

Frontier Farm Credit reminds producers of aflatoxin adjustment under MPCCI crop insurance policy

Frontier Farm Credit's crop insurance experts remind farmers that the level of aflatoxin in corn may qualify the production for quality adjustment under their MPCCI crop insurance policy.

"With the exceptionally hot and dry summer we have been experiencing, the presence in aflatoxin in corn is becoming a bigger concern," said Eric Wiles, Crop Insurance Specialist with Frontier Farm Credit. "It is important to call your crop insurance agent if any presence is suspected."

For production that will be stored on the farm

or in commercial storage, the appropriate samples must be obtained by the adjuster (or a trained disinterested third party approved by the crop insurance company) prior to the production entering storage, because aflatoxin has the potential to increase in stored production. Other substances or conditions may also have the potential to increase in storage. If appropriate samples are not obtained prior to storage, such production will not be adjusted for quality due to a substance or condition injurious to human or animal health.

Checklist for an aflatoxin adjustment:

- Check fields
- If aflatoxin is suspected, contact your insurance agent to turn in claim (do not store until tested)
- Tell adjuster of aflatoxin concerns
- The adjuster will pull samples from field and send to an approved laboratory for third party testing
- If the level of the aflatoxin in the production is at a high enough level to qualify the production for quality adjustment, the

production to count will be adjusted for quality.

The RMA discount factors for Aflatoxin are:
 20.1-50.0 ppb = .100 Reduction to Yield
 50.1-100.0 ppb = .200 Reduction to Yield
 100.1-Reduction to Yield
 200.1-300.0 ppb = .400 Reduction to Yield
 300.1 ppb & above = .500 or 0 factor. Reduction to Yield

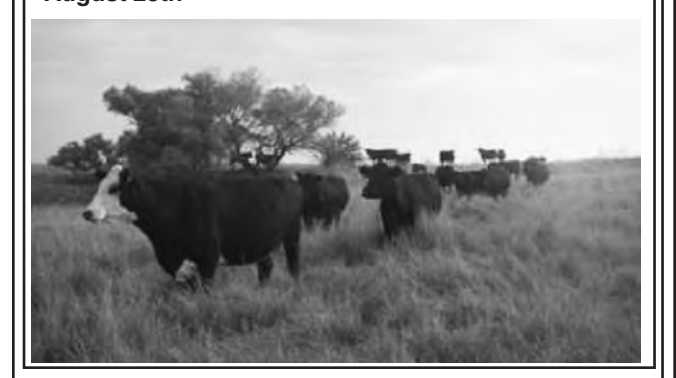

Cattle are moving early off of grass over the southern three-fourths of Kansas due to the shortages of all forages for hay and grazing. Hay producers are receiving more and more calls for the little hay that they have available. Trucks are busy bringing hay South from as far away as Canada, they just cannot keep up with demand. The overall supply of hay remains tight to very tight. Kansas ranchers selling cattle because of drought, heat

(AP) Ranchers in parts of Kansas are hauling their spring cattle to auction barns because a drought and the brutal heat have made it difficult to provide the water and hay needed to keep the animals healthy, according to a state agency.

Some auction markets are seeing more than triple the number of cattle at weekly sales than they typically have at this time of year, the Kansas Agricultural Statistics Service said. For example, 14,500 head of cattle were taken to sale rings at Pratt, Salina and Dodge City last week. Last year, those auction markets sold just 4,300 head.

The sales are necessary because the hot, dry weather has dried up ponds and pastures, the Hutchinson News reported recently. The statistics service said more than half of the range and pasture conditions are in poor or very poor condition.

Some areas of southwest Kansas haven't received a good rain for more than a year. Large cattle-producing areas like Comanche County had just 1.49 inches at Coldwater from January through June, said Larry Ruthi, with the National Weather Service's Dodge City office.

It also has been the driest July through July on record for Dodge City, with about eight inches of rain falling during the period, Ruthi said.

And temperatures have reached past 100 degrees more than 30 days in a row for much of southern Kansas, with no significant rain forecast for the near future.

Cattle pens have been packed at Winter Livestock in Dodge City, said Brian Winter, who owns several Midwest sale barns. Recently about 5,500 head sold at the Wednesday sale. In July 2010, market receipts for the month totaled 6,000.

