Seven states compete at regional Heartland Envirothon in Flint Hills aquatics ecology, forestry,

Bringing together more than 35 high school student leaders in sustainability, applied life sciences and ecology, the Kansas Heartland Envirothon drew teams from Arkansas, Florida, Kansas, North and South Dakota, Tennessee and Texas for a week-long learning experience and competition at Rock Springs 4-H Center from July 21 to 25.

"Each of these teams competed in local, regional and state contests to be named overall state winners and earn the privilege to participate in the event at Rock Springs," said Tom Meek, coordinator of the Kansas Environthon Committee and Clay County Conservation District manager.

The original national contest fell through, and local leaders from Kansas took up the call to organize a regional Envirothon contest.

"When the North American Environthon contest that was supposed to be hosted in Georgia was cancelled in February, we decided to host an alternate event for the region," Meek said. "We made the decision on March 19; and 123 days later here we are. We made a leap of faith that we could do it.'

Planning the Event

Meek reached out to other state leaders in the region, and he found interested teams to join the event.

"I talked to a number of organizers from many states and a reccurring theme came up that many felt they didn't have enough time to put it all together after more than a year of planning," he said. "We reached this milestone of short-time turnaround with the help of many conservation districts across Kansas who supported us financially and with person-

"One thing I can say about the whole team is reflected in our state song: 'where seldom is heard a discouraging word,' and I certainly thank those people who stepped up," Meek said.

Teams of organizers centered on a hospitality team who organized learning trips. A competition team was responsible for the testing and judges. A budget and finance team raised the necessary support. The resource presentation team helped teach about the unique features of the Great Plains re-

A team from Chapman High School represented Kansas with Adrian Fink, Dakota Caldwell, Kaylen Gugler, Wade Hambright, Brittany Duer and advisor Trenton Horn.

Envirothon appealed to Fink because he set a goal to solve the energy crisis from the ground up to make the nation better.

"Envirothon helps to teach me how to involve

local communities to work on sustainability," Fink said.

Caldwell started on the Envirothon team as a freshman, like many who have years of experience in the contest when a senior recruited him.

"About two years ago, a former member came up to me and asked me to join the team," Caldwell said. "Our team got stronger each year."

Gugler plans to use what she learns to study agriculture in college.

Hambright, who grew up hunting and fishing with his family, wants to study wildlife management after high school.

"Even in my life, I've seen a drastic change in resources," Hambright said. "I want to make it my goal in life to make sure these resources are there for future generations who want to hunt or fish."

Duer, a future agronomist, loves to study science and the integration of many complex subjects to support and understand the interconnectedness of life.

"I want to know exactly what's happening with our soils, plants and animals," she said.

off the score to determine the overall winning team on the topic of "Sustainable Local Agriculture - Locally Grown" and used a scenario developed with the help of the Kansas Water Office. The scenario focused on a fictional Kansas ranching family and their efforts to develop practices to sustain water on their ranch and feedlot in southwest Kansas. The Texas team won this portion.

Overall, Tennessee finished in third place with \$400 awards for each member; Florida was second with \$600; and Texas received the championship plaque to display at their school, the Academy of Science and Technology in The Woodlands, Texas near Houston and \$1000 each.

Envirothon's Benefits

'Throughout the event, the students come together to solve real-world challenges by working as a team," said Brandon Dibben, chair of the Geary County

Conservation District. "Students will be able to learn from each other and professionals in the field to learn about the Flint Hills."

Troy Munsch, assistant state Natural Resources Conservations Services director, worked with more than a dozen professionals who led the students through stations to make observations and ask questions before the tests.

"We had some very good specialists and speakers to work with teams. Students could ask questions and learn from these resources to learn from the best of the best about our local region."

Dibben said environmental and sustainability issues are central to producers.

"At the heart of every farmer and rancher, is the need to sustain the environment," Dibben said. "We seek to bridge the gap between urban and rural populations with the best conservation practices."

Munsch said the students' future is vital to the role of conservation in upcoming generations.

