





# Kansas drought continues, production losses reach \$1.7 billion

Drought continues in Kansas with nearly three-fourths of the state abnormally to exceptionally dry. The estimated value loss of wheat, corn, sorghum and soybeans in Kansas in 2011 is more than 1.77 billion dollars, based on a comparison of current U.S. Department of Agriculture production estimates and average historic production.

The Kansas Department of Agriculture is offering emergency drought term permits to additional counties as conditions worsen. Additionally, certain motor carrier regulations remain suspended to allow hay to be moved to drought-stricken areas faster.

"We want to be flexible and do our part to help Kansas farmers and ranchers deal with this severe drought," Kansas Secretary of Agriculture Dale Rodman said. "We have learned as a new administration that there are ways we can work with the USDA and other agencies to ease the burden on producers. Our goal is to take what we've learned to respond swiftly to address producers concerns now and in the future."

In response to Gov. Brownback's recent request for federal assistance for additional drought-stricken counties, the Department of Agriculture has extended the Drought Emergency Term Permit option to water right holders in Allen, Anderson, Bourbon, Chase, Chautauqua, Cherokee, Coffey, Crawford, Elk, Ellsworth, Greenwood, Labette, Linn, Lyon, Montgomery, Neosho, Wilson, and Woodson counties.

The one-time, drought-focused term permit allows holders of existing water rights the flexibility to borrow a portion of next year's authorized quantity in order to complete the 2011 growing season.

Additional information about the drought emergency term permit, including application forms, can be found on the 2011 Drought Options webpage. Program enrollment ends on December 31, 2011 and water right holders must apply for this program prior to exceeding the quantity of water authorized by their water right(s). There have been 903 drought emergency

term permit applications as of September 14.

With the addition, qualifying counties include Allen, Anderson, Barber, Barton, Bourbon, Butler, Chase, Chautauqua, Cherokee, Clark, Coffey, Comanche, Cowley, Crawford, Edwards, Elk, Ellis, Ellsworth, Finney, Ford, Gove, Graham, Grant, Gray, Greeley, Greenwood, Hamilton, Harper, Harvey, Haskell, Hodgeman, Kearny, Kingman, Kiowa, Labette, Lane, Lincoln, Linn, Logan, Lyon, Marion, McPherson, Meade, Montgomery, Morton, Neosho, Ness, Norton, Pawnee, Phillips, Pratt, Reno, Rice, Rush, Russell, Sedgwick, Scott, Seward, Sheridan, Sherman, Stafford, Stanton, Stevens, Sumner, Thomas, Trego, Wallace, Wichita, Wilson, and Woodson counties.

The drought has also significantly limited forage options for livestock producers. On July 28, Brownback signed Executive Order 11-25 temporarily suspending certain motor carrier rules and regulations in order to expedite efforts to transport

hay to livestock in drought-stricken areas.

There is an online hay and pasture exchange in Kansas to better connect those who have hay and pasture with those who do not. People can list hay or pasture available or

their hay or pasture needs on the exchange found at [www.kfb.org/hayandpasture/default.htm](http://www.kfb.org/hayandpasture/default.htm). The exchange is not a broker but rather is set up to connect individual parties who communicate directly to negotiate accept-

able hay prices or pasture rates. The Hay and Pasture Exchange is a joint effort of Kansas Farm Bureau and Kansas State University Research and Extension. You do not have to be a Farm Bureau member to use the exchange.

# USDA agency chief to speak at K-State on conservation challenges in times of extreme events

The chief of USDA's Natural Resources and Conservation Service (NRCS), Dave White, will speak at Kansas State University on Wed., Sept. 21. His talk, "NRCS - Then and Now," will be part of the Department of Agronomy's seminar series.

White will speak on the history of NRCS conservation initiatives over the past 75 years, and the impact these initiatives have had on agriculture in Kansas and the nation. The practices and stan-

dards associated with NRCS initiatives include everything from terraces and grass waterways to protect against soil loss to prescribed burning to protect grassland productivity.

The challenges of protecting soil resources are as real now as during the Dust Bowl days, said DeAnn Presley, K-State Research and Extension soil management specialist.

"We've had soil erosion losses and soil quality degradation due to flooding in some regions. And we've had wind erosion concerns due to crop failures related to the extreme drought and heat in other regions," she said.

Through the efforts of NRCS, working with K-State Research and Extension, we can help producers protect their valuable soil resources under these adverse conditions, Presley said.

White's seminar will address the wide range of activities and practices that have been used through the years, their effectiveness, and how this has resulted in the practices being

used and recommended to meet today's challenges.

The seminar begins at 4 p.m. in Throckmorton 1018 on the K-State campus, and is open to the public. There will be refreshments before the seminar at 3:30. For more information, contact Terry Jo Litchfield at 785-532-7217 or terryjo@ksu.edu.

