

K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy accepting applications

Students from across the country with an interest in the livestock industry and related careers can apply now for the Kansas State University Ani-

mal Sciences Leadership Academy (KASLA). The academy, which is celebrating its eleventh year, is an intensive four-day educational experience

designed to enhance the leadership skills and animal science knowledge of students in ninth through 12th grades.

Hosted by the K-State

Department of Animal Sciences and Industry and sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council (LMIC), the academy's goal is to develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a successful future in this field.

"Letting young people have more exposure to the industry allows them to see the possibilities and even the dreams available to them in this very big industry," said Mark Gardiner, LMIC president. "We want to help them match up their mind with the opportunities, to take them

places. It's our job to invest in the future, and it's part of our K-State Animal Sciences family tradition to pay it forward and make sure the next generation is better than the preceding."

The academy will take place in Manhattan, June 5-8. Applications are due April 1, 2019, and can be found at <http://www.Youth-Livestock.KSU.edu>. The program's itinerary will feature interactive workshops, tours and faculty mentor time with animal sciences and industry professors. Industry leaders will also join the partici-

pants frequently to share their knowledge and expertise. Throughout the week, participants will work in teams to evaluate current events within the animal science industry and educate others. This experience will culminate with team presentations and a closing reception on Saturday morning.

Only 20 students will be accepted for each session to ensure individualized attention from counselors, professors and industry leaders. Participants will stay on campus in university housing with program staff for the duration of the event. Transportation to and from the event is the responsibility of the participant, along with a \$50 fee to reserve his or her space. This fee is only due upon acceptance and not at the time of application. The Livestock and Meat Industry Council generously provides all other sponsorships.

Coffee Shop Meeting scheduled for February 21

Merits of Different Types of Entities and 1031 Exchange Requirements will be the topics at the February 21 Coffee Shop Meeting, scheduled for 10:30 a.m. to noon at Nelson's Landing in Leonardville. Mark Dikeman, Kansas Farm Management Association associate director, will be the featured speaker.

"A 1031 Exchange is a tax management tool that allows farmers or other real estate owners to trade property without incurring large capital gains taxes," said Greg McClure, KSU-Riley County Extension agent. "It is a good tax management option for some, but it is important to know the rules before starting the process. It is not as simple as just selling one piece of property and then replacing it with another."

Dikeman will also discuss the pros and cons of the various types of entities under which a farm could operate. He will highlight the pros and cons of Limited Liability Companies (LLCs), corporations, partnerships, and sole proprietorships, and will answer audience questions about each type of entity.

Over the past 20 years, the Gelbvieh and Balancer breed has gained favorable progress in docility on top of a solid foundation of historically docile cattle. However, the range of docility EPDs of active sires proves that there is genetic diversity, which means further progress can be made. It’s also important to note that in herds where temperament is not currently a concern, differences will not be as intensely realized.

Capital gains and understanding basis

Basis is defined as the amount of your capital investment in property for tax purposes. In common terms it’s what you paid for the property or its value when you acquired it. Basis plays a big role in determining depreciation, recapture, and the dreaded capital gain. This article will discuss how basis in property can affect property transfers.

There are two basic types of property transactions or transfers: transfers during life and transfers after death. Transfers during life are usually viewed as sales or gifts. In the event of a sale during life, the basic rule is that the price the property is sold for minus the property’s basis is your capital gain (or loss). For example, if Ima Farmer bought 160 acres in 1980 for \$500 per acre and sold that property in 2019 for \$3,500 per acre, Ima Farmer’s gain would be \$3,000. We arrive at that figure by subtracting the price the property sold for (\$3,500) from Ima Farmer’s basis in the property (\$500) – or what he acquired it for. That \$3,000 per acre gain is subject to capital gains tax. Depending on Farm-

er’s tax bracket, it could be up to 40%.

Example 1: Let’s see what Ima Farmer could have done to avoid such a large tax bill. If instead of selling the property, Ima Farmer had instead left it to his heirs in his will or in a trust, at Ima Farmer’s death, the property would have received a step-up in basis under IRC 1014. This provision in the tax code gives Ima Farmer’s heirs the property with the current fair market value as of Farmer’s date of death as their basis in the property. So, using the previous example, if instead of selling the land for \$3,500 per acre, Ima Farmer had died and left the land to his heirs, the heirs would take the property and their basis in the property would be \$3,500 per acre. Therefore, if the heirs decided to sell the property after Farmer’s death for \$3,500 per acre, they would not have any gain because their basis is \$3,500.

