

## Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Last week saw a tremendous amount of volatility in a number of markets. World equity markets were very weak a week ago Monday building upon the sizeable losses from last week, but by Friday the Dow and S&P were positive. The same thing was true for the dollar and crude oil as well. Monday the dollar scored multimonth lows and the crude made multi-year lows, but by Friday there were both up for the week. Nearly all of the volatility was associated with fear about the Chinese and world economies. Fears like that don't usually go away in a week, so plan on more volatility in the

The livestock markets were very violent. The October hogs were limit higher a week ago Monday during the huge break in the stock market and the October feeders touched the expanded limit lower of \$6.75. When it was all said and done, the Octoher live cattle were positive for the week and closed above the 9-day moving average for the first time since August 11th. The next upside objective for the October live cattle contract will be the \$145.90 level and there is a good chance we see that early this week. After that we will need to see the cash cattle market advantage, and one week of

post consistent gains in order for the futures to keep climbing. The fundamentals are still supportive since beef production is still historically low, but high carcass weights and high pork production are the two main limiting factors that the bulls face.

If there was one market that was able to avoid the volatility it was the corn market. The corn has traded sideways since the Thursday after the August supply and demand report. Crop condition ratings have been nearly steady, yield reports haven't given either the bulls nor the bears an good export sales won't get speculators excited. Traders are waiting for more news either in the form of more yield reports or more export sales, but for the time being it looks like we are stuck going nowhere.

The wheat was more ac-

tive than the corn, but unfortunately the action was mostly sideways to lower. The December KW moved up through some important trend line resistance and the 9-day moving average. but ended up making a new low on Friday, which means there is still no reason to get excited about buying wheat. The bulls have to see consistently large export sales in order to have a chance at sustained strength. The 500,000 MT we saw last week isn't bad, but with a record French crop and lower prices around the world, it looks like we won't be able to be competitive in the world market without lower wheat prices or higher corn

The November soybeans were lower for the week, but finished Friday at the top end of the trading range. There is strong overhead resistance near from \$8.85 to \$8.90 and the market has

had a tough time working through it. Traders are nervous about the Chinese economy and what it might d0 to their demand for our soybeans. Their purchases are running well behind the pace we saw last year, so there is quite a bit of anxiety regarding our number one customer.

Forecasts are a little warmer and drier than what farmers would like to see for the tail end of the growing season, so we may see crop condition ratings fall in the Corn Belt in the next two weeks, but we are past time for any major weather scare. So, unless we see a surge in demand or some very bad weather, rallies are for selling.



## Kansas Hay Market Report

Hay trade slow. Demand light to moderate for dairy alfalfa, light for grinding alfalfa and alfalfa pellets and grass hay. Cooler temperatures and lower humidity have been welcome by alfalfa producers. It has been easier to get hay to dry in the windrow and the growing hay has a better chance to be dairy quality. There continues to be interest from the stock cow producers to feed alfalfa as their protein source this fall and winter. There is an area in northwest and north central Kansas between I-70 and the Nebraska state line that is really dry and desperately needs rain. Sugar cane aphids are showing up in Kansas and pose a serious threat to all sorghum crops. ## **Proceed with caution – Feeding Quality Forum** presenters prep cattlemen for curves ahead

By Miranda Reiman

In a cyclical business, when you're riding the good times, it probably means you're not far from the bad

So it is with the cattle business, said Dan Basse, president of Ag Resource Company, as he kicked off the Feeding Quality Forum in La Vista, Neb., and Garden City. "It's not like the mid-1980s, with land values collapsing. It's more like a slow bleed," Basse said of the general "downturn" in agricultural commodities. Ag equipment sales have slowed, land prices are going down and grain trade has softened as the dollar strengthened. The cow-calf business is still poised for profit for the next couple of years, but Basse shared a tale of caution beyond that.

"You've got to make sure you're around for when the good times are rolling again," he said.

