National Weather Service website features helpful information for farmers

profound impact on the 2010 Kansas wheat crop, with hail and straight line winds flattening fields in northern Kansas last week and severe thunderstorms and tornadoes racing across the landscape in southern Kansas. Meanwhile, the effects of a Mother's Day weekend cold snap on the wheat crop are still unknown.

Meteorologist Chance Hayes, with the National Weather Service from Wichita, says this year's severe storm season will likely be quite active, with tornadoes and hail posing significant problems throughout the state. Hayes, who manned a booth at the 3i Show May 5-7, says the combination of a wet winter and strong front systems could pack a powerful punch.

"We're anticipating that if those fronts continuing to be strong with that moisture still in place, we could have a very volatile severe weather season through May and June," he explains. "Once July gets here, hopefully we will get enough heat to squash most of those storms."

At his booth during his 3i Show, Hayes demonstrated some of the new features of the National Weather Service Web site, which are designed to help folks make crucial planning decisions based on more detailed weather information. Folks who log onto www.weather.gov may click on their area of the state to hone in on the home page of either the Topeka, Dodge City, Wichita or Hastings, Neb. weather service office, where local information is displayed.

Severe weather season has already had a Hayes encourages folks to click on the button called "the Weather Story," which focuses on the upcoming week in weather. "We create a graphic look at the most significant weather event for the next seven days," Hayes says. "Whether it's freezing weather when we're not supposed to have freezing temperatures, or a major outbreak for severe weather two, three or four days in advance, we're going to give people a heads up so they can start planning," he says. The traditional satellite and radar sweeps also are featured on that page, as is the "Top News of the Day," hourly weather recap and short- and long-term weather forecasts and severe weather warnings and

> Hayes says the NWS Web site isn't the only resource for people interested in the weather, however. A weather radio is still the most common source of severe weather information and should be in every Kansas household. Also, many radio and television stations offer text messages when severe weather is imminent. Folks also can subscribe to services from private companies who will make a personal phone call if their home is in a warning box.

> Still, for many farmers and ranchers who work outside on a daily basis, there is no substitute for experience.

> "There are many different things folks can utilize, but the best thing to me is to use your eyes. Use those eyes and if it doesn't look right, it probably isn't right and you need to go to safety," Hayes says.

Use local data for planting info

Recent reports from research in Nebraska, Indiana, etc... have supported early planted soybeans. This is in contrast to our traditional practice of corn first, then beans. It also helps us flower and fill stages during stressful times of the year.

Would early planting work here? Note first off that the Nebraska work was done under irrigation. Not quite what we see here. Iowa's data is from a dryland site indicating that soybeans planted in late-April to early May versus mid May yielded better 79% of the time (high yield environments favored).

Indiana research found much the same due to increased pods per unit area. Work in Kansas was done about 10 years ago during a period of generally low yields. In NE/NC Kansas, we are similar to other states. With yields up to 55 bu/A at Topeka, yields increased with planting dates in late April compared to May for Group III and IV vari-

eties. At Belleville, with yields up to 50 bu/acre, yields were generally unaffected by planting dates up to mid-May, but had a fairly sizable yield drop when planting in June. In a lower yield environment at Powhattan (less than 30 bu/acre), there was no advantage to planting any earlier than early May. East Central Kansas work also showed no evidence supporting earlier planting.

The bottom line — plant early if practical. Seed should be fungicide and insecticide treated and varieties with resistance to soybean cyst nematode and sudden death syndrome are preferred. Do not plant into wet soils or until soil temperatures are at least 50 degrees to avoid poor seedling vigor. Ultimately, weather patterns dictate soybean yields, especially under dryland conditions and that means there are no guarantees when it comes to soybean yields

Breakeven calculators put quality into the equation for educated decisions

Cattle enterprises are risky business. You can invest a year's input into one annual calf sale, or look into ownership in the growing and finishing phases. As market prices move up and down, you have to appreciate a new tool that calculates "breakeven," the threshold to profit.

Paul Dykstra, beef cattle

specialist with Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB), developed a calf price breakeven calculator to do just that.

"This tool helps you understand the market and make the tough calls on whether to accept a bid," he says. "It can also help you make an informed decision on whether to retain owner-

ship and finish your cattle."
Available at www.cab partners.com/facts/break even.php, the breakeven calculator is a spreadsheet that can establish a reference point for producers. But an accurate calculation can only be determined if users enter precise data.

