



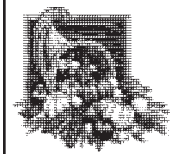

13th annual youth and women pheasant hunt Dec. 18-19 at Glen Elder

On Dec. 18-19, the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP) and Pass It On - Outdoor Mentors, Inc., will sponsor their annual pheasant hunt for youth and women at Glen Elder Reservoir. The event will begin early on both Saturday and Sunday mornings with a hunter breakfast followed

by a pre-hunt safety meeting. Groups of hunters, guides, and mentors will then go to various areas around Glen Elder Reservoir and hunt until noon. A noon meal will also be provided for hunt participants each day.

Women of any age and youth ages 11 through 16 are eligible for this hunt, which is geared toward providing a comfortable and positive hunting environment for new or inexperienced hunters. Previous hunting experience is not required, and some shotguns and ammunition will be provided to applicants who do not have access to their own equipment.

A free trap shoot will be offered on Saturday afternoon from 1:30 p.m. to 4 p.m. west of the Glen Elder Area Office. While designed for new and beginning shooters, the shoot will be open to anyone.

One highlight of this event is that each group will hunt pheasants with a military veteran and celebrity. This guest list is currently being developed, but these individuals may be former athletes, TV personalities, or servicemen and women have recently returned from deployment.

For more information and applications, phone the Glen Elder Area Office at 785-545-3345 (8 a.m.-4:30 p.m. weekdays) by Friday, Dec. 10. Forty applicants will be selected to participate in one of the morning hunts.

Red Angus Juniors offer leadership training in Denver

The National Junior Red Angus Association (JRA) is hosting the "Loaded 4 Leadership" conference Thursday, Jan. 6 and Friday, Jan. 7 at the Doubletree Hotel, Denver, Colo. All JRA members are eligible to enroll and improve their leadership skills.

The conference will kick-off with motivational speaker and Red Angus seedstock supplier Lee Leachman, Leachman Cattle of Colorado, Wellington, Colo.

Attendees will then train with National Cattlemen's Beef Association's Darin Williams in the "Masters of Beef Advocacy" (MBA) Program. This hands-on training prepares graduates to deliver a positive agriculture message to media, classrooms and their peers. Terry Engle of Colorado State Extension will address livestock ethics and producer responsibilities, and Blake Angell of Meyer Natural Angus (MNA) will explain MNA's humane certification program and how it ties in with consumer acceptance of their product. Juniors will have the opportunity to participate in hands-on ethics activities.

Kim Coley of Birmingham, Iowa, will inspire and motivate attendees as she discusses her involvement in the Farm Bureau Ag Leaders program, lobbying efforts and the importance of being an agriculture activist. The JRA board will work with conference attendees on public speaking, team building and other leadership skills that will tie in with their MBA training.

"We are excited to offer this caliber of leadership training to our junior members," said Dawn Bernhard, JRA programs coordinator. "What they learn at 'Loaded 4 Leadership' will prepare them to be the next generation of beef producers."

The "Loaded 4 Leadership" conference is held prior to the Red Angus events at the National Western Stock Show. In order to accommodate juniors who are showing cattle at the junior national show, the conference will run from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. MST to allow them time to take care of their cattle. A noon meal and snacks will be provided each day. Registration cost is \$50 per person and the deadline is Dec. 1. A \$25 late fee will apply for applications received after Dec. 1. Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Last week held more corrective action for a number of commodity markets. Talk that the Chinese are working to slow their economy was the main downward force in the marketplace. The idea being that if the Chinese slow their economic growth it will weaken demand for raw materials. The Chinese are also releasing large quantities of grain and vegetable oil from their strategic reserves in order to slow food inflation. The release of the reserves lessens the quantities needed in the short run, but in the long run it tells us that they will eventually need to import more food products. It is still easy to make a bullish case for American ag products.

