ahead of this report as well. As for the wheat, the fundamental outlook is still poor and recent rains in the HRW belt will only make it worse, so this market is very susceptible to a sell off caused by a negative stocks report as

Trading action this week was mostly negative with the corn, wheat and soybeans all losing ground. The corn fell to the bottom of the recent trading range before bouncing back Thursday and Friday. The recovery wasn't very impressive, but looking back at the sideways nature of the market and the fact that Chinese corn prices keep rising, it just looks natural that the corn

would start to move back to

the top of the trading range

ahead of the report.

well.

The same theory applies to the wheat. The July KW actually fell through the important support at \$6.80, but bounced back Thursday and didn't close below the support. The rebound in the wheat was actually impressive considering the lack of news and the lackluster action in the corn. However, one shouldn't expect much more than getting back to the upper end of the trading range unless we see friendly

numbers from the USDA.

The soybeans were overdue for a correction, so a little bit of weakness in that market wasn't a concern. By the end of the week the July contract was only down 9 cents, so the correction didn't amount to anything anyway. At the very least we will see a retest of the highs, and depending on the report, the beans may continue on with the bull market. Traders are talking about shrinking S. American production estimates again, which translates to stronger exports both this year and next. Supplies are adequate so far this year, but USDA is underestimating exports and stocks are already projected to be tight in the new crop, which will keep a bid under the market for some

time to come.

The Cattle on feed estimate came in at 103%. Placements at 103%, and Marketings at 98%. All of the numbers were skewed to the negative side. The cattle futures didn't perform very well this week despite cash cattle trade at \$128 in Nebraska. The charts look very negative at this point, which is surprising considering the fundamentals. It is easier to understand that the feeder cattle have run out of steam when cattle feeders are losing money even with record high prices. The recent price break in the beef market seems to have attracted demand and in this week's export sales report sales were record large at 52,000 MT. Hopefully this is





Moran, Thune introduce bill to block overreaching DOL farm labor rule

U.S. Sens. John Thune (R-S.D.) and Jerry Moran (R-Kan.) have introduced common sense legislation, the Preserving America's Family Farm Act, to prevent the Department of Labor (DOL) from enacting its controversial proposed restrictions on youth working on family farms.

Last year, DOL Secretary Hilda Solis proposed rules that would restrict family farm operations by prohibiting youth under the age of 18 from being near certain-age animals without adult supervision, participating in common livestock practices such as vaccinating and hoof trimming, and handling most animals more than six months old, which would severely limit participation in 4-H and FFA activities and restrict their youth farm safety classes; operating farm machinery over 20 PTO horsepower; completing tasks at elevations over six feet high; and working at stockyards and grain and feed facilities. The language of the proposed rule is so specific it would even ban youth from operating a battery-powered screwdriver or a pressurized garden

"The Department Labor has proposed 85 pages of unreasonable and overreaching rules that would unnecessarily restrict the participation of young people in agriculture related activities," said Thune. "Family farms and farming communities teach young people responsible work ethics and these proposed rules would change that by severely limiting the commonplace activities in which young people can learn about agriculture. This is another example of the Obama administration initiating unsolicited regulations that would prohibit normal practices that have been carried out in rural

"For generations, the contributions of young people have helped family farm and ranch operations survive and prosper. If this proposal goes into effect, not only will the shrinking rural workforce be further reduced, and our nation's youth be deprived of valuable career training opportunities, but a way of life will begin to disappear. This proposal should alarm more than just rural America. If the federal government can regulate the relationship between parents and their children on their own family's farm, there is virtually nothing off limits when it comes to government intrusion into our

In December of last

28 of their Senate colleagues sent a letter to Secretary Solis requesting that the proposed rule be withdrawn and outlined numerous concerns. As of today, DOL has not responded to the bipartisan letter.





