

The corn market traded up one day and down the next, which days traders probably enjoyed, but choppy markets sometimes drive me crazy. It seems like the market is always on the verge of a breakout in one direction or the other, but never quite gets the job done. The wheat market traded sideways/lower and the December KW chart is beginning to look negative. It doesn't seem that traders have enough conviction to really push the wheat sharply lower, but if the corn heads lower the wheat will probably follow suit unless we see very good export sales.

The soybeans are trading in their own world right now. The trend and momentum of the market is clearly up thanks to concerns about crop development and the fear of how tight stocks may get if yield is reduced in future reports. The November beans finished the week by testing the June high and although the market is overbought, there is definitely a chance that the market makes a run at the contract highs.

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Moving forward the direction of the market will be determined by the forecasts, either wet or dry, hot or cold. It is hard saying which scenario the crop would prefer, but there is definitely fear of an early freeze and there are definitely some areas that could use some rain. Warm weather would be good for crop development, but if the warmth comes without rain there will be concerns, especially for the soybeans, about running out of moisture before the crop is mature.

What we all have to keep in mind is that a one bushel to the acre cut in soybean yield would make stocks tight again for another year, especially if we can't slow the Chinese imports. For the corn, it is looking less likely all the time that we will end up with two billion bushels of ending stocks. There is still the chance that we see rains in early September and a late freeze to help the corn crop to a great finish, but right now it appears that traders are at least a little nervous about that not happening. Even if we do have a poor

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finish to the year corn stocks will still be much larger than last year, but they won't be burdensome and we have big enough demand numbers that we will need a good crop next vear. so at least the markets will stay interesting. The worst case scenario all along has been to be buried in a huge crop this year and follow it up with another next year. If this year's corn or soybean crop ends up being average or worse, then we delay that worst case scenario for at least one more year.

The cattle market might liven up Monday morning thanks to the bullish cattle on feed report. The on feed estimate came in at 94%, which was below the lowest trade guess, the placements figure came in at 90%, which was below the lowest trade guess and the marketings came in at 105%, which was above the average trade guess. Cattle on feed numbers don't always matter, but if they are ever going to, it should be now. These numbers, along with slowing cow slaughter, and the halt on using Zilmax are all bullish and should support the beef market as long as consumer demand doesn't drop off. I like December live cattle calls.

# Ottawa county fall crop tour to be held on September 3


The Central Kansas Extension District (Ottawa and Saline counties) will host a Fall Crop Tour in Ottawa County on Tuesday, September 3rd starting at 5:00 p.m. The tour features stops at plots of Roundup Ready soybean varieties and grain sorghum hybrids. Discussion will focus on cover crops for central Kansas cropping systems, cover crops for grazing, a systems approach to managing weeds in soybeans and sorghum, and a soil fertility update for central Kansas crops. A complimentary meal will be served following the tour, courtesy of cooperating seed dealers at the Delphos Senior Center, 203 N. Washington St., Delphos. In case of inclement weather meet directly at the Delphos Senior Center and presentations will be given there.

The first stop is at 5:00 p.m. at a Roundup Ready

soybean variety plot, on ground farmed by Nathan and John Hyde. From Minneapolis go 3 miles north on 120th Rd., 1 mile west on Oxbow Rd., then 3/4 mile north on 110th Rd. Second stop will be at 6:00 p.m. at a grain sorghum hybrid plot also on ground farmed by Nathan and John Hyde, located 1½ miles west of Delphos on Volunteer Rd. and 1 mile north on 70th Rd.

Tour speakers include South Central Kansas Experiment field agronomist Gary Cramer, K-State Extension weed management specialist Dallas Peterson, and CKD Extension agents Anthony Ruiz and Tom Maxwell. All area farmers and interested persons are welcome to attend.

The weather has turned sunny and dry, just what hay producers want to put up alfalfa and prairie hay. Swathers are busy and balers will be as soon as the hay cures and dries. High humidity and wet ground are slowing things down a bit. The row crops are looking great but some late planted milo and soybeans need heat units to mature. More low quality alfalfa is showing up, some rain damaged, some with weeds and some mature hay, which is putting pressure on the market. 

# K-State's Dikeman named to **Meat Industry Hall of Fame**

Whether it was through his role as coach of the Kansas State University Meat Judging Team, advisor to Block & Bridle or Ag Student Council or one of the many classes he taught as a professor of animal science, a generation of Kansans learned from Michael Dikeman.

