

# Schwieterman Market Outlook A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The Pro Farmer Crop Tour consistently found less corn yield potential than a year ago and in five of the seven states toured they found less yield potential than the 3-year average. There final guess for the national average yield is 146.45 - 149.4. If the Pro Farmer es-

timates are even remotely accurate, it doesn't look good for the national average corn yield and most likely we will see a final yield somewhere below 150 bu/ac. As for the soybeans, the outlook isn't quite so negative. The Pro Farmer Tour found mixed yield potential relative to last year and their final estimate was a national average yield of 40.96 to 42.64, which means they think there is potential for USDA to increase the yield estimate in a future report. The crop condition ratings over the next couple of weeks will be key since that will tell us whether yield potential is growing or shrinking from the present level.

The gold market made massive price swings last week. The October contract reached \$1915/oz. on Tuesday, only to fall as low as \$1701.70/oz. on Thursday. The market then bounced and climbed back to about \$1829/oz. on Friday. Extreme volatility is often a sign of a top, and that may be the

case with the gold. Since there wasn't any further quantitative easing announced by Ben Bernanke in Jackson Hole last week, we may not see money printing continue at such a rapid rate. Stay tuned though, it will take a close below \$1700 to confirm a top.

December corn The gained 41<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cents for the week, due mostly to Friday's surge higher. The December contract did make new contract highs 4 of the 5 trading days, so obviously not all of the strength came on Friday. Concerns about the corn crops yield potential have been growing for quite a while, which keeps good support under the market, and once the speech was done in Jackson hold Friday, traders felt free to buy everything except the U.S. dollar.

The corn market is certainly overbought at this point, but it can stay that way for a long time. A correction can occur at any time, but we won't see a change in trend until the size of the corn crop is confirmed. As long as there is any fear that the crop size will continue to shrink, there will be little reason to break the market. Right now, that means the market will maintain an upward bias at least until the September Crop Production report. After that it will depend upon the size of the cut made in September and the likelihood of another cut in October.

December KW The worked its way higher last week gaining nearly 50 cents. On the charts the December KW reached the 62% retracement of the move down from the May high, which will likely provide resistance next week, since the market is overbought. A correction is likely, but as long as the corn is firm, the wheat will be as well.

There is little fresh fundamental news. There are production problems in the spring wheat area and the HRW Belt is still dry. Exports are still too slow to inspire speculative buying and the market is basically relying on strength in the corn to create feed wheat demand. For independent strength the wheat has to have some fresh demand news

Finally, after about eight months of trying, the November soybeans closed decisively above \$14.00. The November beans spent about three days consolidating below the resistance then surged higher on Friday making the highest close in the November 2011 contract in three years. On the weekly chart we are at the highest level since early

June and closed above trend line resistance that began back in February.

Daily chart indicators are overbought, but weekly chart indicators are nowhere near overbought. The action early next week will be critical, but it looks to me like the \$14.00 level should now act as support and breaks should be bought.

The Pro Farmer Tour wasn't particularly supportive to the soybeans like it was to the corn, but I think is did put emphasis on the fact that we will need to see a good finish to the growing season in order for the soybean crop to maintain the production potential that it has. Heat and dry weather the next few weeks won't help the crop.

The cattle started the week under pressure, but found support and then strength to close out the week. The October LC only lost 30 cents for the week, which really wasn't that bad. The market is oversold and due for a bounce and I think we will get it next week. The beef market continues to move higher, which is certainly supportive and I think cash cattle trade will be higher next week. Look for the October LC to climb back to the \$119 area.

The feeder cattle should be able to muster a similar rally next week. I look to sell the October feeder cattle on a move above \$136.

# Narrowbanding deadline nears for mobile radio operators

Farmers, fleet operators, schools and government agencies operating business band or Private Land Mobile Radio (PLMR) systems are facing a critical January 1, 2013, deadline. By that date, the FCC has mandated that all private PLMR licensees operating below 512 MHz move to 12.5 kHz narrowband voice channels.


Nex-Tech Mobile Radio Supervisor Ryan McClung urges PLMR operators to act soon, as the narrowbanding licensing process can be time-consuming. "The required FCC paperwork can take anywhere from six to nine months to process. Since everyone is required to make this change, the FCC's approval process continues to lengthen," he said.

While the narrowbanding mandate may have caught some licensees off-guard, McClung said many operators are taking action now.

"Many of our law enforcement customers are aware of the changes and are well on their way to being narrowband compliant," said McClung. "They have either purchased the equipment to become narrowband compliant or we have already transferred them over. Several schools are in the process now as well," he added.