Embrace and prepare for change was also a theme that Marilyn Corbin, Zoetis veterinarian, delivered to the cattle feeders and allied industry in attendance.

She provided a history of the veterinary feed directive, decoding the legal language for the policy that goes into effect January 1, 2017. "They want your veterinarians involved to decide when and how to use antibiotics," Corbin said. "To make this process work, we're going to have to have communication among evervbody.'

That means establishing relationships with a veterinarian and a nutritionist, and making sure they work together.

During the last several become more common in the beef business, said Industry Achievement Award honoree James Herring, of Friona Industries.

"If you follow the alliance philosophy, if you are

aligned with your partners in philosophy, you will have a solid future," he said, noting that approach has helped the feeding giant better meet consumer de-

Beef eaters not only want a higher quality, more consistent product, but they also want to know that animal welfare is a top priority.

Terry Mader, Mader Consulting, challenged feeders to look at ways to increase cattle comfort during both heat and cold stress.

"They are doing a lot better job today than we were 20 to 25 years ago," said the University of Nebraska professor emeritus. Mader offered practical ideas for monitoring animals during weather events and to mitigate environmental stress. "If I'm going to do one thing, just get more water space in that pen." If Galen Erickson, University of Nebraska animal scientist is, going to do one thing, it's feed cattle

"With corn prices and cattle prices where they're at today, there is an incentive to feed them longer," he said, sharing the numbers as proof.

One study compared cattle finished for 142 days with 163 and 185 days on feed. Going from that short-

est feeding period to the longest increased carcass weight by 80 pounds and profit went from virtually none to \$54.11 per head. So how long is too long? Erickson said they need more rebecause search, they haven't found the ceiling "Our job is to test the lim-

its so you don't have to," he said. Panelists at both locations also shared experiences, in hopes that feeders could learn without having to do all the "trial and error" themselves. Risk management was the topic and the Nebraska session featured Doug Deets, of Buchanan & Co.; Marshall Hansen, of Farm Credit Services; and Scott Mueller, of SAMSON Commodities. "If we're not managing not only the sales price of our animals but also the feed costs and the other things that will get us to the point of selling that animal, then a lot of times all you've done is take a position in the market," Hansen said. "All you've done is lock in one piece of the market. We've had people get hurt on that as much as almost anything else." In Kansas, attendees heard from Herring, W. Ashley Allen with Bank of America/Merrill Lynch and Brent Manwarren of Poky

## Colorado, Kansas & Nebraska water agreement further helps water users

The states of Colorado, Kansas and Nebraska have reached an agreement that will ensure more certainty to the basin's water users in both Nebraska and Kansas. The agreement, in the form of a Resolution approved by the Republican River Com-Administration (RRCA), was achieved through collaborative negotiations that began in April 2015 and will provide timely notice and access to water for the 2016 irrigation sea-

The agreement provides additional flexibility for Nebraska to achieve its Compact obligations while ensuring that the interests of Kansas are protected. The additional flexibility will allow the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources to provide a portion of the forecasted compliance water early in 2016 and provide any additional shortfall later in 2016 and through April 1, 2017. This also provides some improved operational predictability for Nebraska water users in that water users will not be subjected to closing notices related to the 2016 irrigation season. The 2016 agreement builds

agreement upon the reached for the 2015 irrigation season with further beneficial developments for water users. This agreement provides more advanced notice to irrigators in the basin of compliance activities that will likely occur in 2016, allowing for an advanced planning period producers desire for their efficiently run operations.

The states' agreement is contingent upon the Nebraska and the Kansas Bostwick Irrigation Districts. working with the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, reaching agreement on modifications of certain contract provisions contained in their Memorandum of Agreement also adopted last year. Thus, ensuring the availability of the water pumped from Nebraska augmentation projects for RRCA compliance. Current RRCA chairman Gordon W. "Jeff" Fassett, Director of the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources, said, "Today's agreement is good news for Nebraska water users and represents the continuation of the cooperative and positive collaboration we've fostered between our states as we work to find mutually agreeable solutions that best serve our citizens. Additionally, we are hopeful that this positive momentum will continue to move us closer to the goal of securing a long-term agreement. With significantly more planning

time, Nebraska's water users will have greater certainty in their water supply and make the best decisions for their operations."