"That's pretty telling," Winter said. "Some of these

guys wouldn't sell until the fall, but it's just been so dry they can't maintain their herd."

The good news is that prices, for the most part, have stayed high, Winter said, because supplies haven't rebuilt from the past decade's droughts, demand for beef remains high and there's a good export market.

But Mike Lewis, with Pratt Livestock, said calves weighing 600 pounds or less are bringing substantially lower prices.

Lewis, who has been at the sale barn since 1959, said he's never seen numbers like this at this time of year. More than 5,500 cattle were sold at the market during a recent sale. A normal July sale usually brings just 1,000 head, he said.

"We'll be larger yet next week," he said. "The numbers have increased weekly due to the lack of rain. If it doesn't rain, the exodus of cows and light calves will increase at a rapid pace. There is just no feed being raised in this country."

The lack of hay means prices for the feed have doubled in the past year. Farmers are selling wheat straw for \$70 a ton, The News re-

ported. Alfalfa traded for a high of \$180 a ton in June, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The agency also reports 2011 could have the lowest U.S. hay acreage on record.

The Kansas Livestock Association is fielding calls from ranchers as far away as Texas who need grass.

"It's not hundreds of cows, it's thousands of cows," said Matt Teagarden, the organization's industry relations director said.

Waiting for his cattle to sell, Gary Sterneker, a Cunningham-area rancher, said he's running out of hay, with only a 30 percent yield this year. His ponds are also empty and he's been using track hoes to dig deeper for water.

He brought 60 calves to sale the previous week, three months earlier than schedule, and he might bring more if rain doesn't come soon.

"Everyone is in the same situation," Sterneker said. "We'll just be playing it by ear. Without rain in a couple weeks, we'll have to do something different."

Moreover, he added, "We don't need an inch of rain. We need lots of inches of rain."

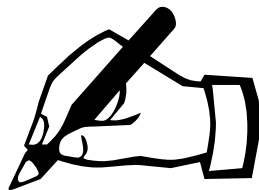

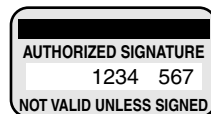

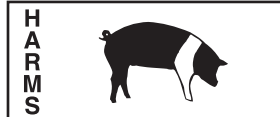

Southern Carcass Improvement Project provides update

A survey designed to estimate the value of the Southern Carcass Improvement Project (SCIP) cattle as 60-day weaned feeder calves was recently completed by feedyard managers, stocker producers, and auction market operators. A total of 95 experienced cattle market participants from a dozen states were asked to gauge the value of each of the two SCIP sire groups using pictures and a brief written description on the sires and dams represented by each group. This allowed a market value assessment at the post-weaning stage of production

without actually selling any of the project cattle. The survey was conducted during the first half of 2011. Market prices reflected where feeder cattle were trading at that time. Each participant was asked to independently value the two sire groups, according to what they would be willing to pay given market conditions at the time the survey was completed. States represented in the survey include: Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Florida, Kansas, Kentucky, Missouri, Mississippi, New Mexico, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Tennessee, and

Texas. Results: 100% of survey participants valued the Angus x Southern group higher than the Southern x Southern cattle, with the average price differential exceeding \$9 per cwt. at 700 lbs. This difference amounted to 7.8% and was highly statistically significant.

One generation of high-growth/high carcass Angus bulls can therefore add nearly \$65 per head in marketable calf value to a cowherd with mixed southern breeding and little or no apparent Angus influence. "Our survey respondents come from different vantage points in the industry and are involved in trading literally millions of cattle each year. Their collective perspective represents a wealth of experience concerning how the market values these types of cattle," says Mark Gardiner of Gardiner Angus Ranch. "Value creation is what the SCIP project is all about, and the survey confirms that using even one generation of high-end Angus bulls will give producers a calf crop worth substantially more as compared to calves with mixed southern breeding."