Crop insurance leader asks Congress to do no harm

emerges from the 2012 Farm Bill process will hold major ramifications for this risk management program and for America's farmers and ranchers who have come to rely on it," Steve Rutledge told the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry on March 15, 2012

Rutledge, who spoke on behalf of crop insurance companies, underscored the public-private partnership that is unique to crop insurance and how that relationship lowers risk for taxpayers. The chairman of Farmers Mutual Hail Insurance Company of Iowa also asked lawmakers to do no harm to crop insurance with additional funding reductions or regulatory burdens in the ongoing legislative debate.

Rutledge's testimony comes on the heels of record indemnities being paid out by crop insurers to farmers and ranchers recouping from the worst weather year in history, with claims to date totaling nearly \$10.3 billion to cover agricultural losses. This surpasses the old 2008 record of \$8.67 billion by approximately 19 percent.

"The fact that the United States is planting crops just months after such devastation in 2011 should not be taken for granted," he testified, noting the importance of a vibrant agricultural sector to the larger U.S. economy.

"I can't tell you how many times I have seen the relief and gratitude on a farmer's face when they realize that because of crop insurance, they will be back in the fields in the spring and life will go on uninterrupted," explained Rutledge, who began his career as an insurance adjuster.

But this success could be upended if the crop insurance infrastructure is strained, Rutledge said. He explained that in the midst of the growth of crop insurance and the rising crop prices-both of which increase the cost of the policy and company risk-crop insurance has lost about \$12 billion in funding since 2008, making it one of the only sectors to sacrifice for deficit reduction.

"This reduction is astounding when one considers that crop insurance represented only eight percent of Farm Bill spending and a meager one-tenth of one percent of overall government outlays," he said.

The private sector should continue to provide and deliver crop insurance options, share in the risk of loss caused by changing markets and natural disasters, and adjust losses for insurable crops. We believe the private sector, not the government, is the best way to provide the individual risk management information and tools that are indispensible for producers today. We understand that is the way farmers and ranchers want the program to operate, and trust in our congressional leaders to stay the course."

Crop insurance companies wrote more than \$11.9 billion in federal multiple peril crop insurance premiums last year, covering nearly 265 million acres of farmland, protecting more than 80 percent of eligible crops, with total potential liability exceeding \$113 bil-

Since 2008, a total of more than \$28 billion has been sent to farmers for policies they purchased. Federal investment in crop insurance, during that same period, was reduced by more than \$12 billion.



Deep roots: Kansas Forest Service celebrating 125 years of tree-mendous work promoting forestry practices

Like Dr. Seuss' "The Lorax," the Kansas Forest Service at Kansas State University has been speaking for the trees for the past 125 years.

The forest service got its start March 10, 1887, when the state of Kansas established the commissioner of forestry office to encourage and promote forestry practices. The state legislature assigned administrative responsibilities for state forestry to Kansas State University in 1909.

To commemorate its 125 years of promoting state forestry efforts, the forest service will offer several events throughout the year, including Tree City, March 28; Agro Forestry, May 10; Walnut Council, June 1; an anniversary open house, Oct. 4; and Fall Forestry Field Day, Oct. 18.

The state has also recognized the forest service's longtime contributions. Gov. Sam Brownback issued a proclamation honoring the Kansas Forest Service on Feb. 24, and the state senate and House passed resolutions to honor the anniver-

"Celebrating the 125th anniversary is significant because Kansans clearly like trees," said Larry Biles, state forester. "Over the years Kansans have planted nearly half as many acres of trees as are found naturally."

Although the establishment of the commissioner of forestry office was a milestone event, interest in planting trees began 22 Legislature assigned ad-

years earlier. In 1865 the Kansas Legislature established a 50-cent bounty for planting and cultivating five acres of wood crops that would aid with water and wind damage control. This bounty was to be paid for 25 years. Three years later the bounty was raised to \$2, and an additional \$2 was also provided for each half mile of trees planted not more than a mile apart along public highways.

Despite the state's reputation for flat plains and rolling prairies, forest trees play an integral role in the Kansas ecosystem.

"Kansas' rivers, ponds and lakes are filling with sediment due to the removal of riparian forests along streambeds," Biles said. "Trees and woody stabilize vegetation stream banks and help slow sedimentation."