"These students are ambassadors to the future to take this information to others," Munsch said. "As the farming and agriculture community gets smaller, more responsibility falls to our shoulders to share the message of what we're doing and what needs to be done.'

Kansas State considers \$150M research facility

(AP) - Kansas State University is seeking \$5 million in state funding to lay the groundwork for a \$150 million research facility that would focus on food.

University president Kirk Schulz requested the funding in the next fiscal year for the College of Agriculture and K-State Research and Extension to plan what is being called the Food Systems Research and Education Facility.

The proposal was discussed briefly during a recent Kansas Board of Regents budget session, the Lawrence Journal-World reported.

The project – which could involve the construction of several buildings - may be a few

years down the road, Schulz said, but he wants expected to start operating in 2022. It will focus to get legislators and other state officials familiar with the request.

The 200,000-square-foot facility would house labs, modern greenhouses, classrooms and Extension and distance education space, to be funded by a combination of federal, state and private funding, Schulz said.

"It will require all three to participate to make this a reality," he said.

The project would complement research at the planned National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility adjacent to Kansas State, Schulz and regents members said. The \$1 billion NBAF is primarily on infectious animal-borne diseases and threats to the food supply.

Research at the proposed Food Systems Research and Education Facility also would focus on the food supply, such as developing higheryielding crops, more intensive cropping systems and improved processing and distribution

Kansas State hopes to receive the \$5 million planning grant in the next fiscal year, which starts July 1, 2015. If it gets the money, the school could start construction on the facility in 2017-2018, with completion set two years later.



Speak from the heart

Life experiences teach plenty to those willing to learn. From the time I was a small boy, I remember my dad, uncles and grandfather talking and debating the issues of the day whenever we visited one another.

As I grew older, I began to hear some of what they said. I began to understand what they were talking about. But it has taken me several decades to process, learn from and use what my elders were saying about the issues of their days.

About the time I was half way through high school,

something he said finally sunk in. Grandpa Bert always said when you know a little about an issue, it's easy to form an opinion. When you learn a little more, it becomes a little more difficult to make a decision. And when you learn even more about an issue, your decision becomes, "just plain hard."

Lately, I've been thinking a lot about the issue of farmers and ranchers who often toil long days away by themselves. Sometimes they feel isolated with their backs against the wall. More than one farmer has expressed a feeling of, "It's ture has it been more important for farmers to ex-

me against the world."

press their basic wants, hopes and needs. Things like protection of personal property, a sound education for their children and a responsible, nonintrusive federal government, water usage to mention a few.

Never before has there been such an opportunity to express agriculture's needs. Today there are hundreds of satellites in orbit around our globe. Our cable system is loaded with hundreds of networks. The information highway continues to speed forward and we can communicate with people around the world instantly.

Today's technology allows individuals to access videos, music, news, weather, markets and consumer information - literally anything happening in our world today.

It's been more than three decades since newspapers entered the era of national and international publications. In this country, Christian Science Monitor and the Wall Street Journal pioneered the way.

Magazines and newspapers from all over the world are online today, available for anyone with the time and desire to read them. Of course they are still being shipped by mail. You can also read news, weather, markets and sports and screen after screen on your computer.

And that's not even mentioning all the data out there on social media - you know Twitter, Facebook, Pinterest - you name it, there's data out there. All you really need is time.

With all of these different information avenues at your fingertips, it may also be easy for some to tune out and turn off. Farmers. ranchers. businessmen, bankers and professionals cannot afford to do that. We must utilize these communication tools to tell our story. One way to help do this is by becoming active in the farm organizations and commodity groups of your choice. They can provide the vehicle to help you tell agriculture's story while developing sound farming policy that must be communicated.

Agriculture finally arrived as a headliner during the farm crisis of the mid-'80s. Every day, newspapers. radios, televisions and computers are chock full of stories on agriculture. Subjects range from food additives in processing to agricultural chemicals. Stories include animal welfare, cholesterol in the diet, sugarless foods, the farm bill and finding ways to increase agricultural trade.

Remember, farmers and ranchers must continue to voice their message in the public information arena. Agriculture must utilize this medium to promote and persuade others to bring about change - change that will benefit agriculture and a society that relies on U.S. farmers and ranchers for

the safest and most abundant food source in the world.

