Wheat yield contest entry deadline extended to April 8

Extreme weather conditions throughout Kansas have prompted the Kansas Wheat Commission to postpone the entry deadline of the Kansas Wheat Yield Contest to April 8.

Justin Gilpin, chief executive officer of the KWC, says the extra time will allow farmers to evaluate their wheat stands and give the crop a chance to thrive, and thus make important management decisions to maximize yield. Three \$1,000 cash prizes and several potential bonus awards are at stake for wheat growers who enter the 2011 Kansas Wheat Yield Contest, sponsored by the Kansas Wheat Commission and Kansas Association of Wheat Growers.

Producers achieving the top yield receive a \$1,000 cash prize and plaque. Contest winners will be announced next summer. The contest includes three regions: Region 1 (Western Kansas), Region 2 (Central Kansas) and Region 3 (Eastern Kansas). Entry deadline for the 2011 Wheat Yield Contest is April 8.

Corporate sponsors of the Yield Contest include:

BASF, Syngenta, SFP, Kansas Wheat Alliance and the Kansas Grain Inspection Service. Many of these partners are offering special rewards for qualified entrants. For example:

The Kansas Wheat Alliance was founded by Kansas wheat producers, seedsmen, and researchers to create a variety delivery system that provides new funds for wheat research, and ensures availability of improved wheat varieties to benefit farmers and consumers. New for 2011, farmers will be eligible to partici-

pate in a Quality Initiative of the Wheat Yield Contest. Each contest participant will be asked to submit a five-pound sample of wheat from the contest field. The quality of that sample will be evaluated by the Kansas Grain Inspection Service for dockage, test weight and protein. Top scoring samples will be further tested at the Kansas State University Wheat Quality Laboratory, where milling and baking attributes will be evaluated. The sample with the top quality score will receive a \$250 cash prize. "High yields may capture the spotlight, but high quality captures the market," Harries says. "As we learned from the 2010 contest, good yields and quality can go hand in hand with the right management practices. Ultimately, good quality is what can differentiate U.S. wheat in a competitive global marketplace."

Folks who enter the contest will be asked to share management information about their farm, including details about

tillage and agronomic practices, crop protection products usage and more. A third party verifier will be employed at harvest to ensure the integrity of the contest.

Wheat farmers who are 18 years or older from throughout Kansas are eligible to participate by enrolling a plot at least five acres in size. The fee is \$50 per entry. Producers may enter more than once, but each entry must be submitted on a separate entry form. Kansas Wheat directors, employees and spouses are prohibited from entering the contest. Contestants must use certified seed. The contest is open only to dryland fields.



Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

It was an eventful week in the markets. The gold and silver both made new highs and the natural gas reached the highest level since early February. The Dow Jones has basically regained all of the post- Japanese earthquake losses, so traders in general seem to be less nervous about the global economy slowing.

There will be a huge amount of information thrown at us in the next two weeks. April 8th will be the April supply and demand report and this week the USDA will release both the Quarterly Stocks report and the Prospective Plantings Report. Both of these reports could have market moving information. The key number in the stocks report will be the corn stocks. Ethanol production has been very strong and cattle on feed numbers have been above year ago levels, which means there is a chance that stocks are tighter than expected. A surprisingly small stocks level would be very supportive to the old crop contracts.

As for the Plantings numbers, both the corn and soybean figures will be watched closely. We have to have more corn acres, and yet we cannot give up soybean acres. This report will have huge ramifications on

the spread trade for both old crop – new crop spreads in the corn and soybeans and the spread relationship between the corn and soybeans.

For the week the July corn gained 5 ½ cents and the December picked up 11. The spread trade between the old crop and new crop contracts was very active. Ideas of better demand helped the old crop corn get back a big part of the losses against the new crop by the end of the week.

