Kansas buffalo producers getting high prices

(AP) — Kansas buffalo producers have seen demand for their product spike and are scrambling to meet a rising demand for hormone-free, low-cholesterol meat options.

Prices at a buffalo auction this week at the Maxwell Wildlife Refuge in central Kansas were twice as high as they were five years ago, and producers are hailing the prospects that demand will continue to rise.

“Everyone is looking for it,” said Dick Gehring, a Newton firefighter and buffalo producer from Moundridge. “Today is a prime example. We have buyers from Iowa, from South Dakota, North Dakota and several other states. They are here to fill their trucks, and they have a lot of orders to fill.”

Gehring, a member of the Kansas Buffalo Association board, said it will take another five or six years of growth before producers are able to meet customers’ needs, the Hutchinson News reported Friday.

“Everything is based on carcass price,” he said. “Demand for meat has outstripped supply.”

Turnout at Wednesday’s auction near Canton, in McPherson County, was sparse, but that didn’t stop prices from hitting some of their highest marks this decade.

Prices were averaging \$2 to \$2.25 a pound for bigger animals, while young calves were selling for \$2.50 to \$3 a pound. In 2005, prices were roughly \$1.20 a pound for calves and \$1.10 to \$1.20 per pound for older animals.

Jerry Schmidt, a Haven-area producer who also serves on the state buffalo association board, estimated prices were at least 50 percent higher than a year ago, if not more.

Gehring expects prices to be even higher at the association’s annual sale Dec. 4 in Salina. The association has consigned 360 head, and he said prices have the potential to hit \$3.25 per pound for bull calves and nearly \$3 per pound for heifer calves.

He credits better marketing for the growth in demand for buffalo, touted as rich in vitamins and minerals while low in fat, cholesterol and calories. Since buffalo tend to eat grass and have very little handling by producers, they also tend to be free of hormones.

The National Bison Association said the nation’s buffalo herds were nearly wiped out by the 1880s, and there are fewer than 1,000 animals in existence.

Stock numbers have been rising as the buffalo thrived, especially on public lands, and there now are more than 220,000 head, the association said.

Farmers warned of fabricated building scam

The Nebraska Farm Bureau and state attorney general are warning farmers to be wary of a business that promises fabricated outbuildings but never delivers.

Attorney General Jon Bruning says one of the victims paid \$15,000 to Fargo, N.D.-based Quality Steel Buildings for a building he never got.

Quality Steel Buildings also does business as Pioneer Building Systems, which was incorpo-

rated in Minnesota. Numbers were not listed for the businesses, nor for owner Dennis Burton.

Burton’s businesses have run into trouble before. Last year, he was sued by the Minnesota attorney general for charging \$260,000 for buildings he never delivered to farmers. In North Dakota, Burton agreed in 2008 to pay consumers \$300,000 for deceptive business practices.

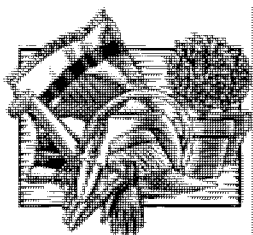

Yard & Garden Tips

The Mexican Poinsettia

The red poinsettia is a favorite Christmas time decoration. Several breeders have put a spin on the color red. Besides many shades of red, poinsettias come in white, marble, pink speckled and others. You can take a white one and dye it any color you want, such as purple.

Horticulture students at K-State taking the course Greenhouse Operations Management have produced 63 different cultivars of poinsettias this semester as a part of the regional poinsettia trials. Poinsettia plants became a Christmastime decoration because in their natural habitat of Mexico, they are in full flower at that time. Flowering is "photoperiodic" induced in the poinsettia. This means that flowers begin to form when the days are a certain length,

or, more accurately, when the nights are long enough. The poinsettia is a short-day or long-night plant. Without long nights, this plant will continue to produce leaves and will grow but will never flower.

The flowers themselves are not that eye-catching. They give way to the colorful bracts or modified leaves. However, the flowers are a good indicator of the maturity of the plant. A fresh poinsettia is one on which little or no yellow pollen is showing on the flower clusters in the center of the bracts. Really old plants are missing their flowers; however, the colorful bracts remain.