A Kansas citizen said it best more than 90 years ago, "This nation will survive, this state will prosper, the orderly business of life will go forward only if men can speak in whatever way given them to utter what their hearts hold - by voice, by postal card, by letter or by press."

William Allen White wrote this in his Emporia Gazette during the post-World War I recession in 1922. These words ring true today.

Maybe our day before the fair luck was changing, or maybe it was just setting us up for bigger calamities.

It was a good plan, run a couple of errands in Manhattan, drive up to Clay Center, deliver the tire and make it back to Manhattan for a doctor's appointment. The day started off smoothly, in fact, we were



Kansas cattle on feed down 6 percent

Kansas feedlots, with capacities of 1.000 or more head, contained 1.90 million cattle on feed on July 1, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. This inventory was down 6 percent from last year. This is the lowest July inventory since 1998.

Placements during June totaled 315,000 head, down 10 percent from

Fed cattle marketings for the month of June totaled 420,000 head, up 8 percent from last year.

Other disappearance during June totaled 15,000 head, up 5,000 head from last vear.





I have clipped and saved many of her recipes that were published in Grass & Grain and also have her cookbook that she had published in 2002 of many of her favorites. The recipes that I clipped from Grass & Grain have been pasted in her cookbook. I am sending one of my favorites from her cookbook. Thelma got this recipe from an area woman, Ira Hare. It is a really good recipe and I have used it many times at harvest time. I often make half a recipe - good with whipped cream on top.

APPLE GOODY

1 1/2 quart peeled, thinly sliced apples (use a good cooking apple; Thelma liked Granny Smith apples)

1 1/2 cups sugar 1/4 cup flour

1 teaspoon cinnamon 1 cup oatmeal

1 cup flour

1 cup brown sugar 1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon baking powder 1/2 cup melted margarine

Mix 1 1/2 cups white sugar, flour and cinnamon in

the sliced apples. Place in a buttered 9-by-13-inch baking dish. Mix oatmeal, flour, brown sugar, soda and baking powder in large bowl. Add melted margarine. Mix well. Put into baking dish. Put topping on apples. Pat down. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 40 minutes or until apples are tender.

FAST & EASY MEAT DISH 8-ounce package medium egg

noodles 1 pound ground beef 8-oz. package taco seasoning

3/4 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon pepper

cheese

8-ounce can tomato sauce 4-ounce package cream

12-ounce carton cottage cheese

1/2 cup Parmesan cheese

1/2 cup water

Cook noodles as directed on package. Drain; set aside. Brown beef, drain; add taco seasoning, salt, pepper and tomato sauce. Rinse the sauce can with 1/2 cup water.

Add to meat mixture. Cook on simmer until liquid is cooked down. In medium-size bowl mix softened cream cheese and cottage cheese. Stir in meat mixture. Add cooked noodles. 



Return to Ojito

We were exhausted the following morning, having arrived home filthy and mud-crusted around 1:30 a.m. My brother Reece, never an early riser, nevertheless showed up on our doorstep at a reasonably early hour for our return trip to the Ojito Wilderness. Though there were two opposing theories about the timing of our return — later in the day would allow the road to dry harder, but it could also put us into a second helping of monsoons - our weariness was the deciding factor. We had only so much energy left to expend, so the earlier the attempt, the better.

There were other factors to consider, imponderables and unanswerable questions that could only be resolved after the fact. What if we walked back to the abandoned truck and found the road impassable in both directions? Our only recourse would be to walk back out and have someone make a third 85-mile drive from Albuquerque to retrieve us. Nor was waiting for us an option for it might be six hours before we met pavement if we were forced to go out the far side.

Without trying to decipher the intangible differences between optimism and delusion, my father dropped off Reece and I at the entrance to the wilderness. We weren't sure of the road's condition and didn't want to take a chance on getting stuck, so felt this was our best alternative.

