



Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

It was quite a week for all the markets. Trade war talk created a great deal of volatility in the stock market and in the ag futures as well. We had both limit higher and limit lower moves in the cattle, new all-time highs in the lumber, and nearly a limit lower move in the soybeans.

By the end of the week it was a mixed bag for the markets. Some live cattle contracts were higher and some were lower, feeder cattle were higher, soybeans were lower, but soybean meal was higher, and the Dow Jones was less than 200 points lower for the week.

The scattered finished to the week is because of complete uncertainty about our economic future. Generally speaking,

uncertainty is bad, but at the same time there is a very high chance that nothing really happens, which means selling out of fear is pointless. Large traders are perfectly willing to buy breaks in a number of markets, especially when the breaks seem overdone, but they are also very willing to exit long positions on the slightest bit of potentially negative news.

As far as agriculture is concerned, the soybean market could suffer the most if the Chinese place retaliatory tariffs on our products. The Chinese are far and away our largest customer, and although they cannot get by without buying U.S. soybeans, adding 25% to the cost of our soybeans will shift some of their demand elsewhere.

The Chinese don't take much U.S. corn, but they do by large quantities of ethanol and DDG's at times, which can hurt corn demand, but worse would be if we need fewer acres of soybeans, those acres would likely be shifted to corn. Much of the bullish potential for corn in the next couple of years is the prospect of declining acreage this year. If that doesn't happen, we will be back to hoping for a weather problem to control supplies.

We don't send much beef or wheat to China, so I don't see much problem arising with those markets. Tariffs on pork will be a problem since we are sending more pork to China now than we have in the past, and that could also impact the feed mar-

kets here if we start slowing our pork production.

What we are going to find out over the next couple of months is how willing the Chinese government is to create food inflation. Putting tariffs on food and feed products will have a very big impact on food prices in China. They don't want to see rioting because of inflation, but they also don't want to see unemployment caused by slowing purchases by us. We have larger economy than China, and we have food security, which gives us two big advantages if we end up in a trade war. What they have is over a trillion dollars in Treasury Bonds and they produce a ton of products we use that we can't quickly start producing. One absolute certainty is that if both sides start implementing tariffs there will be higher prices for consumers both here and there. Rampant worldwide inflation might mean that the gold market finally wakes up.

In the short run we could see the Chinese ramp up purchases of our products before the tariffs

kick in. That could create some bull spreading the beans and in the meal. The charts suggest more strength in the corn and wheat and that the cattle have bottomed out for a while.

Smoke modeling, weather info available on www.ksfire.org

With nearly 40,000 acres burned thus far in the Kansas Flint Hills, prescribed burning season is getting into full swing. Landowners and managers are encouraged to help spread out the timing of burns by using web-based tools on www.ksfire.org. Interactive smoke models on this website are designed to help Flint Hills ranchers voluntarily mitigate air quality problems in downwind communities with larger populations. This and other steps included in the Flint Hills Smoke Management Plan are intended to help the ranching community avoid more strict regulation in the future.

There are two smoke forecast models available. The Cumulative Fire Impact map shows the predicted potential smoke contributions from each county to air quality in urban areas. It is based on the assumption that multiple fires will be occurring simultaneously across the Flint Hills. A second model shows the direction and extent of the predicted plume from a single burn. Users select a county where the burn is located, provide the number of acres to be burned and estimate the fuel load. An animated display shows movement of the smoke plume over the next 48 hours.

A discussion of weather conditions also is available. This allows ranchers to evaluate whether better days for burning lie ahead.