Example 2: Let’s look at another route Ima Farmer does not want to take in the event his children are planning on selling the property. If instead of selling the property himself and instead of leaving the property to his family

after his death, Ima Farmer decides to gift the property to his family during his lifetime. In this scenario, Ima Farmer’s basis of \$500 per acre (what he purchased the land for in 1980) is transferred to the family members he gifts the land to. So, instead of receiving a step-up in basis like in the example where Farmer dies and leaves the land to his family, his family steps into the shoes of Ima Farmer and possesses the property with Farmer’s basis. Therefore, if Farmer’s family decides to sell the land, even they wait to sell it after Farmer dies, they will still have a capital gains problem.

Example 3: One way to get around a capital gains problem is to do a 1031 Exchange. How this works is Ima Farmer sells the land (Tract 1), then turns around and buys another piece of land (Tract 2) and Farmer’s basis in Tract 1 is

now transferred or substituted as Farmer’s basis for Tract 2. For this to work, timing is important. The IRS requires that the exchange be completed within 180 days. The result of the 1031 exchange is that Tract 1’s basis of \$500 per acre is transferred or substituted for Tract 2’s basis. So now, even though Farmer paid \$3,500 per acre for Tract 2, his basis in Tract 2 is still \$500. In essence, the 1031 exchange allows Farmer to defer any capital gains he received when he sold Tract 1. This can be likened to kicking the can down the road, but if the situation is structured correctly, Farmer will die and Tract 2’s basis will receive a 1014 step-up like in Example 1. Now if Farmer’s heirs decide to sell Tract 2 after Farmer’s death, there will be little or no capital gain.

Depending on the situation, one of these examples can be used to avoid a

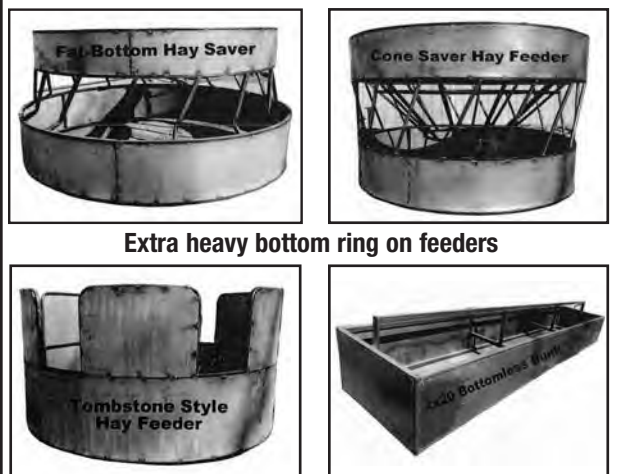

Crop disease management meeting to be held February 27th

The challenges of man-
aging diseases in corn and
soybean production sys-

tems are many. Disease
identification isn't always
straightforward. Not know-

ing isn't an option - no
sense in treating a bacte-
rial disease with a fungi-

cide, right? If a fungicide
is applied, which product
and when? That's just for
foliar diseases. Seedling
diseases can be complicat-
ed as well.

To assist with navigat-
ing the varying disease
challenges we see on an
annual basis, our annual
Meadowlark Extension
District-Atchison Coun-
ty crops meeting will this
year focus on the topic of
disease management for
the corn and soybean pro-
ducer. Wednesday, Febru-
ary 27th is the date. The
Knights of Columbus Hall
in Nortonville is the place.

We'll start with a cater-
ed breakfast at 7:45 a.m.
courtesy of our generous
sponsors. At 8:30, we'll
kick off with the first of two
presentations by long time
K-State Research & Exten-
sion plant pathologist Dr.
Doug Jardine. He'll talk
soybean diseases, with a
focus on identification of

foliar diseases, share ob-

Avoiding winter dehydration crucial for cattle health

It is important to provide adequate water for livestock during cold weather. Body metabolism increases during cold weather. Feed intake increases as cattle need more "fuel" to keep warm. To process the additional feed, the digestive tract needs adequate fluid. A cow's winter water requirement may not be as high as in the heat of summer, but she must drink enough to handle the demands of increased metabolism to prevent dehydration and impaction. If the cow is lactating, she needs more water regardless of weather.

Charles Stoltenow, professor and assistant director of the North Dakota State University Extension Service, says everyone thinks about the importance of water during summer, but not so much

during winter.

If cattle become dehydrated with decreased feed and water intake, they can't get the protein and energy necessary for body condition maintenance and pregnancy.

