Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

There was no follow-through strength from the September Quarterly Stocks report, which was very disappointing. Corn, wheat, and soybeans were all lower for the week and the December KW and the November soybeans never even took out last Friday's high. After a poor performance like that the charts don't look too bullish. The wheat is back to trading at the bottom end of the trading range, which should be very good support and barring negative numbers in the supply and demand report, should hold. The problem is that traders are been hearing about the Russians running out of wheat for ages and yet nothing has become of it. Our export sales are mediocre at best and the bulls are back to hoping for higher corn prices to keep wheat in the feed mix. Then there is a bearish reaction to the supply and demand report and the wheat falls out of the trading range, the charts will then look very bearish.

After the stocks report suggested that there was a lot more feed usage than USDA had estimated, the assumption was that the October supply and demand report would be bullish for the wheat.

That would be logical, but I don't think that it is wise to get your hopes up. We see this happen all the time when the stocks report suggests either higher demand or lower production, but it is never reflected in the supply and demand reports when traders expect it to be. I think the report should be bullish, but I urge caution because we could certainly have a disappointing report.

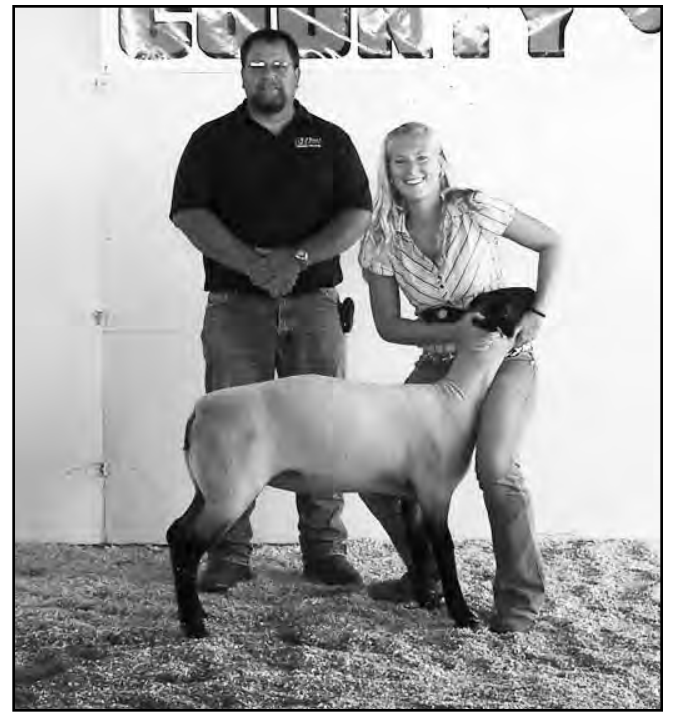
The December corn found support at the nine-day moving average several times through the week and that is what traders will be watching when trading resumes. Failure at that support early in the week will result in a drop back to the \$7.30 area. Thursday's report will then determine the direction of the market to close out the week.

There will be numerous changes to the supply and demand numbers next week. First, old crop stocks have to be cut to 988 million, because that is what the stocks report had. Then there will probably be a change in yield, some say it will be higher, some say lower, and I say that the change won't be very big which ever direction it is. Planted acreage will probably be in-

creased, but harvested acreage could still be cut. I don't think that USDA will let ending stocks fall below 650 million at this time, so we will then have to see demand cuts across the board. The report will be bullish, but what will the reaction be? I think we have scored the harvest low, but it may be hard to the market to move until we see better demand numbers to get speculators excited. Right now it is the basis doing the work and not the futures market. You can get bids of around \$1.00 over July in SW Kansas.

The soybeans may have made their harvest low on

Wednesday. It's about time considering how strong demand is and how the Chinese are just loving this break in prices. Just about everyone is convinced that USDA will increase yield by at least two bu/ac in the report. Some think it will be as much as four bu/ac, which seems like a lot considering the severity of the drought, but 39.3 bu/ac would still be the lowest since 2003, so may it isn't out of line. Regardless of the yield is still looks like we will use just about everything we produce. Currently demand is penciled in at 487 million bushels lower than last year and a four bu/ac increase in yield would only be 298 million. It won't be a surprise to see changes in the planted and harvested acres just like in the corn and we will obviously see demand changes in every category. Exports in particular should be increased if USDA is being honest with us.