It wasn't, as we discovered within a hundred yards. From outward appearances not a drop of rain had fallen the previous day; the road was hard-packed

and dusty, the soil extending to the horizons sandy and seemingly dry as a

"Oh, man," my brother groaned as we passed a construction site a half-mile up the road. "This sucks."

we were on an adventure and this could only add to

stupid thing. There was nothing to do but continue, step by step by dusty step, hoping for a miracle—a lift to the arroyo.

When it came, a mile and a half in, maybe two miles, we were shocked to see Myron's smiling face peering out the window. In the back were Christian and Levi, his nephew and son, and Will at the wheel. "Hop in," Will said, and off we went in a plume of dust.

We didn't have time to formulate a plan for navigating the washed-out area, but we agreed that the last thing we wanted was to drive across the bad spot in the bed of a truck. 

In a recent visit to Huelskamp's office, leaders from Kansas Corn Growers Association (KCGA) delivered a letter signed by several ag and ethanol groups asking him to remove his name as a cosponsor of H.R. 4286, the American Energy Renaissance Act. The congressman's staff told KCGA that he will not respond to the letter.

"This bill would do some good things for domestic oil and gas production, but why go after ethanol, a vital part of our domestic energy portfo-

The letter was signed by Kansas Corn, Kansas Farm Bureau, Kansas Association of Ethanol Processors and the Kansas Grain Sorghum Producers Association. Ethanol industry signers were: Conestoga Energy Partners, Liberal and Garden City; Western Plains Energy, Campus; Nesika Energy, Scandia and Kansas Ethanol, Lyons, and ICM, Inc., Col-

In the letter, the groups

contained many beneficial items for domestic energy, the repeal of the RFS is also a key provision of the bill. The letter states:

"While the legislation may propose several beneficial items regarding domestic energy, we are adamantly opposed to its provision that would repeal the existing Renewable Fuels Standard and corresponding programs. Our state biofuels industry includes eleven plants which are in your district, employ many of your constituents and add value to the Kansas economy; therefore, your support of this provision simply is not in the best interest of the Kansas Big First Congressional District. USDA reminds farmers of 2014 farm bill conservation compliance changes

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack reminds producers that changes mandated through the 2014 Farm Bill require them to have on file a Highly Erodible Land Conservation and Wetland Conservation Certification (AD-1026). The Farm Bill relinked highly erodible land conservation and wetland conservation compliance with eligibility for premium support paid under the federal crop insurance program.

"It's important that farmers and ranchers taking the right steps to conserve valuable farm and natural resources have completed AD-1026 forms on file at their local Farm Service Agency (FSA) office," said Vilsack. "This will ensure they remain eligible for crop insurance support."

For farmers to be eligible for premium support on their federal crop insurance, a completed and signed AD-1026 form must be on file with the FSA. Since many FSA and Natural Re-Conservation (NRCS) programs have this requirement, most producers should already have an AD-1026 on file. If producers have not filed, they must do so by June 1, 2015.

When a farmer completes the AD-1026, FSA and NRCS staff will outline any additional actions that may be required for compliance with the provisions. The Risk Management Agency, through the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation (FCIC), manages the federal crop insurance program that provides the modern farm safety net for American farmers and ranchers.

Since enactment of the 1985 Farm Bill, eligibility for most commodity, disaster, and conservation programs has been linked to compliance with the highly erodible land conservation and wetland conservation provisions. The 2014 Farm Bill continues the requirement that producers adhere to conservation compliance guidelines to be eligible for

most programs administered by FSA and NRCS. This includes the new price and revenue protection programs, the Conservation Reserve Program, the Livestock Disaster Assistance programs and Marketing Assistance Loans implemented by FSA. It also includes the Environmental Quality Incentives Program, the Conservation Stewardship Program, and other conservation programs.

FSA recently released a revised form AD-1026, which is available at USDA Service Centers and online www.fsa.usda.gov.

