Kansas Hay Market Report

Hay market activity slowed while demand remained moderate for all classes of hay; prices steady. Most of the grinding hay and better quality hay has been picked over, worrying some about making it to first cutting. Almost all of Kansas received a good amount of rainfall over the last two weeks. Although it was much needed and greatly appreciated, farmers are anxious to get into their fields. The abnormally dry (D0) category degreased to 45.72 pct, moderate drought (D1) decreased to 10.41pct, severe drought category (D2) decreased to .53 pct and the extreme drought (D3) category was eliminated. According to the NASS Kansas Crop Progress and Condition Report, top soil moisture rated 6 pct very short, 14 pct short, 66 pct adequate and 14 pct surplus. Subsoil moisture rated 6 pct very short, 20 pct short, 70 pct adequate and 4 pct surplus. Hay and roughage supplies rated 2 pct very short, 6 pct short, 84 pct adequate, and 8 pct surplus. Relief efforts for those affected by the wildfires continue and information to help can be found at the Kansas Department of Agriculture website, www. agriculture.ks.gov/wildfire. Kansas companies participate in trade mission to Mexico

In March 2017, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, in partnership with the Kansas Corn Commission, sponsored an agricultural trade mission to Mexico to expand market opportunities in corn, distiller's grains and ethanol. Participants on the trade mission included: Brian Baalman, Western Plains Energy, Oakley; Tom Bauck, Kansas Ethanol, Lyons; Brad Rayl, Kansas Ethanol, Lyons; Pat Ross, Lawrence; and Terry Vinduska, S and V Family Farms, Marion. The group was accompanied by Greg Krissek and Stacy Mayo with the Kansas Corn Commission and Kellen Liebsch and Brooke Minihan with the Kansas Department of Agriculture

"I felt the meetings were all very constructive. I now see how many opportunities there are for Kansas grains in Mexico," said Vinduska, a Kansas corn producer and Kansas Corn Commission member. "I am excited for what is coming in trade relations, and think there is a

lot of potential here for us."

The participants visited Grupo Lala and Rancho Lucero in Torreon; the U.S. Consulate, Northeastern Cattle Producers Association and Petrorack in Monterrey; and Los Choneros and Bartlett Grain in Aguascalientes. Additionally, Ryan LeGrand and Javier Chávez with the U.S. Grains Council provided an ethanol update to the group.

"I was previously unaware of how much is going on in Mexico and how fast they are growing," said Bauck. "It is now apparent that we need to work together and establish relationships that will benefit both countries."

Mexico is a key trade partner for Kansas agricultural commodities. In 2016, Mexico imported almost 30% of the state's total agriculture exports, easily making them Kansas' number one trade partner. "If you look at the logistics of Mexico, no other country can replace it as a customer for Kansas grain. It's more im-



Earth Day Celebrations

Gardeners celebrate nature every time they put a seed or plant into the earth. April is national gardening month and the 22nd is proclaimed as Earth Day, Riley County, K-State Research and Extension Master Gardeners will be doing their part around the community.

Master Gardeners will be at the Sunset Zoo's "Party for the Plant" event from noon to 4:30 p.m. They will be in the butterfly garden habitat area that they have developed and maintain at the zoo. It will be one of the scavenger hunt stations for the day. Other activities in the Master Gardener booth are the migration station, the origami station, the butterfly tattoo/stamp stations, and the plant station.

We project to have around 400 milkweed, dill. or parsley plants to hand out this year. These plants provide food for several kinds of butterflies that you can attract to your own garden. Butterflies are strongly attracted to the color purple and to gold.

Milkweed is the exclusive food for Monarch caterpillars. Monarch butterfly populations have dropped due to the loss of food and habitat. Get some milkweed and plant it in a sunny spot of your yard.

Butterflies like water to go along with their plants to feed on. It is desirable to include a shallow water source for butterflies to use. A concave, light-colored rock could be used to hold water and give the butterfly a spot to sun bathe.

Considerations during bull buying season

You can tell it's that time of year, to buy a bull, when your mailbox is filled up with sale catalogs! For decades we have been collecting performance data on bulls, but in earlier times it was mostly individual performance under feedlot conditions. A large breakthrough came when computers became available and statistical methods were developed to calculate Expected Progeny Differences. EPDs provide an estimate of the genetic potential of an animal as a parent based upon three sources of information: ancestors, the animal's own record and the record of its progeny.

EPDs are calculated by breed associations for all kinds of traits. Once you've determined which traits are the most important to your herd, you can go bull buying!

