Kansas Wagyu genetics to help build Hawaiian herd

Created when two large volcanoes pushed through the surface of the Pacific Ocean, Molokai is the fifthlargest island in the Hawaiian archipelago. It has an estimated population of 8,000, nearly 40% of which are of Hawaiian descent, earning it the nickname, "The Most Hawaiian Island." Soon the island will be home to Kansas Wagyu beef, as Gypsum Valley Wagyu Cattle Company located near Salina re-

cently sent its first shipment of semen and embryos to the Molokai Ranch.

The ranch, which was once owned by King Kamehameha, cites four pillars of business: animal husbandry, sustainable agriculture, renewable energy and green improvements to existing infrastructure. Their grassfed cattle operation spans more than 3,000 acres on the west side of Molokai. The cattle are processed on the island, with the beef supplying Molokai and the neighboring islands. The company also plans to breed high-quality pigs for use on the island and statewide.

Gypsum Valley Wagyu Cattle Company co-owner Jack Cossette met a representative from the Molokai Ranch at the Denver Stock Show last January. Cossette spoke to Molokai Ranch CEO Clay Rumbaoa by phone and they agreed to meet at a Wagyu auction in Escalon, California. While there were several other Wagyu producers competing for Rumbaoa's business, Cossette believes a combination of the Midwest approach and the extensive knowledge of Dr. Casey Barten of Bluestem Embryo in Dickinson County helped them seal the deal. Barten did the embryo and semen work for the Molokai purchase, then shipped it to Hawkeye Breeders in Iowa who gathered all the embryos they had purchased and prepared them for shipment to the island.

"The big thing about putting embryos in is making sure the recipient cows are in the best shape they can be for conception," Cossette said. "Hopefully things will go well and they'll get a good conception rate and want to do more. They want to build their herd pretty quick and I think that's a good way to do it with the embryos and recips." Cos-

sette said that 100% Wagyu cattle do better on grass, and that is how they will be finished out.

The American Wagyu Beef produced at Molokai Ranch will be sold to higher-end steak houses in Hawaii.

Gypsum Valley Wagyu Cattle Company has been in business since 2008, with their first calves born from flushed embryos in 2009. They market their American Wagyu Beef through Jackman Florida Wagyu Beef, LLC. They began partnering with other cattle producers and will soon buy their first batch of calves

back from Mike Marker of Cambridge.

Marker runs a Red Angus-based herd, and breeds to Charolais bulls to get females that he believes are perfect for breeding to Wagyu bulls. "You get the muscle and growth of the Charolais along with the marbling of the Wagyu," he said. "And we bring in the Red Angus to shore up quality."

Cossette pays a premium for the calves he buys back and continues to look for producers to include in his program. More information can be found at www. gvwagyu.com.

Farmers face important decisions related to U.S. health reform

America's farmers have important decisions to make – both for their families and for their employees – with the Affordable Care Act which went into effect Oct. 1.

"On the whole, farmers are more likely to be insured than the rest of the U.S. population," said Roberta Riportella, the Kansas Health Foundation's professor of Community Health at

Kansas State University.
"This is not surprising given that farm work is hazardous with many potential

occupational injuries. Purchasing health insurance and disability insurance is viewed by many farmers as essential elements in protecting their family farms."

The Affordable Care Act, also known as Obamacare, is now federal law that requires all Americans to have health insurance. One provision of the law is set up as a 'marketplace' through which individuals can make decisions on what's best for them

"Because premiums in the individual health insurance market are rated based on the individual's own risks, they have been exceptionally high for farmers," said Barbara O'Neill, an Extension specialist in financial resource management at Rutgers University.

The new law, O'Neill added, makes it more likely that "farm families will be able to purchase less expensive coverage."

A challenge for farmers, however, is that many will have to make insurance decisions for their families and their business.

Farms with less than 50 employees will not be required to provide insurance, and thus won't face government penalties, O'Neill said.

But, she adds, "tax credits are available to help the smallest employers (less than 25 employees) pay for the cost of employee health insurance."

O'Neill added that a mandate for large farms (more than 50 employees) to provide health care coverage is currently delayed. So fines, which could be as much as \$3,000 for every employee,

will not be imposed until January 2015. Riportella shared three tips to help farm families make decisions about insurance coverage for themselves and their employees:

• Compare the cost and features of your current insurance with those in the new insurance 'market-place.' State-based navigators and insurance agents can assist farmers in making decisions on personal insurance. "If you are considering

Is the answer blowing in the wind?

Kansas Farm Bureau With each passing day there's more interest in the Grain Belt Express Clean Line transmission project. This is the proposed direct current (DC) electric transmission line that would run from near Spearville north and east across the state to the Kansas-Missouri border.

Thousands of farmers and ranchers who live and work along the proposed route of this project may need to alter their practices if the line is built across their property.

Like other Kansans, farmers and ranchers understand the importance of developing our state's wind resources. They also realize that in order to maximize the potential for wind de-

velopment, transmission lines are necessary to move power to population centers across the state and the na-

If Grain Belt is successful in building this transmission line, nearly 1,000 more wind towers could go online in southwestern Kansas. This could result in an economic boom for a part of the state that is reeling from extended drought and the impact of the declining Ogallala Aquifer on the grain and feedlot industries.

Utilities building transmission lines in Kansas should look at options that minimize the impact on landowners and create positive long-term relationships between agriculture and industry.

