Pay attention to details, including calving rates, to reap profits from beef herd

The fall of the year is the time to make herd evaluations and managerial and nutritional improvements without fighting the weather. The key to understanding the overall performance of a herd is reproduction.

For example, the calving distribution of the herd is very important because delayed calving costs pounds. The calving distribution indicates how many cows calved within each 21-day period of the calving season.

The actual number of pounds lost due to later calving is critical. By viewing the average calf weight by 21-day calving periods, this lost income potential actually can be traced.

For example, let's compare two herds of cattle that calved in 2008 and restrict our discussion only to those cows that calved during the first, second or third 21-day period of the calving season. The first herd (herd A) has 186 calves during this 63-day period with 74.7 percent of the cows calving in the first 21 days. In other words, the cows bred well. The larger second herd (herd B) has 256 calves during this 63-day period, but only 42.5 percent of the cows calved during the first 21 days.

Is there a difference in these two herds? Obviously herd A is a tighter, more reproductively responsive herd. So

what does this mean? One could evaluate actual weaning weight. However, even before overall improvement in calf weaning weight is discussed, a more serious problem is the pounds of weaning weight given up due to later calving.

In herd A, the more reproductively responsive herd, those calves born during the second 21 days of the calving season are 42 pounds lighter than those born during the first 21 days of the calving cycle. Those born during the third 21 days of the calving season are 86 pounds lighter than those born during the first 21 days.

In herd B, the herd with a more spread-out calving season, those calves born during the second 21 days of are 41 pounds lighter than those born during the first 21 days. Those born during the third 21 days of the calving cycle are 88 pounds lighter than those born during the first 21 days.

I realize that not all the calves can be born during the first 21 days of the cycle. However, the degree of effort put forth to keep cows calving early in your chosen calving season needs to be proportional to the amount of weight lost in the lighter calves. Regardless of herd A or B, both herds are giving up more than 40 pounds for every calf delayed into the second cycle and almost 90 pounds into the third cycle.

Adding this weight loss to the number of calves in each

cycle, herd A gave up 1,680 pounds on 40 calves born during the second 21 days of the calving season, while herd B gave up a whooping 4,551 pounds on the 111 calves born during the second 21 days.

If one looks at calves born during the third 21 days of the calving season, herd A gave up 602 pounds on seven calves and herd B gave up an additional 3,168 pounds on 36 calves. Adding up the weight loss, herd A lost 2,282 pounds or 1,231 pounds per hundred calves, while herd B lost 7.719 pounds of calf or 3,045 pounds per hundred cows. Granted, the younger, lighter calves may bring more dollars per pound to help offset some of the losses, but they don't bring more dollars per head.

However, the overriding principle is one of pressure in a herd to keep the cows calving early with respect to the desired calving season. Each producer sets his or her calving date for the type of cows he or she wants to raise and then needs to review the herd's reproductive performance utilizing the calving distribution.

If you're not satisfied, evaluate the cows, check the condition score and take steps to start improving the most likely problem, which is cow nutrition. Doing it next spring after calving is too late. See your nutritionist because four tons of calf is not easy to give up.



What does it mean to be rural? People who live in geographically isolated, low population areas where occupations are tied to natural resources have more in common with each other than they do with their fellow countryman in cities and towns of any size.

The fewness of numbers is key to understanding the peculiar dynamics of relationships and the assortment



residents experience.

Rural values. The values that underpin rural life are more family, social, religious and community-based. The social and relational parts of rural life are powerful in terms of stress and in their psychological rewards.

Rural people have lifelong relationships with relatives close by and friends who seem like family. Peo-

of troubles and distress rural ple are judged on how good a neighbor they are. It is a major way people earn respect in a rural community.

> Occupations and careers are important, but only in a larger context of social obligations and constraints. People count. Community counts.

Rituals are enacted. The cycle of life repeats itself through birth and death, summer and winter, sowing and harvesting, young and old - a never-ending succession of patterns and rhythms. One generation replaces the next.

The landscape is familiar and comforting. Family history and connection is meaningful. Local history is passed on as a part of heritage. Each person's future and family well-being are tied to place.

The "place" is alive. It is whole. It has a life of its own. It is the glue that holds things together. To be separated from place is to not belong or be a part of something important. Place is the stage upon which the drama of life is being played out.

Importance of belonging. Personal identity is drawn from the association and support of other people. Belonging and being in good standing with the group has deep meaning. Reliance on social identity is at once a strength and a weakness. The boundaries between oneself and others is more fluid and subject to pressures and threat.