Once you make your selections, place your poinsettia in a spot with bright natural light, but don't let it touch cold windowpanes. The day temperature should not be more than 75 degrees F. with 60 to 65 degrees at night. Temperatures above 75 degrees will shorten bloom life, and below 60 degrees may cause root rot. Move plants away from windows at night or draw drapes between them to avoid damage from the cold.

Poinsettias do best with a constantly moist

but not wet potting media. Examine the potting media daily for moisture. Picking up the container can be a good indicator of moisture. Heavy pots don't need water and light pots need moisture added. Water the plant until some water runs out of the container's drainage holes and the potting media is moist. Discard the excess water.

Nebraska inspector accused of falsifying BSE tests

(AP) - A former state cattle inspector has been indicted for faking tests for bovine spongiform encephalopathy.

The two-count indictment announced Wednesday by the U.S. Attorney's Office says 41-year-old Galen Niehues, of Cozad, submitted inspection re-

ports on 92 cattle operations in Nebraska but never actually performed the inspections. He faces federal charges of making false statements and mail fraud.

No number was listed for Niehues, and court records don't list his attorney.

His first court appear-

ance is scheduled for Dec. 2. Niehues faces up to 25 years in prison if convicted.

A message left with the Agriculture Department wasn't immediately returned. The indictment says Niehues worked for the department from July 2009 through March.

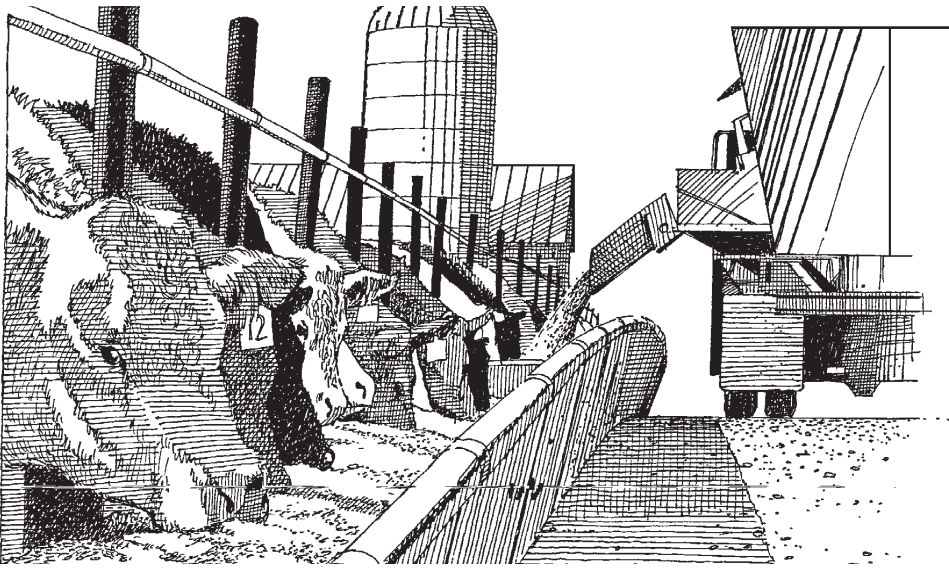

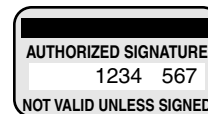

UNL Beef Short-Courses give cow-calf producers valuable information

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln’s 2010-2011 Beef Short-Course program, “Staying Competitive in an Ever-Changing Beef Cow-Calf Industry,” will be broadcast on NET 2 in December and January.

Each session will be broadcast at 7 p.m. Dec. 16, Jan. 13, 20 and 27. Each presentation will end at 8 p.m. and be followed by a question and answer session.

The short-course series is designed to help cow-calf producers remain competitive in an industry that is constantly changing. “The cow-calf enterprise is a complex production system,” Rick Rasby, UNL Extension beef specialist. “For producers to be competitive, they need to integrate human, financial and feed resources in their operation.”

Rasby said the programs will help producers integrate resources and increase the profit potential of their cow-calf enterprise. The Dec. 16 session will focus on “Animal Identification and Using Ear Tag Technology as a Management Tool.” Presenters during this session will be Rasby, Nebraska Department of Agriculture’s Lynn Gordon, producers Mark and Bonnie Wagner and Midwest Microsystems’ Tim Davis. The session on Jan. 13 will cover “Working with Your Banker in Tough Economic Times: What to Include and how to Get Your Financial Portfolio Ready.”

