# Aflatoxin — a guide for beef producers

This year's drought has brought numerous challenges to cattlemen. Shortages of grass and water forced cow culling and sent many calves to the sale barn earlier than planned. The most recent challenge cattlemen are facing is high feed costs combined with the possibility of aflatoxin in the corn crop.

"It is a common misconception that the olive-green mold known as aspergillus automatically results in aflatoxin," said University of Illinois Extension beef educator Travis Meteer. "This is not the case. If you find mold present on your corn, it needs to be tested for aflatoxin."

Meteer cautioned that aflatoxin can also be found in Dry Distillers Grains with Solubles (DDGS) produced from infected corn. "Aflatoxin is concentrated in the fermentation process and thus the levels in DDGS can be dangerous," he said. "Testing corn and corn co-products for aflatoxin is recommended."

Livestock are usually the market for mycotoxin-infected commodities, he added. "Livestock can tolerate some level of mycotoxin, but levels above legal limits can cause problems in livestock. Reduced performance, immunosuppression, liver damage, and in extreme cases even death can be the result of feeding high levels of aflatoxin," Meteer said.

The chart below illustrates the approved levels in livestock.

Livestock, especially finishing cattle, will be the end user of much of the aflatoxin-infected corn, Meteer said. "Caution and management are crucial to ensure that negative results do not occur from feeding this toxin-bearing feed."

Meteer recommends that the storage of corn that has aspergillus present needs to be dried down to less than 14 percent moisture to limit mold growth. Also, cool the grain down after drying and use aeration to control temperature. Mold inhibitors may also be applied to corn to reduce mold growth.

Test and monitor aflatoxin levels of corn to be fed to livestock. Blending aflatoxin-bearing corn with clean corn at the time of feeding can be a good practice to reduce aflatoxin levels in the diet.

Dilution is the solution. Blending should only occur directly before feeding. Blended corn is not legal for resale. Blending corn before feeding could result in contamination of clean corn.

Toxin-binding agents can also be incorporated into a ration.

"Many studies have shown that phyllosilicate

feed additives bind toxins (clays, sodium bentonite, aluminosilicate)," Meteer said. "These products can bind toxins and ensure they are not absorbed by the animal. Many feed mills will include them in feeds if they are using corn with traces of aflatoxin. It would be a good idea to use toxin binders in a ration that includes corn that has high levels of aflatoxin," he said.

Grazing cornstalks where aflatoxin was found in corn should be of a lesser concern than feeding the corn. However, cornfields that have down corn or lots of ear drop coupled with aflatoxin being present may have potential to be dangerous to cattle. The less corn left in the field the better in this situation, Meteer said. Also, baling cornstalks from fields that have aflatoxin is discouraged.

Meteer said that corn silage or huskage that contains aflatoxin can also be a concern. However, if properly ensiled, the environment should not be conducive to mold growth. In the case of corn huskage, a byproduct of the seed corn industry, if it is not ensiled properly, mold growth may occur and aflatoxin could

be a concern.

"Producers should dry corn below 14 percent moisture to reduce mold growth, be prepared to blend aflatoxin corn with

clean corn directly before feeding, and consider toxin binders as a feed additive," Meteer said. "Identification of molds, testing for aflatoxin, and proper man-

agement and storage considerations will be vital to ensure livestock performance is maintained and legal limits are not exceeded."

## USDA announces Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments sign-up period for 2011 crop losses

Farm Service Agency administrator Juan Garcia has announced the sign-up period for the 2011 crop year Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments (SURE) program will open Oct. 22, 2012. The SURE program is part of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (Farm Bill). Under the 2008 Farm Bill, SURE authorizes assistance to farmers and ranchers who suffered crop losses caused by natural disasters occurring through Sept. 30, 2011.

