Bipartisan bill sets five-year depreciation schedule for farming equipment

U.S. Sen. Jerry Moran (R-Kan.) joined U.S. Senators Pat Roberts (R-Kan.), Debbie Stabenow (D-Mich.) and Amy Klobuchar (D-Minn.) to introduce bipartisan legislation that would amend the U.S. tax code to permanently set a five-year depreciation schedule for agricultural equipment. The current tax code sets a seven-year depreciation schedule for agricultural equipment, while the depreciation schedule for construction equipment which is similar in use and

life span to farming equipment - is five years. Changing the depreciation schedule for agricultural equipment to five years would make the tax code more consistent and aid rural development by aligning depreciation and debt service, increasing farm income by over \$850 million a year, and helping farmers and ranchers finance new equipment and replace worn-out machinery.

"Common sense dictates that depreciation schedules should match the typical length of debt service farm machinery," Moran said. "By reforming the tax code, we will better align the code with the realities of agribusiness and support our nation's farmers and ranchers, who are critical to the success of our economy."

"Providing certainty in the tax code by making agriculture equipment eligible for a five-year depreciation schedule makes sense and will go a long way in helping America's farmers and ranchers invest in their businesses and communities," Roberts

"This bipartisan effort will strengthen American manufacturing and American agriculture," said Chairwoman Stabenow. "As chairwoman of the Senate Agriculture Committee, I'm committed to streamlining and simplifying our nation's farm policies and finding ways to make existing programs work better. This legislation will encourage farmers and agricultural producers to continue investing in their businesses, creating jobs and strengthening the economy."

"Putting money back in the pockets of our farmers and ranchers enables them to grow our agricultural economy and strengthen our rural communities," Klo-buchar said. "By bringing tax fairness to our farms and ranches, our agricultural producers can purchase the modern equipment that will allow them to produce more while spending less.'

A five-year depreciation schedule would boost domestic demand for equipment. The United States is the world leader in the production of agricultural equipment, with the industry directly and indirectly employing 250,000 workers.

Modern equipment is fitted with the latest safety features to help prevent injury and loss of life, as well as technology that employs emission controls that help reduce air pollution and fertilizer runoff.

K-State to pilot farmer crops database — first year to focus on corn

With the advent of yield monitors in the field, many farmers are doing their own sideby-side comparisons of plant populations, fertilizer treatments, planting dates or many other factors. agronomic These comparisons are useful to the farmer, but farmers have been unable to look at what another farmer in the area is doing. For that reason, Kansas State University Extension agronomists have developed a Farmer Crop Database, with a first-year goal to evaluate corn populations across Kansas.

If a farmer is planting a comparison for himself or for a seed company, he or she can also enter the information into the database, said Brian Olson, agronomist with K-State Research and Extension. This will allow for everyone to view the results of population comparisons that happened in his or her area.

"If the pilot is successful this first year, we hopefully will be able to expand the database to all crops with some outside support and make the database more interactive," Olson said. "However this first year, the goal is to simplify the focus and look at corn populations." Interested producers can register and log into the website www.agronomy. ksu.edu/cropsdatabase.

"We ask that if a grower is interested, he or she use at least four of the following corn populations: 10,000, 12,000, 14,000, 16,000, 18,000, 20,000, 22,000, 28,000, 24,000, 26,000, 30,000, 32,000, 34,000, 36,000 or 38,000 seeds per acre. All planting information for the sites will need to be entered into the system by the end of June. Yield information will be entered in by the end of December. At the end of the year, everyone will be able to view all of the planting and yield information from each site. "If this project is successful, it will help Kansas crop producers gain more information to make more informed decisions," Olson said.

