Potential wheat freeze injury determined by several factors

A hard freeze was predicted for the night of May 7 in parts of Kansas. In such instances at this stage of development, wheat will suffer some injury. The extent of that injury will depend on several factors, said Brian Olson, K-State Northwest Area crops and soils specialist, and Jim Shroyer, K-State Extension agrono-

A number of factors will determine freeze damage: the stage of development of the wheat, the density of the stand and condition of the plants, the extent and duration of low temperatures, gradients temperature within the field, soil moisture, and the wind speed, Olson and Shroyer said.

The K-State agronomists summarized the effect of these factors:

1. Stage of development. Jointing wheat can usually tolerate temperatures in the mid to upper 20s with no significant injury. But, if temperatures fall into the low 20s or lower for several hours, the lower stems, leaves, or developing head can sustain injury. If the leaves of tillers are yellowish as they emerge from the whorl, this indicates those

tillers have been damaged. Existing leaves may also be damaged so severely that they turn bluish, then bleach out. This usually results in the field's having a "silage smell." At the boot stage, wheat can be injured if temperatures drop into the upper 20s for several hours. There can be damage to the flag leaf, stems, and developing head.

2. Density of the stand and condition of the plants. If the stand is thick, that will tend to reduce the extent of freeze damage. On the other hand, well-fertilized wheat has often sustained more freeze injury than wheat that is not as well fertilized.

3. Extent and duration of low temperatures. It usually takes more than just a momentary dip into the upper 20s to damage wheat in the jointing or boot stages of growth. Significant injury becomes much more likely if temperatures in the damaging range last for two hours or longer.

4. Temperature gradients within the field. Low spots in the field are almost always the first to have freeze injury. The coldest air tends to settle in low areas, especially under have freeze injury," Olson calm wind conditions.

5. Soil moisture. There is often less freeze injury at a given temperature when soils are wet than when dry. Wetter soils tend to radiate a little more warmth than dry soils.

6. Wind speed. Windy conditions during nighttime hours when temperatures reach their lows will increase the chance of injury.

7. Tillage system. Wheat tends to suffer more freeze injury in no-till systems where residue covers the soil surface and keeps some of the soil heat from radiating into the plant canopy.

If a freeze occurs, the best thing producers can do for the first few days is to simply walk the fields to observe lodging, crimped stems, and damaged leaves, Olson and Shroyer said.

"Be patient. It will take several days of warm weather to accurately evaluate the extent of damage. After several days, producers should split open some stems and check the developing head. If the head is green or light greenish in color and seems firm, it is probably fine. If the head is yellowish and mushy, it may

said.

There are also early signs producers might notice right away, the K-State agronomists added.

Silage smell. If a field of wheat is giving off the aroma of silage, that indicates that leaves have been damaged. Damaged leaves will likely turn black within a few days, then become bleached. If the flag leaf is killed, that tiller won't produce much, if any, grain. Damage to lower leaves will not have such a drastic effect. Even if the flag leaf on the most advanced tillers is lost, less developed tillers can still come on and produce grain at this point in the season.

Ice in the stems. If there was ice in the stems below the first node the morning of the freeze, those tillers will probably be damaged (although not always) and may not produce grain.

Lodging. If the wheat lodged immediately after the freeze, that indicates stem damage. Later tillers may eventually cover the damaged tillers.

In the boot stage, the heads will go ahead and emerge even if they are severely freeze damaged, they added. However, that head may be partially damaged or completely dead. If the freeze damage is light to severe, heads may "back out of the boot," Shroyer

Producers should remember that even if primary tillers are damaged, less-developed secondary tillers may be fine, Olson said. "If there are enough secondary tillers that survive, these tillers should be able to compensate and keep yield losses to a minimum," he added.

Tractor course planned

A Hazardous Occupations Training course (tractor safety) will be conducted on Thursday, May 27 and Friday, May 28 at KanEquip in Wamego. The class will run from 9 a.m to 4 p.m. the first day, and from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on day two.

The course is taught by KSU Extension Agents from Pottawatomie, Riley, Shawnee and Wabaunsee counties and is recommended for youths age 12 and older. Any youth 14 or 15 years old who will operate a tractor for someone other than their parent is required to pass the course to be legally employed. Youths age 12 and 13 are welcome to participate in the class, but can't be certified until age 14.