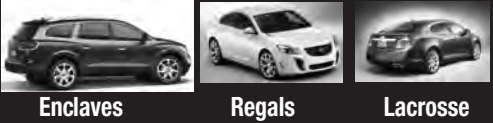

# Historic restoration to create Rogler Prairie Heritage Center

The first significant construction project in nearly 100 years has been launched at Pioneer Bluffs.

The 1916 granary and carriage house will soon become the Rogler Prairie Heritage Center.

Through careful restoration, the exterior of the historic building will look much like it did in 1916 while the interior will be renovated to include a multi-purpose classroom, heritage gallery area, and accessible public restrooms. The new center will offer a place for educational programs and respite for travelers along the Flint Hills National Scenic Byway.

After three years of planning and design development, and a competitive bidding process earlier this year, Mitchell-Markowitz Construction of Emporia was awarded the construction contract.

The Rogler Prairie Heritage Center will be dedicated during the Pioneer Bluffs annual Fall Festival to be held Saturday, October 8. Everyone is invited to attend this historic celebration.

Funding for this project has been provided by a grant from the National Scenic Byways, the K.T. Wiedemann Foundation, and many individual donors. Additional funding is needed to complete the renovation.

# Moran's bill to remove trade barrier with Cuba approved by committee

Last Thursday, U.S. Sen. Jerry Moran's legislation to remove a trade barrier with Cuba, by allowing direct cash payments from Cuban buyers to U.S. financial institutions during the 2012 fiscal year (FY), was adopted by the U.S. Senate Committee on Appropriations as an amendment to the FY2012 Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Bill. By allowing direct cash payments, Moran's amendment will fuel economic growth and enable agricultural producers to compete

on a level playing field. "Current U.S. trade policies hurt American farmers and ranchers by making it more expensive for Cuba to purchase agriculture products from the United States," Moran said. "This means Cuba is buying more of its food from countries such as Vietnam and China. The change is an important step to increase American export sales and support thousands of American jobs without increasing the debt." In 2000, the passage of the Trade Sanctions Re-

form and Export Enhancement Act allowed for the cash sale - including sales by direct cash transfer - of U.S. agricultural commodities and medicine to Cuba for the first time in 38 years. In 2005, however, the Treasury Department administratively banned direct cash transfers. This resulted in payments having to be routed through a third party in a foreign country, driving up transaction costs and making American products less competitive. In addition to Moran's

amendment, the FY2012 Financial Services and General Government Appropriations Bill includes a provision making cash payments due when a Cuban buyer receives their goods, which is standard trading practice. Without the provision to fix the definition of "payment of cash in advance," which has been included in appropriations bills for the last three years, payments would be due before ships leave U.S. ports. This bill was voted out of committee and will now move to the full

Senate for a vote. According to a Texas A&M University report, giving relief from the current regulatory prohibitions on direct cash transfers could increase annual agricultural exports to Cuba by over \$270 million and support nearly 4,500 United States jobs per year. In February 2010, then-Congressman Moran introduced - and the House

Agriculture Committee passed - H.R. 4645, legislation to expand agricultural trade with Cuba. Nearly 150 U.S. organizations have voiced their strong support for doing so, including the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, the American Farm Bureau Federation, the National Association of Wheat Growers and the National Farmers Union.

# Roberts works to stop EPA from regulating farm dust

Continuing his efforts to repeal burdensome, costly and ridiculous regulations, U.S. Sen. Pat Roberts (R-Kan.) signed on as a co-sponsor this week to a bill that prohibits the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) from regulating farm dust. "This is one of those potential regulations that makes you scratch your head, because it simply defies common sense," said Roberts. "Whether it is cattle kicking up dust in a feedlot in Larned, Kansas or wheat being harvested on a hot afternoon on the High Plains in June, dust is a naturally occurring event. It is critical to recognize that no one cares more about maintaining a clean environ-

ment than the American farmer and rancher, who know firsthand that clean air and water and healthy soil go hand-in-hand with a healthy economy. Our producers deserve respect and appreciation from the EPA, not costly and redundant regulation." The bill, S. 1328, the Farm Dust Regulation Prevention Act, would stop the EPA from regulating dust in rural America by preventing it from imposing more stringent dust standards for one year. It would also allow state and localities the flexibility to address any rural dust issues before the federal government would have the authority to do so. For the EPA to retain regulatory

authority, the bill would require them to identify scientific evidence of substantial adverse health effects of farm dust, as well as demonstrate that the benefits of the regulation outweigh the economic costs to affected communities. The bill was recently introduced in the Senate by Sens. Mike Johanns (R-Neb.) and Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa). Roberts is the author of legislation to require a review of federal regulations to identify those regulations that harm the nation's economic recovery. It has 47 cosponsors. Roberts is the ranking member of the Senate Agriculture Committee.
