Consider growth regulator herbicides for burndown applications

Weeds can be controlled prior to planting corn or soybean by using preplant tillage, herbicides, or both, according to Aaron Hager, associate professor of weed science at the University of Illinois.

Weed control may be improved when more than one active herbicide ingredient is included in the burndown application. Burndown applications often include growthregulator herbicides, such as 2,4-D. Both amine and ester formulations of 2,4-D are labeled for preplanting burndown applications, but the ester formulation is usually preferred over the amine for mulation. Hager explains, "The low water solubility of an ester makes it less likely to be moved into the soil by precipitation, where it could injure germinating crop seeds." Also, esters are better able to penetrate the waxy surfaces of weed leaves, so they provide better control of large weeds, especially when air

temperatures are cool. Some 2,4-D ester formulations can be applied without a waiting period before planting corn, while a seven-day wait is recommended for others. "When applied prior to planting soybean, wait at least seven days between application of one pint per acre and planting, or 15 to 30 days between application of up to two pints per acre and planting," said Hager. "Pay careful attention to label statements of any 2,4-D formulation used prior to crop planting."

Some retail applicators might be experiencing difficulty acquiring sufficient quantities of 2,4-D to meet the need for burndown applications. "Substituting an amine formulation of 2,4-D for an ester formulation is possible," Hager said, "but remember, there are significant differences between these formulations." Specifically:

• Higher application rates

might be necessary because an amine formulation does not penetrate the weed's leaf cuticle as easily as an ester formulation does.

• Amine formulations are less volatile but more water soluble than ester formulations, meaning that they are more likely to move into the soil after precipitation, increasing the likelihood of crop injury.

• The interval between application of 2,4-D amine and soybean planting is longer (15 days for one pint or less, 30 days for greater than one pint) than the interval with ester formulations.

Dicamba is another


growth-regulator herbicide used to control existing vegetation before planting. Several commercially available products contain dicamba, but not all of them are labeled for application prior to crop (especially soybean) planting.

"In comparison with 2,4-D, dicamba provides greater control of chickweed, henbit and prickly lettuce, comparable control of dandelion, and less control of horseweed and mustard species," said Hager.

Application rates used in burndown applications can impact the interval between application and planting. For example, Clarity can be applied at up to 16 fluid ounces

per acre before planting corn (up to eight fluid ounces on coarse soils or medium- and fine-textured soils with less than 2.5 percent organic matter) with no interval between application and planting. However, the 16-ounce use rate requires a minimum accumulation of one inch of precipitation and a 28-day waiting interval between application and soybean planting. An eight-ounce application rate still requires a minimum accumulation of one inch of precipitation, but the waiting interval is only 14 days. These intervals must be observed prior to planting soybean or crop injury might occur.

Kansas farmers invest in planting estimated 4.7 million acres of corn

Kansas corn farmers are expected to plant 4.7 million acres of corn this year, the third largest planted corn acreage since 1936, according to the USDA Prospective Planting report released last week. The report estimates that planted acreage for Kansas corn at 4.7 million acres, down four percent from the 2011 acreage. Nationally, farmers are expected to plant 95.9 million acres, up four percent from 2011.

Kansas farmers continue to invest in planting crops to meet the needs of their customers. Most Kansas corn is fed to livestock, or used as a feedstock for ethanol production, where a third of the grain used returns as distillers grains, a high nutrient livestock feed, according to the Kansas Corn Commission.

"One thing people don't think about is the investment farmers make to put their crop in the ground and get it off to a good start. Even with the most conservative figures, Kansas corn farmers are spending well over a billion dollars just for seed, fertilizer and crop protection and that's just part of the picture," Kansas Corn Commission communications director Sue Schulte said.

Kansas is a diverse state for agriculture, and an irrigated producer in southwest Kansas will have higher planting costs than a dryland producer in northeast Kansas.

"K-State has some excellent tools to help growers calculate their cost-return for crops. Depending on location and growing practices, a farmer can spend somewhere between \$250 and \$395 per acre for seed, fertilizer and crop protection, we didn't even factor in other costs like land, equipment, fuel, labor and crop insurance. If every corn farmer in the state used only the more conservative figure of \$250 an acre to get his corn crop going, the investment statewide would be \$1.175 billion."

Farmers have a significant impact on the Kansas economy not only by what they produce, but also the money they invest to grow their crops.

"Most of the time, we simply look at how many bushels of grain are produced. But we should be more aware of economic activity that is created by agriculture in Kansas," Schulte said. "In addition to 4.7 million acres of corn being planted this spring, we will also see 2.5 million acres of sorghum and 3.9 million acres of soybeans being planted. Our Kansas growers will be putting seed into 11 million acres of land this spring. Those crops will then be sold to people who will convert the grain into meats, fuels and other products."

A strong increase in wheat acres offset some of the planted acreage for the spring planted crops. Kansas farmers planted 9.5 million acres of wheat, up 700,000 acres from last year, and eight percent increase.

