How city-raised women adjust to rural life

Can a city-raised woman be happy in the country? Of course she can!

All it takes is four or five years of apprenticeship in a strange environment where:

She is removed from her own family.

She lives in a different culture: Minnesota Nice.

She is part of a family business where expectations and ways of doing things are strong.

She lives with a husband who puts in long hours and can justify every one of them.

She has to budget household and family living expenses based on variable paydays with prices for farm products being set by outside forces.

She is expected to fit in and do everything right with a husband who may or may not be a patient teacher.

During this time, she is to hold her own with her husband, be an equal partner and to be treated with re-

spect. Maybe she'll start a family and care for little ones while proving she is a good farm partner.

Suppose she comes from a loving family where the husband/father is home and relaxed in the evenings and weekends – her expectations couldn't be more different of what a father and husband should be doing.

Worse yet, suppose she comes from a "dysfunctional" family and she brings her own problems, needs, hangups or strong expectations into the marriage. Suppose her husband's family has extreme personalities and is a little dysfunctional too. Suppose she is careeroriented and can't find a job in her job-scarce rural community.

Sounds a little crazy doesn't it? Yet women do it all the time.

How do they do it? What are the key adjustments they have to make? How do their husbands help or hinder the

process? Is the mother-inlaw is helpful — or critical? How do new farm wives learn to set boundaries around their marriage and family life without offending anyone? How do they learn about farming and the rural lifestyle?

You won't find the answers spelled out in bridal books, so I'll take the liberty to emphasize a few points.

- 1. All these adjustments and difficult times are normal. It takes time. Many city-raised women have been down this path and have learned to love their new life, the rural lifestyle, their new in-laws, the open spaces and the new rhythm and rationale of things.
- 2. A crucial factor in adjusting is having a support system that patiently educates while accepting the newcomer. The local culture and rural mentality need to be explained. Family dynamics need to be figured

out. Skills on the farm need to be learned.

Husbands, mothers-inlaw, and other city-raised farm women can play a positive role in easing the transition. "Dumb" questions need to be asked in an atmosphere of patience and acceptance while keeping up wants this too. a semblance of self-confidence. Women in this position often walk a tightrope of being assertive and selfconfident, yet being humble

Sort out the chaff of strong male prerogatives and entitlement from the reality of farming. Learn to know when these guys are blowing smoke so they can get their way - or when they are right and you have to adjust.

- 3. City-raised women need to demand courtesy and consideration in a rushed and occasionally tense environment - even when they don't know what is going on. Offending spouses and in-laws need to rein in their temper problems. Communication skills that eliminate harshness and criticism will keep things positive.
- 4. Primary loyalty and partnership with the hus-

band are crucial. The farm couple needs to be a working team and not let the newcomer status or other family members drive a wedge between them. It's all about boundaries — good healthy boundaries. It helps when the husband understands and

5. City-raised women often learn the hard way that the people in the local community are intimately connected - if not related to each other. Anonymity was left behind in the city. Welcome to life in the fish bowl.

Comments and attitudes will be scrutinized. Criticisms not meant to be for public consumption will often get back to the party being talked about. Part of living a rural community is knowing how and when to keep your mouth shut. Spontaneous and expressive people will have more trouble. A few truly confidential relationships will provide needed emotional outlets.

6. A new farm-wife needs to learn to do her part and pitch in with community affairs and volunteer activities. This is a give-and-take society. There are many social expectations. A newcomer who expects a lot of leisure or time for specialized interests will find her personal time encroached on by the community.

City-raised women have to adjust and find balance in their lives by learning to say yes and by learning how and when to say no. Again it is about healthy boundaries this time between the self, family, and the community.

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The stock market fell to a new low for the year last Tuesday, but made a strong bounce back to close only slightly lower for the week. The rally back stalled out at the 50% retracement of the move down in the June S and P futures, which suggests we may see a retest of the lows. It was nearly the same scenario in the crude oil which fell to new lows for the year on Tuesday and but closed Friday nearly \$4.00 higher for the week. However, Friday's rally stalled out at the 38% retracement of the move higher, which suggests we could easily see a retest of the

lows. If we do retest the report. There is a good lows and the support holds, it will be a very good buying opportunity, so watch for that chance next week.