Brian Bertelsen, vice president of field operations for U.S. Premium Beef, explains that cattle feeders and other market participants have become increasingly sensitive to carcass potential, while continuing to emphasize health and feedyard performance in the feeder cattle they buy. "The mar-

ketplace continues to move toward a true value-based system. Carcass merit is gaining importance at the fed cattle level and working its way back through the supply chain all the way to the cow/calf producer," Bertelsen says. "That's why these results are not surprising. For producers wanting to add value to their calves, the road map on how to do so is becoming increasingly clear."

The Southern Carcass Improvement Project is collaboration with Gardiner Angus Ranch, Kansas State University and Virginia Tech, to determine the carcass improvement that can be made in one generation, using high carcass value Angus bulls on typical Southern-origin beef cows, representing typical bos indicus-influenced genetics most often found in southern states. The SCIP addresses the beef industry's long-standing need for higher quality grades and better overall carcass traits in southern U.S. packing plants.

Farm production expenditures climb slightly in 2010

After a brief reprieve in 2009, last year farm production expenditures resumed an upward trend. In 2010, U.S. farmers reported spending \$289 billion to produce agricultural products, up from \$287.4 billion in the prior year. The Farm Production Expenditures 2010 summary released on Aug. 2 by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) provides national, regional and Crop and Livestock farm expenditures.

Highlights from the 2010 summary include:

Farm expenditures of \$45.4 billion for feed, \$35.7 billion on farm services and \$27.4 billion on labor expenses. These three categories

account for over a third of all expenses incurred by producers in 2010.

Livestock farm expenditures of \$130.6 billion, which is up 1.3 percent from the previous year.

Crop farm expenditures of \$158.4 billion, a slight decrease from 2009.

The largest increase in expenditures (7.3 percent) on southern region farms.

An increase of 1.5 percent in farm expenditures reported by Atlantic region farms.

A significant decrease in the amount spent on farm improvements and construction. Producers spent \$12.6 billion on these expenditures, \$1.5 billion less than in 2009.

They enjoyed a Kansas City Royals baseball game that evening.

For the next five days, the Red Angus juniors traveled across Missouri and Kansas touring ranches, a bull test facility, a regional livestock market, feedlots and Kansas State University. The Red Angus juniors also competed in national contests and participated in their annual business and committee meetings and officer elections.

"We had an outstanding turnout this year with over 50 juniors and adult chaperones," said Dawn Bernhard, Red Angus Association of America (RAAA) junior programs coordinator. "The kids come intending to have fun with other

Red Angus youth but leave with communication and beef industry life skills as well as a network of friends that they will keep throughout their lives."

Host ranches and enterprises interacted with the Round-Up group in viewing cattle, Red Angus and beef industry education, and JRA contests.

On June 22 Jack and Karen Lindstrom of JK Cattle and Kurt and Paula Schwarz of Three Fires Cattle Co., both of LaCygre, welcomed juniors with hayrack pasture tours and weight-guessing contests. Paula Schwarz discussed her job as senior food specialist for Applebee's restaurants and Cathy Miller of Mountain City Meats explained her position as coordinator between retail restaurants and the packing industry. Jason Hightower, neighbor, partner and banker to the Schwarzes, discussed pasture management, ag finances and crossbreeding with Red Angus. The juniors competed in the Stockman's Quiz and Team Sales Contest.

Kent Abele of Green Springs Bull Test, Nevada, Mo., spoke to tour attendees about the GrowSafe system their operation uses to monitor residual feed intake (RFI). He explained how Green Springs Bull Test works with universities and breed associations to improve EPDs through data sharing and experimentation. At Rush Red Angus, Jasper, Mo., Rocky, Karen, Tyler and Shelby Rush

welcomed the Round-Up group with pasture tours, judging contests and a tour of their donor cows and resulting offspring. The day concluded with a dance and beef brisket meal. Tyler is a former JRA board member and Shelby was a participant in this year's Round-Up.

The first stop of the morning on Thursday was Joplin Regional Stockyards near Cathage, Mo. Mark Harmon, field representative, addressed juniors about their day-to-day operations and life skills of being a good employee. Joplin Regional Stockyards markets approximately 425,000 head of cattle annually and they have designed a commingling process that sorts cattle by color, size and weight into groups utilizing a specifically designed chute system that uses jets of air to move cattle through the system.