"Yet a beef cow requires about one gallon of water per 100 pounds of body weight, so a 1,200-pound cow needs about 12 gallons daily, which is about 100 pounds of water. One of the hardest things about managing cattle in winter is providing dependable water sources, since ponds, streams or tanks may freeze up or ice over," he says.

"We can move our feeding site, but it's not as easy to move our watering sites. We know from our research that if cattle decrease water intake, they will also decrease dry-matter intake (DMI) so it becomes a double

whammy. They drink less, so they eat less; so in order to maintain body temperature or maintain a fetus they have to start drawing on their own energy and protein reserves and lose weight," he explains.

In some areas ranchers have trained their cattle to use snow as a water source. It can be done, but cattle have to learn how to lick snow, which many will do by mimicking their mothers or other cattle, but some are slow to learn. If cattle must use snow, it can't be crusted, says Stoltenow. They have to be able to scoop it up with their tongue. If it's gone through a thaw-freeze cycle and is crusted, cattle have a hard time consuming enough snow to supply the water they need.

If they try to chew crusted snow, they can end up with abrasions in their mouth, making it more

painful and difficult to graze. This, too, results in decreased feed intake, as well as decreased water intake. It becomes a vicious cycle, he says.

If cattle become dehydrated with decreased feed and water intake, they can't get the protein and energy necessary for body condition maintenance and pregnancy.

"The fetus, as it develops, is primarily water, muscles and bones. It depends on the dam for all its nutrients (vitamins, energy, proteins, etc.) in order to grow. So if the cow decreases feed intake

because she is short on water, she will be short on all nutrients. This shortchanges the fetus for growth and there is inadequate protein for the dam to make enough colostrum and immunoglobulins," he explains.

We are learning more about fetal programming and the importance of proper nutrients, including water, for the dam during pregnancy — and some things we didn't think about 20 years ago, he says. Knowing that lack of water can affect the amount a cow eats and that it may have an adverse effect on her

unborn calf later, it becomes more imperative to provide adequate feed and water.



How much hay will a cow consume?

Estimating forage usage by cows is an important part of the task of calculating winter feed needs. Hay or standing forage intake must be estimated in order to make the calculations. Forage quality will be a determining factor in the amount of forage consumed. Higher-quality forages contain larger concentrations of important nutrients, so animals consuming these forages should be more likely to meet their nutrient needs from the forages. Also cows can consume a larger quantity of higher-quality forages.

Higher-quality forages are fermented more rapidly in the rumen, leaving a void that the animal can refill with additional forage. Consequently, forage intake increases. For example, low-quality forages (below about 6% crude protein) will be consumed at about 1.5% of body weight (on a dry-matter basis) per day. Higher-quality grass hays (above 8% crude protein) may be consumed at about 2.0% of body weight. Excellent forages, such as good alfalfa, silages or green pasture, may be consumed at the rate of 2.5% dry matter of body weight per day.

The combination of increased nutrient content and increased forage intake makes high-quality forage very valuable to the animal and the producer. With these intake estimates, now producers can calculate the estimated

amounts of hay that need to be available.

Accurate knowledge of average cow size in your herd, as well as the average weight of your big round bales, becomes necessary to predict hay needs and hay feeding strategies.

Using an example of 1,200-pound pregnant spring-calving cows, let's assume that the grass-hay quality is good and tested at 8% crude protein. Cows will voluntarily consume 2.0% of body weight or 24 lb. per day. The 24 lb. is based on 100% dry matter. Grass hays will often be 7% to 10% moisture. If we assume that the hay is 92% dry matter or 8% moisture, then the cows will consume about 26 lb. per day on an "as-fed" basis.

Unfortunately, we also have to consider hay wastage when feeding big round bales. Hay wastage is difficult to estimate, but generally has been found to be from 6% to 20% (or more). For this example, let's assume 15% hay wastage. This means that approximately 30 lb. of grass hay must be hauled to the pasture for each cow each day that hay is expected to be the primary ingredient in the diet.

After calving and during early lactation, the cow may weigh 100 lb. less, but will be able to consume about 2.6% of her body weight (100% dry matter) in hay. This would translate into 36 lb. of "as-fed" hay per cow per day necessary to be hauled to the pasture. This again assumes 15% hay wastage. Accurate knowledge of the average

cow size in your herd, as well as the average weight of your big round bales becomes necessary to predict hay needs and hay feeding strategies.

Big round hay bales will vary in weight. Diameter and length of the bale, density of the bale, type of hay, and moisture content all will greatly influence weight of the bale. Weighing a pickup or trailer with and without a bale may be the best method to estimate bale weights.

