

K-State Risk and Profit Conference set for August 18-19 in Manhattan

Kansas State University's Department of Agricultural Economics will host its annual Risk and Profit Conference and Trade Show Thursday-Friday, Aug. 18-19 at the K-State Alumni Center in Manhattan. Conference topics change every year in keeping with key issues agricultural producers face in any given year, according to Allen Featherstone, K-State professor in agricultural economics. This year's conference will feature two keynote addresses. Fred Seamon, associate director of commodity research and prod-

uct development with the CME Group will present "Hedging in 2011: What's Changed and What Remains the Same" at the Aug. 18 luncheon. Kent and Rebecca Ott, longtime agricultural producers from south central Kansas will provide "A Conversation with a Kansas Producer" just after the Aug. 19 breakfast.

At the CME Group, Seamon is responsible for conducting research on the structure and performance of commodity markets, which is used to monitor the performance of and maintain the viability

of CME Group commodity futures and options contract markets. He also is responsible for investigating the feasibility of new commodity futures contracts and writing trading rules for new commodity futures. He has been involved in the creation of the CBOT Ethanol futures contract and the accompanying Ethanol Calendar Swap, as well as the creation of cleared-only agri-

cultural swap products.

Kent and Rebecca Ott have partnered in farming for over 30 years along with Kent's parents, Charles and Patricia Ott. They grow wheat, soybeans, corn and grain sorghum. Kent has served on the local co-op and Farm Service agency boards, and has served as a local school board member and state representative.

After the Thursday evening dinner, K-State agricultural economists Dan O'Brien and Glynn Tonsor will present this year's grain and livestock outlooks. Conference participants also may attend eight of 21 breakout sessions. All conference presentations, however, will be included on a compact disk that will be included as part of registration.

Breakout session topics include everything from crop insurance volatility to machinery costs, including forecasting custom rates to international benchmarking of beef production. Presentations also will include land prices, biofuels contracting, using spreadsheets to manage expenses and the basics of futures and options. The conference will feature a trade show with displays by agri-businesses and commodity groups.

New this year is the opportunity to register for just one day of the confer-

ence, said Rich Llewellyn, one of the conference coordinators. Registration for both days, which includes two lunches, one dinner and one breakfast, plus conference proceedings on a CD and conference parking, is \$210 for the first registration and \$190 for each additional registration from the same organization, if paid by Aug. 12. One-day registration if paid by Aug. 12 is \$120 for the first registration and \$110 for additional registrations from the same organization. After Aug. 12 and at the door, the fee is \$230 for both days and \$140 for one day.

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Governor establishes NBAF steering committee

Kansas Governor Sam Brownback signed an executive order last Friday establishing the National Bio and Agro Defense Facility in Kansas Steering Committee during a news conference at the Bayer Healthcare LLC Animal Health Division facility in Shawnee. The committee will coordinate the state's efforts in building the facility in Kansas and transitioning research currently at Plum Island to Manhattan.

"The completion of the NBAF in Manhattan is a high priority for the Kansas economy and for my administration. It is expected to have a \$3.5 billion economic impact on the state in the facility's first 20 years of use," Governor Brownback said. "NBAF is a bipartisan

commitment at all levels to this once in a generation opportunity to grow our economy long term. I am pleased we will have continued leadership to see this project through - from groundbreaking to ribbon cutting." The committee will consist of federal and state elected leaders as well as key stakeholders in the NBAF project.

U.S. Sen. Pat Roberts, Kansas Senate President Steve Morris, U.S. Senator Jerry Moran, Kansas House Speaker Mike O'Neal, U.S. Congressman Tim Huelskamp, Kansas House Minority Leader Paul Davis, U.S. Congresswoman Lynn Jenkins, Kansas Senate Minority Leader Anthony Hensley, U.S. Congressman Kevin Yoder, Kansas Board of

Regents Chair Ed McKechnie, U.S. Congressman Mike Pompeo, KSU President Kirk Schultz, Mark Parkinson, Fmr. Kansas Governor, KBA Chairman John Carlin, Manhattan Mayor Jim Sherow.