USDA will publish a rule later this year that will provide details outlining the connection of conservation compliance with crop insurance premium support. Producers can also contact

their local USDA Service Center for information. A listing of service center locations is available at www. nrcs.usda.gov/wps/portal/ nrcs/main/national/contact/



Sheep and goat management workshop to be held August 15-16 in Manhattan

Dr. Jim Gerrish, wellknown rancher, researcher, grazing educator, and cofounder of the Missouri Grazing School will be in Kansas this month to kick off Amazing Grazing II for Ruminants Great and Small. A workshop entitled "Management of Sheep and Goats for Grazing, Herd Health, Performance and Profitability" will be held August 15-16, 2014, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. both days at Four Points by Sheraton in Manhattan.

This workshop is tailored for small ruminant producers specifically, and Gerrish will be able to help producers make better choices for their pasture situation. Dr. Gerrish states, "Sheep and goats offer opportunities for landowners as alternatives to raising cattle. Greater production efficiencies, niche market values, and ease of handling make sheep and goats particularly attractive for smaller acreages. Managing smaller ruminants does require a different skill set than cattle, and they require more attention to details of management. This workshop will cover topics including grazing practices for parasite management, fence and stock water development for ease of grazing, extending the grazing season, among others."

Dr. Brian Faris, head of KSU Animal Science Department Sheep and Goats and the newly built small ruminant facility, will join the Manhattan Small Ruminant Workshop. 

Appeals court upholds FDA action on judicious use of antibiotics

Court of Appeals issued a 2-1 decision in New York recently that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration is not required to hold hearings concerning the safety of feeding antibiotics at subtherapeutic levels. The ruling overturns two district court rulings from 2012 in a case initially filed in 2011 by the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), the Center for Science in the Public Interest. Food Animal Concerns Trust, Public Citizen and the Union of Concerned Sci-

The groups argue that regulatory action is sup-FDA is required by statute to hold hearings to determine whether to withdraw approval for the use of penicillin and tetracyclines in animal feed after the agency declared that the subtherapeutic use of the drugs in animal feed "has not been shown to be safe" in the late 1970s.

Such hearings would require industry to prove that the use of these drugs, as approved, is safe.

FDA's policy to pursue a collaborative stakeholder process to implement significant changes to antibiotic use rather than a

ported by the Animal Health Institute (AHI), Centers for Disease Control and the President's Council of Advisors on Science & Technology. All 26 companies affected by the policy have pledged to align their products with the effort, and changes have begun. The implementation of this policy means all medically important antibiotics used in food animals will be used to fight disease at the direction of a veterinari-

The legal challenges

are set aside by this decision have diverted agency resources from focusing on moving ahead with implementing the judicious use policy. AHI said it believes this decision will clear the way and allow FDA to focus on working with stakeholders to successfully implement this policy in a timely manner. Roberts is seeking his fourth, six-year term. Wolf is a Leawood radiologist and has the backing of national Tea Party groups ahead of the state's Aug. 5 primary.

Wolf spokesman Ben Hartman said Roberts won't stop his slide in the polls no matter how many endorse-

"The future face of agriculture needs to be varied in experience, background and knowledge to meet the demand of the 21st century," said Harden. "The 2501 Program enables USDA to bring more farmers and ranchers into American agriculture by partnering with the insti-

tutions, land-grant universities and other organizations that work directly with these diverse communities. Through these critical partnerships, we will build a stronger agricultural future for our country and for the world."

Harden made this announcement at the White House during the Future of American Agriculture Champions of Change event celebrating the next generation of America's farmers and ranchers.

Through the 2501 Program, support is distributed to entities that work with minority or veteran farmers and ranchers — 1890 Land Grant Institutions, 1994 Land Grant Institutions, American Indian Tribal community colleges and Alaska Native cooperative colleges, Hispanic-serving and other institutions of higher education, Tribal governments and organizations, or community-based organizations. The 2501 Program, administered by the USDA's Office of Advocacy

and Outreach, has distributed over \$57 million to 188 partners since 2010. The 2014 Farm Bill reauthorized the program and expanded targeted communities to include military veterans. Applications for 2501 Program funding will be accepted through August 25, 2014, and must be submitted through www.grants.gov. More information about the 2501 Program is available

Building beef cow herd requires quality management and genetics

Rebuilding a beef cow herd to capture record-setting high prices is more than saving heifers to breed.