The corn market spent most of the week trading sideways/higher, but followed the stock market lower on Friday and gave up all of the week's gains. The corn is still stuck in the same sideways trading pattern it has been in for over 2 months. Demand is good, which supports the market on breaks. USDA will have to increase the export estimate, and possibly the ethanol usage estimate in the next supply and demand

chance the old crop ending stocks are cut by 100 million bushels. On the other hand, traders are concerned about the rising crop condition ratings and the possibility of another record high yield, which would keep new crop stocks at comfortable levels. Weather will be critical this year, as usual, and right now traders are comfortable with the start to the crop year. Looking ahead, a break to the \$3.75 level in the December contract is likely, but that level should hold. There is still too much uncertainty for a move below

that in the short run.

The July KW tested the \$5.00 area 3 times this week and failed each time. There is too much wheat and too poor of a basis level for the wheat to sustain any sort of rally. Until we see a major improvement in demand, there isn't any reason to expect to see the wheat do anything other than trade sideways to lower. Rallies are your chance to sell call options. Collect the premium and if the wheat does happen to rally, sell your wheat if it reaches your strike price.

I have been expecting to see the July KW reach the \$4.73 area for a while now and next week could finally

be the time it happens. The market made new lows for the move this week. It made three failed rally attempts and I think that if there is any negative news next week the wheat will move sharply lower. If the March lows don't hold as support, then we will have to look for a move to \$4.50 as harvest activity increases.

The July soybeans moved through trend line resistance on Thursday, but failed to follow through on Friday. The market is basically sideways as traders try to balance the strong old crop demand with the large new crop supplies and the volatility in the outside markets. USDA is probably still

mate and the old crop ending stocks are probably too high. I look for the June supply and demand numbers to be friendly to the old crop, but it is hard to get a sustained rally when there is so much potential for large new crop stocks. For new crop price protection, something to consider is to sell 3 of the November soybean \$8.00 puts, and then on a rally buy 1 \$9.00 put and sell 1 \$10.00 call. It is a good idea to have downside protection in the market, but near the money put options are too expensive to be practical, but at the same time it is unlikely that the market falls below \$8.00.

Selling a call is a good way to help pay for your put, and if the market does move to \$10, price your soybeans and exit the positions.

Live cattle futures basically chased the stock market around. August LC made new lows for the move on Tuesday, bounced back Wednesday and Thursday, then went lower on Friday. Technical indicators are oversold, but it looks like the August LC want to move down to the \$88.00 level before turning around. Supply fundamentals are still friendly, but in the short run traders seem to be more concerned with the stock market.

The August feeder cattle reached the 50% retracement of the entire move up on Tuesday and spent the rest of the week consolidating just above the support. We will probably see at least one more test of the lows and if they hold through this week, one should consider owning August feeder cattle calls.



High-tech method developed to classify soil types

A University of Missouri doctoral student has developed a technique that uses digital imaging of soil samples to take some of the guesswork out of wetland identification.

Identifying wetlands isn't always easy. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' manual on wetlands identification is 143 pages long. Land that is wet isn't necessarily a wetland, and some wetlands aren't always wet. One important tool is looking at the soil for colors and patterns characteristic of frequent and prolonged saturation, said Kevin O'Donnell, a doctoral student in soil science at MU.

Chronic saturation changes a soil's structure and chemical composition and affects the types of microorganisms it harbors. These changes determine the colors and other visible features of soil. Soil scientists use those features to identify what they call "hydric soils."

A trusty companion of soil scientists in the field is a small loose-leaf binder holding a set of "Munsell Soil Color Charts," which contains 238 color chips and

"There's a lot of room for error," O'Donnell said. Cloud cover, time of day and many other factors can affect perception of a soil's appearance. Experienced soil scientists learn to take this into account, but even seasoned pros might come to different conclusions about a given sample.

"You're dealing with ju-

large areas and determine sample's dominant colors in land use based on color and other attributes. "Why not use that technology on a smaller scale?"

He decided to bring soil samples to the laboratory and photograph them under controlled conditions.

