

Wildland fire mitigation provides peace of mind and training

The Kansas Forest Service will conduct prescribed burns and fuel mitigation under the direction of a Type 3 Incident Management Team at the Quivira Council Boy

Scouts of America Camp. The Kansas Forest Service Incident Management Team will lead efforts to reduce the risk of wildland fire on the Quivira Scout Ranch at the 15th

Annual Hazardous Fuels Mitigation Project scheduled for March 24-30, 2019. "The Hazardous Fuels Mitigation Project exemplifies the overall goals of the wildland fire program

for the Kansas Forest Service: collaborating with agencies throughout Kansas and the region; providing training for future and current firefighters; conducting on-the-ground fuels reduction through physical removal; and using prescribed burning to conserve and promote the native ecosystems of Kansas," said Rodney Redinger, incident commander for the project and assistant fire management officer focusing on training and operations for the Kansas Forest Service.

Located about 12 miles north of Sedan, Quivira Scout Ranch experienced a wildfire in 2016 that damaged approximately 1,700 acres and another smaller fire in 2018 that burnt 800 acres.

"The council wants to protect our property for its intended use," said Warren McCoskey, vice president of properties for the Quivira Council.

During the mitigation project, firefighters will thin woodlands, build fire

breaks, remove snags, conduct prescribed burning, and more to meet the conservation and fire-adapted landscape goals of the Quivira Scout Ranch.

As part of a partnership between KFS and Hutchinson Community College, the annual project offers HCC students in the Fire Science Program an opportunity for one-of-kind hands-on training.

"The mitigation project gives them the experience of an incident command structure and the demands of the career field," said Bobby White, HCC department chair and fire science coordinator.

Many of the students will go on to careers in city fire departments. As urban boundaries continue to blend with rural landscapes and the risk of wildland fire increases across the state, those future firefighters will need the wildfire-fighting skills they practice as part of the mitigation activities.

The mitigation project is managed by KFS

staff members who are nationally-certified wildland firefighters and incident managers. Wildland firefighters are highly trained in fire behavior, suppression methods and wildland fire mitigation. Throughout the week of mitigation activities, they will use the National Incident Management System to manage the event.

Other wildland firefighters will join KFS staff from Kansas and surrounding states, representing 20 local, state and federal agencies that house wildland firefighters.

"Bringing together agencies from across our region for a planned mitigation project helps us build working relationships for emergency responses to wildland fire incidents," Redinger said.

USDA to survey farmers' planting intentions for 2019

As the 2019 crop production season begins, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will contact producers nationwide to determine their plans for the upcoming growing season.

"Each year, the agriculture industry eagerly awaits USDA's Prospective Plantings report, which provides the first survey-based estimates of U.S. farmers' planting intentions for the year," said NASS' Kansas state statistician Doug Bounds. "The March Agricultural Survey provides the factual data that underpins these projections, making it one of the most important surveys we conduct each year."

NASS will mail the survey questionnaire in February, asking producers to provide information about the types of crops they intend to plant in 2019, how many acres they intend to plant, and the amounts of grain and oilseed stored on their farms. NASS encourages producers to respond online or by mail. Those producers who do not respond by the deadline may be contacted for a telephone or personal interview. NASS safeguards the privacy of all respondents and publishes only aggregate data, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

Upon completion of this class, participants will be recognized as approved morel identifiers in order to meet this regulation.

on Tuesday, March 12, 2019, from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Reno County Extension office, 2 W. 10th Ave. in South Hutchinson. The session in Eureka will be held on Tuesday, March 19, 2019, from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. at the Eureka Public Library, 606 N. Main St. in Eureka.

Crop insurance sets record, saves money, protects America's heartland in 2018

More than 334 million acres of farmland were protected by crop insur-ance in 2018, a 20-mil-lion-acre increase over 2017 and an all-time high. And, crop insurance came in \$2 billion under original federal budget projections for the year.