Rural people accept the interplay between good and bad, accommodate themselves to the reality they see, and do what is necessary to be in harmony with their environment. They have a sense of how things fit together and how decisions affect each life.

The downside of rural life. When people are in short supply, they are recruited and "pressured" into community service. Serving in multiple roles adds to stress. The same person may serve on different civic boards or as a member of various groups.

At the same time, community members see and meet each other at church, school functions, games, stores, dealerships, card parties, weddings, funerals, community fund raisers and at the local cafes and bars. They "change hats" often and make subtle shifts in relationships depending on the roles they are playing.

How do people cope with complicated social relationships when goals and ideas come in conflict? By being "nice," that's how. Being "nice" means not rocking the boat, not engaging in

controversy and not giving strong opinions. It means papering over conflict and living with the difference.

In a word; they "stuff it." Being "nice" is the socially correct way of coexisting in a rural community. To be other than "nice" invites criticism. It isn't safe not to be nice.

Feeling out of step, judged or excluded is painful. They often live lives of hidden pain, resentments and anger because they fear the pathway to reconciliation will cause further and perhaps irreparable harm. They live with private anger and opinions which they keep to themselves. Their public face and their private thoughts don't always match up.

This isn't to say that rural communities don't have people who are genuinely kind, compassionate, nonjudgmental and open with their feelings. These people don't have suppressed hostility and anger. They have a strong sense of identity. What you see is what you get. They are also nice.

Avoiding personal risks. Those who have difficulty in controlling their emotions or in resolving conflict find it

easier to keep the peace. Being nice means they don't have to think, take a stand or risk rejection.

People are too interconnected to risk alienating each other or to start a feud. One blowup might last a lifetime. Everyone has vested interests. If you oppose someone strongly in one setting, he or she may block your goals in another.

Even enemies have friends. The friend of your enemy is your friend. To make an enemy is to put a strain on your friend. Strong political controversy rips apart the delicate social fabric of a rural community. People don't know how to act when lines of conflict divide the community.

Harmony is the value that makes the community work. Even if power is concentrated and public interest isn't served, it is still seems better to most people than raw, open controversy that upsets the social system. Attempts at change are more likely to go through indirect means such as gossip and social ostracism.

It is easy to stick your head in the sand and ignore injustice, abuse of power or harm to the public good. Calling attention to the

problem will ruffle somebody's feathers. Going along to get along perpetuates the status quo.

Change is hard in rural communities because of the inertia created by the need for social harmony. Personal integrity takes courage because it comes with a cost.





Freeze stops crop growth, but cool weather slowed maturity earlier

First freeze of the fall ends the growing season for crops, but extended cool weather before frost may have stopped crop maturity early, said a University of Missouri Extension agronomist.

"The science of low temperatures and photosynthesis is not perfect, but we expect some reduced yields in both soybean and corn fields because of unusual fall weather," said Bill Wiebold, MU Extension soybean and corn specialist.

When temperatures fall below 40 degrees, little growth occurs. Photosynthesis slows and then stops with low temperatures and reduced day length. Photosynthesis is the chemical process in which chlorophyll in plants converts carbon dioxide and water into starches and sugars for seed fill.

Plants can survive frost at 32 degrees, but a hard freeze at 28 degrees kills most plants. Freezing temperatures can vary across a landscape, with colder temperatures in low-lying areas and north-facing slopes. Lack of wind increases chance of killing freeze.

As of Oct 7, frost from 32degree temperatures had occurred in much of northwest Missouri. However, no 28-degree temperatures, the killing freeze, were reported, said Pat Guinan, climatologist with the MU Extension Commercial Agriculture Program. Those killing across the state line in Iowa and Kansas.

Long-range forecasts call for killing freeze on Sunday, Oct 11. "There is even the possibility of snow in far northern Missouri," Guinan "However, snow said. should be light and not accumulate on warm soils."

"Unfortunately, we are not getting the late freeze that we had last year," Wiebold said. "In 2008, a long, warm fall season helped yields."

Guinan said the median date for a freeze is Oct. 11-16 in counties across far northern Missouri. In most of Missouri the median freeze date is Oct. 16-21. Counties in extreme southwest Missouri and the Bootheel have median

freezes from Oct. 26 to Nov.

Delayed planting last spring because of cool, rainy weather put more crops at risk of delayed maturity. Some crops, normally up and growing in springtime, were not planted until after the first day of summer.

Crop observers have noted many fields of green soybean plants late in the season this year, Wiebold said. "Near-perfect growing conditions in the fall have kept the plants alive. Usually we see the leaves turn yellow and begin to drop by early October."