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The big event of last week was the release of three reports by the USDA on Thursday morning. The Quarterly Stocks Report, the Prospective Planting's Report, and the Export Sales Report, all contained important information. As it turned out though, there was one number in particular that was the most important, and that was the corn stocks figure. The corn stocks estimate came in about 180 million bushels below the average trade guess at 6.52 billion. 180 million bushels doesn't seem like a lot in relation to the 12.45 billion bushels we produced or even the 6.52 billion we have left, but it is about 25% of the projected ending stocks from the March supply and demand report. What the stocks report tells us is that either usage is greater than expected, or that production was overstated. What is going to happen is that in next week's April supply and demand report we will see some combination of exports, feed usage, and ethanol usage increased and the ending stocks estimate will be cut to something in the vicinity of 500 million bushels and our stocks to use ratio will be 4% or less, which will be a record low. A record tight stocks to use ratio means we will need to see record high prices. The job of the corn market will be to slow demand enough to insure that we don't run out of corn and also to make sure we get at least the 92.2 million acres planted that USDA predicted on Thursday.

So far, it doesn't appear

that the market has been very successful at all in slowing demand. Ethanol production is still at a greater pace than what USDA has been planning on and export sales seem to be following the recent pattern of being very good in the second two-thirds of the crop year. Last week's export sales report showed 1.914 MMT of old crop sales. Most of that was the expected big sale to unknown destinations. but it was still a good week even without that. Japan has been a big buyer despite all their problems, so we don't even have that to worry about right now. As far as feed demand goes, it looks as if demand for meat is strong enough to absorb the higher cost of gains. Feeder cattle have to quit making new all time highs before I will become too concerned about losing feed demand.

Right now it looks like we should expect further gains, and more bull spreading in the corn. It is very likely that we see new all-time highs in the corn next week ahead of the supply and demand report. The \$7.65 area will likely provide some resistance, but there are two very important facts to pay attention to in the corn market: First, we have resumed the trend of lower ending stocks estimates that began with last year's June Stocks Report and Planted Acreage Report, and second, we haven't slowed demand. Until one of those two things changes, the price trend must continue higher.

There was nothing friendly about the wheat numbers. Stocks were

slightly higher than expected, acreage was slightly higher than expected, and the export sales report was poor. The two main supporting factors in the wheat right now are the terrible crop conditions and the strength in the corn. It is now the first of April so we are running out of time for a dramatic improvement to the crop. A huge portion of the HRW Belt needs rain now. It is looking more and more likely that stocks will be much tighter next year and maybe more people will become cognizant of that when the national crop condition numbers

If we don't begin to see some consistent strength in the wheat market there are a couple of things that could happen. One of those is that we will see

come out.

draw stocks down. The other thing is that the expected jump in spring wheat acreage may not happen. I am not sure how we are going to get the 9 million more major crop acres planted that USDA is expecting, but I am pretty sure that if the wheat doesn't keep pace with the corn and soybeans, then we aren't going to get over 14 million acres of spring wheat.

The soybean numbers were friendly across the board. The stocks were lower than expected at 1.25 billion and acreage was lower than expected at 76.6. If we really end up with acreage below year ago levels, next year's ending stocks could become very tight. There has been persistent bear spreading in the soybean market, which is a little odd considering our record exports and relatively tight supplies. The problem is that the new crop really can't afford to have planted acreage fall below year ago levels like USDA has projected. If we really only have 76.6 million acres of soybeans, then the July of 2012 contract, Some wet weather in the Corn Belt might change the ideas about acreage, so watch the forecasts closely, they can really affect the way the spreads are traded over the next month or two. A couple of weeks of strong export sales might also give the old crop a boost.

The cash cattle trade ranged from \$120 to \$125 and is basically leading the futures market higher. Demand for beef and pork is tremendous and our herds are not expanding to meet the demand. Livestock markets tend to be very inflationary so our ever growing monetary base and growing demand force prices higher. The U.S. employment situation is looking better as well, which will only serve to increase demand further. Every day we are closer to the top, but in the meantime, don't underestimate just how high the price of cattle can go. Be patient with hedges, and keep in mind that \$150 August feeder cattle calls at \$2.00 may look cheap in the near future.