For advice on photo equipment. O'Donnell sought out David Rees, chair of photojournalism at MU. O'Donnell procured a Nikon D80 camera, a 60mm f/2.8 macro lens and a pair of lens-mounted flashes to provide uniform, consistent lighting. His equipment purchases were funded in part by a scholarship named in honor of the late C.E. Marshall, an MU soil scientist and, as it turned out, the father-in-law of David Rees.

O'Donnell calibrated the software by photographing a brand-new set of Munsell color charts.

"I didn't know if this was going to work," O'Donnell

recalled. The goal was to precisely quantify a soil



Webinar to look at animal agriculture's role in climate change

University of California-Davis associate professor and air quality specialist Frank Mitloehner traces much of the public confusion over meat and milk's role in climate change to two sentences in a 2006 United Nations report, titled "Livestock's Long Shad-

Printed only in the report's executive summary and nowhere in the body of the report, the sentences read: "The livestock sector is a major player, responsible for 18 percent of greenhouse gas emissions measured in CO2e (carbon dioxide equivalents). This is a higher share than transport."

Those statements are not accurate, Mitloehner said, yet their wide distribution has put Americans and others on the wrong path toward solutions. Leading authorities agree that, in the United States, raising cattle and pigs for food accounts for about 3 percent of all greenhouse gas emissions, while transportation creates an estimated 26 percent, he added.

Mitloehner will present his views June 11 in a free webinar "Animal Ag's Role in Greenhouse Gas Production: A Closer Look." Rick Stowell, University of Nebraska Extension specialist focusing on air quality in animal agriculture, is the moderator. The presentation begins at 1:30 p.m. Central Time.

Safety necessary when handling breeding livestock

As breeding season rolls around, Kansas State University's Chris Reinhardt wants to remind cattle producers to take extra care when working with cattle, especially bulls.

'Hand-raised bulls do not have the same timidity of humans as those raised by their dam," said Reinhardt, who is a feedlot specialist with K-State Research and Extension. "These bulls view humans as their equal and constantly have the potential to become aggressive toward their handler."

He also encourages producers to take the time to inspect and repair their working facilities, noting that the same facilities that handled last season's calves through weaning may be sufficiently worn enough that larger, stronger, and more aggressive

bulls may push the system beyond its limits.

"An extra day of maintenance could prove a great investment if human or animal injury is prevented and the time and inconvenience of escaped bulls is avoided," Reinhardt said.

He encourages producers to take their own age into account when working with mature cattle: "As the body ages, several things happen. Response time slows, vision diminishes. and healing time is extended. At 18 the body is still nimble enough to dash out of harm's way; with advancing age, the need to plan for, avoid, and prevent dangerous situations increases. A mishap at 18 or 20 resulting in a muscle pull, a sprain, or even a broken bone will heal more rapidly and permanently than the same in-

Help for predicting head scab available

In addition to the leaf rust and stripe rust that Kansas wheat producers are watching for this year, Fusarium head scab is another disease that could pose a risk if frequent rains continue to soak wheat fields.

A disease prediction system is available to help farmers evaluate the risk of Fusarium head scab in their area, said Erick DeWolf, plant pathologist with K-State Research and Extension. The system summarizes the weather conditions over the last seven days and provides a daily estimate of risk. The risk of disease is presented in a map-based format where colors represent the chance of a scab epidemic (green = low risk, yellow = moderate and red = high risk).

"The risk of disease appears to be low at the current time in Kansas, but conditions may change rapidly if frequent rains continue," DeWolf said.

Selection of an appropriate fungicide is important. The fungicides in the strobilurin class are not recommended for control of head scab. The triazole fungicides Folicur (and generic tebuconazole), Prosaro, Proline, and Caramba are available for use in Kansas and can help suppress disease development by 40 to 60 percent, DeWolf said.

New tool will help track prairie burning, could improve air quality predictions

When farmers and ranchers burn grassland each spring, it's difficult to track just how much grass is burned and the impact of that smoke.

That's why Rhett Mohler, a Kansas State University doctoral student in geography, Wakeeney, is developing a new technique to accurately track the burning of tallgrass prairie in Kansas and Oklahoma. Mohler's project also could enable the modeling of smoke plumes. which could help predict the effects of burning's byproducts downwind.