Traders waited all week for confirmation of a big Chinese corn purchase, and it never came. USDA announced a sale of 1.25 MMT to unknown destinations, which could very well be China, but it could also be Japan. Rumors of Asian corn demand have been persistent, and where there is smoke, there is usually fire, so there may be more big announcements next week. Although the corn market didn't react favorably to Friday's big sales announcement, and we ended up with buy the rumor, sell the fact, type trade, the big sale, no matter who it went to, will put a great deal of pressure on USDA to raise the export estimate. The recent sales pace has simply been too strong and this week's sale will only add to that. A larger export estimate, along

with possible increases in the feed usage estimate, and the ethanol usage estimate will draw the ending stocks estimate down to extremely tight levels in the April supply and demand report.

The wheat market chopped sideways last week. The July KW gained 10 cents for the week, but it also stalled out right at last week's high. Failing at last week's high followed by a mediocre close isn't very encouraging from a technical stand point, but the fundamentals are a different story. The recent export sales pace indicates USDA may have made a mistake when cutting the export estimate last month. The concern right now is the shipment pace. The sales are being made, but the wheat hasn't left the country yet. The other big fundamental, and it becomes bigger every day, is the poor state of the HRW crop. Crop conditions are terrible. When the national numbers come out on April 4th, they will be horrendous. I think that once the USDA starts putting out the weekly condition ratings, the sorry state of our wheat crop will get more attention, and when that happens the wheat market will get more attention from the spec community and from end users, such as importers, who will

want to secure supplies and avoid problems later in the year. Use a close above \$8.80 in the July KW as your signal to buy July KW \$9.50 calls.

The old crop soybeans lost a little ground last week with the July contract falling 3 cents. The new crop November, however, gained 16 ½ cents. There is concern that USDA will come out with a soybean acreage estimate that is below year ago levels, and that probably won't work without some major demand rationing, which is why the bear spreads were working this week. If USDA comes out with a low acreage guess, the November contract will have to get to work buying back acres.

Old crop demand is still better than what we can handle too, with export

sales coming in at 264,500 MT. That doesn't seem like a lot, but sales were so strong in the fall, we just don't have to do much. So the lack of strength in the front months isn't based so much off of lack of bullish fundamentals as it is the fundamentals are potentially getting very bullish for the new crop and the spread trade puts pressure on the old crop contracts.

Despite the lack of strength last week, the old crop soybean charts suggest there is still plenty of upside potential in the market. With just a little bit of fundamental help it is very likely that the May soybeans will retest the highs.

I think there is considerable upside risk in the soybeans. If USDA comes out with a low acreage estimate, both the old crop and new

crop futures will move sharply higher. Buy the May soybean \$14.00 call to take advantage of a rally.

Live cattle and feeder cattle futures both gained more than \$6.00 last week and there were numerous new contract highs. One just cannot underestimate the upside potential of the cattle market. It is very likely that the Japanese will be importing more US beef and pork in the near future which will only serve to put more upward pressure on US beef prices. The overall fundamental outlook of the livestock industry in very bullish and it is getting more so every day. The simplest way to put it is that our cow herd is shrinking, but our demand is rising. From a historical perspective, in terms of buying power, \$118 live cattle are cheap. The

Each regional winner will receive a \$5,000 cash prize from Monsanto, and the farm mom receiving the most online votes by May 26 will receive an additional \$2,500 and the title of America's Farmers Mom of the Year 2011.

Farm moms make valuable contributions in the field, and often they are also bookkeepers, cooks, teachers, FFA advisers, veterinarians, drivers, mentors, spokespeople and volunteers.

"We're looking forward to reading about more amazing, hard-working farm moms this year. I encourage everyone to nominate their favorite farm mom — she could be this year's winner!"

