Association CEO Allen Moczygemba says establishing a feeder calf program built on the use of registered Angus bulls that ties calves back to superior Angus genetics was a strategic priority set by the board in 2016.

"By marrying the advanced technology platform and proprietary software from Verified Beef with the strength and scale of the Angus brand, the Association will deliver a feeder calf program that is not only invaluable to commercial cattlemen but is unmatched in the

most valuable to their business, specifically gain and grade, Moczygemba explains. The Angus feeder calf program will provide a simple tool that validates the genetic potential of feeder calves.

The Association will build on the Reputation Feeder Cattle® program. While the current offering is based on a dollar scoring system, its underlying data analysis methodologies and computer modeling can be adapted to alternative scoring systems, such as the indexing system envisioned by American Angus Association.

"We're confident that as cattlemen better understand the overall performance of Angus genetics, they'll replace other breeds in their bull battery with Angus bulls," Moczygemba says.

According to Tim Watts, chief executive officer of Verified Beef, "Selling calves the old-fashioned way, without

"Top Angus calves are consistently undervalued by several dollars per cwt. or more," Watt says. "Calves from several other popular breeds are often significantly over valued, and the only way to fix this broken marketplace is for the AAA to implement an industry-changing feeder calf program."

The program, which will be configured and integrated with existing Angus systems, is expected to be available in summer 2018. An index scoring system will replace the estimated dollar values currently offered. Herds will receive three genetic indexes: average daily gain, quality grade and a score for replacement heifers.

Don't underestimate importance of bull battery

By Jody Holthaus. Meadowlark Extension District, Livestock and **Natural Resources** As funny as some folks

think the words "bull battery" sound, they need to be taken seriously. On cow/ calf operations, bulls provide half of the genetics in a calf crop. And bull fertility far outweighs cow fertility, at least if you consider that a bull should breed about 25 to 40 cows in a season, (about one for every month of age from two yrs. to four yrs. of age).

USDA data shows over 90% of commercial operations using only natural service to get cows pregnant. Nearly every operation could easilv have iust one poor-performing bull cause a lot of open or late

bred cows.

Getting cows to conceive early in the breeding season is crucial to the long-term reproductive and financial success of an operation. Otherwise, more open and late-bred cows will result in a longer calving season. And, late bred cows will produce younger and lighter weight calves next year, reducing

On spring-calving operations, most bulls have been pulled from the cowherd (or at least should have been) by early fall. It's important that these bulls be given a period of post-breeding season "R&R" (rest and recuperation), particularly since it is common for bulls to

lose upwards of 10-15% of their body weight during a breeding season (i.e. 200 to 300 lbs. on a 2000 lb. bull). Each bull in your bull battery should be evaluated annually for health and ability to breed, including structural soundness and vigor. After culls are removed, bulls should be divided into two groups: 1) older and more dominant bulls that have decent body condition, and 2) young and thin bulls. It is important to separate bulls, since these two groups have significantly different nutritional

good body condition can get by on a 100% forage diet, without addition-

Most mature bulls in

al supplementation from grain. A hay diet consisting of 7% CP (crude protein) and about 50% TDN (total digestible nutrients) will meet a mature bull's requirements, but only if he doesn't need to gain weight. A daily intake of about 1.5-2.0% of body weight (2,000 lbs. \times 2% = 40 lbs./day; dry matter

basis) should be targeted. and body condition should be monitored closely. In contrast, young bulls that lost weight during the past breeding season (but are still growing) often need to

gain upwards of two lbs./ day during the off-season. Older bulls that are thin due to significant weight loss also need to put on substantial gain, commonly one-two lbs./day.







North Dakota, and South Dakota) there were 36,000 workers hired directly by farm operators on farms and ranches during the week of July 09 - 15, 2017, up 6 percent from the July 2016 reference week, according to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Workers numbered 40,000 during the week of October 8-14, 2017, up 18 percent from the October 2016 reference week. Farm operators in the

Northern Plains Region paid their hired workers an average wage of \$13.94 per hour during the July 2017 reference week, down 4 percent from the July 2016 reference week. Field workers received an average of \$13.83 per hour,

up 6 cents. The field and livestock worker combined wage rate at \$13.40, was down 70 cents from the 2016 reference week. Hired laborers worked an average of 44.4 hours during the July 2017 reference week, compared with 44.0 hours worked during the July Farm operators paid their hired workers an av-

One of those fields produced 233 bushels per acre on 14.12 inches and the other produced 222 bushels per acre on 13.5 inches In the fall of 2016 Roth

started meeting with a group of area producers and those talks began forming a larger water conservation project as some of the areas have seen water level declines of over 60 feet in the last ten years. The talks progressed and now the Kearny Finney Local Enhanced Management Area proposal has been receiving public input and evaluating various water conservation ideas to address the depletion of the aquifer in

their area. Could sub-Saharan Africa be the world's next breadbasket? Nebraska study says it's unlikely could also limit sub-Saha-

potential for sub-Saharan Africa to increase agricultural productivity, the odds that the region will become the world's next breadbasket are low, according to a new study from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

Breadbaskets are regions that produce a large and stable surplus of one or more major food crops that not only meet local demand, but substantially contribute to the food supply in other regions. By this definition, there are only a few major breadbaskets in the world. The only rain-fed corn and soybean breadbaskets are the U.S. Corn Belt, Brazilian Cerrados and Argentinean

"Even though there are not very many breadbaskets, they are critically important because they account for a major part of global food production," said Patricio Grassini, assistant professor of agronomv and horticulture at Nebraska and a co-author of the study.

yields in Current sub-Saharan Africa are well below what could be achieved given the region's farmable land and annual rainfall. The area receives more rainfall per year than other breadbaskets around the world. Given these factors, there is a persistent narrative that sub-Saharan Africa has the potential to become a grain breadbasket if production is intensified.

