Ground alfalfa movement: Southwest/South Central Tonnage: 10,912/4,200 Last week: 11,514/3,514 Last year: 10,809/3,112 Hay trade is moderate. Demand is strong for dairy alfalfa and grinding alfalfa, moderate for alfalfa pellets, prairie hay and stock cow quality hay. The restraining order will remain in place blocking livestock producers from haying and grazing CRP under a special USDA program. If any haying and grazing is allowed in the coming weeks it will be with tighter restrictions. With alfalfa acres and yields down, total production for the year is likely to be 20 to 25 percent, maybe as high as third less than normal. Prairie hay producers are beginning the haying season with rain and showers slowing progress and damaging hay. The forecast is for mostly hot and dry, that should help with cutting, curing and baling. Yields are reported lighter than expected and quality good when the weather allows. 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Kansas rodeos dominate the July calendar

If you throw a rock in the state of Kansas this time of year, you're bound to hit a county fair.

The annual county fair is as American as apple pie, and towards the end of July, as plentiful as fireflies in the summer.

With these county fairs comes the usual evening entertainment — rodeos.

If a cowboy or cowgirl wanted to compete in a lot of rodeos without traveling far, Kansas would be the place to be right now. For the eleven days between July 24 and August 3, there is a rodeo going on in Kansas every night except

place in that time span: Manhattan, Hardtner, Hill City, Abilene, Phillipsburg, Colby, and Dodge City. Even though their dates nearly fall on each other, they don't consider each other as competition. In fact, they say that the calendar overlap is beneficial, because it entices more rodeo athletes to compete at Kansas rodeos.

Because those seven rodeos are within 11 days of each other and are geographically close, they see some of the best pro rodeo athletes in the nation. Many of the current and past world champions, plus contestants ranked in the top 20 in the world, travel to Kansas and compete at most of the week and a half's rodeos.

Abilene rodeo chairman Jerry Marsteller says the seven rodeos at the same time is good. "It's an advantage for us, as far as getting contestants, because they don't have as far to drive."

Dr. R.C. Trotter, Dodge City Roundup chairman, agrees. "It's a great series. It (the close dates) benefits us all because it makes us all very attractive places to

The rodeos with smaller payouts also reap the benefits. Louis Schindler, president of the Jayhawker Roundup Rodeo in Hill City, says, "It's pretty good for us. They (contestants) come

down from Cheyenne (Frontier Days in Wyo.) and they can split off," and compete in several different places.

Manhattan kicks off the rodeo run on July 24-26. The Hardtner rodeo takes place July 25-26. Hill City is next, with a rodeo on July 28-30.

Colby's rodeo is July 29-30, Abilene's rodeo dates are July 30-August 2, Phillipsburg is July 31-August 2, and the Dodge City Roundup caps off the run July 30 through August 3.

If you're looking for something to do, consider attending one of the pro rodeos in the state. You'll see some of the greatest rodeo talent in the nation, all without going far from home!

Gray leaf spot in Kansas corn near epidemic levels in some areas

bing disease, gray leaf spot, has surfaced in east Kansas corn fields, heightening the need for producers to scout their acreage, a Kansas State University plant pathologist said.

"Over the past 10 days, levels of gray leaf spot have exploded in many fields in the eastern half of the state," said Doug Jardine, plant pathology state leader with K-State Research and Extension. "Much of the corn in the west is just starting to reach the maturity stage when gray leaf spot needs to be monitored."

Gray leaf spot is caused by the fungus Cercospora zeae-maydis.

Jardine said he scouted numerous corn fields in the western half of the Kansas River Valley (Manhattan to Rossville) the first week in July. Growth stages there ranged from tassels just emerging to pollen shed.

1 mile North and 1/2 mile West.

"In nearly every field, gray leaf spot lesions could be found within one to three leaves of the ear leaf. In a couple of fields, lesions were already present above the ear leaf," Jardine said. "It is my understanding that fungicide applications have begun. Still, every field should be checked for gray leaf spot progress and development."

Jardine surveyed southeast Kansas July 17-18 and found the corn there looks healthy, with little evidence of gray leaf spot.