Two hours of practical tractor experience is also required for certification. A parent or employer will supervise the two hours of practical experience at a later date. Actual tractor driving will not be included in the course.

The registration deadline to enroll in the Hazardous Occupations Training course is Tuesday, May 25. A \$30 fee will be collected to cover class materials and lunch both

Demand for veterinarians in Kansas grows

MANHATTAN (AP) Bigger classes and new student loan forgiveness programs are increasing the number of veterinarians in Kansas, but demand continues to far exceed sup-— a situation that has implications for the health of humans as well as ani-

Within the next five years, the nation is expected to be 15.000 veterinarians short of the number said needed. Ralph Richardson, dean of the College of Veterinary Medicine at Kansas State Uni-

In Kansas, the shortage continues to be acute in large-animal practices, even in areas not considered rural.

Richardson said other shortages are looming, especially in areas that relate to public health and food

Large-animal practices

The shortage, especially in large-animal practices, is in part a reflection of the changing enrollment at veterinary schools, where women now make up the majority of students.

"The rewards of being in a large-animal practice are tremendous," said Sedgwick County veterinarian James Speer of Equine Surgery and Medicine.

But "large-animal medicine takes a unique individual" willing to put up with physically demanding work and long hours, he said.

"It's not unusual to go 20 nights in a row having to go on an emergency call following a long day's work."

Preston Hickman, also a Sedgwick County veterinarian with a large-animal practice, said the debt level that new graduates have "makes it very difficult for them to look at a rural practice" where pay may be lower.

And the long hours may make a rural large-animal practice less attractive to women, he said.

Speer said, "It's not that they can't practice" in a large-animal setting but that women may not find it appealing.

A survey by the American Veterinary Medical Association showed that for 2009, 67.5 percent of veterinarians in private practice limited themselves to companion animals - pets. Only 1.8 percent had practices devoted exclusively to food animals. Of them, 82.5 percent were men.

K-State's Class of 2012 has 85 women and 23 men.

Richardson said the veterinary school is increasing its next class size by four, to 112. Space constraints make it difficult to expand more, he said, though he'd like a

class of 125 to 150.

Students are offered a new state loan forgiveness program designed to help fill the need for rural veterinarians.

The first five students in the program graduate later this month, Richardson said, and four had jobs by mid-April, with the fifth near agreement.

The program is similar to loan forgiveness programs for physicians and other

health professionals who agree to practice in underserved areas.

The veterinary graduates will have \$20,000 of debt forgiven each year, to a maximum of \$80,000

Hickman said the program should be expanded to those who've practiced in rural areas for five or six years.

That might be worthwhile: A study in the latest Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association says retention is an

issue for rural practitioners. Those who'd left said emergency duty, time off, salary, practice atmosphere and family were issues.

A new U.S. Department of Agriculture program offers more rural practice incentives. Its details are being finalized, but it will offer loan forgiveness to veterinarians in areas determined to be underserved.

Even urban areas have a lack of veterinarians in Continued on page 20





large-animal practices, said Greg Seiler, whose clinic is in Andale.

"They're closing up shop everywhere," he said, noting that Kingman County. Winfield and Clearwater are among places that have lost all or most of their veterinarians.

Most job offers are still in companion animal practices, Richardson said, and as metropolitan areas continue to grow, that trend will continue.

Public health effects

But shortages are looming in public health.

In Manhattan, veterinarians will be needed to help staff the National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility, a \$450 million facility where scientists will research and develop vaccines for deadly

biological threats, including foot-and-mouth disease.

Also to be built in Manhattan is the Arthropod-Borne Animal Disease Research Laboratory, which works with livestock diseases spread by insects and arachnids.

And K-State will get \$12 million over the next six years as a Center of Excellence for Emerging and Zoonotic Animal Diseases.

In addition, Richardson said, dozens of private companies working in animal health have set up shop in a corridor running from Manhattan to Kansas Citv.

"Our region ... will experience great growth in employment opportunities" as a result of the public health facilities, he said.

