

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Wednesday is the September supply and demand report. Expectations are for friendly numbers due to declining production estimates. The average trade guess calls for corn production to come in at 10.403 billion, down 376 million from last month while end stocks are expected to fall 32 million to 618 million. Those two numbers tell us that traders expect, on average. for demand to be reduced by 344 million. Most likely we will see cuts in feed usage, exports, and ethanol demand. Right now the easiest of those to believe is exports since they have been poor most of the time. Ethanol production has been better and will have to slow in order to meet USDA's current estimate. Feed usage is probably the biggest dilemma, because we know it will have to be reduced, but we don't know what the animals are going to eat instead of corn or what the impact will be on meat production. It is interesting to note that the average trade guess for wheat ending stocks is 709 million, up 11 million from last month, which means that most analysts don't expect to see wheat feed usage increased. I really don't understand how we can't feed more wheat, but apparently USDA disagrees.

For the soybeans expectations are for production to

be cut 54 million to 2.638 billion and ending stocks to be cut to 9 million to 106 million. Old crop ending stocks are also expected to be cut, so there will have to be about 50 million bushels of demand cut and that basically has to come from either exports or crush. It will be hard to take demand from either one of those categories. Export and crush demand are still very strong and it will probably take much higher prices to slow that demand another 50 million bushels. The Chinese appetite for soybeans is relentless, so I suppose the world should hope that the S. American crop is very large so that the demand is met. For that matter we will probably be importing more sovbeans or sovbean meal than normal from S. Ameri-

On the charts it is just the same old story for the corn and wheat. The December corn just can't move very far from \$8.00 for very long. Indicators are oversold, but there isn't enough consistent strength to generate a buy signal and we seem to uncover some demand or buying interest when the market gets below \$7.90. Eventually the market will move one way or the other, but for the moment directionless trade is what we have. It will probably take some fresh information like much better demand, or

larger than expected production in the report to make the market move.

December KW at least acted like a bull market on Thursday and Friday. Friday's close wasn't the greatest, but it was the best in the past couple of weeks, which is encouraging. The market is trying to work its way out the top of a bull flag that would suggest a move up to the \$11.50 area and on the weekly chart we had an outside week higher. In the meantime the market is still range bound, but with the consistent bullish news out of Russia due to their poor crop, the prospects for better U.S. wheat demand, and the poor planting conditions in much of the HRW belt, the wheat seems to have very good upside potential.

The soybean chart is a little different than the corn and wheat. Last Tuesday the beans made new all-time highs, then spent the rest of the week moving lower. The November contract closed below the nine-day moving average for the first time in about four weeks, but the market is still clearly in an uptrend. \$18.00 is inevitable since we can't seem to slow demand enough to make a difference and weakness will only attract more demand. There are numerous option strategies that can take advantage for further strength and it is still wise

to replace any cash sales you make this fall.

There was no cash cattle trade to speak of as of early Friday afternoon and the futures were pretty quiet all week. The October live cattle did make the best close since mid-August on Friday, but that was only about 40 cents above last week, so it wasn't all that impressive. Meanwhile the little bit of strength that we did see has put the indicators into overbought territory, so we may end up seeing yet another test of the 40 and 50-day moving average support before we see another big move higher. A dollar break in the live cattle would be a buying opportunity.

CRP emergency grazing extended to Nov. 30 in Kansas

Adrian J. Polansky, State Executive Director of USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Kansas announced recently that emergency grazing of Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acreage has been authorized to extend to November 30, 2012 from the original September 30th final date.

On August 29th, USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack announced that "(in order) to assist producers, USDA is permitting farmers and ranchers in drought stricken states that have been approved for emergency grazing to extend grazing on CRP land through November 30, 2012, without incurring an additional CRP rental payment reduction."

