Western Kansas residents to vote on mega-hog operation

(AP) — Greeley County residents approved a nonbinding referendum in October to allow large hog confinements in their county.

But that vote wasn't good enough to replace laws on the county's books forbidding such operations as the one Seaboard Corp. wants to build in the western Kansas county.

The Garden City Telegram reports a new election has been scheduled for Dec. 21, and if approved Seaboard could go ahead with its plans for up to 120 barns with 1,000 hogs per barn. The company says the new operation would cost more than \$30 million and bring at least 18 new jobs to the county.

Greeley County voters rejected such hog operations in 1997 in a non-binding vote, and the next year the county repealed a 1994 resolution that allowed large hog farms.

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
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

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

As expected the December supply and demand report was rather uneventful. There were just a few inconsequential changes to the U.S. numbers. In the corn, USDA increased the import estimate by 5 million bushels, which in turn increased ending stocks by 5 million. These extra imports would have to come from Canada and really won't have a market impact. In the wheat, the food usage estimate was cut by 10 million bushels due to better than expected flour extraction rates, which is something that we saw happen last year and the year before. Some were hoping to see an increase in the export estimate, and that is certainly possible in the January report. For the soybeans, USDA raised the export estimate by 20 million bushels to a new record high of 1.590 billion and therefore cut ending stocks by 20 million to 165 million bushels. The increase in exports was totally expected since the Chinese buying pace has been very, very strong. None of the changes were market movers and do nothing to change what we know about the markets. Since the report didn't provide any new information, the markets will likely sink into the holiday doldrums and continue

on with a couple more weeks of sideways trade. There could be some volatile, low volume days ahead as traders jump around in the face of fresh S. American forecasts, rumors about Index Fund rebalancing, and changes in monetary policy around the globe. Eventually, but probably not until after the first of the year, traders' focus will turn back to ideas that USDA is going to cut corn production in the "final" crop production report in January and that there is going to be fierce competition for acreage in the spring. The corn was basically flat for the week, gaining about a penny. The chart pattern is still higher and the market did make a new high for the move in overnight trade Friday. On the negative side, the March corn stalled out at the 62% retracement of the last move down and has really struggled to hold gains on the days when it does move higher. Technical indicators are not overbought and if the market could get a spark, it seems to me that the market could move sharply higher. The problem, of course, is that we are missing the spark. I've mentioned before that the bulls could really stand to see better exports. This week's report wasn't as good as I had hoped at 671,100 MT of old crop sales. That just isn't enough to meet the current expectations or the get speculators excited about buying corn. We had a big visible sale to Mexico this week, so perhaps next Thursday's report will be better.

From a technical perspective the corn market is really pretty simple. The March corn needs to close above \$5.80 early next week and that would propel the market up to the \$5.95 area.

Several wheat contracts made new contract highs including the March KW. Unfortunately the gains didn't hold and the March KW finished the week only about 9 cents higher. Technical indicators are overbought and several poor closes suggest that we will see some fol-

low-through weakness. The general trend in global wheat prices is still higher though. The French milling wheat made a new high this week and here in the U.S. the March Minneapolis wheat was higher 17 sessions in a row and made new contract highs four days in a row. Quality milling wheat is gaining value because weather problems around the world may make supplies tight in the coming year. The excessive moisture in Australia and the dry weather in the U.S. are the two major concerns at present. In the short run we may see some corrective weakness in the wheat, but in the long run we will eventually see the Kansas City wheat reach \$9.18 and then \$10.28.

Surprisingly the soybeans were the weak link. I didn't expect to see the beans be the downside leader considering how strong the demand for soybeans and soybean oil is. Export sales were great again at 637,800 MT. Soybean oil sales were huge this week and will be again next week. The USDA has a history of underestimating soybean exports, and they

have again this year, but they are also severely underestimating sovbean oil exports. Unless there is a dramatic slowdown, then USDA isn't even in the ballpark. Since it looks more and more likely that the bio-diesel blender's credit will be reinstated, perhaps exports will slow down due to competition here at home, but I suspect it will take higher prices to slow the demand from importers.

The charts look a little weak after last week's performance. There is a definite bearish divergence in the stochastics and RSI, which suggests a little more weakness. I can't rule out a move down to \$12.60 in the March contract at some point next week. However, I can't see the weakness lasting very long with the big demand numbers we have been seeing.

The cattle market didn't fair too well. Cash cattle traded mostly at the \$101 level in light volume. The futures were weak and it looks like the February live cattle have peaked out, at least temporarily. The big reversal down, following the next contract high, just doesn't look good. The next major support is just below the market at the \$104area. At this point it would be wise to sell the February LC on a \$103.40 stop. If the market doesn't take out that level early in the week, then we will see the uptrend resume. The fundamentals of the market are still very good, but sometime it is necessary to take a break.