Land-grant universities a great success over 150 years, but face new challenges

Lest the nation's land-grant universities be tempted to rest on their laurels as they celebrate 150 years of their nation-changing tradition, four former U.S. secretaries of agriculture and the leader of one of the world's leading philanthropic organizations laid out an ambitious to-do list for them for the next few decades.

The opening Heuermann Lecture of 2012-13 capped the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's weeklong celebration of the 150th anniversary of the Morrill Act. The legislation, passed at the height of the Civil War, helped transform the nation by opening up higher education to the masses through a system of land-grant universities.

The four former agriculture secretaries featured in the Lied Center lecture — Clayton Yeutter, Mike Johanns, Dan Glickman and John Block — pronounced the act an unqualified success in its creation of a system of agricultural research, extension and teaching that has helped transform agriculture in the United States into the most technologically advanced,

profitable, efficient and productive system in the world.

The discussion's title, "The Land-Grant Mission of 2012: Transforming Agriculture for the 2050 World," is a nod to the land-grant system's challenges today: Helping to feed a world whose population is expected to increase from seven billion to nine billion by 2050.

Nebraska native Jeff Raikes, CEO of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and co-moderator of the lecture, said some estimates are that agricultural outputs actually will need to increase by 70 to 100 percent to meet that 2050 population's needs because as people in the developing world become wealthier, they will seek out more protein-rich diets.

"If you're going to feed the world... you're going to need science and you're going to need technology and you're going to need the best of land-grant universities," said Johanns, now a U.S. senator from Nebraska. "We've got to do everything better than we do it today," Yeutter said.

Yeutter turned to Ronnie Green, Harlan vice chancellor of UNL's Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources and the other moderator of the lecture, to call on UNL and other land-grant universities to be "bold" in their research, extension and teaching.

The panelists cited several goals for land-grant universities in the next few decades:

- Increase public-private partnerships, especially given federal budget limits that mean fewer government dollars for research.
- Help farmers continue to adjust to climate change and its impact on production.
- Continue to pursue biofuels options, notable cellulosic ethanol, that do not pit fuel versus food as crop uses.
- Help farmers in the developing world increase their productivity and efficiency.

Johanns stressed that last point. While American farmers are justifiably proud of their role in feeding the world, he said, meeting the needs of 2050 and beyond will require producers in Africa and elsewhere to get more efficient. American scientists, many of them in land-grant universities, can play a key role in training them to do so.

"Nothing will buy more goodwill for the United States of America," Johanns added.

"They want our help. They want to feed themselves," Glickman agreed.

Although farmers now comprise fewer than 2 percent of Americans — compared to 60 percent when the Morrill Act was passed — the ag sector actually is positioned to have greater political, social and economic influence than ever because of concerns about the expanding population's food needs, panelists agreed.

culture and food is poised to be a very dominant industry in America," Glickman said.

This year's punishing drought has increased the interest of people who normally don't think about agriculture, Block said.

"They don't know about farming, they don't care about farming, but they do care about having enough food," he said.

The four former agriculture secretaries, all but one of whom — Glickman — served Republican presidents, generally agreed on the issues and challenges, but for a good-natured exchange between Block and Glickman over organic agriculture, which the former dismissed as largely insignificant, while Glickman noted that consumers nowadays do want food that's been treated with fewer


chemicals. "That doesn't mean they want to be vegetarian hippies from the 1960s," he joked.

Johanns and Glickman agreed that today's consumers do want more information about the food they eat, and they expect choices in the marketplace they didn't expect in years past.

Always aiming higher — Kansas feedyard stands out as a leader year after year

Maintaining a high profile based on deeds, Jerry Bohn and the staff at Pratt Feeders keep finding ways to increase beef quality, while making money for customers and better steaks for consumers.