"Because of the severe and ongoing drought conditions, emergency grazing in approved Kansas counties is allowed through November 30, 2012" stated Polansky. The emergency grazing extension applies to eligible practices except for continuous practices. Polansky added, "The Kansas FSA State Committee completed the emergency grazing authorizations in all Kansas counties on July 20th as a result of the D2 Severe Drought designations." As of August 28, 2012, a good portion of Kansas has elevated to D3 and D4 on the U.S. Drought Monitor. Drought monitor conditions can be found at www. droughtmonitor.unl.edu.

Participants shall leave at least 25 percent of each field or contiguous CRP fields ungrazed for wildlife, or graze not more than 75 percent of the stocking rate as set by the Natural Resource Conservation Service. All livestock must be removed by the end of this grazing period. Producers without livestock may rent or lease the grazing privi-

The Secretary of Agriculture announced on July 11, 2012, the payment reduction cost for Emergency haying and grazing was reduced from 25 percent of the rental payment per acre to 10 percent for the 2012

CRP participants shall contact their local FSA county office, if they have not already done so, to request emergency grazing on an individual contract basis prior to grazing. Participants shall work with the Natural Resources Conservation Service to develop a forage management plan. If the CRP cover is destroyed, the practice must be re-established at the participants own expense to remain in compliance with the CRP con-

Participants accept a 10 percent reduction in the annual rental payment for the acres actually hayed or grazed in 2012. CRP haying and grazing policies will be posted online at www.fsa .usda.gov/ks

New wheat seed solutions coming from Syngenta/AgriPro

New wheat varieties with new diseases and agronomic packages for Kansas wheat farmers are coming from Syngenta within the next two years.

Available this fall is SY Wolf, which has been a top-performing variety in several university and private yield trials. Adapted for farmers in the I-70 corridor and north throughout Kansas, SY Wolf features excellent resistance to the 2010 and 2012 strains of stripe rust; moderate resistance to leaf rust, tan spot and Septoria leaf blotch and has good drought tolerance and test weight. It also has excellent resistance to bacterial leaf blight, a disease that cannot be controlled with fungicide. SY Wolf has also been a top yielder in irrigated trials with good straw strength.

Jon Rich, wheat breeder in the Central Plains for Syngenta, says SY Wolf is a great fit for no-till farmers planting wheat into wheat stubble, or due to its excellent tillering ability, wheat into soybeans following fall harvest. It is a medium maturity, medium height variety.

"The yields of SY Wolf compare favorably to Armour and Everest, and it really shines when it has a seed treatment applied to it. In South Dakota, we've seen a seven to eight bushel per acre improvement in yields when a seed treatment is applied," Rich said.

SY Wolf is available to farmers this fall.

SY Wolf will be joined next fall by SY Southwind, which will be on increase by AgriPro associates this fall. SY Southwind features excellent resistance to leaf and stripe rust, Hessian fly resistance and tolerance to Barley Yellow Dwarf Virus. SY Southwind has good straw strength and possesses very good milling and baking properties, Rich says. It is a medium-short,

early-maturing variety that grows well in low pH soils.

The launch of SY Wolf this fall and SY Southwind next fall represents continued growth of Syngenta and further development of a "systems approach" to growing wheat, says Matt Keating, cereals key account lead for Syngenta.

Syngenta's crop protection portfolio includes seed treatments and fungicides, which can improve yield potential in lessthan-ideal growing conditions. In fact, Syngenta is studying the effects of crop protection products like seed treatment fungicides and insecticides on specific wheat seed vari-

For instance, in no-till or reduced tillage environments, crop residue provides a good habitat for wireworms. "On average, we could lose 5% of the wheat stand to wireworms. A seed-applied insecticide can dramatically reduce that problem," Keating savs. "Seed treatments are not a silver bullet, but they can provide insect and disease control until the crop hits dormancy.'

Rich, who works in Syngenta's Junction City wheat breeding program, says wheat farmers are keen to improving management skills.

"They are understanding fertility needs and that planting certified seed can improve yield. Now, we're starting to look more at the benefits of seed treatments and chemistry solutions that can fix problems that routinely plague wheat production.