Jim Korin, chairman of National Crop Insurance Services (NCIS) and pres-ident of NAU Country In-surance Company, noted these accomplishments, among others, in his open-ing remarks at the crop in-surance industry's annual meeting.

With more than 1.1 mil-lion crop insurance poli-cies sold to farmers across the nation, Korin credited the growing popularity of crop insurance to the ex-ceptional service provided by private-sector insurers and the unique working re-lationship they share with the government.

“The public-private partnership that defines crop insurance has been successful in providing the important safety net for our farmers and the rural areas where they live,” Korin said. He noted that the crop insurance in-dustry has been able to quickly pay claims while routinely coming in below budget projections, saving taxpayers billions.

Under the successful crop insurance model, farmers invested in their

own protection by paying \$3.7 billion in premiums and shouldering a sig-nificant portion of losses through deductibles.

This public-private partnership was further reinforced with the over-whelming passage of a bi-partisan Farm Bill in De-cember that strengthened crop insurance and firmly rebuffed efforts by some critics to make the pro-gram less affordable and available to farmers.

“With everything that occurred during the year, nothing defined the world of agriculture more than the debate and passage of the 2018 Farm Bill,” said Korin. “This process saw congressional field hear-ings from coast to coast and a steady call from farmers across the nation to ‘do no harm’ to the crop insurance safety net.”

Larry Heitman, chair-man of the American As-sociation of Crop Insurers and senior vice president of NAU Country Insurance Company, also addressed the convention and said maintaining this kind of support from farmers will continue to be important moving forward.

“As tempting as it may be to relax until the next Farm Bill negotiations begin again, let's remem-ber our program is a tar-get for those that want to redirect agricultural funds to their own causes or programs,” he told the group. “We must continue to maintain and strengthen our partnership with ag-riculture commodity as-sociations and conservation and wildlife protection groups to work together for a coalition to benefit all Americans – rural and urban.”

Heitman and Korin ex-plained that the industry's attention will now turn to working with the U.S. De-partment of Agriculture to ensure a smooth im-plementation of the 2018 Farm Bill, while continu-ing to serve rural America.

Korin concluded, “We must remember our pur-pose: To provide excep-tional coverage and ser-vice to farmers and ranch-ers to help them do what they do best... feed and clothe the world.”

persal patterns for newly detected invasive insect species,” says University of Missouri Extension field crops entomologist Kevin Rice. That information can help farmers decide how to treat for insect pests, which cost an estimated \$120 billion annually in economic loss.

“Detecting Invasive Insects With Unmanned Aerial Vehicles” tells how research team members tracked insect travel patterns using specially fitted drones. They marked insects with a fluorescent powders and released them into fields.

UAVs equipped with sensors, lightweight ultraviolet lights and cameras flew over fields. They tracked and recorded the travel patterns of marked insects. Researchers downloaded the data for review.

For more than a century, researchers used a time-consuming process to manually track insects. Less than 5 percent of marked insects were recaptured using this process. The new technology

tracks more insects efficiently, accurately and with less labor, Rice says.

“Our system can detect real target insects in field conditions with high precision,” he says.

In previous research, Rice described the novel method to detect fluorescent-marked insects using hand-held UV lasers with focusable lenses. This allows the beam to be widened for a larger search area and detection distances up to 40 meters. It also allows scanning in tree canopies and water areas that previously could not be accessed.

Researchers examined the dispersal rates of invasive species such as the fast-moving brown marmorated stink bug and the slow-moving emerald ash borer. They also considered the influence of wind and temperature during insect movement.

Scientists have long studied how invasive species travel from their native environments to new habitats. Invasive insects affect food security, public health, economic interests and native species biodiversity, Rice says.

In addition to Rice, team members include Brian Stumph, Miguel Hernandez Virto and Henry Medeiros of Marquette University in Milwaukee; and Amy Tabb, Scott Wolford and Tracy Leskey with the USDA Appalachian Fruit Research Station in West Virginia.

