

## State's largest classroom expected to generate excitement

Life's lessons sometime come from unusual circumstances. Visitors at the Kansas State Fair may think students attending the fair have been given a day off. For many, however, the day at the fair is a first-time opportunity to learn about how food is grown and where milk really comes from, said Pam Van Horn, Kansas State University Research and Extension coordinator of educational 4-H programs. Those programs are part of Kansas Largest Classroom at the Kansas State Fair in Hutchinson.

Using fair exhibits and facilities as teaching tools yields educational opportunities that might not otherwise be available, she said. Kansas' teachers are invited to bring students (usually 3rd through 6th graders) to the fair, said Van Horn, who is a state 4-H youth development specialist. In 2008, more than 5,000 students participated in the educational effort sponsored by the Kansas State Fair. Opportunities this year will include:

Agriland, which will focus on Kansas' crops and livestock and offer opportunities to view growing crops, touch grains, "drive" a combine, weigh on a cattle scale, and compare a student's weight to that of a calf and other young farm animals.

Biofuel Blast, a Kansas 4-H science and technology offering, will demonstrate how organic materials can be converted to fuel to supply energy.

Birthing Center, at which calves, ewes, piglets and chicks are born during the fair, will highlight the life cycle of a dairy cow, offer tips for basic pet care and a glimpse into the lifestyle of sheep and goats and a career in veteri-

nary medicine.

Corn, It's Ear-Resistible will focus on the growing of corn for food and a variety of corn products.

Dr. Goddard's Lab will draw from examples of early scientific research that serves as the foundation for modern rocketry.

Electrical Safety Demonstration will illustrate how electricity works and potential dangers from high voltage.

Equestrian Acrobatics will demonstrate riding styles.

Exotic Animal Petting Zoo will allow students to see animals such as kangaroos and ostriches that are not native to Kansas.

Farm Bureau Ag Central will provide an opportunity to milk a cow, learn about animal behavior and interaction with humans and fun facts about agriculture in the larger world.

Fire and Medical Safety Demonstration will focus on emergency preparedness.

FFA will offer educational demonstrations and information about careers in agriculture.

Getting to Know Plants should help students learn about the different parts of various plants and how plants grow, thrive and produce food.

Helpful Hydrogels, which also is a Kansas 4-H science and technology offering, will focus on water quality and conservation.

How Do You Spell Grain Sorghum? will highlight the Kansas crop also known as milo, and how it is used for food, feed and industry.

Kansas Wildlife and Parks Aquarium will offer a closer look at fish

in the state.

**Parts of a Plant: What's for dinner?** will explore plant parts, including edible roots, stems, leaves and seeds, and the differences between fruits and vegetables.

**Pollination Equation:** Plants + Pollinators = Fruit will help students learn more about the role of honeybees and other insects in food production.

Sensory Science will help students learn how five senses work both separately and together in the enjoyment of food.

Sheep Shearing, which will highlight wool production, will include shearing, spinning and weaving demonstrations.

The Soil Guys will focus on the importance of soil and soil and water conservation.

What's in Your Water explores water quality and pollution prevention.

Wormology 101 will highlight a worm's role in the environment.

You Be the Judge will offer an overview of livestock and their role in producing various products. A spelling bee and debate sessions also are scheduled, and a Do Art project will provide an opportunity for students to create and take home an artistic impression of their day at Kansas' Largest Classroom.

## Demonstrations provide entertainment, learning opportunities

Sit back — and enjoy ...

Kansas State Fair visitors are invited to educational and typically fun-filled 4-H demonstrations at the fair this year, said Pam Van Horn, state coordinator for the 4-H presentations.

Topics for the 10-15 minute demonstrations vary, but each reflects the knowledge and skill learned in a 4-H project, she said. "With more than 150 4-H demonstrations scheduled, take-

home ideas range from “Eggstreme Makeover, Breakfast Edition” to “Holey Moley, It’s Guacamole,” and from “Ooops to Awesome” to “Hoof It,” said Van Horn, who is a Kansas State University Research and Extension 4-H youth development specialist.

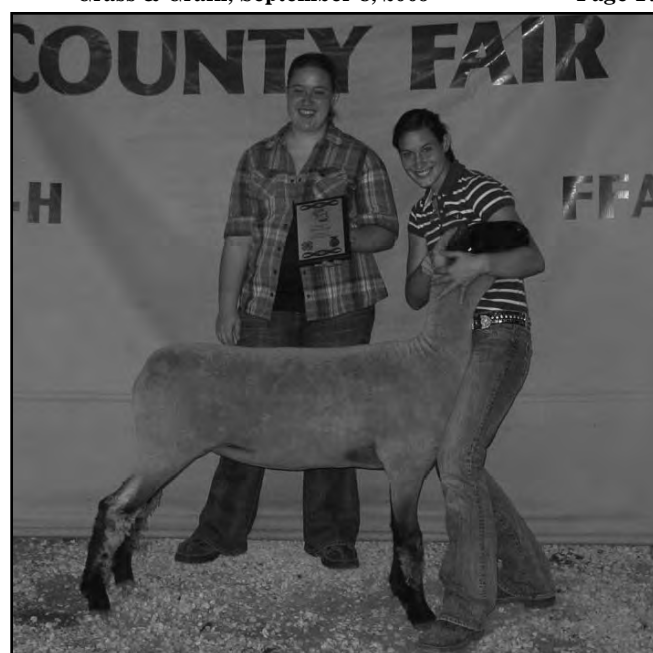
The demonstrations are free and scheduled throughout each weekend of the Kansas State Fair (Sept. 12-13 and 19-20) in 4-H Cen-

tennial Hall, which is located at the north end of the fairgrounds. To be eligible to present a demonstration at the Kansas State Fair, a 4-H member must first earn a top award for their presentation at a county fair, Van Horn said.