Kansas Hay Market Report

Hay market activity slow due to limited supply, although demand remains good for both grinding alfalfa and grass hay. Prices for alfalfa edged higher, while grass hay stayed mostly steady. A green-up can be seen in the wheat fields and grassland pastures in areas that received moisture, but the drought continues. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor the 180-day precipitation departures are four to eight inches below normal and extreme drought expanded in southern Kansas within the last week. The abnormally dry (D0) category is at 98 pct, moderate drought (D1) is at 81 pct, severe drought (D2) is at 56 pct, extreme drought (D3) is at 21 pct and exceptional drought (D4) is at 4 pct. AROUND KANSAS



March brought the loss of two incredible Kansans, David Dary and Linda Brown Thompson. They had very different paths, though each was in the public eye, and they left legacies that will endure long after them.

Dave, a respected journalist and prolific author died in March following a brief illness, according to a published obituary. He was 83.

A Manhattan native, Dave was recruited to Norman, Oklahoma, in 1989 to lead the H.H. Herbert School of Journalism and Mass Communication. He previously served as a faculty member and administrator for 20 years at the

University of Kansas' William Allen White School of Journalism and Mass Communication.

Upon his arrival at OU, Dave worked tirelessly to get the school re-credited and back in the graces of the state's newspaper publishers. He approached Edward L. Gaylord in the early 1990s requesting consideration for a \$22 million gift to build a new journalism building and underwrite faculty positions and scholarships. Later, with the help of the university's new president, David Boren, the gift became reality.

"David Dary was multi-talented," Boren said. "Not only was he an

outstanding teacher, but he was also a gifted writer and historian of the American West. He was an inspiration for countless students."

At Kansas, Dave began writing newspaper articles on Kansas history. That lead to a 21-book publishing career. Four books dealt with journalism and the remainder focused on the historical aspects of the American West, including *True Tales of Old-Time Kansas*. Among his awards were two Wrangler Awards from the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum, two Spur Awards and the Owen Wister Lifetime Achievement Award from the Western Writers of America.

Prior to his teaching and academic career, Dave worked in radio and television news, first in Kansas and Texas before joining CBS News in Washington. He covered the last months of the Eisenhower and then the Kennedy administrations. He introduced President Kennedy on CBS for the president's Cuban Missile Crisis

State reported slight uptick in trichomoniasis last year

The Kansas Department of Agriculture Division of Animal Health has reported there was a slight increase in the number of trichomoniasis-infected bulls and herds in 2017. There were nine new cases diagnosed last year, compared to only three cases in 2016. The cases involved ten positive herds with 2,500 total cows and 23 positive bulls. These positive cases resulted in 18 herds being placed under quarantine due to possible exposure.

Most of the positive bulls ranged from five to seven years old. About 50%

of the herd owners reported carrying over open heifers or cows. All the positive herds had contact with short-bred or open cows.

Trichomoniasis is a venereal disease spread through sexual contact. It causes abortions, prolonged calving intervals and high open rates.

Kansas regulations address testing bulls at change of ownership and requiring breeding cattle imported from other states to meet certain criteria. More information on regulations related to trichomoniasis can be found here. An increase in

producer awareness and testing during recent years has led to a lower incidence rate of the disease.

speech and later overflow Soviet ships carrying missiles outbound from Cuba.

In 1963, Dave was recruited by rival NBC News to manage its local news in Washington, D.C. He returned to Kansas in the late 1960s to help build a new NBC television station in Topeka before joining the KU faculty.

He retired in 2000 as professor emeritus and returned to writing. He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Sue, and their four daughters, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.

His former co-worker William Redlin said, Dave Dary was a Kansan of the best kind, through and through.

A little girl who wanted to go to school with her neighboring playmates: that's who Linda Brown was. When she passed away March 25, the world mourned. News of her passing was reported in New York and London, and, in her hometown of Topeka.

As the oldest child of Oliver and Leola Brown, Linda, became the focal

point for the plaintiffs in the landmark Supreme Court Case, Brown v. Topeka Board of Education. Linda traveled the country with other family members lecturing about the history of this significant civil rights milestone. She along with her family and others involved in the cases consolidated under Brown, were guests at the White House during the Clinton and Obama administrations.