To be eligible, a mom must be at least 18 years of age and work on a working farm or livestock operation. Anyone can submit a nomination by visiting the America's Farmers website

and explaining in 300 words or fewer how their favorite farm mom embodies the farm family way of life. Nominations will be judged by Monsanto and American Agri-Women (AAW), a national coalition of women's farmer, ranch and agribusiness organizations.

hoped that other parks will create their own quilts and join the display. From July 3 – August 14, 2011 two of the student quilts will be on display at the Stauth Memorial Museum in Montezuma, representing Chase and Graham counties as part of the many 150th statehood celebrations being held this year across Kansas. Subsequent exhibit dates and locations are pending, including the National Park Service Midwest Regional Office in Omaha, Neb. and the Na-



Grassland plants after wildfire show minimal lasting impact

Prescribed fires are often used to control undesirable species and enhance herbaceous biomass production. But what are the results when a wildfire burns out of control? In March 2006, more than 367,000 hectares burned in wildfires known as the East Amarillo Complex that raged in the U.S. Texas Panhandle. By studying the survival and re-growth of plants from these wildfires, scientists can learn more about its effects on the ecosystem.

An article in the January 2011 issue of the journal Rangeland Ecology & Management reports on a study of the effects of wildfire on perennial grass mortality and peak standing crop at one, two, and three years following the Texas fires. Plots of grasses in burned areas were compared with plots in unburned areas.

The wildfires increased perennial grass mortality. The impact was strongest in the first growing season after the fire, but greater growth occurred for three successive years following the fire. A significant effect was still noted after three growing seasons.

Wildfire effects on the standing crop of grasses, however, were more short-lived. The burn sites showed modest to no impact on standing crop in the following years. This study did not find a link between frequency of individual plant mortality and standing crop production.

Similar growth following a fire may occur because the death of individual plants releases resources that can be used by surviving plants. Burned sites were able to produce the same biomass as unburned sites because surviving plants could “take up the slack” using the additional resources that would have been used by the dead plants.

Researchers found that these plants exhibited a resilience that likely reflects the historical role of fire in this ecosystem. Grassland plant species have endured frequent cycles of burning. Adaptations to these conditions, such as bud banks at or below ground level or the production of surplus branch meristems, are common.

The effects of these wildfires were found to be similar to the effects of prescribed burns. The minimal impacts associated with these wildfires suggests that additional land management in unnecessary to counter their effects.

No-till soil management and cover crop field day to be held near Gypsum

Research conducted by K-State agronomists shows that cover crops can provide benefits that improve no-till performance. A field day with a focus on soil management and use of cover crops in a no-till cropping system will be held near Gypsum on Tuesday, April 5th, starting at 1:30 p.m. Participants are asked to RSVP to the CKD-Salina office at 785-309-5850 so adequate materials are available. There is no cost to attend.

First stop will be at a field planted to a cover crop of annual ryegrass on the Mike Jensen farm. The location coming from the east is

3 miles west of Gypsum, on Hwy K-4 and ½ mile south on Niles Rd. or coming from the west is 1 ½ miles east of Southeast of Saline School on Hwy K-4 and ½ mile south on Niles Rd.

Deann Presley, K-State Extension soil and water conservation specialist, will discuss soil management issues in no-till farming systems including research findings with cover crops, dealing with soil compaction issues and the benefits of earthworms in no-till. The field day will feature a soil pit for participants to view the soil profile, soil structure, soil com-

paction and look at rooting patterns of the cover crop. Kraig Roozeboom, Extension cropping systems specialist, will discuss cover crops and the impact of cover crops on soil quality and crop yields in a no-till crop rotation.

The second stop will be at a recently expired CRP contract field that was no-till seeded to wheat last fall. Tom Maxwell, CKD Extension agent, will discuss fac-

tors to consider in the transition from CRP to a no-till cropping system.

The field day is sponsored by K-State Research & Extension and the Central Kansas Extension District. In case of rain or muddy field conditions on April 5th, the field day will be rescheduled for April 8th. All area farmers and other persons interested in no-till farming are invited to attend.



state bureaucracy, however, the state agencies were unable or unwilling to fund such a show.

When he reported these results to his fellow members in the Kansas chapter of the Western Music Association, the response was vintage Kansas. In effect, it was: “Fine, we won’t wait for the government. We will do this ourselves.”