For his work as a researcher, teacher and advisor. Dikeman has been named to the Meat Industry Hall of Fame. He will be honored Nov. 3 at a ceremony and dinner in Chicago.

Dikeman, who retired earlier this year after 42 years at K-State, taught 13 different courses to more than 9,000 undergraduate and dozens of graduate students. He won two K-State research scholar awards and nine college, regional and national teaching awards, including a U.S. Department of Agriculture-National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges award.

His many awards include the American Society of Animal Science Fellow Award (2013), a lifetime achievement award pre-

sented to animal scientists who have made outstanding contributions to the industry

He earned a bachelor's degree in animal sciences and industry at K-State and a master's degree at Michigan State University. He then returned to K-State to earn a Ph.D. in 1970.

In a statement about the award, the Meat Industry Hall of Fame noted that Dikeman's research spanned the entire farm-to-fork spectrum in beef production-from genetics to cooking and processing. His work included such projects as the Germ Plasm Evaluation and Utilization research at the U.S. Meat Animal Research Center and work with breed associations to develop the Expected Progeny Differences (EPD) for beef tenderness. which has had a groundbreaking impact on beef quality and consistency.

Dikeman served as president of the American Meat Science Association, chairman of the AMSA Reciprocal Meat Conference, and president of the Federation of American Societies of Food Animal Sciences. He

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authored or coauthored hundreds of refereed journal articles, abstracts, and bulletin articles, written a book chapter, and developed videos and contributions to the Meat Science Encyclopedia.

His research encompassed production-management systems, the genetics of beef tenderness, muscle characteristics in Bos indicus and Bos taurus cattle, ultrasound and computermodeled beef cooking and the impact of stress on meat quality.

The Meat Industry Hall of Fame has inducted 60 members since the Inaugural Class of 2009. Nominations come from the meat industry at large and winners are chosen by the Meat Industry Hall of Fame board of directors and previous inductees. The United States Department of Agriculture's Risk Management Agency (RMA) recently expanded federal crop insurance coverage options for winter canola in Kansas. Irrigated and non-irrigated winter canola is now insurable for producers in Barber, Harper, Kingman, and Sumner counties. Irrigated winter insurability only is available for Gray County. Coverage in other counties may also be available by written agreement if certain criteria are met, including providing records for at least the three most recent years of production history for canola or a similar crop.

Revenue coverage will now be available for Kansas beginning in the 2014 crop year.

Acres planted to canola in Kansas have more than doubled since 2008. RMA's Topeka Regional Office (RO) expects that the amount of insured acreage will continue to increase in Kansas due to expanded coverage options, the current commodity prices, and the increase in national demand for canola. With little research on how nutrition affects reproductive performance in dairy cows, it is generally believed that a cow needs a higher energy intake before calving. Research by University of Illinois scientists challenges this accepted wisdom.

Animal sciences researcher Phil Cardoso said that this line of research was the result of an "accident." Students in animal sciences professor James Drackley's group compared cows fed before calving with diets containing the recommended energy levels to cows fed reduced energy diets. They found that the cows fed the reduced energv diets performed better after calving.

Cardoso, intrigued by those results, wondered if diet might also be linked to reproductive performance. Using data from seven experiments completed at the U of I from 1993 to 2010, he constructed a database of 408 cows containing data on prepartum diet and physiological status. He also looked at days to next pregnancy (DTP) after calving, which had not been considered in previous studies.

He found that, on average, cows fed the controlled energy (CE) diets (80% of the recommended amount) ten days sooner than cows fed high-energy (HE) diets, an average time period of 157 versus 167 days.

"People say that if you give this CE diet, the cows don't get pregnant, but that's not true," he said. "If anything, they are a little better off."

They also lost less in body condition score (BCS) and had a lower disease incidence because they were eating more.

Cardoso said that the shorter time to conception for cows fed the CE diet is due to the fact that they eat more after calving than the cows fed the HE diet.

"Just after calving, the cows have a negative energy balance (NEB)," he explained. This is because they cannot consume enough en-

#### ergy to compensate for the fact that they are producing milk.

This NEB, which can be measured by looking at metabolites in the blood, causes them to lose weight, lowering their BCS. High levels of the metabolites just before calving or one to two weeks after calving are associated with metabolic disorders and certain diseases, which cause them to eat less. These in turn affect reproductive performance.