The December corn lost 13 ¼ cents last week. It seemed worse than it really was, I guess. We had two up days, two down days, and one near unchanged, but the down days happened to be bigger than the positive ones. The outside day down on Friday suggests that we

will see a test of Wednesday's low next week. It is very important from a technical trading standpoint that the corn holds above Wednesday's low. I still think that the long term fundamentals of the market will take the corn to new highs, but in the short run, if technical traders see another support level fail, we will see the December corn move down to \$4.87.

Corn export sales were disappointing again at only 533,700 MT. It would certainly help the market if the sales pace would pick up, but it is important to note that the early sales pace has been relatively slow for 3 consecutive years now. Last year in particular the sales pace made a great rebound the second half of the year, so hopefully we see something similar this year. At the current pace it will be very tempting for the USDA to lower the export estimate in the January supply and demand report. An important side note is that DDG exports are very strong

thanks to the Chinese. The Chinese may not be buying large quantities of our corn, but DDG's are a completely different story.

Wheat sales remain solid. Last week's total of 943,400 MT is a little more than double what we need to see each week. The U.S. is very competitive in the world market right now and a few more weeks of good sales totals will force USDA to raise the ending stocks estimate and lower ending stocks. Wheat market fundamentals are becoming more friendly due to demand and also because poor crop condition ratings, unless they improve, will threaten to make new crop stocks much tighter.

The March KW found support at the bottom end of the trading channel and was able to bounce off of that support. The market has made six consecutive closes below the 50-day, which I don't like to see, but since the fundamentals of the wheat market have actually

improved since the last four times the market has tested this support, I really don't see the support failing now. I expect to see the wheat begin moving back to the top of the trading channel very soon.

Soybean sales were tremendous again at 1.08 MMT. That is more than three times what we need each week and is simply an unsustainable pace. Either the USDA is still too low with their export estimate or sales are going to slow drastically very soon. So far there is no evidence of sales slowing. Soybean meal and oil sales are also very good, so it isn't just one segment of the complex that is doing well.

The January soybeans lost 67 ½ cents and suffered some chart damage last week. The soybeans seemed very sensitive to stories about the Chinese trying to slow their economy, but I am not sure that can have a lasting effect on the market. We have to remember that they are trying to slow growth and slow food inflation. That means that they are still going to have growth and inflation, which means they are still going to require more raw materials in the future and not less. I am nervous about technical traders putting more pressure on the market, but I am not the least bit nervous

about the fundamentals.

Cash cattle trade was mostly at the \$98 level last week, which was basically steady, but the futures market did much better than that. In the live cattle the contracts from February forward made new contract highs and in the Feeder cattle the contracts from January forward made new highs. Last week I was very concerned about the inability of the feeder cattle to push higher even with sharply lower corn. Last week the market made up for the previous week's lack luster performance.

Technical indicators are beginning to indicate the cattle markets are beginning to get overbought, which is right on time for next week's holiday trade. It won't be surprising at all to see a setback next week. Long term fundamentals look promising though. Cow slaughter is very aggressive, which means there will be no expansion to the herd again this year. Due to the aggressive placements the past several months, we will quickly be entering a period where placements fall below year ago levels, which is very friendly to the cattle market from late spring forward. The deferred feeder cattle are already testing the weekly and monthly chart highs and I expect the live cattle to do the same.

The cattle on feed report was mostly as expected with 103% on feed, 101% placed, and 99% marketed. The important thing to take away from this report is that placements were lower than last year in every weight class except the smallest, which was up 15% from last year. Cattle are being put on feed quicker, which is very bullish to the June through October contracts.

When I was a kid, I spent hours plowing with an old Farmall tractor, dreaming of a high-tech day when robots would farm in the future. Now, that day is virtually here. Today we'll meet a Kansas farm equipment dealership that has modernized to keep up with changes in technology and agriculture. Jim Meinhardt is CEO/Stockholder of Kan-Equip, a leading agricultural and construction equipment dealership. Jim is committed to rural Kansas, having grown up at the rural community of Paxico, population 210 people. Now, that's rural. Jim's father had a store called Eddie's Service there, and he got into farm equipment in the 1950s. Jim grew up in the business, and after a stint in the Army, bought a dealership in Wamego in 1967.