"Numbers you plug in must be solid, either taken from herd history, futures markets or a feedlot manager who has records of similar calves with similar history," Dykstra says. "The more you can document similarities, the more accurate results."

The calculator begins with an ending price for fed cattle, projected from the Chicago Mercantile Exchange Live Cattle Futures. It works backwards to predict some aspects of how your calves will perform in the feedlot, accounting for input costs and the final premiums and discounts.

"All these factors interact in the educated – or calculat-

ed – guess at a breakeven price for the day when your calves would be sold," Dykstra explains.

This calculator is unique because it factors in the premiums and discounts associated with percent Prime, the Certified Angus Beef ® brand, Choice and lower quality grades, Yield Grades and carcass weights. It's easy to use for a technical tool: just hover the cursor to see instructions for each cell, or download the cell-by-cell guide.

"We didn't completely reinvent breakeven, but there are new features that are often overlooked, including freight charges and dressing percentages," Dykstra adds.

With enough detailed information, producers can decide whether to retain ownership or when to sell the calves after evaluating the input costs. And when the decision is based on more than a hunch, it can be a topic of discussion at the

bank

Knowledge is the key in deciding whether to hedge cattle, forward contract or wait to sell.

"The more you can educate yourself about your cattle, the better your prediction will be," Dykstra points out.

Herd history provides average daily gain, feed conversion and carcass quality. If those are unknown, feedlot managers or nutritionists can help find logical numbers from calves of similar genetics, weight, age and nutritional background.

When all the numbers are entered, the calculator shows cost of gain and breakeven. "If you're the seller, you might see that as a floor price," Dykstra notes. "On the other hand, a buyer might see breakeven as the ceiling. The market works because no two producers plug in the same numbers. One bidder may

walk away because the numbers don't work for him, while another may bid significantly higher and see room for profit."

And whether you are the calf buyer or have chosen to retain ownership, there's also a "fed- cattle price calculator" at the cabpartners.com site, and it works the same way. When evaluating the futures price for the probable harvest month, those who use this calculator can know their target floor.

Overall, these are userfriendly tools, Dykstra adds. "All the calculations are performed by the spreadsheets, leaving just the data collection and entering to the producer."

Buying or selling, "nobody wants to just break even," he allows. "But with quality cattle and a cultivated awareness of the market, these tools can help you cross that threshold and harvest some profit."

Landscaping, tips can have big impact on cooling costs of the home

Shade trees that shield the home from the summer sun can typically yield a savings on utility bills, said Bruce Snead, a Kansas State University Research and Extension residential energy specialist. Newer homes and neighborhoods may not have trees that have reached maturity that will allow them to provide relief from the summer heat. and sun, but homeowners can still take steps to reduce summer cooling costs, said Snead, who offered these tips: Clean or replace the filter in a heating and cooling system every three months. Check periodically to see that the condensate drain, which removes condensation water drawn from the air during the cooling process, has not become clogged by accumulated

rust or other debris. A clog may cause water to back up and damage nearby flooring or a ceiling of a lower level.

Install a programmable thermostat that allows heating and cooling systems to adjust the inside temperature to match a homeowner's needs and lifestyle. If the family is away during the day, the home need not be cooled to the same level during that time, but the thermostat can be set to begin cooling before the family arrives home. Check with the electric utility to see if they offer rebates on thermostats.

Keep the home closed up to reduce solar gain during intense heat; close shades and blinds during the hottest part. Install ceiling fans, which, although not cooling units, do circulate

the air and minimize stuffiness. To conserve more energy, turn off the fan when the room is not occupied.

Supplement hard-to-cool spots with a box fan or by installing a window air conditioner. Read the manufacturer's instructions and place the unit out of direct sunlight and preferably on the north or east side of the home. Look for and seal air leaks around windows, doors, ducts or construction (of the home) with appropriate materials, such as caulk. weatherstripping, minum foil tape or fiberglass tape with mastic for ducts, or other durable products. Follow the manufacturer's recommendations for safety and personal protection when installing or using these materials in and around the

home. Evaluate attic ventilation, and add soffit, ridge or gable end vents.

Check insulation levels. Add more if needed, according to U.S. Department of Energy region and climate recommendations. Rvalue recommendations can be found at http://www.ornl. gov/sci/roofs%2bwalls/insul ation/ins_16.html. "Monitor utility bills to check for an unexpected change that may reflect a loss of efficiency in a cooling system," Snead said.