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

The March Kansas City wheat managed to break out of the sideways trading range we had been stuck in for months, but unfortunately it broke out to the downside and made new contract lows. The next major chart support we have is at the continuation chart low of \$4.56 ¾ made back in November. The unfortunate reality of the wheat market is that we have a billion-bushel carry out and no obvious means of getting rid of it. Winter wheat acreages is historically low, but we could stand to have even fewer. We have been hoping for months that the Russians would run out of wheat and that we would see a surge in exports, but that hasn't happened and we are now closing in on another harvest that will replenish supplies in

the northern hemisphere. The next best hope for the wheat is the next export sales report, which will give us a month's worth of data and maybe show that sales were better than expected. Otherwise, this market is going to be stuck sliding lower until we get a summer row crop weather scare.

Corn futures are still stuck going sideways and there still appears to be no end to that. Supply and demand fundamentals are much better for the corn than the wheat, but we are still projected to have plenty of corn on hand, which keeps the market from going anywhere. With the corn we have the potential to see some friendly numbers in the next export sales report, and we have the potential to see some sales to China,

which would draw down our stocks. With the corn we are in need of another big crop to maintain our supplies and we are always on the verge of seeing stocks getting uncomfortably tight if we ever have any hiccups. If there isn't any supportive news on the demand front, we are going to be waiting for a summer weather scare to make the corn break out of the range.

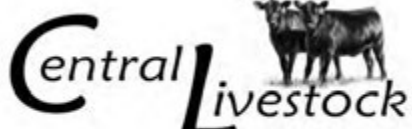
March soybeans have made another test of trend line support and the overall pattern of the market is still sideways to higher. The soybean market is still waiting for word that trade relations with China are back to normal and we are going to be exporting more beans. The problem now is that any trade deal with China will not be finalized until at least March and

possibly much later. The next export sales report will be critical for the soybeans just like the wheat and corn, because we need to see big numbers and specifically big numbers going to China. Even more important than the sales to China, we need to see shipments that help ease fears that the orders will be cancelled.

As of early Friday afternoon there was no cash cattle trade to report. Bids were are \$122 and asks at \$126. February live cattle futures finished the week at \$126.626, which would lead one to believe that \$126 trade was certainly possible. April live cattle future, however, look like they are trying to roll over. The market hasn't had much luck holding gains and the market is due for a deeper correction.

The feeder market just can't get anything going, and the March contract had yet another sideways week. The cash index is sideways and that hasn't improved despite the June and August live cattle futures being near the contract highs. There still seems to be some hesita-

tion to put cattle on feed with the current lot conditions. Regenerative ag pioneers form new partnership, announce three-year project with General Mills

them and take some virtual tours to share at the Beef Issues Group meeting later in the month.

I'm teaming up with Will Boyer, our Water Quality Specialist, to discuss these operation and Will has a drone, so we can get some cool overhead shots. This should be fun!

If you'd like to see what we come up with, join us for the Beef Issues Group

meeting on February 28th at 7 p.m. at the Glacial Hills Resource center, 913 Dakota in Sabetha.

So just a few things about confined raising cows with their calves. Cows require between 125 and 700 square feet of pen space. Smaller cows weighing 1000 to 1200 pounds can get by with 125 square feet in dry conditions and 250 square feet during wet conditions. Keeping pairs

together requires more pen space. Start with a minimum of 400-square-feet per pair in lots that are dry and add space as calves grow. Regardless of feeder or bunk type, each cow needs 24 to 30 inches of bunk space, horned cattle need even more. Fences should be sturdy enough to withstand a mature cow rubbing and reaching under the fence for grass. Regardless of facilities, water is the main concern

because it is the number one nutrient for cattle. Each cow consumes 15 to 20 gallons per day. You must be able to provide a continuous supply of water for the number of animals in the pen. During the summer, water consumption usually peaks in early afternoon.

If using dry lots, portable bunks can be added to provide enough space. Shade has to be provided to minimize heat stress. Plan on 20 to 25 square feet of shade per head, place the shade in the middle of the pen for continuous protection throughout the day. Cattle should be sorted

ed into uniform groups by weight, size, age or body condition. Age is important so the bossy older cows won't intimidate younger cows. Sorting by body condition score enables you to offer different diets based on the goal of increasing, decreasing or maintaining body condition. Sorting increases the efficiency of the operation.

Feeding programs can be limit-fed, or full-fed. I'm excited to learn more about confined cow/calf operations and how they are working. I will be visiting three different operations that are using hoop buildings and outside lots. Stay tuned!
