KDA announces additional drought assistance

The Kansas Department of Agriculture, Division of Conservation (DOC) is pleased to announce the availability of funds to assist landowners that have previously drilled livestock water supply wells in response to the ongoing drought. Previously installed livestock water supply pipeline and tanks are also eligible for fund-

ing. The State Conserva-

tion Commission took action on July 31, 2018 to approve funding that will provide financial assistance for livestock water supply wells, pipeline and tanks installed after June 1, 2018 and before the announcement of the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) Drought Initiative by NRCS on July 24, 2018.

Following is addition-

al program guidance on the Retroactive Livestock Well Incentive Payment Initiative:

Applications will be accepted from August 1 through August 31, 2018.

**Eligible livestock wells, pipeline and tanks must have been installed or have started the installation process between the dates of June 1, 2018 and July 24, 2018.

**Eligible livestock wells, pipeline and tanks must serve pastures 40 acres or larger with a permanent perimeter fence.

**Landowners must provide a copy of the completed WWC-5 Water Well Record form for all wells drilled.

**Landowners must provide copies of all bills pertaining to drilling the livestock wells, installing livestock water supply pipeline and installing

**Landowners must certify that these practices are being used for livestock water supply.

Eligible counties are the same as the NRCS EQIP 2018 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) Drought Initiative. There are 50 counties eligible across the state and include: Geary, Riley, Pottawatomie and Wabaunsee counties.

The DOC will approve applications until all specified funds are allocated at the end of the sign-up period. Applications will be ranked based on criteria developed and approved by the State Conservation Commission.

Practice Code 642 (Water Well) will have a statewide county average cost of \$25.00 per linear foot of depth with a costshare percentage of 50%

under this initiative.

Practice Code 516 (Pipeline) will have a statewide county average cost of \$3.00 per linear foot with a cost-share percentage of 50% under this initiative. Practice Code 614 (Wa-

tering Facility) will have a statewide county average cost of \$1.50 per gallon with a cost-share percent age of 50% under this ini tiative.

Landowners with ap proved applications will sign a 10-year maintenance agreement for the

practices as installed. The total landowner limit for financial assistance will be \$6,000 under this initiative.

Are property values affected by wind farms?

Wind energy has paid off for rural areas. Whether it be new employment opportunities, additional revenue for counties, or direct payments to landowners, rural communities have received signifi-

cant benefits. However, any kind of new development comes with concerns. One frequent concern voiced by local residents is what effect a wind farm may have on property values. Several studies have examined how wind farms may affect property values.

Lawrence

National Laboratory completed a study in 2013 that used data collected from the sale of more than 50,000 homes in 27 counties, in nine different states. These homes were within ten miles of wind projects, with 1,198 sales within one mile and 331 within half a mile. This study also used data from before a project; the post-announcement, pre-construction period; and during operation. The study found no evidence of an effect on prices of homes in proximity to wind turbines.

While wind farms ap-

pear to have no notable effect on property values, siting remains an important piece of wind energy development. Developers, along with county and community officials, must identify ways to address concerns and mitigate impacts from new development, while allowing landowners to host wind turbines, if they choose to. A good first step is to

identify questions and concerns of local residents, often through public meetings, to discuss potential projects and share information. These meetings can offer an opportunity for county officials to gather input informing decisions about local regulations, and for developers to answer questions and use feedback to make adjustments to projects. Careful siting and

fair, well-informed standards also help ensure other local concerns can be avoided or mitigated. Rural communities can work together, and with developers, to make wind energy projects better, and continue to reap the benefits of new renewable

Kansas Hay Market Report

Hay market trade activity is light to moderate. Prices mostly steady. Demand is fairly good. There have been a lot of inquiries about purchasing and pricing, but both sides remain hesitant. Buyers are not sure they want to pay the asking price, while sellers are not sure they want to sell on the chance that prices may increase or that they may need the hay themselves. The western half of the state continues to see spotty rain, while the eastern half continues to struggle with drought. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, the moderate drought (D1) category was removed in southwest Kansas where short term indicators have rebounded. The abnormally dry (D0) category is at 24 pct, moderate drought (D1) is at 20 pct, severe drought (D2) is at 19 pct, and extreme drought (D3) is at 7 pct and exceptional drought (D4) is at 1 pct. Right now, KFS, which is a division of the Kansas State University College of Agriculture, has 18 personnel working fire situations in California, Colorado, Nevada, Oregon and Wvoming, including specialist Darci Paull and public information officer Shawna Hartman, who are assigned to the Ferguson Fire near Yosemite National Park. As of Aug. 1, two firefighters have died and nine have been injured battling the 62,000acre blaze.

As the situation worsens, more people and equipment will be needed. An additional KFS wildland fire engine will be available for assignment nationwide beginning Aug. 6. The engine will

In return for enrolling land in CRP, USDA. through FSA on behalf of the Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC), provides participants that remove sensitive lands from production and plant certain grasses, shrubs and trees that improve water quality, prevent soil erosion and increase wildlife habitat with annual rental payments and cost-share

assistance. Landowners enter into contracts that last between ten and 15 Signed into law by

President Reagan in 1985, CRP is one of the largest private-lands conservation programs in the United States. Thanks to voluntary participation by farmers, ranchers and private landowners, CRP has improved water quality, reduced soil erosion and increased habitat for endangered and threat-

The new changes to CRP do not impact the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program, a related program offered by CCC and state partners.