Conference on managing rangelands coming

Using the theme "Shaping Public Perceptions" the tenets of grassland ecology and ranch management will be brought together by a diverse set of presenters including ranchers, said Tim Christian, coordinator for the Kansas Grazing Lands Coalition (KGLC).

KGLC is hosting the school for eastern Kansas at Camp White Memorial, Council Grove, in Morris County, Christian continued. Entitled "Principles of Rangeland Management, Grass and Animal Ecology in Kansas" the subject matter targets the Tallgrass prairie areas of east central and eastern Kansas. The school will run August 17-19, 2010.

The registration includes two nights

lodging, meals, and materials for \$300, and if a second or third person from the same outfit attends their fee is reduced to \$250. Deadline for registration the school is August 2. Space is limited to 35 participants, so early registration is advised.

Scholarships are available to most ranchers and eligible college students reducing the fee to \$150 per person, said Christian. Agency staffs may qualify for a \$100 scholarship. A simple scholarship form will be available soon on the KGLC web site www.kglc.org. The completed form must reach KGLC by July 19.

Interested landowners, operators, hired hands, outdoor enthusiasts, agency and organization staffs, and others will want to enroll. Topically, the agenda will combine rangeland ecology, wildlife considerations, and livestock management within the context of how the ranch community can showcase their resource stewardship and what they do to ranch sustainably and profitably, said Christian.

Presentations by area ranchers, university and agency staffs help reinforce the information and techniques attendees will be exposed to over the 3-day session.

Co-sponsoring entities for the schools at this time include the Natural Resources Conservation Service, Kansas State University Extension, Fort Hays State University, The Nature Conservancy, Playa Lakes Joint Venture, and the Kansas Section of the Society for Range Management.

KGLC was organized in 1991 and as a

non-profit its vision is regenerating Kansas Grazing Lands. The partnership meets its mission to regenerate Kansas grazing land resources through cooperative management, economics, ecology, production, education, and technical assistance programs through a variety of voluntary methods to reach landowners, ranchers, and other making decisions on grazing lands. Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Tuesday's supply and demand report confirmed that we have, and will continue to have, plenty of wheat even with this year's extremely low acreage level. Despite lower acreage, a lower yield estimate, and higher demand than last year, ending stocks are still expected to grow to nearly 1 billion bushels. There are basically only two things that can help the wheat market this year and that is either much better demand or a major problem with the corn

Old crop corn ending stocks came in below expectations at 1.738 billion due to a myriad of changes which included a cut in the production estimate and increases in ethanol usage and exports. The lower than expected old crop stocks estimate was friendly, but it was somewhat offset by the fact that USDA used a yield estimate on the new crop of 163.5 bu./ac.. which would be the 2nd highest ever and is above the "trend line yield." The high yield estimate, along with 88.8 million planted acres results in a record high production estimate. The USDA also predicts record high usage, but ending stocks climb to 1.818

Old crop soybean ending stocks were left unchanged at 190 million, but that will likely be cut next month since exports are still good. The new crop ending stocks came in at 365 million, which is way more than adequate. If exports and crush drop off as USDA expects, we will simply have too many soybeans on hand.

Wednesday morning the December corn was 13 cents higher for the week, but the gains didn't hold and it ended up being 6 cents lower for the week. The corn ran into "buy the rumor, sell the fact" type trade after it became apparent that the Chinese had bought a great deal of corn. Some traders were disappointed that some of the purchases were for the new crop year and farmers looked at the move up to nearly \$4.00 was a good place to make sales.

The markets failure to hold gains on Wednesday looked negative on the charts, which led to follow through weakness the rest of the week. The weakness in the crude oil and in the stock market didn't help matters either. The December contract eventually found support at the \$3.80 area Friday, which should hold the market if there isn't further weakness in the outside markets. The overall pattern in the corn is still sideways and at the moment, corn fundamentals alone are not enough to push the market out of the trading range, but further weakness in crude oil

and the stock market would

The July KW closed below the 50-day moving average and reached the lowest level since early April. The fundamentals of the market have been negative for a very long time, but the technical outlook has been supportive. This week the fundamentals won out and now the technicals look bearish too. For the week the July KW lost over 30 cents and it looks like there is at least another 20 cents of weakness ahead.

Thursday and Friday's weakness suggest we will see the July KW head to the March low near \$4.73 and more weakness is possible if the outside markets remain under pressure. Virtually all technical indicators are giving sell signals now, so traders will be using any rally as a selling opportunity.

