



# Schwieterman Market Outlook

*A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts*

One has to be pretty pleased with last week's price movement. March corn nearly reached the contract high, the soybeans reached the highest level since the fall of 2008, and the wheat clearly bottomed out at the end of the previous week. Both French milling wheat and corn made new contract highs, so the strength in the grain markets is not isolated to the U.S., which makes the situation even more bullish. The cattle market was very strong as well with many of the live cattle contracts making new contract highs and the feeder cattle making new all time highs.

There are several things fueling the bull market in the grains, and it is difficult to say which is the most important factor. The general fear of inflation certainly helps commodities since that attracts investment dollars, but the fact that there are also bullish supply and demand factors means that those investment dollars can do more to keep the bull market going. There seems to be no end to the Chinese appetite

for our soybeans and a profitable ethanol industry keeps great support under the corn market. The wheat is a little different since our domestic supplies are more than adequate, but weather problems around the world are making trader's question how much longer that will last.

The fundamentals of the livestock sector are very good as well. Beef carcass weights are declining as they should at this time of year, which means we are getting less beef per animal. Right now we are really relying on our huge cow slaughter numbers to supply us with beef and that is something that cannot last forever. Plus, with the Chinese talking about importing more beef, that will mean there will be less high quality beef left in the U.S. for us and less low quality beef that we will be able to import. It is easy to see how beef supplies could really be squeezed in the summer and fall of 2011. The same thing applies to the pork market as well. There is talk that they may start importing pork like they

did in 2008, which would be a huge boost to demand for our pork.

From a grain and livestock marketing perspective, the worst thing you can do right now is underestimate the potential gains. If you have sold grain, you need to replace it. Be patient with new sales and hedges. Look for ways to limit upside risk if you are a cattle feeder. That may mean buying call options above a record high feeder cattle market, or selling corn puts and looking for them to expire worthless. We are in a very bullish, but volatile market climate, and it is our job to take advantage of it.

I like owning bull call spreads in the July corn, wheat, and soybeans. I also like selling deep out of the money put options. I also like owning out of the money call options in the crude oil and natural gas markets. One of the best hedges against potential increases in input costs is being long crude oil. World demand for crude is rising and it won't take much of a sup-

ply concern to send that market sharply higher. For the cattle, there is nothing wrong with hedging a profit, but understand what the cash flow requirements might be to maintain that hedge. Try to be patient and wait for a good technical signal before being a seller.

## Tax incentive for conservation renewed

After a year-long lapse that left many important conservation donations in limbo, Congress renewed an enhanced tax incentive for conservation easements that increased private land conservation by a third — to over a million acres a year. The renewed incentive will be in effect through December 31, 2011 and retroactive to January 1, 2010.

Land Trust Alliance president Rand Wentworth gave special credit to the sponsors of legislation to make this incentive permanent, Senators Max Baucus D-Mont. and Charles Grassley R-Ia., and Representatives Mike Thompson D-Calif. and Eric Cantor R-Va. "These leaders have worked hard to make sure we can continue the success this incentive has already had, protecting special places and productive working lands in hundreds of communities across the country," Wentworth said. "The land this incentive helps protect is an investment in clean water, fresh, local food, wildlife habitat, and scenic beauty."

A broad coalition of sportsmen, outdoors enthusiasts, farmers, ranchers and national conservation groups worked together to renew the incentive and will push to make it permanent in the 112th Congress. Bills to do just that (H.R. 1831 and S. 812) have 274 House and 41 Senate co-sponsors from all 50 states, including majorities of Democrats and Republicans in the House.

By helping modest income landowners deduct the full value of their contributions, this enhanced easement incentive has increased the pace of private, voluntary land conservation by about 250,000 acres a year nationwide, and is especially important now that the latest reports show that America is losing land to development at the rate of 1.5 million acres per year.

The enhanced incentive, which applies to a landowner's federal income tax:

Raises the deduction a donor can take for donating a voluntary conservation agreement from 30% of their income in any year to 50%;

Allows farmers and ranchers to deduct up to 100% of their income; and

Increases the number of years over which a donor can take deductions from 6 to 16 years.