Compensation should be paid annually and based on the fair market value of the property impacted by transmission line easements or restrictions, says Mike Irvin, Kansas Farm Bureau legislative counsel. If lines impact farm or ranching operations or requires alteration of facilities, those expenses should be included in any compensation pack-

"Sitings should be located along section of property lines," Irvin says. "Landowners may be able to maximize the potential of their land and minimize logistical inconvenience - even if a line is built on their property.'

Developers must restore damage to grasslands and compensate for crop damage resulting from activity associated with the building, maintenance and operation of the line.

"Transmission line easements often try to shift or place liability for any unintended or inadvertent damage to structures to the landowner," Irvin says. "The KCC should require

developers to assume and mange that risk."

Transmission lines have the potential to interfere with modern agricultural technologies that are expensive and provide necessary, valuable data to farmers and ranchers about their production practices.

"We strongly suggest that before the KCC approves any transmission line routes in Kansas, that studies be conducted to show potential impacts and efforts be made by developers to minimize interference to landowners, their property and opera-

Are there other unknown and possible unintended consequences?

Consider the following: there has been no discussion of the impact or location of generator lead lines that will connect wind towers with the conversion station. There are no restrictions to prevent other power generation companies from accessing the line

As I write this, our federal government has been shut down, but by the time the paper comes out it may be up and running again. Regardless of how that plays out, a story hit my desk today that I think illustrates what is good in our country and our ability to still do what's right even when the wheels seem to be coming off the

The government shutdown forced the closure of national parks and monuments. So when a group of 85 WWII veterans headed to D.C. with the Heartland Honor Flight, there was a good chance they would not get to see the memorial

built in their honor. However, Kansas Rep. Lynn Jenkins took a stand and hosted them anyway, issuing this statement: "We lose more than 600 of these WWII veterans each day - this is probably their only chance to see their memorial. We owe this to our greatest generation - it's the least we can do. These veterans stormed the beaches at Normandy, liberated Europe and raised the flag at Iwo Jima to protect and preserve freedom across the world."

The picture that accompanied the press release shows the aged veterans - some in wheelchairs, others holding canes and some waving little American flags. Just looking at it brought tears to my eyes.

I first visited the WWII Memorial shortly after it opened in 2004. I will never forget the sight of elderly men and women, some wearing American Legion hats or vests, standing at the section of the memorial that represented the theater they served in, tears just streaming down their faces. For so long they had waited for a memorial to honor their service and the sacrifices made by the ones who never made it home.

This summer when I was there with the youth group, it was still that memorial that had the greatest effect on me. I looked





Spice Up Your Peaches With Something New

Baked Peaches With Pistachio

- 6 peaches, ripe but firm halved & pits removed
- 6 ounces pistachios, shelled 2 macaroons (biscuits) or 2 amaretti (biscuits)
- 2 tablespoons ground almonds
- 2 tablespoons caster sugar 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 egg yolk
- 3 tablespoons orange blossom water or 3 tablespoons rose water
- Low-fat plain yogurt, option-
- 2 to 3 tablespoons honey Approximately 10 ounces
- 2 cinnamon sticks
- Orange peel, few strips
- 2 tablespoons orange blossom water or 2 tablespoons rose water

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Coarsely chop pistachios and biscuits. Put into a bowl and mix into a paste with the almonds, sugar, cinnamon, egg yolk, and orange blossom water or rose water.

Fill the cavity of each



peach generously with this mixture, and arrange the fruit closely in a medium size baking dish.

To prepare the syrup, dissolve the honey in water over a gentle heat, add cinnamon sticks, orange strips and boil for 5-6 minutes until slightly thickened. Stir in orange blossom water or rose water and pour around the peaches.

Bake 15 minutes or until the peaches look soft without falling apart, basting occasionally. Serve with yogurt.

Habanero-Peach Butter

2 tablespoons olive oil 2 habanero peppers or 4 jalapeno chiles, minced 1/2 medium red bell pepper,

minced 1/2 medium shallot, minced 6 tablespoons balsamic vinegar (do not substitute) 1 tablespoon honey

3 large ripe peaches, unpeeled, pitted & sliced 3/4 pound unsalted butter, softened

Heat the oil over high heat in a medium saucepan. Add the chiles, bell pepper, and shallot; cook over high heat for 2 minutes. Add the vinegar and honey to the chile mixture, reduce the heat to low and simmer until almost all the liquid has evaporated, about 3 minutes Remove from the heat; cool.

Place 2 of the peaches and the butter in a food processor or blender. Process until well mixed. Add cooled chile mixture to the butter puree, and process until well blended. Transfer the butter mixture to small bowl. Mince the remaining peach, add it to the butter mixture, and blend well. Cover and refrigerate in an air-tight container until ready to use, or freeze





USDA reports corn and soybean stocks down 17 percent from 2012

USDA's National Agricul-Statistics Service (NASS) has reported that on September 1 there were 824 million bushels of old crop corn and 141 million bushels of old crop soybeans in storage. Corn and soybean stocks stored in all positions were down 17 percent from 2012, according to the quarterly Grain Stocks report.

On September 1, there were 275 million bushels of corn stored on farms and 549 stored off the farm, down 12 and 19 percent from the prior year, respectively. The U.S. corn disappearance totaled 1.94 billion bushels during June-August, down from 2.16 billion bushels during the same period last year.