The July soybeans traded sideways this week and lost 6 cents. Trend line support held and the market never took out last week's low. The soybeans are oversold and with the old crop demand still strong, it looks like the trend line should continue to hold in the July contract.

Export sales came in at 263,300 MT for the old crop and 211,100 MT for the new crop. Both of those numbers are good for this time of year. The old crop total is more than double what we need to see each week and USDA will almost certainly have to raise the export estimate in next month's report.

The problem with the soybean market is still the expected new crop stocks level. We are going to have too many new crop beans unless demand is much better than USDA expects or there is a severe production problem.

The financial markets seemed to take a heavy toll on the cattle market. Cash cattle traded at \$163 in Nebraska, but the futures failed to respond to that, which was the first negative sign. By Friday's close the futures were well below the 50-day moving average. The charts look negative now since a close below the 50-day moving average is often an indicator of a change in the long term trend.

Unless the June LC close back above \$94 on Monday, I will have to recommend making sales. A move down to \$91.80 looks likely in the short run. The close below the 50-day moving average in the feeder cattle is a good indication that it is time to take profits on call options and cow-calf producers should be looking to own puts. A strong recovery in the stock market would change all this, but for now

the market is beginning to look negative.





"Ensuring that our nation's land is returned to production using sustainable methods is critical not only for our future food supply, but also for the economic future of our rural communities," said Merrigan. "Access to land is one of the greatest challenges faced by new farmers. The Transition Incentives Program is one more tool in the USDA toolkit to protect family farms and support beginning and socially disadvantaged farmers."

Producers who want to apply for the TIP can start signing up on Monday, May 17, 2010. If all program requirements are met, TIP provides annual rental payments to the retiring farmer for up to two additional years after the date of the expiration of the CRP contract, provided the transition is not to a family member. To learn more about program, producers interested in applying and participating in TIP should visit their USDA Farm Agency (FSA) county office or www.fsa.usda.gov.

To be eligible, TIP requires that the retired or retiring farmer or rancher:

Have land enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) that is in the last year of the contract.

Agree to allow the beginning or socially disadvantaged farmer or rancher make conservation and land improvements.

Agree to sell, or have a contract to sell, or agree to long-term lease (a minimum of 5 years) the land under CRP contract to a beginning or socially disadvantaged farmer or rancher by Oct. 1 of the year the CRP contract expires.

Supporting local economies and providing opportunities for beginning or socially disadvantaged Americans with a desire to farm or ranch is one of the many ways the Obama Administration and USDA are working to rebuild and revitalize rural America.

Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

The Joy of Thinning Apricots

An attribute of gardening is its development for patience. In pursuit of instant everything, plants can be stubborn and take their own sweet time. If you are the gardener of such plant, perhaps patience will rub off. A world with more patience might actually be progress.

It was 35 years ago that a small whip of an apricot tree was planted in the soil. After

bouts of drought, grasshoppers and hailstorms it matured into a full grown tree. Each spring it would bloom beautifully putting an end to winter. Unfortunately, it would frost after bloom. The tree had never been allowed to set fruit. Not a one.

Now after 35 years it gets to produce the fruit from its many years of enduring Kansas's environment. Even

the gardener will get the opportunity to see if it was worth the wait. Even if the fruit are only average, they may be the best ever produced. Keep the hail, insects, diseases and wildlife away.

Not only are there fruit, but too many. Fruit trees often set more fruit than is practical for a tree to produce. It takes a lot of leaves to produce food for developing fruit and flower buds for next year's crop. Since you can't add leaves, we need to take away the number of fruit. This will leave fruit more suitable for eating.

Some estimates are that one fruit requires 40 to 60 leaves to develop a preferred size fruit. If you don't want to count leaves, the association is to space fruit 4 to 8 inches apart for most fruit tree crops. Apricots aren't as demanding and can be spaced 2 to 4 inches. Cherry trees are efficient and don't require thinning.

Fruit usually isn't evenly spaced along the stem. When there are gaps along the stem with no fruit, you can leave fruit closer spaced to com-

How To Sell a Horse 101

I've sold a few and bought a few over the years and I learned some things about horse trading. The main thing I learned is that I'm in the wrong business. I could have made more money if I had been a lawyer, plumber or maybe a politician. But then I can't see as how they enjoy life having to be inside all day so I'll stick with breeding, training and trading horses. Besides, I meet some interesting people at horse sales, some good, some bad but mostly good. There are also a few crooks in that gallery so I'm mighty careful when I strike up a conversation at a sale.