# Easy does it for cattle, bottom line

Cattlemen often analyze practices based on the return on investment (ROI), but usually they're only talking about money.

Tom Noffsinger, veterinarian and low-stress animal handling specialist from Benkelman, Neb., says working cattle can prove an old equation: investing a little more time then can have significant payoffs down the road.

"People can enhance the genetics in these animals, but we can have caregiver impact that actually takes away from that potential," said Noffsinger, who spoke at the Feeding Quality Forum in November.

Feeders and industry representatives gathered in Grand Island, Neb., and Amarillo, Texas, to hear the 37-year industry professional speak. Noffsinger said animal handling affects many determinants of profitability, along with employee morale and safety.

"Our goal at a feed-yard or ranch is to empower caregivers to be dedicated and make every human-to-cattle interaction a positive one," he said. "When we have dealt with issues in caregiver training, all of a sudden turnover at most of my (consulting) feed-yards is zero."

He shared videos and examples of how to use natural animal behavior to improve weaning, sorting and processing. From the first time animals come in contact with handlers, they're learning, and what cattle are taught can help or hinder everything from immune

response to the end product.

"We used to worry about harvest quality at the end of the feeding period, but we have to worry about harvest quality every day of the calves' lives," Noffsinger said. It starts on the ranch, and even subtleties like frequency of nursing can make a difference.

"We have found that a calf that nurses 20 times a day has a lot less risk compared to a baby that nurses twice a day," he said, noting producers can promote nursing in a variety of ways. "Cows should never go through a gate without their babies by their side. You can fix that."

Noffsinger gave examples of prepping cattle for weaning by separating pairs for a couple hours and then letting them match back up. After a few days of this, they already know what to expect when weaning day arrives.

"We will never process calves until they're willing to leave their favorite corner," he said. "Because until calves trust every corner of their pen or pasture, what else don't they trust? The water trough. Cattle that don't drink much, don't eat. Cattle that don't drink, don't rest."

That all ties back to that initial ROI, Noffsinger said. "The way we make money in this industry is by maximizing intake and conversion."

Handling also affects the ability to ward off sickness and respond to vaccines.

"We're starting to understand that stress actually sends very important white blood cells on vacation. They cease to function," he said. "When people understand how to get a calf to volunteer to travel through a system and stand voluntarily in a chute, the vaccines have a greater chance to work."

The benefits of instructing an animal, rather than "hollering at it," are magnified in breeding stock.

He shared an example of training replacement heifers.

"We asked them to go through the processing facility three times before we even started weaning," he said. "We ran them through and timed how long it took, and we kept running them through until it took half the time it did the first time."

"That changed these animals for the rest of their lives," he said. "If you're going to own these cows for 15 years, it's really fun to have a group that likes you rather than the old mad ones that want to hurt you."

Noffsinger said studying how animals communicate will not only improve your business internally, but also your image with the public.

"If we learn some of these inherent language skills, it's amazing how efficiently we can do this," he said. "We need to jump on these opportunities to display the skills we have as caregivers, so consumers can embrace that."

# Cattle and oil legacy of Greenwood Hotel runs deep



Historic ties to the Greenwood Hotel in Eureka run deep among families in the cattle and oil businesses in the Flint Hills and beyond. From 1883 through the mid-20th century, the Greenwood Hotel was the economic and social magnet for three major industries in Greenwood County and the area – cattlemen, oilmen and travelers. Over a billion dollars worth of cattle traded hands in the lobby of the Greenwood during the early teens and twenties. A reporter from the K.C. Star made the following observation, “The lobby of Eureka’s largest hotel is a sort of small livestock exchange. Always they are ‘talking cattle’...” By 1920, effects of the Flint

Hills oil boom were in evidence. Officials of large oil companies filled the lobby and made million dollar deals. Celebrities such as heavyweight world boxing champion Jess Willard oversaw oil investments from the hotel. For decades, travelers chose the Greenwood as a destination, coming by stage, train, automobile and bus to enjoy elegant accommodations. It served as a bus station for nearly 40 years. Countless soldiers going to war boarded a bus at the Greenwood. The fortunate were welcomed home at the same stop. The hotel is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and has a strong association with the development of com-

merce since the 1880s.

