Kansas State University agronomist offers wheat planting tips

With extremely dry conditions covering most of Kansas during wheat planting season, there are a few important steps farmers can take to improve the chances of getting a good stand of wheat, according to Jim Shroyer, Extension agronomist at Kansas State University.

• Proper tractor speed. It is best to use a tractor speed of between 5 and 6 miles per hour in most cases when drilling wheat, depending on the amount of down pressure on the openers. If higher speeds are used, the openers can tend to "ride up" in the soil every now and then; at slow speeds, openers can sink a bit.

• Proper, uniform seeding depth. The ideal planting depth for wheat in most cases is about 1.5 inches. When planting early into very warm soils, it is especially important not to plant too deeply since coleoptile lengths are shorter than normal under warm conditions. On the other extreme, producers should also be especially careful not to plant too deeply when planting later than the recommended time into verv cool soils. Getting a uniform seeding depth is also important.

• Firm seedbed. One of the most common problems in wheat stand establishment is planting into loose,

fluffy soils. This problem tends to occur most often where soils have been tilled repeatedly during the summer. When seeds are planted into loose soils, rains in the fall will settle the soil and leave the crowns of the seedlings too close to the soil surface.

• Plant during the optimum time. In general, wheat should be planted somewhere around the Hessian fly-free date. There may be good reasons to plant some wheat before the fly-free date, such as planting for pasture or time pressures from having considerable acreage to plant. But stand establishment and ultimate grain yields are usually best when wheat is planted after the fly-free date and before deadlines set by crop insurance.

• Adequate soil fertility. general, producers In should apply at least part of their nitrogen before or at planting time to get the plants off to a strong start. Nitrogen rates of 20-30 lbs can help with fall establishment and tillering. If the soil is low or very low in phosphorus or potassium, these nutrients should be applied at planting time as well so that the plants benefit early in their development.

• Using a seed treatment. Fungicide seed treatments may help with stand establishment in certain situations. For seed production fields, a systemic seed treatment is highly recommended to help keep seedborne pathogens such as bunt and loose smut out of seed stocks. In addition, seed treatments sometimes improve stands.

• Make adjustments for planting into row crop stubble. When planting wheat into grain sorghum stubble. producers will need an extra 30 lbs N per acre over their normal N rate. Also, it is important to make sure the sorghum is dead before planting wheat.

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When planting wheat into soybean stubble, producers should not reduce their N rates since the N credit from sovbeans doesn't take effect until the following spring. If the wheat is being planted no-till after row crop harvest, N rates should be increased by 20 lbs N per acre over the normal N rate. Seeding rates should be increased when planting wheat late after row crop harvest. It's best to use a seeding rate of 90 to 120 lbs per acre in central and eastern Kansas, and 75 to 100 lbs per acre in western Kansas.

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

Kansas State University (KSU) is offering its fashion design students a chance to discover how a small cotton plant can make a huge fashion statement. Kansas Cotton Association (KCA) is partnering with Lubbock, Texas-based Plains Cotton Cooperative Association (PCCA) and KSU to bring cotton, denim and future fashion designers together in the Sunflower State via a design contest at the university

KCA is a 100 percent producer-based organization whose primary purpose is the promotion of Kansas cotton production and use through education and research. The chance to educate future apparel designers about cotton and denim is the association's latest goal.

"The idea to expand PCCA's original denim design contest, entitled 'Denim Runway', will give us just this opportunity," said KCA president Bob Miller, a cotton farmer from Wellington. "KCA has provided a generous grant to aid in sponsorship of the contest for the KSU fashion design students," he added.

"Our success with the Denim Runway design contest at Texas Tech University for the past two years led to the expansion of the contest to KSU's Department of Apparel, Textiles, and Interior Design," said PCCA president and CEO Wally Darneille. "We believe PCCA's producer-members in Kansas will enjoy seeing their own version of the contest unfold in their state."

PCCA is a farmer-owned cotton marketing cooperative with the only fully vertically integrated supply chain for denim apparel in the Western Hemisphere. The supply chain includes the American Cotton Grow-

ers (ACG) denim mill at Littlefield, Texas, and the Denimatrix jeans facility in Guatemala City, Guatemala, both of which are renowned for innovative, high-fashion denim fabrics and jeans.

With its ties to the cotton and textile industry, PCCA created the Denim Runway design contest in 2010 in collaboration with Texas Tech University's Apparel Design and Manufacturing Department in the College of Human Sciences as a way to help fashion design students understand all of the links in the denim apparel supply chain.

Thus, KCA reached out to KSU Assistant Professor of Apparel Textiles and Interior Design Joycelyn Burdett, Ph.D., recognizing the potential joint-venture the association could have with the university. Miller says this contest will create a unique partnership and link between the university and the cotton industry in Kansas.

"Kansas farmers often do not get to see the crop they raise end up on a fashion runway," Miller said. "This is a very exciting opportunity to promote our product and benefit the university.'

Burdett said this contest will be an excellent approach in engaging her fashion design students with a natural fiber such as cotton while promoting Kansas agriculture.

"We are absolutely thrilled to have the support of KCA for our design students," Burdett said. "It will give our students a definite advantage in the job market."