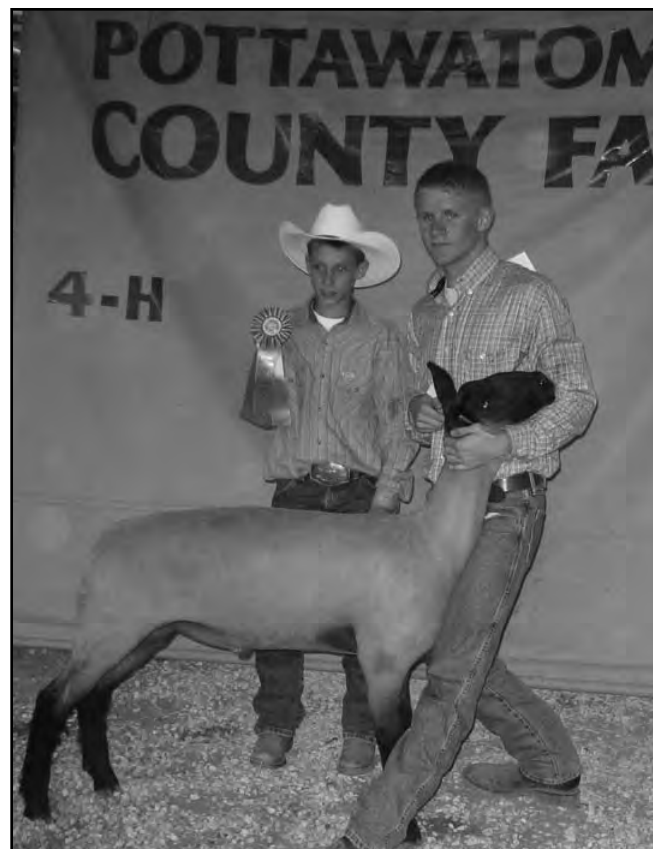
Seeing the demonstrations also can be helpful to current and future 4-H members in choosing a project or subject area, she said. "The basis for 4-H demonstrations — building skill in

a subject, public speaking and making a connection with an audience — is almost always high on the list of benefits from 4-H programs cited by former members,” she said.