To map the burned areas Mohler will use data and images from satellite systems — including the Thematic Mapper and NASA's Moderate Resolution Imaging Spectroradiometer sensors — and combine that with information he gathers using sensors on the ground. By combining these techniques, he'll develop a set of criteria that can accurately detect what kind of ground cover is in an area, whether it's been burned and how recently. By integrating historical images, Mohler will build a set of maps dating back to 2000.

"What we'll have is a retrospective for each burn that is large enough to detect, information on when it happened, where and how much grass actually got burned," said Douglas Goodin, K-State professor of geography and Mohler's adviser.

The study will contribute to a broader body of knowledge by examining and mapping the burning of tallgrass, which is a lessstudied cover type.

Each spring, farmers and ranchers in the Midwest burn their pastures in an effort to clear dead plant material and encourage new growth. But the resulting smoke sometimes raises questions about the trade-offs between air quality and land management.

Some have made the argument that burning in rural areas is responsible for increased air pollution in more urban areas.

"In order to estimate how the effects are going to play out in Wichita, Kansas City, Omaha, Neb., maybe Tulsa, Okla., and even farther, we need to know how much area is burned every year, or at least be able to make an informed estimate," Mohler said. "Mapping the burns is the best way to try and figure that out."

After Mohler's mapping technique is refined, Goodin said they'll look at spikes in air quality data to determine whether spring burns add to pollution in cities.

"This project will look at air quality in certain urban airsheds and see if there is a correlation be-

tween burn events and increases in certain air quality indicators," Goodin said.

The technique could provide scientific data critical to building relationships between stakeholders, according to Goodin.

"This research will ensure that partnerships are built between researchers, extension personnel and local ranchers," he said. "This relationship will be vital if the tallgrass prairie is to be managed based on sound scientific knowledge for the benefit of all involved."

Mohler's research is supported by a National Science Foundation Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement grant.

Tour to highlight role of conservation measures

Conservation can be beautiful — literally.

Kansans will see that fact for themselves June 5 from 9 a.m. to noon during a comeand-go Wildflower Tour in southeast Russell County. The site will be the Dubuque Land and Cattle Company, much of which the farm's owners will donate to Pheasants Forever over the next five years.

"The biodiversity of plants there is truly exceptional. Dubuque's gently rolling hills combine almost 1,600 acres of range, CRP (Conservation and Reserve Program), and crop lands. They're home to hundreds of wildflower and native grass species," said Stacie Minson, area watershed specialist with Kansas State University Research and Extension.

Take-home packets of Kansas wildflower seed, bottled water, and handouts on wildflowers and other native plants will be available at the tour site. Local experts will serve as guides in identifying the wildflowers and native grasses present - rain

"Wildflowers are pretty, but they also can play an important role in protecting water quality. As part of healthy rangeland and pastures, for example, their root zones slow down, use and filter storm water runoff. As part of the home landscape, wildflowers do the same plus conserve water by limiting the need for irrigation," Minson said.

The free tour is the fourth in an annual series. Its organizers are the citizen-led advisory group for the Kansas watershed known as Big Creek-Middle Smoky Hill River. A member of that group, retired U.S. Army Col. Wallace Weber, is the third generation of his family to run the Dubuque Land and Cattle Company.

"This tour has proven to be a great way to learn which wildflowers can be used in a home landscape or pasture setting. Being out where the wildflowers grow is a great way to learn about the history of the Kansas landscape and about humans' relationships with native plants, past and present," Minson said.

Col. Weber has been a lifelong sportsman and conservationist. So, in addition to being an agricultural enterprise, the Dubuque Land and Cattle Company now offers guided hunting for pheasant, duck, coyote, rabbit and deer. And, it requires "green" shotgun shells (shotshells).

In recent years, Col. Weber has been working with his sister, Cheryl, and with Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks advisors to make his family's farm a future field-test and demonstration area. His goal is promote the best combined practices in rangeland and wildlife management, as well as soil and water conservation.