Our job at Syngenta is to provide the best package to not only create higher yields, but create yield stability year after year," Rich says.

The company's hybrid wheat program is showing great potential in doing just that. Expanded hybrid trials will be planted this fall, and commercial wheat hybrids could be available in seven or eight years. It all adds up to a bright future for wheat producers, Rich says.

"Syngenta is in a great position of being able to provide not only top-quality wheat genetics, but the whole package of products that can help producers be more profitable."



Governor Brownback meets with southeast Kansas farmers on agricultural tour

Kansas Gov. Sam Brownback, joined by Kansas Secretary of Agriculture Dale Rodman and Kansas Farm Bureau President Steve Baccus, heard from than 50 Kansas Farm Bureau members and local farmers, ranchers and agribusiness leaders in southeast Kansas about challenges they are facing and about opportunities they have to expand and grow the industry during the 2012 Kansas Farm Bureau Governor's Tour.

"From a three-generation family farm looking to innovate and diversify to an agribusiness working to improve genetics for our cattle herd, there is great potential for agriculture in southeast Kansas to expand, generate economic growth and create jobs for Kansans."

The first stop of the day was at the third-generation farm of Don and Linda Sale, which sits just outside of Cherryvale. The Sale family grows wheat and soybeans and raises cattle. They also run a soybean dealership, providing a critical service for area farmers. The youngest generation of the Sale family recently launched a ven-

ture selling custom hunting trips on the family's land and will host their first hunters this fall.

Next, the group stopped at SEK Genetics in Galesburg. Jim Bates with Genetic Horizons told a crowd of approximately 50 people that Genetic Horizons, which is the top independent semen dealer in the nation, is focused on enhancing animal agriculture through improved genetics and producing a premium product. Specifically, Bates said they are working to

improve the U.S. cattle industry through improved genetics. During the tour, Bates demonstrated an ultrasound on a beef cow.

"Agriculture is the state's largest industry. Our farmers and ranchers are recognized as leaders nationwide and Governor Brownback and I are fully committed to doing what we can to help them succeed, expand and innovate," Secretary Rodman said. "The future of agriculture in southeast Kansas and our entire state

Out-of-state hay may harbor red imported fire ants

If you buy hay from some parts of the southern U.S., you might get stung not just once but many times — by red imported fire ants.

An Ozark County, Missouri farmer recently learned that lesson the hard way while unloading hay he'd bought from a farmer in Florida. Unlike most ants, which usually flee when disturbed, these bugs went on the attack.

Drought has left many cattle producers short on feed and forage, prompting some to buy hay from out of state, including from sellers in Florida and other southern states that are home to burgeoning populations of red imported fire ants.

An aggressive, stinging insect native to South America, the red imported fire ant (RIFA) is a significant pest throughout much of the southern U.S., infesting several hundred million acres in more than a dozen states, according to the USDA's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS).

The ants can spread to new locations as stowaways in bales of hay, nursery stock and other products that contain or have been in contact with soil, said Richard Houseman, University of Missouri Extension state entomologist.

Under USDA regulations, hay in areas with established RIFA populations must be inspected and certified before being shipped out of a quarantine zone.

But many hay buyers are unaware of the risk and do not realize that a seller may have skirted federal regulations, said Stacy Hambelton, MU Extension agriculture business specialist in Ozark County.

"I don't think this is an isolated case," he said. "There are literally hundreds of truckloads coming in with the possibility of fire ants."

"Farmers should con-

sider purchasing hay from threat. They can damage northern parts of the country where fire ants don't exist," Houseman said. If that's not possible, then make sure the hay has the required certificate from APHIS indicating that it has been inspected. As a further precaution, inspect the hay yourself upon arrival.

"People should treat all hay as if it's at risk and take the highest possible precautions," he said. "This is a real risk and they need to be vigilant about inspecting that hay."

An established colony will eventually produce winged ants called alates, some of which may start new colonies up to a quarter-mile away. Once red imported fire ants start producing daughter colonies, they can be very difficult to eradicate.