"Most of the corn in southeast Kansas is mature enough that gray leaf spot is likely not to be a problem for the remainder of the season," he said.

If the forecast for continued humid weather and scattered thundershowers materializes in the rest of eastern Kansas however. the disease will continue to develop, he said. For fields where the disease is al-

ready above the ear leaf, producers should consider using a triazole or triazolecontaining fungicide, such as Quilt®, Stratego®, Tilt®, Bumper®, or Propimax®. In fields where the disease has made less progress, strobiluron fungicides such as Headline® or Quadris® can work well.

"The most severe disease outbreaks will occur where susceptible hybrids are being grown in a cornafter-corn or no-till situation," the plant pathologist

Producers can estimate returns that may come from applying a fungicide to a field with heavy gray leaf spot, Jardine said. With the following formula, for example, a grower might use these assumptions: Yield potential of 110 bushels per acre; fungicide application at a cost of \$22 per acre; gray leaf spot at or above the ear leaf; and a selling price of \$7 per bushel: 5 percent loss to disease = ~ \$16 net return; 10 percent

loss to disease = \sim \$53 net return; 15 percent loss to disease = \sim \$90 net return; 20 percent loss to disease = ~ \$129 net return. Higher yields would result in higher net returns, Jardine

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NAL publishes new editions of agricultural thesaurus, glossary

The USDA National Agricultural Library (NAL) has published 2008 editions of its NAL Agricultural Thesaurus (NALT) and Glossary of Agricultural Terms in both Spanish and English. The update is published collaboratively with the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation in Agriculture

NAL, the world's foremost research library focused on agriculture, is part of the Agricultural Research Service (ARS), the U.S. Department of Agriculture's chief scientific research agency.

The 2008 edition of the Agricultural Thesaurus and Glossary adds about 70 new definitions in Spanish and English, with expanded terminology associated with fuels, chocolate manufacture, bodies of water, the U.S. National Forest System, and acronyms used in the taxonomic classification of viruses. The Thesaurus and Glossary website features a new format presenting parallel English and Spanish language interfaces, enabling users to search and read all background materials in either language. The website is at: http://agclass.nal.usda.gov/a gt/agt.shtml

It also features a "Download Files" page enabling users to download the thesaurus and glossary files in an array of formats. A "Contact us" page is also included where users can propose terms to be added to the thesaurus and glossary.

The NALT is a key component for organizing and describing agricultural information, and the indexing vocabulary for NAL's AGRI-COLA bibliographic database of citations to agricultural resources. It is used throughout NAL, by the Agriculture Network Information Center (AgNIC), and within websites and databases of other USDA science agencies.

The NAL published Spanish language versions of the NALT (Tesauro Agrícola) and Glossary (Glosario) in May 2007, supporting increased Spanish-language access to agricultural information throughout the United States and

NAL staff originally prepared the NALT to meet the needs of ARS scientists, publishing the First Edition on January 1, 2002. The thesaurus is updated each year.

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

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
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

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Research 'N' **Review**

With feed costs continuing to loom on producers for the foreseeable future, planning for an optimum feeding regime is important as we look out for this fall and winter. One such feed that has received much attention is

South Dakota State University researchers studied the effects of DDGS on reproduction in pregnant 2year-old heifers over two years. In the first year, 96 Angus-Hereford-Simmental heifers were evaluated, followed in the second year by a group of 105 predominantly-Angus heifers. Heifers were about 22 months of age and averaged weighing about 1070 lb. All heifers were managed in drylot for 90-100 days before calving and fed approximately 9 lb of ground 9% CP grass hay.

In addition, about half received 6-6 1/2 lb DDGS and the other half 7-7 1/2 lb soybean hulls (SBH). Overall, DDGS fed heifers gained 125 lb compared to 108 lb for SBH, but Body Condition Score changed little for either group. The groups did not differ significantly in calving ease, calf vigor, calf birth weight, calf weaning weight, expression of estrus, or pregnancy distribution. However, 94% of DDGS heifers became pregnant, compared to 84% for SBH. Therefore, DDGS was an effective supplement for heifers in late gestation.