NASS reported that as of September 1, there were 39.6 million bushels of soybeans stored on the farm. up 3 percent from 2012, and 101 million bushels off the farm, down 23 percent from last September. The U.S. soybean disappearance during June-August totaled 294 million bushels, down 41 percent from the same period last year.

In addition to releasing the Grain Stocks report, NASS also released the Small Grains 2013 Summary, which included the final tallies for U.S. wheat, oats and other small grains. According to the report, in 2013 U.S. small grain farmers in some parts of the country were challenged with adverse weather conditions causing delays in planting and harvesting.

NASS reported growers harvested 45.2 million acres of wheat this year, down 8 percent from 2012. The levels of production and changes from 2012 by type are winter wheat, 1.53 billion bushels, down 7 percent; other spring wheat, 532 million bushels, down 2 percent; and Durum wheat. 61.5 million bushels, down 26 percent.

Oat production is estimated at 66.0 million bushels, up 3 percent from 2012 but the third-lowest production on record, according to NASS. Harvested area, at 1.03 million acres, is slightly below last year and is the second lowest acreage harvested for grain on record.

Due to delays in this year's harvest, NASS will re-survey small grain growers in Montana and North Dakota. Operators will be asked to verify and update, if necessary, the acreage, yield, production and stock estimates for barley, oats, Durum wheat and other spring wheat.

When producers were surveyed earlier this month, there was significant unharvested acreage in these two states. As a result of this resurveying effort, NASS may release updated estimates for small grains in its November 8 Crop Production report. All NASS reports are available online at www. nass.usda.gov.



The KCC worked with Harvesters Community Food Network and their Manhattan area partner, Flint Hills Breadbasket, and the 443 pounds of canned and boxed food goods donated will go toward feeding the hungry in Riley County.



The Devil's Brew

James Riely was attracted to Arkansas City in 1880 after the Atchison, Topeka, and Santa Fe Railroad reached the city. The town was platted on a peninsula of ground between the Arkansas River on the west and the Walnut River on the east. The Indian Territory border was four miles south. As with most frontier towns, the railroad brought prosperity to the town, creating a boom atmosphere. Arkansas City was just the place for an energetic young businessman.

Riely established a drug store and quickly became a fixture in the town. The local editor described him as "a young man of more than ordinary intelligence, and, although at times quarrelsome, his general manner was prepossessing, and he gathered about him a circle of friends and admirers. His business prospered, and a bright future lay before him." He appeared to be on the road to success until he acquired a race

Horse racing was popular all over America. However, the pastime, which involved gambling, was considered an immoral pursuit by respectable citizens. Riely dearly loved

his horse and could be seen regularly at the track seven miles southwest of town in Indian Territory.

In late September, 1881, a Missouri man by the name of Burch caused a considerable stir in Arkansas City when he suggested that his horse could outrun James Riely's horse. The challenge grew to a state of frenzy with fervent backers for each horse. The race was set and promoted as a "race for blood" among horse men. "Hacks and carriages were brought forth, and everyone of a sporting disposition turned out."

Riely was known to sell liquor to customers against Kansas prohibition laws. On the day of the race he sold two pints of liquor to Thomas J. Armstrong. Armstrong attended the race, and placed his bet on the Missouri horse. Riely's horse faltered and lost, bringing considerable argument over the fairness of the race.

Later that night Armstrong showed up at Riely's drug store. "Armstrong is happy," reported the Winfield Courier, "and

doesn't care one cent. whether the white-winged angel of peace is within one mile or fifty of the spot." He just wanted to see Riely squirm and everyone knew Riely was passionate about his horse. He was passionate about everything.

When Armstrong asked Riely to smoke a cigar with him, Riely angrily replied "No. I won't smoke with anyone who bet against my horse." Armstrong insisted that Riely couldn't smoke with a better man, and suggesting that Riely was not in his class, Armstrong

added that he thought he was the best man in town. Riely's friends could see that the evening was about to have a bad ending and suggested Riely close the store, but Armstrong refused to leave. He was pushed outside and in the commotion Armstrong was hurled from the raised sidewalk to the ground eighteen inches below.

In the meantime, Riely could not be held back. He kicked at Armstrong as he was getting up from the ground. In the ensuing scuffle Armstrong pulled a

pistol from his pocket "and quick as lightning," the loud report of the pistol broke upon "the still night air." With a cry of "I'm dead! I'm dead!" the young druggist "fell in his tracks." Riely's friends gently lifted him and carried his lifeless body to the counter in his store. Armstrong ran up the street to a barn, acquired a horse, and raced out of town.

While Cowley County sheriff Albert Shenneman was mounting a posse to go after Armstrong, the fugitive's horse returned to the barn. Thirty minutes later

the posse was in the saddle and in hot pursuit. It was an easy matter to follow the fresh tracks of the horse. When Armstrong found himself surrounded the killer first "yelled like an Apache Indian," then gave himself up without a fight.

The posse brought Armstrong back Arkansas City where he was compelled to look upon the lifeless form of his victim before being whisked off to jail. Armstrong was sentenced to fifteen years in the penitentiary; however the Courier noted that Riely had contributed to the tragic event through his own disregard for the law. "The liquor that was unlawfully dealt out over his counter was the same liquor that made a devil of Armstrong..." Disregard for the law and the devil's brew ruined two lives the day two unfortunate men crossed paths on The Way West.