Farmers worry about whether the soybean seed pods and corn ears have

the killing freeze, Wiebold said. Of greater concern is whether the soybean seed matured normally or remained green. Off-color beans can be docked in price at market time.

"Green soybeans don't mature in the bin after harvest," Wiebold added. "Immature sovbean seeds contain chlorophyll and appear green. During maturity in normal fall weather, the chlorophyll breaks down and partially bleaches in sunlight. Premature death stops this degradation and the seeds remain green."

The extent of the greenbean syndrome depends on how mature the seeds were when frozen.

"If death occurs late in

color is confined to the seed coat," he said. "If death occurs during early to mid fill, the green color remains throughout the interior of the seed."

Soybean buyers dock the price of green beans brought to elevators. In processing, green beans produce green soy oil, an undesirable quality for cooking.

Nearly all soybeans are classified and sold as "yellow soybeans," Wiebold said.

Farmers can check their soybean seed by splitting them with a knife. If only the seed coat is green, the beans should be classified as yellow beans and not docked.

is yellow, the beans will be classified as "soybeans of other color.'

A load of beans containing more than 10 percent seed of other color will be graded "standard" and can receive substantial dockage, he said.

Sometimes early freezing damages seed so badly that they are classified "total damage kernels," the lowest grade.

For the most part, corn has passed the critical stage of maturity called "black layer." This layer, at the base of the kernel where it attaches to the corn cob, seals the kernel off from the plant, stopping nutrient intake. At that point the corn starts to dry for harvest.

Corn killed before black layer forms can be difficult to dry, both on the stalk and in the bin

"Delaying harvest to allow corn to dry in the field leads to increased risk of cornstalks falling over," Wiebold warned. "The wet season has increased chances for stalk rot."



Since the U.S. dairy industry intensified selective breeding efforts in the 1960s, average milk yield in Holsteins has doubled, but the cattle are less fertile. A comparison of DNA from cattle selectively bred for milk production versus cattle isolated from such practices shows a genetic link between increased vields and reduced fertility, according to researchers at the ARS Animal and Natural Resources Institute (ANRI) in Beltsville, Md.

The researchers teamed up with colleagues at the University of Minnesota (UM) to compare the genomes of modern Holsteins with those of UM cattle never exposed to the

modern selective breeding practices. The lack of exposure meant that DNA from the UM cattle were genetic "time capsules" of an era before the selection efforts intensified.

Scientists study Holstein milk

ANRI geneticist John Cole and colleagues drew DNA samples from the genetic material of about 2,000 cattle, stored at the ARS National Center for Genetic Resources Preservation, the U.S. Holstein Association, and five U.S. universities, including UM. The scientists extracted DNA and genotyped the samples using the Illumina Bovine SNP50 BeadChip, a glass slide capable of obtaining genotypes for thousands of markers simultaneously. The device was developed by ARS researchers in collaboration with industry, university and other ARS partners.

By analyzing 50,000 genetic markers, the researchers found that many of the chromosomal regions associated with increased milk vield were also associated with reduced fertility rates. The results also showed that up to 30 percent of the Holstein genome may be influenced by standard breeding practices, according to Tad Sonstegard, an ANRI geneticist.

The researchers say the results will help Holstein breeders and milk producers better understand tradeoffs between high yield and low fertility when selecting for more profitable dairy cattle.

Managing lawn weeds

If you mow tall, fertilize some and water when the grass needs it, you will likely have few weeds. I will testify that this has worked for me. My lawn is the best it ever has been. Besides following the K-State Research and Extension recommendations, weather has been extremely helpful.

Most Kansas lawns are made up of a cool-season grass like tall fescue with perhaps some bluegrass mixed in. These grasses are

up earlier in the spring than the warm-season types. A characteristic of cool-season grasses is that they usually brown up with the heat and reduced rainfall of the summer. That didn't happen for me this summer.

With actively growing tall fescue, there wasn't time or room for weeds to grow. The cool and sufficient rainfall of this year's growing season helped the grass keep weeds out. I was walking

selected because they green my lawn looking for dandelions and the start of henbit, chickweed or speedwell. Little to no signs of these or bindweed could I find that have been in my lawn.

> In the past on a day when the weeds are actively growing, I have treated for these broadleaf weeds. Α broadleaf herbicide spray will cover the weed leaf surface and give good control. Sprays also allow for treating areas that only have weeds while granular prod

ucts are applied to the entire lawn whether it is needed or not.