Eighty-three percent of shoppers purchase only a couple of meat cuts and kinds, while 42 percent said they would branch out if advised, according to *The Power of Meat* 2018 report, which was published by the Food Marketing Institute and the Foundation for Meat & Poultry Research & Education.

According to NCBA research, what consumers are searching for most online are recipes. With the Chuck assistant, consumers can select recipes from beefitswhatsfordinner.com, and Chuck will send a list of necessary ingredients directly to their phones.

“This results in a seamless shopping experience that can help raise overall cart price,” said Wasser. “It's also an opportunity to get in front of the shopper, as a lot of times they don't have the patience to wait at the meat counter.”

K-State researchers seeking ways to protect flour

Most consumers typically don't think that a food safety risk lurks in their kitchen's flour bin, but a handful of product recalls since 2015 in the United States and other countries is changing that mindset.

Rather than accept that it's just the way the cookie crumbles, scientists at Kansas State University are taking the challenge

head on to find ways to ensure the safety of flour and the many products that are made from it.

"When I was trained as a food scientist, one of the things we were taught is that there were a few products that were generally safe," said Gordon Smith, department head for grain science and industry at K-State. "Maybe those products were not

absolutely safe, but they were on a continuum of things that were much lower risk. Flour was one of those products."

In January, 2019, General Mills announced a voluntary national recall of five-pound bags of its Gold Medal unbleached flour, citing the potential presence of salmonella. There have been no confirmed consumer illnesses as a result of the suspect flour, but the company issued the recall "out of an abundance of care," according to a statement.

The incident symbolized a heightened awareness in the flour industry that the raw product could carry such potent pathogens as Shiga toxin-producing E. coli (STEC) or

Salmonella introduced at some point from harvest in a crop field to the consumer's kitchen.

"We are curious about where the contamination comes from," Smith said. "We can speculate and speculate, but no one knows the answer to that positively or if there's a single source. No one knows where it comes from or what happens during storage or processing."

Armed with world-class laboratories capable of studying dangerous pathogens in controlled settings, the university is replicating commercial milling and baking processes and introducing E. coli and Salmonella at high doses to determine ways to reduce the risk

of contaminated flour and finished bakery products.

K-State food scientist and microbiologist Randy Phebus has worked for more than 30 years tracking foodborne pathogens. Since 2012, Phebus has been a lead investigator on a \$25 million project to investigate the presence of STEC in beef products and cattle.

He's now part of a K-State group that has turned a watchful eye to flour.

"Ultimately in flour, like in many other products, we would like to have a ready-to-eat, pasteurized product that is safe," he said. "The (food) industry is looking for that type of product, but the reality is that raw, agricultural-based products like flour are not risk free.

"We are on a quest to find a processing method or antimicrobial technology that will help the industry reduce these food safety risks to a very low probability of causing consumers to get sick or companies to have a contamination-related recall."

Kaliramesh Siliveru, an assistant professor in the Department of Grain Science and Industry, is leading computerized modeling of grain processing, re-creating the life of flour from the time a wheat stalk is grown in a farmer's field to the time flour is scooped out for a homemade cake or cookies.

That work is finely detailed, essentially building a picture of the entire environment for flour processing.

"You have to make certain that the entire chain is clean," Siliveru said.

He added that, in practice, computerized modeling provides a fuller understanding of the potential spots where E. coli or other pathogens may be found, whether that be in the field, during harvest, at the flour mill, in a consumer's kitchen or someplace else.

"Computer modeling also provides insight into how these pathogens are transferred in the supply chain from farm to table and allows us to design a kill step to inactivate these dangerous pathogens," Siliveru said.

Phebus notes that K-State's work responds to an important industry issue to maintain the safety of flour and baked products.

"Companies have a brand and the liabilities that go with marketing retail or wholesale flour," he said. "It's also a very important food service issue because if you're a pizza parlor or something like that making bread, you've got to know that you're not going to be making people sick.