The two-day functional exercise, which will be based out of the Biosecurity Research Institute (BRI) on K-State's main campus, will enable KDA and its partners in neighboring states, other state agencies, federal and local government, industry and universities to practice the state's foreign animal disease response plan. More than 200 individuals will participate in the functional exercise, which will be based on the confirmation of foot-andmouth disease in the United States. According to Kansas Secretary of Agriculture Dale Rodman, the exercise will provide valuable preparation experience for the agency and all stakeholders as well as identify gaps in the response plan.

and procedures that have been developed and revised since the Stop Animal Movement Statewide KS-OK border exercise was conducted with Oklahoma in 2009. The KDA Division of Animal Health has been working with more than 50 stakeholders from a variety of agencies and associations to refine plans and develop Memorandums of Understanding with border states to ensure collaboration and continuity of business for the livestock industry should a highly contagious disease outbreak occur in the United States. K-State, Riley County and the State of Kansas will activate emergency operations centers as part of the October exercise.





UNL scientist: genetic modification one key tool for feeding growing population

Genetic modification of species has been a driving force of nature for thousands of years, and humans' ability to harness the science behind it is a critical, and safe, component of efforts to feed a growing global population, a leading plant scientist said recently.

Sally Mackenzie, Ralph and Alice Raikes Chair for Plant Science in the Center for Plant Science Innovation at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, was the first speaker in the Heuermann Lectures' 2013-14 series.

Mackenzie's lecture, titled "Beyond GMOs to a More Honest Dialogue About Our Food," put today's science into historical perspective.

"Recombinant DNA is the biological driving force of nature," she said. "It is a fact of life. It is why you have your mother's blue eyes and your father's dark hair."

Nature's genetic modification process helps ensure a diversity of life on the planet, and agricultural scientists long have been modifying plants too, through cross-breeding, she told a packed Hardin Hall auditorium at the lecture, sponsored by the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources at UNL.

Scientists first developed a genetically modified plant – an antibiotic-resistant tobacco – in 1982. Great progress has been made since, Mackenzie said.

"We've simply taken advantage of a very natural process that goes on in nature all the time," Mackenzie

Until 2000, that process was motivated by a goal to increase yields, and profits. In 2000, though, what Mackenzie called "the start of a golden era," golden rice was developed. That nutritionally enhanced rice can help feed starving and malnourished children in the developing world, in particular preventing blindness that now strikes up to 500,000 a year because of a lack of Vitamin A. The effort was funded not by corporations for profit but by leading philanthropic organizations such as the Rockefeller and Bill & Melinda Gates foundations.

"This is why scientists get into science, to make a difference in the world," Mackenzie said. "This just makes me proud to be a part of this community."

There are downsides to genetically modified crops, but mostly due to mismanagement, not the science itself, she said. So-called "super bugs" and "super weeds" have emerged because the crops have been overplanted.

However, Mackenzie said, there is no evidence genetically modified crops are unsafe to eat. She dismissed claims otherwise as bad science or politically motivated activism.

'We're not encountering any health effects yet," she

The continued debate over genetically modified crops is a "sociological and psychological discussion," not a scientific one, Mackenzie said, and it's a distraction from the reality: The world's population, now about 7 billion, is expected to top 9 billion by 2050. There's not enough water or arable land to feed those people using current agronomic practices.

A related science that also shows great promise is epigenetics. Mackenzie, one of the world's leading scientists in exploring this technology, said this process focuses on changing how plants express their genes, rather than changing the genes themselves. Early findings indicate this technology could significantly increase yields.

"This is very new territory for the plant-breeding community. There's a lot of potential," she said.



Through the Eye of a Horse

They don't see the world the way we do. Horses see things different than humans. We see things with binocular vision. That means both our eyes work together and see the same thing. Horses have monocular vision, which means each eye is used separately and, because their eyes are on the opposite side of their head, they can see two different objects at once. What one eye sees has no connection to what the other eye sees. That's a simple explanation why you have to train both sides of the horse. You can teach them to make turnarounds to the left but when you try to make a turnaround to the right, they don't understand what you want. You have to start over teaching them to

step around to the right. If you always mount on the left and want to instead mount on the right, don't be surprised if, at first, your horse won't stand still and becomes nervous when you try mounting from the right. That right eye has never seen you step into the right stirrup and the horse doesn't know what to expect.

We see straight ahead and a little to the side. We have good peripheral vision which means we can see things to the side fairly well but we can't see behind us. Horses have poor peripheral vision but they can see behind them. Seeing what's behind them is very important for a prey animal. They can see something trying to sneak up behind them. However. the poor peripheral vision

limits their ability to see something sneaking up on their sides and they are prone to bolt at the least indication of movement from their sides. They have a few blind spots that if you are aware of them can help you work around or train a horse in a more professional manner and avoid spooking the horse by creating movement or noise near these blind spots. If they can't see what is causing a commotion near their blind spot, they'll become nervous and possibly bolt away. Picture the 360-degree circle of a compass with the horse right in the middle looking north or at 360 degrees. They can see almost 350 degrees around them using their eyes separately on the sides and both eyes to look in front of them. Their vision goes from around 185 degrees of the compass clockwise all the way around to about 175 degrees of the compass.