Emergency plans vital to protect farms

Every farm should have a disaster plan to protect assets from natural disasters and other emergencies, said a Kansas State University Extension communication specialist. Producers should also develop a disaster plan as a way to find potential problems that could prove to be costly in the event of an on-farm emergency, said Mary Lou Peter, who also serves as K-State Research and Extension's point of contact with the Extension Disaster Education Network (EDEN). EDEN is a collaborative multi-state effort by extension services across the country to reduce the impact of disasters through education.

Find Risks **Ahead of Disasters**

'Creating a plan helps producers find risks they may have overlooked or not thought about," Peter said. Disaster planning starts with identifying high onfarm risks and acknowledging past emergencies. In many states, the most common natural disasters are floods, straight-line winds, fires and winter storms. Crop insurance can be one of the best ways to protect income if field crops become damaged. Farm disaster planning should include an analysis to determine if crop insurance is best for a particular farm. Peter also recommends producers take risk mitigation steps, such as buying a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration weather radio, labeling all truck and equipment keys, resolving electrical issues and cataloging assets that could be damaged. Farmers, like other business owners, should back up computers and use off-site storage for electronic and hard copy records that are irreplaceable and easily protected but often forgotten. Peter suggests inviting emergency personnel to visit farm properties and help determine major risks. For example, this might help firefighters understand how to respond to a fire at a specific farm. "If there is a fire near chemicals, it may be better to let it burn out rather than using water," she said. "Thinking through these steps before an emergency can help farmers avoid the environmental issues with chemicals getting into the groundwater.'

Review Plans Annually

Once in place, disaster plans should be reviewed and exercised at least once a year. "It does not have to be an elaborate exercise." Peter said. "Just ask questions about who is going to execute certain tasks. When disaster strikes, it won't be the plan that saves lives and

money, it will be the thought process and experience gained knowing the plan." The hardest part about creating a disaster plan can be taking the time to write it down, but two publications developed by Purdue University Extension can help, she said. "Plan Today for Tomorrow's Flood" is a flood response plan for agricultural retailers but which farmers also can use. "Rural Security Planning" is designed to protect family, friends and farms in the event of an emergency. Both publications are available for free download from Purdue Extension at The Education Store at mdc.itap.pur due.edu/

Hard copies are available for \$1 each. "Using the publications and common sense, a producer can have a farm-ready emergency plan in about three hours," Peter said. More information for farmers and others about emergency preparedness and disaster recovery is available at www.exten sion.org. (click on disaster issues) and www.eden.lsu.

NCGA: Billionaire food profiteers wrong to call farmers immoral

Remarks made last week by the chairman of Nestle about the use of corn for biofuels production were not only wrong but dangerous, the president of the National Corn Growers Association said. At a time of economic struggle for millions of Americans, any proposal that will kill jobs, damage the environment and raise energy prices needs to be opposed vehemently.

"It is scandalous, ludicrous and highly irresponsible for the chairman of a global conglomerate that tripled its profits last year to talk about higher corn prices forcing millions into starvation," said NCGA president Bart Schott. "Perhaps if Nestle is so concerned about food prices, its board will consider putting more of their \$35.7 billion in 2010 profits back into poor communities. Just their profits alone represent more than half the entire farm value of the 2010 U.S. corn crop.

Schott was reacting to comments by Nestle chairman Peter Brabeck-Letmathe at a March 22 meeting of the Council on Foreign Relations.

Schott also challenged Brabeck-Letmathe to take the time to study facts and figures before making ridiculous comments about an industry that he clearly knows little about, nor bothered to study up on. "Mr. Brabeck-Letmathe took a swipe at the comments of the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture, Tom Vilsack, when it is Mr. Brabeck-Letmathe's numbers that are erroneous. The facts support the messages of Mr. Vilsack with respect to biofuels," said