One of the most common mistakes with purchasing young bulls is bringing them home, turning them out with older bulls, and expecting them to do well. Most yearling bulls have spent the last five to six months on a high nutritional plane. have been pushed and expected to achieve as much growth as possible. Removing them from that level of nutrition and putting them on a maintenance diet can be detrimental.

It may not be necessary to keep the young bull on a high-gaining diet, but time to adjust to their new the bull is still growing and need adequate nutrition. From the time of purchase to breeding season, could be three to five months, you should strive to keep the bull at a Body Condition Score of six at the time of turnout. This will give the bull adequate nutrition and reserves of energy for use during the breeding season. A yearling bull can be expected to lose 100 pounds or more during the breeding season.

Most bulls will be vaccinated and tested for fertility before the sale. If they have not, a breeding soundness exam (BSE) in necessary. Be sure to vaccinate bulls at least 30 days prior to turning out with the cows.

Yearling bulls will need

surroundings. If you are turning them in with older bulls, they will need a large area so they can determine their order of dominance. Fighting is a natural occurrence with bulls; be sure to stay out of the way, and make sure the facilities can handle these brawls.

USDA offers renewal options for expiring Conservation Stewardship Program contracts

Acting Deputy Agriculture Secretary Michael Young has announced that a contract renewal sign-up is under way for the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP), USDA's largest working lands conservation program with more than 80 million acres enrolled. USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) made several updates to the popular program last fall. These changes help producers better evaluate conservation options that benefit their operations while improving the health and productivity

ing lands.

"The changes made to CSP are providing even greater opportunities for stewardship-minded producers across the country to participate and bring their conservation efforts to a higher level," said Young. "The new tools and methods for evaluating operations, expanded options to address the producer's conservation and business objectives, and the focus on local resource priorities have resulted in a 30 percent increase in applicaprogram."

Participants with existing CSP contracts that will expire on Dec. 31 can access the benefits of the recent program changes through an option to renew their contracts for an additional five years if they agree to adopt additional activities to achieve higher levels of conservation on their lands. Applications to renew expiring contracts are due by May 5.

Through CSP, agricultural producers and forest landowners earn payments

of private and Tribal work- tions for this widely popular for actively managing, maintaining, and expanding conservation activities like cover crops, buffer strips, pollinator and beneficial insect habitat, and soil health building activities - all while maintaining active agricultural production on their land. Benefits to producers can include:

Improved cattle gains per acre;

Increased crop yields; Decreased inputs; Wildlife population improvements; and

Better resilience to weather extremes.

"CSP is for working lands," said Young. "Thousands of people have made the choice to voluntarily enroll in the program because it helps them enhance natural resources and improve their business operation."







K-State to host Southwest **Research-Extension Center** Spring Field Day in Garden City

Masters of Beef Advocacy reaches 10,000 graduates

Recently the beef checkoff's Masters of Beef Advocacy (MBA) program, reached 10,000 graduates. This group of beef and dairy producers along with chefs, teachers, doctors, dietitians and others in the beef community - has stepped up and are leading the way in advocating for the industry and all of agriculture. After completing the program, MBA grads are equipped to have engaging conversations with consumers, both online and in person, and are encouraged to participate in advocacy campaigns. The MBA program was started in March 2009.

The Top of the Class program, which is a next-level training program for advocates wanting to strengthen their advocacy skills was added in 2014. MBA Top of the Class graduates are regularly tapped for media interviews, speaking engagements and other advocacy opportunities on the national level. The Top of the Class program has trained 24 graduates to date and is

accepting applications for the next session, to be held May 23-24, 2017.

Building on the initial success of the program, which celebrated 5,000 graduates in the first five years, the checkoff developed and released a brand new set of lessons in 2015. Since the launch of MBA 2.0 the graduation rate has accelerated to approximately 1,500 graduates per year. To accompany the new courses, MBA program staff developed an interactive "Mobile Conversation Guide" app for iPhone and Android in 2016, giving MBA graduates access to information from the courses at their fingertips.

Terryn Drieling, rancher, blogger and avid beef advocate from Nebraska, says, "I was introduced to the MBA program when it was brandnew back in early 2009 and completed the Top of the Class program in 2015. The MBA program served as a launching pad for my blog and advocacy efforts, and

the Top of the Class helped me feel even more comfortable sharing my story and the story of beef. In fact, I found so much value in the programs that I have recently started recruiting fellow

beef community members to

the MBA program."

Adam Hegsted, James Beard Award-nominated chef who runs three restaurants in Spokane, Washington, says, "I valued being able to learn all aspects of the beef cycle, from genetics, farming, sustainability, nutritional info and everything in between, all the way to the plate. I found it very valuable to be able to see the whole spectrum and make decisions based on the in-depth knowledge and facts that are available."