The Greenwood Preservation Society is currently in the midst of a \$1.2 million restoration of the Greenwood Hotel. Early in 2011, the first floor will serve as a community center, complete with state-of-the-art meeting rooms and banquet facilities. In addition, it will have a small area that will tell the story of how cattle, oil and transportation shaped the social and economic climate of the area.

Funding for this exterior and first-floor restoration has been secured through individual donations, tax credit programs, historic preservation grants and federal

funding. Planning for the future of the building includes establishing a well-funded endowment to take care of maintenance and operations of this community center and centerpiece of downtown Eureka.

To begin this endowment, the Greenwood Preservation Society has designed the “Walk of Legends.” Those with a historic tie to the ranching, oil or businesses of the area may be highlighted in the “Walk of Legends” in front of the Greenwood Hotel with engraved 16”square granite tiles.

## Kansas farmers can soon sign up for disaster aid

(AP) — Farmers in 51 Kansas counties can soon sign up for disaster assistance from 2009.

Jan. 10 is the opening date for enrolling in the 2009 SURE — Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments — disaster program at Farm Service Agency offices.

The Hays Daily News reports that 58 other Kansas counties were declared disaster areas, or are contiguous to declared areas, in 2010, but enrollment in that

program has not been announced.

The SURE program is one of five disaster programs included in the 2008 farm bill, and requires most farmers to purchase crop insurance to cover any losses. Generally, farmers don’t fully insure the crop because of the high cost.

Many of the counties are in central Kansas, where spring frost and heavy rains decimated the 2009 wheat crop.

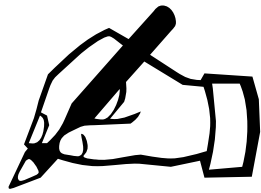

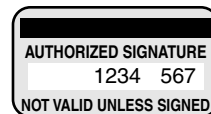

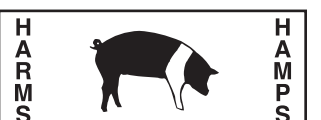

## Atrazine re-registration means farmers should strive to prevent runoff

As part of the re-registration of the popular herbicide atrazine, farmers should adopt practices to prevent runoff and ensure that atrazine remains a viable product, said a University of Missouri Extension water quality specialist.

Pesticide re-registration involves reviewing the scientific data for pesticides registered before November 1984 to ensure it meets today's scientific standards, said Bob Broz.

“Re-registration does not imply that there is anything wrong with the product, but simply that it makes sense to ensure that products meet the most current standards,” he said.

Atrazine has been in use 50 years and continues to be one of the most effective products for control of grasses and broadleaf weeds in corn, grain sorghums and sugar cane fields. Based on the review of available scientific studies, EPA determined in 2000 that atrazine is not likely to cause cancer in humans. Additional studies in 2003 and 2006 verified that atrazine is not carcinogenic to humans, Broz said.

Starting in 2009, EPA has been looking at the characteristics of atrazine and how they affect certain ecological indicators. Levels considered safe for humans may not be deemed acceptable for other, more sensitive species.

Without sound management practices, excessive runoff can create problems. Forty representative watersheds were selected in the Midwest for a study to determine the levels of atrazine in streams.

Three of these watersheds, one in Nebraska and two in Missouri, exceeded trigger levels for atrazine. Under the latest re-registration agreement, EPA has more authority to limit or ban atrazine if runoff levels are over set target values.

“Even though the watersheds where testing was done are fairly small, about 20,000 acres each, these represent similar soil conditions in more than a million acres,” said Broz.