If you fertilize only once a year, the weed and feed granular products would be a good fit. The leaf surface of the weeds needs to be moist so that the herbicide will stick to it. The more leaf surface the better for contact of the herbicide. Don't mow right before treating and wait a few days for it to be absorbed. After a few days, the lawn should be watered for the fertilizer to be moved into the root zone. Any fertilizer or herbicide that falls on the driveway, sidewalk or in the street needs to be swept up and put on the lawn. It becomes a pollutant on these hard surfaces and is a waste

age them. They become a lot tougher as they get bigger. With only a few weeds, hand digging may be a good option. Mowing tall, fertilizing and strategic watering will aid in reducing weeds. Those factors I can control. It is good to have help with cool summer temperatures and timely rains. Kansas to harvest record corn, soybeans

WICHITA (AP) - A new government report is predicting record crops of corn and soybeans in Kansas this harvest. Sorghum yields may set a record as well.

Kansas Agricultural Statistics Service reported Friday that corn production is expected to total 561.2 million bushels. That is 8 percent more than had been forecast last month and 15 percent more than last year's crop.

Another record is forecast for Kansas soybean production. That crop is predicted to be 146 million bushels, a 21 percent increase over last year.

Grain sorghum is not setting any production records because its planted acreage is down. But its growers are still hauling in record yields of 83 bushels per acre. The agency forecasts the state will harvest 207.5 million bushels of sorghum.



The US Dollar Index fell to new lows for the move again last week and the charts suggest we will see the Dollar Index head down to the 71 area and the 2008 low. The weakness in the Dollar and the strength in the stock market seemed to benefit the commodity markets this week. The gold made a new all time high of \$1060.40 in the October contract. There is a lot of fear is regards to the future of the US Dollar and the gold market has been attracting a great deal of flight to quality money. The USDA released the

The yield increase was larger than the average trader guess, which is negative, but how USDA arrived at the higher yield is very interesting and deserves a deeper look. USDA did not increase the yield in Illinois and they only increased Iowa by 1 bushel to the acre. However, North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, and Indiana

Wisconsin was increased by 7, and Nebraska was increased by 9 bu.ac. Combined, less than 60% of the corn in these states is mature and some of it isn't even dented. All of these states, with the exception of Indiana, will have a killing frost this weekend. So the question arises, "Will USDA have to cut the yield in these states next month?" I think the answer is yes. I don't know how much damage will be done, but I think there will be some. We have reached the point that the size of the crop is no longer growing. We haven't made much harvest progress yet, so it is hard to believe a harvest low is in, but it is looking more likely that the har-

vest low came on September 8th. That is not to say that we won't see pressure in the market, because I think it is very likely that we revisit the 50-day moving average, which is near \$3.30, but I don't think we can start to take a more bullish attitude towards the market.

The wheat numbers were nothing but bearish Friday. Higher production, lower usage, and much higher ending stocks. Ending stocks came in at 864 million bushels, which is the highest level since the 2000/2001 crop year and prices were much lower back then. It isn't pleasant when I think about a move below \$3.00 in the wheat. I don't think it will happen, but we have to keep in mind that unless demand improves, stocks will likely build again next year and we really don't need more wheat. We had a good bounce in the wheat this week and technical indicators are giving buy signals, so I can't be too negative right now, but I would be very cautious with long positions. Plan on the wheat being the short leg of spreads and plan on the July KW heading to \$4.50 unless something changes with the weather

Friday's soybean numbers were actually somewhat friendly. Production was lower than expected at 3.250 billion bushels and ending stocks were lower than expected at 230 million. 230 million isn't a bullish number, but it is better than



feared. The export estimate was increased to a new record high level of 1.305 billion. At the moment there is no reason to doubt that number because sales are outstanding and it is still a long time until the S. American harvest. On the charts the beans look a lot better than they did a week ago. The November soybeans gained about 80 cents this week, moved through trend line support and closed back above the 50-day moving average. Strong demand and potential freeze damage were supportive this week and will make traders pay attention to the technical indicators that are giving buy signals when trade starts next week.

There isn't much positive news to report in the cattle market. Cash cattle trade was lower again at the \$81 -\$81.50 level. Boxed beef was lower again. Not much, but still lower. On the bright side, December LC were up 85 cents this week and technical indicators are starting to give buy signals in the deferred months. The biggest

problem I see right now is that the December LC will run into trend line resistance at about \$85.40 next week and probably fail. We shall see, but right now I am not very optimistic. If you want to be a buyer, buy August LC.

