

Cowboy Crown

“It’s the last thing you take off and the first thing that gets noticed.” This sentence is an old cowboy saying referring to the hat.

The hat is probably the most visible symbol of cowboy apparel. It has been described as the one item which can be worn anywhere in the world and receive immediate recognition. As with other elements of cowboy culture, the hat began as a matter of practicality but has developed its own lore and style.

John B. Stetson was the maker of the first cowboy hat. He was from a hat-maker’s family in the east, but he contracted tuberculosis and came west in search of a better climate.

Stetson showed some friends how he could make felt from fur. He fashioned a large hat to protect himself from sun and rain. The hat

worked so well that others wanted one. He took the design back east and opened a factory to produce them. By the early twentieth century, Stetson owned the world’s largest hat factory.

Stetson’s original hat was known as the “Boss of the Plains.” It sold for five dollars.

In the early 1900s, a cowboy in Arizona started ranching but lost his herd in a drought and took up the art of painting. He created an illustration of a cowboy giving his horse a drink of water from his hat. The picture was titled “The Last Drop from his Stetson.” Since 1924, virtually every Stetson hat has displayed that picture on the satin lining inside the crown.

Felt hats were also marked with Xs on the headband. More Xs meant a higher fur content, better

quality, and higher cost.

Other brands and designs of hats came along through the years. A couple of men in Texas marketed a hat which they claimed could “resist all” types of weather. That company would become Resistol which is now the largest manufacturer of headwear in the world.

Western and dress hats were almost universal men’s headwear until the 1950s. Urban legend says that when John F. Kennedy gave his inaugural address without a hat in 1961, it set a trend and doomed the hat industry. For lots of guys, ball caps now seem to be the hat of choice.

Demand for cowboy hats took a major jump after the movie *Urban Cowboy* was released in 1980. That movie featured John Travolta and Debra Winger in some great looking hats.

The urban cowboy faded down but the working cowboy continues to value and wear good cowboy hats. I have several town hats, both straw and felt. For summer work, I like to use a palm leaf hat. It can stand up to abuse, soak up sweat and be reshaped with a dunk in the stock tank.

Hats have different shapes and styles. I prefer the classic hat design with a cattlemen’s crease in the crown. In 1989, a television miniseries based on Larry McMurtry’s novel *Lonesome Dove* featured Gus McCrae in a hat with a steep slanted front. That design is now called the “Gus Crease.”

The cowboy hat remains an important tool for the cowboy and an iconic symbol of the west. The Stetson company has evolved and still sells hats along with other products. A 100X beaver Stetson hat called the El Presidente now sells for \$1,000 each. That’s a long way from John B.’s original five dollar hat. I would think it would certainly get noticed.

Planting technology outpacing agronomy

Advanced planting technologies can reduce labor, seed and other input costs, and increase profits, says a University of Missouri Extension cereal crops specialist.

These technologies include automatic section control (ASC), as-planted maps, variable-rate seeding, precision seed metering, auto steering, yield monitoring, and on-farm research, said Brent Myers during the recent Crop Injury Diagnostic Clinic sponsored by MU Extension and the MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources.

A farm implement equipped with ASC knows where to plant and can sense where it has already planted, reducing skipped areas and overlap of planted areas. It can shut itself off when finished.

“There are good economic reasons to do this,” Myers said, citing savings in seed costs and harvest time.

There are costs associated with ASC, he said. A spreadsheet tool from the University of Tennessee-Knoxville lets producers compare lost revenue from reduced yield on overlaps to additional costs for seed, treatments and equipment. The Automatic Section Control for Planters Cost Calculator is available for download at [economics.ag.utk.edu/asccc.html](http://economics.ag.utk.edu/asccc.html).

Assuming that producers already have some system components, such as a field computer and GPS system from a yield monitoring system, additional ASC component costs include compatible plan-

ters, software activation, planter controllers and row clutches. Based on a 12-row system, costs run \$8,100 to \$13,000.

Myers demonstrated the use of the UT software on a 1,000-acre farm planted equally in soybeans and corn to examine the years of repayment needed to recover costs of ASC. He concluded that it would take less than one year to recoup costs in a 1,000-acre farm with high overlap severity, and 2.6 years for medium overlap severity. A farm with a 25-50-25 mix of fields with low, medium and high overlap severity — a good estimate for many Missouri farms — would take about three years to pay for ASC. It would take 10.4 years to recoup costs in farms with low overlap severity, and probably would not be financially beneficial, Myers said.