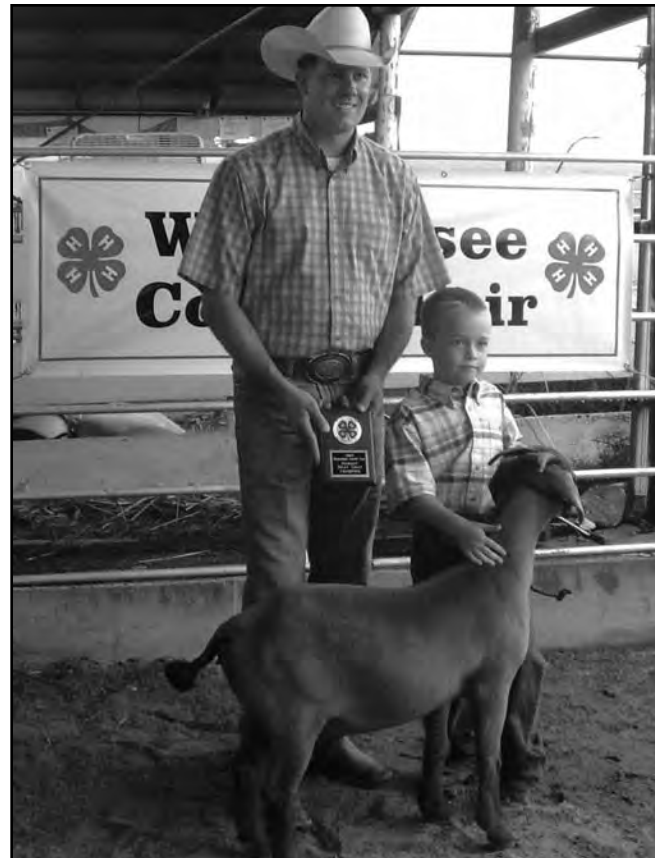

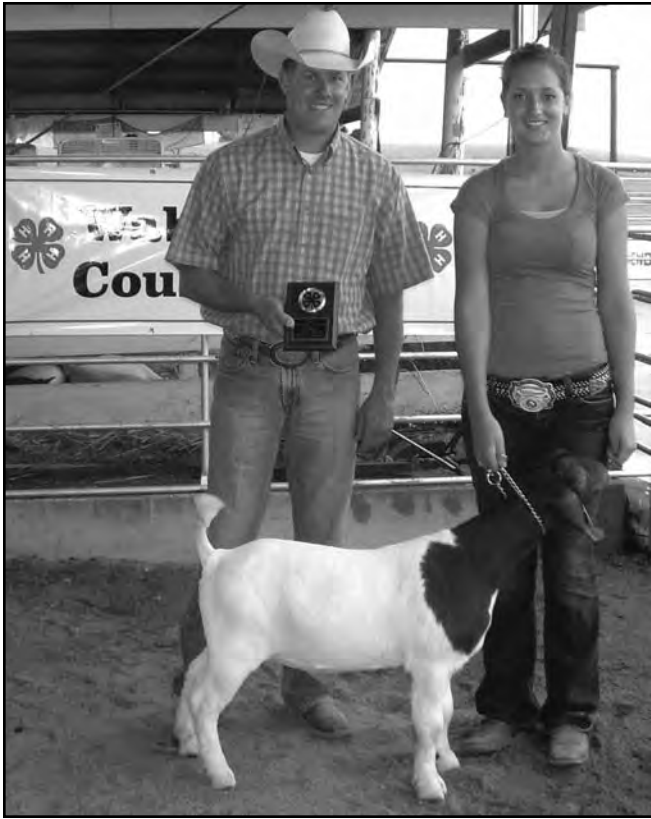

Kids are busy, as a record number of Kansas 4-H members — 399 — study for the Family and Consumer Sciences Judging Contest at the Kansas State Fair Sept. 19. With family and consumer sciences subject matter, 4-H members will take home lessons about food, nutrition, health and tips for choosing consumer products and services needed for everyday living, said Carol Fink, Kansas State Research and Extension specialist and state contest coordinator. Judging contests vary, yet each nurtures comparative evaluation and decision-making skills, she said.

As a bonus, 4-H Meats Judging Contest participants will, for example, be better able to choose the highest quality products from the meat case, and successful horticulture judging contest entrants may end up with the best-looking lawn and garden on the block. Some, like the livestock judging contest, require oral reasons to define the decision-making process, Fink said. Such experiences have prompted

former judging team members to credit the skills developed as a team member as important building blocks in their careers in business, education and public service.

Contest questions and preparation materials are developed by a state volunteer committee each year, and that makes the contest fresh — and challenging, she said. Entrants compete as individuals and scores are compiled to arrive at a team score, said Fink, who is expecting 56 teams in the senior division (ages 14 to 18) and 51 teams in the intermediate division

(ages 9 to 13). The Family and Consumer Sciences contest will include six test stations. At each, she said, participants will be asked to make observations, comparisons and evaluations before choosing (or ranking) the best product, service or technique.

In addition to the 4-H Family and Consumer Sciences Judging Contest at the Kansas State Fair, Kansas 4-H will also challenge students with a Photography Judging Contest (Sept. 13); Poultry Judging Contest (also Sept. 19), and a (4-

H/FFA) Rabbit Showmanship and Judging Contest (Sept. 20). Other judging contests, such as crops, livestock and horticulture, are scheduled throughout the year. 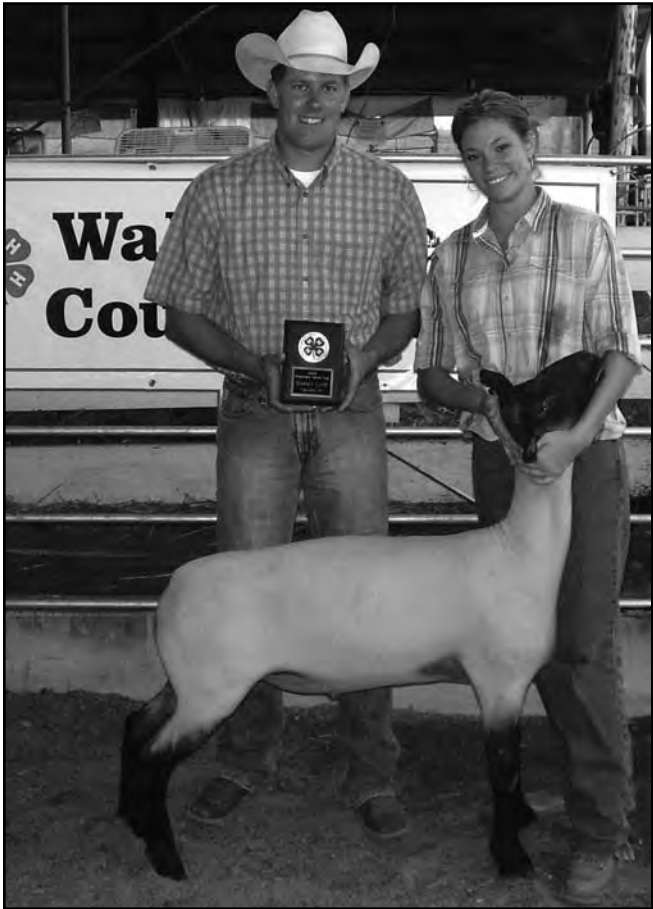