“Atrazine has provided the ability to control grasses and weeds in no-till farming systems. Without such weed control, many farmers may never have adopted the concept of conservation tillage. Atrazine has become an important tool in promoting no-till and minimum-tillage farming systems that save soil and reduce water runoff,” he said.

“If farmers can determine and implement the best management practices that work effectively at preventing atrazine runoff, they should be able to continue using atrazine as a viable product,” he said.

Farmers use atrazine to control weeds on more than half of the corn, 65 percent of the grain sorghum and about 90 percent of the sugar cane grown in the U.S.



# China, corn and cattle: analyst explains their linked and bullish outlook

The No. 1 factor in cattle feeding profit or loss is not fed or feeder cattle price, beef demand or the nation's shrinking cow herd. It's the price of corn.

"U.S. cattlemen, I can't say it strong enough," said Dan Basse, president of AgResource Company of Chicago. "You've got to be focused on grain prices and your ingredient prices because it's going to determine who stays in business, who makes money, who expands and who goes." Basse addressed crowds at the Feeding Quality Forum Nov. 9 in Grand Island, Neb., and Nov. 11 in Amarillo, Texas. The market analyst examined the interactions between corn and beef markets, starting with global factors that affect both. "It used to be when I woke up in the morning, I would look at the weather forecast as one of the first drivers for grain markets," Basse said. "Now I get up and the first thing I think about is, what are the Chinese markets doing?"

In general, that economy is bullish, its gross domestic product (GDP) expanding at 8% to 12% per year. As such countries emerge, demand rises for all raw materials, Basse said.

The average income for a Chinese worker is \$4,300, significant because studies indicate people start including more meat in their diets as annual incomes reach \$5,000.

"Feeding those people in that new higher economic status is going to be important for us all," he said.

"China is now consuming record amounts of rice, corn and cotton. We've seen these commodity markets just explode upwards as China finds its dominance in terms of world economic power." The Chinese government has historically placed a great emphasis on being food secure and holds high volumes of commodity reserves, but that's changing in an effort to curtail food inflation.

"If Chinese food inflation is rising above 5.5% or 6%, that's a warning sign to their government," Basse said. "If you're making \$4,000 per year and you're already spending 60% of that amount on food to begin with, and food inflation is taking control of another 6%, that's a worry."

Since March, China has sold corn reserves on weekly auctions trying to regain control, but even after a record crop in that country, food prices are still rising.

"You're selling a million tons a week and prices are still rising — what are you going to do next?" Basse asked. "You better go and get some of that U.S. corn, and I don't care what price it is because we need food security. I don't know how the Chinese avoid buying U.S. corn sometime after the first of the year." U.S. grain ending stocks are relatively tight, too.

"U.S. cattlemen, why I'm so focused on China is that not only do we have to fight the ethanol monster each and every day, but we have to fight the Chinese for what's left," Basse said.

There is increasing global competition for by-products as well.

"China can import distillers grain without a tax. Corn comes in with a 13% tax, but distillers grain comes in tax free and they like the product," he said.

Even Brazilian sugar price affects the industry. It has been trading at \$.31 per pound this fall, but break-even for using sugar in ethanol production is near \$.18/lb.

"If you are the biggest ethanol producers in Brazil, what do you do?" Basse asked. "You sell sugar on the world market and you bring in ethanol from somewhere else." So foreign markets are helping prop up U.S. corn-based ethanol production, he said—and with current price relationships, it would take at least \$6.50-per-bushel corn before those margins turn negative.

"You are going to be fighting the corn market for multiple years," he said. Domestic and export demand for U.S. corn requires 13.8 billion bu. If there are 87 million planted acres next year, the yields need to be at least 174 bu./acre to break even with demand. This year, yields were the third-highest in history at 154.3 bu./acre.

"The corn market is what drives everything, and unfortunately I don't see a way we can get corn prices relaxing unless we have multiple years of good weather," Basse said. A drought, or any other major yield detractor, would push prices even higher.

There is good news for cattle producers however: global meat demand is higher.