Schott. "Brabeck-Letmathe distorted grossly the amount of water used for biofuels production, and seems unaware that Southern Africa and India are surplus corn this year and exporting large quantities. He also took a cheap shot at ethanol being the cause of unrest in the Middle East, which completely belittles the root causes of that unrest - a thirst for freedom, a desire for economic reform and years of political and economic tyranny." Schott further questioned Brabeck-Letmathe's comments about the pace of agricultural production. "In the United States we are seeing a much higher corn yield than elsewhere, a higher yield that efficiently uses each acre of land in a very sustainable way, because of advances in technology from the seed itself to the GPS that helps steer our combines," Schott said. "Many of these technologies are not allowed in other parts of the world, despite their safety and economic or environmental efficiency. This needs to stop. Farmers around the globe should have access to the same technology that has

noted. And when it comes to food prices, numerous reports since the 2008 price spike have shown that ethanol demand was not a major factor. The general consensus is that commodity market speculation, higher energy prices and other causes were more to blame.

A few examples from around the world:

• The United Kingdom's Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs issued a report in March 2010 that discounted biofuels' impact, stating "Available evidence suggests that biofuels had a relatively small contribution to the 2008 spike in agricultural commodity prices. Studies which have

found a large biofuel impact across agricultural commodities have often considered too few variables, relied on statistical associations or made unrealistic or inconsistent assumptions."

• In a July 2010 report, the World Bank stated that "the effect of biofuels on food prices has not been as large as originally thought, but the use of commodities by financial investors may have been partly responsible for the 2007-08 spike."

"It's time for the food processing industry, which has been using higher grain prices to justify its price increases, to explain to hungry families why they have

to eat less so those who can afford company stock can make more money," Schott said. "Profiteering off world hunger needs to end, and that is what is truly immoral. If there is a 'food versus fuel' crisis it exists because families are being

forced to decide which of the two they can afford gasoline from Big Oil or food from companies like these. That's something I challenge Nestle to step forward and help alleviate. They certainly can afford

Kansas Alliance for Biorefining and Bioenergy invests \$200,000 in KU Biofuels Laboratory

The Kansas Alliance for Biorefining and Bioenergy (KABB) has announced its investment of \$200,000 in the Biofuels Testing Laboratory at the University of Kansas. The Biofuels Lab is a \$1.2 million initiative to develop a full suite of testing facilities for chemical and fuel properties of existing and potential next-generation fuels.

"The Biofuels Lab at the University of Kansas will allow researchers to gather critical information about next generation biofuels," said KABB CEO Jeff Roskam. "This facility will be an innovative resource that will help position Kansas on the forefront of the emerging bioenergy economy. At a time when uncertain world events dictate the ever increasing price of fossil fuels, KABB is working to reduce fuel costs through innovative biofuel research done right here in Kansas."

The KU Biofuels Laboratory capabilities will accelerate the development of biofuels, engine and engine emission technology for industry, students and state agencies. The facility will have a suite of equipment allowing it to complete American Society for Testing Materials (ASTM) testing on required biodiesel, fuel ethanol and other fuels under development. The lab will also house an engine test cell that will allow researchers to test the combustion and emission properties of

"Our researchers are excited to be working with KABB on a project that is extremely important for the Kansas economy," said Carey Novak, director of business and industry outreach at KU. "We have exfacilities cellent Lawrence for biofuels and biorefining research, and a strong desire to turn the resulting technology into new products and services that benefit society."

The primary funding source for the KU Biofuels Lab was secured from the federal government by then-Senator Sam Brownback. KABB made its first investment - a commitment of \$200,000 - and provided the required matching funds to build out the full capabilities of the lab as

U.S. AgBank and CoBank submit merger application to **Farm Credit Administration**

CoBank, two of the five banks in the Farm Credit System, announced today that they have submitted their merger application to the Farm Credit Administration (FCA), the System's independent regulator.

Following unanimous votes by the boards of the two banks, the application was submitted yesterday afternoon at the FCA's headquarters in McLean, Virginia. Under statute and applicable regulations, the FCA reviews merger proposals involving Farm Credit entities to ensure they don't pose safety and soundness issues, and also to ensure that disclosure materials prepared for stockholders adequately cover all key aspects of a given transaction.