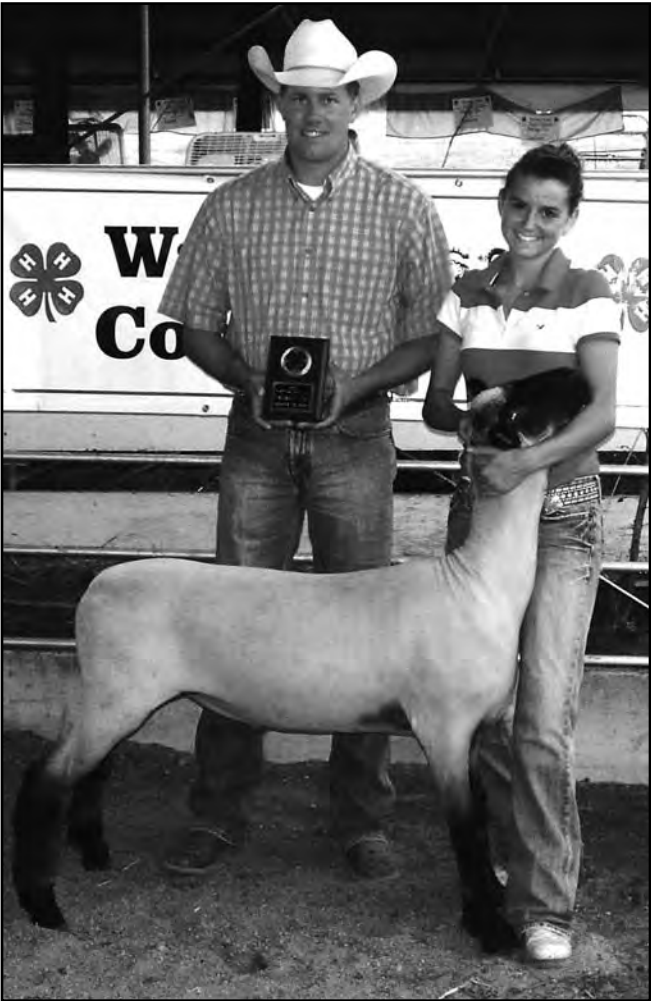

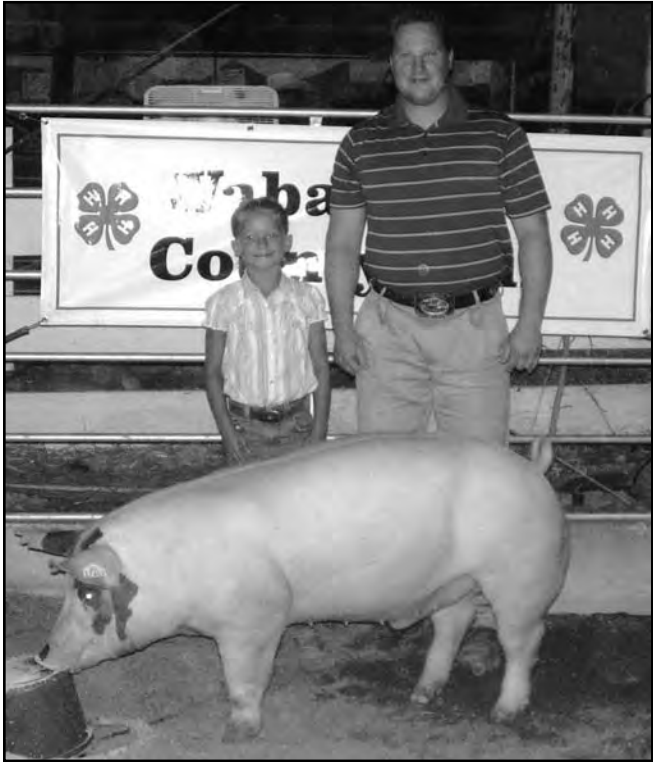

# Schwieterman Market Outlook

*A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts*

The US Dollar Index has been stuck in a sideways trading range for about six weeks. The Index keeps testing trend line support and the trend line keeps holding. The Gold market is back to testing \$1000/oz. The gold hasn't been able to move very far past \$1000, so both the gold and the Dollar at price levels where a turnaround in the market could be expected. However, if the Dollar and Gold don't turn around here it would mean the Dollar is starting another leg lower and the gold is headed for all time highs. Next week's trade will be very important and have an impact on a number of markets.

Natural gas fell to new multiyear lows and the crude oil - natural gas ratio is reaching historically wide levels. The problem, still, is that there is a great deal of carry in the natural gas market, so we can't take advantage of the low prices.

The December corn lost another 23 cents last week, primarily because we went another week without any kind of threatening weather forecast and also because private analysts are coming out with bigger, and bigger yield estimates. Informa now thinks that if all goes well for the rest of the growing season 168 bu/ac is possible.