Lesser prairie chicken to gain 30,000 acres of Kansas habitat

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) recently approved a request that 30,000 acres of land be allocated for a new conservation practice — Kansas State Acres for Wildlife Enhancement (SAFE) — a continuous practice in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP). The additional SAFE acres will be targeted in areas within the lesser prairie chicken range in the southwest portion of the state. The lesser prairie chicken is a resident grouse species known for its showy breeding displays performed on mating grounds, called "leks." While its Kansas range has expanded for several years, it has recently become known as a species of high conservation concern throughout the high plains.

"Through cooperative efforts like the SAFE initiative, farmers and ranchers can play key roles in protecting wildlife that may be

threatened or endangered," said USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack. "These additional SAFE acres will provide new opportunities for state and regional agencies, non-profit organizations, farm groups, and other conservation partners to work with farmers and ranchers to restore wildlife habitats and conserve rare species, so they don't have to be listed under the Endangered Species Act."

The Playa Lakes Joint Venture (PLJV) worked with the Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, The Nature Conservancy, Pheasants Forever, the Kansas Wildlife Federation, Audubon of Kansas, and others to develop the SAFE proposal. These target areas are places where new or re-enrolled CRP acres will provide the most benefit for the lesser prairie chicken by expanding large patches of native habitat.

The SAFE initiative is a type of conservation practice known as "spatial targeting." Some broader scales of spatial targeting have been used in USDA programs. For example, in this year's CRP general signup, Conservation Priority Areas (CPAs) for the lesser prairie chicken were defined by identifying target counties or target watersheds. Applicants located within the CPAs received additional points, making them more likely to be accepted into the program.

Comparatively, the spatial targeting used for the lesser prairie chicken SAFE was much more refined in both its spatial scale and targeting criteria. To define target areas, a Geographic Information System (GIS) was used to evaluate land against several criteria related to lesser prairie chicken habitat needs, including the following:

- proximity to core lesser prairie chicken habitat patches;
- size of nearest lesser prairie chicken habitat patch; and

• percent of CRP expiring in areas adjacent to habitat patches.

Generally, the target areas are within two miles of a large habitat patch (1,235 to 74,130 acres) where a high percentage of CRP has been set to expire in 2010 and 2011.

Landowners who are interested in enrolling land in the Kansas lesser prairie chicken SAFE practice and think their land may be in one of the targeted areas should visit their local Farm Service Agency service center after Dec. 1 to get more details and find out if they are eligible.

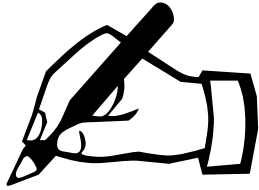

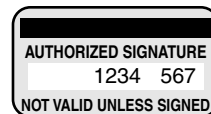

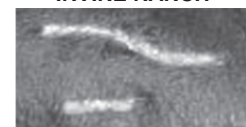

Memories still linger of ghost town in Kansas

(AP) Growing up in the 1960s, Jim Arwood watched as this ghost town disappeared completely, not only from its location off a rural country road in Rice County, but also from the map and most people's memory.

The remnants of Wherry, Kansas, are marked only by an overgrown railroad bed and maybe a few chunks of concrete, along with a clump of cottonwood trees.

"It seems over the years that between our visits a little bit of the town would disappear — torn down, blown down or burned down — I don't exactly recall the reasons," Arwood said, noting his mother would sometimes stop at the abandoned ghost town on the way from Lyons to visit his grandparents in Hutchinson.

In February 1967, what remained of Wherry went up in smoke.

This is the story of a town that grew, then died in less than 40 years. Wherry is a town that, after death, maybe became even more popular as a place to explore — including by youth on Halloween night.

These days, the traffic passing Wherry are just farmers traipsing back in forth in their pickups to farm fields. And only a few old-timers can recall the town whose heyday peaked in the 1910s before it began to dwindle to nothingness.

The railroad town started as a post office on April

17, 1888, closing, ironically, on Halloween of 1923, according to the Kansas State Historical Society.