Dave Patterson, University of Missouri Extension beef specialist, said heifers need management - and new breeding technology.

Producers who do it right benefit in the long term. Patterson spoke to a national meeting of the American Society of Animal Science in Kansas City July 23.

Patterson, developer of the Show-Me-Select Replacement Heifer Program, said management and genetics add value to heifers. In managed care, more heifers become pregnant, producing live calves and staying in a herd longer.

The heifer program was started to improve calving ease. That takes more than using calving-ease bulls.

Much management focuses on checking stages of puberty. That reveals when heifers are ready to breed.

Selecting heifers to save starts earlier. Only those from the first calves born in a calving season are saved. Calves from early-calving cows will likely become pregnant early, like their mothers.

More Missouri producers breed heifers according the SMS management plan, even if not enrolled, Patterson said.

Successful producers learn that Show-Me-Select heifers are worth more.

Recent SMS production sales show that Tier Two heifers, with stacked genetics, bring an average \$407

high SMS base price.

"Repeat buyers drive up heifer prices," Patterson said. "Those buyers learn the value of almost troublefree calving."

With managed breeding, calving seasons are shortened. Also, there's less death loss.

Those enrolled in Show-Me-Select work with their regional MU Extension livestock specialist. Their local veterinarian becomes part of the management team.

"Pre-breeding exams show herd owners which heifers to breed - and which to feed out."

By palpation of reproductive tract, vets learn the stage of puberty. The reproductive tract score (RTS) ranks heifers 1 to 5. Those scoring 1 are not saved to breed. Those prepubertal heifers develop late and might not breed.

Those scoring 4 or 5 are cycling, making them candidates for herd replacements. Added maturity of reproductive tract improves success.

Another part of prebreeding includes measuring pelvic opening. Heifers with small pelvic openings aren't bred.

doesn't Management stop at breeding. Ninety days after breeding, a pregnancy check tells of success. Those not bred go to the feedlot. That's more profitable than waiting nine months to find a heifer wasn't bred.

The vet helps with yearround health, a part of the plan. The extra effort pays big dividends. Nutrition

premium. That's above the needs attention also. Heifers must be gaining weight before breeding and calving.

"There's lots of known management tips and technology," Patterson told his peers. "Having them in a written plan makes work easier for producers.

"It sounds confusing. But it is not rocket science."

The SMS "Missouri Recipe" is one sheet of paper printed front and back.

"When we first worked with producers, I was shocked that few had a breeding plan," Patterson said. With a plan, herd owners can aim to have every cow, and heifer, bred, leading to a live calf to sell. All of that happens within one

Missouri producers learned the value of timed artificial insemination, which gives herd owners access to top proven AI sires. Breeding all cows, or heifers, on one day shortens calving seasons. Resulting uniformity of calves adds value for feeders.

spring and fall SMS sales adds value by attracting buyers. Heifers have sold into 95 percent of Missouri counties. Also, Missouri heifers have sold into 18

states.

"Many buyers quit developing their own replacements to buy them at Show-Me-Select sales," Patterson said.

The SMS program keeps adding value. A computerized database gives feedback.

"The system works," Patterson told animal scientists. "There's no need to reinvent the wheel. Other states starting heifer programs base them on the Missouri Recipe."



Ranch Management for Successful Winter and Year-Round Grazing of Beef Cattle to be held August 13-14 in Topeka

Dr. Jim Gerrish, wellknown rancher, researcher, grazing educator, and cofounder of the Missouri Grazing School returns to Kansas this month to kick off Amazing Grazing II for Ruminants Great and Small. A workshop entitled "Ranch Management for Successful Winter and Year Round Grazing of Beef Cattle" will be held from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. August 13-14, 2014 at Topeka Ramada, 420 SE 6th St. Topeka.

Better management of ranch resources will lead to increased performance of the grass and forages, and Dr. Gerrish will be able to help producers make better choices for their pasture situation. Many ranchers are currently being forced to de-stock due to drought conditions and lack of forage. Ranch managers will learn valuable grazing information and management skills that will improve production and profitability.