Governor Brownback has asked Senator Pat Roberts to chair the Steering Committee.

"I'm pleased to have Sam back home keeping a watchful eye on NBAF's developments in Kansas. Together we have been immersed in efforts to bring NBAF to our state for a long time, and I am honored to continue being a driving force in that effort," Sen. Roberts said. "As ranking member of the Senate Agriculture Committee, I have no greater priority than ensuring our food, farms,

ranches, and communities remain safe from biological attack. Our national security is always foremost in my mind. As we continue to move forward with the developments of NBAF, I look forward to the day when we can finally climb on that pile of dirt next to the bulldozers and celebrate."

The state of Kansas has committed \$105 million dollars of matching state funds to the NBAF project and \$35 million dollars of research funding for transitioning the NBAF mission to Manhattan. Brownback said both require active management so he has appointed Policy Director Landon Fulmer to assist the Steering Committee with its coordination with federal, state, and the pri-

vate sector as its executive director.

"I am committed to the NBAF. With the animal health corridor running between Manhattan and Columbia, Kansas can be the world leader in animal health research and development. We are globally good at this. We can grow more. We will compete and we will

win," Brownback said.

The \$650 million laboratory will research and develop countermeasures to animal, human, and zoonotic diseases. So far the U.S. Department of Homeland Security has invested more than \$150 million into site preparation, engineering, design, and site specific risk-assessments.

Record breaking temperatures and drought over the southern two-thirds of Kansas are resulting in shortages of alfalfa and all forages. Fall crops are being affected, much of the dryland corn is being baled or chopped for silage. The overall supply of hay remains tight to very tight. 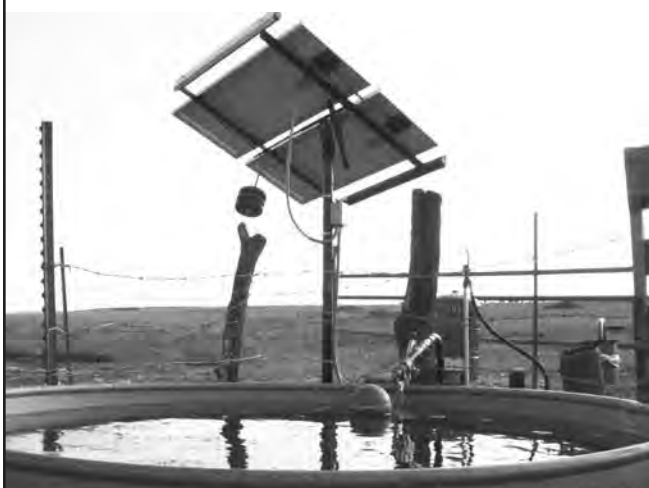

Kansas State veterinarian encourages livestock producers to watch for signs of anthrax after flooding

Flooding along the Missouri and other rivers through the central United States is prompting a call for cattle and other livestock producers to watch for signs of the deadly anthrax bacteria once floodwaters recede.

"Cattle producers in areas along the Missouri River should watch for unexplained cattle deaths which might occur as a result of anthrax spores washing down and being consumed by cattle after the floodwaters recede," said K-State Research and Extension veterinarian Larry Hollis. Veterinarians and animal health officials in North Dakota, Minnesota and Canada have issued similar warnings. "Because the Missouri River is carrying water from the Dakotas where they historically have anthrax just about every summer, anthrax spores may be carried down

and end up on flooded Kansas backwater pastures," Hollis said. "Any unexplained cattle deaths should be reported immediately to a veterinarian. The veterinarian may choose to necropsy the carcass to make sure that anthrax is not the cause. Spores of other spore-forming organisms, such as the Clostridial specie that causes blackleg, also can be carried to new areas by floodwaters." Anthrax, which can affect all mammals, is caused by a spore-forming bacterium called *Bacillus anthracis*. Animals typically acquire the disease by grazing in areas contaminated by spores. Cattle, bison, sheep, goats and horses are particularly susceptible. Anthrax spores are hardy and occur naturally in the soil, where they can survive for decades.