“Optimum Cow Size: Matching Cow Size and Milk Production and Your Resources” will be one of two topics covered Jan. 20 with Rasby and Matt Spangler, UNL Extension beef cattle specialist. The other topic is “Getting Your Bull’s Battery Ready for the Breeding Season.”

The final session on Jan. 27 with Rick Funston, UNL Extension beef cattle reproductive physiologist, will focus on “Managing Calving Interval and Its Impact on Profit Potential” along with “Estrous Synchronization Protocols for Beef Cows and Heifers.”

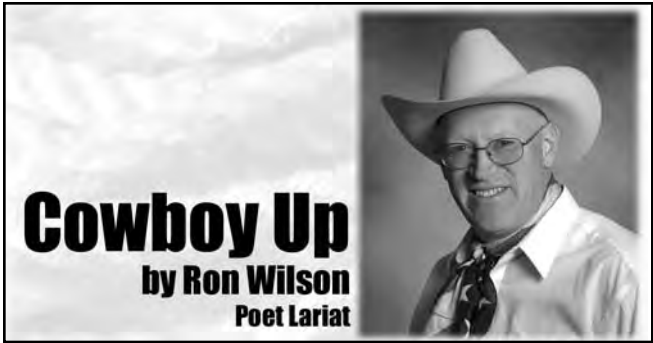



USDA finalizes procedures for sorghum referendum

Sorghum Checkoff Chairman Bill Greving is glad to announce the U.S. Department of Agriculture has finalized procedures for the upcoming referendum on the continuation of the Sorghum Checkoff Program.

For the program to continue, the Sorghum Promotion, Research, and Information Order requires that a referendum be conducted no later than three years after the start of assessments, which began on July 1, 2008.

USDA will conduct the referendum Feb. 1-28, 2011, at local Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices for producers and the Agricultural Marketing Service office for importers. Ballots may be obtained in person, by mail or facsimile at county FSA offices, or via the Internet.

Any eligible person engaged in the production or importation of sorghum from July 1, 2008, to Dec. 31, 2010, is eligible to participate. Individuals are required to provide documentation such as a sales receipt or remittance form that shows they engaged in production or im-

portation of sorghum.

The Sorghum Checkoff Program, and its 13-member board, is authorized by the Commodity Promotion, Research, and Information Act of 1996. The mandatory program is funded at the rate of 0.6 percent of the net market value on grain sorghum and 0.35 percent of the net market value of sorghum forage.

The Sorghum Checkoff is intended to be a national, coordinated, self-help marketing program designed to strengthen the position of sorghum in the marketplace, maintain and expand existing domestic and foreign markets and uses for sorghum, and develop new markets and uses for sorghum.

The final procedures were published in the Nov. 18, 2010, Federal Register.

With the help of hunters, meat processors, and private donors, Kansas Hunters Feeding the Hungry (KSHFH) annually provides thousands of meals to those in need. Just one deer can feed nearly 200 hungry people in the state. In 2009, 1,010 deer were donated through KSHFH, providing nearly 225,000 meals.

The Kansas deer firearm season — Dec. 1-12 this year — is the busiest time for the organization. Hunters donate hundreds of deer and occasionally an elk or even a bison. The organization supplies meat to nearly 100 food banks across the state through cooperating meat processors.

The Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks makes supporting this important program easy. When outdoorsmen and women buy licenses, permits, or stamps, they can donate \$2 to fund the program, which the agency collects for KSHFH.

To find the nearest meat processor involved in this program, go online to kshfh.org and click on "Lockers." If you plan to take big game to a locker, be sure to contact them as soon as possible after harvest.

Increasing agricultural commodity prices causing some concern

Although the recent surge in agricultural commodity prices has caused some concern about a potential increase in food costs, an overall increase likely will be "modest," according to economists with the Texas AgriLife Extension Service. "Commodity prices reached record or near-record highs in 2008, but weakened in 2009 and most of 2010," said Jose Pena, AgriLife Extension economist-management at the Texas AgriLife Research and Extension Center in Uvalde, Texas. "Food prices increased in 2008 just as the U.S. was entering into what many economists describe as the worst recession since the Great Depression."

Pena and other AgriLife Extension economists recently assessed the effect rising farm commodity prices might have on retail food prices and whether those increases would result in increases similar to those experienced in and beyond 2008.