Kansas growers are expected to plant 20.6 million acres to the four major crops (wheat, sorghum, corn, and soybeans), up 1.5 percent from 2011.

"Most of our farmers grow more than one crop, and we are hoping for good growing conditions for all our Kansas crops," Schulte said.

Producer general sign-up and reenrollment deadline extended for CRP

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) administrator Bruce Nelson has announced that the sign-up deadline for the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) has been extended to April 13, 2012. "Due to strong interest in CRP, the decision was made to extend CRP signup 43 for an additional week. I encourage all eligible farmers and ranchers to take advantage of this opportunity to participate in CRP," said Nelson. "Whether new enrollees or re-enrolling existing CRP contracts, producers who sign up for CRP help to conserve land and improve our soil, water, air and wildlife habitat resources."

After the CRP general sign-up ends on April 13, FSA will evaluate offers based on cost and the Environmental Benefits Index (EBI). The EBI takes into consideration variables such as wildlife habitat, water quality protection, soil erosion reduction, air quality protection and other enduring benefits. Accepted offers will become effective Oct. 1, 2012.

CRP is a voluntary program available to agricultural producers to help them use environmentally sensitive land for conservation benefits. Producers enrolled in CRP plant long-term, resource-conserving covers to improve the quality of water, control soil erosion and develop wildlife habitat. In return, USDA provides participants with rental payments and cost-share assistance. Contract duration is between 10 and 15 years. Producers with expiring contracts and producers with environmentally sensitive land are encouraged to evaluate their options under CRP. CRP has a 25-year legacy of successfully protecting the nation's natural resources through voluntary participation, while providing significant economic and environmental benefits to rural communities across the United States. Currently, about 30 million acres are enrolled in CRP.

Page 21 **USDA offers specialty crop block grant**

Since 2004, the U.S. Department of Agriculture has made available grants to state departments of agriculture solely to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops. The current funding for the program was established in the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (Farm Bill) which authorized the USDA to provide grants to states for each of the fiscal years 2008 through 2012 to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops.

Each state that submits an application that is reviewed and approved by the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is to receive at least an amount that is equal to the higher of \$100,000, or 1/3 of 1 percent of the total amount of funding made available for that fiscal year. In addition, AMS will allocate the remainder of the grant funds based on the value of specialty crop production in each state in relation to the national value of specialty crop production using the latest available cash receipt data.

Kansas received \$102,000 for fiscal year 2007 and 2008, and received \$104,504.80, for fiscal year 2009. Because a provision in the Food, Conservation and Energy Act of 2008 appropriated an additional \$10 million for the grant program, Kansas received an additional \$106,240, to help fund specialty crop programs in fiscal year 2009. For fiscal year 2010, Kansas received \$214,055.68. In state fiscal year 2011, Kansas received \$282,828; and in state fiscal year 2012, Kansas received \$273,616.54.

Later 2012, or state fiscal year 2013, Kansas expects to receive \$258,363.

Applications for grant funds should show how the project potentially impacts and produces measurable outcomes for the specialty crop industry and/or the public rather than a single organization. institution, or individual. Grant funds will not be awarded for projects that solely benefit a particular commercial product or provide a profit to a single organization, institution, or individual. Single organizations, institutions, and individuals are encouraged to participate as project partners.

Applicants must be a legal entity and have the legal capacity to contract. Applicants also are strongly encouraged to provide a cash match for their projects.

Specialty crops are defined as fruits and vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits and nursery crops, floriculture. including Some examples of enhancing the competitiveness of specialty crops are research, promotion, marketing, nutrition, food safety and security, plant health, education, "buy local" programs, addressing environmental concerns and developing cooperatives. K-State students help researchers study cardiac rehabilitation programs for producers

Recovering from a heart attack is never easy, but it can be especially difficult for those in physically demanding occupations, such as farming and ranching. For three days in March, about 30 K-State agronomy students participated in a study that may help make this process easier and safer.

The study was conducted by Jenny Adams from the Baylor Research Institute of Baylor Heart and Vascular Hospital and Shannon Jordan from Texas Woman's University Department of Kinesiology. They came to K-State March 12-14 to measure oxygen consumption, heart rates and other physical factors of student volunteers as they did some routine farm chores.

The purpose of the study was to gather data on the physical demands of specific tasks so that medical professionals can have better information to guide the recovery who are recovering from a cardiac problem event.

The question for both cardiac patients and their medical care providers is: What kind of strenuous activities around the farm are appropriate for producers recovering from a cardiac problem, and at what point in the recovery process are they appropriate?

"The main goal of this research is to publish recommended guidelines regarding heart rates and workloads reached while performing typical farming tasks. These guidelines will be used by professionals in cardiac rehabilitation," Adams said.

This information could help a producer appropriately train at higher intensities in cardiac rehab to find out if he or she can safely return to work.