Not everyone thinks we will see a record yield. I read an article about a firm called Lanworth that thinks the yield will end up being the third highest ever, which would be less than 153.9, but they are definitely in the minority right now. I think we have to plan on a higher yield number in next Friday's crop report.

There could be some better demand numbers

and a lower old crop ending stocks numbers, but I don't think there will be enough demand changes to offset the production increase. If there isn't a weather problem soon, traders will start talking about an even bigger yield estimate in the October report. Right now everything is pointing to continued weakness and a normal harvest low sometime this fall.

The December KW lost 26 3/4 cents last week. There isn't much positive new that I can come up with and apparently no one else can either.

Export sales were back to being poor with only 405,700 MT sold. I really don't know why USDA increased the export estimate in the past two crop reports when we have really only had 1 or two decent weeks of sales. I don't think USDA will cut exports this month, but I will not be surprised to see a cut in either the October or November report, unless we see a dramatic improvement in the export business.

I don't think there will be many adjustments to the US wheat numbers at all. There is the potential for a slightly higher production figure, but I think most numbers will be left alone. There could be numerous changes in the world supply and demand numbers, but you never know when USDA will make them. Argentina and Australia could both have production estimates cut, so that is something to look for in the next few months.

Soybean harvest in the south is replenishing supplies and killing the basis and the September contract. The September contract dropped over \$2.00 from last Friday's high. The November contract didn't

fair quite that poorly, but did lose about 90 cents this week.

Demand is still very strong. New crop export sales were 1.11 MMT and we are on a record pace for the new crop year. USDA could increase the new crop export estimate, but they usually don't get in a hurry about adjusting demand numbers this early in the crop year. As for the rest of the supply and demand numbers, the biggest thing to look for is an increase in the yield estimate, which is another thing weighing on the futures. We are moving into the highest supply time of the year and it looks like that supply is getting bigger.

# U.S. agriculture interests split over energy bill

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) \_ Legislation to confront climate change could be an economic godsend to farmers and ranchers. Or it could be an enormous financial burden. It depends on whom you ask, and not even farmers and ranchers agree on the matter.

Those who are against the bill say it would lead to skyrocketing fuel and fertilizer costs, cutting into farmers' and ranchers' already unpredictable profits. Those who support it contend any losses would be more than made up for through a provision that would allow companies to meet their pollution targets by investing in offset projects, such as farms that capture methane or plant trees.

The legislation would cap emissions from major industrial sources, including power plants, factories,

refineries and electricity and natural gas distributors. Emissions from agriculture would be excluded.

A U.S. Department of Agriculture report concluded that if the proposal passed, farmers and others in agriculture could see an initial 1 percent to 7.2 percent loss in income due to increased costs in energy and, therefore, fertilizer — which requires a great deal of energy to be produced. Those losses would be far outweighed by the tens of billions of dollars farmers are expected to rake in for projects to reduce greenhouse gases in years to come, the report said.

But Sen. Mike Johanns, R-Neb., said the report is incomplete and believes the USDA rushed the study to address senators' concerns after the House passed its bill in June. The Senate is expected to vote this fall.

"We still have a question about how is this going to impact livestock, corn, soybeans and wheat in our state," said Johanns, who was agriculture secretary from 2005-2007 under President George W. Bush. "This makes no sense to me whatsoever. Why would the leadership of the House ... put a bill out when they hadn't had analysis on the ag sector? That not only impacts farmers and ranchers, it impacts consumers."

However, the National Farmers Union backs the legislation, provided the USDA administer the agriculture offset program and that those already practicing carbon-reducing techniques be rewarded for their efforts.

"These guys that are screaming that it's going to drive costs through the roof ... all of the credible economic research that's been

done really disproves that," said National Farmers Union president Roger Johnson.

He also said that energy costs could soar even without the legislation and noted that global warming could wreak havoc on the food supply.

"All of the climate change research says we're going to see more flooding, we're going to see more droughts, we're going to see higher temperatures, we're going to see more pests, we're going to see more diseases," he said. "All of these things are going to require significant adaptation cost increases for agriculture."

Other farm groups share Johanns' view on the legislation, as do a number of farm-state lawmakers in Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and South Dakota. Leaders in Southern energy-producing

states, such as Virginia, West Virginia and Kentucky, also have voiced concern that their coal and natural gas industries will be hurt.

The American Farm Bureau Federation has denounced the legislation as an energy tax in disguise, saying energy costs alone could spike well beyond the 20 percent estimated by the federal government.

Sen. Pat Roberts, R-Kan., said the USDA report grossly underestimated the increases in natural gas and fertilizer costs likely to be sparked by the climate legislation.

"This bill puts a chokehold on the local economy," Roberts said. "Bottom line ... this bill is a wet dog that is not welcome in any farm or ranch house."

Don't tell that to Conde, S.D., cattle producer and grain farmer Doug Sombke,

who has been employing environmentally friendly techniques like no-till planting for more than a decade on his 2,500-acre operation.

"People are so afraid of this energy cost thing; that just amazes me," Sombke said. "In the last two years, we've still seen energy costs go up, and not just the 15 or 20 percent like they're predicting. We've seen it go up 200 percent."

"We survived that; we'll survive this small increase."