Not only do we have to plan an optimum feeding program for heifers and cows this winter, but we need to make sure heifers and cows are in the optimum body condition for calving and the next breeding. Nu-

merous research studies have shown a relationship in beef cows between reproduction and body fatness at calving, measured by Body Condition Score (BCS, where 1=emaciated to 9=obese). Again, researchers at South Dakota State University recently confirmed this, finding post partum intervals as follows: BCS3 = 88 days; BCS 4 = 70days; BCS 5 = 59 days; BCS 6= 52 days; BCS 7 = 31 days. The authors noted that, for best efficiency, post partum intervals to first heat should not exceed 60 days and the minimum BCS at calving

should be BCS 5 for mature cows or BCS 6 for heifers calving first at two years of

Since many producers put up or purchase round bales of hay for winter feeding, the loss of nutrient content must be minimized to assure the most value from the forage.

North Carolina State University researchers compared five storage methods of round bale, second-cut grass hay.

Hay was baled in August and stored for 7 or 15 months. Storage methods

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were: on ground, uncovered (GU), on pallets, uncovered (PU), on ground, covered with tarp (GC), on pallets, covered with tarp (PC), barnstored (BS).

The results showed that losses of dry matter was highest in the two uncovered methods (-23% and -31% for 7and 15 months of storage, respectively) as expected. Dry matter loss for hay stored on the ground or on pallets covered with tarps were -10% for 7 month storage. However, 19% was lost for hay on the ground covered with a tarp while only 11% was lost when outside and covered when placed on a pallet after 15 months of storage.

When stored in a barn, -3% of the dry matter was lost in 7 months while 11% was

lost in 15 months of storage. The most economical method in this study was with hay stored outside and covered, whether on pallets

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
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K-State team gets \$690,000 for study on producing cellulosic ethanol from pelleted forage crops

To meet a goal of replacing one-third of the nation's petroleum consumption with biofuels by the year 2030, the biomass research and development technical advisory committee of the U.S. Departments of Agriculture and Energy estimates it will require growing 1 billion dry tons annually of collectable biomass and converting it to biofuels.

But critical barriers exist to producing biomass efficiently and cost-effectively. One roadblock is transportation-related and as old as agriculture: getting the crop to the market, or in this case, getting tons of biomass to the nearest storage and ethanol production facilities.

Kansas State University researchers will address logistics hurdles with a \$690,000 grant from the Department of Agriculture's Rural Development Section, in conjunction with the Department of Energy. The three-year proof-of-concept project is one of 21 research and development studies

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being funded to address limitations to adopting biomass for energy as national policy.

The K-State project is the first study of its kind to test the notion of making biomass pellets at or near the farm field and assessing the effect of pelletizing through to ethanol conversion. Pellet making is a mechanical, extrusion process that reduces the enormous volume of plant material.

Researchers are Scott Staggenborg, associate professor of agronomy and principal investigator; Leland McKinney, assistant professor and extension state leader in grain science and industry; Donghai Wang, associate professor of biological and agricultural engineering; and Praveen Vadlani, assistant professor of grain science and indus-

The logistics piece surrounding biomass is the one thing that might keep biomass conversion from ever being as big as hoped, Staggenborg said.

"The hay paradigm won't

work; that is, thinking we'll grow crops and haul plant residue to a production facility and store it," he said. "Hay handling on the massive scale that'll be needed would be a nightmare."

On the other hand, if we imagine a grain trailer filled with biomass pellets - "now you've done something," Staggenborg said, because pellets can be transported efficiently and they also can be handled like grain with existing equipment.

The project is comprehensive, Staggenborg said. "We're taking the research upstream to assess alcohol production to make sure what our output is going to

be from an energy perspective, and too, we're doing this study ahead of time, before the whole ag industry starts changing to growing crops for biofuels production."

In preliminary work in 2007, agronomists grew test plots to get an idea of how various sorghum species compare production wise to corn. They grew forage sorghum, a dual-purpose sorghum, a photoperiod sensitive sorghum and sweet sorghum, as well as big bluestem, switchgrass and a favorite European energy crop, miscanthus.