MBA grads at work Over the past few years, MBA graduates have had the opportunity to put their skills to use in a variety of ways, ranging from providing a rancher's perspective for a media interview or magazine article to promoting one of numerous campaigns developed by MBA program staff. Most recently, graduates participated in the Food Waste Challenge, which sought to bring awareness to how food

waste affects sustainability while highlighting beef's efficiencies. Additionally, graduates shared resources and information regarding the Veterinary Feed Directive in order to provide clarity to an inquiring consumer base.

Joan Ruskamp, beef producer from Nebraska and Top of the Class program grad, participated in the New York Times' Food for Tomorrow conference, which featured speakers such as Michael Pollan, Mark Bittman and Tom Colicchio. Ruskamp was part of a producer panel that offered an up-close look at how the ag community is continuously improving food production.

Soy protein concentrate can replace animal proteins in weanling pig diets

Plant-derived proteins are less expensive than animal proteins if used in weanling pig diets, but may contain anti-nutritional factors that can negatively affect gut health and growth performance. However, results of a new study from the University of Illinois indicate that soy protein concentrate (SPC) may be partly or fully substituted for animal proteins without adverse effects.

"We determined digestibility of crude protein, amino acids, and energy in SPC ground to three particle sizes," says U of I animal sciences professor Hans H. Stein. "We also investigated the effects of substituting SPC for animal proteins on weanling growth performance.'

Soy protein concentrate is derived from defatted soy flakes by removing soluble carbohydrates and some nonprotein constituents. Three particle sizes - 70, 180, and 700 micrometers were tested because earlier work showed that particle size of soybean meal affects digestibility of amino acids in weanling pigs.

In the group's first experiment, pigs were fed diets containing soybean meal, fish meal, or SPC ground to one of the three particle sizes. Ileal digesta were collected and analyzed for amino acid and crude protein content.

Standardized ileal digestibility (SID) of crude protein was not different among the three diets containing SPC, but diets with SPC ground to 70 or 180 micrometers had greater crude protein digestibility

than the traditional protein sources. The SID of several amino acids, including tryptophan, was also greater in diets containing SPC ground to 70 or 180 micrometers, compared with the other

Stein explains that these results differed from similar studies using soybean meal, in which particle size had a greater influence on digestibility. "It could be that alcohol extraction used in SPC processing improves digestibility, making it unnecessary to reduce particle size further to obtain the same results.'

In a second experiment, weanling pigs were fed corn mixed with each of the protein sources used in the first experiment. The goal was to measure apparent total tract digestibility of gross energy and the digestible and metabolizable energy in

"There were no differences in digestible and metabolizable energy among the three SPC particle sizes, but SPC ground to 180 micrometers contained more digestible energy than corn, sovbean meal, and fish meal," Stein says.

Finally, the researchers investigated the effects of SPC on growth performance and blood characteristics. In this experiment, pigs were fed combinations of fish meal, spray-dried protein plasma, and SPC ground to 180 micrometers. The different diets did not change growth performance overall and no reduction in performance was observed if SPC was used instead of fish meal or spray-dried protein plasma.

"Results of this experiment indicated that diets based on soybean meal and SPC can be fed to weanling pigs without negative effects on growth performance during the initial four weeks after weaning," Stein says.

Altogether, results of the three experiments indicate that SPC ground to 180 micrometers may be used as an alternative to animal proteins in weanling pig



2016/2017 exports of feed grains in all forms up 33 percent year-on-year

U.S. exports of feed grains in all forms increased 33 percent year-over-year in the first six months of the 2016/2017 marketing year, according to recently published trade data from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and analysis by the U.S. Grains Council (USGC).

That data showed the United States exported more than 56.6 million metric tons of feed grains in all forms - a calculation that measures grain products in corn equivalent - from September 2016 to February 2017, compared to 42.5 million tons during the same time the prior marketing year.

Leading the increase, exports of U.S. corn increased 71 percent year-on-year during the first half of the marketing year to 27.8 million tons (1.09 billion bushels) compared to 16.3 million tons (641.7 million bushels) the year prior. Exports as of February 2016 represented 58 percent of last marketing year's total volume.

In addition, exports of U.S. meat produced with feed grains, including beef, pork and poultry, increased from 9.9 million tons (389.7 million bushels) to 11.5 million tons (452.7 million bushels) in corn equivalent year-over-year, an increase of 15 percent.

U.S. ethanol exports during 2016/2017 as of February 2017 also increased substantially during the first six months of the marketing year, reaching 82 percent of the total volume for 2015/2016 at 711 million gallons (6.45 million tons or 253.9 million bushels in corn equivalent). That volume represents a 66 percent increase year-over-year, up from last marketing year's 428 million gallons (3.88 million tons or 152.7 million bushels in corn equivalent) during the same time frame.