And so the members of the Kansas Chapter of the WMA took on this idea as a grassroots project of their own. As Martha Farrell, the show’s producer, said, “Out of hardship comes inspiration, as is always the case with Kansans.” A date and showtime were set. As we wrote in Grass and Grain a few weeks ago, this first-ever performance was titled “Kansas – Home on the Range” and scheduled for the historic Fox Theatre in downtown Hutchinson on March 13, 2011. Performers came from Texas and Colorado, as well as around the state, for this musical salute to Kansas and its people.

There was one catch: Would anybody come to watch?


We didn’t know what to expect for an audience, and there was always the possibility that the project would lose money. But members got out the word and went forward in faith.

On March 13, more than 500 people convened for “Kansas – Home on the Range.” I performed cowboy poetry in the show, including the accompanying poem. When WMA was requesting performers for the show last fall, we were urged to bring only our very best. On that stage on March 13, the very best came forward.

Barry Ward sang about the resilience of Greensburg. The Diamond W Wranglers sang of the bravery of the pioneer. Martha Farrell’s company, First Generation Video, provided wonderful video backdrops. The inimitable Judy Coder yodeled, Tallgrass Express played a bluegrass beat, and much, much more. As these performers’ voices soared, it sent a chill up my spine.

Then it was time for the finale. All the performers, including the McPherson Children’s Choir, took the stage. As the Hutchinson Symphony played Home on the Range, the entire company joined in.

Even with me singing off-key, it was a magical moment.

Kansas Wheat Research Foundation offers Herb Clutter scholarship

Students looking for help funding college expenses should apply for the Herb Clutter Memorial Scholarship, a scholarship program to honor Herb Clutter's influential role in organizing leadership groups on behalf of Kansas wheat producers.

The Herb Clutter Memorial Scholarship was established in 2009 by the Kansas Wheat Research Foundation, which is administered by the Kansas Association of Wheat Growers.

The scholarship fund will award one \$500 scholarship per year, to a college or university-bound incoming freshman from Kansas, pursuing a career in the field of agriculture. To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must be a full-time student at any two or four year, Kansas college or university.

Recipients will be selected based on academic achievement, leadership qualities and career objectives focused around the field of agriculture. Recipients will receive the scholarship to be applied toward tuition for the student's college or university education. The scholarship is non-renewable.

The Herb Clutter Memorial Scholarship was established through a fund in memory of Herbert W. Clutter, a farmer from Holcomb and the first president of the National Association of Wheat Growers, which was established in 1948. Clutter encouraged Kansas wheat farmers to organize as a strong, unified voice, which led to the formation of the Kansas Association of

Wheat Growers in 1952. He encouraged research in education and industrial uses of wheat, use of more wheat as food, improved variety development and methods to produce the best product at the lowest cost. Clutter's efforts led to the formation of the Kansas Wheat Commission by the Kansas legislature, in 1957.

The slayings of Herb Clutter, his wife, Bonnie and their children Kenyon and Nancy were chronicled in the Truman Capote book, *In Cold Blood*.

“Herb’s story and the impact he had on the wheat industry serves as an excellent example to young adults as they begin their college careers,” says Justin Gilpin, CEO, Kansas Wheat. “His vision, hard work, and sense of community are all qualities tomorrow’s leaders will need to possess.”

Applicants of the Herb Clutter Memorial Scholarship must complete the scholarship application, which includes a 400-500 word essay discussing why they have chosen to pursue a career in agriculture. The selection committee will use this essay along with application in determining the scholarship winner. The deadline for scholarship applications is April 15, 2011.