RAAA president Joe Mushrush and his wife Connie welcomed the JRA Round-Up group to Mushrush Red Angus. In addition to pasture and feedlot tours, Mushrushes explained grazing management of tall grass prairie and how they incorporate stocker cattle to best utilize their grazing environment. The juniors returned back to Kniebel Cattle Co. for a meal and the annual JRA business meeting.

They competed in Barnyard Olympics and the Equipment Identification Contest and concluded the 2011 JRA Round-Up with a swimming and pizza party and awards presentations.

The newly elected JRA board is Laura Daniel of LaGrange, Ga., president; Cele Ketchum of Plevna, Mont., first vice president; Shana Morcom of Arlington, Wash., second vice president; and Alyssa

Looney of Denton, Texas, as public relations director. On June 26, the new board trained under Kassie Curran, KSU student from Girard on developing mission statements, team building and goal setting.

Deets honored by Feeding Quality Forum



Some people set out to make a lasting change on their industry, but Max Deets, Beloit, says he never thought of himself in that light.

Instead the cattle feeder's natural leadership ability, quest for improvement and genuine respect for others led him to some of the most influential roles in the beef business.

Deets, who managed Solomon Valley Feeders until 2007, is just the second recipient of the Feeding Quality Forum Industry Achievement Award.

He will accept the recognition at the meetings in Nebraska and Kansas later this month.

"I have always respected Max because he is a true gentleman," says fellow Kansas cattleman Jerry Bohn. "He wasn't an 'in your face' leader, but could be forceful in his own way. He is just somebody you look up to."

The Pratt Feeders manager says he got to know Deets by way of career path. "I wasn't directly in-

olved with him a great deal, but in a way he was an industry mentor to a lot of us, just by our watching him," Bohn says.

Deets's story doesn't start much differently than others. He grew up on a diversified crop and livestock farm in south central Kansas. He was drafted into World War II and then used the GI Bill to attend Kansas State University.

"At that point I still planned to go back to the family farm," says Deets. He and wife Marcelyn did just that for five years, before managing a cow-calf operation, starting a small feedlot and eventually moving to Arkansas City to manage a yard.

There his story deviates. Deets began doing bull testing and pioneered that concept within the state.

"I didn't have any real vision of being an instigator of bull tests in Kansas," he reflects. "I'd always been interested in putting figures together and the competition in breeds was always fascinating to me."

He thought the Arkansas City location was a permanent one, until investors in Beloit wooed him with their enthusiasm and plans. So the couple made their final move to manage the newly built 20,000-head Solomon Valley yard.

There he got more involved in industry associations, particularly the Kansas Livestock Association (KLA) board and then presidency in 1988.

"He is a natural leader and always gravitates to-

ward leadership positions in whatever organization he's in," says Larry Corah, Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB) vice president.

The KLA president worked closely with the National Cattlemen's Association (NCA, now NCBA), so it's no surprise that Deets eventually served as its president in 1997.

"I enjoyed meeting other people with interests similar to mine, but I could see the value in influencing government decisions," he says. "There wouldn't be any way I could have a say in that by myself. This way we were able to have a voice."

One cause he championed was a focus on the ultimate customers.

"In my year as president, consumer acceptance of beef was at its lowest percentage in some time, so we had a real interest in trying to turn that around," Deets says. "That's what generates profits for the whole industry. I liken it to a pie. For every segment to get a bigger piece, you have to have a bigger pie."

Bohn says the beef industry has historically been "a bit predatory."

"Here over the past few years we've all been able to make a little, and rising water floats all boats," he says. "Max was certainly somebody who had the interests of the industry at

heart, much more than his own."

Change happens in all segments, Deets says, but it takes information and producer involvement.

"They have to train themselves by getting records on their cattle and learning what they're producing," he says. "If they're not producing the best, they need to do something better."

Deets jokes that the market volatility and soaring input costs make him glad to

be retired, but in the next breath he remains optimistic: "The industry has always had to live with these kinds of occurrences; they come out of it and are stronger."

His real joy in retirement is rooted in family time, spent with his six children and 16 grandchildren that are "spread out all over the country."

"It was important to have the support of family, and they understood what I was

about," he says.

Deets will give remarks during the lunch program at Omaha, Neb., on Aug. 23 and Garden City on Aug. 25.