"And it's a home kitchen issue because if you've ever baked a cake, you know that even if you've baked the cake well, the flour gets all over the kitchen, so it's a cross-contamination hazard."

Smith noted that K-State's work includes faculty in the university's grain science department and the Food Science Institute. K-State also is working with the Manhattan-based American Institute of Baking, which works with more than 200 bakery companies across the United States, and several milling and processing equipment companies.

Parts of the studies are being carried out in the Hal Ross Flour Mill, located in the university's grain science complex in Manhattan, and in food safety labs in the Department of Animal Sciences and Industry.

"It's high level research, but it's also information that is part of teaching students," Phebus said. "We may be training the first generation of food science, milling and baking science students who will be food safety experts concentrating on grain handling, flour milling, bakery products and even pet food."

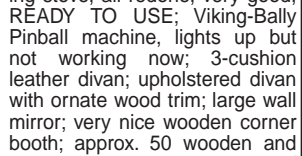
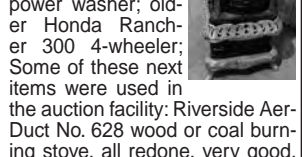
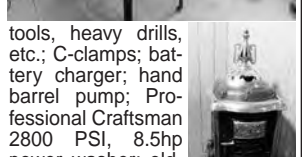

USDA conducts March hogs and pigs survey; results to publish March 28

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) is contacting

producers for the March Hogs and Pigs Survey. The agency will survey pork producers for detailed in-

formation on market hog and breeding stock inventories as well as pig crop and farrowing intentions

in every state.

"According to the most recent Quarterly Hogs and Pigs report in December,

there were 74.6 million hogs and pigs in the United States," said Doug Bounds, KS State Statistician of the NASS Kansas Field Office. "The March survey and resulting report will continue to provide important indicators for the industry of what changes are occurring - if any."

NASS will mail the questionnaires to all producers selected for the survey in late February. To ensure all survey participants have an opportunity to respond, NASS interviewers will contact producers who do not respond by mail or online to conduct telephone and personal interviews.

The data gathered in this survey allow NASS to accurately measure and report conditions and trends in the U.S. pork industry over the course of the year. The information is used by all sectors of the industry, including producers themselves, to help make sound and timely business decisions.

NASS will publish the survey results in the Quarterly Hogs and Pigs report on March 28. All NASS reports are available online at www.nass.usda.gov/Publications/. For more information, call the NASS Northern Plains Regional Office at (800) 582-6443.

Ag secretary addresses cattlemen

U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue understands how important export markets are to U.S. agriculture, and he's made sure that President Donald Trump understands it, too. Perdue offered that assurance in a media conference and during a speech delivered to cattle folk attending the recent 2019 Cattle Industry Convention in New Orleans, La. The Secretary also commented on issues such as so-called "fake meat," the new federal farm bill, and the electronic logging device (ELD) mandate, but devoted a majority of his time to what he called three priorities for agricultural producers, "trade, trade and trade."

Referring to trade talks with China, Perdue said he believes negotiations are re-entering a phase of cooperation. He cited a serious desire, on both sides, to arrive at a trade agreement. He added, however, that any agreement made on paper must be accompanied by a willingness to comply with its rules.

Perdue said trading partners must act like

"good neighbors." Liking past behavior to that of a cattleman that purposefully and repeatedly lets his stock get into a neighbor's pasture, Perdue referred to China's forced transfer or theft of intellectual property as unneighborly.

"You've got to respect that what's yours is yours and what's mine is mine. You've got to respect the rules," said Perdue. "That's how trade is supposed to work."

Perdue also warned against the folly of becoming too dependent on any one customer, neglecting other markets. He noted ongoing efforts to open and expand trade in Southeast Asia, Europe and Japan by trying to remove tariff and non-tariff barriers to U.S. beef and other agricultural products.

Regarding the development and expected commercialization of cell-cultured meat, Perdue acknowledged tension between the USDA and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) concerning which agency should have oversight of production, packaging and labeling. He said both agencies are

in the "food safety business" and need to get along, so jurisdiction will be shared.