There are two main blind spots. They cannot see directly behind their tail or the area of the compass around 180 degrees. To each side of this area, vision begins to improve. The other main area is directly in front of them in a cone- shaped area beginning at their eyes and going out to a point three or four feet directly in front of them and also right behind the head. That blind spot extends over their back and behind the tail when standing with the head facing straight forward. As a horse jumps an obstacle, the obstacle briefly disappears from sight right before the horse begins to jump. It has entered that forward blind spot. So a horse going over a jump

loses sight of the jump just before it jumps.

That also means that a horse can't see part of your body when you're sitting in the saddle. How many times have you been on a horse and you pull your hat off or slap a bug and your horse reacts or spooks from the movement? Perhaps you swung your hat out into their field of vision and it surprised them. When I ride colts and have an itch or want to wipe sweat off my

brow, I am very careful to move my arm or hat slowly in the blind spot to prevent surprises with the youngsters. Horses also have a small range of binocular vision. Their binocular vision extends in front of them in an approximate arc of 65 degrees. They use this to look ahead in the distance. Ever notice how a horse will lift his head to look ahead? Usually they have their ears at attention too when they are trying to see

something in the distance because they are trying to figure out what it is they see. They raise their head because it enables them to see better in the distance. In order to see something on the ground below them, they will lower their head to see better using that limited binocular vision. You've probably noticed when you walk directly toward a horse they will sometimes turn their head a little to the side to see you better and take you out of that blind spot directly in front of their head. The horse also has a

visual streak, which is a linear shape within the retina. Horses have better acuity (make out more detail) when the objects they are looking at fall in this region. They will tilt or raise their heads to help place the objects within the area of the visual streak to see more detail. They also don't like it when you work in the blind spot in front of them brushing their face or combing their forelock. When I do those chores, I try to stand off to the side a little so they can see me better. It makes them more

comfortable if they can see what I'm doing.

It's an advantage for anyone working with horses to understand the limitations of a horse's vision. They can use their knowledge to work with horses in a manner that enhances the animal's awareness of your activities. When they can see what you are doing, they will be more relaxed and comfortable making it easier to work with or train them.

Kansas growers to pay more for wheat check-off

(AP) - Kansas growers will soon be paying more for the wheat "check-off" program that supports research and market development.

The Kansas Wheat Commission announced recently that its board has approved a check-off increase to 2 cents per bushel from the current 1.5 cents per bushel, effective

Commission chairman Ron Suppes says that shrinking government research funding, combined with fewer wheat acres and smaller crops, make it more vital than ever for farmers to invest in their industry.

The new Kansas Wheat Innovation Center that opened last December is a \$10.3 million research facility that is expected to create new wheat varieties.

The industry group says the check-off increase will help pay down debt on the building and fund research at the center.

Pond Management Workshop planned near Valley Falls October 14

By David Hallauer, Meadowlark Extension District, Crops and Soils, Horticulture

Whether we like to admit it or not, most ponds are less than maintenance-free. There are always repairs to be made to the tube or trees to remove from the dam. Then there's stocking, aquatic weed control, and simply hoping that the thing doesn't leak! Your management and maintenance can affect the pond in a big way.

To help you with some of those management tasks, the Meadowlark Extension District is hosting a Pond Management Workshop starting at 5:15 p.m. on Monday evening, October 14th. Larry and Kristy Burns will be our hosts at their pond located one half mile east of the junction of Highway K-16 and Ferguson Road on the south side of the road (approximately two and a half miles east of the K-4/K-16 junction watch for signs for parking) just east of Valley Falls.

Shawnee County Weed Director John Kabus will talk about pond weed identification and some options for control. Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism Fisheries Biologist Kirk Tjelmeland will discuss stocking as well as pond evaluation and use. Copies of KSU's Aquatic Weed Control publication will also be available.

We won't be out there long, but while we're there, we'll try to help you get a better handle on at least a couple of management tasks you can implement for your pond.

Re-pledged 2012 crop sugar loans are not subject to sequester. 2013 crop loan rates are not affected.

Collecting and analyzing yield data is important at harvest time

Collecting yield data for crops like corn, soybeans and wheat at harvest time is an important step when it comes to precision ag management techniques, a University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension precision ag specialist says.

Yield data collected from yield monitors allows producers who have been doing precision ag management to evaluate year to year what is happening in their fields, and, more specifically, within management zones in those fields, said Joe Luck, UNL Extension precision ag specialist.

Yield monitor calibration is one of the most important aspects of collecting that data, and it's often overlooked by many producers at harvest time, he

"It is important that yield monitors are calibrated for every different crop that producers harvest," Luck said. "If you are harvesting corn, you need to perform a calibration for corn, if you switch to soybeans, you need to perform a calibration for that and so forth.

"If you want to get the most accurate data, you want to have a good calibration for that crop."

Luck said another thing that is becoming very important right now is "cleaning" the yield data, or removing the errors from that data.

"This has become a very important part of the process as people try to get really accurate infor-

mation from their fields," he said. Producers have been using vield monitors for more than 20 years, but the systems haven't changed very much and still tend to generate some

He said there is a software program available from the U.S. Department of Agriculture called Yield Editor that can help remove those errors.

"This is becoming very important as producers use yield data to develop new prescription layers for example nitrogen recommendation based on yield information from the previous year - it is important to have accurate yield data to move that process forward," he said.