She was involved as Program Associate with the Brown Foundation where she assisted with the establishment of four libraries for preschool children.

Linda graduated from Central High School in Springfield, Missouri and received certification in early childhood education from Kansas State University.

As reported in the *Topeka Capital Journal*, she was preceded in death by her husband William Thompson. She is survived by her mother, Leola Brown Montgomery, and by her children, Charles and Kim-

berly. three grandsons and three step grandchildren and three great-grandchildren, as well as a host of nieces and nephews.

Her siblings, Terry Brown Tyler and Cheryl Brown Henderson, also survive.

Linda was my neighbor many years ago in Topeka, and we passed, as neighbors do, headed in and out on daily errands. I often looked toward her doorway, thinking how ordinary it was, just like every other doorway on the block. I thought how someone looking on us unaware would never guess that this quiet lady caring for her family, going back and forth to work and to church, this ordinary woman, who had been an ordinary girl, had left an extraordinary impact on the world.

Rest in peace and God-speed, Linda. Well done.



American Lamb Board establishes goal of two percent yearly demand growth

The American Lamb Board (ALB) has approved a new long range plan for 2018-2022 to focus the work of the checkoff and its stakeholders in the areas of promotion, information and research over the next five years – and it boldly sets a demand growth goal.

The strategic objective of the plan is to increase demand for American Lamb by two percent annually over the next five years, for a total demand growth of ten percent. Per capita consumption of lamb in the U.S. has remained steady over the past ten years at approximately one pound per person per year with nearly 20 percent of lamb consumption occurring during the spring holidays. Urban shoppers are the most likely to consume lamb with the highest consumption occurring on the East and West coasts. In 2015, lamb demand was up seven percent compared to 2014 and increased again in 2016 by 2.5 percent.

“The future holds tremendous promise for our industry which produces a unique, flavorful, tender and nutritious protein that meets the changing needs and preferences of consumers,” says Jim Percival, Xenia, Ohio, ALB chairman. “Improving the quality and consistency of our products to ensuring consumers have a great eating experience every time, increasing our industry’s productivity and stabilizing our prices are all critical to the success of creating demand for American Lamb.”

ALB is committed to Five Core Strategies outlined in the Long Range Plan that aim to increase the demand for American Lamb.

Grow awareness and increase usage of American Lamb among chefs and consumers.

Promote and strengthen American Lamb’s Value Proposition.

Improve the quality and consistency of American Lamb.

Support industry efforts to increase domestic supplies of lamb.

Collaborate and communicate with industry partners and stakeholders to expand efforts to address the first four strategies.

“Using these core strategies, the ALB will create budgets and annual work plans to achieve the goals and initiatives set by the Long Range Plan. America’s lamb producers are excited about the work we’ll be doing over the next several years to increase the demand not just for lamb, but specifically for American Lamb,” Percival says.

The Long Range Plan identifies key trends and opportunities in today’s marketing climate. Global demand growth, interest in buying local and production practices, changing consumer preferences, nutrition perceptions of lamb, as well as the price and perceived value of American Lamb all influenced the five core strategies outlined in the Long Range Plan.

“We trust that other stakeholders and allied industry partners will seek opportunities to align their plans with this plan and find ways to support the industry-wide objectives. We all benefit when we focus our efforts to build demand for American Lamb,” Percival says.

NPB collaboration continues to multiply checkoff value for farm-level research

The National Pork Board has announced a new collaboration with the Foundation for Food and Agriculture Research, a nonprofit established in the 2014 Farm Bill, to support a competitive research program to improve pig health, productivity and well-being. The end goal is to improve pig survival during all stages of

production. The joint venture has \$2 million of grant funds available to potential investigators.

As U.S. pork producers strive to produce more pork in a sustainable way, animal care, pig health, well-being and productivity are all critical pieces of production. This grant program is designed to focus research, education and training in these key areas of pork production to help producers achieve their goals in a responsible way.