While painful, attacks by red imported fire ants are rarely fatal to people or livestock, but the ants still pose a serious economic and ecological soybeans and other crops, and their mounds may disrupt farm operations and damage equipment. Red imported fire ants disrupt natural ecosystems by displacing beneficial native insects and killing small mammals, reptiles and ground-nesting Houseman said

"They have a major impact in residential areas," he added. "They produce unsightly mounds, enter residential structures and deliver a potent sting when they are threatened or disturbed." Worker ants out forag-

ing for food will typically respond to threats by attacking en masse, latching on to victims with their mandi-bles, then maneuvering their abdomens into place to deliver repeated jabs with their venom-filled stingers. Their unusual alkaloid venom produces an acute burning sensation—hence the name "fire ant"-followed by the formation of tules that may take days to disappear.

Underground colonies can undermine sidewalks, roads and bridges, inflicting extensive and costly damage, Houseman said.

The ants also have a mysterious attraction to electrical equipment, he said. They will nest in circuit breakers, air conditioners and similar items. They have shorted out traffic signals and disrupted power in buildings. According to a study at Texas Tech University, fire ant damage to electrical and communications equipment in that state totals hundreds of millions of dollars annually.

Houseman urges those who suspect the presence of red imported fire ants to contact their local Extension center and the state Department of Agriculture.

You can find out if a particular location is under quarantine through







EQIP Funds available for woodland improvements

Kansas landowners wishing to implement conservation practices by improving tree stands may be eligible for federal funding assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program.

The program provides funds to help landowners manage woodlands, renovate windbreaks, protect against stream bank erosion or implement other conservation practices on their land, said Bob Atchison, rural forestry program coordinator with the Kansas Forest Service.

"Landowners who are interested should start the application process early by contacting their local forester," Atchison said.

A forester then visits the landowner's property to identify natural resource concerns, such as gaps or dead trees in windbreaks and shelterbelts. If the property has sufficient resource concerns making it eligible for EQIP funds, the forester creates a conservation plan and submits it to the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS). which ranks applications based on priority. Atchison said most Kansas applicants receive EQIP funding.

Common resource concerns foresters are watching for include a shortage of trees next to stream banks. leading to bank erosion that contributes to the sedimentation of federal water reservoirs. "We want trees planted along the banks to help hold the dirt in place," Atchison said.

Foresters also examine the species present in wood-

land areas. Most woodlands in Kansas are not managed. leading to an abundance of trees like honey locust and Osage orange, which are less beneficial than trees such as black walnut or bur oak.

While the official deadline for applying for EQIP is Nov. 16, Atchison encouraged landowners to apply early and begin talking with their foresters about conservation practices now. Forester contact information is available online at www.kansasforests.org or by calling the Kansas Forest Service state office at 785-532-3310.



Winter Feeding Strategies meeting planned for September 25

The Frontier Extension District will host a public meeting to discuss cattle feeding options and pasture recovery September 25, beginning at 7:00 p.m. at the Overbrook Livestock Commission Company in Overbrook. Speakers for the evenings program will be KSU Extension beef specialist Dale Blasi and KSU Extension agronomist Doug Shoup. The program is open to all.

This summer's drought reduced forage in pastures and hay meadows, leaving us to question "What can we do to get our cow herd through the winter?" Many native grass pastures and hay meadows only produced one-third of a normal years production. Some brome hay fields produced nearly a normal crop, while others were down from a year ago. This

year's drought effects, in combination with all the hay that was sold from this area a year ago, has left many producers short on forage.

At the meeting Dr. Blasi will discuss limit feeding forages to cows; feeding stalks or soybean hay to meet the cows needs; how feeding rumensin can increase the energy value of a forage diet, thus reducing hay needs; and what can be done to reduce hay feeding losses. Dr. Shoup will explain time needed for pasture recovery; stocking rates following a drought season; stock pil-

ing fescue; and seeding fall cereal crops for forage. Both presenters will be available for a Q and A session.