"Any eligible producer who suffered losses during the 2011 crop year is encouraged to visit a local FSA office to learn more about the SURE program and how to apply," said Garcia. As of Sept. 30, 2011, the Department's authority to operate the SURE program expired along with four other, important disaster assistance programs: the Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP); the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-Raised Fish (ELAP); the Livestock Forage Disaster Program (LFP); and the Tree Assistance Program (TAP). Production losses due to disasters occurring after Sept. 30, 2011, are not eligible for disaster program coverage. To be eligible for SURE, a farm or ranch must have:

At least a 10-percent production loss on a crop of economic significance; a policy or plan of insurance under the Federal Crop Insurance Act or the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) for all economically significant crops; been physically located in a county that was declared a primary disaster county or contiguous county by the Secretary of Agriculture under a Secretarial Disaster Designation. Without a Secretarial Disaster Designation, individual producers may be eligible if the actual production on the farm is less than 50 percent of the normal production on the farm due to a natural disaster. A "farm" for SURE purposes means the entirety of all crop acreage in all counties that a producer planted or intended to be planted for harvest for normal commercial sale or on-farm livestock feeding, including native and improved grassland intended for haying. Producers considered socially disadvantaged, a beginning farmer or rancher, or a limited resource farmer may be eligible for SURE without a policy or plan of insurance or NAP coverage.

Farmers and ranchers interested in signing up must do so before the June 7, 2013 deadline.

## FSA announces drought assistance available for livestock producers

Adrian J. Polansky, State Executive Director of USDA's Farm Service Agency in Kansas has announced that drought assistance is available for livestock producers affected by drought in all Kansas Counties except Republic. Eligibility to request to implement ECP is based on the County Committee providing evidence that the County is designated as level D3, Drought Extreme according to the U.S. Drought Monitor or providing evidence of a 40 percent or greater loss of normal precipitation for the 4 most recent months.

Producers may request assistance in approved Counties by filing an application for cost-share assistance under the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) from October 15 through November 15, 2012 at their local Farm Service Agency (FSA). ECP is being implemented to assist in providing access to water because of extended period of severe drought. The damage must be of such magnitude that it would be too costly for the producer to rehabili-

tate without Federal assistance.

Participants can receive cost-share assistance of up to 75 percent of the cost for temporary measures and 50% of the cost for permanent measures for approved emergency conservation practices. Practices approved are EC6, Drought Measures (example: constructing and deepening wells, installing pipe to another source of water because primary source is inadequate) and EC7, Hauling Water for Livestock (example: hauling water, tanks and troughs).

ECP has been approved for implementation by the National office without an ECP fund allocation therefore FSA will be accepting applications for which funds are not currently available. ECP funding is limited and should funds become available, the National office will give priority to permanent measures.

The champion Duroc title went to an entry exhibited by Taylor Fischer from Wright. Austin Shideler, Fontana, owned the reserve champion Duroc. Brody Nemecek of Iola exhibited the champion Hampshire. Reserve honors went to an entry shown by Morgan Laird, Mayetta. In the Yorkshire division, Tristan Davis of Princeton owned the champion. Caitlin Dreher from Iola showed the Yorkshire barrow taking re-

serve. Andrew Hodges from Lebo showed the champion dark AOB hog, while the reserve was exhibited by Campbell Martin, Bucklin. 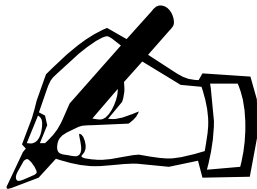

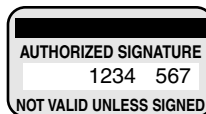

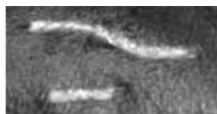

# River Valley Extension announces results to wheat straw ammoniation experiment

The long anticipated results are in. For those of you that were unable to attend the River Valley District Straw Ammoniation Field Day, I will give you a little background.

With the dry conditions across most of the Midwest, forage has become scarce and high priced. Treating wheat straw with anhydrous ammonia is an option to turn poor quality forage into a more palatable, nutritious product for cattle. Specifically, it increases the protein and energy available to the cattle, in turn increasing intake and digestibility. This was a very popular process back in the 1970s and 1980s, but since then the price of plastic and anhydrous ammonia made it cost-prohibitive. This year we hit a threshold of where straw can be purchased and ammoniated, and still be a cheaper forage than buying prairie hay in most cases.