After receiving a completed merger application, the FCA has 60 days to act on the merger request. An issuance of preliminary approval by the FCA would enable CoBank and U.S. Ag-Bank to conduct stockholder votes on the merger this summer. Assuming the merger is approved, the banks plan to close the transaction on October 1,

pleased to have reached this important step in the merger process," said John Eisenhut, chairman of the U.S. AgBank board of directors. "We believe our application fully satisfies all regulatory requirements governing mergers of Farm Credit System banks, and we look forward to working with the FCA staff over the next 60 days to address any questions they may have about the transaction so that we can bring the merger proposal to our shareholders later this year."

"Our two boards remain unanimous in their support for the merger, which will bring together two financially sound, profitable, cooperative banks to create an even stronger, more durable institution," said Everett Dobrinski, chairman of the CoBank board. "We believe the merger is the right long-term decision for the farmers, ranchers, cooperatives and other borrowers we serve across

rural America. The combined bank will be uniquely well positioned to fulfill its mission and meet the financial needs of its customers, both today and for future generations."

U.S. AgBank is headquartered in Wichita and provides wholesale loan funds and financial services to Farm Credit associations in the states of Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Kansas, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Utah, southeastern Idaho and the western edge of Wyoming. It had approximately \$25 billion in total assets at December 31, 2010.

CoBank is headquartered in Denver, Colorado, and provides wholesale funds to Farm Credit associations serving Alaska, Connecticut, Idaho, Maine, Massachusetts, Montana, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont and Washington. The bank also provides direct loans, leases, export financing and other financial services to agribusinesses and rural infrastructure providers in all 50 states. CoBank had approximately \$66 billion in total assets at December 31, 2010

The merged bank would continue to do business under the CoBank name and be headquartered in Colorado, but it would maintain U.S. AgBank's existing presence and operations in Wichita and Sacramento, California. Robert B. Engel, CoBank's president & chief executive officer, would be the chief executive of the combined en-

Darryl Rhodes, president & chief executive officer of U.S. AgBank, who will be retiring shortly after the completion of the merger, noted that since the boards of the two banks executed a Letter of Intent (LOI) to December. CoBank and U.S. AgBank have completed a formal due diligence process that included a detailed review of everything from legal contracts and personnel policies to liquidity investment positions and the

The merged bank would continue to be organized and operate as a cooperative, with eligible borrowers earning cash and equity patronage based on the amount of business they do with the organization. On the effective date of the merger, the CoBank and U.S. AgBank boards would be temporarily combined. Following a transition period, the merged bank's board would have directors elected from six regions across the country, with half elected via one-member-onevote and half elected on a modified equity basis. KDA accepting applications for specialty crop grants

of Agriculture (KDA) is accepting applications for the 2011 Specialty Crop Block Grant program. Funds for the program are awarded to the agency by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Agricultural Marketing Service. The funds are in turn granted to projects and organizations that promote the competitiveness of specialty crops.

The purpose of the specialty crop program is to enhance the competitiveness of specialty crops. Specialty crops are defined by the USDA as "fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, dried fruits, horticulture, and nursery crops, including floricul-

Each state that submits an application that is re-

Marketing Agricultural Service is to receive at least an amount that is equal to the higher of \$100,000, or 1/3 of 1 percent of the total amount of funding made available for that fiscal year. In addition, the Agricultural Marketing Service will allocate the remainder of the grant funds based on the value of specialty crop production in each state in relation to the national value of specialty crop production using the latest available cash receipt data.

In 2010, Kansas received \$282,828 for the grant pro-

The exact amount of funds available and final dates for application are unclear for the 2011 grant cycle, as Congress has not

for the block grant. The KDA will work to keep stakeholders informed through its Specialty Crop email list, as well as through other outlets, of any news as it becomes available.

Applications will be evaluated by a team of reviewers assembled by the agency. The team will rate proposals on their ability to successfully promote specialty crops in Kansas, and submit those recommendations to the Secretary of Agriculture, who will make the final awards.

Noise and sun — top two health concerns around the farm

Long days working in the sun and exposure to loud equipment noise are givens for many farmers. With proper protection, skin cancer and hearing loss doesn't have to be the outcome. Consider taking precautions to protect skin and ears.