"We are pleased to collaborate with Nebraska and Colorado as we continue to develop balanced and fair water solutions benefiting all of the basin's water users that reflects good water management," said Kansas commissioner David Barfield. "This fourth in our series of recent agreements with Nebraska allows Kansas to make effective use of its water supply in 2016 and allows the states additional time and experience with Nebraska's compliance activities as we continue to move toward longterm agreement."

Colorado commissioner Dick Wolfe said, "This agreement exemplifies the success that can be achieved through collaboration and cooperation of the RRCA and the water users in the basin."

The RRCA is comprised of one member each from the states of Colorado, Kansas and Nebraska. The purpose of the RRCA is to administer the Republican River Compact. This Compact allocates the waters of the Republican River among the three states. The next RRCA annual meeting is scheduled for August of 2016 and will be hosted by the state of Colorado in a location of their choice.

## Roberts praises decision to halt EPA's 'Waters of the U.S.' rule in several states

U.S. Senator Pat Roberts, R-Kan., Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture. Nutrition and Forestry, is pleased to announce a decision by a federal judge to halt the damaging 'Waters of the U.S.' (WOTUS) rule from implementation in 13 states.

Just a day before the WOTUS rule was set to go into effect, North Dakota district court Judge Ralph Erickson issued a preliminary injunction to stop the

WOTUS rule in North Dako-Alaska, Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Idaho, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, South Dakota, Wyoming and New Mexico.

"This is great news for parts of agriculture and rural America," said Roberts. "I have been opposed to this ridiculous rule from its inception. The WOTUS rule is nothing but a land grab under the guise of the Clean Water Act, and I'll continue to keep fighting the good fight to push back against EPA's federal overreach."

The WOTUS rule, which expands federal jurisdiction over land and waterways, has received considerable criticism from a variety of industries - including agriculture. Kansas' lawsuit was filed with several other states in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Georgia, which denied the plea. Multiple rulings undoubtedly leads to confusion for landowners and farmers and ranchers.

The Senate Agriculture Committee held a hearing on the WOTUS rule in March. Roberts introduced legislation in April to stop implementation of the WOTUS rule, which was approved by the Senate Environment & Public Works Committee and is now waiting on the Senate floor.

## See for Yourself program offers farmers an in-depth look at soy checkoff

course provided ten farmers from around the country the chance to see and evaluate the work of the soy checkoff. This course, the United Soybean Board's (USB's) See for Yourself program, took the farmerparticipants from St. Louis to China and Vietnam from July 30- Aug. 7 to learn about U.S. soy's customers, the soy checkoff's role in marketing U.S. soy to those customers, and the research being done both domestically and internationally to improve U.S. soy.

"After my participation in the See for Yourself program, I think the checkoff is a worthwhile investment for said Antron farmers," Williams, a South Carolina soybean farmer and See for Yourself participant. "It is working behind the scenes, where we aren't even thinking about it, by creating new markets and new technolo-

Sponsored by USB's Audit and Evaluation (A&E) Committee, the program began at USB's St. Louis headquarters. Participants learned more about the soy checkoff and some of the ways their soybeans are used domestically. A tour of DuPont's<sup>TM</sup> Nutrition & Health Facility demonstrated a few of the ways soy is being incorporated into a growing number of food products. Participants next traveled to the country that uses roughly 25 percent of all U.S. soy, China. The group first visited an aquaculture facility that recently increased production by nearly 300 percent, thanks to checkoff-funded technology and the benefits of using a soy-based feed. The farm now uses feed containing more than 60 percent soy. Participants also had the chance to tour the Shanghai Xinnong Feed Mill, which provides feed for numerous large-scale swine operations in the country. Soybean meal is an important component of the