On the other side of the debate is Sallie Adkins, who owns a 15,000-acre ranch with her husband near Halsey in the Nebraska Sandhills.

"I just think the major concern in agriculture today is how we can keep our cost of production affordable to stay in business and still be competitive with other markets," she said.

## New technology can give producers hints at profitability

Producers make tough decisions every day that directly affect the profitability of their herd. Fall brings decisions about feeder calves and questions about retaining ownership. Kevin Good, senior analyst, Cattle-Fax, says cow-calf producers should strongly consider holding onto feeder calves this fall.

"In 2008, calf prices dropped in the second half of the year so a lot of producers retained ownership of their calves, and it paid for those producers to do that," he says. "When we consider that feeder-calf prices are likely to be depressed this fall; corn prices have come down from their 2008 record highs; and, historically, it pays to hold calves into the feeding phase — we are recommending that cow-calf producers take a hard look at retaining ownership of their 2009 calf crop."

Good adds that though all cow-calf producers stand to profit from retaining ownership, those who know more about their herd's health and genetics are a step ahead.

"Producers who know about the genetics and

health of their cattle are in better shape to be profitable when retaining ownership," he says. "It definitely is a benefit to have information about the cattle's potential to gain and perform for both yield and grade."

Kevin DeHaan, technical services director for Igenity,® says cow-calf producers can gain inside information about quality, yield grade and more this fall in time to make some important retained ownership decisions.

"The comprehensive Igenity profile includes DNA analyses for 15 economically important traits, several of which directly affect feeder-calf profitability," he says. "Producers can use this information to make more confident decisions about feeder calves to help ensure they are pointed in the most profitable direction based on their individual genetic merit."

"Using DNA technology to help sort feeder calves can help producers reduce some of this variability within a population, resulting in more profitable calves because they were marketed based on their individual genetic potential," DeHaan says.

# Agriland offers hands-on opportunities to learn about ag

Agriland, the anchor of the Pride of Kansas building at the Kansas State Fair, engages the senses and stimulates the minds of children and adults alike with its interactive activities that teach the importance of Kansas agriculture.

Agriland is also where teachers can sign up to win one of five classroom presentations that focus on teaching students where their food comes from. The presentations will be provided by the Kansas Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom, and they come with a pizza lunch for an entire classroom. To be eligible to register for one of the giveaway presentations, teachers must visit Agriland at the fair with their class. Presentation expenses will be covered by the organizations that join forces to bring Agriland to the fair each year. To find Agriland in the Pride of Kansas building, all you have to do is look for the 6-foot-tall greenhouse where visitors will be able to see different crops in their seedling and mature stages. The greenhouse will also showcase products that come from Kansas grains. The greenhouse exhibit is new, as is the beef exhibit where children can climb onto a saddle to learn what it's like to herd cattle. Another well-liked feature of Agriland is the life size milking cow that gives children and adults alike the opportunity to learn the art of milking. It has a self-contained pump to circulate fluid milked from the udder into an authentic stainless steel milking pail.

The My Pyramid display helps children and their parents learn more about the food guidance system developed by the United States Department of Agriculture. My Pyramid is the

symbol USDA designed to represent the system that provides many options to help Americans make healthy food choices and to be active every day.

Agriland also features a soil tunnel that lets children explore what's below the plants, trees and crops that cover the Kansas landscape. The three-dimensional display illustrates how important soil is to plant growth, waste recycling, water purification and habitat for organisms.

Other returning features include the "bright and shining faces" sunflower cutout display where children can poke their faces through openings to become "shining faces" among the large, yellow blooms.

In the byproducts section, visitors can play the "Did you know?!" interactive game to learn how livestock and crops are used in thousands of products from toothpaste to crayons, shoes and fuel. Children and adults will learn about livestock — how they are raised and what they eat — and they may even pose for a photograph with wood cutouts of a steer, sheep and hog. A stop at the scales will tell you if you weigh as much as a bushel of corn or a baby calf.

Kids can look at Kansas grains displayed in a kid-sized grain elevator, or dig into kid-sized vats filled with grain if they want to know what it feels like. The ever-popular ride in a John Deere combine cab shows

how Kansas crops are harvested in the field. Teachers can make a stop in the teacher resource center to see what materials are available to help them teach about Kansas agriculture.

A huge implement tire serves as a centerpiece to the environmental stewardship area, where visitors learn how farmers care for their livestock and crops, and how they work to keep the land, air and water clean.

Another feature is a section of carpet that lies underneath Agriland. It was donated by Universal Textile Technologies of Dalton, Georgia. The carpet has a flexible foam backing made from SoyOyl, a soy-based polyol developed with funding from the soybean

checkoff. It is estimated that 47 million bushels of beans would be used if soybean oil was used for all U.S. commercial carpets.

Volunteers from the co-operating commodity groups will staff Agriland each day of the fair. Cooperators include the Kansas Department of Agriculture; Kansas Beef Council; Kansas Corn Growers Association and Commission; Kansas Dairy Association; Kansas Wheat; Kansas Grain Sorghum Producers Association and Commission; Kansas Soybean Association and Commission; Kansas Agriwomen, Kansas Sunflower Commission; and the Kansas Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom. Kansas FFA chapters also help with Agriland.