There are intangible benefits for the farmer, including reduced fatigue, improved concentration, greater efficiency and simplicity. “Reduced stress at the end of every planter pass and not having to fight end rows during harvest is a paradigm shift,” Myers said. “It makes both planting and harvesting a lot easier.”

Myers said yield map analysis has become an important tool for farmers, and will be more so into the future. He warns that yield map analysis is hindered without important management data and recommends the collection and use of as-planted maps. As-planted maps provide important man-

agement details such as planting date, precipitation and temperature, hybrid, and areas planted. This can often change within a field boundary in ways that are difficult to recall.

“Producers will need to know the details of a planting operation five or 10 years down the road,” Myers said. “Planting date, for instance, can have a larger influence on yield than many of the factors causing variability within a field.”

Myers expects that the development of more advanced tools for producers will make as-planted data a necessity.

Data like this is also needed to use variable-rate seeding technology. Equipment is now capable of planting different amounts of seed in areas of the same field, based upon yield, soil or landscape variability.

But Myers cautions that “the agronomy is behind the technology.” Farmers should consider on-farm research as a key tool for making variable-rate seeding work. Local and multiyear data from check areas or test strips in contrasting parts of a field can help producers see if they are getting good variable-rate prescriptions.

“Seeding rate response in corn can vary a lot from year to year,” Myers says. “A multiyear perspective is needed to dial in on the correct range of seeding rates.” New technology and accurate record keeping will help producers make those decisions in the future.

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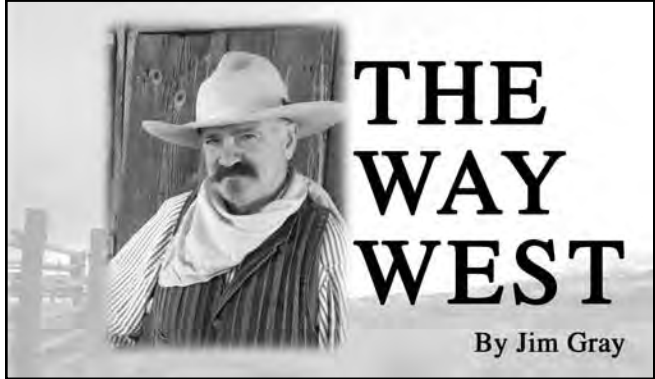
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# THE WAY WEST

## Burning the Candle

Frontier Kansas is filled with all kinds of characters. Characters bring history to life. As a world traveler of the day once said, "Those were the days of your 'Wild Bills'... and 'Long Steves,' your 'Dad Smith', 'Rake Jake' and Tom Smith of Bear River." Apache Bill Seamans was such a character. His story is a short one but in true Wild West character he lit a candle that was certain to burn out before its time.

No one knows for certain, but 1834 is the probable year of his birth. He may have been one William B. Seaman who served during the Civil War in Company A of the Seventh Volunteer Kansas Cavalry. If Apache Bill Seamans and William Seaman are one and the same, Jennison's command was just the kind of unit that

would have appealed to Bill Seamans. The regiment was organized at Fort Leavenworth in 1861, under the command of Colonel Charles R. Jennison. The outfit was more famously known as Jennison's Jayhawkers. Jennison was described as a "sincere abolitionist" and recruited "fighting abolitionists" to his cause.

Effective in military operations, Jennison often relied upon guerilla tactics to win the day. Slaves were rescued and farms burned. The spoils of war included livestock driven back to Kansas. In later years horses with questionable bloodlines were referred to as "out of Missouri by Jennison."

By 1868, Bill Seamans, famously known as Apache Bill, or "Patchy," was working as an army scout out of

Fort Dodge. A small tribe of Plains Apache often traveled and camped with the Southern Cheyenne and Arapaho. An encounter with that tribe may have been the reason for the title or he may have developed an affinity for the people he was watching. The close association allowed the scouts to see the other side of the coin in a way that brought them closer to their "enemy."

Captain George A. Armes of the Tenth U.S. Cavalry mentioned Apache Bill in his diary, September 8, 1868. Patchy had been jailed in the guardhouse for drunken behavior. Armes noted, "He is looked upon with suspicion as inclined to aid the Indians." Even so, the quartermaster's office had great respect for his abilities. He

was one of only a handful of men who was paid one hundred dollars a month for his services at a time when some very good men were getting seventy-five dollars.

In November, General Sheridan put forces into the field to attack unsuspecting villages in Indian Territory. Troops converged from New Mexico, Colorado, and Kansas. Lt. Col. George Custer was the field commander. The Nineteenth Kansas Volunteer Cavalry advanced into Indian Territory from the east with Apache Bill and Comanche Jack Stillwell as scouts. Apache Bill claimed to know the country and referred to his route as the Dutch Henry Trail. But fate intervened to tarnish Apache Bill's reputation when he lost his way in a se-

vere snow storm.