feed ration. "The See for Yourself program has really shown me how our small checkoff investment in the world soybean industry really goes a long way to increase our demand and our customer base," said Justin Knoebel, Pennsylvania farmer and See for Yourself participant. The program's final destination was Vietnam, an emerging market for U.S. soy. Participants first toured the Cai Mep Agricultural Port, which handles approximately 50 percent of all soybean meal imported into Vietnam. Roughly 300,000 metric tons of U.S. soybean meal has passed through the port just this

year. One of the most beneficial stops in Vietnam was the opportunity to hear from industry individuals about the promising market outlook for U.S. sov in Vietnam in the near future.

"This year's program was especially unique because our participants were able to see a well-established market in China, as well as a market that the checkoff is working to develop in Vietnam," said Keith Tapp, Kentucky soybean farmer and A&E Committee chairman. "In all of our locations, I







steps into the street, facing a bad guy in a black hat. They draw their sixguns and fire! The good guy prevails, the bad guy falls, and into the Dodge City air, there rises a wisp of Gunsmoke.

For several years, that was the opening scene of the classic western TV show known as Gunsmoke, starring James Arness as Marshall Matt Dillon. For twenty years on this show, and on continuing satellite reruns today, the incorruptible Marshall Dillon provided the law in Dodge City. Gun-

The tall, brave lawman smoke was the best of the west. It would become the longest-running prime time live action television drama in history.

It all began on September 10, 1955. The first show was introduced by a guy who knew something about westerns: a character known as John Wayne. Wayne had worked with James Arness in the movies, and he introduced the first Gunsmoke show on CBS television. The show quickly became a hit.

It was described as an adult western, in contrast to the singing cowboys and

kids' shows which preceded it. Death, drinking, and violence were common elements of the show, but we could always count on the good guys to win in the end (though there might be some casualties along the way).

Of course, the factual basis for the show was the authentic wild west town of Dodge City, complete with Front Street and an actual Boot Hill where unlucky cowboys were buried with their boots on. The writers would occasionally throw in references to Kansas places, such as Wichita, Abilene, and Hays City. Marshall Dillon would frequently have to tell some bad guy to "Get outta Dodge."

The cast of Gunsmoke was outstanding. Marshall Dillon was joined by a pretty redhead, Long Branch Saloon owner named Miss Kitty, the grouchy but loveable Doc Adams, and deputies such as Chester and then Festus Haggen (The only actual Kansan in the cast was Milburn Stone who played Doc Adams. Stone was a native of Burrton which is situated between Hutchinson and Newton). These memorable characters had their lighter moments as well as times of stark, searing drama. The numerous guest stars were also remarkable, from Bette Davis to Jon Voight.

When I was a kid, our family would gather around the black-and-white television set on Saturday nights to watch Gunsmoke. In contrast to today's satellite dish with 500 channels, our TV antenna got only 2 1/2 channels (cause the third one didn't come in very well). However, we could get CBS, and my dad never wanted to miss Gunsmoke.

2015 will mark six decades since the debut of Gunsmoke. I'm pleased that this landmark is being celebrated. There are actually two celebrations: One is in Studio City, California and the other is in Dodge City. The California event is described www. Gunsmoke 60 th. com.

The Kansas event is described www.visitdodgecity.org. On September 25-27, 2015, Dodge City will play host to a full weekend of activities, including a reunion of several actors who appeared on the show. The guest of honor is Janet Arness, widow of

the late star James Arness. Through the years, the opening scene of Gunsmoke would change. Over time, it went from a scene of a quick draw to a fast-running horse to simply pictures of the costars. But through it all, Gunsmoke stood tall as the best of the west.

## Wheat: protecting your investment

Variables affecting your wheat yield ten months from now begin with your decisions made and the actions you are taking now. Protecting your investment now for a successful wheat year starts with insuring your seedling wheat has a vigorous, healthy start to its growing season. Two actions that will help insure this is the case for your farm is applying a fungicide seed treatment to your wheat seed and controlling volunteer wheat that sprouts from grain scattered last harvest.