Nothing succeeds like success. Gary Fike, beef cattle specialist at Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB), explains how numbers support this 38,000-head CAB licensee winning the 2012 Feedlot Partner of the Year Award for those with more than 15,000-head capacity. "From last June through May, Pratt Feeders enrolled more cattle with complete data than any other partner in the Feedlot Licensing Program, at 23,015 head. That shows a huge commitment," he notes, "a 36% jump from their historical average volume, which was already at a high level." Pratt also won the Partner award in 2004 and 2010, and a Quality Focus Award last year.

"It's not easy to increase quality at the same time as quantity, but that's what they did, moving up 4 percentage points to nearly 36% CAB or Prime," Fike says. "More than two million pounds of branded boxed-

beef products originated at this one yard."

Bohn attributes some of that trend to more intensive management.

"We are identifying the outlier, heavier cattle to market earlier," he says. "That allows us to feed the rest to a more optimum endpoint."

Higher quality and higher percentage Angus genetics coming in have

more than kept up.

"I don't think we have seen a marked advantage in feedyard performance from crossbreds versus our better quality Angus cattle anyway," Bohn says. "And when the Choice-Select spread is as wide as it has been recently, that gives the Angus a leg up, too."

Two years of hot summers and drought brought concerns about the effects on cattle and grading, but Pratt Feeders took action to maintain animal comfort. Setting up shades in several pens, Bohn gathered data on cost effectiveness and benefits.

"It looks like those cattle held their consumption better than in the rest of the feedyard," he reports. "We also put out some extra water tanks in other pens to try to mitigate the heat as best we could."

Bohn was a proponent of higher quality beef at seminars across North America. "The industry's goal is to produce consistently higher quality beef for consumers, and to do that, I think the message has to get out that we need to ramp up the quality in our cattle population," he says. "We're seeing that happen very slowly, but we still have a lot of genetic variation and too many poor cattle."

"I think it's important for all of us to speak out and encourage and help get better returns to the people who are producing the kind of beef we're looking for," Bohn says, adding a window

of opportunity may present itself for improving more herds. "We need to get this drought headed in a different direction, and then we can begin to grow the cowherd again. I hope people will see the advantage in building back with higher quality heifers."

Every month or two in the past year, Bohn was either speaking out in some beef industry venue or hosting chefs and other end-product folks at the Pratt feedlot.

"We have to be transparent and tell consumers exactly what we do," he says. "Hosting these groups is our attempt to do what we can to educate the chefs, restaur-

ant operators, retailers, school kids—all of those groups need to learn more about our industry. And we really enjoy doing it. We've gotten to meet some really cool people."

As fall approached, Bohn was hosting an international delegation of CAB partners, and overseeing a Gene-Max™ sorting demonstration on feedlot and carcass results. That was to fit into the feedlot's presentation for the National Angus Tour in October.

"We try to manage cattle individually, and DNA testing certainly goes quite a way down that road," Bohn says. "It's probably the wave of the future."

"Without farmers there would be no food. We, as farmers need to continue to reach out and spread the word in regards to what we do, when we do it, where we do it, how we do it, and basically, why we do it. 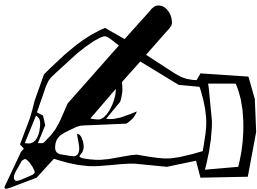

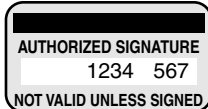

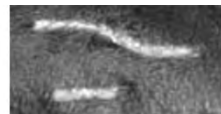

Committees range from production and stewardship, research and business development, public policy, grower services, ethanol committee, trade policy, biotechnology and the national political action committee.

“As a grassroots organization, NCGA relies on its members to step forward and take an active role in developing the policies that will lead our industry forward,” NCGA first vice president Pam Johnson said. “We have opportunities in all of the areas the organization touches, thus allowing members to take their involvement to the next level while exploring in great depth the areas that interest them the most.”