General Sheridan filed a highly critical report implying that the Nineteenth Kansas had performed in an unprofessional manner. The blame was placed squarely on Apache Bill, leading to his release from duty. Disgraced, Apache Bill returned to Kansas where his troubles refused to depart. The commanding officer at Fort Wallace issued a directive on August 15, 1869, warning that certain "Suspicious Characters" should not be employed. Apache Bill's name was on the list.

Perhaps utilizing the skills learned as a Jayhawker, Patchy and a man by the name of Alexander Boyd were accused of stealing four mules late in December, 1868. A week or so later the two men were arrested

at Fort Harker. Apache Bill was acquitted of the charges May 20, 1869, just in time to fill the need for a lawman in Ellsworth.

The Texas cattle trade brought wild cowboys to town during the summer season and the town needed a man who could stand up to them. Apache Bill Seamans was hired to do the job. The combination of whiskey, women, and dancing often resulted in arguments and gunplay. The evening of August 3, 1869, a wild shot brought Apache Bill to a crowded dance hall. The rowdy Texan was ready for a fight. As the constable rushed through the swinging doors he was shot through the chest. Captain Ames paid a last visit to the former scout as his light softly flickered. Inevitably the

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flame that had burned so bright went dark and the story of Apache Bill Seamans came to an end on The Way West.

# \$5 million lamb purchase announced

U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Service's (AMS) administrator Anne Alonzo announced on July 18 the agency's intent to make available up to \$5 million to purchase lamb products for federal food nutrition assistance programs, including food banks. The American Sheep Industry Association (ASI) requested the lamb meat purchase earlier this summer to prompt stronger prices for lambs at the farm and ranch gate.

In its request letter to AMS, ASI stated that live lamb prices are below the cost of production and producers face the highest feed costs in years.

"The market has not yet recovered to the cost of production for America's sheep producers and

ranchers. This \$5 million lamb buy will help strengthen feeder and slaughter lamb prices," says ASI president Clint Krebs. "ASI greatly appreciates AMS's announcement of a \$5 million supplemental lamb purchase."

"The domestic lamb industry faces various market challenges. Increased imports, weather problems and excess supply have added new pressures on the industry," says Alonzo. "This purchase will help relieve pressure on American lamb producers and will help mitigate

further downward prices, stabilize market conditions and provide high quality, nutritious food to recipients of USDA's nutrition program."

As USDA completed its deliveries from the 2012 lamb buy in June, this announcement is very helpful to provide more movement in the lamb meat system ahead of the traditional large shipments of feeder lambs in the fall.

AMS purchases only 100-percent domestic, high-quality food products each year to support the National School Lunch Program, the Summer

Food Service Program, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations, the Commodity Supplemental Food Program and the Emergency Food Assistance Program. USDA also makes emergency food purchases for distribution to victims of natural disasters.

# Ammoniating wheat straw a viable option for forage production

One option that may be underutilized in our region is the ammoniation of low quality forages like wheat straw.

Most producers would say that the last few years have been very good to excellent wheat years for our corner of the state. As a rule

of thumb, for every bushel of wheat produced (approximately 60 lbs.) there are 100 lbs. of straw produced. Obviously, it is not possible to harvest every bit of that straw produced, but there is a massive amount of biomass available to harvest.

Without any treatment, straw is bulky and relatively low in energy and protein so very little of this roughage is used. However, with treatment of ammonia, wheat straw (and other low quality forages) digestibility, feed intake, and crude protein are all increased. Digestibility is boosted because the ammonia actually helps break down the lignin and cellulose in the plants which can improve the total

digestible nutrients (TDN) by 8 to 15 percentage points. The process usually doubles the crude protein because the ammonia is a great non-toxic source of non-protein nitrogen (NPN). Feed intake is increased by 15 to 20 percent due to the increased digestibility and crude protein. As if these were not enough, ammoniation can also preserve forages that contain up to 25 to 30 percent moisture because the gas kills molds and fungi.

To ammoniate, the straw must be covered in a sheet of plastic with the edges sealed with soil. The recommended arrangement of the bales is in a 3-2-1 stack of large round bales. The typical recommendation was to

then allow 3% by weight (60 lbs. of anhydrous for every ton of dry forage) of the gas to pass through. However, recent studies have shown that a reduced rate of 1.5 % by weight has provided adequate results.