"We're now back to exporting one in 10 head of the cattle we slaughter," he said. "We're getting back to pre-BSE [bovine spongiform encephalopathy] days."

The pork industry derives twice as much business from overseas, exporting one in five head. If the beef industry reached that point, fed cattle prices could reach \$118 to \$120 per hundredweight.

"That would create real competition between the U.S. consumer and the world," Basse said. "Quality is something we always want to be cognizant of, because it's our key marketing grounds that we'll have for working our beef into those Asian markets." He's predicting cattle prices to reach record highs in 2011.

"Being bullish on cattle is one thing, but what I really want you to be focused on is the margin on grains," he said. "Only the producers who have vision on feed prices will make money and hold on to equity long-term."

## USDA publishes Grassland Reserve Program final rule

USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) recently issued the final rule for the Grassland Reserve Program (GRP), which defines requirements for participants and incorporates changes to program implementation requested by the public. The final rule can be viewed at [www.regulations.gov](http://www.regulations.gov).

"We have lost more than 21 million acres of ranchland and pastureland to development over the past 25 years," said NRCS Chief Dave White. "GRP helps to retain agricultural lands ensuring healthy and diverse ecosystems that benefit the landowner and the surrounding community while also providing wildlife habitat."

The final rule addresses public comments on various program definitions, wind power, native species, landowner contributions, long-term management funding, ranking priorities, state-level priorities and the terms and conditions of GRP deeds.

GRP is a voluntary program that helps landowners restore and protect grassland, rangeland, pastureland, scrubland, and other lands, and provides assistance for rehabilitating grasslands. The program supports working grazing operations, enhancement of plant and animal biodiversity, and protection of grassland and land containing shrubs and forbs under the threat of conversion. GRP is available in all 50 states and territories. NRCS and USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) administer the program.

Applications are accepted continuously. Each application is ranked by the NRCS State Conservationist and the FSA State Executive Director based upon criteria developed with input from the state technical committee.

Participants agree to limit future development and cropping uses of the land. They retain the right to conduct common grazing practices and operations; this is subject to certain restrictions during nesting seasons of bird species that are in significant decline. A grazing management plan is required for all participants.

Privately owned grasslands and shrublands make up the largest land cover on America's private lands, covering more than 525 million acres. Grasslands are vital to livestock production. They provide food, cover, and nesting areas for wildlife, and filter nutrients from soil that would otherwise enter surface and groundwater. Healthy grasslands also prevent climate change by storing carbon dioxide that would re-enter the atmosphere and increase the greenhouse effect.

# Smart firewood buys take some know-how

Getting the most for your money can be tricky with firewood.

The basic measure for selling firewood is the cord – a well-stacked pile that adds up to 128 cubic feet (usually 4 feet high, 8 feet long and 4 feet deep). It's a measure of volume or the pile's size in 3-D.

That alone can be tricky, according to Charles Barden, forester with Kansas State University Research and Extension. If nothing else, one person's definition of a properly stacked firewood pile can differ from another's.

At the same time, though, the pile's size isn't the best guide to its worth in dollar terms. That measure is something else: The denser (and heavier) the wood, the higher its heating value. Pound for pound, all woods have the same heating value, Barden said. But, the amount of wood needed to make up a pound varies by tree species – sometimes by quite a bit. Compared to oak, for example, cottonwood isn't very dense. And, because it's lighter weight, it burns faster. "In fact, you would need more than two cords of cottonwood to equal the heat value or weight of a single cord of oak," Barden said. "So, to be fair, a single cord of cottonwood should cost no more than half the price of a cord of oak."

But, weight itself isn't a worry-free measure, he said. A fresh-cut cord of green firewood can be up to 60 percent water. As a result, it can weigh hundreds or even thousands of pounds more than the same cord, after curing (air-drying) down to a 20 to 25 percent moisture level. Properly curing or seasoning the densest

woods can take almost a year, Barden said. During that time, the logs must be open to the air, preferably protected from precipitation.