"As animal caretakers, America's pig farmers strive to give their animals the best opportunity to reach marketable weight," said Dustin Kendall, a swine nutritionist with Prestage Farms in Clinton, North Carolina and chair of the National Pork Board's Animal Science Committee. "Unfortunately, data from the Pork Checkoff's Industry Pro-

ductivity Analysis suggests the trends are negative in this area. Focusing Checkoff funds in this underserved research area will allow us to find solutions that significantly benefit all of our producer stakeholders."

The grant funding is anticipated to be awarded to one scientifically diverse group of researchers willing to pool talent and resources to make a significant, immediate impact on pig survival. Potential research areas may include health, genetics, nutrition, facility design, management, monitoring, economics and welfare.

"The most meaningful agricultural research is designed in partnership with stakeholders," said Sally Rockey, executive director of the Foundation for Food and Agriculture Research. "The Foundation for Food and Agriculture

Research is pleased to join the National Pork Board to support this important initiative to address swine mortality rates on farms across the United States."

In addition to research, successful applicants are expected to conduct outreach to industry stakeholders and train graduate and veterinary students involved as assistants on the project. Applicants are required to submit a clearly defined outreach plan with specific objectives for disseminating research results to the scientific community as well as to pork producers and their staff.

"Investing Checkoff funds in production research makes a real difference at the farm level," said Chris Hostetler, director of animal science at the National Pork Board. "In fact, every dollar invested in production research returns of \$83 in industry-wide benefit according to a third-party audit by Cornell University. This collaboration with FFAR is just one of the ways producer dollars can be leveraged to magnify the return on investment."

Chinese trade war will cripple Kansas farmers and ranchers

Kansas farmers and ranchers depend on market access for our exports around the globe. Kansas Farm Bureau voiced concern about retaliation when the Trump administration announced new tariffs on steel and aluminum and continue to watch developments closely.

The retaliation by China against the proposed tariffs will result in drastic impacts on Kansas markets for beef, pork, soybeans, sorghum and airplanes. Many of these products already face tariffs and will now be subject to additional surcharges of 15 to 25 percent.

Farmers and ranchers are, by necessity, patient and optimistic, says Kansas Farm Bureau president Richard Felts who farms in Montgomery County. Markets ebb and flow but China's threatened retaliation against the U.S. tariff proposal is testing both the patience and optimism of families who are facing the worst agricultural economy in 16 years. This must stop.

“Growing trade disputes have placed farmers and ranchers in a precarious position,” Felts said. “We have bills to pay and debts we must settle and

Chinese national sentenced in Kansas engineered rice theft

(AP) — A Chinese national who lived in Manhattan has been sentenced to ten years in prison for conspiring to steal proprietary rice seeds developed in the U.S. and giving them to visitors from China.

Federal prosecutors announced 51-year-old Weiqiang Zhang's sentence on two counts of conspiracy and one count of interstate transportation of stolen property. He was convicted in February 2017.

Zhang was a rice breeder for Ventria Bioscience in Junction City, which developed genetically engineered rice for therapeutic and medical fields.

Prosecutors said Zhang stored hundreds of seeds from Ventria at his home. In 2013, Zhang toured facilities in the Midwest with officials from a crop research institute in China. Federal officials found Ventria seeds in the visitors' luggage as they prepared to return to China.

Registration is now open for the 2018 Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Annual Meeting and Research Symposium. This year's event, themed 50th Anniversary in the Rockies, will be June 20 to June 23 at the Embassy Suites Convention Center Hotel in Loveland, Colorado.

Early registration deadline is May 31. Attendees can save \$80 by pre-registering. Online registration is available at <http://www.beefimprovement.org>.