Highly efficient food production can feed a hungry planet – making safe, affordable and abundant food a global reality

Global food prices have reached record highs in the past months. Hunger afflicts more than 1 billion people around the world. Emerging nations seeking to diversify their citizens' diets are driving demand for more food, while we're learning more about how fragile our environment is. is environmentally right. Modern technology is allowing today's farmers to produce more food while consuming fewer environmental resources and generating less waste. An acre of wheat globally today feeds nearly six people, compared to feeding just two people half a century ago. As emerging nations help drive demand for more food, technology provides a resource-efficient means of meeting rising demand. Despite the Green Revolution's legacy of employing agricultural technologies to improve yields and eradicate famines, some fringe groups seek to restrict farmers' access to efficiency-enhancing technologies. They push for laws and regulations that make food production less efficient. "The world already has a proven and powerful weapon to fight an affliction that killed more than 18 million people between 2008 and 2010. Denying people access to technology that can make safe, affordable food more abundant is wrong and a violation of basic rights all people deserve," said Simmons. Simmons authored a 2009

white paper titled "Food Economics and Consumer Choice," which expanded upon the assertion that by 2050, the world will need to produce 100 percent more food and according to the United Nations


Food and Agriculture Organization, 70 percent of that food must be produced with efficiency-enhancing agricultural technologies. Both papers are posted at www.plentytothink.org. Simmons encourages food producers, manufacturers and consumers to visit the blog and submit their comments on what it will take to feed 9 billion people by 2050.

USDA and USTR announce U.S. beef and beef products now have greater access to Chilean market

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack and U.S. Trade Representative Ron Kirk announced last week that U.S. producers are now eligible to ship a larger array of U.S. beef and beef products to Chile. The market opening in Chile follows months of bilateral meetings between officials from the Chilean government, USDA and the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative. President Obama recently visited Chile to meet with Chilean leaders to discuss how the United States can create jobs in America by deepening our economic relationship and expanding exports to South America.

“This action by the government of Chile will provide Chilean consumers with greater access to safe, high-quality U.S. beef,” Vilsack said. “Since day one, the Obama Administration has remained committed to removing barriers to trade, expanding market access for U.S. farmers and ranchers, and lowering tariffs on U.S. agricultural goods. These negotiations were based on a mutual respect for international, science-based standards, and USDA will continue to work with other nations to open their markets to U.S. beef based on the same, internationally accepted principles.”

“Expanding our market for U.S. beef exports to Chile is an important advance,” said Kirk. “Having just attended the meetings between President Obama

and President Pinera in Chile, I know how vibrant and deep our trade relationship is. The commitment of Chile and the United States to work together to promote science-based trade rules while providing our consumers with safe and wholesome foods is a win-win for both countries.”

The United States exported approximately \$6.2 million in beef and beef products to Chile in 2010. Worldwide, the United States exported nearly \$4.1 billion of beef and beef products in calendar year 2010, up 32 percent from 2009. The value of U.S. beef exports for 2010 was on par with beef trade figures preceding 2004, when bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) was discovered in December 2003 in a cow that

had been exported from Canada to Washington state. Since that time, USDA has worked hard to regain market access for U.S. beef and beef products around the world. Currently, more than 100 markets are open to U.S. beef.

U.S. farm exports, including beef and beef products, reached an all-time high of \$115.8 billion in calendar year 2010. The most recent forecast for U.S. farm exports in fiscal year 2011 (Oct. 1, 2010 – Sept. 30, 2011) anticipates a record \$135.5 billion in sales for products from U.S. farmers, ranchers and processors, which would support more than 1.1 million jobs. The U.S. agricultural trade surplus is expected to reach a record \$47.5 billion in fiscal year 2011.

Dramatic payoff of ag research spotlighted on Capitol Hill

The importance of agriculture research to feeding an exploding global population and keeping the U.S. economy strong was highlighted this week in Washington in a new paper released on ag research return-on-investment and as part of FY2012 budget discussions.

Last week, the Council for Agricultural Science and Technology, commonly known as CAST, released a new paper taking a deep dive into the historic returns from agriculture research.

The paper showed that research knowledge pays off over a long period of time, but also depreciates and requires maintenance because agricultural pests continually evolve.

Public agriculture research expenditures grew by only 0.6 percent between 1990 and 2009, CAST

said, and U.S. agricultural productivity growth has begun to slow while that in countries such as Brazil and China continues to grow.

Still, there is significant return on investment in agriculture research. Every dollar spent on public ag research and Extension returns \$32 to society. This echoes a separate study from Texas AgriLife Extension Service estimating wheat variety research and Extension for 2009 alone provided \$24 per acre in increased net returns to farmers.