“To keep the renewable energy sector of the economy growing in Kansas we must continue to push the envelope for innovative policies at the state level,” Brownback said. “We cannot look to Washington for answers, as Congress continues to struggle with a balanced energy policy. We must keep things moving at home.”

Featured speakers at the conference included John Graham, president and CEO of BP Wind Energy; Kevin Rabinovitch, global sustainability director for MARS Inc.; and David Terry, executive director of the National Association of State Energy Officials.

One issue that was highlighted by several presenters is that the job creators of the future will seek regulatory flexibility for purchasing renewable energy. Additionally, they spoke to the need to ensure that transmission requirements and permitting issues are addressed so that more renewable energy projects can get online in Kansas.

The energy efficiency initiatives of MARS, in particular, were described by Kevin Rabinovitch, who discussed the significant waste reductions and improved efficiency across his company’s supply chain. Rabinovitch also spoke of a greater need for cooperation with government and local utilities in order to get their renewable efforts off the ground in Kansas.

John Graham of BP Wind Energy echoed this sentiment in his remarks: “The wind industry is constrained by a lack of transmission and needs assurance that it can get on to the existing grid in accordance with fair and non-discriminatory government policies. The strongest wind resources are often in out-of-the-way places and far from the metropolitan areas where the energy would be consumed. This is an opportunity for states like Kansas who have great wind to

access nearby markets with new transmission lines.”

Graham concluded that regulatory improvements at the federal and state level would help with the development of renewable energy infrastructure, particularly with regard to the permitting process. These and other participants called for the extension of the federal wind production tax credit (PTC), which if allowed to expire at the end of 2012 would negatively impact the wind energy sector.

Kansas is currently the No. 1 state in the nation for wind farms under construction, and the wind industry either directly or indirectly employs more than 2,000 workers.

The event wrapped up with a tour of the Riley County Public Works that demonstrated the benefits of including energy efficient features to new construction such as geothermal heating and cooling, extra insulation, efficiency lighting and wind and solar power energy systems.

Four-Legged Superstars

Every Friday, Saturday and Sunday, some of our animal friends are idolized by millions of people across the country. Horses, cattle, buffalo and even coyotes are the stars of the show at sporting events across America.

They are the mascots of colleges and universities and are thought to bring luck representing the school or team as the official mascot. They inspire the fans and instill in them a sense of identity and pride of belonging to the school and team.

They decorate jerseys, t-shirts and caps and fans proudly wear clothing with the picture of their mascot that represents their team. The mascot's job is not easy. They have to walk in parades, attend all games and events and sometimes perform to the crowd. Some mascots are people who wear costumes depicting the likeness of a real-life animal.

Kansas Wesleyan University's mascot is a coyote. There is a statue of a bronze coyote at "Coyote Corner" on the campus in Salina. The University of South Dakota has a coyote mascot too. Nowadays, he's named Charlie and is a costumed mascot. Charlie wasn't always a costume. The original mascot started out as a

real coyote named "Tootsie."

Florida State University's symbol is an Appaloosa horse named Renegade. His rider is dressed as Chief Osceola and they are on the field at all home games. When Bill Durham was a sophomore on the Homecoming Committee in 1962, he envisioned the idea of a team mascot for the Florida State Seminoles, consisting of a horse and Native American rider. His dream came true at the opening home game on September 16, 1978 against Oklahoma State. The highlight of every home game occurs right after the coin toss, when Chief Osceola and Renegade gallop to center field and plant a flaming spear. For the University of Florida game only, the Chief will dismount and brandish the spear at the opponent (Florida Gators) before planting it.

For over 25 years, Chief Osceola and Renegade have been named the number one college mascot in America!

"It's about the little old lady from West Florida that comes to every game just to see the horse; it's about the chill bumps that go up and down your spine when the spear hits the ground. The spirit of FSU and the Seminole Indian Tribe of Florida is what it's all about," said

Bill Durham, Renegade's trainer.