Fungicide seed treatments are especially advisable if seed is infected with Fusarium head scab which was prevalent in our fields this past spring, or other diseases such as loose smut, common bunt, or black point. Fungicide seed treatments can help improve germination and seedling vigor of wheat seed infected with these diseases. In the case of flag smut (found in northwest Kansas this past year), seed treatments will help prevent the re-occurrence of this disease. Fungicide seed treatments are also advisable if seeding dates are unusually early or late; in no-till situations, or on low-test-weight seed simply to protect the seed against seed-borne disseed rots, and seedling blights that may reduce vigor beyond the already reduced vigor in a low test weight seed.

If you are saving your own seed wheat, it is advisable to submit a sample to the Kansas Crop Improvement lab for a germination test. Seed lots with germination below 80 percent are strong candidates for a fungicide seed treatment, or at least increased seeding rates to compensate for the low germination. Producers and others can get the latest information on seed treatments in the newly revised version of Seed Treatment Fungicides for Wheat Disease Management 2015, K-

Controlling volunteer wheat is also a critical step in insuring a healthy start to your wheat crop. Volunteer wheat within a half-mile of a field that will be planted to wheat should be completely dead at least two weeks before wheat planting. This will help control wheat curl mites, Hessian fly, and greenbugs in the

The most important threat from volunteer wheat is the wheat streak mosaic virus complex. A fall infestation of this virus can cause 50% loss or more. The disease causes stunting and vellow streaking on the leaves. Wheat streak mosaic virus is carried from volunteer to newly planted wheat by the wheat curl mite. Volunteer wheat is the primary host for these mites, although there are other hosts, such as corn, millet. and many annual grasses. However, control of volunteer is the main defense against the wheat streak mosaic virus complex.

Reducing Hessian fly populations is another reason to remove the volunteer wheat hotbed awaiting your newly planted fields. Hessian flies survive over the summer on wheat stubble. When the adults emerge, they can infest any volunteer wheat that may be present, which will keep the Hessian fly population alive and going through the upcoming crop season. If there is no volunteer around when these adults emerge they will not be able to oviposit on a suitable host plant. If the volunteer is destroyed while the flies are still larvae, this will help to reduce potential problems. Hessian flies often cause significant damage. Hessian fly larvae attack young wheat plants near the soil line, and tillers may be stunted and have lodging issues. In heavy infestations, the whole stand may be lost.

it's produced."

When asked about Farmland, Wildin noted that he sells farm and ranch real estate and the people in the film are the people he works with. 



## Retail beef prices, Cattle on Feed and more USDA data

An assortment of new data was released recently. Choice retail beef prices for July decreased for the second month in a row, dropping 4.1 cents per pound from June to \$636.5/cwt. Choice retail beef prices peaked in May at \$641.2/cwt. All-Fresh retail beef prices. however, continued to increase, setting a new record in July at \$616.3/cwt., up 5.2 cents per pound from June. The July spread between the Choice and All-Fresh retail price at 20.2 cents per pound is the narrowest July levels since 1995. tially offset reduced cattle

since June of 2012. The July All-Fresh retail price is 96.8 percent of the Choice retail price, a new record percentage and compares to the five year average of 93.1 percent. The percent Choice grading of cattle is high resulting is a relatively large supply of Choice to Select beef, likely the cause of the narrow spread between Choice and All-Fresh retail beef prices.

The August Cattle on Feed report pegged July placements at 99 percent of the low level of one year ago. July marketings were 97 percent of last year. Both placements and marketings in July were at the lowest

supply indicated by the July inventory report will result in increased feedlot placements in the coming months, the flow of cattle through feedlots at the current time continues to be low. This is reflected in year-to-date cattle slaughter, down 7.0 percent compared to last year. The August 1 cattle on-feed inventory was 102 percent of last year as a result of continued slowdown of cattle in the feedlot, resulting in increased slaughter and carcass weights. Average cattle carcass weights are currently 13 pounds heavier than this time last year and parto-date total beef production down 4.7 percent from one year ago.