It once had a store, a hotel, lumberyard, railroad station, grain elevators and houses. In fact, at one time, the town and its vicinity had 300 people, said Gary Battey, who was helping cut soybeans just a few miles north of Wherry's location. He remembers an old house that he once ventured into — maybe the hotel. The inside had a Wild West look with its balcony — just the type used as backdrops in the old western movies.

According to Daniel Fitzgerald, the author of several Kansas ghost town books, it's not clear why Wherry was called Wherry. Most of the buildings were built between 1910 and 1915 as the town boomed with the location next to the railroad.

Joe and Al Hauschild built the lumberyard, hardware and machinery store. Farmers would travel to town to visit with Jonas Neun. Another popular spot was the home of Steve Thompson, the first person in town to own a phonograph. He would bring the machine outside and folks would set up chairs to listen to

the music.

Wherry's prosperity began to decline in the 1920s, however. The general store and post office closed and residents began to travel to bigger cities for goods.

The final demise, however, came during two separate events in February 1967, when, according to The Hutchinson News, the general store, followed by an old Hauschild home, were destroyed by fire, "blamed on trysting neckers who perhaps were careless while smoking."

Joe Hedrick, Nickerson, who owns part of the section that butts up to the old town site, said little, if anything remains. Maybe a few concrete pieces, he said — if the remains haven't been buried by dirt work.

Yet for Jim Arwood and his sister, Sally Beydler, memories remain.

Beydler, who lives in Hutchinson, said their mother, Jenny Arwood, now in her 90s, recalls square dancing on a roof in the town in the 1930s. Jenny Arwood was the adventurous type and loved to take her children on a journey during their weekly trips to Hutchinson.

Arwood says he remembers the hotel the most — a two-story building that he

loved because it looked like something out of the television show "Gun-smoke."

"I also remember the bank, and there were several other abandoned homes," he said.

The youngest of five children, he was a bit scared of going inside but would watch his mother, along with his four sisters, disappear through the doorways of the worn-down structures.

"I was sure there were ghosts on the inside," he said.

Arwood, who now lives in Phoenix, said he visits Kansas a couple times a year, taking his own family to the stops that were a large part of his past.

"It is definitely a fond memory from my childhood," Arwood said. "It is amazing that something as simple as an old abandoned building could have been the highlight of a journey. But I guess during those days, kids were more interested in their surroundings. We didn't have iPods to keep us entertained. Instead of asking 'Are we there yet?' we wanted to stop and see something."

The Million Hour Challenge, in its fourth year of operation, is a special initiative of the National FFA Organization designed to unite youth across the country and strengthen communities through civic engagement and community service.

Hearing loss a growing concern in agriculture

Protecting their hearing might be the furthest thing from the minds of most farmers as they drive tractors, operate chainsaws or check grain drying in their bins, but not being cautious around these loud noises produces irreparable damage.

“Farmers have lifelong exposure to levels of noise that cause hearing loss,” said David Baker, University of Missouri assistant dean of agriculture extension and a former state safety and occupational health specialist. “These higher exposure levels mean farmers who don’t protect themselves will invariably experience hearing loss that will impact their lives.”

Agriculture ranks high among industries that take their toll on hearing.

According to National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) surveys, more than 43 percent of workers in U.S. agriculture encounter dangerous levels

of noise. Farmers rank only behind mines, factories and utility workers in exposure to high levels of noise.

Even short bouts of loud noise can cause permanent hearing loss.

As little as two hours of driving an open-cab tractor or two minutes running a chainsaw can cause a temporary hearing loss. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration recommends earplugs or other hearing protection for prolonged exposure to noises louder than 90 decibels.

“Sounds that register above 90 decibels cause harm over a period of time, and farmers often don’t know the risk level they are exposed to,” Baker said. “Combined with the perceived hassle of wearing hearing muffs all the time, awareness issues and the idea that hearing loss goes with the territory cause higher prevalence of hearing loss among farmers than some

industries.”

Farm operators and managers report the second-highest hearing difficulty (22 percent) of all occupational categories in data collected from 1997 to 2004, according to the NIOSH survey.