And while most Americans don't realize it, from 1948 to 2009 the share of U.S. household income spent on food declined from 22.3 to 9.5 percent.

These important facts were highlighted at a lunch-and-learn session for Capitol Hill staffers

sponsored by the National Coalition for Food and Agricultural Research (National C-FAR).

About 70 staffers attended the session, at which Dr. George Norton, a professor at Virginia Tech, presented the CAST findings during a provided lunch.

A representative of NAWG's staff also attended the luncheon and was available to meet with attendees who had specific questions about wheat.

Later in the week, the importance of public research investments even in a time of fiscal austerity was highlighted at a House Appropriations Committee agriculture subcommittee hearing to examine USDA's Research, Education and Economics (REE) mission area request for FY2012.

Dr. Catherine Woteki, USDA undersecretary for REE, was the chief witness

at the hearing. In her testimony, she highlighted the important public-private partnerships that exist in agriculture research, and agriculture's important contributions to the U.S. economy that are possible because of the basic research supported through USDA programs. Woteki and other Administration officials also specifically emphasized the contributions USDA has made to wheat research.

In an era of dramatic deficits and looming budget cuts, much of the hearing's discussions focused on why the federal government should be investing in agriculture research at all.

In her testimony, Woteki answered these calls, saying:

REE conducts research that is prohibitively expensive for private sector com-

panies but that undergirds technological development in private businesses.

Many REE-developed technologies move into the private sector for use by the agriculture, food and other industries.

Basic research done by REE often paves the way for demonstration and commercialization of new products and processes.

"The food and agriculture sector of the economy has proven to be strong. Focusing on and enhancing these high priority programs in the budget is critical to keeping them strong, and continuing their contributions to the future economic well-being of our country," she told subcommittee members.

NAWG continues to work with coalition part-

ners, including state associations, to demonstrate the value of agriculture research on Capitol Hill, particularly as budget decisions are being made for both FY2011 and FY2012.

Unlike crops including corn and soybeans, wheat is disproportionately dependent on public research. Wheat is also uniquely complicated, with regional-specific varieties of six unique types, called classes, grown across 42 U.S. states. Wheat's genome is larger than the human genome.

Feeder cattle prices hit record high

According to Drovers/CattleNetwork's 50-market auction summary, the average national price for 450-pound steer calves for March, 2011 is \$156.73. That represents a gain of \$10.06 per hundredweight from February, and \$34.75 per hundredweight higher than one year ago, or a 22 percent increase.

That's the highest monthly average price in the Drovers/CattleNetwork database. In fact, it's the third consecutive month for record-high average auction prices in the database. Average auction prices for 450-pound steer calves were recorded for Jan., Feb., and Mar. at \$143.65, \$146.67 and \$156.73, respectively.

The only other month in the Drovers/CattleNetwork database with average auction prices for 450-pound steers at \$140 or better was recorded in February, 2006, at \$143.49, the previous record-high.

Yearling steer prices have posted equally impressive gains. Steers weighing 750 pounds posted a national auction average of \$132.91 per hundredweight for March, a gain of \$7.52 over February. Those same steers sold in March of last year for \$105.11 per hundredweight. That means yearling steers are seeing bids of \$27.80 per hundredweight higher this year (\$208.50 more per head), or, a 21 percent increase.

Similar to steer calf prices, the yearling steer prices represent three consecutive months of record-highs in the Drovers/CattleNetwork database. Average auction prices for 750-pound yearling steers were recorded for Jan., Feb., and Mar. at \$124.25, \$125.39 and \$132.91, respectively.

The previous record in the Drovers/CattleNetwork database for 750-pound yearling steers was \$119.81, recorded in May, 2005.

Wool pelt values strengthen

The industry is experiencing record markets for lamb and wool with slaughter prices the highest seen in years and wool selling at rates not seen since 1989. Another less visible market for the sheep industry is that of wool pelts.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) reported that pelt prices increased fairly quickly over the last few months. Pelt demand is good while supply and offerings continue to be short.