You won't get rich trading at auctions and sometimes you can get hurt in the pocket. To stay ahead of the game, you have to know what type of horse is selling well. Know the market. Sit through lots of sales and determine which horses

bring the best bids. For example, are they working ranch horses, barrel horses, pleasure or cutting horses? Cutting horses and barrel horses always seem to do well. Maybe that's because the good ones have the ability to win enough money in the show ring to make owning them profitched.

Good ranch horses only occasionally bring top dollar. That's a mystery. I've always wondered why a cowboy would pay \$40,000 for a new pick-up but balk at giving \$2,500 for a decent horse that will be his partner day in and day out. I'm thinking it may be a matter of pride in their ability to take a green or troublesome horse and turn it into a top notch mount. Those horses come cheaper and I can't fault that kind of thinking.

There are some people that do fairly well selling

horses and I have made a habit of watching and listening when they describe the animal they have put on the block. I'll share with you a bit of knowledge I've picked up over the years.

Reputation is everything. It will make or break you trying to sell horses. If you have misled people in the past, that misinformation will follow you from sale to sale. Discuss the good points and mention the bad. You don't have to go overboard talking about bad habits but let the buyer know they exist. You won't be trusted much if you sell a horse and the buyer finds out it has dangerous traits like bucking or rearing when he rides him. Don't sell dangerous horses unless you make the buyer fully aware of any problems the horse may have. If you don't, it will follow you forever and your reputation will be questionable.

Successful sellers point out all the good traits first. They mention any bad habits or possible health issues or lameness and then proceed to describe the horses' history. If he has winnings in the arena, they are sure to mention the dollar total. Maybe the horse is simply a pleasure horse suitable for kids or someone that just wants to trail ride. That's an asset and I've listened to them describe the horse's demeanor such as how he is solid on the trail with no

If your horse has good breeding and champion bloodlines are on his registration papers, you should have the papers handy to show them to all prospective buyers. Let the auctioneer know of the quality breeding and any specialties your horse or its sires and dams may have. Lots of people are looking for horses that have sires and dams known for producing outstanding horses in the discipline they are involved in. A grade horse is an unregistered horse of possible mixed breeds. It can also be a purebred horse that was never registered by previous owners. They don't usually bring as much as registered horses but can be just as good. Buyers that aren't interested in purebred papers know they can sometimes find a bargain in a well trained grade horse. If you have a good grade horse, don't be afraid to ask a fair price. Just because he's not registered doesn't mean you have to give him away. Savvy horsemen know a good horse when they see one and will pay a fair price whether he has papers or not. Let's look over a few of the most important ways you can better market your horse.

First off, the horse has to be in good shape. No ribs showing, shiny coat, good conformation and a finelooking head. Droopy ears, dull coats, coarse heads and underweight critters don't show well and won't bring top dollar or may not even sell. So, before you take your horse to a sale barn or place an ad in the paper, start a month or so before and give him plenty groceries if he needs them. Dig in your pocket and buy one of the coat supplements that will make your pony shine. Spend lots of time grooming and combing his mane and tale. Make him stand out.

Do it yourself or have a farrier shoe or trim his hooves. Have you ever seen the letters UTD listed on a horse for sale ad? It took me a while to figure it out but it means Up To Date. Give all the shots needed and worm the horse. Print out a record of all the shots and worming performed over the years if you know the dates and then you can also put down UTD on all shots and worming in your ad. It's a professional approach and will be recognized.

If your horse has any training issues such as poor reining, stopping or lead changes, use the time before a sale to give him a tune-up. Work on making him stand still for mounting. If he throws his head, ride him with a tie-down and try to cure the problem before riding him in the sale ring. Perhaps you know a trainer that could fine tune him before the sale. Appearance and training are everything. A good handle goes right along with a shiny coat.

If you've done your homework and you still can't sell him, cheer up. You'll be hauling home a better horse than you had before you decided to sell him and there's always another sale. You just might think about keeping him for yourself since he looks so much better now than he did when you first decided to sell him. 



A Real Barn-Burner

9:15 p.m. May 11, 2010. The wife and kids went to the store, and I was doing chores late. Then I went out to the highway to pick up the evening paper. But as I came back toward the house, I saw a strange light on the east end of the machine shed. I started toward the shed to see what it was, and then realized in horror: The machine shed was on FIRE!