Hearing loss: Noisy farm equipment and even livestock can take a toll on hearing, and farmers may think they've become used to it. Actually, they're likely experiencing hearing loss and don't know it. Or, they may develop tinnitus, which people describe as a ringing, buzzing or clicking in the

Caused by prolonged exposure to high decibels, hearing loss is painless, progressive and permanent. Farmers can reduce noise or decibel levels using one or more of 400 hearing protection devices available on the market. Devices range from ear plugs to large ear-

Skin cancer: This condition plagues farmers far too often, but it's avoidable. Although skin cancer usually doesn't result until after age

50, it's related to a lifetime of overexposure to the sun. The risk factors of basal cell carcinoma and squamous cell carcinoma includes scars, burns, infections and family history. Actinic keratosis - the flat, scaly growths on the ears, face and backs of hands - is one of the biggest factors in developing skin cancer. It's also something many farmers experience. Farmers also should watch for lingering, sore bumps and lumps.

A third type of skin cancer, melanoma, is much more dangerous. Cure rates are lower than with other types of skin cancer and can spread more easily to other parts of the body. Red flags for melanoma include change in shape, size or color of a mole or the appearance of a new mole that looks black or abnormal. Melanoma growths look asymmetrical with ragged borders and an uneven

Practice regular skin exams, even in areas of the body not exposed to sunlight. Wear clothing that filters UV rays; liberally apply

sunscreen at least 20 minutes before going outside; and protect the face and neck with sunglasses and 3inch brimmed hats

Projected sorghum acres announced

The USDA prospective plantings estimates released on March 31, 2011, indicate the planting of sorghum is up 4 percent from 2010. Growers intend to plant 5.65 million acres of sorghum for all purposes in 2011. Producers in Kansas expect to plant 2.5 million acres this year, up 6 percent from 2010. Texas growers expect to plant 1.8 million acres, down 5 percent from the previous season. Kansas and Texas account for 76 percent of the expected United States acreage. As of March 27, Texas had planted 46 percent of their sorghum crop.

Planting intentions show U.S. farmers ready to meet domestic and world grain demand

U.S. grain production is the talk of the world today as USDA announced the 2011 farmer planting intentions of 92.2 million acres of corn, 3 million acres of barley and 5.6 million acres of sorghum. For corn, this represents a nearly 4-million-acre increase from 88.2 million acres in 2010, approaching the 93.5 million acres in 2007, which was the largest

corn acreage since World

With grain prices, world food demand and corn stocks on everyone's mind, grain customers worldwide are keenly focused on U.S. planting intentions this season.

"This healthy expansion of corn planted area comes at a time when world coarse grains demand is increasing," said

Thomas C. Dorr, U.S. Grains Council president and CEO. "Today's report is the first official indication that U.S. producers are responding to market signals by significantly expanding their corn production area. The ability of U.S. farmers to meet growing market demand has established the United States' position in the global marketplace as a

reliable, long-term supplier of coarse grains and coproducts."

Indeed, today's report was a positive signal for export customers, clearly demonstrating that U.S. farmers consider their international customers' needs when making important planting decisions.

"Farmers have responded to market indicators and will plant more corn acres this year. We anticipated these planting numbers because farmers have invested in building demand and take a great interest in meeting the needs of their customers," said Ohio Corn & Wheat Growers Association CEO Dwavne Siekman.

Erick Erickson of the Council says that two factors determine crop production: area planted and yield.

"With 92.2 million planted acres and yields at least at trend, international customers should be optimistic about U.S. corn production in 2011,' he said.

The United States has the ability to meet growing world demand and will continue to be a reliable and leading supplier of coarse grains for years to

If a pond was weedy last year, it probably will be again this year

pounds of pond weed may be somewhat of a challenge, but it is nowhere near the amount of fun as hooking into a good-sized fish and battling it all the way to the shore.