"We need to start right now, getting those students

Ag students' idea has potential to save lives

Five Kansas State University seniors have come up with an idea that could resolve a persistent problem in storing grain and other dry bulk ingredients, and reduce fatalities associated with managing the stored products.

The students — Ryan Roberts, of Pomona, Andy Linscott, from Effingham, Aaron Bingham, from Manhattan and Carl Tharman, from Atchison, who are each majoring in feed science and management, and Justin Howie, of Abilene, who is majoring in milling science and management and agricultural economics, are enrolled in Management Applications in the Grain Processing Industries, a 600 upper-level grain science course.

The students' new product idea was developed as an entry in the new product division of K-State's 2010 Next Big Thing Competition, said Fred Fairchild, a professor in the Department of Grain Science and Industry at K-State.

entrepreneurial contest is open to students in all areas of study at the university and is normally considered an extracurricular activity. Fairchild said, however, that he includes it as the major student project for his class because it gives students the opportunity to incorporate their knowledge into a business-type situation.

Students who enter the contest have the opportunity to attend six informational business seminars and are encouraged to combine the new concepts they are learning with their education, personal experience and interests to develop a winning idea.

Participating in the contest brings opportunities, said Jeffrey Hornsby, director for K-State's Center for the Advancement of Entrepreneurship, which sponsors the contest.

According to Hornsby, a series of six business-planning seminars leading up to the contest finals provides the tools students will need to complement their creative thinking and test their skills in a safe, but competitive businesslike environ-

Doing a market survey, feasibility study, financial analysis and business plan are integral to the process. said Hornsby, who has observed that students who

of the seminars usually fare the best in the contest.

Given the planning that goes into the seminars, it would seem no surprise that students attending the sessions give them high marks. As an example, Justin Howie, a member of the successful ag team, noted that he thought the financial seminar a key step in developing a realistic business plan.

Aaron Bingham credited the seminars with helping the team plug personal experience into the new product development process, as he, Roberts, Linscott, and Tharman have each worked in the feed and grain business. They've had to deal with difficulties with stored dry bulk ingredients and, also, had to fill out forms required by Occupational Safety Health Administration (OSHA) before climbing into a grain bin to resolve problems.

"Filling out the form is a reminder of how dangerous climbing into a grain bin can be," said Bingham, who referred to a report in the Delta Farm Press indicating that, in 2009, accidents in grain bins claimed 34 lives in the United States.

Bingham, who has been working part time at a feed mill this spring to earn money for college, was actually working in a grain bin and thinking "there must be a better way" when he had an a-ha moment that proved important in developing the new product idea.

After making the pitch for their new product idea during the competition April 23, the ag students learned they had earned second place in the new product division in the entrepreneurial Next Big Thing contest.

For now, the product itself is under wraps, as its young developers are being

Finalists in K-State's 2010 Next Big Thing competition ranged from a penny auction for automobiles to an innovative design for containers to prevent cross contamination of foods in restaurants, bottling rain water and creating a community-based credit card with cash back going to support charitable community agencies, said Chad Jackson, contest coordinator.

The contest has proved popular with students. Although scheduled during the spring semester, which often is considered the busiest time of year for students, the 2010 contest drew 152 participants, a 50 percent increase over the 100 who participated in the inaugural 2009 contest, said Jackson, who is the outreach coordinator for K-State's Center for Advancement of Entrepreneurship, the contest sponsor.

The opportunity to think in new and creative ways is appealing to students, said Jackson, who noted that the prize money (first place, \$3,000; second place, \$2,000, and third place, \$1,000) also is appealing.

The cash awards for the contest have been provided by Phil Howe, an entrepreneurial Manhattan businessman, Jackson said.

Trade group emphasizes importance of markets for wheat

During the 2010 State of the Union Address, President Barack Obama advocated a stronger export program to boost the American economy. The passage of trade programs continues to be a priority of U.S. wheat industry leaders, not only to improve demand for wheat, but to benefit consumers in other countries.

Alejandro Daly, president of the Wheat Millers Committee in Lima, Peru, says a free trade agreement between Peru and the United States has created jobs and wealth for his countrymen, by providing a market for Peru's booming textile and vegetable markets. Meanwhile, the agreement was a boon for U.S. wheat producers who now sell some 500,000 metric tons of wheat per year to Peru, thanks to the elimination of a 20%

The Peru Free Trade Agreement has been an unqualified success for both countries."It means more employment, better salaries and better opportunities for our people," Daly says.