Luck also recommends producers become familiar with the capabilities of farm management software to bring in yield data from the harvester, display that data and then perform some sort of analysis of that data. Even if producers are going to allow a trusted advisor to manage their data, understanding how that process works will result in better communication about the goals for their operation.

Ethanol byproducts still pay their way in feedlot rations

Paying the feed bill has cleaned out bank accounts faster than Jesse James in recent years, as high corn prices left cattlemen everywhere looking for the cheapest, most efficient alterna-

Answering that search, Galen Erickson shared research results and insight on distillers grains at the Feeding Quality Forums in Omaha, Neb., and Garden City in August.

As of late summer, the ethanol byproducts were selling at near corn prices. Many cattlemen responded by cutting back or removing it, but Erickson, feedlot Extension specialist at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, said that could be a mistake.

Ethanol plants remove starch from grain, he explained, thus concentrating the remaining protein, oils and minerals in byproducts that have nearly three times the amount of those as corn.

'No matter how expensive it gets, it's still an inexpensive protein source," Erickson said. He suggested lowering the amount of distillers grains in a diet to no less than 15% to lower input costs while maintaining a relatively cheap protein supplement.

After reviewing research

on feeding performance, he explained there are three common forms to consider.

All ethanol plants produce wet distillers grains and solubles, frequently mixed together (WDGS). Some plants partially or completely dry the WDGS, producing modified distillers grain (MDGS) or dried distillers grains (DDGS). These three products start out the same way, but feeding performance differs.

Research has studied performance of all three in comparison to dry-rolled corn in feedlot rations.

"Wetter is better," Erickson said as he went over the results. With diets including 30% distillers grains, WDGS had the most value at approximately 137% that of corn.

During his presentation in southwest Kansas, Erickson warned of local exceptions because of steamflaked corn fed in the region rather than dry-rolled corn. Research showed performance of WDGS was distinctly lower in a steam-flaked ration: gains decreased when more than 15% WDGS were added to the steam-flaked diet, while feed conversions stayed the same.

"So how you process the corn appears to dramatically impact the value of distillers relative to corn," he where you have access to a lot of distillers grains and you're planning to feed 20% or more, I would not recommend flaked corn."

For those feeding a steam-flaked diet, Erickson offered another option. He found feed-to-gain ratios and average daily gains could be improved by including more solubles in the ration.

Most rations that contain solubles have no more than 10%. But if the price is right, Erickson would double the amount. Research showed optimum gains and conversions when 18% to 27% solubles were included. That may change the appearance of the feed, he added. "But cattle don't really care what the diet looks like."

Nearly half the ethanol

added a new step in processing: to cut back on tonnage shipped out, they spin off a third of the oil from those soluble first.

Erickson expected that to decrease feeding performance but was surprised by research results that showed no large impact. So far, studies show a range of 1% improvement to a 3.5% decline in performance depending on the setup, and results will be monitored over time.

Producers often ask if distillers grains in a ration require changes in roughages or additives, but the Extension specialist said to manage the same as any grain-based diet.

One concern associated with feeding a high level of

said. "If you're in an area plants across the U.S. have distillers grains is that one of the concentrated minerals is sulfur. Too much of that can lead to polio in cattle. But the Nebraska research often feeds cattle much higher levels of distillers grains than any commercial operation would.

> "So if there's going to be any polio, we should see it," Erickson said, noting they have seen 28 cases out of 17,000 head finished in the past seven years. Summariz

ing that data, he concluded as long as an operation is feeding less than 40% distillers grains in the diet and the water does not have high levels of sulfur, there should be no problems with polio.

Managing key to health of horse pasture

In my experience if there ever was a species of animal that needed to be rotationally grazed, it would be the horse. Because of their anatomy and grazing behavior, horses can be difficult to manage to keep a pasture healthy and productive in the long-term.

Horses are notorious for selecting their favorite plant species in a pasture, grazing them to the ground, and then continuously grazing the new sprouts while leaving other species untouched. The grasses that do get continuously grazed are unable to photosynthesize because of their lack of leaf surface and have to draw energy from their root reserves. Eventually, these species will die off and bare spots will begin to form in the pasture or weeds will take over since the grass can no longer keep them suppressed. Meanwhile, other valuable forage is wasted as it is allowed to become mature and unpalatable.

There are ways to manage this problem, however. A great publication by Mis-

souri NRCS is titled "Pasture Management Guide for Horse Owners" and can be found at www.nrcs.usda.gov /Internet/FSE_DOCMENTS /nrcs144p2_011001.pdf. This publication suggests a minimum of four paddocks to rotationally graze horses with 12 or more being ideal. By rotating horses throughout the grazing season, horses are forced to more uniformly graze and plants receive a recovery period to replenish their root reserves. Pastures should be grazed when they are 6-10 inches tall and then horses should be removed when the average height is 3-4 inches. To really manage the pasture well, you should mow the forage to a uniform height of 3-4 inches and drag or harrow the paddock to spread out the manure. Mowing will prevent the ungrazed plants from becoming old and mature and provide more sunlight for grazed plants to regrow. Horses do not like grazing next to manure, so dragging the pasture will eliminate these ungrazable areas while spreading out the nutrients and exposing parasites to sunlight if present. Tempo-

rary fencing with polywire and lightweight fiberglass or plastic posts is an excellent and inexpensive way to make paddocks out of your existing pasture. This can easily be set up and moved periodically in less than an