Temperature can play a role in how long the straw will need to be sealed. The time ranges from two weeks when the temperature is above 80 degrees to more than eight weeks when the temperature is below 40.

As anyone who has worked with anhydrous ammonia knows, extreme cau-

tion should be taken when applying the gas. Exposure to anhydrous can cause blindness, lung damage, burns, or death. Be sure to wear personal protective equipment when applying including a mask, goggles, long-sleeved shirt, long pants, and proper work shoes or boots.

Hopefully producers will contemplate ammoniating low quality forages in the future. With high feed costs, alternative methods should be considered. If you have questions or would like more information, please

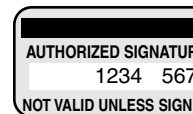

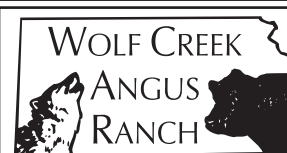

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# Producers gain premium prices when selling quality beef from planned-breeding programs

Quality beef pays. Technology to produce quality is on the shelf, ready to use, said David Patterson, University of Missouri Extension beef reproduction specialist.

He spoke to the South Central Missouri Cattlemen's Association in West Plains, July 25.

"There is increasing demand, domestic and international, for high-quality beef," he said. "Markets recognize value and pay for quality."

Quality beef becomes a way for U.S. cow herds to compete in a growing world market. "We can't compete by producing commodity beef," he added.

U.S. cow numbers are the lowest in decades, but prospects for lower feed costs make profitable herd expansion possible.

Since arriving in Missouri, Patterson led statewide adoption of the Show-Me-Select Replacement Heifer Program. The program improves performance genetics in beef herds.

At base, the heifer program uses sires with proven high-accuracy genetics. Increasingly, those genetics are delivered by fixed-time artificial insemination

(FTAI). Patterson developed and proved protocols in research at the MU Thompson Farm in Grundy County. They were tested in farm herds across the state.

Success in heifer breeding led to Quality Beef by the Numbers, a new MU Extension program. It helps market steer mates of superior heifers.

Patterson showed recent analysis of economic returns at heifer sales.

At baseline, bull-bred heifers brought an average of \$1,549 per head. But AI-bred heifers averaged \$1,695, an increase of \$146.

Over time, Show-Me-Select added Tier Two heifers, which require higher-accuracy sires. Those heifers bred natural service brought \$1,786, an increase of \$237 over baseline.

Tier Two heifers bred AI averaged \$1,906, adding \$357 per heifer.

"Prices paid show that buyers recognize proven AI genetics," Patterson said. "At the sales, repeat buyers bid up prices. They know the value."

Reproductive management stacks genetics, which brings more money, Patterson said.

Technology that boosts

value in heifers also adds value to genetically superior steers. That's the foundation for Quality Beef by the Numbers.

As in the heifer program, a computer database of herd performance will aid QB development.

Quality breeding requires a system. "It requires sticking with a plan through generations," Patterson said. He explained the programs include more than genetics from proven high-accuracy sires.

With timed AI, all cows in a herd can be bred on the first day of breeding season. That groups calves into uniform lots sought by buyers. Also, early-born calves gain more weight over the longer growing season, adding pounds to herd production.

In addition, early-born replacement heifers stay in cow herds longer, producing more calves.

In heifer development, pre-breeding exams and early pregnancy diagnosis play a part in management. Local veterinarians help.

Initially, the main aim was calving ease. Those genetics added more live births. Now, breeding at

MU Thompson Farm uses \$Value Indexes. An index allows multi-trait selection, expressed in dollars per head. "This simplifies genetic decisions," Patterson said.

Steers from Tier Two breeding at Thompson Farm grade 34 percent prime at the packing plant. The national average for prime is 3 percent.

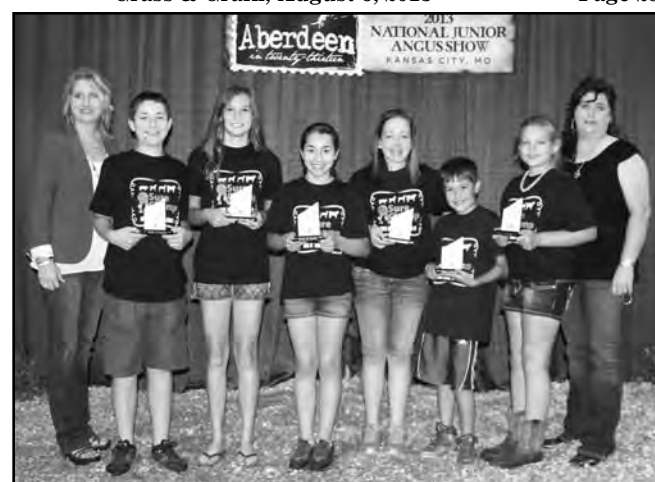
Prime-grade premiums remain the highest and most consistent bonuses paid. However, other premiums are gained as well.