When asked why a producer should attend this meeting, Gerrish replied, "Winter feed costs are generally the biggest determinant of profitability in the cow-calf business, but they don't have to be. Gerrish continued, "Throw off the hay addiction shackles of iron and oil and feel the freedom of grazing in the grass. Topics to be covered include extending the grazing season, managing and planning for successful winter grazing including nutritional requirements, using winter annuals, effectively utilizing winter pastures for animal performance, managing animal costs, and how calving date effects profitability.

USDA announces results of soy checkoff request for referendum vote

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced the results of the request for referendum on the Soybean Research and Promotion Program (soy checkoff). USDA received 355 request-for-referendum forms, of which only 324 were valid, from Farm Service Agency offices. The 355 forms represent 0.06 percent of all eligible U.S. soybean farmers. That result falls short of the 10 percent needed to prompt a referen-

These results show that U.S. sovbean farmers overwhelmingly see the value in our soy checkoff," says Jim Call, soybean farmer from Madison, Minnesota, and United Soybean Board Board (USB) chairman. "It's more important than ever that the volunteer farmer-leaders of USB continue to invest soy checkoff funds to maximize the profit potential for all U.S. soybean farmers.'

If 10 percent of the 569,998 U.S. soybean farmers had requested a referendum, with no more than one-fifth of the 10 percent coming from one state, USDA would have conducted the referendum on the checkoff within 12 months. USDA conducts the request-for-referendum vote every five years, as required by the Soybean Promotion, Research and Consumer Information Act. The most recent period took place from May 5 through May 30.

Farmers certifying that they or the entity they represent paid into the checkoff at any time between Jan. 1, 2012, and Dec. 31, 2013, were eligible to participate in the petition for referendum. Eligible farmers who did not want a referendum did not need to take any action.

USDA requested and approved a notification by USB to inform U.S. soybean farmers about the request-for-referendum period. USB placed paid notifications on the request for referendum in national, regional and state agricultural publications and also distributed the notification to all Qualified State Soybean Boards and the news media. In addition, USDA's Agricultural Marketing Service and Farm Service Agency distributed the information about the request-for-referendum period.

"As industry leaders, USB will keep moving U.S. soybeans forward to be the top global oilseed," adds "It's a great vote of Call. confidence knowing U.S. soybean farmers support this work as well."

horpe honored for beef industry achievements

There is no man more associated with the words "cattle market" than Topper Thorpe, who left his mark on the industry during a 32year tenure with CattleFax. His contributions and leadership will be noted as Thorpe receives the Feeding Quality Forum Industry Achievement Award in August. "The uniqueness of the cattle feeding industry is that we supply almost 80% of the fed cattle produced in the world," says Larry Corah, vice president of supply for Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB), who began his own career when Thorpe was a rising star. "That is a pretty impactful industry, and CattleFax and Topper have had a strong influence on how successful it has been.

Raised on a diversified livestock and crop operation in southern New Mexico, Thorpe earned degrees in business and economics from New Mexico State University before becoming one of two original employees of CattleFax in 1968. As the first analyst at the start-up company, Thorpe laid the foundation and served 30 years as CEO of what became "the nation's premier market information, analysis, research and education service, owned by cattle producers and feeders."

"His leadership in creating the organization of CattleFax and putting market power in producer hands helped the feeding industry grow and become what it is today," Corah says.

tion, and he could take that aggregate data and do the analysis and then weave a picture of what this industry looked like and what it was going to look like five to ten years down the road," says Randy Blach, current CattleFax CEO, hired by Thorpe in 1980. Friends and customers always appreciated Thorpe's candor in bringing transparency to all sectors of the cattle industry. He led CattleFax through the farm crisis of the 1980s, ensuring company analysts always told the honest truth, even if it wasn't what customers wanted to hear. During his leadership.

that "accelerated the learning curve" for producers.

"I think really all the credit goes to Topper," Blach says. "CattleFax wouldn't be here today if it wasn't for him. And it wasn't always easy - there were a lot of lean years, but his wisdom and guidance got us through those years and developed a foundation that we still benefit from today."