It is always best to have a "sacrificial" lot to put horses in when the pasture is not suited for grazing. This will allow forages to get a good start in the spring before they are grazed and provide a place to put horses when conditions are muddy. Horse hooves are worse than other species when it comes to tearing up a pasture and can cause a lot of damage quite quickly. Take caution in switching horses from hay back to green pasture however, since they can easily colic or founder. By feeding them their normal amounts of hay and turning them out for just a short time on the pasture, horses will become adapted to the green forage. Grazing time on the pasture can be increased over a week or two until the horse adjusts. Also watch out for our poisonous forage species and weeds. Alsike clover, sweet clover,

sorghum species, and switch grass are among the species that horses should avoid.

If you haven't rotationally grazed in the past, now would be a good time to make that sacrificial lot, pull horses off the pasture, and prepare for next season's grazing. Grasses need this recovery time to store carbohydrates in their roots to survive over the winter. For brome pastures, soil test now for pH, P, and K. Phosphorus and Potassium should be applied in the fall which will help the grass develop a good root system for the winter. If legumes are not present in the pasture, nitrogen should also be applied at 40 pounds per acre in early fall and another 60-70 pounds per acre in January or February. Intra-seeding or frost seeding legumes into the pasture in the spring will increase the quality of the pasture and reduce the need for nitrogen fertilizer in the future. Weeds also need to be controlled on a periodic basis, but will be less of a problem with a well-managed stand of forages established. Most weeds are best controlled in the spring and early summer when they are actively growing, however some species will react well to herbicides applied in the fall. If you are unsure of your weed

species, bring a sample in to your local extension office for identification and recommendations. Now is also a good time to drag or harrow the pasture for reasons mentioned earlier.

Extension has more information and many ideas to help you manage your horse pasture than the little I've been able to squeeze into this article. As I drive across the countryside, horse pastures seem to catch my eye as areas that are notoriously in poor shape. We are certainly not going to change how a horse will graze, but we can be much better managers when it comes to their pastures.

What is agroforestry?

Forests and farms may seem like two completely different things, but agroforestry puts them togeth-

Agroforestry offer landowners an opportunity to diversify farm income, provide habitat for wildlife and practice good land stewardship, says Tim Baker, regional horticulture specialist for University of Missouri Extension.

'Agroforestry involves the intentional integration of trees with other aspects of agriculture," Baker said. "There's not only a place for foresters in agroforestry, but also row crop, livestock and even horticultural producers."

Agroforestry concentrates on five main practices: alley cropping, forest farming, silvopasture, riparian buffers and windbreaks.

"Alley cropping is the practice of planting crops in between rows of trees," Baker said. "It may seem counterproductive for a farmer to plant trees in a field, and in most cases this is not what a farmer wants or needs. However, sometimes it makes sense." In the early years, crops are harvested between the rows of trees. Later, lumber and/or nuts and other crops may be harvested


from the trees as they mature.

Common alley cropping plantings include wheat, corn, soybeans or hay planted between rows of black walnut or pecan trees, he said. Nontraditional or value-added crops might include sunflowers or medicinal herbs between rows of nut trees alternated with nurserystock trees. Fine hardwoods like walnut, oak, ash and pecan in alley cropping systems can potentially provide high-value lumber or veneer logs while the landowner derives income from a companion crop planted in the alleyways.

Forest farming is the practice of growing highvalue specialty crops under the protection of a forest canopy. "There are many shade-tolerant crops that can be grown within a forest. Some of these are quite valuable," Baker said.

Forest crops like ginseng, mushrooms and decorative ferns are sold for medicinal, culinary and ornamental uses. "Or your entire planting may be of woody species that produce food, such as nut crops or elderberries," he said.

Silvopasture is the inte-



In a typical silvopasture practice, perennial grasses and/or grass-legume mixes are planted between rows of trees for livestock pasture. The trees not only provide a long-term investment for nut crops or a timber harvest, but also provide the animals shade in the summer and a windbreak in the winter.

Riparian forest buffers deal with areas along stream banks and other waterways. Farmers losing cropland to streams might create a buffer with trees, shrubs, grasses and forbs to prevent erosion. "In extreme cases, it may take some engineering practices to help stabilize the stream bank," Baker said.

Windbreaks can protect livestock and crops, and control soil erosion. Windbreaks can help keep drifting snow away from roads or spread snow more evenly across a field, increasing spring soil moisture.

I'm a rose lover because most bloom up to the first frost. Their colors and fragrance draw my attention. Roses also vary in form and leaf for added interest. With approximately 3,000 varieties available, it would seem to me that everyone would have a rose that they

Modern shrub roses are the current trend in rose growing. My favorite is the Knock-Out® with its cherry red fragrant blooms. All roses bloom in the spring and the modern roses keep on blooming. Pruning to keep them the size you want is about their only maintenance.

Hybrid tea roses are grown mostly for harvest of the blooms for enjoyment indoors. Our local public gardens in the Manhattan City Park and University Gardens have several varieties of roses to view. These roses perform best with some care from pests, spent flower removal and consistent water. My seven varieties of hybrid teas supply my home and office desk with blooms all season long.