McClung said operators most significantly impacted by the narrowbanding mandate will be those who are using older radio equipment. "Most radios purchased within the last five years will be narrowband compliant," stated Mc-Clung. "The manufacturers have known since 1997 that this date was coming and that these mandates were going into effect in 2013. Nex-Tech Mobile Radio will provide free narrowband walkthroughs for all customers, law enforcement agencies and schools, and will provide them with a current list of radios they have, indicate which radios are compliant or non-compliant, and provide them a solution to become narrowband compliant by the 2013 deadline."

# Page 19 More than 11,000 4-H exhibits expected at 2011 Kansas State Fair

The 2011 Kansas State Fair will open Sept. 9 and continue through Sept. 18. While attending the annual event is a tradition for many, seasoned as well as firsttime fairgoers are encouraged to visit 4-H Centennial Hall to view 4-H projects that have earned the top awards at local fairs, a special Kansas Sesquicentennial award celebrating Kansas' 150th birthday - or both.

4-H Centennial Hall is located at the north end of the fairgrounds, and will house the majority of the more than 11,000 4-H project exhibits during the fair, said Beth Hinshaw, one of the K-State Research and Extension specialists coordinating 4-H events at the fair.

The building is open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., from Sept. 9-Sept. 17, and, on Sept. 18 (closing day) from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m.

Viewing the exhibits is an excellent way for children and families to see the wide variety of 4-H projects and to see how youth use them to build on their interests and skills, Hinshaw said.

"Doing so is recommended for families considering youth development opportunities, but age need not be a factor in enjoying the exhibits," she said.

"Qualifying 4-H exhibits typically showcase the state," said Hinshaw, who noted that adults who have no connection with 4-H enjoy looking at the projects, as well. The entomology and geology collections are popular with visitors, she said, adding that it's not unusual for fairgoers to express interest in buying a woodworking project or tracking down a quilt or other craft pattern for their use.

While traditional projects are plentiful, visitors can also find the unusual.

Elizabeth Banks, a Crawford County 4-H member, has earned high marks this year for creating a dress, with accessories, from recycled materials. The dress,

made for 75 cents, will be on display in the clothing construction area.

Joshua Fowler, from Anderson County, is combining the 4-H Self Determined and Visual Arts projects in a historical study of blacksmithing. His top 2011 project - a copy of a medieval dagger – was fashioned from a rod by heating and beating the metal to shape it. His project will be displayed in the visual arts area.

Environmental concerns, science and technology are integral to 4-H programs, and visitors to 4-H Centennial Hall also are encouraged to look for a "Foreign Animal Disease Security Map," crafted by Leavenworth County 4-H technology project participants. In building their project, the 4-H members used GPS-GIS (global positioning and geographic information systems) tech-

nologies to aid emergency management and homeland security.

The teens earned praise from local and state officials and captured second place in the K-12 division of an international map-making contest that drew more than 1,000 entries from 100 countries, said Beth Hecht, K-State Research and Extension associate specialist for geospatial literacy and advisor to the group. The map, as well as opportunities to try out geospatial technologies, will be on display in 4-H Centennial Hall during the state fair.

4-H programs are readily associated with foods, nutrition and health project, yet only a small sample of the more than 1,700 fresh food entries can be displayed at the fair, said Diane Mack, 4-H area specialist, who is coordinating the foods, nutrition and health entries at the fair this year. 

# Future food producers test crops, award winners to be announced September 10

The 4-H-FFA Wheat Plot Variety Contest is challenging, yet appealing, in that it offers future food producers the opportunity and the structure to literally plant seeds for their career, said Deryl Waldren, K-State Research and Extension area 4-H specialist.

The project provides samples of five different varieties of wheat seed, and requires young producers to track the crops from planting to harvest, and to prepare a report for each of the crop varieties, said Waldren, who is the advisor for the year-long project.

Thirty-seven youth producers participated in the project this year, and 18 will present their wheat variety displays in the 4-H Showcase Building during the 2011 Kansas State Fair, Sept. 9-18 in Hutchinson. The building is located at the north end of the fairgrounds, across from the Bison Arena.

The young growers will be on hand Saturday, Sept. 10 at 11:30 a.m. for the awards ceremony. Throughout the fair, the public is encouraged to view the wheat displays and information. Successful producers will be rewarded for their efforts, a prerequisite for choosing said Waldren, who acknowledged several donors. The 4-H-FFA Wheat Plot Variety Champion will be given \$250, provided by the Kansas Wheat Commission; Reserve Champion will win \$150, donated by the Kansas Crop Improvement Association, and third through fifth place cash awards will be given, courtesy of the Kansas Grain and Feed Association. KGFA also provides an award plaque for each of the top five award recipients

the project," said Waldren, who noted that several 4-H members "adopted a producer" by working with a neighbor or relative who collaborated with the 4-H member to provide the equipment and land. This is an excellent way to help youth appreciate the value of the project experience, and to encourage future food producers.