Parts of the inner ear like the cochlea and small hairs that line its membranes are damaged by continued exposure to loud noise. Over time this can eliminate hearing of high-frequency noises, like the voices of women.

While some farmers might joke that it could be a blessing to not hear everything their wife says, hearing loss can result in ringing known as tinnitus, reduced muscular control and disruption of sleep as well as the reduced ability to understand other people.

One solution is to reduce noise from machinery.

Simple maintenance can help with much machinery racket. Replacing

worn or loose parts cuts down on vibration, maintaining properly working mufflers cuts exhaust noise and isolating yourself with an acoustically designed tractor cab all reduce exposure.

Still, keeping hearing protection handy and actually using it around loud equipment remains the biggest challenge for farmers. One in four ag workers admitted they don’t use hearing protection.

Baker acknowledges that convincing farmers to protect their hearing can be a tough sell but should be addressed.

“Farmers are by nature risk-takers,” he said. “They are losing their ability to sense the risk but getting them to realize the long-term harm is a start.”

Mushrush has also served as a director for the Kansas Red Angus Association (KRAA) and is a past president of the KRAA. He has also served on the Board of Directors for the Exchange National Bank for the past 20 years.

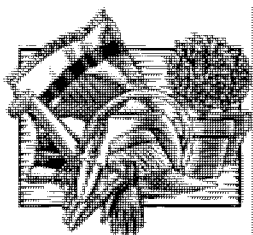

Yard & Garden Tips

Planning For the 2011 Fruit Planting

A gardener is always thinking (dreaming) of the next growing season. Thinking turns to planning. Planning and preparation aids in making a successful garden. This is true for all areas of the garden whether it is the vegetable, fruit, turf or the ornamental landscape. Fruit crops remain in the garden for several to many years.

Planning is essential in getting a good harvest. Selecting the fruits you have time to grow and enjoy eating is the first step in planning. Children typically like to eat fruit over some vegetables. If children are part of the household, you might get some help at least with harvesting.

Strawberries are a family favorite in our household. For the past three years, we have harvested them from our patch. Production generally drops off and the patch needs a new location. We have decided to plant strawberries in

one of the raised beds that has been growing vegetables.

Like most fruit crops, strawberries like full sun and well-drained soil. The soil test indicated that the soil pH is 7.6. Strawberries prefer a lower pH so two pounds of sulphur per 100 square feet will be worked into the soil. Phosphorus and potassium are ample for plant growth. Tree leaves and other organic matter will be added to improve soil conditions this fall.

With the planning and preparation this fall, planting of a June bearing type of strawberry will be done next March. Typically, the soil is too wet to prepare in the spring. Attempting to improve the soil when it is wet is fighting an uphill battle. Soil with a good amount of clay will only compress and harden.

The old strawberry patch will produce one last time this next spring. A

layer of mulch over the plants will prepare them for a spring harvest. This layer of straw, hay or ornamental grass should be in place between Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Strawberries are just one fruit crop that succeeds when planning has taken place. To aid you in planning a fruit crop, turn to the K-State Research and Extension publication "Planning Your Fruit Garden." It is available on the web at www.ksre.ksu.edu or from the Extension office.