The same could be true in Colombia, where a free trade agreement with the U.S. has been the wheat industry's top trade priority and is key to maintaining more than \$90 million in annual wheat exports to Colombia. The tariff on U.S. wheat to Colombia now stands at 19%, according to Jaime Jimenez, executive director of the National Federation of Wheat Millers in Bogota, Colombia. His country buys 1.3 million metric tons of wheat each year.

U.S. wheat faces competition in Colombia from Argentina, which enjoys advantages from the Mercosur trade agreement allowing for duty-free access; and Canada, which is expected to approve its own free trade agreement with Colombia within six months. Although the U.S. has consistent supplies of high-quality wheat that Colombian millers and bakers prefer, the Colombian wheat industry can achieve a similar product by blending wheat sourced from Argentina and Canada. Meanwhile, farmers in Paraguay and Uruguay also are increasing wheat production and could soon be a supplier to Colombia. All of these factors could combine to cause a precipitous drop in U.S. exports to Colombia, Jimenez

"A chicken finds a piece of corn here and there and eventually gets full. That could be the same way for our wheat industry. We may have to buy our wheat from several different countries, but we will eventually have enough to meet our needs," he explains.


U.S. Wheat Associates estimates that, at current export prices, failure to ratify the U.S.-Colombia FTA could lead to an annual loss of more than \$92 million for the U.S. wheat industry.

On the other hand, analysis by the Food and Agricultural Policy Research Institute (FAPRI) suggests that if the Colombia FTA were in effect now, U.S. wheat exports would be 20 million bushels greater and the farm price would be 10 cents per bushel

"A free trade agreement between the U.S and Colombia would improve demand for U.S. wheat 30% today," Jimenez says. "In turn, it would improve the income of our people, and allow us to sell goods to a country with 300 million people who have great purchasing power."

Producer-members of organizations representing wheat, corn, beef and pork, along with the American Farm Bureau Federation, have lobbied on behalf of a U.S.-Colombia Free Trade Agreement, and hosted a press conference at the National Press Club in Washington D.C. on May 3 to demonstrate the importance of such an agreement.





Freezing temperatures cause alfalfa management decisions

Freezing temperatures at this point in early May can injure the stems of alfalfa and create some management decisions for producers, said Jim Shroyer, K-State Extension agronomist. "When temperatures get into the 20s for several hours, producers can expect to see injury to stems. With the amount of growth currently on alfalfa, I would expect to see stems being crimped high in the plant canopy on stands injured by the freeze," he said. Heat radiating upward from the soil can counteract the freezing temperatures to some extent and may help protect the plants, he added. However, windy conditions can increase the likelihood of potential injury.

If the tops of stems suffer freeze injury, the uppermost leaves in the canopy will begin dropping within a few days, Shroyer said. Beyond

that, alfalfa plant sensitivity will depend on the amount of growth at the time of the freeze. Plants that are 12inches tall are much more likely to experience significant damage than three-inch tall plants.

During the next few warm weather days, Shroyer advised producers to watch

1. New growth continuing from the tip. This means plants are recovering nicely. Take no action unless the stand is nearly ready to cut anyway. If the stand is nearly ready to cut, do so quickly before any leaf drop oc-

2. New growth emerging as branches below the tip. This means the growing point was killed, slowing plant development significantly, but recovery is occurring. As mentioned above, take no action unless the stand is nearly ready to cut anyway. 3. Normal regrowth emerging from crown buds. This means the growing point was killed and very little new growth can be expected from existing shoots.

Cut the stand as soon as possible if sufficient growth is available for economical harvest before new shoots

get tall enough to be damaged by the harvest. Cutting or damaging new regrowth shoots will cause severe damage.

If the stand is too short, just let the new shoots develop and expect to take the first cutting much later than normal. When cutting freeze-damaged alfalfa, be sure to leave at least 2-3 inches of stubble. This will help encourage regrowth, Shroyer said.

If damaged stands are cut, producers should watch the regrowth carefully for further infestations of alfalfa weevil and possibly pea aphids, and treat immediately, he added.