Our farm yard has buildings arranged in the shape of a crescent moon, with a machine shed on one end, a granary in the middle, and a stone-and-wood barn on the other end. The granary and barn are old structures and are even listed on the National Register of Historic

The machine shed is also old, but not so distinguished. It's just an open-front, corrugated tin shed where we store our tractors, wagons, mowers, and various other implements.

Or perhaps I should say, that's where we used to store those things. On the night of May 11, our daughter had used the riding lawnmower to mow Grandma's lawn next door. When she was done, she put the mower away, as I have told our kids

to do. She backed the mower into the machine shed.

Unfortunately, there was some loose straw in the machine shed too. I'm guessing that the straw caught fire from the hot exhaust pipe of that mower, just like I've heard of pickup truck exhaust pipes setting fire to a field of straw. By the time we got to the machine shed, the east end was a roaring in-

A person has to make quick decisions in times of crisis. My cowboy smarts kicked in and I realized that a brand new tractor was sitting in that shed. In what was perhaps not exactly an Albert Einstein moment, I decided to go in after that tractor. I got it to start and started to pull it forward, but the heat became unbearable and I bailed out. In no time the flame roared across the entire structure.

The rural fire department came quickly, but the structure was engulfed in flames by the time they arrived. They saved the granary

and then pointed out that I had welts on my head and my nylon vest had melted in the back. My good cotton workshirt had protected me. But the shed and all the equipment were a total loss.

These are costly disasters.

We do have some insurance. But how does a guy replace the Super H Farmall tractor which my dad used since the 1950s? That's a piece of family history gone forever.

Still, I try to keep perspective for my kids. As the country song says, "This ain't nothin" compared to the real tragedies of life. Many families face much, much worse. And all our family was safe. It was a night we will always remem-



Grass & Grain, May 18, 2010 Checking conditions of stored grain can prevent problems

As spring weather warms things up, farmers should keep a keen eye on the health of their stored grain.

That attention could prevent a problem before it

"We recommend that farmers work to bring grain temperatures back to within 10 degrees of the average temperature this time of year," said Wayne Bailey, a University of Missouri Extension entomologist. "If you don't raise bin temperatures back up from standard winter temperatures, you have a cold grain mass sitting there and you'll get condensation inside the bin that will help grow mold that attracts insects."

Last fall's wet harvest created conditions favorable to storage molds.

"We did have higher levels of ear and kernel rots last fall," said Laura Sweets, a University of Missouri Extension plant pathologist. "Some corn was harvested at higher-than-recommended moisture contents, so there could very well be grain that has higher levels of fungal infection like penicillium. The wet fall delayed harvest and with input costs being high, farmers were reluctant to dry with propane, which may have led to highermoisture corn going into storage."

Signs of a growing mold problem include discolored kernels and grain that cakes together due to moisture. Penicillium and aspergillus molds are likely to cause the most damage.

"I'd be checking it every other week or at least monthly if there are concerns," Sweets said. "This year our warm weather didn't really come until April, but when we start spiking up into the 80s you should be out there looking at your bins."

"Out-of-condition grain will attract insects," Bailey said. "They'll smell it and come in if it's not treated."

The most common types of insect infestation include Indian meal moth and various types of granary and maize weevils.

"With Indian meal moth," Bailey said, "we look for webbing and an ooze underneath where the larvae develop. In really severe cases it can go down 12 inches. Granary and maize weevils tend to be in the grain mass. The best way to sample is to probe into the side of the bin with a piece of PVC pipe and put that sample in a glass jar to see if there are insects moving in it."

Fumigation and some in-

secticides can bring problems under control but at extra cost, and their effectiveness depends on the type of insect. Keeping grain at a proper temperature can stop these problems before they

"Farmers really have to make sure they change the temperature on the whole grain mass and not just run fans for a day or two," Bailey said. "Those fans need to be run long enough for the temperature change to travel all the way through the

Bailey noted that once insects infiltrate a bin, farmers need to move that grain.

"It's really tough to control a population of insects once you have it in a grain bin," he said. He recommends that farmers feed it out to cattle quickly, market it or move the grain to another bin and sanitize the infest-

Rural Life

What it means to belong to a community

What is a sense of community? How is it created? Why do some rural towns have a greater sense of community than others? Are rural towns losing their sense of community? Why? How can it be increased?

Some people think community is a type of joining with other people of like interests or circumstances the banking community, art community, bowling community or the "gay or lesbian" community. These are not true communities. These groups are factions of communities.