The reported value of pelts has been volatile over the last 25 years. In 1987,

No. 1 U.S. pelts (pelts with a wool length of 5/8 to 1 inch) reached a 10-year high of \$10.25 per pelt. Prices fell from there ranging between \$4.82 and \$7.35 from 1988 through 1994. \$11 and \$12 No. 1 pelts were common from 2001 through 2004 before prices for No. 1 pelts again fell into the \$6 to \$7 range. For the week ending March 18, USDA reported No. 1 pelt prices at \$7 to \$12 per pelt.

U.S. pelt prices are reported by length of wool, but within a length category, the price actually paid might range considerably from the prices reported. Industry sources recently quoted No. 1 and Imperial Valley pelts at \$20 to \$25 per pelt.

Australian prices for pelts that were generally comparable in size to the average U.S. pelts last week brought \$22 to \$30 for clean pelts compared to \$10 to \$14 per pelt at the beginning of November 2010.

The Australian dollar has been at near parity with the U.S. dollar from the end of September 2010 until now, ranging between .95 and 1.01.

KDA warns of inspector impersonation fraud

The Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) is warning regulated business to not pay any licensing fees directly to individuals who come to their place of business claiming to be KDA inspectors.

"KDA does not collect any money in the field during food safety and lodging inspections," said KDA Food Safety Policy Director Erik Wisner. "All fees collected from these regulated businesses are submitted by mail or fax directly to the Topeka office."

KDA has received a report of an individual in southeast Kansas who impersonated a KDA employee and accepted a check in person from a business to renew its license. Several other businesses in the area also reported that an individual will come in and

ask for cash to perform a food safety inspection.

Any business that experiences an individual claiming to be a KDA inspector attempting to collect fees should not pay the individual and instead report the incident immediately to their local authorities as well as the KDA at 785-296-5600. Recent incidents of this type should also be reported to the authorities and the KDA.

The KDA promotes public safety by regulating the production and sale of food products in Kansas. Regulated entities include grocery stores, convenience stores, restaurants, schools, senior meal sites, mobile food units, lodging facilities, food wholesalers and warehouses, food processors and food manufacturers.

Kansas Ranch among Historic Angus Herd Award honorees

Hinkson Angus Ranch, Cottonwood Falls, is a recipient of the Historic Angus Herd Award, presented by the American Angus Association® for continuous ownership and production of Angus cattle for 50 or more years.

The Hinkson herd is owned by Frank II and Marilyn Hinkson, along with their son Trey. The herd was founded in 1959 by Hinkson's father, Frank Hinkson Sr. and his brother, Everett Hinkson.

The operation began in Lazbuddie, Texas, with 60 cows to raise bulls and send to a 1,500-head commercial Angus ranch in Arizona, owned by the

brothers. The cows were bought from Ralph Smith Dispersal, Chillicothe, Mo., and Essar Ranch of San Antonio, Texas.

The partnership in Arizona dissolved in 1984, and land was purchased at Cottonwood Falls. In 1985, Frank II, Marilyn, Trey and daughter Tyla moved to Kansas to manage the operation. Frank says he cannot remember a time when animals were not being raised on the land, now home to 325 registered Angus cattle.

The ranch has conducted an annual Angus bull sale for the last 15 years and sells approximately 110 bulls per year.

The second option will probably not appeal to producers with enterprise units on their wheat if they are going to harvest some

For those producers with wheat they will harvest, double crop sorghum may be an option to take advantage of high prices. If a producer wishes to double-crop sorghum behind harvested wheat, crop insurance may be available in certain Kansas and Oklahoma counties with a written agreement. If the crop is insured, it will count toward the SURE calculation on the farm. If the crop is not insured, then it will be a "ghost crop" and not used in the SURE calculation. As mentioned earlier, those enrolled in ACRE will have the choice to use the grain sorghum acres if they are beneficial in the ACRE calculation.