In this study, which was conducted at K-State's Agronomy North Farm, students were asked to perform

• Shovel 100 pounds of seed/feed into a wheelbarrow

• Load 10 square bales of hay weighing 65 pounds each into the bed of a truck

• Load two 50-pound bags of seed into each of eight hopper boxes

• Dig holes with a post hole digger for three minutes

While performing these tasks, the students were asked to wear a portable oxygen consumption mask strapped to their bodies. This allowed the research team to discover the physiological difficulty of standard farming work tasks. The heart rate of the students was also measured as they performed the tasks.

Students involved in the study were not compensated. Their hope is that the information collected will benefit future farmers who have heart-related illness return to work and be physically able to perform the tasks required of a farmer, Adams said.







In recent letters to food marketers, the National Corn Growers Association called on them to stop marketing products as not containing high fructose corn syrup, implying there is something especially unhealthy or unnatural about corn sugar.

"Such innuendos are not scientifically supportable and they are offensive to the hundreds of thousands of U.S. consumers that grow corn as well as the many others in rural communities," NCGA CEO Rick Tolman wrote in letters to the chief marketing officers at Welch Foods and Dean Foods, producers respectively of Welch's Natural Spreads and TruMoo Chocolate Milk, just two examples of anti-HFCS marketing. "Your focus on health and nutrition are commendable and supportable. Those points can all be well made without the reference to HFCS."

While the March 21 letters did lead to a dialog with Dean Foods, their response to-date has been unsatisfactory, Tolman noted in a follow-up letter.

"As you pointed out, you are a significant user of HFCS in other products and are familiar with the science supporting the manufacturing, safety, and functional properties of HFCS. Therefore, you know there is no scientific basis for the preference you see from consumers. It is a misperception. A big part of that problem is that the type of advertising you are doing with respect to HFCS perpetuates this misperception. That is our concern. You are using a misperception to differentiate your product and therefore helping to

perpetuate that misperception."

Tolman also points out these facts about HFCS: The American Medical Association stated in June 2008 that high fructose corn syrup does not appear to contribute to obesity more than other caloric sweeteners, and the American Dietetic Association concluded in December 2008 that "No persuasive evidence supports the claim that high fructose corn syrup is a unique contributor to obesity." Further, the ADA also noted, "High fructose corn syrup... is nutritionally equivalent to sucrose. Both sweeteners contain the same

number of calories (4 per gram) and consist of about equal parts of fructose and glucose. Once absorbed into the blood stream, the two sweeteners are indistinguishable." High fructose corn syrup is made from corn, a natural grain product. High fructose corn syrup contains no artificial or synthetic ingredients or color additives and meets the FDA requirements for use of the term "natural." When it comes to marketing products as HFCS-free, some popular food writers also consider it problematic.

The journalist Michael Pollan, an opponent of mod-

ern agriculture, recognizes a scam when he sees one. In his book Food Rules, he writes: "Don't fall for the food industry's latest scam: products reformulated to contain 'no HFCS' or 'real cane sugar.' These claims imply these foods are somehow healthier, but they're not. Sugar is sugar."

Food retailers themselves express frustration over rampant misinformation about food safety and nutrition, Tolman said. Companies like Dean Foods are very strong when it comes to fighting myths about milk and other dairy products, for example. It's time for them to put their advertising where their mouth is.

"Instead of exploiting myths about corn sugar, they should join us in exploding the myths by exploring the facts," Tolman said. "We urge our growers and others to take action and help inform companies like Dean about the truth behind natural corn products like HFCS."



These permanent law provisions would authorize the imposition of marketing quotas, acreage allotments, marketing certificates and parity price support programs for wheat. Since the 2008 farm

bill only covers through the 2012 crop, the ag secretary is required by the 1938 Act to announce whether or not a marketing quota will be in effect for the 2013 wheat crop prior to April 15, 2012. The 1938 Act would require a marketing quota for the

2013 wheat crop if the total supply of the crop would likely be excessive without the quota, and would require the secretary to decide not later than April 15, 2012, whether a quota is needed. Based on projected supply and demand, no quota is required.

Sorghum Foundation seeking scholarship applicants

The National Sorghum Foundation was established in an effort to aid and promote higher education in agriculture, and more specifically, to promote the study of sorghum and its impact on agriculture. Producers, researchers and private industry collectively funded the Foundation endowment to enhance the awareness of sorghum as the fifth most important cereal crop in the world today.

The foundation now offers two scholarships. The Darrell Rosenow Memorial Scholarship is given in honor of Dr. Darrell Rosenow, a pioneer in hybrid sorghum breeding. The winner of this scholarship will receive \$1,000 to be applied toward one semester of education expenses. The other scholarship goes to the Sorghum Challenge award winner who will receive \$1,000 to be applied toward one semester of tuition expenses as well as a trip to Washington, D.C. with the National Sorghum Producers. Both scholarship applications are due May, 31, 2012. Students are asked to submit a completed copy of the application, signed by applicant's department head, an official copy of current transcripts and at least two letters of recommendation.