The K-State Livestock Program Focus Team saw a need for updating the research on this process since virtually nothing had been done since the 1980's. Rather than making this a

small study on a university farm, the team decided to have producers around the state participate in the research and open the sites up to the public so that all could benefit from the process. Six different sites across Kansas performed demonstrations on how to cover and apply anhydrous ammonia while partaking in the research.

The largest part of the research trial was to experiment with anhydrous ammonia application rates. Two separate stacks of straw were treated; one at the traditional 3% anhydrous ammonia rate, and one at a reduced 1.5% rate. A manifold was also attached to the anhydrous tank which split into three hoses that were threaded over the bottom row of bales, spaced out along the entire stack. The rationale for this was to lose less anhydrous ammonia to the ground and make a slower and more uniform release. Black 6mm plastic was used to cover 70 straw bales per stack and left for two weeks before sampling.

The straw used in the Morganville demonstration started at 88.9% dry matter (11.1% moisture) with a dry matter crude protein content

of 3.16% and TDN of 37.71%.

After anhydrous ammonia treatment, both samples were reduced to near 7.6% moisture. Crude protein for the 1.5% application rate increased to 8.72%, while the 3% application rate increased to 12.56%. Crude protein values after ammoniation cannot be directly interpreted as available protein to livestock. The rule of thumb is that half of the increase will be available protein. So with smaller application rate, crude protein increased 2.78%; adding that to the initial 3.16% gives us forage of approximately 5.94% available protein. Similarly, the higher ammoniation application rate gives us 7.86% available protein. As cows enter the third trimester this winter, supplementation will still be needed, but either level of ammoniated straw still gives a much better quality forage than it was initially.

Energy content in the samples should have also increased 8-15% according to 1980s research. Our samples do not initially show this change, however we are

not sure the laboratory has accurately captured TDN in our ammoniated samples. All three samples (Initial, 1.5% Ammonia application, and 3% Ammonia application) will be sent for "In Vitro True Matter Digestibility" which more extensively captures forage value by studying how digestive enzymes break down the forage. The Morganville demonstration site results will also be compiled with 5fiveother demonstration sites around the state to standardize findings. Please watch for this research paper on the 100th anniversary of Cattlemen's Day coming up in March 2013.

As for now, if you are still waiting to treat your straw with anhydrous ammonia, my advice would be to lean towards the 3% application rate until more data comes in from this research. Also, keep in mind the lower the temperatures get, the longer this process takes, so don't wait too long! # Kansas Corn represented in trade group to South Korea and China

Upon his return from a recent trade mission to South Korea and China, Kansas Corn Commissioner Brian Baalman said the abundance of food is the number one concern among the governments of these two countries.

Baalman was among a select delegation of farmers, ranchers and agribusiness leaders who toured the countries earlier this month, meeting with business and governmental leaders and existing buyers of Kansas agricultural products in addition to touring import and processing facilities.

Last year, Kansas agricultural exports to South Korea totaled \$125.2 million and exports to China totaled \$49.7 million.

The delegation began the mission in Seoul, South Korea to explore ways for Kansas farmers and ranchers to benefit from the U.S.-South Korea Free Trade Agreement (KORUS), which could increase trade between the two countries. Korea is the fifth largest market for food in the world and the United States has become Korea's largest trading partner. In 2011, Korea imported \$26 billion in goods from the U.S. and by 2016,

Korea is expected to import \$90.6 billion worth of U.S. goods.

The delegation spent the bulk of its mission in Beijing and Shanghai, China to learn more about the Chinese marketplace and build a greater understanding of China's food needs for its growing middle class. With only 12 percent of its land designated as arable, China strives to be self-sufficient in corn, wheat and rice production. The country's water

resources are limited and the number of farmers is declining but China is protective of its food supply with quotas for importing corn, wheat, rice and sugar.

Baalman said the affluent Chinese consumer is also craving beef, a high-quality food which the nation can not produce enough of to meet demand. He also learned China had a wetter than normal growing season.

"In China, one of the

things that struck me is that they are sitting on a heck of a corn crop," Baalman said. "One farmer told me, 'We got your rain.'"

Though the country may have enough moisture, what it lacks is land to grow the popular crop. Baalman said much of the corn in China is grown on very small family plots.