# Fire causes hay loss at **Parsons Livestock Market**

The Parsons Fire Department was dispatched to the Parsons Livestock Market on north U.S. 59 Highway early the morning of August 24th in response to a hav barn on fire.

Parsons Fire Chief, Larry Steeby said that upon their arrival the responders found the hay barn north of the sale facility fully engulfed in flames. Parsons Fire Department got the fire under control but left it still smoldering, according to the employees of the facility. The next morning, a local contractor was onsite moving hay around with a track hoe and skid steers. It is expected to continue to smolder and burn for several days.

The hay fire is currently under investigation. No one was injured, but the early morning fire caused an estimated loss of more than 3,000 square bales of prairie hay.



Maintain those mineral feeders, introduce calves to a hay and grain ration and water from a tank or waterer. You can run through alternative story lines that skip some of those steps.

If the calves had no shots in the spring, it will pay to vaccinate a few weeks before weaning and then booster on the day. A lot of nonfiction research can illustrate consequences.

Plan your facilities and flow to minimize stress and security. Discuss all plans with your crew, veterinarian, marketer and cattle feeder. This is a rich area for plot and character development, but if communication breaks down, keep it clean.

If you have not taken an active enough role in writing your story, now's the time to jump in and save the day, or at least set up a cliffhanger with potential for a happy ending in the next episode.

Those choices at the pump may look a little greener in the future as a Kansas State University research team is conducting a study that could eventually add "plant" to the list of fuel options.

In early August, four faculty members from K-State's College of Agriculture and College of Engineering received an \$800,000 grant from the U.S. departments of Agriculture and Energy under the Plant Feedstocks Genomics for Bioenergy research program. The grant funds a three-year study that will provide the genetic groundwork necessary for potentially turning sorghum into biofuel by increasing the plant's biomass yield.

"Bioenergy is a very hot topic and there's a lot of talk about its possibilities," said Jianming Yu, associate professor of agronomy and leader of the study. "But a lot of work still needs to be done since it's still a new field. And unless genetics is improved, industries probably won't want to get involved because there are still too many unknowns."

Yu is conducting the sorghum bioenergy study with K-State's Tesfaye Tesso, assistant professor of agronomy; Scott Staggenborg, professor of agronomy; and Donghai Wang, professor of biological and agricultural engineering, along with researchers from the University of Minnesota and the USDA's Agricultural Research Service plant genetic resources conservation unit. K-State is one of nine universities chosen nationally to participate in genomics studies related to bioenergy. Potential benefits from these university studies range from decreasing oil imports to optimizing crops that can tolerate drought, poor soil and other unfavorable conditions. ic diversity in sorghum's germplasm — essentially the plant's gene bank. Members will start with 1,000 sorghum lines selected from

Over the next three years the K-State team will build a genetic database on biomass sorghum, a type of sorghum that contains little grain and is mostly leaves and stalk. Biomass sorghum provides a large amount of high-quality feedstock. which can produce ecofriendly fuels. Kansas is the top producer of sorghum in the U.S., accounting for nearly half of the country's annual yield. Similarly, the U.S. is the world's largest grain sorghum exporter and ranks second in production, according to Staggenborg.

But despite the country's large production of sorghum, little data about biomass sorghum's genetics and how to improve the crop exists, outside of some USDA studies on the sorghum collection conducted many years ago. While many grain crops have had their genetics and production refined and documented for decades, the K-State sorghum team essentially has to start from scratch.

"Our study will sort of be a prototype with new lessons and insights into how we combine this proven method of plant breeding changing a plant's genetics to make more starch, more vield, or in this case, more biomass — with this new genomic technology to optimize the improvement process," Tesso said. "In the bigger picture, this study addresses some of those emerging issues with energy and climate change."

To build the database, the team is looking at genet-

germplasm — essentially the plant's gene bank. Members will start with 1,000 sorghum lines selected from the center of the germplasm pool. A line is the unique genetic material in sorghum. Those samples will then be genotyped, a process where the team looks at each sample's unique molecular diversity and compares it to the molecular diversity found in the sampled collection as a whole.

From those 1,000 samples, a subset of 300 samples will be chosen to represent the maximum amount of diversity, and will be studied more in depth for biomass yield and biomass composition. Once the biomass yield is found for those 300 sam-



# **Extension agronomist offers** wheat variety selection tips

The 2011 wheat harvest is but a distant memory for many farmers, who are well on their way to planning the 2012 wheat crop. It is variety selection time, and Jim Shroyer, Extension agronomist for Kansas State University, says choosing the best wheat varieties requires due diligence, but there are four traits to keep in mind: adaptability, genetic variability, pest resistance and yield.