When complete, the Weber family's land donation will be the largest in Pheasants Forever history. The remainder of Col. Weber's estate will go into a charitable trust to cover the land's management ex-



Yard & Garden Tips By Gregg Eyestone

Growing Annual Flowers

The off and on wet weather has delayed planting of some vegetables and flowers. Quick establishment of these plants sets up an easy growing season. They will reward the grower well. Flowers can be planted from seed or as young plants. These transplants are most often used for designed flower beds. Young plants benefit from a mild fertilizer application at transplanting. Make a solution of phosphorus fertilizer to put around the transplants. This will get the plants off to a quick start. Read and follow the fertilizer product's instructions. Weeds will be an issue until the flowers fill in. The weeds can be cut off at ground level with a cultivator. A preemergent herbicide can be applied before weeds sprout. Read and follow the product label.

In general, it can be applied three days after transplanting without intervening with establishment of the flowers. Remove the first flush of flowers. This

may sound silly but it is the it promotes weeds, dissame principle as pinching chrysanthemums until July. Removing the top portion of the plant will stimulate it to branch. More branching equals more flowers in the long run. Branching also will make a wider plant that will choke out weeds.

Once established, fertilize with nitrogen until frost. A little bit of nitrogen fertilizer throughout the growing season will keep the flowers blooming. There is several nitrogen fertilizing options. You can choose a slow release fertilizer and apply it a couple of times a year. Water-soluble fertilizers are added to water and applied when irrigating. A combination of liquid and dry fertilizer can be used. It doesn't require a lot of nitrogen fertilizer but some through out the growing season.

Plants need water. If natural rainfall doesn't supply adequate water, the flowers will benefit from irrigation. Plants will tolerate watering everyday but

eases and insects. Established flowers in the ground can get by with an inch of water per week applied in one day. Use a layer of mulch and the flowers will be quite happy and reward you with plenty of blooms. The use of mulch and only watering once a week will grow a healthy flower and reduce the weeds, diseases and in-

eaders ask for comments on Kansas tree resources by June 4

The Kansas Forest Service is seeking public comments by June 4 on a plan that will target its efforts during a future expected to bring pressures on and threats to the state's forestrelated resources.

The finalized plan must reach the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture by June 18.

'Ideas and opinions from the public are probably more important in Kansas than in any other state. That's why we looking for individual written comments, submitted to us directly by mail or e-mail," said Bob Atchison, KFS rural forestry program coordinator.

The nation's ongoing economic woes are just one force driving the strategic change, Atchison explained. The Kansas plan also must address a rather unusual fact: The state's forested land exceeds 5.2 million acres, at least 95 percent of which is privately owned. And, well

over half of this private property occurs in scattered small holdings, affected by widely differing factors.

"This really raises the difficulty in figuring how best to target funds and resources," he said. "To fulfill our mission, the Kansas Forest Service must help produce the highest returns possible — in terms of ecological, social and economic benefits — from the state's diverse forest and agroforestry resources."

The KFS's proposed plan includes a changed approach for identifying forest areas at risk. It also covers Kansas' participation in the Forest Legacy Program — a new, voluntary federal effort designed to protect private forestland by purchasing development rights (through conservation easements).

Atchison said the state's citizen-owned forest includes some large areas devoted simply to trees.

But, it also includes the he warned. The 1,000 riparian trees that preserve and protect Kansas water quality. It includes the carefully sited windbreaks that help to reduce the state's ongoing soil erosion and other wind-related losses. It includes urban trees that improve the quality of life in 631 Kansas communities, more than 100 of which have earned the title Tree City USA

"That's complicated enough. At the same time, though, we've got invasive and often disease-carrying tree pests up to our eastern and western borders. Others are already here," Atchison said. "So far, education and proactive management are our best protection. These invasives are bringing problems without cures - as the European elm bark beetle did in the past with Dutch elm disease."

The threat identified most recently could be the worst, cankers disease wiping out black walnuts from California to Colorado is simply killing well-loved ornamental and shade trees.

If it makes its way into Kansas, however, 1,000 cankers could also decimate the state's nut and lumber industries. In turn, the disease could enter the nation's major walnut production areas, which extend from eastern Kansas to the East Coast.

"Added to that, Kansas has been losing forest and agroforestry land since World War I ushered in fencerow-to-fencerow agriculture. We've seen ebbs and flows in inventory since then. The Dust Bowl, for example, was a hard lesson that led to a big rise in tree plantings," he said. "Modern conservation efforts have played

a part, too, but so has urban sprawl. Today, we're seeing a rapid increase in converting woodlands to non-forest uses."