To foster healthy forestry practices and reduce issues such as sedimentation, the Kansas Forest Service educates and provides Kansans with tools through programs such as conservation trees, fire management, community forestry, rural forestry, forest health and wood products program.

"These programs clearly reflect fulfillment of the agency's mission of care of natural resources and service to people through forestry," Biles

Some key events in the history of the Kansas Forest Service include:

• In 1909 the Kansas

ministration responsibilities for the state forestry to Kansas State Universi-

- In 1957 a revised conservation tree-planting program began, providing seedlings to landowners;
- In 1963 the community fire program was started, currently serving more than 500 volunteer fire districts;
- In 1968 the current Kansas Forest Service building, 2610 Claflin Manhattan, was Road,
- In 1997 the name was changed to Kansas Forest Service; and
- In 2009, Kansas' first state forest, Cimarron National Grassland in Marion County, was established.

"We are most pleased to be working with this anniversary celebration and observing successes of the past 125 years," Biles said. "Moreover, we are excited about addressing the state's contemporary forest and tree challenges.'

In the service's forest action plan, Biles has identified those challenges as forest health, water quality and quantibiodiversity wildlife habitat management, forest sustainability, windbreak and shelterbelt planting and management, and economic benefits through forest products and ecosystem servic-

Animal health breakthrough: research uncovers genetic marker that could help control, eliminate PRRS virus

ery involving Kansas State University researchers may improve animal health and save the U.S. pork industry millions of dollars each year.

Raymond "Bob" Rowland, a virologist and professor of diagnostic medicine and pathobiology, was part of the collaborative effort that discovered a genetic marker that identifies nigs with reduced susceptibility to porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome, or PRRS. This virus costs the U.S. pork industry more than \$600 million each year.

"This discovery is what you call a first-first," Rowland said. "This discovery is the first of its kind for PRRS but also for any large food animal infectious disease. I have worked in the field for 20 years and this is one of the biggest advances I have seen.'

Rowland and searchers Jack Dekkers from Iowa State University and Joan Lunney from the Research Agricultural Service discovered a genetic marker called a quantitative trait locus, or QTL, which is associated with porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome virus susceptibility. This discovery is a first step in controlling and eliminating the

The research recently appeared in the Journal of Animal Science. The project's beginning and future center around Kansas State University, Rowland said.

It begins at the universi-

ty because Rowland is involved with an organization called the PRRS Host Genetics Consortium, or PHGC, which initiated and provided more than \$5 million for the research. Rowland is co-director of the consortium, which is a collaboration among the United States Department of Agriculture, the National Pork Board and Genome Canada as well as universities and industry members. Rowland is also director of the USDA-funded PRRS Coordinated Agriculture Project, known as PRRS CAP.

"The PRRS Host Genetics Consortium takes fundamental science and turns it into utility," Rowland

Kansas State University's new Large Animal Research Center is the site of much of the project's experimental work. The researchers obtain multiple measurements — including growth, weight gain, performance and virus measurements — over time. They have collected samples from more than 2,000 pigs since they began the study in 2007, for a total of more than 100,000 samples that are stored or distributed to the consortium's collaborators.

The university shipped samples to the Agricultural Research Service for genomic DNA preparations to identify differences among more than 60,000 genes. The data was transferred to Iowa State University for genetic analysis that led to the discovery of the QTL.

Iowa State University created a common database so that all the data collected during the project can be accessed at multiple locations by researchers and the breeding industry for the next several decades.

"A unique aspect of this project is that we have been looking at genes that may provide long-term resistance to a lot of infections," Rowland said. "This is very important for animal health because there are a lot of diseases for which there are no cures and no vaccines. Now we have a tool to study these diseases."

These findings open new possibilities with Kansas State University's Biosecurity Research Institute and the future National Bio and Agro-defense Facility. Scientists can take this new genetic tool and study different infectious diseases in these world-class research facilities.

The discovery plays a role in nearly every aspect of animal health and is a large economic driver, Rowland said. Industry members are especially interested in how it opens

cines. The next step is to find which genes contribute to the best vaccine response.