Humans can contract anthrax, but it is unusual to

find a human case of anthrax linked to an animal outbreak if proper precautions are taken during the handling of affected carcasses, Hollis said. That's why it is important for livestock owners to be vigilant in watching for the disease, especially in animals grazing in previously flooded areas. Death from anthrax can occur in a matter of hours from the time the first symptoms occur, so a seemingly healthy animal may die before anyone notices clinical signs, he said. Animals that are discovered before dying may appear distressed and have difficulty breathing. Hemorrhaging from the mouth, nose and anus is common. Pigs and carnivores are more resistant to the disease, although they may develop swelling in the neck and throat or have gastrointestinal disturbances. Carcasses of animals that die of anthrax de-

compose rapidly, and rigor mortis is often incomplete or absent.

If a livestock owner suspects anthrax in a live animal, or in the case of a sudden death of unknown cause in previously flooded areas, he or she should not touch or

move the animal. A veterinarian should be called in to investigate the death and determine the proper samples to test for anthrax along with the proper carcass disposal method.

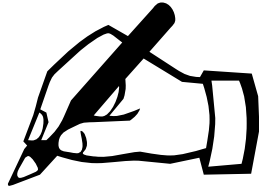

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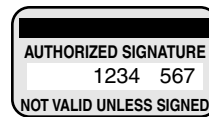

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New mini-bulk rules to impact producers

The Kansas Agribusiness Retailers Association wants Kansas producers to be aware of the new EPA mini-bulk rules that go into effect on August 16. These new rules will change the handling of mini-bulks from manufacturer to retailer to field. The rules also mean that retailers might have new or additional requirements of handling mini-bulks or filling farmer-owned tanks. The new rules include:

- All tanks will now be marked as either one-use or refillable tanks.
- Refillable tanks have several requirements:
 - All openings (except vents) must have one way valves, tamper evident devices or both
 - The container must have a unique method of identification (serial number or barcode)
 - The container must be compatible with the pesticide
 - The container must meet DOT design, construction and marking for packaging group III, or be listed as "an approved container for refill," in the registrant agreement
 - EPA Est. # and net contents must be on product label If you use mini-bulks in your farming operation, start preparing for this rule by recycling old tanks that do not meet the new requirements. Additionally, contact your local retailer to see if they have any new requirements for using their mini-bulks, such as not breaking the tamper device or triple rinsing. 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High on the Little Blue

On the Little Blue River Farm in Washington County, Robin Kelley and her husband, Randy have one high tunnel in which they grow fresh produce year-round. They market this produce to local farmers markets and grocery stores.

Robin first heard about high tunnels at an organic producers' meeting in 2010. After researching the subject on the internet, she contacted her local Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) office in Washington.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's NRCS provides financial assistance for seasonal high tunnels as part of a three-year trial to determine their effectiveness in conserving water, reducing pesticide use, maintaining vital soil nutrients, and increasing crop yields.

According to Dee Minge, Supervisory District Conservationist, NRCS, Washington, the Kelleys were the first producers in the county to install a seasonal high tunnel (sometimes referred to as a hoop house). They are made of plastic or metal pipe and covered with plastic, require no energy and rely on sunlight to modify the climate inside to create favorable conditions for growing vegetables and other specialty crops.

"The Kelleys were able to qualify for financial assistance through the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) Organic Initiative under the Beginning Farmer Program," says Minge. This initiative is an NRCS effort to help connect farmers and consumers, strengthen local and regional food pro-

duction, increase the use of sustainable agricultural practices, and promote consumption of fresh, local food. Little Blue River Farm once belonged to Robin's parents. After they passed away, she and Randy bought the farm with the idea of settling down in a quiet place. For now, the high tunnel is their main focus. "We hadn't always planned on being farmers, but I guess we are now!" jokes Robin. "We couldn't have done this without NRCS' help." Under this contract explains Minge, "A conservation plan was developed to provide assistance on the high tunnel and micro-irrigation." "Organic farming is right down my alley," says Robin. "I don't like using pesticides on my gardens, and I can't see how these chemicals can be any good for you." The Kelleys installed their high tunnel in August 2010. It is approximately 30 feet wide by 96 feet in length. Last fall they grew lettuce and mustard greens. "Lettuce was our cash crop this winter," says Randy. "We harvested all winter and had two grocery stores buying from us. Fresh greens in the winter, unbelievable."