"Farm commodity prices fell sharply in 2009 and 2010 after reaching record levels in 2008," Pena said. "However, food prices continued to rise in 2009 and 2010 even as farm commodity prices returned to 2007 levels."

Pena said the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) recently forecasted the consumer-price index for food will rise between 0.5% and 1.5% this year and between 2% to 3% for 2011. "From 1990 to 2006 the average annual food price increase was 4% and the increase in 2010 will be the smallest since 1992," he said. "While prices for basic commodities like corn and wheat are higher than they were in 2007, they remain well below the record highs of 2008." Pena said adverse weather, a weaker U.S. dollar, increased exports, higher crude-oil prices and heavy commodity contract buying by speculative in-

vestor funds have contributed to increasing commodity prices. "Although the agricultural producer is sometimes vilified because of the increasing price of agricultural commodities, the lion's share of that increase is due to factors beyond the producer's control," he said. "USDA data show farmers get less than 20¢ of every dollar spent on food. So the majority of the increase comes from the elevation of production and post-production costs, including the costs of energy, labor, advertising, packaging and transportation."

He added, however, that producers do receive a higher percentage for foods consumed closer to their raw form, such as fresh fruits and vegetables, as opposed to processed food items, such as baked goods and cereal products. "Still, on average, a 50% increase in the price received by the farmer results in only a 10% increase in the retail cost of food," Pena said. "The recent upward movement in commodities pricing is expected to have little immediate effect on the prices of basic food items." He said consumers should expect to see a modest price increase in meat, poultry and dairy products in 2011, as well as an increase in grain prices due to temporarily tighter grain supplies.

"We're seeing commodity price increases across the board, but are looking at a situation relating to U.S. stocks of wheat, corn and soybeans," said Mark Welch, an AgriLife Extension economist at Texas A&M University in College Station who specializes in grain marketing. Welch said quantities of these grain commodities were all reduced in the recent Supply and Demand Estimates released by the USDA.

"We already expected a further reduction in the estimate of the U.S. corn supply, but the cut in the soy-

bean estimate was a surprise," he said.

He said, however, that the worldwide supply of these grains is in good shape with carry-over stocks above their 20-year average, but there is a "pipeline" problem affecting their short-term supply in the U.S.

"The reduction in U.S. corn and soybean supplies can be offset by production in and exportation from other countries, but there is some concern about whether there will be adequate stock to comfortably carry the U.S. consumer over until we get more," he said. "With lower grain production, as the supply tightens the prices will increase — certainly at least in the short term."

"There also was a small reduction in the wheat estimate, but that may be offset by increased production in Argentina, Australia and elsewhere. Plus, we'll need to wait and see what happens with the upcoming Russian wheat harvest."

There also has been a reduction in another significant agricultural commodity, beef cattle, said David

Anderson, AgriLife Extension livestock economist. Anderson said cattle numbers will be fewer over the next decade, but the price of corn will dictate the level and spread in calf prices.

"I think we will continue seeing beef production and cattle numbers drop off in the next couple of years," he said. "We are forecast to produce 25.4 billion pounds of beef in 2011 versus 25.9 billion pounds in 2010. That will lead to increases in price, but it also depends on corn prices and (their effect on) calf prices."

Anderson said the first quarter of 2010 resulted in the least amount of beef supplies since 1997, after factoring out exports, and he expects that during each quarter through 2012 the beef supply will continue to decline.

"Overall, beef demand has been hurt by the recession, but has been strong due to consumers 'trading down' to stretch their income," he said. "That's led to more grinding of specific cuts of beef — chucks and rounds — to take advantage of the hamburger demand."

He added, however, that

cull cattle have also been fetching premium prices as a result of the demand for ground beef, and that export markets also continue to grow and show strength, with Vietnam emerging as a top customer for U.S. beef exports in 2009.

"What I'm suggesting is that booming exports tighten domestic beef supplies even more and should lead to higher cattle prices for the next couple of years,"

Anderson said. "Supplies keep cutting back because we're not making enough money to build herds back."

Generally, however, the economists agreed that in spite of the commodity increases and the possibility of slightly higher food prices in the future, American consumers can still expect to have adequate supplies of the best and safest food in the world at the lowest overall cost.