Community feeling happens when people come together for the good of the whole. People feel they belong to a community when there is a pattern of trust. cooperation and organization that benefits everyone. This type of intense relationship and mutual trust follows the lead of local leaders who are unselfish, visionary, inclusive and skillful at negotiations and developing consensus.

They have a history of

past successes in working together. It is a tradition. Looking at a town's history. you can identity a core group of leaders who started a tradition of civic responsibility. Their example educated a subsequent generation of leaders on how leadership is done well. They set a pattern of community cooperation and celebration.

It is grounded in the norms and beliefs of the community. "This is what we do. We have strong ties to each other. Our local organizations work together."

Rural places have an advantage when it comes to community. There is a greater density of relationships. People know one another and relate to each other in multiple settings and roles. They aren't segregated into interest or age groups. Community activities affect everyone. This is the great potential strength of rural communities. The whole is better than the sum

is a real resource. You can literally bank on it. The more you have of it, the better children do in school. As to rural development, it has more monetary consequences than natural resources, location of the interstate, community infrastructure or even the education of the populace.

This sense of community trust and willingness to interact and cooperate in solving community wide problems doesn't belong to any one person. It is embodied within the community. If you don't use it, you'll lose it. The more you use it, the more you have.

People learn civic responsibility in their families, churches and schools. Working with others to do good for the community creates good feelings. There is positive reinforcement for constructive behavior. People migrating from cities often are looking for the feeling of belonging to a community. The inclusive friendliness is a powerful attraction of rural communities.

The towns that don't have it have their leadership fractionated into separate groups. An example of this would be a town with five churches each going their separate ways versus a town with five churches who collaborate on proj-

Children feel it when they sense that the community is proud of them and their school. They can learn civic responsibility at school and collaborate on

projects for community betterment. Schools can be a centerpiece in cultivating a sense of community.

What forces detract from community?

An increase in rural commuting. Many people live in small towns and commute to other places for medical services, entertainment, supplies, shopping, work etc. Bedroom communities don't organize themselves around problems and goals. Geographic isolation helps keep community spirit alive.

The private world of television and electronic media. Many people attribute the decline of "neighboring" and community spirit to the arrival of television. Electronic neighbors replace real ones. This development has accelerated with DVD's, video games, the Internet, social media and people getting obsessed with "virtual reality" instead of real world relationships.

A reliance on national media instead of local media. People are more familiar and better informed about the White House than about their local court house. They borrow problems from elsewhere and assume these problems are going on in their own back yard. Young people grow up not knowing their place, their local history, their local economy or local issues.


Leadership development programs fill a key role by informing local leadership. Local leaders keep uptodate on what is happening and affecting them in their own backyard socially, economically and politically.

An avoidance of controversy and conflict. Rural people tend to put a constant restraint on their willingness to take risks. They have to weigh carefully

Polarization on issues, whether national or local, destroys the willingness to look for solutions that respect differences.

Community spirit and responsibility are what makes rural communities special. How does your community stack up? Do you feel like you belong?



Time and money

Cutting back, lowering inputs, pinching penniesthey've all become catch phrases, a result of the recent recession. But before you tighten the belt on your cowherd or scale back on management, health or nutrition, be sure to weigh the impact.

Being cost conscious pays in any economic climate, but you can only cut so much across the board before you cause harm. The secret is to get the most out of all inputs.

Efficiency boils down to curtailing waste. That often means less feed or labor in some area of your operation, since those are two big inputs. Savings there equals fewer dollars down the drain.

The first step to reaching peak performance is tracking where you've been. If you don't have production numbers it's hard to make comparisons or data-driven decisions. You don't need to make a complicated recordkeeping system, just make sure it includes all the variables that make a difference. Calving percentages, sale weights and health programs

are a place to start. As you build on this, individual identification can help with culling decisions, bull buying and even marketing.

That may seem like an unnecessary expenditure of time, but long-term it'll help you set goals and prioritize. You can focus on the most significant places to make improvements, saving time and headaches later.

Tightening your calving season might help inch up the efficiency. By paring down the number of days spent in that hectic period of sleep-deprived high-alert time, you can spend the rest of the months completely centered on other aspects of your cattle business. It'll probably provide extra income, too, because the more uniform the group, the higher price they'll fetch at the sale barn.