"We saw corn being harvested by hand," he said. "They took the whole stalk and stripped the ear off. There were piles of corn

drying on porches, in yards and beside fields. If there was a yard, or the back of the house, or a little space between the house and road, they would plant a couple rows of corn. They used every inch they could find to plant corn."

On the trade mission, Baalman was among 18 members of the Kansas Beef Council, Kansas Pork Commission, Kansas Wheat Commission, Kansas Soybean Commission, Kansas Farm Bureau,

Agtech, Inc. and SureFire Ag. The trip was organized and conducted by the Kansas Department of Agriculture.

Baalman, Menlo, represents the northwest district of the KCC. He and his wife, Sheri, manage a diversified farm with corn and other crops as well as livestock. Baalman is a past president of the Kansas Corn Growers Association and represents the Kansas Corn Commission to the U.S. Meat Export Federation.

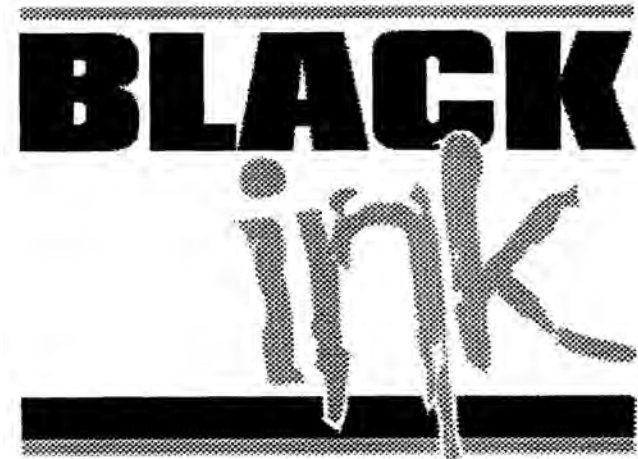

We've come so far

In this day and age, would you buy a sedan that only got 13 miles per gallon?

Seems a little absurd now, but that was average in the 1970s. It really shows how far the auto industry has come in improving fuel economy.

That same decade, a farmer would be pleased with a corn crop that binned 80 or 90 bushels per acre. Today, that's a disaster in most places.

But if you think those gains are impressive, take a moment to think of what you, America's beef producers, have accomplished.

Cattlemen used to brag about their cattle reaching "more than 60% Choice." In the last couple of years, USDA harvest reports show the national average was hovering near

65% Choice or better.

Nobody brags about just being average, especially not if they sell on a grid. In the upper Midwest, you're held to a fairly high standard if you want to beat plant averages and find yourself in the premiums.

Hitting 60% Choice won't cut it.

When premium Choice branded programs emerged, it was really something to get 15% or 20% that reached those marbling levels in commercial cattle. That's when it was incidental production, or luck of the draw that landed those cattle in branded programs.

Today, some cattlemen have made these upper-end markets their goal. They've built business plans that count on it. Some scoff at a number like 50%, thinking if 100% fit a premium program,

just imagine the financial reward.

Beyond that, there's a tier of producers who look to the highest level.

Take Missouri cattleman John Osborn, who routinely sends in loads that reach more than 50% Prime, and he's still looking to improve. The industry average is 3%.

What was once thought of as a happy accident, one or two in a pen, is now a logical target with premiums of \$200 or more per head.

As students return to class each fall, many are assessed on what they remember from last year or on what they already know. It's an evaluation to find their benchmark level going into the school year.

The beef industry has a similar measure that you've surely heard about this summer: The National Beef Quality Audit. The Checkoff-funded report tells us how far we've come and how far we have to go on consumer acceptance and meeting beef demand.

Done every five years since 1991, the 2011 results tell us we need more quality. Consumers called for 5% Prime and 30% premium Choice. Actual production levels for all beef in those categories during 2011 were 2% and 20%, 14 points short of expectations.

To some, that's inspiring. It's an objective to reach toward. To others, it's a little bit depressing. We've been working for 20 years and we still aren't quite where we want to be?

But the hard data tells the positive story: The 1996 audit revealed the lowest carcass quality of all reports at 49% Choice and Prime, but it's been an upward trend since then. Making stops at 51% in 2001 and 55% in 2006, before settling at 61% in 2011.