USDA opens election period for seed cotton program

The U.S. Department recently announced that seed cotton producers who want to participate in the Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage (PLC) programs for the 2018 crop year, may now submit applications. The signup period ends on Dec. 7, 2018. In accordance with

changes to ARC and PLC made by the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018, farm owners with generic base acres and recent planting history of covered commodities have a one-time opportunity to allocate all of the generic base acres on their farm. "ARC and PLC are a

vital part of the safety net that ensures American agriculture remains competitive and producers are able to manage risk," said USDA Farm Service Agencv administrator Richard Fordyce. "USDA encourages any cotton producer to look into these important safety net programs," Farms with generic

base acres that were plant-

ed or approved as a prevented planted commodity ties on the farm. An increase in total

Producers have two options to allocate generic

Option 1: Allocate generic base acres on a farm to seed cotton base acres equal to the higher of the following: 80 percent of the gener-

Option 2: Allocate generic base acres in proportion to the 4-year average acreage planted on the farm and prevented from being planted for each covered commodity, including upland cotton, in crop years 2009 through 2012, to the total acreage planted and considered planted for all covered commodi-

base acres on the farm is not allowed. For farms without planted or considered planted history of covered commodities, including upland cotton, during the 2009 through 2016 crop years, all generic base acres shall be con-Winter Canola Preplant School

during the 2009 through verted to unassigned generic base acres for which no benefits may be available.

If a farm owner is unable to allocate generic base acres during the allocation period, the generic base acres will be deemed to be allocated to seed cotton base under the provisions in Option 1.

FSA posted a notice on Current farm owner(s)

have a one-time opportunity to update the farm's payment yield for seed cotton with either retaining the Counter-Cyclical (CC) payment yield for upland cotton, as listed on the farm record as of Sept. 3, 2013, multiplied by 2.4, or update the upland cotton yield to 90 percent of a simple average of the upland cotton yield per planted acre on the farm for years 2008 through 2012. The retained or updated yield becomes the PLC yield for the farm, effective for the 2018 crop year, and will only be used in calculating payment rates for the PLC program. If a request to update yields is not filed within the yield update period, the former CC yield on the farm multiplied by 2.4 will be carried forward as the farm's PLC yield for the 2018 crop year. If the generic base acre allocation results in crop base acres for a covered commodity base where a PLC farm, then an owner may update the yield(s) for the new crop(s).

Following the generic base acre allocation and yield update, the current producer(s) on the farm will have a one-time opportunity to unanimously elect either ARC or PLC for the seed cotton base acres resulting from the generic base acre allocation. Farms with an ARC-IC election will continue in ARC-IC, which would include any seed cotton base acres allocated to the farm. Any farm that fails to make a unanimous election will be deemed to have elected PLC for acres allocated on the farm to seed cotton.

The final step in the process is enrolling the farm in ARC/PLC for 2018. After completing the aforementioned steps, producers on farms must still enroll the farm for that farm to be eligible for ARC and PLC for 2018. Enrollment of ARC and PLC farms, consistent with the program election for the farm and covered commodities made in the election period, for the 2018 crop year, began Nov. 1, 2017 and will end on Dec. 7, 2018.

Online entry is still open for the Angus Value Discovery Contest (AVDC) until Sept. 7. In this second year as in its first, the nationwide contest will highlight commercial Angus producers aiming for the

high-quality beef target. The AVDC is especially meant for those who use best practices, retain some ownership of calves and receive carcass data. It's easier than ever to enter. Kara Lee, production brand manager for

(CAB), says producers can self-nominate this year. "The biggest differ-

ence is that last year we required all entries to be nominated by their seedstock provider, which could have been an Angus breeder or AI (artificial insemination) company," she says. "They'll still be asked to designate one, because a portion of the prize money is in the form of credit toward a purchase from their seedstock

Despite that change, Lee still asks registered breeders and companies to enter their customers.

"You likely know which of them are buying the right kind of bulls and semen to compete, and those who are following their calves through from a data perspective.'

To qualify, an eligible group must consist of 30 head or more, 70% sired by Angus bulls with a harvest date spanning more than a year, between August 1 last year and August 30, 2018. Groups will rank based on grade, yield, noted in the packer summary.

"As we know Certified Angus Beef ® brand acceptance rates continue to increase across the industry, rates that used to be considered really outstanding today may be average," Lee says. "We want to continue to push commercial producers striving for excellent to outpace that average and get better

to earn more premiums." She says the contest design works to recognize producer effort, and any U.S. commercial producer with cattle meeting the requirements may enter the contest.

"We know a lot of carcass contests are done on a local level," she says. "We certainly encourage the pursuit of carcass quality no matter where you are or what you're measuring against. However, this allows producers to compete on a national level."

First prize wins \$2,000 credit towards a future purchase from their designated seedstock provider, and second prize similarly receives \$1,000 credit.