Bv participating in Denim Runway, contestants advance their design skills by creating denim garments using ACG denim and have the opportunity to strengthen their speaking skills by presenting their designs to a panel of judges. Interacting with judges provides a real-world experience as they discuss their design inspirations, marketing and pricing strategies, and construction

Denim Runway at KSU is set to officially kick-off on September 13 with interactive tours and presentations for participating student/ contestants. PCCA Director of Business Development for Kansas and Northern Oklahoma Dick Cooper, and Gary Feist, manager of the Southern Kansas Cotton Growers (SKCG) gin in Anthony, will present "A Farmer's Perspective" and "Grading Cotton" in a classroom lecture. Contestants also will travel to SKCG where they will be able to see first hand the cotton ginning process and, essentially, where jeans originate

"This will be the start of the contestants' 'field to fashion' experience throughout the next few months," said PCCA communications specialist Emma Matkin.

The design contest will consist of three major categories. The Fashion Jeans competition will feature designs for men's and women's jeans and is limited to upperclassmen enrolled in special topics classes. In the Casual Category, contestants have the opportunity to design and create products out of denim fabric other than jeans. Items designed in this contest must be made of denim, and contestants are encouraged to express unlimited design ideas. The final category is a Cotton Trend Board competition where students will research trends for cotton fiber and apparel and demonstrate the results in the form of a presentation board. Both the Casual Cat-


Board competition will be open to all students in the department who wish to participate. After visiting SCKG, contestants will be presented with a selection of high fashion ACG denim fabrics to choose from for

their project entries. Educated with a background of cotton and supplied with some of the finest denim in the United States, contestants will then spend the next two months designing and creating their desired garments. A \$10,000 grant from KCA will enable those contestants eligible for the Fashion Jeans competition to travel to ACG's denim mill in Littlefield, Texas, to complete their designs. Denim mill personnel will assist contestants in proper sanding and washing techniques and applying buttons and rivets with industrial-grade machines.

"The opportunity to see the field-to-fabric cotton production and to work in

egory and Cotton Trend the textile finishing labs at ACG is quite rare," Burdett said. "No amount of classroom lecture can be as meaningful as an actual experience such as this."

Contest judging will begin the last week of November, and results will be announced at the department's "Cotton, the Fabric of our Future: Today" fashion show on December 1, 2011, at KSU. Contest winners in each category will receive cash prizes and recognition plaques from PCCA.



Producers should check grain sorghum for stalk rot

A lot of attention has been given to stalk rot and other lodging problems in corn this year. But producers should keep in mind that stalk rot can be an even bigger problem in grain sorghum due to a generally thinner stalk, said Doug Jardine, K-State Research and Extension plant pathologist.

The best estimates are that at least 5 percent of the sorghum crop is lost each year to stalk rot, he said.

"The incidence of stalk rot in individual fields may reach 90 to 100 percent with yield losses of 50 percent. The most obvious losses occur when plants lodge. More important may be the yield losses that go unnoticed," Jardine said.

These losses are caused by reduced head size, poor filling of grain, and early head lodging as plants mature early, he explained.

In grain sorghum, the two most common types of stalk rot are charcoal rot and Fusarium stalk rot, he said. Although caused by many different organisms, the symptoms of the various stalk rots are somewhat similar, he said.

'Symptoms generally appear several weeks after pollination when the plant appears to prematurely ripen. The leaves become dry, taking on a grayishgreen appearance similar to frost injury. The stalk usually dies a few weeks later," Jardine said.

Producers can check their sorghum for stalk rots by squeezing the lower



fingers.

'If the stalks crush easily, they are probably infected with one of the stalk rot organisms and may lodge at any time. Check 100 plants across the field to determine the percentage of affected plants. If the percentage of stalk-rot-infected plants is high, sorghum should be harvested as soon as possible, even if it hasn't dried down adequately in the field," the K-State plant pathologist said.

"If the stalks are firm, the plants will probably be able to stand just fine in the field for several more weeks if necessary," he added

Stalk rot is a stress-re-

stem with their thumb and lated disease, he said.

"When the carbohy drates used to fill grain become unavailable due to nutrient shortage, drought stress, leaf loss from insects, hail, disease or reduced sunlight, the plant is forced to use nitrogen and carbohydrate reserves stored in the stalk to complete grain fill. This loss of nitrogen and carbohydrate reserves weakens stalk tissues and results in increased stalk rot susceptibility," Jardine said.

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



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

Civil War story to come to life at Farm Heritage Celebration

Living historian Michelle Martin of Bartlesville, Okla., will bring the dramatic story of Emma Caroline Morely's survival during the Civil War at the fourth annual Farm Heritage Celebration on Friday, September 30. Throughout the day, Martin will present "She Slept on the Cold, Hard Ground."

Martin's historical pro-

gram will combine life on her arrival in Fort Scott in the prairie with how women survived on the plains during the tumultuous time. The story line was created based on Morely's diary as she traveled to Kansas.

In October 1864, Emma Caroline Morely left the comfort of her home and family in Ohio to travel west to Kansas. From the moment she left St. Louis until

October 1864. Emma's journey was filled with danger; little did she know that she would travel just a few days ahead of Confederate general Sterling Price's massive raid from Missouri into Kansas. After arriving in Fort Scott to spend time with her brother John, a successful mercantile owner, Emma would be forced to once again leave safety and comfort as Price's troops headed south from Kansas City towards Fort Scott intent on taking the city and military post for the Confederacy.

Emma and her family and friends would become refugees adrift in the Kansas prairie living in wagons, sleeping on the cold hard ground, searching for food and fighting to survive. After returning to Fort Scott, Emma would live out her life's dream and served



as a nurse in the hospital ward at Fort Scott tending the sick and wounded after the Battle of Mine Creek.