'We're not only making healthier animals, but we're also understanding the fundamental biological relationship between a host and a pathogen," Rowland said. "This has direct applications to human medicine because the same type of science and relationships applies to humans.'

In addition to providing a better model for the porcine reproductive and respiratory syndrome virus, the research has led to several spin-offs:

• The Kansas State University researchers are able to collect thousands of samples that companies need to validate and develop the next generation of diagnostic tests. One such test is the use of oral fluids — a noninvasive diagnostic test in which pigs chew on a rope and scientists analyze the saliva left on the rope.

 The research led to the discovery of pigs with severe combined immunodeficiency, or SCID. This research should enable researchers to better study the syndrome and apply its use to the study of human cancer and anti-cancer drugs.

The project has also proved to be very valuable for education because it has involved more than 20 veterinary medicine, preveterinary medicine and graduate students Kansas State University.

"This is an incredible opportunity for students to come in, learn how to work biosecurity and have the opportunity to do research," Rowland said. "It provides them with a lot of practical hands-on knowl-



The circle of farming: cover crops a good step toward soil health

Emporia farmer Gail Fuller's advice for ranchers and farmers seeking to improve air, water and soil quality while increasing crop yield, livestock health and financial investments is simple: take

It wasn't just a figure of speech. By walking through native grassland, along perennial creeks or through dense woodlands, Fuller said, one can see that Mother Nature abhors a vacuum, or, more specifically, a monoculture. That intensive mass of diverse vegetation aboveground and an equally diverse biomass below form an intimately interconnected web at once independent and dependent on the whole.

Farmers can do no better than to replicate nature, he said.

Fuller spoke at the 2012 Agriculture and Conservation Expo held March 12 in Horton. Calling it 'farming in nature's image,' Fuller's approach is based on holistic principles, incorporating the extensive use of cover crops, mob livestock grazing and rapid feeding site rotation. "We have to look at everything as whole," he said. "Above ground and below ground. It's all got to come together. And no, holistic isn't a hippie

To farm holistically is to farm biologically, he said. It involves increasing organic matter in the soil through the use of cover crops. Benefits are almost immediate and take on a life of their own—literally.

"You start ramping up your biological life in the

soil," Fuller said. "The more life in the soil, the more it consumes, so the more biomass you have to grow above the ground to feed the biomass below. It's a circle of farming."

It also necessitates a change in management style and a different way of looking at farming practices. It's no longer enough to look at shortterm effects; a long-term approach is needed to ensure long-term viability. "Everything I do affects something else," he said. "We no longer look at a cropping plan as just corn and soybeans. We look at it as how this cropping plan will affect this year's crop, next year's crop, how it's going to affect the wildlife, the livestockthere are so many different things to address, and with cover crops we're addressing them all. We're recycling nutrients, we're improving water infiltration, we're feeding wildlife and livestock at the same time."

Fuller continues to experiment with various cover crops, but has at one time or another planted oats, barley, triticale, orchard grass, lupin, cosmos, safflower, mustard, rape, sunn hemp, vetch and others, usually in a cocktail mixing warm and cool season species. His mantra—"When you plant things together, it brings the soil to life"—relies on crop diversity to not only enrich the soil but to anchor it. In many ways, he's trying to make his crops emulate native grassland. The more biomass, the more water will soak in. Increasing organic matter in the soil from one to three percent doubles the soil's water-holding capacity, Fuller said.

And if there's one lesson to derive from last year's drought, which was severe in Fuller's area, it's this: "The last thing to burn up in a drought is the prairie," he said. Cover crops also reduce erosion,

which was one reason he got into cover crops in the first place.

For livestock, Fuller takes another tip from Mother Nature: replicating the grazing practices of bison from pre-settlement days. At one time, 60 million bison roamed the Great Plains. The numbers were staggering; nor were they alone—cougars, elk, deer, coyotes, wolves, all accompanied the great herd. Grazing was intense followed by months of rest, giving the land time to heal. More grazing and less confinement are key ingredients to healthy pasture and healthy livestock, Fuller said.