After one season, the photoperiod sensitive sorghum is showing biomass potential in the drier conditions of Kansas. Staggenborg said the plant, which is like bamboo in appearance, is "unbelievable" in terms of its vegetative or biomass production, and that it never puts on a head of grain. Sweet sorghum also excelled in the 2007 trials, he said.

The K-State project will compare sorghums and other feedstocks to corn, a kind of common currency among farmers in the Midwest and Great Plains.

"Farmers know growing conditions for corn,' Staggenborg said. "So, when I tell them our photoperiod sensitive sorghum or the sweet sorghum made 11 tons last season, they see the po-

McKinney, a grain and feed scientist, will assess what it takes to make good pellets using off-the-shelf technology. He'll include wheat straw, too, because Kansas produces a lot of it. Pelleting essentials include how finely forages need to be ground and what type of pellet-making die will be required.

Breaking the cellulosesugar chemical bonds happens in the next step, preprocessing, which makes the plant sugars ready for fermentation and ethanol production. Wang, the project's agricultural engineer, will determine the preprocessing methods best suited for treating biomass

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

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Last week was not very good for commodity markets. Corn, soybeans, sugar and crude oil, to name a few, suffered very large losses. Some very old trend lines and some very important support levels failed in these markets. There were numerous news stories saving that the commodity bubble had burst. Perhaps that is true. I don't think the bull market in commodities is dead yet, but we do have to pay attention to trend changes and trends appear to be changing.

One indicator of this change in trend is fund position. The net long futures and options fund position in the corn is the smallest since October and the Index fund position in the corn is the smallest since early February. In the Kansas City wheat the Index fund position is the smallest since mid January and trading funds are net short for the first time since April of 2005. Watching this fund position is important for a couple of reasons. First if fund traders want to have a large short position then they still have a lot of selling they can do. Second, with the fund liquidation we have seen they could also do a lot of buying to get back to the position that they had a few months ago. Watching how the fund position changes over the next few weeks will give us a good indication of which way the big money is going in the commodity mar-

The corn market lost a lot of ground last week. In the December contract the support at the 50-day moving average failed and the first trend line support failed. The support at the 38% retracement of the entire move up failed as well. On the weekly chart the trend

line support failed as well. This makes the technical outlook for the corn market pretty bleak. Right now we have to expect follow through selling and look for more downside targets. For the moment the \$5.90 - \$6.00 area looks like the next level we are headed. From there down side potential should be limited. The lower prices will attract demand, especially export demand with the Dollar being so weak, and keep in mind that we have to expand acres next year. With the tight new crop supply situation we aren't going to at-

tract more acres with lower prices. You should avoid locking in a price on cash grain at this price level, but put option coverage is wise. A close back above \$6.50 in the December contract will be our first indication that it is time to be long again.

The wheat market held on relatively well compared the corn and soybeans. The Kansas City wheat is stuck in a sideways lower pattern. The corn is dragging the wheat lower, but the solid export demand we are seeing suggests that further pressure isn't really necessary. The trend in the wheat

will not be able to turn up until the trend turns up in the corn, so we have to look to the corn for price direction. The chart resistance is still very clear at the \$8.70 -\$8.75 level in the September KW. When the market moves through that level we will have to become aggressive buyers.

The soybean chart didn't look too bad until Friday when the market suffered its second 50 cent loss in a row. The 40 and 50 day moving averages both failed, but there is still solid trend line support below the market. I still don't want to sell new crop soybeans because our supply situation is so precarious. There is warm, dry weather in the extended forecast and if that actually materializes, the complexion of the soybean market will change dramatically. Export demand is still good enough and these lower prices may attract more de-

mand, which we really can't handle. The cheaper prices and the cheap dollar are a hard combination to beat.

The cattle had a poor week as well. Boxed beef was lower, cash cattle were lower and the August live cattle suffered large losses again. The market is oversold, but we have to look at any strength as a selling opportunity for the time being. I would sell August LC on any move back over \$100. The feeder cattle were one of the few bright spots this week due to the weakness in the corn. If the corn stays weak and we get a little bounce in the live cattle we could have new contract highs in the feeders.