U.S. exports of distiller's dried grains with solubles (DDGS) also increased slightly at 3 percent year-over-year despite trade disruptions in two major markets, China and Vietnam. U.S. DDGS exports totaled 5.9 million tons in the first six months of the 2016/2017 marketing year, compared to 5.7 million tons the prior year.

While overall feed grain exports increased, exports of both sorghum and barley declined in the first six months of the 2016/2017 marketing year. U.S. sorghum exports decreased year-on-year from 5 million tons (196.8 million bushels) to 3.4 million tons (133.9 million bushels). Smaller purchases by China drove the sharp decline. U.S. barley exports decreased year-over-year from nearly 143,000 tons (6.57 million bushels) to about 41,000 tons (1.88 million bushels) due to a decline in U.S. exports to Mexico.

The Council's programs and activities aim to ramp up U.S. feed grain exports in the remaining months of the 2016/2017 marketing year and reach a third-straight year of 100 million tons of exports of U.S. feed grains in all forms.



Texas Northward

On April 1 – no fooling promote one of the greatest - a consortium of communities launched an effort to

events in western history, the Chisholm Trail. 2017

marks the 150th year since the Chisholm Trail began. and celebrations are being planned throughout the year from Texas to Kansas.

The setting was 1867. The nation was trying to recover from the Civil War. As a southern state, Texas had many men who had gone away to fight for the Confederacy. Interestingly, Sam Houston was governor of Texas and was loval to the Union. After he refused to take an oath to support the Confederacy, he was replaced and Texas joined the southern states in the war.

While the men were gone fighting in the War Between the States, longhorn cattle got free and thrived in the wilds of south Texas. The local market for such cattle was flooded and prices were low. Such cattle might be worth three or four dollars a head, if a buyer could be found.

But in markets back east, it was a different story. The post-war recovery had taken place in the northeastern cities and there was demand for beef. Those same cattle might be valued at \$30 or \$40 a head back east.

What was the solution? The Chisholm Trail.

The economic opportunity for beef spurred cattlemen to gather these Texas longhorns and hire drovers to move them north to the railheads in Kansas. It was in this huge migration of cattle that the legend of the cowboy came to life.

Two key people are identified with this era, as described in the following poem. One was Joseph McCoy and the other was Jesse Chisholm. McCoy was the Illinois cattle buyer who traveled along the Kansas Pacific railroad tracks until he found Abilene where he could build stockvards to attract those cattle from Texas.

Jesse Chisholm was a half-Cherokee, half-Scot fur trader. He shipped goods from Wichita by wagon south into Indian territory, where he traded with the soldiers and native tribes. When the cattle herds started coming north through the territory, they found that they could

follow the path made by Chisholm's wagons. From Wichita, they could go on north to Abilene. Eventually this route would become dubbed the Chisholm Trail.

We Pointed Them North Recollections of a Cowpuncher was a book of reminiscences by Teddy Blue Abbott, which is considered authentic because he actually cowboyed during that era. The book's co-author. Helena Huntington Smith, recorded Teddy Blue's recollections of his adventures while he was still alive in 1937. Teddy Blue helped bring cattle north from

Texas, although more of his time was spent on the Western Trail.

While the northern part of the Chisholm Trail was clearly defined, a map of the southern part in Texas looked like the roots of a tree. Many collector routes fed in to what would become the Chisholm Trail, which crossed the Red River into Indian territory at Doan's Crossing.

It all began in Texas. In future columns, I plan to describe the communities who were part of the Chisholm Trail in Kansas.

Down in Texas, after the Civil War ended, Came a time of migration on which the nation depended.

Men gathered up longhorns, down toward the Rio Grande,

And pointed 'em north, toward Kansas prairie land. Here the legend of the cowboy would come alive, As the hero of the era of the great cattle drive. After the Civil War, cattle in Texas were running free, Because the men had been off fighting

with the Confederacy. In the cities back east,

there was high demand for beef. A man named Joseph McCoy wanted to get them relief.

He built stockyards in Abilene next to the railroad, And asked Texas drovers to bring him a load. Meanwhile, Jesse Chisholm, as told in the story, Sent wagons to trade down in Indian territory. When the cattle came north, they could follow the way Where Chisholm's wagons passed in an earlier day. The route became known as the Chisholm Trail, And it became a fundamental American tale

So we thank the Chisholm Trail and Joseph McCoy, For helping bring alive the Great American Cowboy. Happy Trails!