"Weevil larvae that survive in the leaf litter on the soil surface will start feeding on the new growth once the weather warms up. A hard freeze will probably kill a certain percentage of the weevil larvae, but it's not certain how many. Some of the weevils have already pupated by now," he said. "If an insecticide had already been applied to the alfalfa for weevil control, producers should be aware of any residual insecticide in the alfalfa that may affect how it can be utilized," he said.

Improper biodiesel storage lets your profits evaporate

With the high cost of biodiesel fuel, every gallon counts. Improper storage of biodiesel could mean thousands of dollars disappearing into thin air, warns a University of Missouri professor of agricultural systems management.

"Biodiesel blends, like petroleum diesel fuels, should be kept in a clean, dry, dark environment," said Leon Schumacher. "As with any fuel, water must be prevented from entering the tank. Algae can also grow in biodiesel fuels just as it does in petroleum fuels."

Clean, inspect and repair your tank before filling with biodiesel fuel. Have older tanks cleaned professionally to remove particles and deposits that might contaminate the fuel supply, he said.

A single 300-gallon tank of biodiesel blend can lose up to 120 gallons each year due to evaporation. At today's prices, not taking steps to lessen evaporation can cost a farmer thousands of dollars a year.

Paint tanks white or aluminum to better reflect the sunlight. Place the tanks in an east-west orientation. Keep tanks shaded if allowed under local building and fire codes. This is especially important for tanks and containers constructed from polyethylene or polypropylene, which should be protected from sunlight.

Pressure-relief vacuum caps rather than conventional gas caps also will help reduce evaporation.

Inspect tanks regularly for material


decomposition. Some materials, including aluminum, tin and zinc, reduce the shelf life of biodiesel. Biodiesel will break down concrete, varnish and PVC tank linings, Schumacher said.


Pure biodiesel will readily dissolve rubber components in your tank's plumbing. Low-biodiesel blends reduce degradation of rubber, but there has been little research on the longterm effects of low-biodiesel blends on rubber components, he said.

During inspections, tighten components between the storage tank outlet and the pump. Check valve packings and look for nozzle seepage.

Be especially careful about inspecting underground storage tanks. Leaks can contaminate groundwater.

Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

Flavorful Gardening Means Herbs

Plants that add distinct flavor to our foods can be called herbs. My current favorite herb is cilantro in leaf which is also coriander when using the seeds. Cilantro is an annual herb that needs to be planted each year. In the garden, it will most likely seed itself and come back relatively in the same spot. If the seed gets spread, it could be everywhere in the garden.

For the most part, herbs are easy to grow. Give any plant the right growing conditions and you will be rewarded. The oils which are the flavor in an herb are produced in the greatest quantity when plants receive six to eight hours of full sunlight. Less light locations will still produce but their growth and quality will not be as good.

Your typical garden soil is likely adequate for herbs. Typical garden soil has a few inches of compost incorporated into it. The soil should drain so that the herbs roots are not constantly wet. Herbs won't need much extra fertilizer. Excessive fertilizer will produce an abundance of foliage which is generally poor in flavor.

Many herbs are destined for containers. Our cilantro is in a container on the deck so that I can easily harvest fresh leaves for salsa. A container that has drainage

holes filled with a potting mix is ideal. The container herbs can be moved indoors and used during the winter.


Some herbs will spread out pretty quickly. A container will help manage this pattern. They can still be put in the garden. Dig a hole for the container and plant to set them in. It isn't a perfect solution but can slow the spread.

Fennel is a great herb to have in your garden. Besides its cooking uses, it provides habitat for many beneficial insects. It likes full sun and will be a perennial for your garden.

Harvesting is fairly simple. For most herbs, you harvest the leaves. Collect dry leaves in the morning, rinse them with water and pat dry. Use them right away or dry them for storage in an airtight container.

Herbs are great plants to get you gardening. For more information, you will want a copy of the "Kansas Garden Guide" which includes herb and vegetable gardening. It is available from the Extension office for five dollars or can be downloaded from www.ksre.ksu.edu.