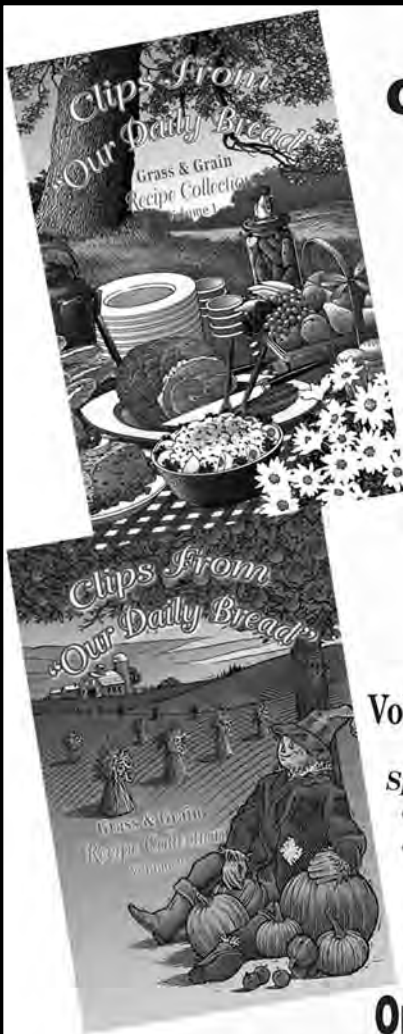

Schulers honored as 2010 Red Angus Pioneer Breeder of the Year



Schuler-Olsen Ranch of Bridgeport, Neb., received the 2010 Red Angus Association of America (RAAA) Pioneer Breeder of the Year Award at the National Red Angus Convention in Springfield, Mo., Sept. 16-17. Melvin Leland of Sidney, Mont., and Kenda Ponder of Denton, Texas, presented the award to Darrell and the late Mary Lou Schuler, their son Butch and his wife Susan.

"Schulers represent a long-established Red Angus Program that exemplifies the commitment and dedication of so many of the pioneer breeders in our breed's history," said fellow seedstock producer Melvin Leland.

The Schulers were first introduced to Red Angus when they purchased yearling grass cattle and were unable to sell the Red Angus heifers with the rest of the group. They kept them in their commercial herd and were so impressed with their calves that they purchased Red Angus bulls to use as a cross on their Hereford cows. They began adding Red Angus cows and built up a herd of registered

stock.

"They developed one of the most data-intense programs in the breed with many years of successful sales," said Leland. "Their reputation as seedstock producers is widely known and respected with years of accumulated carcass and feedlot data."

Darrell Schuler was elected president of the RAAA in 1986 when the Association was essentially broke. Schuler was so committed to the breed that he signed a personal bank note using their ranch as collateral in order to keep the RAAA functioning. Darrell also spent two or three days a month at the RAAA office in Denton, Texas, managing the business of the Association. At the end of his term, the RAAA was back on sound financial footing.

"While Darrell was the face and voice that most knew as Schuler Red Angus, his late wife Mary Lou was the backbone, holding everything together," said Kenda Ponder, RAAA Member Services Director.

Mary Lou was meticulous in everything she did

whether she was in the A.I. corral or maintaining the bookkeeping and cattle registrations. Her son, Butch, continues her tradition of analytical thinking and attention to detail.

Butch grew up with Red Angus as a member of the Junior Red Angus Association. Today, he has established a worldwide presence in the breed, serving on Marketing and Technical Committees and played a key role in many Brain Trust Sessions. He is currently serving on the Breed Improvement and Strategic Planning Committees, as well as the Technical Advancement Committee.

Butch's wife Susan contributes to the ranch through the day-to-day activities as well as raising their family. She currently serves on the Registration Committee and provides valuable input to help guide RAAA policy.

"The Schuler family continues to value the same hard work and dedication to producing consistently functional cattle that help sustain their customers' profitability. Today, Butch, Susan and family continue the Schuler-Olsen legacy of commitment to the beef industry as one of Red Angus' elite seedstock producers," concluded Ponder.

Central U.S. winter may bring red flag warnings

Something relatively new and different appears likely to be a frequent feature in central High Plains weather forecasts this winter.

"A 'Red Flag Warning' is a step above the 'extreme' category on the old Range Fire Danger index. And, for the first time in a number of years, Kansas appears to be primed to hear it during wintertime, too," said State Climatologist Mary Knapp. The term emerged with the same change that put a slightly modified slogan in Smokey Bear's mouth: "Only you can prevent wildfires." The National Weather Service now reports over all U.S. wildfire conditions, rather than separating the risks for forests and grasslands.

Knapp said what warrants a Red Flag varies from area to area. In general, the criteria are a dangerous mix of wind, low relative humidity, moderate to warm temperatures and available fuel.

No matter the location, however, a Red Flag always means the same: Fire-promoting conditions have reached or will soon be at the critical level. The

danger is real, and it's high. Any spark could create a devastating fire with explosive growth potential.