Then there's the pleasure of seeing a Texas Longhorn at all University of Texas games. Their Longhorn mascot is named Bevo and he's an impressive steer. The shape of the Longhorn's head and horns gives rise to the school's hand symbol and the saying, "Hook 'Em Horns." The current Bevo is fourteenth in the line of longhorns that have been the university's mascot.

The idea to use a live longhorn as the university's mascot is attributed to UT alumnus Stephen Pinckney in 1916. Pinckney gathered \$124 from other alumni to purchase a steer in the Texas Panhandle, which they originally named "Bo" and shipped to the university.

One of the legends has it that a prank was perpetrated by Texas A&M students in 1917. They kidnapped Bo and branded 13-0 on his side. That was the score of their 1915 win over Texas. Texas students retaliated by altering the brand to Bevo. Since then the Longhorn mascot has been named Bevo. At a football banquet in 1920, the original Bevo, who had been fattened and slaughtered, was barbecued. The Aggies were fed the side they had branded and then were presented with the hide, which still

read Bevo. Texans are known for their skillful pranks and that one ranks right up there with the best.

The University of Central Missouri is known as the Mules and the student newspaper is The Muleskinner. The men's sports teams are the Mules and women's teams are the Jennies. UCM has a living mascot named Mancow, and another named Mo the Mule.

Southern Methodist University selected the Mustang as the school mascot in 1917. The name was suggested by the secretary of the school's president. She was struck with the idea while watching the team practice. She said the team looked like "a herd of wild mustangs kicking up a cloud of dust." The name stuck and was made official. Seven other colleges share the Mustang as their mascot.

Cam the Ram shares his distinction of Colorado State's mascot with seven other institutions that use a ram as the mascot. The ram was named Colorado's mascot in 1947. CAM is the 21st official Ram mascot. The first school mascot was introduced in 1947. There have been both live and costumed versions of the mascot. The 2006 version of CAM was a Rambouillet sheep and the 21st ram to represent the university.

The thoroughbred horse is Kentucky State's mascot

and that is sure a fitting criterion for that state college. The first thoroughbred was brought to Lexington in 1779, and a 1789 census showed more horses than people. Horses are a multi-billion dollar industry in Kentucky. Central Kentucky's Bluegrass Region has the world's greatest concentration of thoroughbred breeding farms. More registered thoroughbred foals are produced there than any other state.

Marshall College is known as "The Thundering Herd." Fittingly, their mascot is a costumed Bison.

The White Mule was adopted as Colby College's mascot in 1923. Currently there's a costume with a giant mule's head, known to students as "Morty."

The U.S. Naval Academy's first mascot was a gorilla. Then in 1893 a goat named El Cid made his debut at the fourth Army-Navy game. El Cid was a gift to the Brigade of Midshipmen from officers of the USS New York. The goat helped Navy win 6-3 over Army that year, so the goat became the official Navy mascot. In the early 1900s

the Navy goat was finally given a name. On the return trip to the Naval Academy after Annapolis' triumph over West Point, the goat was led on a victory lap through the train and did not leave the midshipmen until they arrived back at the Academy. The midshipmen named the goat Bill. He was the first of a long line of "Bill the Goats" that still serve as Navy's mascot.

There are hundreds more institutions and NFL teams with four legged critters as their mascot. That says something about the high regard we place on our livestock. Our animals have attained the lofty status of symbols of power, ability and toughness that organizations try to emulate.

But wait — there are eleven colleges that have the Yellow Jacket as their school mascot. Are they trying to intimidate their opponents with the threat of a being stung by a bee? I'll stick with the mustangs or thoroughbreds as my superstars.

Drought-proofing our soils: the benefits of cover crops and profiting from streamside trees

"How can cover crops increase my cattle and crop profits?" "Is dairy quality forage for \$10 per ton possible?" "How can I turn that waste area down by the creek into long-term cash from timber and wildlife value?"