Farmers who plant several different varieties would be wise to choose varieties with different genetic background, in order to increase resistance to pests, and spread out maturity levels. The prevalence of stripe rust two years ago is a grim reminder at how important genetic diversity can be.

"The 2010 crop really got hurt by stripe rust, especially if varieties had Jagger in the background, and most of our varieties then did have Jagger in the background," Shroyer says. "That really sifted the susceptibility out. From that point on, we're seeing varieties that don't have as much Jagger in the background, or have no Jagger in the background." Shroyer adds that studying the K-State Disease and Insect Resistance Ratings is critical, too. In 2011, barley yellow dwarf was the most prevalent wheat disease in Kansas, but each year is different. In 2010, it was stripe rust; in past years, speckled leaf blotch, leaf rust and wheat streak mosaic were challenges.

Finally, producers need to look at yield.



The agronomist says wheat farmers may want to use blends of multiple varieties of wheat in order to add disease resistance and complementation diversity. For example, a farmer may want to plant a variety with high yield potential, but is susceptible to stripe rust. To protect against stripe rust, blend that variety with another variety that contains stripe rust resistance. That way, if an outbreak of stripe rust were to occur, some of the yield potential of that field is protected.



#### Page 34 Grass & Grain, August 30, 2011 Maintaining farms' grass waterways essential for best results

Grass waterways are an important part of a farm's overall soil conservation plan, but producers and landowners have to work at maintaining them or they cannot fulfill their function, said DeAnn Presley, K-State Research and Extension soil management specialist.

Grass waterways are permanent strips of grass seeded in areas of cropland where water either concentrates or flows off a field from terraces or diversions. They have several functions, each of which adds value to a farm. Presley said. "The overall purpose of the waterway is to carry runoff water from a field. The grass prevents the water from forming a gully and traps some sedi-

ment," she said. "In addition, the vegetation absorbs some of the chemicals and nutrients in the runoff water, and provides habitat for small animals and birds." For maintenance of grass waterways, Presley recommends:

\* Lift equipment out of the ground and shut off spray equipment when crossing the waterway. Encourage commercial applicators to do the same.

\* If bare spots appear, reseed with sod-forming grasses

\* Do not use the waterway as a roadway. Tracks can turn into gullies in single, intense rain events.

\* Do not overgraze or allow livestock trails to form. These can quickly turn into gullies.

\* If gullies form, fill, reshape, and reseed. Contact your local USDA Natural **Resources** Conservation

Service field office for recommendations on grass species to plant.

\* Fertilize cool-season grasses regularly at a rate of 30 to 40 pounds of nitrogen per acre between November and mid-March. Many producers fertilize grass waterways when they topdress wheat.

\* Mow periodically, but don't mow between April 20 and July 15 when birds are nesting. It's important to mow grass because it encourages the formation of a dense sod. Also, shorter, thick grass is more effective at trapping sedi-


ment than tall grass, which will lay over in an intense rain event.

\* Be careful not to till into the edges of the waterway.

\* Avoid end rows planted parallel along the waterway. They may allow gullies to form on the waterway edge.



# **Controlling sericea lespedeza**

If it hasn't already, sericea lespedeza will soon begin the bloom stage. This flowering period will continue through much of September. And even though it's fast heading towards maturity, this can be a very good time for sericea control with herbicides.

At the bud and early flowering stage, sericea lespedeza can be controlled with Remedy Ultra (triclopyr) at 1.5 pints/acre. Watch plants closely, how-

ever. After sericea has reached the full-bloom stage until the first freeze, products containing metsulfuron are the herbicides of choice. Use rate is one-half ounce of metsulfuron per acre.


Metsulfuron can control sericea lespedeza even through seed fill, unless the plants are under drought stress (no problem this year!).

Control the plants before mid-seed fill, however. If the sericea has already formed viable seeds when it is treated with metsulfuron, the seeds can germinate the following year and spread the problem.

Avoid haying or grazing of grass with sericea lespedeza infestations after the plants have gone to seed or spreading to other areas will occur.

Next spring, areas with a sericea lespedeza infestation should be burned to encourage germination of sericea seed, remove new sericea growth, and remove all dead plant material. After the burn, these areas should be intensively grazed until no later than mid-July. Four to six weeks after grazing ceases, any remaining sericea can be treated with an appropriate product. An alternative to the burn + graze + herbicide approach is to spray sericea lespedeza in June when plants are in a vegetative growth stage with Remedy (1-1.5pts/a) or

PastureGard (2 pts/a).