A \$20 million National Science Foundation grant will further establish Kansas as an internationally recognized leader in global climate change and renewable energy research and will let a Nobel Prize-winning K-State scientist continue his work on the effects of climate change.

"More than being pleased for researchers across the state, I also am excited what this investment by the National Science Foundation will mean for scientists at K-State," said Kirk Schulz, K-State president. "This grant allows Charles Rice, a university distinguished professor of agronomy, and his fellow researchers to continue their important work on climate change. As K-State continues to make sustainability a campus priority, we are more proud than ever to be involved in a project on global climate change and renewable energy."

Rice was a member of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change that was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 2007.

The five-year award to Kansas NSF EPSCoR (Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research), a statewide program that includes major Kansas research universities, will provide a fresh integrative approach to address climate change and renewable energy challenges.

The grant is a multi-institutional, multi-sector effort that will link four universities: Kansas State University (K-State), the University of Kansas (KU), Wichita State University (WSU) and Haskell Indian Nations University; three Kansas-based companies: Abengoa Bioenergy, MGP Ingredients, and Nanoscale, and two companies outside of the state: ADM (Illinois) and Netcrystals (California) in a massive research effort. The initiative also will be supported by \$4 million in matching funds from K-State, KU and Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation (KTEC).

The Climate Change and Renewable Energy initiative spans a variety of disciplines, with five team leaders.

Rice, a University Distinguished Professor of Agronomy at K-State, leads the group that will use climate modeling tactics to predict the effects of climate change and develop strategies for adaptation and mitigation. Dietrich Earnhart, Associate Professor of Economics at KU and colleagues will assess how farmers make decisions about which crops to grow.

The part of the project that K-State's Rice leads — the climate change portion - makes up about \$5 million of the \$20 million funding.

About 40 scientists are currently involved in the collaborative consortium, representing a vast array of disciplines, including agronomy, anthropology, computer science, economics, geography, mathematics, sociology, engineering, biology, chemistry and physics.

Winter annual weeds are faring well this fall in winter wheat fields, thanks in part due to ample precipitation throughout much of Kansas.

Dallas Peterson, Extension weed specialist at Kansas State University, says that in fields where growers have experienced past problems, grass and broadleaf weeds can be a challenge this fall.

"If you had problems in that field in previous years, especially in continuous wheat, rest assured you're going to have a problem this year," he explains. Taking frequent good, hard looks at wheat fields from now until dormancy is a good idea, particularly when it comes to grassy weeds. "I always encourage farmers to scout fields for weeds, but you have to look close to see them in the fall. You're not a herbicide application," he ally have resistance to all of going to see them from the road. When winter annual grasses have just one or two leaves, they're easiest to kill," says Peterson, who adds that many farmers might be surprised at how invasive these weeds can be in the fall.

"In most cases, when people think they don't have a problem in the fall, but then they go back in the spring and see a lot of weeds they were probably already there in the fall." And fall, he points out, is the best time to treat these problem grass and broadleaf weeds. "If you have grasses such as cheatgrass, rye or jointed goatgrass and you're pretty confident you are going to treat the field some time during the season, fall is clearly the best time to make

says.

Wheat producers have a broad spectrum of weed control products to choose from. Although they come from four different companies, Powerflex, Olympus, Olympus Flex, Beyond and Maverick all are similar in how they work. "All of these herbicides are very good for control of cheat and Japanese brome, but they're not quite as good on downy brome and they work better as a fall treatment than in the spring," he explains. "All have the same mode of action and that's important, since we are starting to see some resistance in our cheat populations to the ALS-inhibiting class of herbicides. When we have resistance to one of those herbicides, we gener-

them because they all work the same way." Many producers are rotating wheat into a summer-planted row crop, Peterson says, in which case paying close attention to the rotation restriction on the herbicide's label is critical.

"Another advantage of a fall application is the longer interval before planting a summer row crop, which may allow you to plant certain row crops the next summer, whereas a late spring application may not fit into those guidelines," he adds. Peterson adds that this fall's ample precipitation has been beneficial for winter annual broadleaf weeds like mustard, field pennycress and henbit, all of which go dormant over the winter but resume growth in the spring.

Many of the herbicides mentioned above will suppress the winter annual broadleaves too. A new product - Huskie, from Bayer Crop Science – features excellent control of winter annual broadleaves, although it has no effect on winter annual grasses. Huskie has a bleaching mode of action and is a viable alternative to existing

broadleaf herbicides, especially in areas where ALSresistant broadleaf weeds are present.