# Repellents can be effective without going overboard

“The more, the merrier” and “Seeing is believing” are both mistakes when applying insect repellent.

“For best results, you really do need to cover every square inch of exposed skin and clothing,” said Ludek Zurek, entomologist with Kansas State University Research and Extension. “A mosquito can hone in on an unprotected spot that’s dime-size. “At the same time, though, you should apply repellent sparingly. Saturating your skin or clothes does nothing to increase product effectiveness.” This year’s new clip-on, fan-distributed repellent sounds like an easy way to achieve coverage without a direct application. TV ads for the product have reinforced that view. Based on its own instructions, however, the product has several serious shortcomings, Zurek said. “They include the suggestion that you clip the product to your waistband,” he explained. “Yet, they also provide a string of precautions – including that you avoid contacting the product with your skin, eyes or clothing. You’re also supposed to avoid breathing the product’s fan-distributed

vapor and keep it away from food. “Besides, the product doesn’t seem to be very practical unless you’re basically going to stay in one place. The instructions say that whenever you move, you have to allow a few minutes for the unit to rebuild its protection. That would be a problem if you were mowing, playing touch football or using a swing.” Applying other products evenly on skin is easiest with towelette, stick, liquid or creams repellents – although sprays can be evened out if spread by hand, he said. For good coverage on clothing, however, aerosols or pump sprays always work best. When selecting among products, however, content can be more important than form, Zurek added. Repellents can contain different active ingredients and different percentages of the same active ingredient. The percentages have nothing to do with how well the products work. They indicate how long the products will provide protection.

“Even the manufacturer of DEET – the most proven repellent you can buy – recommends that you select on

the basis of how long you’ll be outside,” he said. “Depending on the weather and your activity level, a 7 to 10 percent concentration of DEET is good protection if you’re just going outside for a little while. A 30 percent product can protect you for four to five hours. “No matter its percentage, though, you reapply only if the mosquitoes start biting because you’ve stayed out longer than you planned or sweat your first application away.”

Zurek pointed out four important exceptions to these rules:

Spraying plastics, leather or rayon with repellent can cause surface damage. Protection from ticks requires at least a 20 percent-concentration product. No matter what, follow label directions exactly – for example, on how many separate times you can reapply the product safely. And, wash off the repellent as soon as you return indoors. In most cases, combination sunscreen-repellent products aren’t a good idea. If you reapply them as often as you need more sunscreen, you can end up with too much repellent too soon.

# CSP public meetings being held across Kansas

Is the Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) right for your operation? Here is your chance to find out more at a public meeting. Agricultural and private forestry producers interested in CSP are encouraged to attend a public meeting to get information and ask questions.

"The new CSP is more than a name change," said Eric B. Banks, State Conservationist for the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). Some of the new CSP benefits include national in scope, not by watershed; no tiers; acres allocated by state; and priority resource concerns determined by the state.

"This is the stewardship program that is about maintaining your current conservation system and adopting additional conservation activities," continued Banks. "CSP is going to encourage new conservation on the land. It is a private working-lands program. It is not a land retirement program."

The NRCS is holding public meetings across the state. Check the website [www.ks.nrcs.usda.gov](http://www.ks.nrcs.usda.gov) for an entire listing of meeting locations. If an attendee requires special needs such as a signer or interpreter when attending a meeting, please call the contact number.

The signup for the CSP began August 10, 2009, and continues through September 30, 2009. Applications received by the September 30 cutoff date that meet the eligibility requirements will be ranked for 2010 funding consideration. Since signup for CSP is continuous, eligible applications received after the cutoff date could be considered in the next funding period.

The CSP is a voluntary

program that encourages agricultural and forestry producers to maintain existing conservation activities and adopt additional ones on their operations.

Eligible applicants may include individual producers, legal entities, and Indian tribes. The program will be offered to producers in all 50 states, District of Columbia, and the Pacific and Caribbean areas through continuous sign-ups.

# MU scientists develop method to detect live E. coli in ground beef

University of Missouri food scientists have come up with a new method to detect live E. coli cells in ground beef.

According to the national Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about 70,000 people in the U.S. become ill each year from infection with Escherichia coli O157:H7. This bacterium colonizes the intestinal tract of cattle and can contaminate beef products during slaughter and processing.

The MU researchers developed a two-step method that can distinguish between dead and living E. coli cells. Dead cells won't make you sick, but as few as 10 live cells can inflict a severe intestinal illness, said Azlin Mustapha, associate professor of food science in the MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources.

"This is the first such research using these methods in testing beef," she said. Mustapha and colleagues reported on the research in the Journal of Applied

Microbiology.

The research employs a technique called a real-time polymerase chain reaction (PCR). This is a quick, reliable method for detecting and identifying pathogens in food. PCR, however, can't differentiate viable from dead microbial cells. The presence of dead pathogenic cells may result in false-positive findings, which could lead to unnecessary product recalls, Mustapha said.