Pond owners can follow a general rule to try and eliminate this occurrence from their fishing experience: if your pond was weedy last year, then chances are you will have a similar problem this

There are two main causes of excess aquatic plant growth, said Marley Beem, Oklahoma State University Cooperative Extension aquaculture spe-

"The first is shallow areas. These are ideal for emergent aquatic plants like cattails, bulrush and many others," Beem said. "Try deepening shallow edges to minimize the area that is less than three feet in depth."

Shallow areas are often caused by heavy cattle access or erosion in the watershed. Steps should be taken to prevent these situations. The second major cause of pond weed problems is a high level of fertilizer runoff.

"Typically this fuels the growth of algae," Beem

amount of phosphorous that is applied in the watershed. If that's not possible you may wish to consider aquatic dyes to reduce the amount of light getting into the water column."

If these problems are not addressed, plants will tend to come back quickly following herbicide application or most other types of treatment.

"Spring is the best time to monitor pond plant grown with an eye toward doing something about it before it gets out of hand," he said.

There are a couple of options pond owners can

pond of overgrown aquatic plants. The first solution is the use of herbicides, which is typically quite effective, but there is some risk involved.


"One of the main risks in applying herbicides to aquatic plants is that too much plant material will be killed and, as it decays, will use up all the dissolved oxygen in the pond and suffocate the fish," Beem said. "This risk is much lower in the spring and is usually less work and lower cost to treat early because you are treating a smaller area."

As some pond owners

the safety of using herbicides, Beem said those that are labeled for aquatic use have undergone extensive testing to minimize the chance of harming fish, other organisms and the health of people eating the

However, there are nonchemical approaches that can be tried in some situations. Grass carp should be used with caution, especially in fishing ponds as submerged plant beds and grass carp tend to eliminate these.

"If your main problem is not being able to cast because of weedy conditions, you might instead consider spot treatments with herbicides to open up a few stretches of shoreline," Beem said. "From the point of view of the fish, about 20 percent coverage of the pond by aquatic plants is ideal.'







Kansas Sampler Festival 2011

Grab your passport! No, not for some overseas travel. This is about an event inside our state's borders that one magazine has termed a Passport to Kansas - and you won't even have to go through Customs. The event is called the Kansas Sampler Festival. Special thanks to Kansas Magazine and writer Kimberly Winter Stern whose article told this remarkable story.

Marci Penner and her father Mil, whom we've profiled before, are cofounders of this event. In 1990, they hosted the firstever Kansas Sampler Festival on the Penner farm near the rural community of Inman.

"Dad and I wrote our first book, Kansas Weekend Guide," Penner said. "We had a book signing and invited places in the book to help support the purpose, which was to stimulate travel throughout Kansas. We were in one big tent on a cold November day and 1,000 people showed up."

The following year, the farm's outbuildings and large tents were used to house exhibitors.

"The shed where my dad stored tools and oily rags became the Tin Shed Cinema where communities presented slide shows about their town's attractions," Penner said. In 1993, the duo launched the Kansas Sampler Foundation, a nonprofit organization whose mission is to preserve, promote and maintain Kansas culture.

For years the Penners hosted the event on their farm, allowing people to park in a spacious alfalfa field. "We rotated the crops in 1998, so took the show on the road," Penner said.

Now the opportunity to host the Kansas Sampler Festival is awarded to a different town every two years following a rigorous application process. Leavenworth County — the first county-level group to receive the honor in the festival's history — was tapped to organize and host the 2010 and 2011 events. The large and small towns in Leavenworth County come together to stage this event. That includes bigger cities like Leavenworth and Lansing, plus rural communities such as Tonganoxie, population 3,030, and Basehor, Now, that's rural. This year's festival is

population 2,324 people.

May 7-8, 2011 at Leavenworth's Ray Miller Park. In 2010 the event drew more than 8,000 people.