The main crop, however, are the tomatoes. "We've made several adjustments within the high tunnel," Randy says. He points to the trellis system he designed for the tomato plants to climb when they are growing taller this summer. "It's been a learning process," he says. Under the EQIP organic initiative, the Kelley's installed a micro-irrigation system for water efficiency with financial assistance

from NRCS. "This way the plants get the water needed and I'm conserving water," Randy says. The Kelleys are growing and selling locally at farmers' markets. "Our goal in this venture is to subsidize our income doing something we enjoy," Robin said. She takes the produce to area markets, but the main market she is involved in is the one she organized in Hanover. "Buy fresh and buy local, it's good for the community," she said.

The Kelleys are also excited about locating a buyer in Wichita who markets fresh produce in the area. "The buyer wants all the tomatoes we can grow," says Randy. "The great thing about these high tunnels is that they not only extend the season, but you can plant earlier and have beautiful big produce because of a controlled environment," said Robin. And no doubt, the Kelleys tomatoes will be perfect. "I can't wait for these tomatoes, hurry up," Robin says.

Kansas NRCS is participating in a three-year study to see if high tunnels are effective in reducing pesticide use, retaining vital nutrients in the soil, extending the growing season, and increasing yields. Last year Kansas NRCS worked with 47 producers across the state that used \$173,600 in financial assistance under EQIP Organic Initiative to extend the crop growing season.

Angus releases heifer pregnancy EPDs

Whether you have 20 or 2,000 cows, success in the U.S. cattle business lies in your herd's reproductive ability; however, those traits are among the most difficult to characterize from a genetic standpoint.

But after years of collecting breeding records, the American Angus Association has introduced a genetic selection tool to help Angus breeders and their customers better identify animals with desirable reproductive ability.

The heifer pregnancy expected progeny difference (HP EPD) will measure the chance of a sire's daughters becoming pregnant during a normal breeding season.

"One of our research initiatives has been to characterize reproductive traits in the Angus breed. Now, after much time in the research phase, we've developed a database that allows us to provide EPDs for the reproductive complex," says Bill Bowman, American Angus Association chief operating officer (COO).

The HP EPD isn't a new concept. The Association began reporting heifer pregnancy research values in its biannual Sire Evaluation Report in 2007.

In June 2011, the Association Board of Directors approved moving the HP EPD from research to reality. Beginning July 8, the EPD will appear weekly alongside other maternal trait EPDs such as calving ease maternal (CEM), maternal milk (Milk), mature weight (MW), mature height (MH) and cow energy value (\$EN).

"Angus breeders and their customers continue to recognize the value of selection tools available through the Association," says Sally Northcutt, Association director of genetic research. "The weekly heifer pregnan-

cy evaluation will provide more real-time EPDs for improving the probability of successful heifer breedings in the herd."

Heifer pregnancy EPDs are developed using breeding records, pregnancy-check and calving data, as well as pedigree information. The unit of measure for the EPD is a percentage — a higher EPD is more favorable.

"In this case, when comparing two sires on heifer pregnancy EPDs, a higher-EPD sire would be expected to have daughters with a greater probability or chance of becoming pregnant than a sire with the lower EPD," Northcutt explains. Although reproductive traits are challenging to measure and tend to be more lowly heritable in comparison to growth and carcass traits, Northcutt says the Association is spearheading an aggressive push to expand the breeding database, with first-calf heifers as the initial target for selection tools. Planning To Cope

Flood water forces the exodus of cattle to higher ground. Drought does the same on a wider scale, only to greener ground. And in the case of wildfires, tornados and other natural disasters there might not even be time for that. As if the job of beef producer isn't hard enough, this year Mother Nature seems to have dealt an extra dose of hardship to many locations on the map. If you're not among them, count your blessings. If you are among them, count your blessings — there are still others who have it worse.