The Middle Kansas River Watershed Restoration and Protection Strategy (WRAPS), along with the Kansas Forest Service (KFS) and the Kansas Rural Center will be hosting a free workshop on October 17 from 1 p.m. to approximately 5:30 p.m. in Westmoreland that will answer important questions like these. The workshop will take place in the Sunflower Room, located within the Pottawatomie County Building in Westmoreland (612 Campbell Street). Refreshments and snacks will be provided for event attendees. The work-

shop will include a wide variety of talks and hands-on activities aimed at informing producers and landowners about how both cover crops and streamside trees can impact their bottom line.

John Bond, coordinator of the Middle Kansas River WRAPS group, will kick things off at 1 p.m. with a welcome and overview of the WRAPS project. Presentations from Thad Rhodes and Billy Beck (both Kansas Forest Service watershed foresters) will follow, running from 1:15 p.m. to around 2:45 p.m. Beck and Rhodes will cover a wide variety of forestry topics including: streamside timber establishment, forest management for wildlife, low cost stream bank stabilization methods, and funding/cost share for streamside forestry practices.

"There can be a lot of skepticism associated with tree planting in the Midwest", says Beck, "however, one goal of this workshop is to show producers that establishing streamside tree plantings can be a successful, rewarding, and profitable endeavor – and there is abundant cost share out there to get you going."

Following forestry, Dale Strickler of Star Seed, Osbourne, will share his extensive knowledge of cover crops and their year-round use to increase cattle and crop profits. Strickler, a K-

State alum, experienced agronomist, college instructor, farmer, and rancher, states "Our current system of feeding hay to cattle has become rapidly cost prohibitive as hay prices have skyrocketed under drought conditions. As producers seek alternatives to traditional hay feeding, they are increasingly discovering a method to reduce hay needs that not only produces better animal performance but also has a side benefit of also amazingly increasing crop yields. This no-longer-well-kept secret is the graz-

ing of cover crops, an age old but little used method until recently."

"Intelligently selected and managed cover crops can provide an impressive amount of grazing during the traditional hay feeding period, while at the same time fixing nitrogen, generating water saving mulches, improving soil organic matter and tilth, and deepening the root zone, all features that increase subsequent crop yields. In short, grazing cover crops can generate more income at less cost." Dale's talk will cover relevant topics such as: why eliminating hay feeding is the key to cattle profits, why cover crops can increase yields of subsequent crops, and how to select cover crops to provide grazing when you need it. Dale's talk will wrap up around 4:45 p.m. Following Dale, Middle

Kansas WRAPS coordinator John Bond will provide information on available cost share that can help to make streamside forestry and cover crop projects a reality for producers. All presenters plus WRAPS representatives will be available for one-on-one chats for a brief period following the event. Landowners and producers interested in enhancing both water quality and their bottom line through sustainable streamside forestry and cover crops will definitely benefit from the October 17 Cover Crop and Streamside Forestry Workshop. FSA prepares to issue CRP and DCP payments

Riley/Geary USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) County executive director Tamie Buckley announced that FSA will issue Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) and Direct and Counter-cyclical Program (DCP) payments during the first few weeks of October.

“FSA will issue the payments timely as long as all producer eligibility requirements are met,” said Buckley. “This is our favorite time of year at our office, when we get to send payments to the producers that participate in FSA programs. We feel honored to serve our customers, the hard-working men and women who feed our nation and our world.”

CRP and DCP payments could be affected if producers have not submitted the required Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) forms. Affected producers will need to submit the proper AGI forms before payments can be issued. In addition, producers who signed up for CRP emergency haying and grazing and did not pay in advance will notice that their annual rental payment was reduced by the acreage that was hayed or grazed.

As of October 3rd, the Riley/Geary FSA Office had begun making the 2012 annual CRP payments, and is on schedule to begin making DCP payments next week as instructed by the national office.

SowBridge educational series begins fifth year Nov. 7

The distance education program SowBridge will begin its fifth year Nov. 7 and Kansas State University animal science professor and Extension livestock specialist Joel DeRouchey said suggestions from subscribers help maintain the program's value.

SowBridge is sponsored by a group of 11 state universities – including K-State – from major swine producing states. It is coordinated by the Iowa Pork Industry Center (IPIC).