Quality-beef programs require more management, but that can result in less time and labor at breeding and calving times.

AI protocols are suited for small herds, or large. Producers who work off-farm can set FTAI breeding to fit with work.

Logan Wallace, MU Extension livestock specialist, West Plains, arranged the program. He also helps area herd owners develop breeding programs.

Beef research and extension are part of the MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, Columbia.

# New wheat publications now available online

The tests generate information designed to help Kansas growers select wheat varieties suited for their area and conditions. The publication was authored by Jane Lingenfelter, K-State assistant agronomist and performance test coordinator.

Another publication, “Wheat Variety Disease and Insect Rating 2013,” provides information on wheat genetic resistance to diseases and insect pests, which is typically the most effective, economical, and environmentally sound method of control. The ratings represent the results of multiple field and greenhouse evaluations by public and private wheat researchers. The ratings can help producers select wheat varieties to plant and minimize the potential for yield losses. The publication was written by Erick De Wolf and William Bockus, both professors in Kansas State University’s plant pathology department, and Jeff Whitworth, associate professor in K-State’s entomology department.

Fat digestibility in pigs study looks at oils in soybeans, corn co-products

Pork producers need accurate information on the energy value of fat in feed ingredients to ensure that diets are formulated economically and in a way that maximizes pork fat quality. Researchers at the University of Illinois have determined the true ileal and total tract digestibility of fat in four corn co-products, as well as in full fat soybeans and corn oil.

Hans H. Stein, a professor of animal sciences at U of I, led the team of re-

searchers in the study in which they looked at four corn co-products: distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS), high-protein distillers dried grains (HP DDG), corn germ, and a high-oil corn that contained about 7 percent lipids. They also tested full-fat soybeans and extracted corn oil.

Three diets were formulated containing each source of oil, as well as a basal diet that contained no added fat. These diets were fed to cannulated pigs. The

apparent ileal and total tract digestibility of lipids in each diet was calculated and a regression procedure was used to estimate endogenous losses and to calculate the true ileal digestibility and the true total tract digestibility of lipids.

"We observed that the digestibility of oil in soybeans is much greater than in the corn co-products. It appears that pigs can utilize that oil much more easily," Stein said.

the fat in full-fat soybeans (85.2 percent) and HP DDG (76.5 percent) was the most digestible. Digestibility of fat was lowest in DDGS (62.1 percent), high-oil corn (53.0 percent), and corn germ (50.1 percent).

Corn oil also had the greatest true total tract digestibility at 94.3 percent. Full-fat soybeans had the next greatest digestibility at 79.7 percent. HP DDG was next at 70.2 percent. Finally, DDGS (51.9 percent), corn germ (43.9 percent), and high-oil corn (41.4 percent) had the lowest true total tract digestibility.

point of view, there would be a clear advantage if we could first extract the fat and then add it to the diet as corn oil rather than leave it in the ingredients. Whether such an approach would be economical would depend on the cost of extracting the oil from corn germ and other ingredients," Stein said.

The study, "In growing pigs, the true ileal and total tract digestibility of acid hy-

drolyzed ether extract in extracted corn oil is greater than in intact sources of corn oil or soybean oil," was published in the Journal of Animal Science and is available at <http://www.journalofanimalscience.org/content/91/2/755.full>. Illinois graduates Beob Gyun Kim of Konkuk University and Dong Yong Kil of Chung-Ang University in Korea were co-authors of the study.

Kansas farm real estate value and cropland rent higher

Kansas's farm real estate value, a measurement of the value of all land and buildings on farms, increased from 2012, according to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Farm real estate value for 2013 averaged \$1,900 per acre. This is up \$290 per acre or 18 percent higher than last year's revised level.

Cropland value increased 19 percent from last year to \$2,100 per acre. Dryland cropland value averaged \$2,000 per acre, up \$300 from last year. Irrigated cropland value averaged \$3,000 per acre, up \$600 from a year ago. Pastureland, at \$1,250 per acre, increased \$250 from a year ago.

Cash rent paid to landlords in 2013 for cropland also increased from last year. Irrigated cropland rent averaged \$137 per acre, an increase of \$18. Dryland cropland rent averaged \$53 per acre, up slightly from a year earlier. Pasture rented for cash, which averaged \$17.50 per acre, is up \$1.00 from the previous year.