He calls the method "mob grazing," and like with cover crops, its practice has evolved through trial and error. Experiments showed that by moving 66 head of cattle once a day across one paddock and in tighter concentrations three times per day across another paddock, the grass in the latter was eight inches higher the following spring than in the former

"In one mob graze, we got 50 percent more production," he said. "We in-

creased our efficiency in the fall, we increased our production in the spring. We're kick-starting the soil life so fast there. Remember, 90 percent of what goes in a cow's mouth comes out the other end. We're recycling nutrients and minerals." Some have asked about trampling. Compaction is caused by time, not pounds, he stressed, and can be easily alleviated by frequent rotations.

When taken as a whole, livestock is the last piece of the puzzle, what holds it all together, he said. There are, he admitted, alternatives. Farmers can do it as they have for generations, using herbicides and pesticides and confining cattle for winter feeding, but statistics show how that turned out.

"Is the same-old good enough?" he asked. "We've lost 40 percent of our topsoil and lose another five -and-a-half tons per acre annually. mostly due to bad farming practices. If we don't change, our grandkids will have to find a way to farm rock."

Farming holistically, the way Mother Nature intended, doesn't take much more work or cost, he said, but it does involve a change in mindset. "It's almost like having to relearn how to farm," he said. "But we're not reinventing the wheel, we're relearning how our grandfathers and our

great-grandfathers farm-

The Agriculture and Conservation Expo is an annual event hosted by the Delaware WRAPS and the Glacial Hills Resource Conservation and Development Region. Garetson encourages Congress to embrace robust crop insurance plan

farmer appeared recently before the U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry to make the case for an effective and robust crop insurance component of the 2012 Farm Bill.

Jarvis Garetson raises wheat, corn, soybeans, milo and cotton in Haskell County and farms in a family partnership with his brother and parents. He told the committee that crop insurance literally saved the farm from the ravages of last year's severe drought in his corner of the world.

"In the past 18 months, our farm received a total of 4.85 inches of rainfall," Garetson testified. "Quite frankly, without strong and effective crop insurance tools, Garetson Brothers farms could likely have been preparing for a farm sale this spring. Instead, we're planning and preparing to plant."

Garetson's testimony comes at a crucial time, as the U.S. Congress wrestles with spending priorities in an effort to better manage the burgeoning federal deficit.

The southwest Kansas producer encouraged the committee to consider a number of potential improvements to better allow the crop insurance compomeet the needs of farmers in Kansas and across the nation. Among the suggested improvements:

Enterprise units. which combine all acres of a single crop within a county where the policyholder has a financial interest.

• Limited irrigation insurance to insure crops that fall into the gray area between 'irrigated' and 'non-irrigated' crops, the only two categories currently offered.

• Declining yields. The current structure unfairly penalizes drought-stricken farmers with higher premiums, since coverage is based on a recent annual average of what's called 'Actual Production History,' or how much the crop yielded.

• Improved data collection. Since farmers are innovators in technology, it only makes sense that federal government agencies farmers deal with also embrace technology for more efficient delivery of farm programs and indemnity payments.

Garetson serves as president of the Haskell County Farm Bureau and has been active in a variety of leadership capacities with his farm organization. He was in the nation's capital as a participant in Kansas Farm Bureau's annual

county Farm Bureau president's trip to Washington.

"American agriculture relies on a strong safety net, delivered efficiently and effectively, through the current public-private partnership," said Steve Baccus, an Ottawa County grain farmer, who serves as

Bureau and has been a leader in the dialogue over crop insurance reform. "Profit margins on the farm are tight and an adequately-funded risk management program will go a long way to ensuring a strong, viable rural economy."

Beef supplies short in 2012; producers look to expand herd

U.S. beef producers have started the early stages of herd expansion as beef supplies remain very short, says Purdue Extension agricultural economist Chris Hurt.

Beef cow numbers have dropped by 9%, or 3 million head, since 2007. They dropped by 3% in 2011 alone, meaning a smaller calf crop in 2012 and lower slaughter numbers through 2014. But strong finished cattle prices and moderating feed costs have driven some producers to start the expansion.