This year's BIF symposium features two and a half days of educational programming and a full day of tours. The first morning's general session — "Positioning for the Future of Beef Production" — will feature Dave Weaver, EMI Analytics vice president beef analysis; Mark McCully, Certified Angus Beef vice president; Dr. Sara Place, National Cattlemen's Beef Association senior director of sustainable beef production research; Dr. Dorian

Garrick, Massey University professor and chief scientist; and Dr. John Pollak, Cornell University emeritus professor.

The second day's general session, "Decision Time: Who Will Own Our Industry?" will include presentation by Wade Small, Agri Beef Inc. livestock division president; Marty Ropp, Allied Genetic Resources; Dr. Matt Cleveland, Genus ABS global beef product development director; Dan Moser, Angus Genetics Inc. president; Wade Shafer,

American Simmental Association executive vice president; Larry Benyshek, Benyshek and Hough Consulting Services; and John Genho, Livestock Genetic Services LLC.

The afternoon breakout sessions both days will focus on a range of beef-production and genetic-improvement topics. The conference also features a Young Producer Symposium on Wednesday afternoon, designed to

network and equip young cattle producers with essential knowledge as they grow their role in the business. Wednesday evening attendees will also enjoy an opening reception.

and commercial beef producers, academics and allied industry partners. The attendance list is a "who's who" of the beef value chain, offering great networking opportunities and conversations about the issues of the day. Program topics focus on how the beef industry can enhance value through genetic improvement across a range of attributes that affect the value chain.

Pork producers face export tariffs from China; largest market for high-profit products at stake

The recent announcement from the Chinese government that a 25 percent tariff will be charged to American pork imports poses potential economic hardships for American pork producers.

"This tariff basically taxes U.S. product — our product become more expensive going into China," said Glynn Tonsor, K-State Research and Extension livestock market economist. "So U.S. pork would be at a disadvantage compared to, for example, pork from the European Union and other major pork exporters. Our product becomes more expensive — all else equal, we're going to send less pork into China than we did before."

Economically, this creates a surplus — supply is the same, but demand decreases. Tonsor said there are two options for the surplus pork. "Either we eat more pork here at home, or we're going to find a second-best export market for it. Either way, this is probably going to be a lower value than before, so that's why there are some concerns about this announcement."

Lower value means pork producers will get less money when they sell their product. The expenses of that business, how-

ever — the costs for feed, shelter, veterinary care, transportation — will remain stable. That results in less profit for the pork producer.

Lee Schulz, a livestock market economist for Iowa State University and a frequent contributor to the K-State Radio Network's "Agriculture Today," says the biggest hit to American hog farmers could be from what many of us have never eaten, let alone heard of.

"When you look at China, it's the variety meats that are huge. More than one-third of the share of our U.S. pork variety meats were sent to China last year — that accounted for about \$3.50 per slaughtered hog."

Variety meats are things like the ears, the snout, the tongue, many of the hog's internal organs. Americans generally do not consider these food, but in China, Russia, Mexico and other export markets they have value.

According to *National Hog Farmer* magazine, pork ears have no edible value here at home, although a producer can sell them to pet treat producers, at a value of \$0.70 per pound. Those same ears, sent to China, would earn \$2.30 per pound.

Last year, in vari-

ety-meat exports alone, China was our largest destination in both volume (181,351 metric tons) and value (\$425.2 million). China accounted for more than one-third of U.S. pork variety meat exports last year, adding more than \$3.50 value per U.S. hog, according to the U.S. Meat Export Federation.

"It's very important that we're able to send those products to the highest-valued market," Schulz said. "China is a very price-sensitive market, so any time we're going to see a tariff rate increase, that's going to affect the competition for U.S. products in the country. We've been talking about pork, but this really goes across all trade with China."

Tonsor harbors concerns that there may be implications for other potential exports — beef is on his mind — there. "The entire U.S. meat livestock industry wants to be positioned to be able to sell into that market, and anything that makes it harder going forward is going to be a harm," Tonsor said.

"Does this become a broader trade dispute involving other countries and other products? Will it 'snowball,' if you like? That's where my concerns are."