Both groups of cows showed reduced energy consumption around calving due to stress, but the drop was four times, or approximately 30 percent, higher in the HE cows and only 7 percent in the CE cows.

Cows fed the CE diet were able to start eating right after calving. "We want the cow to eat as much as possible just after calving because then she's going to be healthier," Cardoso said.

The researchers also noticed that cows fed the CE diet showed less prepartum versus postpartum variation in how much they ate. By contrast, the cows fed the high energy diet were eating more than they need-

ed before calving. "Cows and ruminants cannot export well from the liver," said Cardoso. "Any time a large amount of fat is going to the liver, that's going to cause a lot of problems. They are going to have lower levels of glucose and ketone bodies will form. Feed intake will start to drop, and the cow will start feeling ill."

In a follow-up study that has not yet been published, the researchers tried to strategies to make the cows eat less. One was to give them just 80 percent of what they needed; the other was to increase fiber in the day so the diet would be lower in energy and the cows could eat more. They had similar results for

the two strategies.

There are indications that a CE diet has other benefits. It may help food to remain longer in the rumen, which is beneficial to the cow if she is stressed.

In short, Cardoso advised, just give the cow what she needs and she will perform better metabolically and reproductively.

"There is money associated with this," he said. "Any disease costs money."

But long intervals between calvings also costs money. "In the dairy business, we'd like the cow to calve once a year and the calving interval to be around 12 to 13 months. Be-

cause to give milk, she needs to calve, so we want her pregnant as soon as possible." Cardoso explained.

He added that research has shown that every day after 90 days in milk that the cow does not get pregnant represents a cost of two to three dollars.

## Bumper crop of hay being reported across the state

(AP) – Hay fields across Kansas have finally dried off from all the recent rainfalls so that farmers can get into them to cut overgrown alfalfa crops and mow lush prairie grasses to put up as feed for livestock this winter.

At the Agriculture Department's office in Dodge City, the agency's hay market reporter Steve Hessman said he is hearing from producers who are cutting as much as two tons of hay per acre from this third cutting of alfalfa – twice as much as normal for August across much of the state. But then a normal August in Kansas is hot and dry, not cool and wet as it has been in recent weeks.

"It is going to be a good cutting tonnage-wise or quantity-wise, whichever way you want to put that," Hessman said. "Quality - we are not sure because most of it is past the prime for maturity and, of course, it could still get rain-damaged. And in some cases we've seen weeds growing up because of the extra moisture."

All that rain that had kept producers out of their alfalfa fields at the peak time to harvest for this third cutting meant much of it has grown too mature, too rank and, for some, with too much pig weed in it, he said.

While there is going to be a lot more of the lower-quality hay - typically used for grinding or stock cows there is not going to be a lot of the top quality, dairy hay that milking cows need.

The recent rains have also affected the market for prairie hay, which is usually cut in July, because the grasses now being harvested are more mature and the stems on them are getting harder, he said.

In a typical growing season, Kansas gets four cuttings of alfalfa – with the first and last cuttings typically producing the topquality hay sought by dairy producers. But late spring frosts and drought this year hurt alfalfa crops, setting plants back so much that the state essentially did not have much of a first cutting

second cutting.

Statewide, this third cutting of alfalfa could potentially be larger than all the other cuttings put together this season, Hessman said. But while most growers benefited from the rains, the drought for the most part persists in far western Kansas.

It has been so dry in northwest Kansas where rancher Mike Schultz runs his cattle operation near Brewster that he plowed up his feed acres and planted milo instead this past spring mostly because crop insurance for milo pays better than the government program that pays for livestock feed losses. He figures that if his milo crop fails this vear then at least he would have enough insurance money to buy feed for his cows.

That is a much better option than last year when he bought \$3.000 worth of forage seed and his insurance paid just \$2,200 for his losses: "I lost quite a bit of money and didn't cut one bale of feed out of my acres." Schultz said.

It has rained a bit more lately around Brewster, but the drought lingers. Schultz had already cut his cattle herd by two-thirds during the drought and plans on buying hay for the 80 cows he has left. He hopes the abundant rainfall elsewhere in the state will help moderate the high hay prices.

"I would think prices would probably come down a little bit. For some that is a good deal, and everybody will make a little bit of money if we can all stay in business," he said. "If you drive one segment out, pretty soon it is not good for everybody."