Fall moisture and temperatures spurs a big burst of blooms before dormancy. These are generally left to produce the seed pods or hips. Some of my roses already have colorful hips on

them since I didn't get around to removing these seed pods. Roses will go into dormancy as the temperatures and light levels diminish. No fertilizer is needed until next year. Irrigation is only to keep the plants alive and not needed in abundance. Pruning until frost is only to remove damaged plant parts.

I do most of my pruning and disease control in the spring as they are coming out of dormancy. Some rose growers prune at winter dormancy and apply a fungicide. My rose garden hasn't needed this treatment.

selves for the winter. The roses that are not winter hardy need some winter protection applied. I've mulched my hybrid tea roses at different times over the years. Generally, I put a foot of woodchip mulch over the crown of the roses that need it after several frosts.

The pleasure I get from roses is tenfold from what I put in. Enjoy the roses around you this season. They still have much to offer before the frost.



Where realistic meets high quality — Kansas family roots feed CAB Feedlot Partner of the Year

By Steve Suther

Ford County Feed Yard is a big one. In fact, Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB) has never licensed a larger feedyard, but the 50,000head-capacity business runs like a collection of smaller

Maybe that's because it is family owned and operated, and 22-year manager Danny Herrmann is the youngest son of a founding partner. Wheat-stocker and feeder George Herrmann went in with four others, including three from what later became National Beef in Dodge City, to build the feedyard 15 miles to the southeast, near Ford, starting in 1972.

Big from the start at 15.000 head, it doubled a couple of years later and was added to in sections to reach current capacity by the time its current manager took the reins in 1990.

That made the alleyways seem like neighborhoods for different types of cattle that came in off the wheat or up

Or maybe, Herrmann suggests today, "When you have to get in 100,000 head a year, you've got to dance with everybody."

Seeing more and better Angus cattle coming in, Herrmann decided in 2010 to do

more than dance and became a CAB partner yard. He gradually built up to enrolling 5,000 head by last spring, and 15,407 head in

the 12 months ending in May

this year.

Herrmann still feeds a huge number of cattle that are not eligible for the Certified Angus Beef ® (CAB®)

of 45 at the feedlot committed to the program and showed the greatest increase in single-year enrollments across the U.S. with a respectable 21.4% CAB and Prime level.

Ford County Feed Yard channeled several thousand cattle into the CAB supply chain in the last year, while expanding data feedback and sharing with customers for herd improvement. That's part of the reason the company was honored at the CAB annual conference in Desert Palms, Calif., Sept. 20-22. Herrmann and his wife Colleen accepted the CAB Feedlot Partner of the Year Award for yards with more than 15,000 head capacity.

Bryan Adams, Welda, was a college roommate back in the 1980s and has fed with Herrmann for 28 years. His AAA Farms backgrounding yard has room for calves from his own 400 commercial Angus cows, plus those from several neighbors using Angus genetics, bought to fill trucks for load lots.

"My dad started with nothing and traded his way up, but calves were usually one-third good, a third medium and a third runts,' Adams says. "Twenty years ago I got more involved and we built on a set of 30 Montana-origin Angus heifers."

Making use of feedback from Ford County and registered Angus bulls mainly from the Gardiner, Hinkle and Ratcliff Ranch programs, Adams developed half spring- and half fallcalving Angus herds that do not produce runts.

Closeouts on two loads of heifers this year show average daily gains of 3.82 pounds (lb.) in February and 3.58 lb. in July, both converting dry matter at better than six to one. CAB acceptance was 40.3% and 34%, respectively.

Relationships like this

are the reason Ford County Feed Yard is thriving. Herrmann enjoys sharing information because it's good for customers and good for the beef industry.

"I say give them everything we know about what stuff does here, so they know. That's the best thing for a producer," he says. "Otherwise, they're always assuming, and usually assuming calves are better than they are."

"By working together, optimistic assumptions can become reality," Herrmann

K-State's Rogers honored for work in agricultural water resources management

Kansas State University professor of biological and agricultural engineering Danny Rogers, has been named a Fellow of the American Society of Agricultural and Biological Engineers. He was honored at the annual ASABE International Meeting in Kansas City, Mo., in July.

Rogers, who has given many presentations addressing water resource management in his 36 years at K-State, is an agricultural engineer with K-State Research and Extension. He,

along with K-State professor and colleague Gary Clark, was co-founder of the Kansas State University Mobile Irrigation Lab, designed to address reduced irrigation water availability.

Rogers and Clark also de-

veloped KanSched, the crop water use-based irrigation scheduling program, which was approved by the U.S. Department of Agriculture-Natural Resources Conservation Service in Kansas. KanSched is now also used in seven other states. "Rogers is recognized as

an authority in physical on-

farm evaluation testing of center pivot sprinklers," the ASABE said in announcing the award. "These evaluation tests have reduced sprinkler nozzle misapplications and have led to greatly improved on-farm usage in Kansas and other neighboring states, through educational and training activities."

He helped develop the Farm*A*Syst and Home* A*Syst educational programming for domestic wellhead protection and worked with the Kansas Farm Bureau in plugging abandoned wells across Kansas, which increases safety and helps keep contaminants from entering underground aquifers. Rogers was one of 13 individuals named ASABE fellows this


Michelle Busch was 1st High Individual: Erin Bush was 3rd High Individual; and Dorothy Menefee was 8th High Individual.