Horse owners encouraged to be vigilant with surveillance for VS disease symptoms

Kansas Department of Agriculture Division of Animal Health officials were notified recently that Colorado has become the second state in 2014 to have a confirmed case of vesicular stomatitis (VS). Four horses tested positive for the disease and have been placed under quarantine. The horses involved in these index cases have no history of travel.

On July 17, the National Veterinary Services Laboratory reported a positive test on samples submitted from four horses. The initial Colorado disease investigation was performed by one of the field veterinarians from the State Veterinarian's Office at the Colorado Department of Agriculture. Previous positive cases of vesicular stomatitis in 2014 have been diagnosed in the southern area of Texas near the Mexico border and more recently in

Bastrop and Travis coun- ther threat for disease ties just south of Austin, Texas.

Kansas Animal Health Commissioner Dr. Bill Brown noted that this information is important to horse owners and those who participate in horse related activities including youth shows and "At this time rodeos. there are no travel restrictions in Kansas. We are asking veterinarians and horse owners to keep an eye on their animals, especially if they are traveling this summer and may be co-mingled with horses from other states."

Veterinarians and livestock owners who suspect an animal may have VS or any other vesicular disease should immediately contact state or federal animal health authorities. Livestock with clinical signs of VS are isolated until they are healed and determined to be of no furspread. There are no USDA-approved vaccines for VS.

While rare, human cases of VS can occur, usually among those who handle infected animals. VS in humans can cause flulike symptoms and only rarely includes lesions or blisters.

Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) Signs and Transmis-

VS-susceptible species include horses, mules, cattle, bison, sheep, goats, pigs and camelids. The clinical signs of VS include vesicles, erosions and sloughing of the skin on the muzzle, tongue, teats and above the hooves of susceptible livestock. Vesicles are usually only seen early in the course of the disease. The transmission of vesicular stomatitis is not completely understood but components include insect vectors, mechanical transmission, and livestock movement.

VS is not fatal, however blister-like lesions swell and break, leaving raw tissue. Infected animals are placed under quarantine during the diseases incubation period.

Tips for Livestock Own-

- Strict fly control is an important factor to inhibit the transmission of the disease.
- Avoid transferring feeding equipment, cleaning tools or health care equipment from other herds.

 - VS disease preven-

tion procedures include minimizing the sharing of water and feed/equipment, applying insect repellent daily (especially to the animal's ears), and closely observing animals for signs of VS.

Important Points for Veterinarians:

- Any vesicular disease of livestock is reportable in Kansas. To report call 785-564-6601.
- · Since VS is considered a foreign animal disease, any case with clinical signs consistent with VS will warrant an investigation by a state or federal foreign animal disease diagnostician (FADD).

• Because of the contagious nature of VS and its resemblance to other diseases such as footand-mouth disease, animal health officials urge livestock owners and caretakers to report these symptoms to their veterinarian immedi-

• When VS is suspected, the FADD will gather the epidemiological information, take the necessary blood samples, collect the necessary fluid or tissue from the lesions, and inform the owners and the referring veterinarian as to necessary bio-security and movement restric-

U.S. cattle inventory Down 3 percent from 2012 pected to be 33.6 million,

As of July 1, there were 95.0 million head of cattle on U.S. farms, according to the cattle report published by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS). This is the lowest inventory for July 1 since the series began in 1973.

plies and historic cattle prices, all cattle on feed decreased to 11.6 million, down 6 percent from 2012.

Of the 95.0 million cattle and calves 390 million were all cows and heifers that have calved.

Of the 39.0 million cows and heifers that have calved, 29.7 million head were beef cows and 9.3 million were milk cows.

Faced with budget reduction in fiscal year 2013, NASS discontinued the July edition of the cattle report. The agency was able to bring the report

To obtain an accurate measurement of the current state of the U.S. cattle industry, NASS surveyed more than 10,000 operators across the nation during the first half of July. NASS interviewers collected the data by mail, telephone and through face-to-face personal interviews. NASS asked all participating producers to report their cattle inventories as of July 1, 2014 and calf crop for the entire 2014 calendar year.