It is a far different scenario in northeast Kansas where rancher Ron Estes said his third cutting of alfalfa is probably going to the biggest of all he has cut this growing season. The brome and sudan grasses are also doing well. He not planning on selling any of it, but intends to keep it to feed his

of alfalfa and just a modest own livestock this winter.

Estes also anticipates hay prices will come down as more hay becomes available: "It will certainly be cheaper, but I don't know whether it will be a lot cheaper," he said.

First cutting of alfalfa for stock cow use was trading about \$210 to \$220 a ton, and is now bidding around \$200 a ton, Hessman said. Topquality dairy hay in southwest Kansas, where the state's dairies are concentrated, was trading this week at \$265 to \$280 a ton.

The improving hay situation in parts of the country that have gotten abundant rains these past few weeks will help keep prices down for those cattlemen still in drought-stricken areas who will have to buy hav for their livestock this winter.

Southeastern Colorado is still dry, but that state's northeastern region got some rain. Eastern Nebraska is in "pretty good shape" as far as hay production and Hessman said. rains. Wyoming is still dry.

"The Texas Panhandle has had rain," Hessman said. "But I don't think they have rebuilt their cow herds."

The American Angus Association announced Aug. 12 that a genetic condition has been identified and documented in Angus cattle through research initiated in Australia with Jonathan Beever at the University of Illinois. This condition, inherited as a simple recessive, has been designated as Developmental Duplication (DD).

The Board of Directors convened by phone Aug. 12 to consider the implications of this genetic condition. At the conclusion of that meeting, President Phil Trowbridge appointed a Task Force and directed it to report to the full board as soon as practical how the Association should respond to this condition considering the best interests of the breed and the membership, the evolving scientific advances in the field of genetics, members' ability to manage

such conditions, and the likelihood that the scientific community will continue to identify genetic conditions in all breeds with increasing frequency in the future.

Trowbridge announced and explained the policy established with regard to DD in a letter to Angus breeders posted on the Association's classic website (www.angus.org/ angus.aspx) Aug. 14.

Artificial insemination (AI) organizations requested the Association provide to the membership the identity of and preliminary test results for 1,099 Angus bulls tested by Beever to determine whether they were carriers or free of the mutation identified for this genetic condition. The Association Board of Director's decision to provide that information to the membership is based in part on its understanding that the test used here was run on a set of animals requested by Beever from the AI organizations for research purposes and therefore remains preliminary in nature.

Commercial availability of a test for DD status (carrier or free) is expected within weeks and will be announced on www.angus.org /angus.aspx.

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

toric landmarks: Statues, historic courthouses. buildings. Dodge City has an especially interesting statue which I had an opportunity to view recently.

In the days of the great post-Civil War longhorn cattle drives from Texas to Kansas, Dodge City earned its title as "Queen of the Cowtowns" and "Cowboy Capital of the World." At the same time, it also earned its titles as the "Wicked Little City" and the "Beautiful, Bibulous Babylon of the Frontier." Drovers got paid at the end of the trail and were ready for revelry. Saloonkeepers, gamblers, and dance hall girls were more than willing to relieve them of their money, and the west got wild.

Famous western icons such as Wyatt Earp and Bat Masterson were not just a figment of some

Cities have many his- writer's imagination. They actually walked the streets of Dodge City.

So when the Kansas Cowboy Poetry Contest was wanting to conduct regional poetry contests to qualify poets for state in 2013, Dodge City seemed like a logical place to hold one. Sure enough, it was great. Dodge City hospitality was gracious and its western history was evident all over. At the contest, excellent poets came to recite. Nearly 80 people showed up on a Friday night to listen.

To make it even better. the poetry winners and I had the chance to recite

cowboy poetry on Saturday morning. We went to Boot Hill and had the opportunity to perform on Front Street inside the Long Branch Saloon.

As someone who grew up watching the TV show *Gunsmoke*, which usually showed the characters meeting in Hollywood's version of the Long Branch Saloon in "Dodge City," this was really fun. It took me back to those days of watching Marshall Dillon and Miss Kitty at the Long Branch, quite possibly the most famous night spot in TV western history.

About a block from Front Street stands that historic statue which I found so interesting. It honors a particular figure which was important in Dodge City history: a longhorn steer named El Capitan, representing the lead steers who helped bring those giant herds in to Dodge. 