When you're done counting, start planning.

There are the immediate plans, like where you're going to find grass for your pairs or how you're going to keep the cattle corralled with the washed-out fence line. There are intermediate plans, like figuring out how to pay back that revolving bank loan when production is down or how to move weaning up to reduce grazing pressure. But the long-term goals are the ones that are easy to lose sight of in a crisis, and understandably so. "Fight or flight" mode leaves little time to consider the future five or ten years down the road. It's

about what's happening now, the immediate cause and effect. If you're reading this, you're likely not in that group, unless your emergency plan includes catching up on industry news. So that means maybe you do have a moment or two to step back and think. After you're done reading, maybe you could do a little multi-tasking and wear your long-range planning cap while raking hay.

If a natural disaster strikes your farm or ranch, what will you do? If you were forced to move or sell cows, which ones would go? You've been building your herd with consistent genetics that are more valuable than just the market price per pound. How can you make sure your investment of time and money in data and breeding programs isn't just lost, leaving you to start all over again?

Yes, desperate times will call for adjustments. You may need to shift your production calendar, doing things like weaning and feeding cows several months earlier than usual. Or in the case of excess moisture, you might need to find an alternative feedstuff when your prime hayfield is under water. But think be-

yond the immediate. If your ultimate goal is selling pounds at weaning, that may suffer in the short term, but you can adjust to select for bulls that deliver both pounds and quality. If quality is king, you can choose marbling in tandem with other production goals. Easy calvers, easy doing cows and easy temperaments have no weather requirements — take that, Mother Nature!

If you're reducing numbers, do you have a plan for picking the best of the best

to keep? It starts with identification and continues with records. That's something you can start on, or continue with, in the good times. If you counted your blessings as not affected by disaster this year, ask a blessing for those thousands of cattlemen and women who do have to deal with these heartbreaking choices. Yard & Garden Tips

By Gregg Eystone

County Fair Big Pepper

The largest vegetable selected for this year's Riley county fair is the bell pepper. Big Bertha was given to 4-H'ers to see who would get the biggest one. Come to the Riley County fair held Thursday, July 21 through Monday, July 25 to see the winner.

You are invited to be part of the fair by bringing your own entries. Gardening and flower exhibits need to be brought to Pottorf Hall in CiCo Park between 8 a.m. and noon on Thursday, July 21. Exhibits are released at 7 p.m. on Monday, July 25.

Vegetable exhibits are judged on five criteria. The judge looks at the exhibit's condition, quality, uniformity, typical of variety and size. Unless it is a class for the biggest specimen, size

should conform to market demands. The two most important criteria are condition and quality. Everyone would choose produce that was in good condition that is clean and without any bruises. Quality indicates that the specimen is ready to eat. Overripe is not desirable.

Uniformity and typical of variety are the other criteria. Attractiveness of an exhibit is enhanced when all specimens are similar in size, shape and color. Avoid using unusual specimens for exhibits.

Flowers are judged mainly on the quality of bloom. It should be just peaking at full bloom. Cleanliness is also important. Give your specimen a bath before you enter it.

The container is part of the exhibit but you don't generally want to draw attention to it. It should be clean, plain and around 1/3 of the height of the overall exhibit. Remove any leaves that would be in the container.

I hope your garden has some purple ribbon specimens for the fair. Contact the Extension office for the publications "Exhibiting Fruits and Vegetables" and "Preparing Cut Flowers for Exhibit." It is also available on the web at www.ksre.ksu.edu.

There is a lot to see and do at the fair. Carnival rides, take in the rodeo, listen to music, and enter the Riley County Idol contest. A list of activities can be found at the fair website www.rileycountyfair.com.