As you're gathering calves or keeping those long summer hours in the hayfield, seize each moment by thinking of ways to achieve greater efficiency. (That multi-tasking in itself will help.) Workable ideas will vary from ranch to ranch. Could you invest in equipment or facilities to save time and effort? Maybe you need to be more proactive in your health program so less work and money are spent treating sick calves.

Walk through your entire production calendar. How much time do you spend bull shopping? Do your homework ahead of time. Study EPDs (expected progeny differences) and cow families; then try to amass a list of favorite sires before you mark the sale catalogs and head out to bid. Being prepared could encourage you make selections that are a better fit for your herd. It also helps curb impulse purchases that could cause problems for years to come.

What is your grazing situation like? If you move up weaning, maybe you'd save a little grass for your cows and push winter feeding later. Or possibly you're in the land of expansive pastures and your cattle aren't utilizing every nook and cranny. Could you install waterers or a dividing fence to entice them?

There are dozens of questions you can ask yourself about the efficiency of every aspect of your farm or ranch. So ask them, find answers and then act.

The buzz these days is all about spending less. Sometimes there is nowhere left to cut spending without cutting your future, so work at getting more for your time and money.

Think of it as stretching your dollar.

Stika honored as KSU young alumnus

As the first brand of fresh beef and category leader today, Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB) must maintain a focus on excellence. John Stika, CAB president since 2006, has led a staff of 100 to realize the brand's potential for consumers and cattlemen alike.

The Lincolnville, native and Kansas State University meat science graduate (1993, MS '98; PhD Kentucky '03), was named 2010 Outstanding Young Alumnus at the K-State Agricultural Alumni Awards Banquet on Saturday, May 8, as part of the "Wild 4 Ag Weekend."

Stika traveled from company headquarters in Wooster, Ohio, arriving a couple of days ahead to address the K-State animal science faculty, including several who once taught him. On "Building and Managing a Brand in the U.S. Beef Industry," he noted that CAB owns nothing else, so its strategy is to add value to that brand, build equity in it and make it more relevant.

In the face of unemployment at a 25-year high, with most consumers eating out less and 37% budgeting retail purchases more closely, 76% still say they are not willing to compromise on food quality, Stika noted.

"Consumer spending is based on a price/value relationship," he pointed out. "Beef costs more than other proteins, and CAB costs more than most beef, but a 2009 study showed demand for CAB outpaced commodity Choice. That suggests brand resilience."

The study showed that CAB sales have added half a billion dollars to the beef industry since 2005, compared to selling as com-

"To be successful a brand must address a basic need, deliver on an expectation, offer value and be available," Stika said. In this case, the need is food with an expectation of taste at a premium price.

CAB, a brand developed on the idea that consumers choose beef for its taste, is produced in 28 plants with access to 85% of the fed beef in North America, he added. Moreover, the percent of black-hided cattle in those numbers continually rises, moving from less than 30% in the 1980s to a projected 63% this year.

"We qualified 1.8 million cattle in 2006, and it will be 3.3 million this year, or 750 million pounds sold," Stika noted. Most of that is retail, 51.5%, but foodservice sales are also bouncing back.

Stika said the real growth needs to come from international sales, which currently represent 10.4% of the brand's total. To move to a billion pounds sold annually, as the company projects by 2020, those export sales need to grow to a 25% share. With opportunities to grow in Canada and Mexico, as well as the Middle East and Asian markets, annual consumer sales should soon reach \$3 billion annually.

Ten years ago, less than 5% of U.S. beef sold as branded. Now, more than 25% of beef from fed cattle carries a brand, including 84 USDA-certified programs, 61 of them Angus. CAB has a 97% market share of the high-quality Angus market, Stika noted.

Building the CAB brand entails continuing education from the producer level through end users and consumers, using effective communications and strategic partnerships.

Stika named six "valuable perspectives" that he said college graduates should keep in mind to be strong candidates for a career in beef marketing and reaching consumers

Technical, biological, economical, social, culinary and marketing points of view must be merged into a balance to connect with consumers and partners.

We must keep in mind that relevance is not what we say it is, but what the consumer says it is," Stika added.

In the university arena, Stika served as the assistant meats judging coach at K-State and head livestock judging team coach for three years at Kentucky. As a graduate student, he taught a variety of undergraduate classes on livestock selection, function and evaluation.

The Animal Science Department's nomination for the award said, "From his early involvement in the meat business to his current role in leading CAB, Stika has shown the vision and ingenuity to face future challenges, and the practicality to take steps one at a