However, the study noted that a lack of data on soil depths that will support root growth has 11mited rigorous evaluations of how well sub-Saharan soils can support high, stable yields. According to Grassini, this is a critical parameter because deeper soils can buffer against rain-free periods. Current soil-depth data lacks adequate underpinning data, Grassini said.

Soils in the U.S. Corn Belt are deep and young, laid down during the past 20,000 years, whereas sub-Saharan soils are weathered and much older, dating back at least 540 million years. In the U.S. Corn Belt, the soils are deeper than 1.5 meters.

For this study, researchers used data provided by the Global Yield Gap and Water Productivity Atlas for 105 locations in major corn-producing countries in the region. Researchers explored a number of different soil-depth scenarios – from 0.5 to 1.5 meters to determine production potential for sub-Saharan Africa.

"We found that for the region to meet its own demand and have a small surplus of (corn), they need to have the same soil depth as soils in the U.S. Corn Belt, and that is very doctoral researcher at Ne-

Mother Nature, mother cows and marbling - some herds can adapt to nature challenges No farmer or rancher is immune from the challenges of nature, but some cow herds are better at adapting than others.

House, Va.; Brian Mc-Culloh of Viroqua, Wis.; and Manny Encinias, Clayton, N.M., shared their stories of selecting cows

that fit unique production scenarios, while also keeping the end product top of mind. They were part of an Angus University panel discussion at the Angus Convention, Nov. 4 to 6, in Fort Worth, Texas.

All cattle ultimately face one consistent challenge: "the consumer's plate," said Justin Sexten, moderator and supply development director for the Certified Angus Beef® (CAB®) brand. Panelists began by naming their diverse issues, from poor forage quality to short growing seasons to lack of rain.

All 385 head are in the top 20% of the breed for weaning weight, yearling weight, weaning value (\$W) and

"We can still hit the mark on weaning weight, yearling weight and marbling. I don't think it's mutually exclusive to select cattle that'll kind of cover all the bases," McCulloh said.

Piloting quality in the desert

"Most of my life, I felt sorry for myself. We lived in a desert," Encinias said. So. for his Ph.D. work, he went to North Dakota, discovering, "You can grow green grass in a lot of different places, but I found out they have their own production challenges."

When he returned to New Mexico to join his family Angus operation and start a consulting business, he "embraced" the environmental pressures. They include raising cattle in a state of varied elevations and temperature that

rain per year and spends two-thirds of its years in drought.

"'I'm a big believer we can take high-end, curve-bender genetics and make them work in our environment if we manage the little things," he said. Those include more available trace minerals and aggressive deworming to "keep that gut as efficient as possible," to do well on low quality or limited

water and feed. Seedstock suppliers must help customers understand the cow's requirements. Encinias

"I think we need to be able to provide customers with an owner's manual, kind of like those with a pilot's license. They know how to fly a Cessna but you're walking into a 747 jet," he said. "By gosh, you might be able to get it off the ground, but landing may be a different monster. I think that's a lot what we're dealing with in New Mexico with high-per-

forming cattle." The breeders agreed: no matter how their commercial customers are marketing calves, it's part of their job to consider what will work for the whole beef community. "It's pretty easy to continue to select for cattle with added marbling while keeping other traits in balance and perspective," Bennett said.



Meat scientists at the university are reporting results of a study that indicates that Omega 3-enriched meat maintains its flavor, tenderness and shelf life just as well as meat that is not enriched with the beneficial fatty

The human body needs Omega 3 fatty acids to function, but they also have been proven to provide substantial health benefits. The U.S. National Inof heart disease, some cancers, age-related macular degeneration, rheumatoid arthritis and possibly even Alzheimer's disease. Omega 3 fatty acids

have also been shown to improve a baby's health and development when the mother's diet includes them during pregnancy and breastfeeding.

John Gonzalez, a meat scientist at Kansas State University, said a past problem with simply adding Omega 3 fatty acids to animals' diet is that it would cause an off-flavor or accelerate discolorbeen thrown out in the history of meat science for the past 20 years is that \$1 billion per year is lost just on meat being thrown away from being discolored," Gonzalez said. "If you actually increase Omega 3's and it has a negative effect, that's a bad thing because you may be able to sell for a greater price, but you have to throw away more of your products."

Those concerns related to feeding Omega 3 enriched diets to pigs and cows may soon go away with K-State's recent find-

meat from animals fed Omega 3's in a patented process called LIPEX and

developed by XFE Products of Des Moines, Iowa. The diet was fed to animals at Omega 3 Family Farms of Columbus, Nebraska, where Nuttelman is the farm director.

Gonzalez and K-State meat scientists found that the Omega 3 content in the consumer meat product increased by 178 percent. Subsequent taste tests with trained panelists showed that there was no reported difference in the taste, color, tenderness or shelf life of


"So what we know is that the level of Omega 3's are increased, and those consumers who care about the level of Omega 3's in the meat will pay the premium," Gonzalez said. "The retailer doesn't have to worry about throwing away the product because this product will have a (reliable) shelf life."

the meat.

Nuttelman said that his business had tested meat products for more than 15 years with Midwest Labs of Omaha, Nebraska, but had not previously worked with a public university to verify the benefits of the Omega 3 products.

He added that the patented feeding process that his company uses has increased marbling in the meat, which adds flavor.

"We believe the work that K-State did for our farm and for XFE Products will bring real value to our programs," Nuttelman said. "I believe that consumers can look for this product in order to receive very good Omega 3 levels in their diet, and for sure the taste will be