That's some improvement, and unlike the auto business, no government mandate said you had to make it. The consumers asked for it and you responded.

That's an accomplishment worth basking in, and celebrating – with a T-bone, perhaps?

Winter wheat planting on pace with season average

AP – Kansas farmers have planted about 17 percent of next year's winter wheat crop while bringing in this year's corn crop far faster than normal.

Kansas Agricultural Statistics Service said in its weekly update September 24 that wheat seeding is on pace with both last year and the average for this point in the season. About 2 percent of the wheat has already emerged.

Meanwhile, the corn harvest reached the 64 percent mark as of Sunday prior to the report, about three weeks ahead of the five-year average. Just 5 percent of the corn still needs to mature in the field.

A lack of rain over the past week slowed the progress of other crops. The Kansas agency says about 67 percent of both the soybean and sorghum crops are in poor to very poor condition.

# NRCS Conservation Innovation Grant applications due October 15

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) state conservationist Eric B. Banks, reminds private individuals, tribes, local and state governments and non-governmental organizations that applications for Conservation Innovation Grants (CIG) are due October 15, 2012. Apply electronically at [www.grants.gov/](http://www.grants.gov/) or contact the NRCS National CIG office at (703) 235-8065.

Banks said that up to \$5 million in grants are available to evaluate and demonstrate agricultural

practices that help farmers and ranchers adapt to drought. NRCS is taking applications for CIGs to help producers build resiliency into their production systems so they can adapt to climatic extremes, such as the historic drought impacting the nation.

NRCS is offering the grants to partnering entities to evaluate innovative, field-based conservation technologies and approaches. These technologies and/or approaches should lead to improvements such as enhancing the water-holding capacity

in soils and installing drought-tolerant grazing systems, which will help farms and ranches become more resilient to drought.

"Severe drought conditions across the U.S. have greatly impacted the livelihood of our farmers and ranchers," said NRCS chief Dave White. "Conservation Innovation Grants allow us to generate and deploy as soon as possible cutting-edge ideas that help farmers and ranchers run sustainable and profitable operations."

Funds will be awarded through a competitive grants process for projects lasting for one to three years.

NRCS is especially interested in projects that demonstrate:

- Cropping or grazing systems that increase resiliency to drought through improved soil health
- Increases in available soil water-holding capacity by enhancing organic matter with reduced tillage, cover crops, and organic amendments
- Improvements in water use efficiency for agricultural production
- Coordination with NRCS Plant Material Centers in using drought-resistant plants and practices
- Recommendations for appropriate nutrient management follow-

ing an extended drought

- Analysis on a regional basis of how agricultural production and conservation systems fared during drought conditions
- Agricultural approaches that flourished in low-precipitation areas
- Traditional/historical production practices that have proven effective in dealing with drought
- Alternative feeding systems for confined

animal operations that incorporate novel drought-tolerant feedstocks

- Alternative housing or cooling systems for improved energy efficiency and better climate control in confined animal operations
- Technologies that reduce water use in confined animal operations

(AP) – Beef Products Inc. has sued ABC News, Inc. for defamation over its coverage of a meat product that critics dub “pink slime,” claiming the network damaged the company by misleading consumers into believing it is unhealthy and unsafe.

The Dakota Dunes, S.D.-based meat processor is seeking \$1.2 billion in damages for roughly 200 “false and misleading and defamatory” statements about the product officially known as lean, finely textured beef, said Dan Webb, BPI’s Chicago-based attorney.

The lawsuit filed in a South Dakota state court also names several individuals as defendants, including ABC news anchor Diane Sawyer and the Department of Agriculture microbiologist who coined the term “pink slime.”

The company's reporting "caused consumers to believe that our lean beef is not beef at all – that it's an unhealthy pink slime, unsafe for public consumption, and that somehow it got hidden in the meat," Webb said before the company's official announcement.

ABC News, owned by the Walt Disney Co., denied BPI's claims.

"The lawsuit is without merit," Jeffrey W. Schneider, the news station's senior vice president, said in a brief statement. "We will contest it vigorously."