"A seller may tell you the wood he split this fall will be just fine. At best, though, green wood is a frustration," he warned. "Uncured wood doesn't put out much heat. It smolders, and its fire keeps going out. Besides, the moisture that goes up with the smoke will accelerate your chimney's creosote build-up."

Barden provided the following tips to help fireplace and woodstove owners become more savvy buyers:

1. The best way to get the most for your money is to find a wood seller with a solid reputation, based on a growing base of satisfied customers who return year after year.

2. An easy way to be overcharged is to buy firewood by the pickup load. A pickup bed can't handle the weight or volume of a cord. So, no standard measure can help you judge what you're getting, unless you're willing to take two or more trips to haul a full cord home.

"Don't be reassured if someone tells you he'll just charge you for a rick," Barden said. "Nowadays, some people seem to think a rick is a half or a quarter of a cord. But, a rick is simply a pile – whether hay or wood, no matter what size it is."

3. The surest way to get an honest cord of wood is to stack and measure it yourself.

4. "Seasoned" firewood will look its age:

a. Green wood can be fairly neat. On the outside, it's not much different from the branches you see on trees. When split open, it has much the

same clean, fresh look of the boards you buy at a lumber yard. b. Cured firewood looks gray or dingy-dark, and it's often rather dusty. The cut ends reveal lots of cracks in the log's inner rings. When split open, the wood inside is dry and white.

5. If you can find them, the premium, top-value fuel woods in the central High Plains are hedge (Osage orange), hickory and oak. In fact, despite its reputation, oak is No. 3 in terms of heating value.

6. The more information you have in memory, pocket or purse, the better you can assess offerings of mixed hardwoods – even if you still have to ask the seller which species of wood make up the majority of a mix. In general, the faster a tree grows, the less dense its wood will be. More specifically, however, the cen-

tral U.S. trees that provide the least heat value per cord include these lightweights: cottonwood, basswood (linden), elm, silver maple and willow. As firewood, they're fine only if you're interested in kindling or lighting the fireplace for an hour or two over the holidays.

In contrast, the better-to-best central U.S. firewoods come from ash, hackberry, hedge, hickory, locust, hard maple, oak and pecan trees.

"The more you depend on wood as a heat source for your home, the more important this kind of information can be. The quality of the firewood you buy will not only impact its price but also its heating power and the number of cords you'll need to get through the winter," Barden said.

He recommends that serious wood buyers con-

sult the University of Missouri Extension factsheet at <http://extension.missouri.edu/publications/DisplayPub.aspx?P=G5450>. It includes specific comparisons of common woods' heating values and provides a chart that compares firewoods to other common heating fuels.

"No matter how serious you are, though, please remember to limit yourself to buying firewood harvested within 50 miles of where you live. Following that rule is the only way we'll have any

hope of limiting the spread of 1,000 cankers disease in black walnuts and the highly destructive emerald ash borer," Barden said.

## Sparks and Cloyd families honored with the Barbara McHargue award at American Royal

During the 42nd National Charolais Show at the American Royal two families were recognized as recipients of the Barb McHargue award. Gordan and Kay Sparks, along with their son James and daughter Jaime, of LaMonte, Missouri, and Buford and Darlene Cloyd, of Kiowa were recognized for their commitment to the development of the cattle industry. The award is given in memory of Barbara Tucker McHargue to honor her commitment and perseverance in promoting youth involvement in the cattle industry. The award is not just considered for Charolais breeders, but for individuals who have supported youth throughout the cattle industry. This year's honorees were all dear friends of Barb.

The Sparks family was recognized for being continually involved in all parts of the Charolais industry. They are known for being willing to think outside of the box and take charge. Always enthusiastic to step up to the plate when they're needed, Kay and Jaime were instrumental in the revamping of the Miss Charolais USA program. As a family, they are known for helping kids get their start with cattle, teaching everything from feeding to fitting; they educate young people in all aspects of herdsmanhip.