To prevent this, researchers stain samples with a dye called ethidium bromide monoazide. EMA can't penetrate live cells, but it can enter dead cells, where it binds to DNA molecules, making them insoluble and therefore invisible to PCR tests.

The researchers have successfully tested the technique on ground beef, chicken and eggs, Mustapha said.

Testing takes about 12 hours, as opposed to older methods, which require up to two days for results.

# KAWG supports national organization's climate change policy

The Kansas Association of Wheat Growers supports a new resolution approved by the National Association of Wheat Growers during a conference call Sept. 4. The resolution is similar to KAWG's own policy, adopted by membership at its annual meeting July 30 in Wichita. "We feel as if KAWG's hard work in Wichita paid off, as the NAWG policy aligns very closely with what we developed," says Paul Penner, KAWG President from Hillsboro. KAWG Vice President David Schemm, Sharon Springs, says the issue of climate change has been difficult for all member states of NAWG to agree upon, but that the approved policy is a good compromise.

"The long-term viability of the Kansas wheat industry and representing Kansas wheat farmers is KAWG's top priority. KAWG wants to be actively engaged in discussions on potential greenhouse gas legislation, and the impact it could have on production agriculture," Schemm says. In a statement released by NAWG of Sept. 4, Karl Scronce, NAWG president and a wheat producer from Klamath Falls, Ore., said, "The NAWG Board of Directors met this morning via conference call and voted 26 to two to approve a new reso-

lution regarding greenhouse gas regulation. The Board also voted 24 to zero to remove existing resolutions relating to greenhouse gas regulation and an agriculture cap-and-trade program."

The new resolution reads: "NAWG is opposed to greenhouse gas legislation or regulation that has a negative impact on production agriculture. NAWG will strive for a net economic benefit to farmers, agriculture and food production. We believe neither greenhouse gas regulation nor legislation should take effect until the major carbon emitting countries of the world have agreed to regulate their own greenhouse gases in a like manner to ours. NAWG urges USDA to do a detailed economic analysis of any legislation or regulation before it becomes law. Furthermore, NAWG will oppose EPA regulation and will work to overturn the Supreme Court ruling."

KAWG's Penner says any climate change policy enacted by the Obama Administration must not have a negative economic impact on Kansas wheat producers. Moreover, legislation should be based on sound science by credible sources of information and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Penner adds.

## No new bovine TB cases found in Nebraska testing

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — After nearly 12,000 tests, Nebraska agriculture officials still haven't found any additional cases of bovine tuberculosis.

The latest results released Monday show a total of 10,500 cattle in north-central and eastern Nebraska have tested negative for the disease since two cases were discovered this spring in a Rock County herd.

Officials are waiting for results of the 1,300 tests done last week, and roughly 5,000 more cattle must be tested to determine whether the disease is prevalent in Nebraska. As of Sunday, 22 herds in 12 counties remained quarantined.

The disease typically spreads from one animal to another through the inhalation of bacteria. Experts say there is little risk of the disease being transmitted to humans.

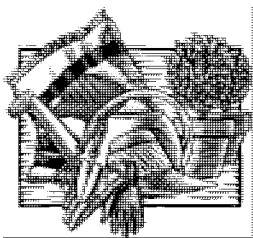

## Yard & Garden Tips

By Gregg Eyestone

### Landscaping with the Lawn

Landscaping includes using some lawn. The lawn referred to as "void," provides a contrast with the trees, shrubs and flowers called "mass." A rule of thumb is 50 percent of space is void or lawn and 50 percent is mass. Once you have an understanding of the rule, you are allowed to bend it in the way you see fit.

To learn more about mass and void, you are invited to participate in the "Home Landscape Design" class. It will begin on September 16 at 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. followed by two more sessions on the 23rd and 30th. Sign up is through the UFM Community Learning Center at (785)

Taking care of your lawn (void) will make your mass more impressive. An unhealthy lawn draws unnecessary attention to it. Many of us would like the focus on the trees, shrubs and flowers. My lawn is broken into several different function areas. One thousand square feet of lawn is towards the front of the house and is mostly used for aesthetics. I've watered it more in the past than the other lawn areas. It was watered only once in April with the rest of the lawn getting none this year.

There is a little over a thousand square feet of lawn

used to move one through the landscape. In other words, the lawn is used as a path. It gets a little more concentrated foot traffic. Therefore, it gets fertilized the same as the front. Last year, with fertilizer being high, the front and paths only got one pound of actual nitrogen per thousand square feet. Both looked fine this year. I will put on at least one pound this fall. Now and or in early November would be the time to fertilize cool-season grasses.

The road ditch doesn't get any treatment. The only maintenance I make sure to do correctly is to mow tall for the tall fescue. It is

mowed at the same height as the rest of the lawn which is 3.5 inches year round.

Football and other lawn games are played in the backyard. It has done well enough with the same mowing, no watering these past three summers and one pound of actual nitrogen. It is four thousand square feet.

September is a good month for yard work. If you are thinking about planting trees and shrubs and other yard work this year, consider taking the home landscape design class. The weather is usually cooperative for accomplishing many landscaping projects.