“We asked participants for suggestions on topics and speakers, and are happy to provide current content on topics that people are interested in,” DeRouchey said. “SowBridge provides all participants with the opportunity to hear directly from experts, and to contact those experts following the individual sessions.”

DeRouchey, who is the Kansas contact for SowBridge, said the program is intended for people who manage or care for boars, sows, and/or their litters, including operation owners, employees, technicians, managers, and technical service providers. SowBridge is designed to im-

prove the understanding and application of various tools and techniques involved in daily care of the breeding herd and piglets.

“People from the United States, Canada, Australia, Ireland and West Indies took part in this past year's program, and they told us they appreciated having the opportunity for all employees to participate in the sessions without requiring any travel or other expenses,” he said. “With the live phone presentation and slideshow viewed on computer, participants do not need internet access and can take part from anywhere.”

Farms or companies with more than one location have the opportunity to add locations at a lower rate. Cost is \$250 (\$U.S.) for the first registration from an entity and \$125 for each subsequent subscription from the same farm or company. This provides access to one phone line per session and all program materials for each registration. DeRouchey said materials, delivery process, and program costs are slightly different for those with non-U.S. mailing addresses, and encouraged potential sub-

scribers from outside the U.S. to contact Sherry Hoyer at IPIC by phone at 515-294-4496 or email shoyer@iastate.edu for more information.

Before each session, U.S. subscribers receive a CD containing that session's presentation, along with information on accessing the live speaker presentation. Most participants will call a toll-free conference line to listen to and interact with presenters. Each session begins at 11:30 a.m. Central time and lasts approximately 45 minutes.

DeRouchey said the yearlong program is offered

by subscription only with an Oct. 15 deadline to ensure participants will receive materials for the first session on Nov. 7.

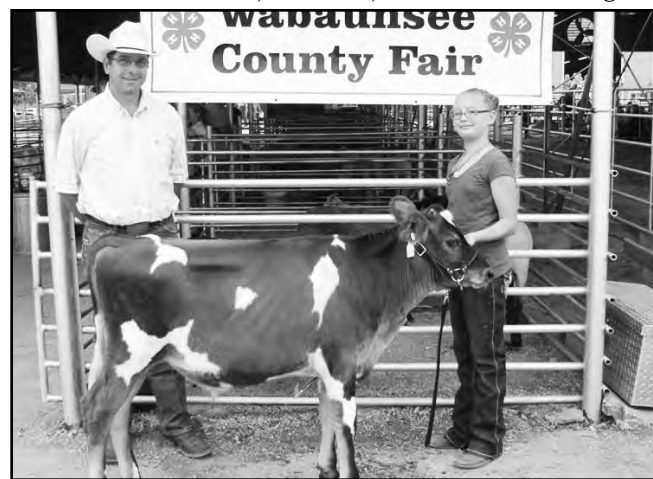

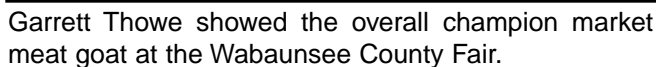
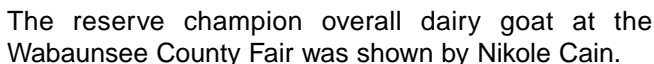

Forage tests should be submitted on feeds with the potential for high nitrates to determine the nitrate level as well as nutrient content

Once eaten, cyanide is absorbed directly into the bloodstream and binds to enzymes in the cell, preventing blood hemoglobin from transferring oxygen to cells and the animal dies from asphyxiation. Prussic acid acts rapidly, often killing the animal within minutes.

Young, rapidly growing plants are likely to contain high levels of prussic acid. Cyanide is more concentrated in the growing point and young leaves than in older leaves or stems. New sorghum growth, especially "suckers" or tillers, following drought or frost are dangerously high in cyanide. Generally, any stress condition that retards normal plant growth may increase prussic acid content. Wait until regrowth get fifteen inches or taller after a drought-ending rain before