The 257-page lawsuit names American Broadcasting Companies, Inc., ABC News, Inc., Sawyer and ABC correspondents Jim Avila and David Kerley as

defendants. It also names Gerald Zirnstein, the USDA microbiologist who named the product “pink slime,” Carl Custer, a former federal food scientist, and Kit Foshee, a former BPI quality assurance manager who was interviewed by ABC.

Richard McIntire, a spokesman for the USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service, declined to comment and attempts to reach Foshee were unsuccessful.

The Food Integrity Campaign, a whistleblower advocacy group that has worked with Foshee, said in a statement that Foshee was fired from BPI because he refused to participate in the company's "misrepresentation of the product's safety to the USDA and to consumers."

"Thanks to ABC News, Kit Foshee and other whistleblowers shared their concerns about BPI," said Amanda Hitt, the group's director and former counsel to Foshee after he was fired. "Doing so took enormous courage for which they should be honored, not attacked. We believe that this product is questionable."

Zirnstien said that he had not yet been served with the lawsuit.

"I'm just a scientist giving my opinion. I'm not going to deal with this nonsense," he said, referring questions to his attorney.

Although several news organizations used the term "pink slime," Webb said ABC was being sued for attacking the company "night after night." The "defendants engaged in a month-long vicious, concerted dis-

information campaign against BPI,” the lawsuit claims, citing 11 TV and 14 online reports from March 7 to April 3.

Craig Letch, BPI's director of food-quality assurance, said the company lost 80 percent of its business in 28 days. BPI has declined to discuss how much it lost in sales, but acknowledged it took a "substantial" hit. Some of the customers have returned, Letch said, but not enough to allow BPI to rehire former employees.

Webb said the reports had a "catastrophic" impact on the company, forcing it to close three of its four U.S. plants and lay off 700 workers.

ABC published a list of major grocery stores that stopped selling the product, pressuring others to follow suit by placing them on a “black list,” he said.

BPI will have to prove the network intended to cause harm for the defamation lawsuit to succeed, said Patrick Garry, a media law expert at the University of South Dakota School of Law.

"The media – regardless of your opinion of them – don't usually print something that they know to be false," Garry said. "It may be negligent, but usually there's a malice requirement as well."

Bill Marler, a Seattle attorney who said he's representing Zirnstein and Custer, said his clients were considering a counter-claim against BPI.

“Our view is that the lawsuit against them, especially as public employees doing their job for food in-

spection, is completely bogus, without merit and frivolous," Marler said.

Critics worry about how the meat is processed. Bits of beef are heated and treated with a small amount of ammonia to kill bacteria, a practice that has been used for decades and meets federal food safety standards. Webb said that ABC ignored that information, instead giving the impression “that it’s some type of chemical product ... some kind of repulsive, horrible, vile substance that got put into ground beef and hidden from consumers.”

The name “pink slime” gained traction after The New York Times quoted Zirnstein in a 2009 article on the safety of meat processing methods. In the fol-

lowing years, celebrity chef Jamie Oliver began railing against it. McDonald's Corp. and other fast food companies stopped using the product, and major supermarket chains vowed to stop selling beef containing the low-cost product. An online petition calling for it to be banned from school menus, attracting hundreds of thousands of supporters.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has said the vast majority of states participating in its National School Lunch Program have opted to order ground beef that doesn't contain the product. Only three – Iowa, Nebraska and South Dakota – chose to order beef that may contain it.

The uproar prompted Beef Products to suspend

operations at plants in Amarillo, Texas; Garden City; and Waterloo, Iowa. Beef Products' plants in Iowa and Kansas each produced about 350,000 pounds of lean, finely textured beef per day, while the one in Texas produced about 200,000 pounds a day.

The company has won support from the governors of Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas, Texas and South Dakota. U.S. Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack has also defended the product, saying the federal government wouldn't allow the product if it was unsafe.

The company has launched its own public relations offensive, including a website, [www. beefisbeef.com](http://www.beefisbeef.com), to advocate for the product.

## Weather History

Oct. 2, 1981 - Severe thunderstorms raked Phoenix with heavy rain, high winds and half up to an inch and a half in diameter, for the second day in a row. Thunderstorms on Oct. 1 deluged Phoenix with .68 inches of rain in five minutes, equaling their all-time record.