Producers have reduced their herds in recent years primarily because of escalating feed costs since 2007 and a drought in the southern Plains that dried up pastures and forages.

According to a January USDA cattle report, the most recent available, beef heifer retention has increased 1% — a sign that producers are starting to expand. If U.S. crop yields return closer to normal during the 2012 crop year, Hurt said feed prices could come down even more, which would encourage further herd expansion.

'This is the first increase in heifer retention since feed prices began increasing," he said.

While higher retention rates would seem to suggest lower finished cattle prices in 2012, Hurt said the opposite is likely true. Beef producers retaining heifers results in lower slaughter supplies and, ultimately, lower beef supplies.


With a reduction in cow numbers, the calf crop could be down more than 2% in 2012, and if heifer retention continues in 2012 and 2013, Hurt said beef supplies might not increase until 2015.

"The modest heifer retention now is actually a price-enhancing factor in the short run," he said. "Look for finished cattle prices to push into the higher \$120s in the spring, moderate to the mid-\$120s this summer, and finish the year near \$130. Spring highs in 2013 could climb to the low \$130s.

Despite the high finished-cattle price projections, Hurt said producers need to keep an eye on the weather and 2012 crop yields before they make further expansion plans. Producers in the southern should Plains watch drought conditions, while producers nationwide need to watch crop progress.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is forecasting that a region of the western Corn Belt will continue to be very dry into the spring.

"That raises concerns for corn and soybean meal prices," Hurt said. "Higher feed prices would depress cattle prices."



Dr. Don Good

A giant has fallen.

No, not a man of huge physical stature, but a giant in the world of livestock judging, animal science, and the Kansas livestock industry.

Dr. Don Good passed away on February 14, 2012, after a 40-year career in the animal science program at Kansas State University. Dr. Good had an international influence, teaching and consulting in more than ten nations while developing the best and the brightest of rural Kansas students.

Don grew up on a farm in Ohio, where he was active in 4-H and FFA. As a member of the Ohio State livestock judging team, he was the high individual in the American Royal livestock judging contest and second high individual at the Internation-

al Livestock Exposition in Chicago. Don got his master's degree from KSU and his doctorate from the University of Minnesota. He came to K-State to coach the livestock judging team, manage the purebred beef herds, and teach and advise students.

As K-State's judging team coach, Don Good won 14 major contests in 18 years. He became head of Animal Husbandry in 1966 and served in that capacity until his retirement in 1987.

In 1966, a devastating tornado hit Kansas and decimated K-State's livestock facilities Dr Good led the effort to establish the K-State Livestock and Meat Industry Council so as to generate funds to respond to these crucial needs. The LMIC was headed by Dr. A.D.

"Dad" Weber, another giant of the industry. Fittingly, the newest wing of K-State's primary animal science building, Weber Hall, is named the Don Good Addi-

Can one man make a dif-

ference? Can one moment change an industry? In 1969, Dr. Good was the official judge at the International Livestock Exposition in Chicago. When the time came to select the winner, Dr. Good broke away from the old type purebred steer and selected an Angus Charolais crossbred steer as grand champion. That one decision has been hailed as a landmark event in the acceptance of crossbreeding and a transition to the modern beef type of today.

I first knew Don Good when his son and I were in FFA together. I remember being inspired by Dr. Good when he spoke to us FFA members, and impressed when I heard him give an incredible set of reasons at a livestock judging contest. Several people commented that Dr. Good had an ability to bring out the best in peo-

Family and faith were top priorities for Don, especially with his children and grandchildren. Don and his beloved wife Jane enjoyed 64 years together. Jane

and the faculty you led.

New livestock centers were built for those

destroyed by storm,
The name changed to Animal Science and Industry to
better inform.

With Dr. Weber as its Executive Vice President, in 1968 the LMIC was conceived, That the mission of Kansas animal agriculture might be better perceived.

Now, with Calvin Drake and the Board of Directors held in high esteem,

We look to the 21st Century as they further pursue your dream. Tonight your colleagues, friends and family

honor you, Don, in appreciation,
For the work you've done,
with much loyalty and dedication.
You've loved your job, Kansas State University,