Smoke alarms should be checked regularly

A smoke alarm's distinctive chirp often is all it takes to remind a homeowner that it's time to replace the battery; like other appliances, however, the alarm also will need to be replaced periodically. A smoke alarm will typically have an eight- to 10-year life span, said Bruce Snead, Kansas State University Research and Extension residential energy specialist.

If an alarm is wired into the electrical system (with or without a battery back-up), a replacement should be installed by an electrician; if a battery-operated alarm, a homeowner often can install a replacement with tools such as a screwdriver.

Some newer models have adhesive backs and can be installed without tools. In installing the potentially life-saving alarms, Snead advises homeowners to read the manufacturer's instructions and follow them. It can be tempting to install an alarm within easy reach to simplify changing the batteries regularly, yet manufacturers typically recommend a ceiling installation because smoke and other gases naturally rise, he said.

He encourages homeowners to note the date of purchase on directions for a smoke alarm (and other appliances) before filing the information with other appliance and house-

Test the batteries in a smoke alarm each month and replace batteries once or twice a year and/or at the first sign (chirp-chirp) that they are no longer effective, Snead ad-

Reviewing a family's plan for escape in the event of a fire periodically also is recommended, said Snead, who encourages purchasing a fire extinguisher and learning how to use it, and installing a carbon monoxide detector in areas where gas appliances, such as a furnace or water heater are in use. Smoke alarms, fire extinguishers and carbon monoxide detectors are sold at hardware, home and discount stores.

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The Ag markets survived the financial turmoil rather well. It was kind of impressive really and makes you wonder what would happen if we had some really good news. It keeps me from wanting to be overly short at these levels, especially in the

Tuesday USDA releases the May supply and demand report, which is our first look at the new crop estimates. The guesses on new crop corn ending stocks range from 1.5 billion to 2.4 billion so there is no consensus on what USDA will do. USDA used an acreage estimate of 88.8 million in the Prospective Plantings report and the trend line yield is roughly 160 bu/ac. Using those figures, production would be below last year and slightly below 13 billion bushels and would likely result in a cut in ending stocks, which is sup-

portive to the market. However, due to the rapid planting pace there is a good chance that either the acreage, or yield estimate is increased, or there is a possibility that both are. Corn demand is also hard to peg, but new crop demand will likely be over 13 billion and a new record high.

It is possible that we will see an increase in the old crop export estimate since sales have been so good lately and that would be a big help to both the old crop and new crop ending stocks.

For the wheat, both old and new crop ending stocks estimates will be close to 1 billion. It is hard to imagine seeing any bullish wheat numbers next week.

Old crop soybean ending stocks could be decreased due to an increase in the export estimate, but I don't think that is a given this month. USDA may want to see if sales stay firm for another month. As for the new crop, plan on higher ending stocks. The range of guesses is from 200 million to 531 million, both of which are higher than the old crop.

The July corn made a new high for the move this week, but couldn't the gains and ended up 3 ½ cents lower for the week. The December contract lost 6 1/4 cents, so there was some bull spreading this week because of the strong export demand we have been seeing.

This week export sales came in at 1.85 MMT, which is a marketing year high and more than 3 times what we need to see each week. We have to watch the export market closely over the next month because if we maintain the current sales pace it implies USDA is way too low on the export estimate,

which, if true, will result in lower ending stocks estimates for both the old crop and new crop, which in turn increases the need for a trend line or better yield this year and increased acreage in 2011. When you already have record demand, it doesn't take much extra usage to change the stock levels from adequate to tight and a market from neutral to bullish.

Looking at the charts, the corn was lower this week, but the pattern for the past 6 weeks is still ways/higher. Buying breaks and selling rallies has been very successful because there has been no follow through in either direction for quite some time. Next week's USDA numbers could change that, so the market's reaction to the report will be very important.

The cattle market often suffers when the stock market does, but that wasn't the case this week. One really has to be impressed by the cattle market. The market was dominated by bull spreading most of the week and the June LC gained \$1.70. The beef market never faltered even with the stock market down all week.

Looking at the charts, I am concerned that the August FC are trying to roll over. It has been a long time since the market made new highs. Many technical indicators are giving sell signals. The trading action early next week will be critical. If the week starts of strong, then plan on new contract highs. However, if Thursday's lows are taken out, look for a move down to \$110.