The Kansas Sampler Festival is like a well-plotted GPS that gives attendees a perspective of the state's simple pleasures and treasures, plus its fascinating past and vibrant pres-

Colorful exhibitor tents feature artists, authors and regional tourism and travel councils. Food and drink concessionaires Kansas-made artisan products, while vendors exhibit everything from soup to nuts. Entertainers perform on various stages and roam the festival grounds. Sprinkled throughout the sprawling event are some hundreds of enthusiastic volunteers who help bring the Kansas Sampler Festival to

Historic performers reenact characters central to Kansas history, including Calamity Jane, Amelia Earhart, General Robert E. Lee, and Doc Holliday. Each vear an all-star cast from the Kansas Alliance of Professional Historical Performers shares thrilling tales of the colorful characters who helped write histo-

Ferguson, an Marc award-winning historic performer, is one of those who portrays multiple characters. Ferguson, a Kansas farmer and former wedding photographer, is an avid history buff who enjoys performing for audiences across the state. He's even appeared as a movie extra and on the History Channel. He delivers riveting monologues about the trials and tribulations of characters who weren't necessarily model citizens in a fledging Kansas but capture the Old West's flavor.

Ferguson is president of the Gray County Historical Society and manager/ curator at the Dalton Gang Hideout in Meade. In the late 1990s, he saw Joyce Thierer performing as Calamity Jane and wanted to try it himself. He attended some workshops and gave it a try. The rest is, um,

USGC keeps watchful eye on Japanese recovery efforts and feed grain trade

The U.S. Grains Council reports the Japanese industry has been making significant strides to regain its normal feed mill production capacity within the next few months.

"Assuming significant escalation of the nuclear power plant issues will not arise and in spite of the horrendous losses suffered in Japan, the Council believes the consumer demand in Japan will remain strong and will drive continued imports of U.S. coarse grains," said Tommy Hamamoto, USGC director in Japan. "In the short-term, logistical issues will continue to be a problem, but the Japanese feed industry is working hard to recover from the damage. By April or May, the Council is hopeful Japan will recover and return to a somewhat normalcv."

As previously reported by the Council, four of Japan's major importing facilities and attached feed mills were severely damaged by the earthquake and subsequent tsunami that struck Japan on March 11. These four facilities account for approximately 3.66 million metric tons of compound feed production per year - around 15 percent of Japan's total annual compound feed production of 25 million tons. Another mill, which accounts for

an additional 15 percent, suffered some damage but compound feed production has already partially resumed.

"Japan is prepared to cover the feed loss by facilities coming back online and increased production in unaffected mills. These (unaffected) mills are sending feed supplies in small vessels affected areas," Hamamoto said. "There are currently bottlenecks: the capacity of unaffected ports to unload redirected shipments and storage limitations; impeded passage of ships through channels caused by de- ever, logistics of fuels,

bris in shipping lanes; increased transportation costs, fuel supplies and shortage of trucks and ships; and power needed for production and processing. The Council hopes those serious bottlenecks will be shortterm setbacks in the recovery efforts."

The Council has heard reports of limited loss of animal herds or flocks.

"Since the majority of livestock and poultry farms are located near Japan's mountain side (west side of Japan), minimal animal loss is expected from the tsunami. Howfeed and products contin- will remain a longer-term ue to be a problem for those farms," said Hiroko Sakashita, USGC associate director in Japan, adding the Council anticipates knowing the total impact in a few weeks. "In addition, some animal production was affected as facilities had to be evacuated due to elevated radiation levels. This market may further be affected by negative perceptions and false information on their prod-

concern. Japan's Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries released a notice alerting livestock farmers to be cautious and not to feed radioactive material-cont-aminated hay, roughage, silage and water to livestock. It recommends that farmers keep their animals indoors if possible. According to Council sources, feed millers in Hokkaido, Chukyo, Kansai and Kyushu have been working around the clock to ensure that sufficient supply of animal feed is available in the damaged

"The Council is searching for the best opportunity to get involved with the relief efforts in Japan. Mostly what we hear is to wait, since much of the relief is being provided by the Japanese government," Hamamoto said. "The Council will continue to monitor the recovery efforts and determine how to best utilize our resources and assets to help mitigate long-term damage."