"Unfortunately, Kansas is leaving a dry fall and moving into our normally drier winter months," Knapp said. "Added to that, the state has a much bigger supply of natural fuels, due to beneficial rains over the last two years.

"Besides, most farmers are now leaving stubble on

harvested fields to conserve soil and moisture. A number of landowners are no longer burning pastures as often as recommended; so, trashy shrubs and trees are rapidly become part of the state's burnable mix. That's dangerous in a fire-based ecology - which actually is one of the ways scientists define 'prairie.'"

Large-scale cattle feeder says quality equals less risk, more rewards

Quality versus quantity. It's an age-old debate, but cattleman Tom Brink, J & F Oklahoma Holdings, Inc., says it doesn't have to be either/or.

And he would know. Brink is the president and chief operating officer (COO) of the cattle ownership arm of Five Rivers Cattle Feeding. Its 12 feedlots can hold more than 950,000 head, annually marketing up to 2 million finished cattle.

Brink talked about managing and hedging high-quality cattle at the 5th Annual Feeding Quality Forum (FQF) in Grand Island, Neb., and Amarillo, Texas, earlier this month. "The topic of quality cattle is always relevant, because the commodity business simply doesn't pay that well," he said. "We have worked for a lot of years in this industry to differentiate our product and have the opportunity to capture additional value."

Brink profiled cattle sold from July through October, sorting them by the top 10% premium-earning pens and the other 90%. There were 40,000 head in that top 10th percentile. That group had an average of 27 pounds higher live weight and a 19-lb. hot carcass weight (HCW) advantage. Dressing percentage was 1.2 points better than the rest, too.

"That added weight speaks well for their performance in the feedyard," Brink said.

Where the top value-getting group really racked up the premiums was in the grade, he said. Choice and Prime percentage was 15.1 points higher than the lower value group, 67.9% versus 52.8%. The Certified Angus Beef® (CAB®) difference was even more dramatic: 17.7% for the top tenth compared to just 8.4% for all others. "If we were to assume the others sold at the average of the live market, those top 10% brought \$48 per head more," he said. "That would mean if we took this same top 40,000 steers and valued them appropriately as a feeder animal, they are worth \$6 per hundredweight (cwt.) more than a commodity animal. So there is tremendous value in those cattle."

Brink profiled the heifers and found similar trends.

"It does say you can give up a bit in terms of yield grades because the premiums are so large on these high grading cattle," he noted. "Around 20% of the money we'll make this year is from the value-added side. That's in a profitable year, so think of how much more value-added premiums matter

in a narrow margin year." When it comes to risk management, high-quality cattle have an often overlooked advantage. "They are going to sell at the top of the market or even above the market, and that gives us a better basis to work with," Brink said. Of course basis is only one piece of the picture. Brink shared his "Ten Tenets of Risk Management."

- Understand your risk tolerance
 - Decide what the futures market should do for you (hedge risk or become a profit center)
 - Start with a competitive breakeven
 - Know your position
 - Analyze financial outcomes over a wide range of potential prices
 - Establish risk management decision-making structure
 - Write down a specific plan. Follow the plan. Update it regularly
 - Project the market's likely range and shorten and lengthen your position accordingly
 - Manage your coverage in percentages while evaluating risk versus reward
 - No one gets the market right 100% of the time, so work for a good batting average
- "There's no question that today's market is less predictable, it is more volatile and it's harder to

manage than ever before," said Brink, who has worked in risk management for more than 20 years. Bankers, spouses and employees might all have a say in determining risk tolerance. Once that's decided, it will be easier to establish futures market goals.

"Your actions over time should reflect that and they should be consis-

tent with your overall strategy," Brink said. Without a known competitive breakeven, "It's very difficult to make hedging decisions," he said. That's achieved by buying cattle as competitively as possible and managing all other inputs. He suggests reanalyzing market position at least once a week. That routine allows cattlemen to "spend more

time thinking about what they should be doing and not just trying to figure out where they are."

Every business — no matter how small — should designate who makes those decisions and then write them down, Brink said. Then in the end, it's important to remember: "You won't always be right with the market."