Austin Reedy, a 15-year old from Windsor, Missouri, got to experience the mentoring of the Sparks family for himself. Austin, who has been showing cattle for seven years, purchased his first Charolais heifer from the

Sparkses this year. James and his family helped Austin get his heifer ready for shows, gave advice on which bull to breed to, bred the heifer, and served as a guide all along the way. Austin was thrilled to have a class winner at a national show like the American Royal, with a lot of thanks to the Sparks family. Austin is only one of the many youth exhibitors the Sparks family has mentored.

The Sparks were close family friends of Barb McHargue. Kay recalled taking show results from the American Royal to Barb when she was in the hospital. She described Barb as "one of those people who touched your heart. Young people were the most important thing to Barbara. She had no biological children, but she had lots of children, including my own."

Buford Cloyd was recognized for his work as a pioneer in the United States Charolais industry. He is known for beginning the push to make the show ring a viable marketing tool for Charolais cattle. "Cloyd was instrumental at the time of infancy of Charolais cattle in the show ring," commented David Hobbs of the American International Charolais Association, "There were times he would bring 20 or 30 cattle just to ensure that there would be a show."

Cloyd met Barb when she was Barb Tucker. She came to work for him when he was herdsman at Litton Ranch in Missouri. Buford described Barbara as a "tough worker. She'd give you her last dollar.

She didn't let any cattle come into the ring looking less than 100 per cent." Buford described Barb as "the most wonderful person in the world."

Both families spoke of fond memories of a wonderful lady who is greatly missed by many in all breeds of the cattle industry. Barb was described as a "straight shooter," and "a great gal." Barb free-lanced for all different breeds, and in her time in the cattle industry she taught a lot of kids about the importance of hard work and integrity. Two awards are given each year, one to recognize a current member of the cattle industry who exemplifies the virtues of Barb McHargue, and a second award to a member of the cattle industry who has exemplified these same virtues in the past.

## National Hereford Feedout tests Hereford efficiency

In 2010, 465 cattle were fed through the National Hereford Feedout. Divided into a winter test and a spring test, the National Hereford Feedout has been testing cattle for six years.

"The data from the 2010 feedout has been gathered and the results clearly show that the trend for Hereford cattle working in the feedyard and carcass phase is confirmed again. Over the years, Hereford breeders involved have improved the muscling, marbling, growth and yield of the Hereford cattle tested without negatively affecting the most important trait of all, efficiency," says Tom Granzow, test coordinator and Kansas Hereford Association (KHA) secretary.

In the winter test, 281 cattle were placed on feed in December 2009. The steers gained 3.87 lb. per day at a cost of gain at \$.59 lb. of gain total. Average feed intake was 5.26 lb. of feed per lb. of gain compared to a yard average of 5.69. This is a 9% advantage to Herefords in feed consumed and a 12% advantage in feed costs. Yet, the Hereford steers were even with the yard average on gain at 3.60 lb. per day. This is a \$42.38 feed savings per animal to the Hereford cattle tested. In the carcass phase, the Herefords had a yield of 65.14%, a Yield Grade of 2.97, hot carcass weight of 810 lb., a backfat measurement of .49 inches, and a marbling score of 5.0 (low Choice). The ribeye area averaged 13.35. The live weight on this group of

steers averaged 1,243 lb.

The spring phase of the test began in February with 184 steers. The steers gained 3.87 lb. per day. On the rail, the steers had an average ribeye area of 13.62 inches, an average backfat of .51 inches, an average marbling score of 5.1 (low Choice), and a hot carcass weight of 857 lb. All of this computed to an average Yield Grade of 3.14. The average live weight on this group was 1,327 lb.

The National Hereford Feedout allows producers from across the country to consign whiteface cattle. The KHA organizes the program in such a way that Hereford and Hereford-English cross pens can be entered in the test with just a minimum of five head. The steers in the 2010 feedout represented a diverse cross-section of Hereford genetics and were all handled the same. They were sorted by weight and body type, and after 75 days on feed, ultrasound data for backfat was collected. The cattle were then marketed according to ultrasound data, with a de-

sired backfat thickness of .4 inches. In this manner, the cattle were all subjected to the same environmental conditions and feed. At harvest they were individually weighed again, and final carcass information was gathered.