"In the case of cell-cultured proteins, the FDA does have some expertise, and it's probably appropriate that it be involved. But when it comes to (cell) harvest, packaging and labeling, I want you to know that USDA is going to be there," stated Perdue.

Commenting on the new farm bill, Perdue credited cattle industry efforts in advocating for its National Animal Disease Preparedness Program and National Animal Vaccine Bank. This measure secures \$120 million in funding for programs including a foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) vaccine bank. Perdue said the bill includes "other good things," such as enhancements to the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)

and other conservation programs. The legislation also maintains funding for USDA's Market Access Program and Foreign Market Development Program, which aid development of global markets for U.S. beef, pork and lamb.

"I know the ELD mandate has been a thorn in your flesh," said Perdue, referring to the federal Electronic Logging Device mandate and its limits on truckers' hours of service. While livestock hauler compliance has been delayed temporarily, Perdue said the rule needs to be amended for haulers of perishable cargo.

"The mandate doesn't make sense for cattle transporters and drivers hauling other perishable goods," Perdue allowed. "I do think Congress is starting to listen and may come to understand the need for consideration of perish-

ables."

In closing, Perdue lamented how government is hindered by political posturing, among both Republicans and Democrats, and how Congress often seems determined to keep the administration from succeeding with anything.

"We really shouldn't let the good of the country suffer because we don't want the other part to have a victory," stated Perdue. "We ought to stop the silly politics and make decisions that are good (for) the people of this country."

Moo-ving The Big Rocks

The new year now feels old once you get into a busy season like calving.

There are many spans of time in cattle country that can make us feel there's too much to do, or too little

time in each day.

By now, some resolutions have fallen to the wayside, the rush of reality helping us sort out what matters most in the commitment to get better.

Yet, there are still some that rise above the rest, beat the average and make it look easy

What's their secret?

A recent visit to a Kansas ranch gave me insight into what sets some cattlemen apart. For 20 years, these brothers focused on raising functional cattle that produced the highest quality beef possible.

Last year, their calves graded 61% Prime.

It wasn't achieved by

single-trait selection, neglecting other traits for the cow herd, or irrational management that ignored profit potential, they assured me.

It was a matter of committing with intense focus to one leading goal and all others in turn rather than just trying to do their best overall.

Have you ever heard the old quote, "A rising tide lifts all boats?"

It's the same when we narrow our focus. Drop a handful of pebbles into a pond and you'll only create ripples. Throw in a large boulder and the water level rises.

Once they began to see

favorable results on herd goals, they realized continued focus on each goal would build momentum over time.

They just succeed by focusing on one thing at a time.

Sounds simple, but it could be a better way to look at it than trying to raise cattle with some kind of management strategy to excel on all fronts, every day. We might make some progress if we have time to analyze it. Then again, we might be over-complicating things. We might be just tossing pebbles.

You know what goes into making a Prime grading calf? An easy-calving, easy-keeping mother, a consistently proactive health program, adequate nutrition and steady genetic improvement over time.

Framed by an overarching goal that doesn't interfere with other priorities, we can hit our quality target and improve other areas of the business simultaneously.

Want to earn more money from your calves next year? What's the single thing you could do that will help you get there fastest? What if you made

that top priority for the next year? The next several years? Your workload may not wane, but clarity of purpose could make it seem lighter. That can make all the difference.

Toward the end of my Kansas visit, I asked the brothers if the goal that lifted their calves to mostly Prime grade remains the same priority today.

They shook their heads no.

Having arrived at the pinnacle of quality, they consider carcass merit built in now, as long as they maintain average pressure. They've shifted their laser focus to the next big rock in their business: performance. Their calves must reach harvest weight faster and faster.

I'm not suggesting you decide to skip checking heifers this evening to focus instead on office work that's fallen behind. We still need to run the business on all fronts, but what if we do that with the perspective of moving one big boulder at a time?