The August Cold Storage report showed that beef stocks in cold storage were down from June but were 24 percent above year ago levels. This is a continuation of the large beef stocks that began building about one year ago after beef stocks had been drawn to very low levels in early 2014. The current level is less than five percent above the five-year average for July. The relatively large level of cold storage inventories most likely reflects the continued large imports of processing

ries are 97 percent of one year ago and beef replacement heifers are 99 percent of last year. The July 1 all cattle inventory in Canada was 13.0 million head, down 2 percent vear over vear. Canadian cattle inventories have decreased an average of 2.6 percent annually the last ten years from the most recent peak of 16.9 million head in 2005. Earlier indications of the beginning of herd expansion in Canada may be being preempted by severe drought this summer in the Canadian Prairie Provinces.

## Biochemist studies oilseed plants for biofuel, industrial development

A Kansas State University biochemistry professor has reached a milestone in building a better biofuel: producing high levels of lipids with modified properties in oil seeds.

istry and molecular biophysics, and collaborators at Michigan State University and the University of Nebraska, Lincoln have modified Camelina sativa — a nonfood oilseed crop - and produced the highest levels of modified seed lipids to

date. By modifying the oilseed biochemistry in camelina, the researchers have achieved very high levels of an oil with reduced viscosity and improved cold temperature characteris-

The goal of the research is to alter oilseeds to pro-

duce large amounts of modified oil that can be used as improved biofuels or even industrial and food-related applications. The research recently appeared in the journal Industrial Crops and Products and on the front cover of the Plant Biotechnology Journal.

"Reducing our dependence on fossil fuel-derived carbon is always good," Durrett said. "Using alternative sources of fuel is the obvious way to reduce our dependence. But even other applications, such as using it for lubricants or as feedstocks for the chemical industry, would help reduce our dependence on fossilderived carbon.'

Camelina can grow on poorer quality farmland, needs little irrigation or fertilizer, and produces seeds that can provide gallons of oil. Durrett said. It also can be rotated with wheat and could become a biofuel crop for semi-arid regions, including western Kansas and Colorado

The camelina genome was recently sequenced, which has greatly helped Durrett and collaborators as they improve camelina's oil properties to produce lowviscosity oil — the kind of oil needed for biofuel. By modifying the oilseed biochemistry in camelina, the researchers were able to get very high levels of the modified oil, which are called acetyl-TAGS. In the best camelina lines, about 85 percent of the oil was comprised of the modified acetyl-TAGs.

One of the team's goals is to make commercial products using oils from the engineered plants. The researchers are analyzing these oils because their acetyl-TAGs possess unusual structures and have high value-added properties.

"The basic problem is that most of our oilseed crops — such as canola or soybean — produce just a few fatty acids because we use them for nutritional needs," Durrett said. "That's great for a source of food, but makes doing any sort of chemistry more complicat-

The researchers think that camelina producing acetyl-TAGs is a renewable resource with potential industrial uses, including plasticizers, biodegradable lubricants and food emulsi-

"The food industry uses similar compounds already," Durrett said. "What we need to do is first of all see if our oil is safe and can match those specifications. Probably one of the most valuable parts of this research is that we can generate meaningful data sets because of the oil's properties and we can learn more about the oil itself and what it can do."

Research collaborators include Mike Pollard, John Ohlrogge, Jinjie Liu, Adam Rice, Kathleen McGlew and Vincent Shaw with the Great Lakes Bioenergy Research Center at Michigan State University; and Hyunwoo Park and Tom Clemente at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln. The researchers have been supported with a four-year \$1.5 million joint U.S. Department of Agriculture and Department of Energy grant.