The feed efficiency of each steer was calculated based on a Cornell University formula that breaks down pen statistics into individual feed efficiency figures by accounting for maintenance and growth requirements of different sized animals.

At the end of the trial, each participant gets a graph analysis of his or her cattle ranked in comparison to the others in cost of gain (COG), as well as other performance and carcass data measures. For producers who consign sire groups, this service provides for genetic selection and rapid herd progress. # Kansas Profile

## Cliff Ralstin — Humboldt Union

Tokyo, Japan. April, 2010. The television is carrying a documentary about the state of the media in the United States. Unfortunately, the broadcast is in the Japanese language which I don't understand. But part of the program is video coverage of a small-town Kansas newspaper. Why would the Japanese send a TV crew halfway around the world to rural Kansas? It's the subject of today's Kansas Profile.

Cliff and Kim Ralstin are owners and publishers of The Humboldt Union in Humboldt. Their remarkable story was featured on Japanese public television in spring 2010.

The Humboldt Union is a weekly newspaper which had been continuously published for 129 years, but closed its doors in 2005. Two years later a man named Stewart Braden restarted the newspaper. He also operated the paper in nearby Yates Center. One of the

people working for him there was Kim Ralstin.

In March 2008, Kim and her husband Cliff Ralstin, who live near Humboldt, took over the ownership of The Humboldt Union. "He does all the writing," Kim said.

"I don't consider myself a journalist," Cliff said. "I came from a background in manufacturing. But the people here wanted a newspaper, and the community has embraced us. They're glad to have us back."

The reopening of a small-town newspaper caught the eye of Gloria Freeland, director of the Huck Boyd National Center for Community Media in K-State's School of Journalism. She and professor Steve Smethers, associate director of the school, did some research on the topic. They con-

cluded that it was vital for community citizens to have a newspaper.

"I think it's wonderful that Humboldt, Kansas didn't give up the idea of having its paper back," Freeland said. "Although I haven't met Cliff and Kim, I've talked to Cliff on the phone, and I admire the couple's hard work to give their community the news it needs."

When they published their research, it caught another set of eyes much further away: Clear over in Japan. The Japanese national public television network was working on a special about the state of the media in the U.S. Ultimately, the Japanese arranged for a TV crew to come to Humboldt to see this phenomenon firsthand.

"They followed me around for four days," Cliff said. "They showed me selling advertising, going to press, and even came in at five in the morning when we were putting together the paper." Only two of the four-person crew spoke English.

"On the morning they left, the producer stated that being here changed his whole perspective on print media," Cliff said. "It helped him realize how important it is to the community." The producer even found it a moving experience. "He used the word 'moved' three times," Cliff said.



"I think they set out to do a story about how newspapers were dying in America, but that's not what they found," he said.

What makes a newspaper significant to a community? The key appears to be local coverage. "All Humboldt, all the time," Kim said. "We focus on Humboldt," Cliff said. "People can get the national news anywhere. We try to focus on the positive things in the community. There's so much happening in this little town.

We have a positive, faith-based, progressive community." Humboldt is a town of 1,964 people. That's rural – but there's more. The Ralstins actually live in the nearby town of Rose, which is unincorporated. When asked the population of Rose, Cliff said, "Well, there's Mrs. Wright, Kelly and his wife, and Terry and JD..." When he was done counting, he concluded that Rose had a population of 16 people. Now, that's rural. "I believe the rural way of life

is the best way of life there is," Cliff said.

It's time to leave Tokyo, where the national Japanese public television network was broadcasting a show with video of a rural Kansas newspaper. We commend Cliff and Kim Ralstin and the people of Humboldt for supporting local coverage and bringing the newspaper back to life. I can't understand the Japanese language on the TV show, but I do understand that this newspaper is making a difference.
